



On the cover: Dr. and Mrs. William James Ferguson greet visitors to their house on the edge of Belvedere Lagoon, in San Francisco Bay, with a constantly changing show of pot plants. The real secret of pot gardening is a never failing supply of plants and a carefully worked out plan for their seasonal (or year-round) rotation. "Every member of the family," says Mrs. Ferguson, "enjoys particularly the drama of flowers. And so I have tried to achieve dramatic bursts of color for every day." Here, the May parade marches along the terrace wall. Starting in the lower right corner: claret pelargoniums and ruffled pink petunias. Cinerarias add blues, lavenders and purples. In the long boxes, sweet-alyssum tumbles among lobelias and more pelargoniums. Alyssum also rings the base of the loquat trees. Variegated Algerian ivy and Phaedranthus buccinatorius mantle the wall itself. Basic plan was devised by Landscape architects Lawrence Halprin & Associates.

Can you tell me when and where my hand-carved musical chair was made? The design is inlaid, and the seat conceals a music box that plays when sat upon. The only marking is "Patd. Nov. 23, 1862" on the music box.

The Swiss made many things with music boxes—including chairs like yours—during the latter half of the nineteenth century. This chair dates between 1875 and 1890. Traveling Americans brought home such chairs as souvenirs. They are much more rare than the usual Swiss cuckoo clock.

Sleigh beds were made by American cabinetmakers in the larger cities about 1820-1835. They were made of the best grade of Santo Domingo mahogany.




SNOW-BIRD EAGLE

Throughout New England, in sections where heavy snowfall was expected, rows of cast-iron eagles like this one 4 to 6 inches high were mounted on sloping roofs to help retard snow slides.




ENGLISH DOME AND PLATTER

The plates were made about 1890-1900 by W. H. Grindley & Co., who still operate the Woodland Pottery, Tunstall, England.

It is an American Victorian cylinder-front desk of the Eastlake substyle, made about 1870-1880. We cannot identify the maker.

Coleus the gloom

CUITE BY DIXIE E. ROSE

Personal paean for a seed-sown plant with a rainbow of built-in color effects



Leaf variations range from subtle to spectacular

Toleus is habit-forming. I'm definitely an addict. I can take its color in big or little doses, any time or place. The effect of its rich variegated foliage against a concrete wall or a brown fence or a gray stone bank is intoxicating. Its brilliance lightens dull patches under shrubs, spills gaily from terrace planter, window box or humdrum tub.

Nowhere does it show up more happily than filling an indoor planter in winter. Sunny days make a sumptuous tapestry of the leaves and even in cloudy weather they glow, combining rose with wine, lime with garnet, cream with chartreuse, peach with rust, coral with bronze. But not consistently-various blends of these tones may appear, sometimes on a single plant.

Coleus grows in any good potting soil, preferably not too moist. If you pinch out the top of each 3- or 4-inch twig, you will shortly have two in its place. This keeps the plant full and bushy, roundly vigorous. Remove depleted lower leaves and you encourage fresh growth along the shanks. Branches that become leggy can be clipped below leaf nodes and dropped in a

jar of water to root for increase.

Three or four plants set in a 6-inch pot make the best display, the pot turned daily to keep growth in balance. If flower buds show, pick them off with your fingers. The pallid bloom is a sapper of strength which the foliage puts to more decorative use.

Shade in summer and sun in winter produce the best colors, if the shade is not overly dense (and if noonday sun through a south window indoors is modified by thin curtains or matchstick bamboo).

I know that the delicate ruffleedged species prefers the house, but toward spring I cut many slips from the hardier kinds and root them in a bowl of water-clear glass, for light-and pot them in friable soil until May or June, when I sink them in partly shaded terrace planters or garden beds. Coleus can be set directly in the ground if desired. But I like to sink the pots, which can then be turned or shifted easily.

Last spring, to increase variety, I planted a packet of mixed seed indoors. I've never had more fun. This was a whole packet, mind you, in a 5-by-7-inch fiber flat. A



The 10-inch depth leaves a place for soap and decorative accessories on back countertop.

Schönbrunn: trees' haircut sets off baroque palace

finding things in

Vienna

An enamored traveler reminds us that this remarkable city has something to please the sight-seer, the music lover, the art lover and the simple hedonist

BY JOAN HASLIP

Editor's Note: Wienophile Joan Haslip is an English writer who has spent much time in Vienna and written a great deal about Austrian subjects. At present she is working on a biography of the Empress Elizabeth.


I like to say that I can remember Imperial Vienna, even if I was only two when the shot was fired at Sarajevo which brought the great top-heavy edifice of Hapsburg power crashing to the ground. I have a distinct recollection of watching a procession while being carried on the shoulder of a man in uniform. It may have been a procession with the Emperor, but all I can remember of that vanished world is a pair of gold epaulettes scratching my bare legs.

In spite of wars, revolutions and years of foreign occupation, the ghosts of that vanished world still haunt the streets of Vienna, and not even the grim statue of the Russian soldier in the Schwarzenberg Platz can keep them at bay. That granite monument put up by the Russians before they left Vienna in front of one of the loveliest of eighteenth-century palaces gives you a shock on arrival. But gradually the visitor learns to ignore it in the same way that the Austrians have learned to ignore it. The Viennese guard tradition jealously, whether it is a certain interpretation of a Strauss opera, the repainting of an old house in a special shade of yellow, the planting of the roses in the Volksgarten or just the red plush benches at the Hotel Sacher. At Demel's, the famous confectioner on the Kohlmarkt, the *Fräuleins*—not one of them less than sixty—still wear the black uniforms and high white collars that were fashionable at the beginning of the century.

Sacher's is so much a part of the Viennese tradition that the celebrated Frau Sacher (who smoked black cigars and swore as well as any Fiaker driver) became a legend even in her lifetime. Although the Imperial Hotel on the Ringstrasse is now considered to be one of the best hotels in Europe, I personally would always choose to stay at Sacher's, not because it is a little cheaper (a double room with bath will cost you about \$23 as against \$25 at the Imperial), but because I find it has far more atmosphere, particularly during the opera season or the music festival in June. The magnificent Opera House, which thanks largely to the self-sacrificing contributions of the Viennese people themselves has risen phoenix-like from the ruins, is just opposite the hotel, so there is never any fear of missing the first act, which often begins punctually at 6 o'clock.

After the performance, you can have supper in the so-called Red Bar at Sacher's, where the brocaded walls are covered with signed photographs of archdukes, ballerinas, tenors and conductors, and Crown Prince Rudolph looks down with Nijinsky, Elisabeth Schwarzkopf and Toscanini. The whole musical world, headed by Director Von Karajan and his beautiful French wife, congre-


PAPERBACKS in three variations to build yourself for every room in the house

Since the "quarter book" was introduced twenty years ago, paperbacks have increased in quantity and quality to the point where today not only are they almost always with us in our pocket or purse, but often they become permanent members of our home library. Virtually every kind of book is now available in soft cover-from belles lettres to cook books. But where can a growing collection of paperbacks be kept? As H&G has pointed out (see May, 1961), they look better and last longer in a section by themselves. This year in honor of National Library Week (April 8th to 14th) H&G asked the architectural firm of Dawson, Oliver & Murtagh to design a versatile easy-to-build storage unit especially for paperbacks. The result is an interlocking arrangement of slanted shelves that keep soft-cover books propped neatly. The same basic construction of plywood, in 1/2- and 1/4-inch thicknesses, can be used to make hanging shelves, a desk-top stand or a mobile chairside reading table. You can stain a unit to blend with the other wood in a room, or paint it a bright accent color and dress it up with hardware. Below and on page 94, in settings by Yale R. Burge, paperbacks from Doubleday-Anchor are attractively stored in the three versions of the storage unit. The spirit of change

■ From the time man abandoned the ways of the nomad, the allure of home has been the allure of permanence. To know we can return sooner or

later to the same friendly table, the same familiar bed, the same view from the window has become a necessity of living. Yet nothing that is wholly static satisfies us for long. "The soul cries aloud for release into change," wrote the late great philosopher Alfred North Whitehead in "Science in the Modern World." But with characteristic perspective he observed: "There are two principles inherent in the very nature of things . . . the spirit of change, and the spirit of conservation. There can be nothing real without both."

The spirit of change is almost irresistible at this time of year when the world outside our windows is changing every day. And in this issue of H&G you will find many cues. If you would change the curtains at your windows, turn to page 154. If you want to give a new kind of party in a new place, see pages 146-153. If you would change the flavor of your cooking, consult H&G's Seasoning Cook Book.

But we have not overlooked the spirit of conservation. Nowhere is the value of conservation-plus-change epitomized more dramatically than in the millions of houses that are being remodeled today all over the country. For the whole aim of remodeling—and the factor that makes it pay off—is to preserve or acquire benefits that total change could never secure. For a full account, read pages 122-123 and the five case histories in remodeling that follow.

The big change in a large part of the country at this season is the move from indoors to outdoors. Terrace living is being translated from wish to reality. But the terrace, as noted at the start of H&G's terrace story early this year, is the place where your house and your landscape overlap—where indoor comforts and amenities are conserved along with your change of ambiance. Means and methods for this type of conservation you will find on pages 108 through 119. To see a house in which the respective delights of indoors and outdoors are conserved as you move from the one to the other, turn the page.



Outdoor drama in five acts

A New England house shares its platform foundation with five terraces in five different moods

most rewarding in terms of pleasure, when they are indivisible from the houses they complement. If they reflect, as they should, the nature of the rooms they adjoin, and share the same purposes, they can be as much a part of the house as its roof, and as varied in mood as the pattern of indoor living to which they correspond. This is beautifully illustrated by the house of many terraces in Longmeadow, Mass., that architect Elroy Webber designed for Mr. and Mrs. Edward Kuzon. Its over-all plan developed naturally from the device the architect used to cope with the undulating site: a raised rectangular platform to hold both house and terraces. The platform is as wide (104 feet) as its wedge-shaped plot will permit it to be, and as deep (80 feet) as it needs to be to provide all the living space, indoor and outdoor, that the Kuzons require and enjoy. In dramatic reversal of the Mediterranean house that surrounds its courtyards, this house is surrounded by a geometric girdle of five terraces. Glass walls, except on the street side of the house, permit perfect visual flow between the rooms and the adjacent terraces, while each terrace exists as an exterior complement to the room or rooms on the other side of the glass. Thus, covered or not, the house really begins at the perimeter of the platform. This romantic concept emphatically contradicts the view of New England as a stern country where home planners, out of deference to the elements, must place practicality first. The Kuzons' house is eminently practical, but its outdoor rooms add to its indoor living the delights of being surrounded by walls of greenery and treillage in summer, and by a sculptured overlay of snow-capped evergreens in winter.








he many and varied terraces that surround the Kuzons' house are not appendages tacked onto the structure as afterthoughts, but foreordained and vital parts of the house itself. Each extends to the outdoors some aspect of indoor living. From the living room, you walk out to the long, arcade-like living terrace that broadens at one end to the dining terrace tucked into a corner between dining room and kitchen and quickly accessible from both. The kitchen, too, has a terrace which functions during outdoor meals as a kind of outdoor serving pantry. On the other side of the house, both living room and study profit from the pool terrace, while the Kuzons' bedroom is blessed with a secluded, alcove-like terrace of its own. Courtyard in front of the house is pure embellishment.



Overhangs and trellises create architectural chiaroscuro

argest of the five terraces and most inducive to play is the pool terrace, opposite page. Although the pool is not for swimming, it is deep enough to paddle in-even to float in. Wide spaces between the trellis beams overhead welcome the sun, and two plinth-like concrete platforms are cushioned for sunbathing. The paving-pre-cast concrete squares delicately veined in blue-extend around the corner of the house to what architect Webber calls the "living" terrace, a long gallery for quiet, leisurely lounging. Here, the hot summer sun is not welcomed. To rout it, the gallery's rafters are topped by a closed roof running the entire length of the living room. This overhang not only shades the outdoor room, but also protects the indoor room from glare. In winter, the less intense sun, having veered in its orbit, is low enough to creep under the overhang, mild enough to be doubly welcome-particularly on a cold New England January afternoon. In any season, the dapple of light and shade created by the trellises and planting is continuously fascinating from indoors as well as outdoors, and in summer, the maximal use of paving proves a practical means to a pleasant end: no lawn to cut.

ven though the study is wide open, visually, to the pool terrace, the fencing and dense planting at that end seclude the room as effectively as if the wall were not glass, but paneled like its neighbor in Philippine mahogany. To complete the sense of isolation, a sliding door can be drawn to shut off the study from the living room. Similarly, the privacy of the master bedroom seems all the more guarded for the fenced and trellised terrace where the Kuzons can sun-bathe or breakfast on a fresh summer morning. Indoors, the lush carpet and engaging Victorian chairs of papier-mâché and mother-of-pearl augment the sense of sheltered luxury. The kitchen, too, seems remote from the world although its sliding glass doors are in effect the service entrance, and the terrace outside is accessible by a short flight of steps from the parking area. For more details of the kitchen, see page 190.

The terrace after hours

"And the best of all ways

ne of the best ways to steal time from the night (although it's not mentioned in Thomas Moore's song to "The Young May Moon") is to have the kind of terrace you'd like to come home to when the day's work is done. Then, even more than during weekend days, a hospitable terrace is a boon and a benison. Especially when it is set among fragrant and lovely flowers that also make a point of lengthening their days by stealing time from the night. So we have chosen twelve well-loved flowers that ask little more of you than a place to grow year after year. All remain open after the sun goes down. Most are sweetly fragrant. At least one gives you, fresh each day, blossoms as yellow as moonlight.

THE HAG TERRACE STORY If your terrace is to serve you adequately as an extra room, it must meet the standards of comfort and convenience by which you measure the rest of your house. The mere fact that the terrace is outdoors is not enough. Once it meets the basic test, however, it becomes the terrace's unique delight that its chief decorative effects are derived from plants and the landscape, that it is indeed roofed by trees, sun and clouds—or simply by the moon and the nighttime sky.

What are the roomlike qualities a good terrace should have? First, a terrace should be useful in a way directly related to the scope and manner of your living. To put it another way (as we did in February H&G), a terrace should share and enlarge the total function of the indoor space it particularly serves. Secondly, a roomlike terrace must be comfortable-not to the point of destroying its character as a terrace, but to the extent that it will be a physical pleasure to use-standing, sitting, or lying. Third, it must please your senses, preferably in ways that ordinary rooms could not do. You see a view, hear a rustle of leaves, feel the breeze on your cheek, smell flower fragrance. These, among other things described on these pages, are what we really mean by extra.

Convenience derives from a good terrace plan

A terrace must be easy to get to—always from the house area that it principally serves, preferably from several areas, both indoors and out. This is not done by doors alone; it is part of the whole business of planning and relating space usefully.

Here the very real accessibility of the terrace is quite apparent. The relationship of terrace to rooms is visibly direct. It is suggested more subtly by arbor-like structural members that seem to extend and connect parts of the actual house while in reality doing the opposite.


On a dining terrace, you dine. Access, furnishings, accessory equipment presumably relate to the interior dining room—as well as (either through the dining room or directly) to the kitchen. Terrace dining (which of course includes every kind of edible entertaining) should be more than sitting down at a weatherproof table on weatherproof chairs. Though in a sense this terrace is a mirror image of its indoor counterpart, its furnishings and its every decorative detail belong to the outdoors.

Flexibility of use can be actually built in

A little structural assistance goes a long way
in giving extra usefulness to
almost any terrace. Shelter, real or suggested;
definition of areas, by the outdoor
counterpart of screens or room dividers;
sheer ornament, which alone may
encourage greater terrace use—
all these factors play a part in making such
a terrace as this seem larger, more
inviting. The effectiveness of making
all construction compatible with the outdoors
is shown in this radiant shelter design.

Freedom from intrusion (call it privacy) is an important ingredient of many forms of relaxation—to which a good terrace is dedicated most of the time. Where terrace space, for whatever reason, is limited, and where the physical adjuncts of common privacy—such as walls, arbors, enclosures of all sorts—are properly employed, your terrace becomes not only an extra room but a uniquely private one. As this simple terrace shows, the suggestion of solitude and quiet contemplation can be even more convincing outdoors than in the house.

ince the day Nebuchadnezzar put outdoor living on the map (except for the Dark Ages, when most people didn't care whether they were indoors or out), the terrace has beguiled mankind as a lovely way to take the air sitting down. To that end, 1962's new leisure furniture offers a refreshing blend of comfort, outdoor fortitude and indoor stylishness. This is furniture for sitting pretty on any of an infinite variety of terraces. It is also, when it should be, as weather-wise as a poncho. Tables, chairs and lounges that must remain outdoors without benefit of shelter are fully equipped to do so—either by the nature of their materials or by weatherproofing finishes. There are, to boot, any number of element-defying cushions and pads that no longer need be hustled indoors at the first sign of rain—a blessing, if ever there was one, to terrace living.

In design, you will see trends that are definitely news-worthy. First, widespread and effective use of mesh in a variety of patterns both simple and intricate (tubular, ribbon-like, cane-like, lattice-like) as well as of materials (rattan, aluminum and other metals, vinyl and other plastics). The lacy look is created either with broad strokes or with delicacy. In both cases, the consequent airiness is very pleasing to look at, and the resilience is beneficent, certainly, to the spine.

Another trend: the romantic look, an indoor quality transported to the terrace. Baroque designs in the Spanish manner are executed in metal with great elegance. Filigrees, rosettes and ribboned tendrils give a wonderful lightness of touch to furniture that, at the same time, and under normal circumstances, is almost indestructible. Less elaborate, but equally graceful, are a few collections that reflect certain aspects of traditional French design—again in metal—while rattan and peel have been used with an imagination sparked sometimes by Far Eastern motifs, sometimes by a feeling for drama.

Even the old favorites are appearing in new interpretations. The officer's chair, familiar stand-by that it is, has a new air due to an interesting exploitation of materials—aluminum combined with wood and canvas in a smart, strong, gleaming amalgam. If you regret the passing of the porch swing, you will welcome its counterpart in hanging (and swinging) basket chairs that would amuse anyone with a yen for a garden trapeze.

Special consideration has also been given to furniture for sheltered spots. This is a rather special category planned for terraces more indoor than outdoor—glassed-in porches or rooms that, through decoration alone, masquerade as terraces. This furniture can approach luxury by way of lacquered finishes and silken coverings, yet it never quite gives up its claim to an affinity for the outdoors.

On the following pages you will find a representative assembly of this year's leisure furniture plus a miscellany of the materials for paving, windbreaks and fencing that collaborate with it to make terrace living summer's greatest joy.

New leisure furniture

for living out-of-doors in an indoor manner

lastic-coated rattan in two patterns of mesh is combined with enameled steel in furniture as weather-sound as science can make it. Permanently set up on a paved terrace walled in woven bamboo, it is oblivious to rain, stylish, pleasantly touched with whimsey: the hanging basket chair looks like a cross-section of a giant bird cage. In both table and chairs, practicality is blended with an interesting composite of design elements: stylized pedestal bases supporting rattan seats and chair backs woven with the delicacy of open canework. The mesh in the hanging chair, for the sake of support, is necessarily more robust. And on inclement days, nothing need be brought indoors except the foam rubber cushions covered in silk. 





LIQUEURS

Colorful, flavorful liqueurs are more than a cordial postscript to dinner. Of all types of liquor they seem the most versatile, adapting with ease to everything from cocktails to cooking. Now that virtually every liqueur is sold in half pints and miniatures as well as full-size bottles, it is no extravagance to keep a supply in both bar and kitchen, ready for you to devise a new drink or recipe according to the inspiration of the moment. Taste and test. You'll find that some liqueurs are perfect in mixed drinks, while others enhance iced tea and coffee. Cognac and vodka combine well with all liqueurs, and Scotch has a special affinity for Chartreuse. So, as a variation on the after-dinner drink, you might pass a tray of these spirits (the vodka well-chilled, of course) plus a selection of liqueurs, and let each guest be his own bartender. Or, if dessert is ice cream or sherbet, put an assortment of liqueurs on the table for each to pick his pet flavoring. (Sleight of hand with liqueurs lifts a simple dessert into the gourmet class, as you can see in the examples above and right spotted in three of New York's best restaurants.)

In the kitchen, try out new tricks with liqueurs. Baste pork with an orange liqueur or crêpes with a raspberry liqueur. Let cordials mingle with the mixtures for soufflés, sauces, puddings or homemade ice cream, or pour them over fresh or poached fruits. Blend liqueurs of complementary flavors, such as crème de menthe and crème de cacao, for ice cream sauce, or spike fudge sauce with crème de menthe.

What liqueurs should the well-stocked kitchen and bar shelf hold? Certainly one or more of the classic herb-flavored elixirs, such as Bénédictine or Chartreuse; definitely an orange liqueur, and a few others with fruit flavors; plus two or more from the mint, coffee, cocoa, anis and spice categories. The chart, opposite page, indicates which liqueurs belong in which categories and suggests ways they can be used in drinks and foods. Don't be afraid to be adventurous—after all, that is how some of the world's greatest inventions with liqueurs came into being.

Remodeling is in the air

■ The ring of the hammer and the rasp of the saw reverberate across the land as porches are being stripped away (or added on), as carports are being built (or enclosed), as partitioning walls are going up (or coming down). Today, as never before, American families are practicing the fascinating arithmetic of remodeling—subtracting from their houses that which is inconvenient, ungainly or distressing, and adding that which is efficient, handsome or delightful.

If remodeling took the courage that legend once suggested it took, today's homeowners would be a lion-hearted breed. For it appears that nearly six billion dollars will be spent this year on home improvements. For what will this stunning sum be spent?

Essentially, for a better way of living. The dollars invested in remodeling can be tracked down and accounted for by purchases of new wall paneling, kitchen appliances, combination storm windows and a host of other building materials and household equipment. But the motives for remodeling are more personal—and much more interesting.

Many families remodel, for example, in order to stay exactly where they are. They may have outgrown their house but cannot bear the thought of leaving their neighborhood where the schools are good and the shopping convenient, or where the streets are tree-shaded and the neighbors companionable. So they add a bedroom wing or finish the attic—and stay happily put.

Others remodel not because they lack space, but because they have the wrong kind. The bedroom for a son who has gone

off with the Peace Corps is no longer needed, but a music-TV room is. So the idle bedroom's walls are paneled and the closet is converted into a storage wall for records, books and hi-fi.

Some families remodel because they own a 1925 house and

can no longer tolerate its vintage earmarks or its pointless side porch. So they administer an architectural face-lifting and, while they are at it, quite possibly add a window wall and a flagstone terrace.

There are families almost beyond count who remodel because they suddenly discover they are quite different people than they were a few years ago. Old enthusiasms have waned and new ones demand house room. So the family room is decommissioned ("we don't look at television so much these days") and the space thus gained is transformed into a home workshop or a sewing center.

the motives the moves the pay-off

Fortunately, the homeowner can now approach remodeling with a degree of confidence that once might have been misplaced. There has been an ever-growing array of building materials and household equipment designed to make home improvement projects economical and almost pleasurable. It is the homeowner's happy plight today that he must choose his remodeling materials from a vast range of products that come in a limitless variety of colors, textures and patterns. Whether do-it-yourself inspired the new materials explosion, or vice versa, is a moot question. But it is undeniable that products of all description have been so well engineered that normally coordinated amateurs who possess the powers to follow directions can install them. Wall panels clip on, ceiling tiles snap on, and floor coverings stay stuck.

Do you hire an architect to remodel? You will want to, certainly, if you are contemplating the stem-to-stern modernizing of a whole house, or if you have it in mind to add a wing that works well and looks well. There are times, too, when it pays to consult an architect on lesser remodeling projects—say, a new fireplace wall or an attic bedroom-bath. He can either reassure you on the soundness of your ideas or suggest improvements in your plans. (Most architects in residential design work are available for consultation on an hourly fee basis; in fact, the American Institute of Architects encourages such consulting.)

More and more homeowners, however, are placing their remodeling problems in the hands of a remarkable new institution—the one-stop remodeling center. The inevitable arrival of this service leads one only to wonder why it hasn't happened sooner. Not all communities have one-stop remodeling centers as yet, and not all such centers deserve the homeowner's patronage. But at its best, this new service can alleviate most of the anxieties of remodeling and also curb the unexpected runaway costs that once typified the home improvement experience.

At the most progressive one-stop centers the homeowner can shop for the kind of remodeling he wishes, just as a housewife shops for Sunday dinner at the super market. A complete range of building wares is on display, and at some centers a complete room will be built, mock-up fashion, to give you a



literal idea of how your remodeled kitchen or bathroom will look in its transformed state. Although these same centers may provide architectural planning services, it is well to realize that the new remodeling industry is roughly analogous to the home-building industry, insofar as it is a high-volume business that simply cannot afford to provide highly individual design solutions for every customer. But many remodeling firms are prepared to work with outside architects; their primary business is structural work, not design, and they complement the architect by supplying the materials and the labor force to carry out a successful project.

Wherever a family of would-be remodelers seeks guidance, they would be well advised to undertake any major project with wide-open eyes and a clear idea of what they expect to gain. For despite the myriad motives for remodeling, there are but a few ways in which home improvements can be made to pay off:

Remodeling can pay off in purely human and social terms if it enables you to remain in the house and the neighborhood you've grown to love.

Remodeling can pay off in a house you have bought for that express purpose if you get more for your total investment after the necessary improvements are made than you could possibly expect from a comparably priced new house.

Remodeling generally can pay off as a financial investment if the project improves the living quality or character of your house. Stated in simplest terms, the dollar value of a house can be increased if the remodeling either corrects flaws or provides new advantages that prospective buyers can readily appreciate.

On the following pages, you will find five remodeling case histories that illustrate the broad scope of home improvement possibilities today. The "after" in each case is a far better house than the "before" was. But even more important, the families in each house enjoy a much more satisfying environment for living "after" than they did "before."

The case histories




In the case of the derelict brick-front



ost people in the market for a city house would have by-passed this old brick-front in Boston's Back Bay. Unprepossessing on the outside, it seemed almost beyond salvaging inside. But to the retired businessman who bought it, the old place seemed to offer a golden opportunity, after years of apartment living, to enjoy the space and freedom of a house without leaving the heart of town. His first thought was to restore the structure, which was built in 1845, to its original state. This proved unworkable, so he turned to architects Krokyn & Krokyn, who had successfully remodeled many other town houses, and gave them carte blanche to make any changes they saw fit.

Though its outer walls were sound, the house was anything but habitable. Its first floor sagged dangerously, the ground floor and basement were filled with rubble. The windows at front and back were too small to compensate for the windowless side walls. But by stretching and joining windows at the back of the house and completely remaking the interior, the architects turned the cramped little row house into a place of space, airiness and light.

The front of the house, unchanged above the street floor, remains in character with its neighbors even though the architects designed a new entrance. They recessed the front wall of the street floor, using part of the space in front (Continued on page 127)

The new two-story windows at the back of the house, opposite page, bathe the conversation area with light from the garden, since ceiling stops 5 feet short of back wall. The new fireplace, with its country-kitchen look, was cut into an existing chimney, and the wall around the chimney covered with bricks. A broad slate-topped ledge built around the base includes a compartment that tidily stores firewood.


At the other end of the room, right, a series of high slender windows facing the entrance court illuminate the dining area where ceiling stops 4 feet short of wall. Door under stairs leads to powder room and storage room a few steps below.


of it to form a sheltered porch and enclosing the rest to create a vestibule. At the back of the house, nothing was changed but the windows: those on the two lower floors were joined to make two-story windows that flood the living areas with light.

After tearing out all the interior walls and the whole first floor, the architects' first step inside was to excavate a new ground floor, $5\frac{1}{2}$ feet below street level but flush with the garden at the back. This new level (white area of section, left) paved in brick and dominated by a new brick fireplace, became the dining-kitchen-informal-living area of the house. The stairs from the entrance landing bring you down to the dining end. At the other end of the room, newly brightened by the tall rear windows, is the living area and, adjoining it, a galley kitchen (see plan). To make this below-street-level room light and airy, the architects devised a bold treatment for the



floor above. Instead of a full floor, they built a mezzanine platform which stops 5 feet short of the back wall of the house, and 4 feet short of the front wall. As a result, the corresponding areas at each end of the garden floor are two stories high. (Continued)





To build the mezzanine (tinted area of section, left) the architects installed steel beams in the ceiling above and hung the new floor from the beams by means of steel rods. This platform-like floor, spanning the house from side to side but free of the front and back walls, creates a new airy space within the tight confines of the row house—and gives the floor below the extra advantage of light from the new front and back windows. The mezzanine is the more formal area of the house where guests gather for conversation before they go down the stairs for dinner, or listen to music while viewing the latest additions to their host's art collection.



The mezzanine living room, bounded on two sides by delicate mahogany railings, is like an airy platform in space. It is suffused with light from the tall strip windows at the front of the house, above, and the two-story windows on the garden side, opposite page, which are veiled in striped linen. Jogs in the original side wall form a natural frame for a brilliant red and yellow abstraction, and the new rounded hearth, cut into the old chimney, has a sculptural effect in the simple, clean-lined room.

The steel beams from which the mezzanine is hung also brace the floor above it, and form a base for posts that were added as extra supports for the third floor. But although the architects preserved these two upper floors, they completely revamped the division of space. The second floor was made into a master bedroomstudy with a large dressing room, and the third floor into a painting studio and extra bedroom. New bathrooms were built on both floors.

From basement to roof, new jackknife stairs with broad open treads take the place of the old straight, steep stairs, doing away with need for halls and freeing more space for living.

To make the two-story windows at the back of the house and reap the benefits of the southern exposure, the architects knocked out the bricks between the old first floor windows and those below them. Long fixed panes were installed in the openings with hoppers above and below to admit air. In the lower half of one window is a door that gives the ground floor immediate access to the garden.

very town has its complement of circa 1900 houses like this one in New Orleans. Its owners, Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Andrus, would have been the first to admit the old house lacked style, but rather than move from a neighborhood they loved and a house that had been home to them for most of their married lives, they bided their time until they could remodel. When they were ready, they called in architect Myrlin McCullar, whose traditional houses they had often admired. With simple structural changes, he endowed the nondescript old house with new grace and symmetry.

His first step was to strip away the useless front porch and roof dormer, to prepare the way for recomposing the elements of the façade. He did away with the narrow and poorly placed front door, and cut a new wide entrance that lines up with the window above. Next he added a whole new clapboard wall to cover the shallow recess around the old front door and eliminate the funny square window downstairs and two unimportant ones upstairs. With the house front pared to essentials, McCullar added the architectural details that give it stateliness and elegance. The new double doors, recessed and framed with deep reveals, are crowned with a classic frieze that a local craftsman carved to the architect's design. New moldings accent the windows, and the downstairs window, with new smaller panes, is visually enlarged with paneled shutters. Pilasters at the corners of the house contribute important vertical elements, and act as a frame for the whole composition.

The Andruses also wanted a new room at the back of the house, where they could entertain visiting grandchildren. To see the spacious wing they added (indicated by large tinted area on plan), please turn to page 188.



The new look, opposite page, was achieved by reducing the jumbled array of doors and windows to four strong and symmetrical elements graced with Georgian details. The new window moldings, shutters, pilasters and door frame were painted white, the house wall light gray. New double front doors in slate gray match flagstone steps.

New hall closets, below, make good use of the space that was gained when the former entrance recess (small tinted area in plan) was filled out by new clapboard wall that covers house front.





pace as such was no problem for the family who owns this generous colonial house in Mount Kisco, N.Y. With their six children they had lived comfortably for years within its ample and dignified walls, and they loved the stately formality of its rooms. But attracted by the freedom of contemporary design, the family wanted to be able to enjoy the informal style of living it offered without sacrificing the pleasure they derived from the old house. The new wing that architect George Nemeny designed gives them the new kind of living they wanted, and at the same time enlarges the scope of the rooms in the old house. What is more, the family can now enjoy from indoors the vista of rolling woodland that the hilltop house commands.

To make way for the new wing, architect Nemeny stripped away the old porch at the back of the house. In its place he built a sparkling rectangle of glass, as handsome in its proportions and (Continued on next page)


Though contemporary in design, the new glass-walled wing is in perfect harmony with the house. The charcoal-stained framework matches the tone of the house roof, and the flat roof of the wing, like that of the old porch, serves as a deck for the library and master bedroom. But here the resemblance ends—for insulated glass walls, radiant-heating in the floor and an air-conditioning system all create a new indoor environment that can be enjoyed year-round. A small pavilion at one end shields the glass there from the midday sun, and double doors on all three sides open the wing to the outdoors. Later, surrounding ground will be leveled and payed

The lion's share of space in the new marble-floored wing was allotted to the living area. There is a game table at one end and a music system built into the cane-front buffet. But such things as TV and books were deliberately excluded, for this is a gregarious room. Its main purpose is to provide a place where people can gather informally to talk, to dance, or simply to enjoy the magnificent view. The furnishings, many of them designed by the architect, bring the colors of sky and greenery indoors.


materials as the old house itself. The new wing is an independent structure, supported by eight oak posts set on a concrete slab—but the new life it offers is completely intertwined with the life of the rest of the house. A teak divider, 6 feet deep, bisects the 20-by-50-foot interior into a large living area and a smaller dining area which are joined to their more formal counterparts by the original French doors that once led from the old porch to the house. A new sliding glass door opens the central hall to the wing, taking the place of an old fanlight-topped door.

Within the sleek walls of the teak divider are a host of practicalities that serve the entire ground floor. The box-like structure contains a coat closet and a powder room, which the ground floor had formerly lacked, as well as a compartment for the new wing's air conditioning unit. At the end of the divider facing the window wall is a handsome serving bar hidden behind folding teak doors.





The original French doors join the new living area with the formal drawing room in the main part of the house. New panels over the doors extend them to ceiling height so that they are now related visually to the rest of the room.





Folding doors at one end of the teak divider open to reveal a bar topped in antique verde marble. Shelves for glassware are backed by opaque white glass.


The new informal dining area is a cool and airy adjunct to the stately main dining room beyond the French doors. Recessed lights like those above all the key areas of the wing bring out the richness of two shades of teak: the dark oiled paneling of the divider and the lighter waxed teak of the buffet. But furniture is simple enough not to distract from the view through the glass walls that form the other two sides of the room, right,







This built-for-sale house had plenty of space but in the wrong places




They remodeled by dividing

Space is certainly an enviable commodity, but there is such a thing as having too much in the wrong places. Witness the enormous living rooms in some of today's new houses and apartments, rooms that are not only difficult to furnish but that fail to offer the sense of containment that is often as important to the human spirit as unrestricted space. This was the problem that faced Mr. and Mrs. Jack Litwack in their new house in Great Neck, L. I. The Litwacks, with three children growing up, had needed larger quarters, and this new soundly constructed built-for-sale house near their old neighborhood, met all their requirements. But the living room—48 feet long and less than 15 feet wide, with a 24-foot ell that started at the front door—was about as livable as a barn. Three bow windows complicated the problem of furnishing, and the location of the kitchen door demanded that the dining area be right in the center of the living room—a location scarcely conducive to smooth entertaining.

To redesign this awkward space, the Litwacks called in architect George Nemeny. By building up rather than tearing down, he simply reshaped the space to form three distinct rooms. He started with the dining area, since its central location was unavoidable, and used as its natural boundaries the sides of the bay window in the long wall. On one side of the bay he built a pair of storage walls that bisected the long arm of the L-shaped room, creating a completely separate study at the end. The other side of the bay marked the logical beginning of the living room wall. By lining it with bookshelves and cupboards, the architect defined the living room character of the ell. A new partition with sliding doors closes the opposite end of the ell from the entrance hall. In each room, curtains square off bow windows, completing contemporary look of the new spaces and forming backdrops against which furniture can be placed.







A new stone fireplace in the study, above left, replaces a squat brick one and gives height to the room. In one of the walnut-paneled storage walls that separate the study and dining room is a bar that opens to both rooms. Other storage wall (see plan) houses TV and music for study.

In the dining room, above, the new pegged oak floor has more than practicality in its favor. For the bare floor helps set this area apart from the carpeted rooms around it and makes the dining area seem more spacious than it really is. Sheer curtains contribute an airy look, whereas in the study, dark opaque curtains across the bow window create a cozy mood.

A whole wall of bookshelves visually establish the limits of the living room. The walnut shelves, with cupboards underneath, give the room a dominant architectural element it needed, and recessed ceiling lights, like those in all three rooms, bring out full importance of the new wall.



At the other end of the living room a new partition with sliding double doors provides privacy from the front door. With the partition, the house gained a separate entrance hall, paved with white vinyl tiles.



In the face of teen-age demand

They turned the carport into a playroom



Some houses never stop growing. Families expand and change and even the best houses have to change with them to keep pace with new demands. H&G's first Hallmark House is a case in point. In the five years since Los Angeles designer Cliff May built this comfortable, friendly house for his family, the Mays' three children reached their teens, and it became clear that the house needed one more room, where the young people could dance and play music and games without disturbing their parents.

The likeliest location for the new room was the carport at the front of the house, since it was already part of the basic structure and needed only to be enclosed. The carport had the additional merit of adjoining a guest room, which the Mays made a part of the new teen-age haven.

With board and batten walls to match the house exterior, Mr. May enclosed about two-thirds of the three-car shelter, leaving space at the end for one car. He built a door in the new front wall, so the room has its own entrance from the street. Then, by knocking out the wall between the former guest room and carport, he added a comfortable living area with a fireplace to the general recreation space salvaged from the former carport.

The Mays' next addition to their growing house will be a big structure alongside the carport, to house not only the dispossessed cars but a workshop and the family's new boat.

The new recreation room, opposite page, has everything to delight teenagers, from a piano and organ to a juke box and pool table. There is even a movie projector housed in a booth at the far end of the room. New oak squares laid over the carport's concrete slab make a sturdy dance floor. Center post marks place where the house wall once ended.

Banks of folding shutters replace the wall that was knocked out to join the former guest room to the new recreation room. Dropped bamboo ceiling sets off the quiet conversation end from the recreation area.




n January 1961 H&G forecast a revolution in storage precipitated by the ever-pressing problem of housing ever-increasing possessions. We proposed a solution—the Family Warehouse-which was based on a concept developed in collaboration with architect-designers George Nelson and Gordon Chadwick. Now we are delighted to announce that our proposal is a concrete reality. Making use of a new ready-made storage unit on wheels, H&G's Building Editor Spalding Waggener has designed a Family Warehouse in an average 12-by-14-foot room. The storage units, made by Crown Wire Manufacturing Corp., were originally designed for commercial establishments like stores or restaurants where every inch of space must pay its way. Lined up along one wall of H&G's Family Warehouse, seven of these units provide a total of 150 lineal feet of shelf space for storing everything from Christmas ornaments to champagne glasses. On another wall of the room are fixed shelves for overflow books and extralong shelves for rolled-up rugs and blankets. Along a third wall is a 10-foot pole for hanging out-of-season clothes and curtains and, next to that, a desk and wrapping center. You could adapt this plan to any comparable space in your basement, attic or anywhere in or adjacent to your house. (Such a room needs no windows.) And on page 142 you will see how the rolling storage units alone can increase the storage capacity of any space you may happen to have.

H&G COLORS IDENTIFY THE CONTENTS of the rolling storage. Hardboard panels, each painted a different hue (see key below), are wired to the end of the chrome-finished steel wire frames, thus concealing from immediate view the assorted shapes on the shelves and presenting a smooth bright front to the room. Three-inch spaces between the panels eliminate the need for handles. Each rolling unit is 4 feet long, 1½ feet wide and 7 feet tall, and there is enough free floor space to roll it out separately so that you can get at all the shelves from both sides. You can reach the bookshelves in the corner of the room by wheeling out the Empire Green unit. The Mastic Tile floor is appropriately dent-resistant.










How H&G's Family Warehouse works



A third of the space in H&G's Family Warehouse is occupied by roll-out storage, the rest by permanent shelves.




THE BASIC COMPONENT




How to adapt the warehouse to smaller space

ADD STORAGE UNITS TO A BEDROOM CLOSET



If you do not have a whole room to devote to storage, you could turn an extra clothes closet into an abbreviated version of a warehouse with the addition of roll-out units in a smaller size. In this small bedroom closet, two units 1 foot wide, 2 feet long and 6 feet tall provide a total of 40 lineal feet of shelf space. One unit might hold out-of-season shoes, hats, boots and gloves; the other, store hard-to-find-a-place-for household extras such as party glassware, holiday decorations.







CLOTHING AND CURTAIN STORAGE ADJOINS WRAPPING DESK


Out-of-season clothing is stored in quilted plastic zippered bags by Enrich hung from a 10-foot pole fixed 7 feet off the floor. There is room below the bags for a series of matching four-drawer chests for sweaters, mufflers, sandals, swim suits and the like. Curtains are hung from the same pole on special brass hangers (see page 181). The wrapping desk is a handy center where all materials for wrapping gifts or packages to mailpaper, tape, string and empty boxescan be kept neatly organized. The desk is 34-inch plywood covered in laminated plastic in H&G's Citron. The file cabinet beneath it and the shelves and cupboard above are painted Bristol Blue. On the top shelf, transparent boxes keep gift-wrapping accessories available and dust free. A short curtain rod fitted in above desk holds spools of ribbon (see page 181).

How H&G centerpieces bloom the year round

Flickering candles and garlands of evergreens were the festive allies of H&G's

Centerpiece collection when we introduced it last Christmas. (See H&G

December 1961, pages 134-137.) But with different companions this same series
of components that embellished our holiday tables—the crystal trees, tôle urns
piled with crystal flowers, crystal artichokes and airy wire stands—

can be used as enchantingly for party table settings the year around. In
place of Christmas-y materials like princess pine and red roses, you can use
flowers of the season, leafy plants or vividly colored fruits and vegetables
to compose centerpieces as fresh as a spring breeze. Many of the components obligingly turn themselves into vases for flowers or bases for
pyramids of fruit. You can even change the color of the tôle urns
and the wire stands, if you like, by spraying them with paint. At
Christmas-time you saw the centerpieces a-glimmer with light for
evening parties. Here they are gracing a variety of luncheon tables, to
prove their any-hour, any-occasion, any-season versatility.

Build a pyramid of lemons

Lemons or limes in place of the vigil lights on the green glass tree make a pert centerpiece for a spring luncheon. Pile up lemons on metal candleholders and anchor fruits at top to stem of tree with toothpicks. For a summer evening party on a terrace: Surround the fruit-laden tree with the vigil lights alternated with tiny white posies.

Fashion small bouquets

Fresh flowers give the tôle urns, opposite page, bottom left, a charming new character. Lift out pyramid of crystal flowers that comes with each urn and substitute bouquets of fresh iris, daffodils, hyacinths or what you will. Since urns are not completely waterproof, use well-soaked Oasis instead of water to keep blossoms fresh. For another party, urns might support tiny plants. On table: Franconia "Rhythm Classic" china; Pasco "Bruxelles" crystal by Riedel of Austria; Alvin "Pirouette" sterling silver.

Pile up painted eggs

A bevy of painted wooden eggs, opposite page, top, adds a harlequin jolt of color to a pale tablecloth. To assemble: Remove candle cups from wire stands and refill with assorted eggs (ours hail from Poland, Mexico and Scandinavia). In the center of the large tiered stand we placed a pot of Boston ferns. Another idea: Retain the candle cups and fill them with miniature bouquets of vivid flowers—plus water, of course. Franconia "Virginia" china; Pasco "Exquisite" crystal by Riedel of Austria.

Fill artichokes with feathery flowers

Clumps of blue lace-flowers, opposite page, bottom right, bring the crystal artichokes to full bloom. Stand bouquets in water in candle-cup inserts. Other good flower choices: bachelors' buttons, blue Roman hyacinths. For an evening party, alternate blooming and candle-lit artichokes. Franconia "Elegance" china; Pasco "Bruxelles" crystal by Riedel of Austria; Alvin "Bridal Bouquet" sterling.

Any number can cook in kitchens that welcome guest chefs

The old saw about too many cooks spoiling the broth is apt to lose its cogency in a kitchen specifically planned to accommodate more than one performer. Almost everyone fancies himself a cook today, and almost every hostess can count up a number of friends who itch to show off their talents at the drop of a fork. But you can welcome these virtuosos into your kitchen with impunity and make their performances part of the party if your ménage is properly geared for them. The cooking party also offers hospitable bonuses: you can be with your guests from the moment they come through the front door until they say good night, and you can afford to include on your menu special delicacies that can only be whipped up with a flourish at the last minute.

Such a party, of course, may not appeal to every hostess-cook—specifically, the loner who squirms at the thought of guests setting foot in her kitchen under any circumstance. But even her viewpoint might change with an alteration of her kitchen plan.

A cooking party does not necessarily call for a king-size kitchen. Even a tiny one can be stretched to make room for one or two guest cooks, and what you gain in space and efficiency will be just as much of a boon when you are cooking by yourself as when you have collaborators. Both the plan of your room and its equipment will depend, obviously, on the kind of parties you like to give and the kind of food you like. A warming oven, for instance, might be essential for gala dinners of many courses to be prepared by as many cooks. On the other hand, for a kitchen short on space, you would want the most space-saving equipment you can find and as much storage as possible so you can whisk clutter out of the way and keep all the counter space free for work. Above all, a cooking-party kitchen should be inviting. Warm woods, rosy bricks and glowing colors all help to create a party mood and entice your guests to come in and turn to. On the following pages are three kitchens for guest cooks. All were planned for people who really enjoy good food and the cooking of it, though their tastes range from hamburgers to crêpes suzettes and their ages from ten years to fifty.


•Cooking can be part of the party at a black-tie dinner without sacrificing any of the evening's formality. All you need to preserve an aura of calm elegance for dining is a well-organized work schedule for your guest cooks plus a little imaginative sleight of hand. A master at this kind of planning is designer Harry Rogers who gives a formal dinner party almost every weekend in his remodeled barn in Weston, Conn. Invariably, some of the guests are invited specifically because they like to cook as much as he does. Only cooks are allowed into the kitchen and each takes over the preparation of a different dish.

The kitchen itself is arranged so that four can work smoothly together without getting in each other's way. Wide ash-topped work counters on all sides of the room alternate with maple blocks for chopping foods or rolling pastry. A double sink on one side of the room is augmented by another sink on the opposite wall which is fitted with a basket that swings out from under the counter to catch vegetable peelings. The gleaming stainless steel equipment—a six-burner restaurant stove with a capacious oven, an overhead broiler and an outsize refrigerator—is admirably suited to cooking with ease even in dinner clothes. (Ice for drinks is supplied by a small refrigerator in the dining room bar.) In addition to all this efficiency, the color scheme—barn red and green with crisp white trim—is well designed to keep everyone in a party spirit. (Continued on the next page)

ANY NUMBER CAN COOK



Well-separated work centers give Mr. Rogers and three guests room to prepare three courses simultaneously.



While guest cooks are at work in Mr. Rogers' kitchen, the rest of the party gathers for cocktails in the adjoining dining area (see plan). From there they can talk to the cooks across the low buffet-divider where the hors d'œuvres are set out. But if the culinary artists prefer seclusion, they can shut off the dining area with one of two folding doors. One pulls across on the dining side of the buffet, below left, so the kitchen team can clear away the hors d'œuvres and set the buffet for dinner unobserved. The other door pulls across the kitchen side of the refrigerator, opposite page, to screen the cooking center from view while the guests are eating.

On the evening H&G dropped in to watch one of Mr. Rogers' dinner parties in action, there were seven guests—three of them happily performing as cooks with Mr. Rogers as head chef. The menu: coquilles St. Jacques, filet de bœuf en croûte, pommes duchesse and steamed zucchini, with pears in red wine for dessert. The order of assembly was serenely simple: Before the guests arrived, the host had prepared the dessert and made the coquilles ready for browning. An hour before dinner, two of the guests fixed the vegetables and twenty minutes later, the meat was put in the oven to roast. Fifteen minutes before dinner, a third guest wrapped the meat in its pastry crust and returned it to the oven. At the last minute, the coquilles were slipped under the broiler. When everything was ready, the folding door was pulled across on the kitchen side of the buffet. Lights were dimmed in the dining area, the candles lit and dinner served with all the tranquil elegance of a former age that relied on droves of kitchen maids and butlers to work the mood magic.



• The combination of country air and children is likely to make demands on a kitchen that few can meet on all counts. But this one rises to the challenge superbly. It is a wonderfully spacious room sheathed in stained ponderosa pine and brightly illuminated from overhead by a skylight running the length of the raftered ceiling. The children of the house and their friends are welcome there after outdoor games and are free to broil their own hamburgers or fix sundaes with the special equipment at one end of the room.


Careful planning went into arranging this kitchen so the children's cooking parties would not interfere with the well-ordered workings of the rest of the room. A long maple-topped buffet cabinet divides the space into two unequal areas. In the smaller is the main cooking center well-equipped for the family with lots of guests. There are two built-in ovens, a four-burner cooking top recessed in the brick wall, and a large built-in refrigerator. On the other side of the buffet is a dining area and at the end of the room, an open barbecue and a soda fountain where the children can gather and entertain their friends without disturbing the kitchen proper.

Since informal entertaining is the forte of the kitchen, this second cooking center also comes into its own during adult parties and also preparations for family meals. One guest can broil steaks or shish-kebabs in the barbecue, while another fixes vegetables at the other end of the room.




A whole wall of closets for china, glass and serving accessories lines one side of the kitchen. Most of the time the closet doors are closed and the kitchen has the appearance of a living room. But when they are opened, the closets present pretty interiors, each lined in a different hue—soft orange, green, gold and brown. Silver and table linens are stored in the buffet-divider.

Before an adult dinner party, a long, removable back board is added to the buffet to hide the cooking surfaces from view. Food is set out on the buffet counter and the hostess serves from there.



3 A tiny kitchen copes with a parade of guests cooking in tandem






Mr. and Mrs. McCobb help their host wrap the terrine with greaseproof paper before putting it in the oven to bake.

Confusion is also averted by the plan of the kitchen itself. The Tobeys limited their equipment to essentials—a four-burner cooking unit, a built-in oven, a refrigerator-freezer—and chose the most compact models that would meet their needs. But they installed as many storage cabinets as possible so they could keep appliances and other paraphernalia from cluttering the limited work surfaces. Since the kitchen is open on two sides (see opposite page), the two counters—one of laminated plastic, one a maple chopping block—are equally accessible from both outside and inside the kitchen, so two cooks can use them at the same time without getting in each other's way.

A typical Tobey dinner party, below left, includes Mr. and Mrs. Paul McCobb, Mrs. Tom Yee and Evan Frankel, all taking part as guest cooks. On this particular evening, the Tobeys were responsible for the pièce de résistance, a terrine of duck. They prepared that first and put it in the oven to bake while the McCobbs fixed a tomato salad and a hot potato salad. Then Mrs. Yee took over the kitchen and made a Chinese shrimp dish that was served with cocktails in the living room. When the terrine was ready, everyone moved to the dining area and dinner began. Finally, the last course, crêpes flambée, was prepared with a flourish in a chafing dish right at the dining table.



Crêpes are flambéed at the table so everyone can remain seated, enjoy the drama and the conversation.



Cabinets in two finishes—mustard yellow and walnut—make a sunny color scheme that seems to increase the size of the kitchen and also blends well with the adjoining living and dining areas. Pole-hung shelves separate the dining and the living areas but preserve an open look.

Sprays of colored candles stuck into ceramic quail and garnished with flowers make a festive centerpiece for dinner.

Other components of table setting: Spode "Heritage" china; Fostoria "Vogue Gold" goblet; Lunt "Raindrop" silver; place mats and Belgian linen napkins from H. G. Stotter & Co.




New decorative feats by the fabric that won't give up

familiar fabric that has earned well-deserved kudos on practical counts—Fiberglas—is now piling up a score for its decorative accomplishments. A fast-growing variety of colors, weaves and textures has made Fiberglas as happy a choice for use at home as it has long been for public buildings. Now you can get patterns in all scales and schools of design to complement the fabric's extraordinary practical virtues. Fiberglas, for instance, cannot burn, shrink or stretch. Sun cannot rot it. Heat—the sun's and the radiator's will neither damage nor dis-

color it. In fact, solid-color Fiberglas is now guaranteed against sun-fading for two years. Mildew is quite unknown to Fiberglas and insects shun it. The fabric behaves well on several other counts, too. It is wrinkle-proof. A close weave gives you extra insulation at the windows. Yet an open weave will not stultify air conditioners, for the air blows right through it without causing wild billowing. And Fiberglas curtains are simple to wash. Since soil and dirt cannot penetrate the fibers, the curtains need only be doused in suds—soap or detergent—rinsed well and rehung while slightly damp. No ironing is called for—not even touching up. (They must be washed by hand, however, never in a washer, and never dry-cleaned. Hence, it might be smart to use single-panel widths in multiple rather than extra-wide panels.) And



today you can buy Fiberglas by the yard, as well as in ready-made curtains. You need not fear that it is hard to sew. All it requires is a sharp needle, a longer stitch, and, on the sewing machine, a looser tension.





Today, you can get Fiberglas in a vast array of weaves and textures. For instance:

1. An open mesh of slightly nubbly thread woven to create a plaid-like pattern.

2. Alternating blocks of mesh and solid weave for half-and-half translucency. 3. A fine marquisette weave with delicate floral sprigs of flocking. 4. Broad and narrow stripes, some solidly woven, some of open mesh. 5. A Jacquard-woven damask pattern in the Florentine manner. 



I love home wedding receptions. They have a joyous intimacy that you somehow never feel at a hotel or club reception, no matter how festive. Our neighbors' daughter was just married and we were all invited to the house for a reception after the church service.

An entrance canopy had been put up, and an accordion trio stationed at the door serenaded the arriving wedding party and guests and set a happy mood. The wedding party received in the furniture-free living room against a most unusual and effective background-an orchard of little orange trees about 4 feet tall and in fragrant bloom, rented from a local greenhouse. There were more tubs of trees throughout the house -acacia covered with mists of bubbly yellow flowers in the hall, lemon trees bearing glossy green fruit in the four corners of the dining room. They created a charming verdant atmosphere, yet they didn't clutter up the house or get in the way of the guests moving from room to room-altogether, they were a refreshing switch from the usual smilax screens and swags.

A good friend told me about a soup that's surprisingly superior, either hot or cold. The basic recipe for four is: Mix one can cream of chicken soup with one can bouillon. Heat and add a small can of applesauce and a heaping teaspoon of curry powder. If served cold, it should still be heated first for the better blending of flavors. My friend says stir it by hand, using no blender, or the texture is lost.

We are not a one-condiment family. (What family is?) Don likes nothing but A.I. I like English mustard. The children vary catsup with chili sauce. The new solution at our house is "Saucy Susan," a sensible offspring of a lazy susan and a caster. Of polished walnut, with counter-sunk well for jars and bottles, it revolves at the flick of a wrist to offer whatsoever is needed. We like ours not only for Saturday hamburger lunches, but also for our always-in-business teen-ager snack bar.

Saucy Susan-handy, spill proof



Not long ago I went into a huddle with my butcher and together we worked out some new ways to turn standard meat cuts into party specials. One suggestion he came up with was that he remove the usually rather stringy top layer on a standing rib roast, grind it up for future hamburger, and then tie back the fat on the best part, the eye of the roast. That would give us a better roast and superior ground meat, too. I suggested he might slice a tinned ham very thinly on his machine and tie it back into shape again. Then I could bake it with a gingery, syrupy sauce, place it on a platter, snip the string and serve it all beautifully fanned out in slices. Along these same lines he might quarter dinner-party ducks so that I could cook only the plump leg and joint portions (the rest to go into our freezer) that would be just the right size for individual servings. Or, a leg of lamb might be pre-cut into thick steaks, which could be marinated in mint sauce and garlic and charcoal-broiled.

Crowded pantry or not, I must admit I covet a magnificent Herend tureen I saw at Black, Starr & Gorham, Inc., in New York. It's in the bird and fruit pattern Baron Rothschild originally commissioned in 1850 for his own private use, but which is now in the public domain. The lemon knob on the cover, the baroque shape, the beautifully rendered birds make it a superlative piece to grace a dinner table or a sideboard.





oday the expression "add a dash of seasoning" means more than salt and pepper, more even than the wide and wonderful range of herbs and spices. The new seasonings to be found in increasing numbers on every super market or specialty food shop shelf are infinitely more complex. They range from monosodium glutamate (flavorless white crystals with the strange power to bring out the true taste of foods) to sauces that are subtle blends of vinegar, onions, garlic, sugar, soy, tomatoes, anchovies, chili peppers and even more exotic ingredients. What qualifies as a seasoning? Generally speaking, anything that can be added to food to improve or intensify the flavor and make it tastier and more appetizing. Bitters and sauces, pickles and vinegars, extracts and seasoning powders all come under this heading. Many are familiar to us in certain well-defined ways. Angostura bitters is inevitably associated with an old-fashioned, Tabasco with seafood cocktails, soy sauce with Chinese food. Yet these versatile compounds can do far, far more than is indicated on their labels. Already at full strength, they do not necessarily have to be cooked to bring out their character. Some seasoning salts are delicious sprinkled on raw vegetables or in cottage cheese dips for cocktails, while sauces and pickles can, of course, be served straight from the jar.

Another virtue of these seasonings: they can speedily ginger up a bland or quick-cooking dish or underseasoned frozen foods—a dash of Tabasco in orange sauce for game, a couple of teaspoons of beef stock base in the cooking water for fresh or frozen vegetables, a judicious fillip of Worcestershire in a prepared rarebit or beef hash, a brush of Kitchen Bouquet or soy sauce on broiled meats and poultry. If you want a barbecue flavor without benefit of charcoal, there is even a powder that captures the essence of charcoal and hickory, and a condensed smoke in liquid form. Almost any tang you can name now comes in a neat, handy package, ready to use.

There is one way in which these packaged products parallel herbs and spices—all should be used "to taste." Experiment with them. Start with the recipes and suggestions in this cook book and then go on to evolve your own combinations. Although it may take one or two tries before you become conversant with the more unfamiliar flavors, you'll find it is well worth the trouble, for your meals will take on a more interesting, unusual savor.

Sauces

TABASCO SAUCE

This pepper sauce must literally be measured by the dash, for otherwise it's easy to use too much.

Add a savory drop to scrambled eggs, soups, gravies. Use it sparingly in sauces—butter or cocktail—for seafood and cold cuts or to give piquancy to fruit sauces for poultry. Seafood and poultry casseroles are the tastier for a soupçon of Tabasco sauce, used, as always, with discretion and a sparing hand.

Orange Sauce for Game

3 tablespoons sweet butter 1/4 cup flour 11/3 cups stock, heated Salt

1 tablespoon grated orange rind

2/3 cup hot orange juice (preferably fresh)

1 tablespoon dry sherry

1 dash Tabasco sauce

Melt the butter and stir in the flour. Add the heated stock slowly, stirring constantly. Salt to taste. Hold over hot water until serving time. Just before serving, stir in the orange rind, juice, sherry and Tabasco. Makes about 2 cups. This is delicious on wild duck.

DURKEE'S FAMOUS SAUCE

Although its flavor seems mild, there's enough mustard bite to this mayonnaise-based sauce to give zest to meats, poultry, seafood, salads and cheese casseroles. Sandwich bread may be spread with the sauce before being covered with meats or chopped vegetables. But it is with cooked vegetables—broiled tomatoes, buttered broccoli, squash casserole, corn pudding—that this sauce excels.

Spinach Ring

1 quart spinach, cooked

1 cup cream sauce

2 tablespoons Durkee's Famous Sauce

2 tablespoons crumbled Roquefort cheese

1 teaspoon grated onion

Salt and pepper


1 cup bread crumbs

3 eggs, separated

1 cup cream, whipped

1/4 teaspoon Spice Islands Spice Parisienne Drain and chop spinach. Combine with cream sauce that has been seasoned with Durkee's Famous Sauce, the crumbled cheese, grated onion and salt and pepper to taste. Mix in bread crumbs. Beat egg yolks and mix in. SOY SAUCE

There's considerably more to soy sauce than salt. It carries an abundance of natural monosodium glutamate from the soybeans from which the sauce is made. That means the sauce not only adds its own flavor, but intensifies the natural flavor of other foods—such as gravies, stews and soups, broiled meats and poultry.

Roast Leg of Lamb

4-pound leg of lamb

1/2 teaspoon Spice Islands
Bouquet Garni for Lamb

Salt and pepper

1/2 cup honey

1 3-ounce bottle soy sauce

Trim fat from leg of lamb. Rub well with Bouquet Garni for Lamb, salt (sparingly) and pepper. Brush honey over all sides of meat. Place on rack in an uncovered pan. Roast 30 minutes at 450°. Remove from oven and brush with soy sauce. Reduce heat to 300° and allow 30 minutes per pound, continuing to baste with soy sauce every 20–30 minutes. Serves 6.

Chicken Breasts on Soy Rice

2 chicken breasts, boned and filleted (4 pieces in all)

31/2 tablespoons flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 cup chicken stock

1 cup light cream

1 teaspoon monosodium glutamate

1 egg yolk, slightly beaten

2 teaspoons soy sauce

1 5-ounce package quickcooking rice

1/3 cup finely chopped canned water chestnuts

2 tablespoons soy sauce

Dip breast fillets into 1½ tablespoons flour which have been seasoned with the salt. Sauté slowly in hot oil until chicken is tender and brown. Place on hot serving dish.

Remove all oil from skillet except 2 tablespoons. Stir in the remaining 2 tablespoons flour until well blended. Add chicken stock, cream and monosodium glutamate, stirring and cooking until gravy is thickened. Just before serving, stir in the egg yolk and 2 teaspoons soy sauce, and cook 2 minutes longer.

Prepare rice according to directions on package. Fold in the water chestnuts and 2 tablespoons soy sauce. Heap rice onto hot serving platter, and place pieces of chicken on top. Spoon some sauce over each, serve the rest in a gravy boat. Serves 4.

WORCESTERSHIRE SAUCE

This venerable concoction is made of, among other things, soy, anchovies, onions, garlic, vinegar, corn syrup, spices, tamarinds (an acid fruit pod), sugar, salt and a variety of flavorings. It has a special affinity for cheese dips and dishes, but creamed seafood and chicken, meat pies, gravies, butter sauces and Caesar salad also require the services of Worcestershire sauce.

Roquefort Cheese Sandwiches

2 tablespoons butter
1/2 cup Roquefort cheese,
crumbled

Salad oil

1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

8 slices whole-wheat bread 1/4 cup chopped watercress

Cream butter. Add Roquefort cheese and enough oil to make a paste. Blend in Worcestershire sauce. Spread thinly on bread slices. Sprinkle with chopped watercress, and sandwich the slices of bread together. Makes 4 sandwiches.

ESCOFFIER SAUCE ROBERT AND SAUCE DIABLE

These two delectable English condiments are the creation of the famous chef, Auguste Escoffier.

Sauce Robert, recommended as a steak sauce, also enhances chops and poultry, or meat and poultry casseroles. Blend it to taste into hot cream to use as a sauce for Rock Cornish game hens, or add 2 tablespoons Sauce Robert to 2 pounds steak for special Swiss steak. It also blends well with creamy cheese mixes—add 1 teaspoon to 4 ounces cream cheese for savory stuffed celery—and gives a special flavor to cheese casseroles.

Use Sauce Diable to give flavor to meat, fish, poultry, gravies and sauces, egg casseroles, scalloped vegetables; blend it with whipped butter as a spread for meat sandwiches or a topping for broiled chicken.

Chuck Stew

1/4 cup oil

3 small onions, chopped

2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley

1 clove garlic, slivered or pressed

1 green pepper, seeded and cut in strips

2 pounds lean chuck, cubed

2 teaspoons monosodium glutamate

2 teaspoons salt

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

4 cups hot beef stock

6 medium potatoes, diced

1 tablespoon flour

2 tablespoons Sauce Robert

Heat oil in a heavy saucepan. Add onions, parsley, garlic, green pepper, and cook gently until tender. Add meat and brown it lightly, turning as needed. Add monosodium glutamate, salt, pepper and stock. Cover and cook gently 1 hour. Add potatoes, and cook until meat is tender. Mix the flour and Sauce Robert with 1 tablespoon cold water. Stir into the meatand-potato mixture and cook until clear and slightly thickened, about 10 minutes. Serves 6.

Shrimp-Potato Casserole

1 pound raw shrimp, cleaned

1 3-ounce can sliced mushrooms, drained

2 tablespoons Sauce Diable

1 teaspoon monosodium glutamate

4 tablespoons butter

4 tablespoons finely chopped onion

4 tablespoons finely sliced celery

2 tablespoons flour

1 cup scalded milk

2/3 cup mayonnaise

3 cups diced boiled potatoes

Combine shrimp, mushrooms, Sauce Diable, monosodium glutamate, and set aside while making sauce.

Melt butter in a pan and sauté onion and celery until tender. Add flour and blend well, heating thoroughly. Stir in milk, cooking and stirring until mixture has thickened. Remove from heat. Blend in mayonnaise. Arrange half the diced potatoes (they should be about the size for potato salad) in a well-oiled 2-quart baking dish. Add half the shrimp mixture and half the sauce. Repeat layers. Bake 30–35 minutes in a 350° oven. Serves 4–6.

CATSUP, CHILI SAUCE, COCKTAIL SAUCE

Catsup, with its rich color and sweet-sour flavor, is a boon to sauces, gravies, soups, stews, chowders and scalloped vegetables. The best catsups are made from sun-ripened tomatoes, vintage vinegars, top-grade spices and herbs, and sugar.

Chili sauce is a softer, sweeter, thicker blend of garden-ripe tomatoes (the seeds are left in), spices and herbs, sugar, vinegar and onions. It costs about one-third more than catsup and has easily one-half more flavor.

Shrimp cocktail sauce, more highly seasoned than catsup, is a peppery combination of tomatoes, vinegar, spices, herbs, sugar and salt, with a smoky flavor that gives a tempting flavor to stews, gravies, meat casseroles, soups, mayonnaise salad dressings, egg and cheese dishes.

Deviled Seafood

5 tablespoons butter

2 tablespoons flour

21/2 cups scalded milk

1 teaspoon grated onion

2 tablespoons minced parsley

1/8-1/4 teaspoon crushed oregano

2 tablespoons cocktail sauce

1 teaspoon monosodium glutamate

3 hard-cooked eggs, finely chopped

2 cups diced cooked shrimp, crab meat, lobster, or fish

1/3 cup dry bread crumbs

Melt 3 tablespoons butter over medium heat and stir in the flour. Slowly add the milk, stirring constantly and cooking gently until the sauce is thickened. Stir in the onion, parsley, oregano, cocktail sauce and monosodium glutamate. Fold in the chopped eggs and seafood. Pour into a well-greased casserole, and top with bread crumbs. Dot with remaining butter, Bake in a 475° oven about 15 minutes. Serves 4.

Creamed Veal Cutlets

6 veal cutlets (about 2 pounds), pounded flat

Flour

2 tablespoons olive oil

2 teaspoons Dash

1 teaspoon monosodium glutamate

1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

2 tablespoons catsup

1/4 teaspoon pepper

1 cup bouillon, heated

1 cup sour cream

Dredge veal cutlets in flour. Brown slowly in olive oil. Add Dash, monosodium glutamate, Worcestershire sauce, catsup and pepper to the hot bouillon. Pour over browned cutlets. Cover closely and simmer 45–60 minutes or until the cutlets are tender. Remove to a hot serving platter. Stir cream into pan drippings, and heat gently (do not let boil). Pour over cutlets. Serve with noodles. Serves 6.

Baked Roquefort Eggs

3 tablespoons butter

11/2 teaspoons Spice Islands Spaghetti Sauce Seasoning

2-4 tablespoons crumbled Roquefort cheese

6 eggs

Salt and pepper

6 tablespoons chili sauce

Place 1 teaspoon butter in each of 6 custard cups. Add ¼ teaspoon Spaghetti Sauce Seasoning. Place cups on baking sheet in hot oven 5 minutes. Remove from oven and add 1-2 teaspoons (to taste) crumbled Roquefort cheese to each cup. Break 1 egg into each cup. Season with salt and pepper, and dot tops with the remaining butter.

Bake in a 350° oven 12 minutes or until eggs are almost firm. Spoon 1 tablespoon chili sauce on top of each egg and return to oven 3 minutes or just until eggs are firm (they should not be hard). Serve in the hot cups on luncheon plates. Serves 6.

Extracts, Liquids, Salts

BEEF EXTRACT (B-V, BOVRIL, GLACE DE VIANDE)

The rich flavor and deep color of this salty seasoning make it an ideal base for quick gravies. Use it also to fortify meat soups, sauces (spaghetti, barbecue, chili con carne), hashes, stews, even cheese dips. Always taste, before seasoning, any dish in which you have used this meat essence. It usually will need only pepper.

Chuck Loaf

1 tablespoon beef extract

- 2 slices Roman Meal bread (or other dark bread)
- 2 teaspoons Bigelow Sausage Seasoning

1 tablespoon grated onion

11/2 pounds ground chuck

11/2 pounds ground veal

1/2 pound ground lean pork

1 egg

Dissolve extract in 1 cup hot water. Tear bread into bits and add, mixing well with fork. Add sausage seasoning and onion and blend thoroughly. Stir in ground meats and egg. Shape the mixture into a loaf on a baking sheet, or press into an oiled loaf pan. Bake in a 325° oven for 1½ hours. Serves 6.

BEEF AND CHICKEN STOCK BASE

Beef stock base, a blend of pure beef extract, herbs and spices, is not only an appetizing aid to gravies, stews, soups and sauces, but can also add wonderful flavor to the cooking water for vegetables. If you are cooking fresh vegetables to serve 4, dissolve 1 tablespoon beef stock base in the water. Stir 2 teaspoons into ½ cup water for frozen vegetables, or add 1 teaspoon to the liquid of a 1-pound can of vegetables.

Chicken stock base and beef stock base are interchangeable in vegetable cookery, but otherwise, chicken stock base is preferable for lighter flavored foods, beef for stronger.

Corn Casserole

1 teaspoon Spice Islands Chicken Stock Base

4 tablespoons hot water

1 cup milk

1 cup fresh corn

4 eggs, beaten slightly

2 tablespoons sugar

Dissolve chicken stock base in hot water. Add to milk, and combine with other ingredients. Pour into a well-buttered casserole, and set in a pan of water. Bake in a 350° oven just until firm. Brown under broiler or sprinkle with paprika. Serves 4.

This dish may be prepared in poached-egg tins (steam over hot water and then brown tops under broiler) and unmolded onto broiled tomato slices.

Hashed Brown Potatoes

4 teaspoons Spice Islands Beef Stock Base

1/2 cup water

3 potatoes, peeled and cubed 6 tablespoons bacon fat

1/8 teaspoon black pepper

1 teaspoon paprika

Add beef stock base to water. Cook potatoes in water, covered, until they are almost tender and most of the liquid is absorbed. Drain off any surplus liquid (save for soups).

Heat bacon fat in a heavy skillet. Add black pepper to potatoes and turn into the hot fat. Sprinkle ½ teaspoon paprika over top. Use an egg turner to press potatoes together. Cook until browned on bottom. Cut in half with egg turner and invert each half to brown on other side. Sprinkle with rest of paprika. Serve when browned. Serves 4.

MONOSODIUM GLUTAMATE (MSG)

Monosodium glutamate, or MSG, derived from such products as corn, wheat and sugar beets, has no color or flavor of its own—it simply brings out the natural flavor of foods and is frequently used in conjunction with salt, herbs and spices. It originated in the Orient, where cooks for centuries had cooked their foods in a seaweed stock that gave them a fine, full flavor. That seaweed, it was found, contained a great quantity of natural glutamate. In 1908, a Japanese professor isolated it, called it *Aji-no-moto* or "essence of taste" and began to produce it from soybeans. Production began in America in 1936. There are a number of brands of monosodium glutamate on the market, both plain and seasoned. Some are packaged as MSG under brand names. Others are:

AC'CENT: Pure monosodium glutamate crystals.

ENHANCE (House of Herbs): A blend of monosodium glutamate, herbs and salt; gray-green in color.

MEI YEN SEASONING (Spice Islands): A combination of monosodium glutamate, salt, sugar and lactose.

PRAISE ALLAH (TryMe): Monosodium glutamate blended with garlic, onion and spices.

Since most foods (except sweet ones in which it is never used) have a wide tolerance for monosodium glutamate, there's no danger of using too much. If you like to cook without measuring, add it in about the same proportion as salt, about ½ teaspoon to 4 servings.

SEASONING SALTS

One-flavor seasoned salts—celery, onion, garlic, etc.—appeared years ago and their uses are so simple as to need no comment. The seasoned or seasoning salts now on the market are more complex for, as their name implies, they are a blend of several seasonings. A few of the better known seasoning salts are:

BEAU MONDE (Spice Islands): A wonderful blend of seasonings that can be used to taste in salad dressings, cheese and sour cream dips, butter spreads. Rub meats, fish and poultry before roasting or broiling (use ½ teaspoon per pound).

DASH (House of Herbs): An all-purpose seasoning, herb-green in color, containing monosodium glutamate, bouillon and herbs. It can be used in salads, sauces, gravies, vegetables, meat and poultry dishes.

LAWRY'S: A popular brand that contains 17 ingredients, in addition to fine salt. Try it on raw vegetables at cocktail time.

HAMBURGER ZOWIE! AND ZOWIE! (Bigelow): Hamburger Zowie!, a 17-spice seasoning, is especially good in ground meat. For patties, also coat them generously to give a colorful, flavorful crust (the same applies to broiled chicken). Rub Zowie! on meats, poultry and fish before cooking.

SEASON-ALL (McCormick-Schilling): An all-purpose seasoning that adds spice to chicken, cottage cheese, stews, soups, egg dishes, salad dressings—it can literally season all. Try it in stuffed eggs, on corn on the cob, or in butter sauces.

OLD HICKORY SMOKED SALT (Spice Islands): A seasoning salt that adds wonderful flavor to roasted and barbecued meats.

Cheery Chicken-in-Pot

1 3- or 4-pound chicken, cut in pieces

Flour

1 tablespoon Hamburger Zowie!

1/4 cup oil

1/2 cup light cream

1 cup hot chicken stock

Roll the chicken in the flour. Sprinkle well with Hamburger Zowie! Brown the chicken in the oil, turning to brown all sides evenly. Add cream to hot stock and re-heat to simmering point. Pour over chicken. Cover the pot and cook gently until tender. If desired, thicken gravy. Serves 4-6.

Broccoli Salad

1 package frozen broccoli

1 teaspoon minced fresh parsley

1 clove garlic

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

1 teaspoon Beau Monde

4 tablespoons oil

2 tablespoons sour cream

2 tablespoons lemon juice

1 hard-cooked egg

Cook broccoli as directed on package but only until tender. Drain and marinate in dressing made by combining the other ingredients (place them in a jar and shake well). Remove garlic. Serve the broccoli on crisp lettuce leaves. Serves 4.

Individual Lamb Loaves

2 pounds ground lean lamb

2 cups fine dry bread crumbs

1 cup bouillon

2 teaspoons Lawry's Seasoned Salt

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce

1 teaspoon monosodium glutamate

1/4 teaspoon Figaro Liquid Barbecue Smoke Mix ingredients together thoroughly but lightly. Place ½ cup of the mixture into each of 12 2"-muffin pans (cast-iron ones are preferable). Bake in a 400° oven 25 minutes, or 15 minutes for less well done.

Remove the little loaves from their pans. Serve promptly with mushroom sauce made by heating 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup with half a soup can of water and spiking it with a dash or two of Worcestershire sauce. Serves 6.

Lugu Fowl

1 4-pound hen or half a small turkey, cut into pieces

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

1 cup finely crushed potato chips

1/4 cup oil

2 tablespoons flour

1 tablespoon paprika

1/2 teaspoon Season-All

1 cup bouillon (or water)

1/2 cup pineapple juice
1 cup pineapple chunks, drained

Sprinkle fowl with salt and pepper. Roll pieces in crushed potato chips. Brown lightly on all sides in hot oil. Remove from skillet.

Combine flour, paprika and Season-All and add to skillet, mixing well. Slowly stir in bouillon (or water) and pineapple juice, stirring constantly until sauce is smooth. Return pieces of fowl to skillet. Add pineapple chunks and cover. Simmer until tender, 30 minutes or longer. Serve hot, with fluffy rice. Serves 4-6.

DRANGE BITTERS

The flavor of orange bitters has a special affinity for mushroom lishes, including soup. Fruit creations—pies, compotes, puddings, obblers, salads, punches—taste zestier when spiked with this mixure of bitter orange peel flavoring, wine, caramel and spices. Also ry adding it to cream cheese frostings for cakes.

Fresh Mushroom Soup

/2 pound fresh mushrooms 4 tablespoons butter, melted 2 tablespoons flour 4 cups chicken stock 1 cup light cream Salt and pepper to taste 2 or 3 drops orange bitters

Wash and chop the mushrooms and sauté in butter until tender. Stir in flour. Add stock slowly, stirring well, and heat to boiling point. Cook gently, stirring constantly, until thickened. Stir in cream and season to taste with salt, pepper and orange bitters. Reheat but do not boil. Serves 4.

KITCHEN BOUQUET

A blend of garden vegetables, spices and herbs, Kitchen Bouquet can enhance both the meaty flavor and the color of any meat dish and give a rich look to gravies and the sauce base of casseroles (use about 1 teaspoon to 4 servings).

If you want a charcoal-broil look, brush meat to be broiled with a light coating of this seasoning. For glazed effect, brush meat with 1 teaspoon Kitchen Bouquet mixed with 2 tablespoons butter.

Eggplant Casserole


1 medium eggplant 2 teaspoons Kitchen Bouquet 1/3 cup olive oil 1/4 cup grated onion 1/2 cup chopped green pepper

- 1 8-ounce can tomato sauce
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon monosodium glutamate

1/8 teaspoon ground allspice 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper 1 tablespoon minced parsley

Grated Parmesan cheese

Peel eggplant and slice 1/2" thick. Brush each slice with Kitchen Bouquet. Brown slices in olive oil and place in a flat, oiled baking dish. Add the grated onion, chopped pepper, tomato sauce, salt, monosodium glutamate, allspice, cayenne pepper and parsley to oil remaining in pan and bring to a boil. Pour over eggplant. Cover and bake in a 350° oven 20 minutes, or until eggplant is tender. Sprinkle with grated Parmesan cheese, Serves 4-5.



FIGARO LIQUID BARBECUE SMOKE

This condensed smoke, captured from smouldering logs, is aged in liquid form in cypress storage tanks and then combined with some 18 ingredients, including sugar, spices, vinegar, peppers.

To obtain the equivalent of genuine barbecue flavor, do not dilute Liquid Barbecue Smoke nor add to it in any way. Brush meat or poultry with it, and then let stand at least 3 hours before cooking; this lets the smoke flavor permeate. Baste with more of the liquid during cooking.

The flavor also adds interest to vegetables. Use 1 teaspoon to I pound of vegetables, adding the liquid to the cooking water.

Baked Beans

11/2 cups dried beans 1/2 cup chopped onion 1/4 pound chopped bacon

3 tablespoons brown sugar

3 tablespoons chili sauce

1 teaspoon salt

1 tablespoon dry mustard

1/8 teaspoon ground allspice

1/2 teaspoon Liquid Barbecue Smoke

4 tablespoons honey or molasses

Soak beans overnight in water to cover. Simmer slowly until just tender (skins should not burst). Drain, reserving the stock. Add the other ingredients except honey. Pour into a well-greased casserole. Bake in a 250° oven 5-6 hours, adding a bit of the stock from time to time if the beans appear dry. One hour before removing from oven dribble honey over top. Serve with barbecued meats. Serves 4.

CHARCRUST

There's a bit of bouquet-spice and herb-to this product that combines charcoal and hickory smoke flavor in dry granular form. Sprinkle it over any meat that is being broiled or barbecuedhamburgers, steaks, spareribs, chops, poultry, fish, or frankfurters. Try it also on baked potatoes. When potatoes are coated with this dark seasoning, potato-peel lovers have additional reason for consuming the nourishing peel.

Fresh Pork or Ham Slice

1-pound fresh pork or ham slice Charcrust

Let meat stand at room temperature about 1 hour before cooking. Wipe carefully with a damp cloth. Trim off excess fat. Rub generously with Charcrust. Place fat side up in a roasting pan. Roast in a 350° oven, allowing 35 minutes per pound. Serves 3.

ANGOSTURA AROMATIC BITTERS

If you aren't yet kitchen handy with bitters, start with the triedand-true dash (2 or 3 drops) in a small package of cream cheese for stuffing celery. Then add a dash to gravies, tomato juice, scrambled eggs, and 1 or more dashes per cup of fruit for fruit pies.

Shrimp Soufflé

1 cup milk

3 tablespoons Minute Tapioca

1 cup finely chopped cooked shrimp

4 tablespoons grated sharp Cheddar cheese

1 teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper

1 teaspoon Angostura Bitters

3 eggs, separated

Paprika

Combine milk and tapioca and let stand 15 minutes. Then place over low heat and stir until milk is scalded and tapioca is clear. Add shrimp, cheese, salt, cayenne, bitters; beat the egg yolks lightly and add. Blend well and cool to room temperature.

Beat egg whites until stiff and fold in the cooled mixture. Pour into a 11/2-quart soufflé dish and place dish in a pan of hot water. Sprinkle top with paprika. Bake in a 375° oven 35 minutes or until a knife inserted in center comes out clean. Serves 4.

Pickles, Vinegars

DILL RELISH

Finely chopped dill pickles, vinegar, red peppers, spices, turmeric, salt and flavorings go into dill relish. It's tasty, of course, spooned onto hamburgers or used as a relish with other foods, but it also adds flavor when used as sauce ingredient or with ground meat.

Dill-Filled Meat Balls

2 pounds lean ground beef (chuck or round steak) 1/4 cup dill relish, drained

1 cup soft bread crumbs

2 eggs

4 tablespoons evaporated milk

2 tablespoons oil

1 can onion or mushroom soup

Combine all the ingredients, except oil and soup, and mix well. Shape into medium-sized balls. Heat oil in a skillet. Add meat balls a few at a time, turning to brown on all sides. Remove balls as they become browned. When all are browned and removed, add soup and heat, stirring constantly. Return meat balls, and cover, Simmer gently 20 minutes or until tender. Serve over spaghetti with Parmesan cheese. Serves 6.

FLAVORED VINEGARS

Orange and pear vinegars, from gift or gourmet shops, add zest to French dressing for fruit salads. Use tarragon vinegar in the water for poaching eggs or fish, or cooking shrimp; in the butter sauce for broiled seafood or chicken—and in stuffed eggs. Use basil vinegar in fruit salad dressings, eschalot vinegar, garlic vinegar or Wagner's Salad Bouquet to dress greens.

Spiced Widow's Mite Vinegar is great for seasoning vegetables—delicious on broccoli (in the butter sauce) or in the dip for globe artichokes; it also goes well in spiced shrimp. This Creole-spiced vinegar contains an unusual blend of seasonings.

House of Herbs' Maestro, a vinegar containing 9 fresh herbs, combines well with cream (sweet or sour) or a good oil, for dressing greens. Use about 4 tablespoons Maestro to $\frac{2}{3}$ cup cream or oil, and add a shade of sugar, too. Or, if you are broiling a round steak, blend $\frac{1}{4}$ cup Maestro with $\frac{3}{4}$ cup olive oil for a marinade.

Hassel's Fresh Pork Ham

Fresh ham

Old Hickory Smoked Salt

2 teaspoons sugar

1/2 cup orange vinegar

2 teaspoons Spice Islands Mild Mustard Skin and then score fat of fresh ham. Rub scored surface well with smoked salt. Place ham in roaster with a small amount of water. Roast uncovered in a 500° oven 30 minutes. Reduce temperature to 325°, cover roaster, and cook until ham is easily pierced with meat fork, turning and basting ham often with syrup made of sugar, vinegar, mustard.

Jellied Tuna or Crab

1 tablespoon unflavored gelatin

2 tablespoons Spice Islands tarragon white wine vinegar

2 cups flaked tuna or crab

1/4 cup green tomato relish, drained

1 dash Tabasco sauce

1 cup mayonnaise

Soften gelatin in a mixture of the vinegar and 2 tablespoons cold water. Then dissolve it in ½ cup hot water. When the gelatin begins to thicken, fold in the other ingredients, adding the Tabasco sauce to the mayonnaise. Pour into molds and chill until firm. Unmold. Serve on greens with more mayonnaise and celery and carrot sticks. Serves 4.

Smothered Spinach

2 pounds fresh spinach 2 shallots, chopped finely 2 tablespoons Maestro Melted butter Salt Wash and drain spinach carefully. Place in heavy saucepan. Add shallots. Dribble Maestro over all. Cover and heat quickly until steaming thoroughly, but do not cook. Remove from heat. Season with melted butter and salt. Serves 4.

CAPERS

These shriveled, pickled flower buds from wild shrubs along the Mediterranean coast line add both piquancy and flair to many foods. Capers are most familiar with seafood—either as a garnish or a tangy flavoring—but try them in egg dishes and on cold cuts and variety meats. Use capers by the teaspoonful as a garnish on individual salads (almost any non-sweet salad can benefit from a sprinkling of capers) and by the tablespoonful in meat sauces.

Steamed Cauliflower

1 2-pound head of cauliflower

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon Mei Yen Seasoning

1/2 cup butter

3 tablespoons lemon juice

1/3 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

1 tablespoon capers, drained Crumbled Roquefort cheese Remove any damaged leaves from the cauliflower but leave a few green ones for color. Sprinkle cauliflower head with salt and Mei Yen Seasoning and steam over boiling water just until tender.

Heat butter until slightly browned. Stir in lemon juice and Worcestershire sauce and heat. Add capers. Place cauliflower head on hot serving dish and pour sauce over it. Sprinkle with Roquefort cheese.

CHOW CHOW

This sweet-sour-hot mixture of cabbage, sweet red and green peppers, hot peppers, tomatoes, onions, vinegar, sugar, salt and spices is most often used as a simple relish, but it is also interesting as a seasoning. Try Chow Chow in snacks or hors d'oeuvre. Drain and fold into cream cheese to spoon on crackers. There is also a mild Chow Chow, but for seasoning purposes the hot is preferable.

Chow Chow Patty Steak

11/2 pounds lean ground beef 1/2 pound lean ground pork

4 strips bacon, chopped finely

4 tablespoons hot Chow Chow

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon monosodium glutamate

1/2 teaspoon black pepper 1/4 teaspoon Liquid Barbecue

Smoke

Combine the beef, pork and bacon. Drain and add the Chow Chow with the salt, monosodium glutamate, pepper and Liquid Barbecue Smoke. Mix lightly. Press gently into 6 thin patties. Broil 3" from preheated broiler unit about 12 minutes, turning once. Serves 6.



HOUSE & GARDEN'S CARVING CLUB

TWO WAYS TO CARVE HAM

Proper carving makes the meal, according to André Surmain whose small select restaurant, Lutèce, has become a haven for New Yorkers seeking superbly prepared and served French food. Here Mr. Surmain demonstrates the French and American styles of carving a ham. The French style, recommended for cold or Virignia hams, results in paper-thin slices.



THE FRENCH STYLE



Arrange ham on platter, top upward. Cut straight down to bone near the shank end.



Make a second, slanting cut rather higher up to connect with first cut. Remove and discard this wedge, which will consist of excess fat.



Start slicing at a 30° angle to the bone, keeping slices very thin and even.



Continue carving ham until about one third of it is sliced. Remove slices to plate as they are carved.



Now carve from side to middle in thin half slices.



Repeat on other side, alternating to keep ham even.

THE AMERICAN STYLE

The American method of carving the traditional baked ham gives more robust slices of meat. In this method, a piece is cut from the thinner side of the ham to make a base, the ham carved straight down to the bone in slices of desired thickness.





Turn ham so it rests on side from which piece has been removed. Wrap shank bone in napkin, grasp firmly. Make cut at end to bone.



As before, make second cut and remove fatty wedge. Slice thickly across rounded side, down to the bone.




After a few slices have been cut, run knife parallel to bone underneath meat to release the carved slices.



Push released slices to side of platter, out of the way, and continue the carving.

Kitchen curtains present a problem undisguisable by cuteness or tailored restraint. Plain or fancy, they are subject to the constant wear and tear of heat, spatter, steam and fumes. 

NEWS FROM THE HOME BUILDERS' SHOW

New styles in custom-designed hardware





Kitchen is planned around an island counter

Double-sink and dishwasher make the island a clean-up center between double ovens on one wall, cooking counter and refrigerator on other wall. At left of pass-through bar (see page 191) at far end of room is a niche for a planning desk and a swing-out swivel stool.

EZRA STOLLER

Laundry equipment is in a separate room

The small, well-planned laundry room is equipped for many tasks to be done in only 85 square feet of space. Arrangement is galley-like: washer and dryer are banked on one wall opposite a pull-out ironer, a drop-down ironing board, a clothes hamper, shelves for linen.

Two-way barbecue serves two terraces

On the wall between kitchen and dining terraces (see page 100) an outdoor barbecue is housed in a cupboard with folding doors that, for easy access, open or close on both sides. Grill is vented through an overhead flue, and ashes are collected in an under-grill drawer. A rotisserie above the grill completes the unit.

Double bar has kitchen-to-hall pass-through

At one end of kitchen, two small panels over a liquor storage counter swing open to permit the passing-through of drinks to the bar in entrance hall. On large party nights, a barman presides on this side to free the hall and keep preparation clutter well out of sight.



Serving bar is in entrance hall

On the hall side, bar is a step-right-up serving counter or, for the family and a guest or two, a spot to mix drinks with the necessary wherewithal simply pushed through from the kitchen. When not in use, bar is neatly masked with folding doors of Philippine mahogany.

Music-system wall cabinet forms a nook for the TV

Television set swivels out from a crescent-shaped corner cabinet in the study. The cabinet also houses the tuner, amplifier and record player for the house-wide music system, and, in an adjoining section, cards, camera equipment and games. Decorative burlap and walnut strips surface entire cabinet.





THE TERRACE AFTER HOURS

H&G's Twelve Twilight Flowers and How to Grow Them (see pages 108 and 109)

The painting on pages 108-109 represents not a garden plan as much as a garden inventory-a roster of flowering plants, most of them familiar in gardens for generations, that by any plan would grace your garden at the end of a summer's day. While the flower genera are all old, the forms and colors of some varieties are new. And while our selection is necessarily definite, if not arbitrary, each choice is representative of many others that, in your garden, might be equally good: Here are some of the practical details:

1. FOXGLOVE (Digitalis purpurea varieties). It has a timeless and indestructible look when at the peak of its flowering, in late spring or early summer. Actually, while it tolerates many soil conditions and considerable shade, it is a biennial-that is, seed must be sown each year for flowering the next. This is no chore-once you accept the requirement. But if you don't wish to bother to sow seeds of the many colorful strains each June to transplant in fall for flowering the following spring, buy plants each fall from a florist or nurseryman. The point is that, once planted, these noble flowers unfailingly fend for themselves. Though scentless, they make amends by their form and their enduring 6-foot flower spikes. Colors: white, pinks, mauves, purples, yellows; spotted or unspotted with contrasting hues.

2. FLOWERING TOBACCO (Nicotiana affinis). This is the old-fashioned straggly white, with a wild tangle of 4-inch tubular flowers that yield in summer evenings the strongest of the delicate (forgive the paradox) flower fragrances the garden affords. It is an annual, but it self-sows freely. Once planted and established at the back of the border or in an out-of-the-way corner, it will recur for many years, reaching 3 feet. Stick to the whiteit is the sweetest and sturdiest variety.

3. MONKSHOOD (Acontimum fischeri and A. napellus). This lovely bluepurple perennial, for all its very poisonous roots (who is going to eat the roots?) is one of the great latesummer border flowers, yet too few people grow it today. It belongs in every garden of old reliables-preferably toward the back (it reaches 3 to 6 feet), and in loamy soil that does not readily dry out. Colors: light blues (napellus) and purples (fischeri). Buy plants or sow your own from freshly collected seed. Once planted in their final locations, leave the plants alone; they resent disturbance.

4. DAY-LILY (Hemerocallis hybrids). There is no end to the perennial daylily parade. But of the newest varieties, those that appeal to us most at the moment (red Bess Ross, perhaps, excepted) are the fragrant vellows that hold their flowers at day's end. The one used as a model by our artist on page 109 is Shooting Star, a new late-summer hybrid that is perhaps lovelier at sunset than at noon, and sweeter by moonlight than at dusk. There are others-similar in color, growth habit and usefulness-that may be presently more widely available. Day-lily heights: 2 to 4 feet; bloom periods: May to September.


But except for the reckless or the downright ignorant gardener, the trip can be a fruitful one.

For the most part it is, by now, a familiar trip. There is little in the realm of garden tools and equipment that is startlingly new. Trends that seem pronounced in 1962 were clearly discernible in 1961. And quality is still of the essence—

this year, as it was a year ago and the year before that and the year before that. If this is small comfort to the manufacturers of shoddy garden products, bad cess to them anyway. For the relatively quiet majority who make reputable merchandise and sell it reputably, it means perhaps fewer but, we trust, more profitable sales. We always hate to see the gardener's tools debased. And we happen to believe that only good tools, that you can really use, are worth buying.


Three factors should rightfully influence your choice of garden equipment. First factor: appropriateness—which might be restated as suitability of function to need. Second factor: intrinsic merit—which includes excellence of basic design, quality of manufacture, durability of the product. Third factor: cost—both to buy and to keep in operable condition. All three factors are related. You must strike some sort of balance among them before you can decide whether your investment in tools and equipment is to prove a sound one.

There is something else that will influence your equipment purchases—too intangible to be termed a factor. That is your attitude toward gardening. For the doers—tillers, hewers, manipulators, muscle-flexers, and deep breathers generally—a shiny new tool may be as pretty and winsome an object as the fairest rose. For the putterers, the brooders and those more interested in laissez-faire play, tools are at best an extension of the hand, and the simpler and fewer the better. For words of opinion, if not wisdom, and a brief maintenance travelogue, see next page.





BASIC INVENTORY OF HAND TOOLS



Dig and rake, plant, snip and spray: These are likely to be the gardener's five commandments, observable henceforth and forevermore, on properties of whatever size and shape. Reduced to their simplest form,

the five functions could be represented first by the ubiquitous and indispensable trowel (we care not who makes a nation's laws so long as we can design its trowels), then in turn by the hand cultivator, the planting dibber, the snipping shears and the grim but necessary insect sprayer.

Even on a handkerchief-size plot, you will accumulate more than one trowel. But start with the best all-round model: forged steel, with a socket handle. Cared for, it will last forever; abused, the blade will rust and pit. Second choice: stainless steel. The blade, abused, will last forever. The handle, though cared for, will inevitably Continued on next page



weaken after a season or two. (Still to be put on the market: a *socket* trowel with a good *stainless* blade.)

Favor a cultivator with stainless tines, a swaged and anchored handle (the pressed steel jokers are worthless). For dibbers (and though we don't really approve of them, they are useful time-savers): again choose stainless steel, with a wood (not plastic) handle. Buy three (the same goes for trowels)—one to lend, one to lose, one to use.


The shears are generic. Maybe grass shears (the old-fashioned sheep model) will serve to trim edges in lawnless gardens. Or maybe you need secateurs, or maybe long-handled no-stoop snippers (there are some superb but expensive ones on the market); maybe all three. But avoid like the plague all the "easy-action" gadgets (there is no easy pruning action) and all models with the handles and cutting edges made from the same piece of metal (blade steel is too good for handles; handle steel is not good enough for blades). As for sprayers, of whatever size: Remember that all pesticides tend to be corrosive, so spend money only for stainless steel, brass, copper, or bronze-in tanks and fittings. (Plastic, in money-saving form, is good only for short-term use.) Total estimated cost range of the five tools listed: \$15 to \$30.



MAN-SIZE BASICS FOR A ONE-MOWER PLACE

When you get out of the terrace box and into the garden, you add a full-size shovel (forged steel, but lightweight if you wish), plain iron rake (flat- or bow-backed), Dhandle spading fork (there's nothing like it for helping to fit your ground—or, as the romantics say, put it in good tilth). Now your lawn will begin to take a good deal of your weekend attention—even a lawn too small to justify purchase of a power mower (although makers of some new electric models say no lawn is too small).

So that you will have turf healthy enough to cut, you will need a fertilizer distributer (one to three feedings a year). And to collect the clippings your healthy lawn produces when mowed, you may need a lawn sweeper (if you don't use a sweeper, you must rake-must rake for healthy turf). There are junk models of all these tools on the market. Shun them. Fair prices for top quality might average: Spade, \$3.50. Rake, \$2.50. Fork, \$3.50 to \$7. Mower (either forged steel or standard castiron frame, first quality, 20-inch size), \$30 to \$40. Distributer, \$10 to \$20. Sweeper, \$30 to \$50. Life expectancy of all tools thus far listed: minimum, five years; normal maximum, fifteen years. This is from three to ten times the expected usefulness of economy models costing half as much.




POWER AUGMENTS THE SPACE BUILD-UP

Whether or not a power mower should be added to your tool inventory will depend partly on the amount of lawn you need to mow, partly on the amount of time and care you wish to devote to your lawn, partly on your regard for the modest exercise of lawn mowing, partly on the ratio of cost to effort that you consider appropriate. Unless you have physical limitations, you will be wasting muscle, saving little time, paying more for results achieved if you use a power mower rather than a good hand mower on a small lawn. By a small lawn we mean anything less than 3,500 square feet (an area 35 by 100 feet), which is more turf than you will normally find on a 75by-100-foot lot. For 5,000 feet of lawn, investing in a power mower may just begin to save appreciable time and effort (including the not inconsiderable effort of storing and caring for the power plant). And you will still need your hand mower if your lawn is irregular in layout, your ideas of lawn care exacting.

Where storage space is ample, cost subordinate to satisfaction, labor something to be expended as flexibly as possible, and the lawn concomitant with a quarter-acre lot or better, power is a civilized must. (It is available, it is dependable; so you use it.)



About 1962 power mowers there is this to say: The trend (one trend) points to battery-operated electric mowers, especially for rotary types. Presumably you would mow anything up to 5,000 feet of turf, then put the battery on the house line for recharging. Another trend is toward reeltype mowers (seeming to reverse or at least slow the flood tide of rotary types that marked the 'Fifties'). Grasscatchers and clipping-lifting generally are receiving more attention. Gasoline motors are becoming easier to start (by means of a new compression by-pass rather than the improved recoil starting handles). Starting cords may be more conveniently located (as on mower handles) now that (and when) starting compression has been reduced. It should be kept in mind that a

poorly adjusted engine may not start, no matter how easily its shaft may be turned. And a careless pull on any starter may also catch a muscle. As for quality of cut, the reel types still get the professional vote over the rotaries, assuming that mechanical quality is equal. (For quality of turf, consider also a turf-slicer-a power-driven, mower-like tool you will hear more of in the future, we predict.)


If you have an extensive cut-flower or vegetable garden or experiment actively with cultivated ground, you may find a small tiller useful. There are no rules to apply except those of common sense and personal attitude. And don't forget a really good lawn sprinkler.

Costs? You are into the budget for \$100 to \$300 additional by now.

TRACTORS:

LABOR-SAVING

WORK-MAKERS



The popularity of small tractors is seemingly increasing at a startling rate. Why? Even some manufacturers we have talked with don't know. One says it's a matter of status. Another says the machines will really take care of all the mowing, tilling, carting needs of a 2- to 5-acre place. Another says men love to ride around on the machines for an hour or so on a pleasant Saturday. Another says a tractor will make people more enthusiastic gardeners. All agree that at current power ratings (from 5 to 7 horsepower), the small tractors, far from being toys, are substantial and expensive machines, deserving-and generally receiving-skilled engineering and honest manufacture. Since the best of them will cost anywhere from \$400 to \$700 (attachments and functions will vary), the investment is also substantial. All we can say is: Shop for a tractor as you would for a caror a stereo hi-fi rig, or a set of golf clubs.

And before you buy a tractor, consider

whether a riding mower (or heavy mower with riding sulky) may not serve you better, all things considered. Consider your climate. Is a snow plow desirable? Tractors pull or push them. But plows and blowers can also stand on their own two wheels -or those of some power mowers.

And speaking of power: how about a power sprayer? The plant enthusiast (rose fan, rhododendron specialist) may need something bigger and easier to use than even the excellent hand-pressure or hosepressure tank models. (Remember what we said about noncorrosive sprayers? Rust is expensive.)

Looking back over what we have written, we find we have talked a lot about quality but forgotten to mention the common hoe. That is what can happen when you become involved with the wonderful world of power. How good a garden can you have without a hoe? Forgive the oversight—one hoe, coming up.

5. PHLOX (*P. suffruticoa*). The early (June) variety Miss Lingaard is an airy white, current descendant of a long line of old-time garden varieties, almost all of which were of English origin and named for women (most of them matrons). Durably perennial, the plants reach 30 inches in height, grow in any sunny spot.

6. DELPHINIUM (D. elatum hybrids). These are the tall (6-foot) spires of blue, lavender, purple and white that grow so well in gardens where winters are long and cold (or summers cool). In favorable climates, these perennial larkspurs are long-lived. In regions of warm summers, you treat them as biennials, contenting yourself with one spectacular spring and fall from each clump, then starting over. Either way, you are the gainer. Buy plants or sow seed yourself of choice West-Coast or English strains.

7. PEONY (Paconia albiflora varieties). For the most dependable and fragrant pinks, stick to the old hybrids. To name but two of many, choose Edulis Superba (dark pink, 30-inch, mid-spring) or Myrtle Gentry (similar, but flowers later). Kelway's Glorious is a fragrant white.

Once properly planted, peonies go on forever—or at least for twenty-five or thirty years.

8. ORIENTAL POPPY (Papaver orientalis). Like peonies, these most majestic of all the poppies produce their late May flowers year after year. They have no appreciable scent but enormous show value. Pick the pinks, white, or scarlets according to taste. We know of no better tall pink (nearly 3 feet) than Helen Elizabeth.


9. HOSTA (H. plantaginea hybrid). Either the species itself or this especially fine hybrid, called Honeybells, will give you late-summer trumpets of a fragrance second only to that of nicotiana in the evening garden. And hosta does especially well in light or moving shade such as you are likely to have beneath tall trees or along shrub borders. Clumps reach 3-foot width, 2-foot height, are pest-free and all but eternal.

10. EVENING-PRIMROSE (Oenothera biennis and O. fruticosa). The first of these species is often referred to as a weed, a derogation that leaves us unmoved. At the back of the sunny border it makes itself at home, justi-

fying any casual pains you may have suffered to get it established. The fruticosa species is far too seldom grown. A perennial, it is as golden as the other. The Young variety (O. f. youngi) is the one to look for. It is 2 feet tall, blooms from June till September.

11. DITTANY (Dictamnus albus). Long-lived as a peony and blooming at about the same time, this white perennial species produces airy 3-foot spikes of fragrant florets (and the rubra variety has purplish-pink blooms). The foliage is graceful and attractive all season. Buy plants and give them a season or two to become established. Or sow seeds in August and raise your own plants.

12. ROCKET (Hesperis matronalis). Sow it in any kind of soil and forget it. But its simple flowers are not easily forgotten—because of their fragrance, which is forthcoming only at night, and their simple blossoms of white, pink or purple. Strictly, this is a biennial. But it self-sows in situations favorable to it (since it is not fussy, a favorable situation is hard to define). The plants are of branching habit, reaching a height of 3 feet.







Notes for April Gardeners

The days are full of busy work; time enough later to relax and enjoy the fruits of your labors



First weekend

Root of the matter. Almost everything of importance that happens above ground in your garden during the coming season will depend on what takes place below ground now. It is, in a phrase, planting time. And there is nothing concerned with planting that will give you more to think about than the roots you find at the business end of a rose bush. When you take the season's first rose plant from the shipping carton and hold it in your hand, "root and all, and all in all," you may not, despite Tennyson, know what God and man is, but you will be in a position to learn a good deal about the top and bottom of a rose as well as the oddly misshapen integument between. After planting a couple of dozen dormant roses on a cold April day, you are sure rose bushes are all alike. Only after you have planted your first hundred, will you realize that they are all

The important thing, of course, is to hold each bush in your hand for a moment of careful scrutiny before you plant it. In this sententious instant the whole future of that particular bush may be decided. Now, if ever, you may note and prune away broken roots, as well as those that are so long and stringy they cannot be given decent accommodation without twining. Now you have your last best chance to appraise the conformation of the top structure, to test for hidden breaks near the stem bases caused by the exigencies of storing and packing, to remove twiggy or ill-developed shoots that may draw strength from the plant without contributing useful growth in return. Some plants have short fat roots, some plants long ropey ones. They may produce equally good results if the root tissue is clean and flexible, and especially if there is evidence of new hair-like white root initiation either near the main root tips or along their length. Make clean cuts above even partial breaks, so that more of these white roots will be stimulated. Some plants may have ten or fifteen roots developing, brushlike, from a heavy root stem below the swelling of the "bud" or graft point. Others may have almost tassel-like roots and almost no root stem below the bud. Still others may have only three or four good roots. Be not dismayed. It is not necessarily the kind or quantity of roots that count, but their turgidity and vigor. Similarly, it is not the diameter or bulk of the top structure that will determine the kind of flowers you get, but the balanced framework of clean, succulent canes.

The real purpose of the preplanting check-up (which should take less time to execute than to describe) is to prepare roots for immediate ramification and tops for strong growth buds breaking low on the stems.

This is not, of course, the whole rose planting story. But it is a part of it that many gardeners overlook. And for this part, anytime after now is too late.



Second weekend

Too, too solid earth. Spring is indeed a wonderful season, full of chilblains and promise. But spring ground, for all that robins and crocuses seem to like it, is a wet, cold, airless, intractable mass, suet-like in general consistency and heavy as mixed cement. In fact, were it not for the zeal of the awakening gardener and the metabolic vagaries of the plants themselves, spring would be the worst of all seasons to plant.

The first rule for working wet spring ground is—don't. But when you dig, dig as unfussily as possible. Don't try to break up wet clods. Avoid treading unnecessarily on wet ground, lest you drive out what little air the seasonal moisture leaves room for. If enrichment with compost or peatmoss is necessary, do the required turning with a digging fork, rather than a spade or shovel. It takes three or four times as much manip-

ulation with a solid blade as with fork times to accomplish the same amount of mixing, and the consistency of the soil may be damaged in the process (the principle is not unlike that of folding pastry flour into cake batter, in case you have noticed anyone in your family making cake lately). Better a coarse and casual approximation of a mix than a fine-textured amalgam.

Whether to firm the wet, cold soils of early spring around shrub and tree roots by foot pressure, by means of a puddling stick or hoe handle, or simply by pouring water into the half-filled hole without any firming at all-that is the question you have to learn to answer for yourself. Too much or too heavy pressure with a foot-or pressure applied after most of the hole has been filled with loose soil-may result in either an airless substance around the roots, or an alternation of airless lumps and empty air pockets. Either way, the results may be harmful. General advice: if water is handy and plentiful, water liberally before finally leveling the planting hole. A little more water won't hurt spring soil. What you add will drain away eventually, settling the soil nicely about new roots and leaving porosity as it goes. If you were to turn the soil to putty with pressure or excessive handling, it might not recover its texture all season, even though it could, of course, become quite-dry.

And if water is not available? Goodness knows the ground is wet enough for all normal purposes. So you must lightly firm and tamp—but do the job progressively, so that the earth is settled into place around trees and shrubs as evenly and gently as may be.



Third weekend

Ups and downs. If you were to set up a profit and loss account for the operation of winter frost in your garden, it is a safe bet you would show more gains than losses. On the debit side you have

such matters as new bulbs tossed out of the ground, roots of iris divisions broken by frost heaving, labels knocked askew, stepping stones dropped an inch or two below grass level (when you raise and reset the flags, by the way, you will have a good chance to put a sand cushion underneath them; that will let them stay level better, heave and sink less next winter). And of course frost action brings seeds of crab-grass up from winter storage level where they can germinate. But on the credit side of the ledger, you have the sanitary service of frost-in destroying fungi and a host of insects and insect eggs, in cleaning (yes, cleaning) the flower pots that you had wisely left in inverted stacks to weather for just this purpose. Frost helps to seal the heat in the center of your compost piles, to break up turned clods you left when you spaded the borders and the cutting bed in the fall, to take down to working levels the fertilizer you put on the lawn last month, to aerate and to restore the texture of ground used not wisely but too well last year, to put the final touch of flavor into the parsnips you left in the vegetable rows for spring use, to settle the oak leaf layer you spread under the rhododendrons and azaleas in November, to soften and to mellow the bales of peatmoss you have standing by against spring needs, and to keep spring from coming on too fast.

Taking advantage of frost (if you are lucky enough to have frost) is a useful technique of the resourceful gardener. Remember, if you can't lick 'em, join 'em.



Fourth weekend

Diversionary tactics. To divide and conquer is to adopt a technique with many applications—none more apt than in gardens, where making a little look like a lot is of great importance. But before you reach for your trowel (or hatchet), consider what it is you are thinking of taking apart. Some gardeners divide bearded iris every year, for exam-

ple (specialists may do so either to increase rhizome production rapidly or because they wish to observe a great number of varieties they otherwise might not have room for). But for best garden effect, iris divisions should consist of two-year rhizomes, perhaps three-year. Within reason, and with many species, however, you will find that division of established crowns and resetting of the smaller portions at planned intervals will give you a fast and inexpensive way of populating a flower border. Especially in the creation of drift effects and the building up of strong color or foliage patterns, a deliberate policy of spreading your material thin may give you gratifying results. Such close attention to the expedients of garden building will surely have the further effect of improving the over-all quality of your plants, since old clumps of most border perennials tend to become overgrown, unproductive of first-quality flowers, and in fact truly weedy if neglected too long. (The more durable the species the rattier it is likely to get.) In addition to iris clumps, day-lilies, hostas, asters, poppies come to mind. One thing is certain: you can't make an oval-shaped planting with one plant, however big. Yet you can do it easily with three or five plants, however small.

Book notes. Two new titles are timely, for varying reasons. Jean Hersey's "Carefree Gardening" (Van Nostrand, \$4.95) will give gardeners, or wouldn't-be gardeners, a more relaxed and philosophical attitude toward the heady problems of horticulture. To find gardening as carefree and at the same time as rewarding as the author says it is, you would of course have to be more industrious than her pleasant words suggest. But then, if you begrudged even that little effort, you would still have the words, which are engaging enough.

The other timely book is entitled, by acclamation, to a place on the permanent reference shelf. It is Bernice Brilmayer's crisp and inclusive "All About Vines and Hanging Plants" (Doubleday, \$5.95). Mrs. Brilmayer's expert enthusiasm is scarcely unfamiliar to H&G readers, so all will be forgiven if we say simply that the book's title is an accurate review of its content. Thank a beneficent providence for the likes of Mrs. B.



Modern pest control in home gardens is a multiple-choice affair. Specific pests may be suppressed by any one of several chemicals, and there are innumerable combinations designed to take care of insects,

mites and fungi in the same application. Insecticides include chlordane, DDT, Diazinon, dieldrin, Dimethoate (Cygon), dinitros and oils for dormant spraying, lead arsenate, lindane, malathion, methoxychlor, nicotine-sulfate, pyrethrum, rotenone and Sevin. Miticides may be Aramite, Chlorobenzilate, Dimethoate, Kelthane, Pen-Tac or Tedion. Fungicides are formulas such as cycloheximide (Acti-dione PM or RZ, Actispray), captan (Orthocide), copper, ferbam (Fermate), dichlone (Phygon), dodine (Cyprex), Karathane, maneb (Dithane M-22 or Manzate), folpet (Phaltan, Ortho Rose Fungicide), sulfur, thiram (Arasan, Thylate) and zineb (Parzate or Dithane Z-78).

It is all-important to read the label to ensure the inclusion of chemicals from proper groups and for the safety of both yourself and your plants. Dimethoate is excellent for tea scale on camellias but cannot be recommended for the same pest on Chinese holly; it is safe for aphids on roses, but may be unsafe for aphids on chrysanthemums. In warm weather Phaltan becomes injurious when combined with certain spreader-stickers. Cyprex may injure roses at normal dosage, but is safe and effective at reduced strength. Chemicals prepared as emulsions are often less safe than wettable powders, due to the supposedly inactive solvent.

Spraying is usually more efficient than dusting and provides an opportunity for foliar feeding. The addition of a fertilizer, such as Rapid-Gro, to the pesticide spray every other week should supplement but not replace the spring ground feeding. Hose-end sprayers are easy and satisfactory if there is an extension tube to allow proper coverage of under surfaces. Compressed air sprayers come in many sizes, some on wheels. In either case, prepare the mixture in a separate container and strain it into the appliance. Those who prefer to dust will find the lightweight rotary duster convenient. Tree spraying is best left to a qualified arborist. To prevent unsightly or injurious residue on under-plantings, hose them off immediately before and after the trees are treated.

Pesticide applications are timed for a certain stage in the life-cycle of the pest and the development of the host. The dates indicated are for the vicinity of New York City in an average year. Adjust dates for other areas and abnormal seasons.

Control

Ants Familiar creepers that make mounds in lawns, encourage root aphids.

Treat nests with 5% chlordane dust or 2% spray, or with dieldrin compounds.

Aphids Soft lice that deform buds, curl leaves, transmit virus diseases. Many colors: pink and green on rose; black on ivy, nasturtium, chrysanthemum; red on delphinium; yellow on lily.

Spray as noticed with malathion, Dimethoate, lindane, pyrethrum-rotenone, or nicotine-sulfate and soap. Use aerosol bombs for house plants and spot treatments outdoors.

PINE BARK. White fluffy masses on trunk and branches.

Use lindane, malathion or Diazinon in May or as necessary.

SPRUCE GALL. Conclike swellings at tip of Colorado spruce twigs, base of Norway spruce twigs.

Apply lindane or malathion before new growth in spring or after galls open in late summer.

ROOT. Powdery lice that stunt at roots.

Control ants; drench soil around plants with lindane.

Bagworms Caterpillars, in bags of silk, leaves and twigs, that feed on evergreens, sometimes on deciduous trees. Cut off bags before eggs hatch in late spring, Spray in June with lead arsenate, chlordane, dieldrin or malathion.

Beetles Soft grubs that feed on roots, bark; hard-shelled adults that feed on flowers, foliage.

Grub-proof soil every 3 years; use protective spray on foliage; cut flowers for house.

JAPANESE. Iridescent coppergreen beetle that feeds in sun. ASIATIC GARDEN. Brown night-feeder. Treat turf in early spring with dieldrin or chlordane granules. Spray flowers, foliage with Sevin or DDT plus malathion, or lindane or lead arsenate.

MAY (JUNE). Large, dark beetle that feeds at night on trees.

Use dormant spray, late fall or early spring, of DDT (12% for mist blowers) or methoxychlor.

ELM BARK. Beetle that disseminates spores of Dutch elm disease in feeding niches in bark.

Spray in late spring with lead arsenate, DDT, or methoxychlor. In summer treat base of trunk

ELM LEAF. Dull yellow and black beetle; skeletonize leaves, which turn brown and drop; serious all over U.S.

Spray with DDT in late summer as necessary.

BLISTER. Long, slender, black or striped beetle on flowers aster, clematis, gladiolus.

Blights Cause of indefinite dead areas.

BOTRYTIS BLIGHT of peony makes shoots rot, buds blacken; of tulip, makes flowers spotted; of lily, makes tan, oval spots in leaves; of dogwood, makes a gray mold. Spray weekly with zineb or ferbam for peonies and tulips up to flowering; use Bordeaux or other copper for lilies, zineb for dogwood. Cut peonies at ground level in fall. Burn tops.

AZALEA PETAL. Makes flowers spotted, then brown, slimy. Disease, omnipresent in South, now invading North.


Spray 2 or 3 times weekly during flowering with zineb, Thylate, or Acti-dione RZ. Northerners—avoid Southern azaleas.

CAMELLIA FLOWER. Makes flowers brown with hard sclerotium in center. Disease scattered from California to Virginia. Treat soil with Terraclor in winter. Order bushes from doubtful areas bare-rooted, with all flower buds showing color removed.

FIRE BLIGHT. Causes branches to appear burned. On crabapple, hawthorn, cotoneaster, pyracantha.

Cut out 6 inches below visibly diseased portion; disinfect shears between cuts.



HAWTHORN LEAF. Dark spots on foliage, which drops prematurely in August.

Spray with zineb at bud-break and 10 and 20 days later.

Borers Larvae of moths or beetles working in woody or herbaceous stems.

Spray trunks and branches with DDT or dieldrin at proper time to prevent egg-laying.

DOGWOOD. Works at base. Kills small trees.

Spray in May; repeat in 3 weeks.

BRONZE BIRCH. Kills from top down.

Spray tops in May.

LILAC. RHODODENDRON. Causes sawdust protruding from holes; dying branches.

Spray in May, repeat in 3 weeks. Cut out infested branches.

LOCUST, Kills black locust.

Spray early spring, late August.

TWIG GIRDLER. Gray beetle that severs twigs and branches by feeding under bark

Mites Minute "spiders" with two-part bodies, eight legs.

TWO-SPOTTED (red spider). Yellow or reddish specks on cobwebs. Leaves turn gray, yellow or reddish and drop. Serious on rose, phlox, ivy.

Spray with Dimethoate, Aramite, Tedion or Kelthane. Clean up weeds on which mites overwinter. Give house plants a weekly bath.

SPRUCE. Turns juniper and spruce gray, arborvitae brown, hemlock white; forms webs between needles. Spray with Aramite or Kelthane in May; repeat 1 month later if necessary.

CYCLAMEN. Too small to see; no webs. Makes plants stunted, buds black, leaves deformed; common on delphinium, African violet. Discard injested plants; keep new isolated. Spray with Kelthane or Dimite.

CLOVER. Large, rusty mites that invade houses from lawns.

Keep 2-foot cultivated strip around house foundation. Spray lawn and walls with Kelthane.

Moths

EUROPEAN PINE SHOOT. Causes tips to be crooked, strawcolored; small brown caterpillar. Small ornamental and red pines. Break out infested tips before moths emerge in June. Spray in spring, Dimethoate, late June or July, DDT or malathion.

Spray as soon as noticed with Acti-dione PM, Phaltan, Karathane, or copper oleate.

SNAPDRAGON. Chocolate pus-

Spray with zineb; use resistant varieties.

HOLLYHOCK. Yellow spots on leaves, orange-red pustules underneath and on stems.

Remove diseased stalks and leaves in early spring. Try ferbam, zineb or sulfur.

Sawflies Caterpillar-like larvae.

PINE. Various species feed in groups, chewing off all old needles from a branch before moving to the next.

Apply DDT, lead arsenate, lindane or malathion, April to August according to species. A virus disease is effective.

ROSE-SLUGS. Slug-like insects that skeletonize leaves.

Use DDT, lead arsenate or malathion when leaves are full out.

quarter of the amount would have been ample. The seedlings appeared the fourth day, bouncing up by the score. In a week they were stepping on each other's toes. I thinned the crop with tweezers, fed it with diluted fertilizer, and started transplanting when the tallest seedlings measured less than an inch and had not yet produced any true leaves.

They lived and grew sturdy, doubling leaf pairs for every pinched bud and ringing endless changes on color. After giving a number away and discarding the dimmer shades, I had enough for every suitable spot. When other garden flowers passed their peaks of brilliance, there was always coleus to fill the gap in the borders.

As summer declined, I cut slips from the brightest foliage heads to make new starts for the house. This past winter the window planter has overflowed with their cheerful exuberance. Ivies staggered among them set off the warm hues. I move a pot of coleus to an end table, group three plants on a slab of rock, or arrange one or a pair with a chunk of driftwood or a piece of lichen-crusted bark or a trail of philodendron. A bowl of leafy cuttings ready to root makes a centerpiece for a luncheon table.

Coleus experts always warn of mealybug infestation. In the years since I acquired my first plant, only one has been affected. A toothpick made a quick tool for removing cottony blobs. Leaf spots caused by too much basal moisture around the stem appear no more since I began trenching the water just inside the pot rims, keeping the crowns fairly dry (not too dry, or the leaf tips brown). Coleus enjoys a little fertilizer now and then but does not sulk without it. Of the hundred kinds of plants and bulbs and flowers that I raise nothing rewards me more generously, in luxuriance and grace, for the time expended.

I really should sow seeds of the new Coleus Chartreuse. And of Othello, the black one. And I've never tried Oriental Splendor. (Alluring name, that.) Oriental Splendor in generous doses ought to cure any old fit of blues. These, and others, have been selected and re-selected so that they can be counted on to give reasonably predictable results in both colors and

leaf patterns.

When you sweep up grass clippings after mowing, you improve both the lawn and the compost heap on which you put them

In principle, if not in execution, our plan for a season's optimum-minimum lawn maintenance is simple:

Organize your work. Plan at least one feeding, an anticrab-grass campaign, a mid-summer weed review, a watering schedule.

Fertilize your lawn with special slow-release lawn fertilizers in early spring, again in early fall. (Check directions on bag of whatever brand you select.)

Prevent crab-grass either with a pre-emergence formulation, applied before mid-April, or a post-emergence poison, powder or liquid, from May through August. Remove weeds as they appear. The best weed control is a thick, healthy turf. In new, neglected or underfed turf, use chemical control. Special compounds, applied in the early spring, form a toxic barrier to many weed seedlings including annual bluegrass (partially effective), chick-weed, knotweed and crab-grass (see above). In mid-season, you may spray with 2, 4-D (or a mixture of 2, 4-D and 2, 4, 5-T) or any of several special formulations to kill broad-leaved weeds.

Water only after prolonged dry spells. Lawns of mixed grasses, fescues or bluegrasses need no artificial watering in normal years. (Bent-grasses must never dry out.) When watering is necessary, soak the soil to a depth of 4 to 6 inches. Allow grass to dry thoroughly before watering again. Too much water may stimulate both crab-grass and turf diseases.

Mow weekly, with a good sharp mower, set at an allpurpose height of 11/2 inches. Bents should be mowed twice a week. Remove clippings (see photograph).

Treat turf diseases according to the chart below. (For insect control, see Plant Protection Guide, page 204.)

Brown Patch: Small "smoke | Apply Formula Z, Kromad or rings" that spread, killing patches of grass. Blades are light brown when dead.

Leaf Spots: Fungus diseases that brown out bluegrasses and fescues in warm weather.

Rust: Rusty red dust that stains shoes. May be severe on bluegrasses in late summer.

Snow Mold: Tan, gray or pink patches of dead grass in spring. Roots not always killed.

Arasan 42. Organic mercury compounds also effective.

Same as for brown patch. Merion is often spot resistant.

Prevention is best cure. Keep grasses cut. Feed generously. Don't overwater. Phaltan and zineb help.

Treat spots with reliable turf fungicide after raking out dead grass and reseed. (Brown patch fungicides also effective.)

Sooty Molds Black fungus in honeydew dropped by aphids, scales, mealybugs and whiteflies. Control insects.

Tent Caterpillars Brown, varnished egg masses around twigs. Large fuzzy caterpillars in webs at branch crotches. Prune out egg bands in winter. Wipe out nests or use aerosol. Spray with Sevin, DDT, lead arsenate or malathion.

Thrips Minute, slender insects. Cause damage by rasping.

GLADIOLUS. Make leaves silvery, flowers streaked, spotted.

Spray DDT or dieldrin every 10 days to flowering. Dust corms.

FLOWER. Make rose, peony buds fail to open, margins brown. Insects come daily from tree and grass flowers.

Control difficult; try dieldrin, DDT, lindane or Dimethoate.

PRIVET. Cause foliage to become dusty, plants stunted.

Use malathion or chlordane.

DDT may injure.

Virus Diseases Cause foliage to be mottled or streaked (tulip mosaic), plants stunted or yellowed (gladiolus yellows). Remove diseased plants before insects can disseminate the virus.

ASTER YELLOWS. Plants dwarfed, flowers green.

Apply DDT or malathion for leafhopper vectors.

CHRYSANTHEMUM STUNT.
Poor growth.

Obtain cuttings from disease-free stock.

Wasps Mostly beneficial, sometimes harmful insects.

GIANT HORNET. Tears bark, girdling lilac and other shrubs.

Give trunk and branches a heavy DDT treatment in late summer.

DIGGER WASP (Cicada-Killer). Very large insect; makes holes, mounds in lawns, paths.

Use DDT, chlordane or dieldrin; dust or wash into holes at night.

Webworms

FALL. Hairy caterpillars inside web over ends of branches; found from June to autumn. Cut out where possible. Spray with Sevin, lead arsenate, DDT or malathion.

MIMOSA. Is also important on honeylocust. Makes leaves webbed, brown.

Spray with lead arsenate or malathion, mid-June and mid-August.

SOD. Fat caterpillars in tubes in grass; grayish moths fly at dusk.

Apply chlordane, dieldrin, or DDT in evening.

Weevils Snout beetles, wingless.

BLACK VINE. Occur on yew, hemlock, rhododendron. New shrubs die from grubs at roots; adults notch leaves at night. When adults are due in June, treat soil and plants with chlordane or dieldrin.

WHITE-PINE. Small grubs that girdle terminal shoots of pine, spruce.

Cut off injested terminal; tie up another leader to replace. Spray as buds swell with DDT.

Whiteflies Nymphs are like flat scales, adults like tiny white moths. Suck from underside of leaves and excrete copious koneydew. Common on gardenia, citrus, chinaberry, ligustrum, azalea, fuchsia.

Spray with malathion; repeat as necessary.

ASTER, Makes plants turn brown and die.

Order varieties marked WR.

MIMOSA. Fungus enters through roots, kills trees.

No control. Try resistant Tryon or Charlotte.

DUTCH ELM DISEASE Makes yellow flags in foliage; causes sudden or gradual death. Fungus spread by bark beetles. Dormant spray for beetle vectors; prompt removal of dead trees and branches. No cure yet by injecting chemicals.

VERTICILLIUM. Vessels turn black, often on one side of plant; maples very susceptible, also chrysanthemum, aconite, many shrubs and perennials. Occasionally you can save tree by pruning wilted branches, but it often dies. Do not replace a dead maple in the same spot.

gates at Sacher's after the opera. (As for the Austrian aristocracy, they have never forgotten that in the bad days after the First World War, Frau Sacher always kept a table d'hôte going for the ex-officers who in the past had been among her best clients, and to whom she gave unlimited credit.) At Sacher's you can sup off baked carp and blue trout followed by Wiener schnitzel or that delicious supper dish of brains cooked with scrambled eggs. And you will probably end the meal either with a piece of the world-famous Sacher Torte or that quaintly named sweet of chocolate and whipped cream called Mohr im Hemd (Moor in a Chemise). Or you might have supper after the opera at the Drei Husaren, particularly if you like Hungarian food-goulash and chicken paprika accompanied appropriately by Hungarian gypsy music.

Music everywhere

This year the Vienna Festival will be particularly brilliant, for it celebrates the 150th anniversary of the "Society of the Friends of Music," which started in the time of Beethoven and has always played a leading part in the musical life of the capital. The headquarters of the Society with its magnificent concert halls is on the Karlsplatz just opposite the beautiful Karlskirche. The Festival runs from May 26 to June 24. A high spot on the rich and varied program will be a performance on May 30 of "The Magic Flute" by the Vienna State Opera directed by Von Karajan. Coincidental with the Festival is the reopening of the old Theater an der Wien, the original home of Viennese musical comedy.

But music in Vienna is not confined to the Opera House or concert halls. On summer nights you can hear the operas of Glück performed among the fountains and statues of the Gardens of Schönbrunn and of the Belvedere. Or better still, you can sit among the roses in the Volksgarten, or by the swan pools of the Stadtpark or under the chestnut trees of the Prater and listen to a firstclass band without its costing you a cent. All over Vienna there are parks and gardens where the bands play and people sit listening happily to their favorite Strauss tunes. And there is hardly a coffee house or a Keller that does not boast at least a zither player or violinist.

The most perfect setting in which to hear a concert is in the

Redoutensaal, at the Hofburg Palace, where the former court balls used to be held-the most exclusive balls in Europe, to which no woman was ever invited who could not produce her sixteen quarterings of nobility. The great rambling palace of the Hapsburgs, lying between the Ringstrasse and the inner city, is a place you will be constantly revisiting. It may not always be for the purpose of sight-seeing. You may be attending one of the innumerable congresses that take place in the Zeremoniensaal, for Vienna is still the congress town par excellence. Or you may have friends living in the Hofburg. Last time I was in Vienna, I was taken to visit a wellknown opera singer who occupies the sad, sinister rooms where the unfortunate Crown Prince Rudolph lived, and from which no one will ever be able to chase away the ghosts.

The Hofburg is a place of contradictions. The superbly ornate architecture of the court library, Fischer von Erlach's masterpiece, is a far cry from the austerity of the imperial apartments with Franz Joseph's truckle bed and wooden washstand. The magical beauty of Winterhalter's portrait of the Empress Elizabeth contrasts sharply with the dreary ugliness of her room where the photographs of her favorite dogs and horses and her gymnastic appliances strike the only human note. On a Sunday you can go and hear the Vienna Boys Choir sing in the Gothic chapel, the oldest part of the palace, and then attend a performance of Spanish haute école in the white and gold colonnaded Riding School, where you will see the world-famous Lipizzaner horses, the only pure breed of royal carriage horse still in existence.

For the majority of women, however, the chief attraction of the Hofburg will undoubtedly be the Schatzkammer, the rooms that contain both the treasures of the House of Hapsburg and the relics of the Holy Roman Empire. Here are the coronation robes of Charlemagne and the Imperial Crown of Austria, studded with some of the biggest rubies in existence. Here are the Emperor's Collar of the Golden Fleece, the proudest order of Europe, with a great pink diamond in the ram's head; the emeralds of Maria Theresa; and the barbaric crown of multicol-



ored stones which the Empress Elizabeth wore to be crowned as Queen of Hungary. And here, though it seems a strange place to find it, is the Imperial Crown of Mexico, a relic of that tragic adventure barely a hundred years ago when an Austrian archduke had aspirations for the throne of Montezuma.

Crystal and porcelain

Dazzled by the jewels of the Schatzkammer, you are inevitably reminded of the lovely jewelry that is still produced in Vienna at half the price of Paris or New York. On the Graben, both Paltscho and Köchert (who proudly parades his old title of imperial court jeweler) specialize in those exquisite, typically Austrian flowers carved out of precious stones. Or, keeping in mind the \$100 dutyfree allowance, you will probably get just as much pleasure out of buying, for the price of a few dollars, some of the beautifully designed jewelry made of finely cut, colored crystal and produced by the big Tyrolese glass factory of Swarowsky.

Karntnerstrasse, Graben and Neuer Markt, adjacent to one another, are full of shopping temptations. Very few Americans will be able to resist a tea set or at least a bowl of Augarten china, which is produced by what is still called the Vienna Porcelain Manufactory (as distinct from factory, for every piece is handmade and handpainted). The eighteenth-century Augarten Palace on the outskirts of the city, where the china is made, is well worth a visit. But if you are pressed for time, you can choose your purchases from their shop on Graben and then cross over to Braun, in the same street,

where you can order tablecloths embroidered in exactly the same design as your china. Augarten china is not cheap. Since the days of Fanny Elssler, the Manufactory has had the charming habit of immortalizing its favorite dancers in porcelain, and Tilly Losch told me that she found it very expensive giving her friends these mementos of herself at \$30 apiece.

Antiques—and Gemütlichkeit

Harder to resist even than the china is the engraved glass of Lobmeyr or the crystal chandeliers you can buy for little more than \$100. If you are a purist and want a genuine antique chandelier, the antiquarian Moser on the Franziskanerplatz will make you one out of eighteenth-century crystals for the price of about \$300. Antiquarians abound in Vienna, and you can easily buy Biedermeier mirrors, baroque silver and prints of old Vienna. The initiated antique-shoppers frequent the State Auction Rooms in the Dorotheum in Dorotheergasse, where you can sometimes pick up real bargains in the way of eighteenth-century china and Maria Theresa silver.

The shop that no tourist can withstand is Hiess, on Neuer Markt. Here you will find all the articles for which Vienna is justly famous—the beautifully made bags of leather and petit point, the elegant umbrellas with handles of rose quartz, the gay little music boxes playing the "Blue Danube" and other popular tunes, the lovely crystal goblets with Lipizzaner engraved in gold.

Referring to the shops and to the equally famous delicatessen

stores, a Frenchman once said that Vienna was the only town where they sold both la galanterie et la delicatesse. This is true in more senses than one, for the Viennese still trade on their politeness and their charm. Their politeness is equalled only by their Gemütlichkeit, a word that means warm, cozy, comfortable-any of the three you please-and describes both life in Vienna and the Viennese. You can, for example, go to a coffee house, and for the price of one cup of coffee spend the whole morning or afternoon reading the various local and foreign newspapers supplied free by the establishment. The waiter will take pride in guessing your nationality as soon as you come in the door, and bring you a New York Herald Tribune or a London Times according to his guess. The newest and most lavish of these coffee houses, by the way, is in the former Auersperg Palace with its lovely rococo rooms and well-kept formal gardens.

Another convivial feature of Viennese life is the Kellers. For historic atmosphere there is the Esterhazykeller, which lies at the back of Am Hof, the oldest and to my mind one of the most enchanting squares in Vienna, on the site of the palace of the Bamberger dukes who ruled Vienna before the Hapsburgs.

Vienna abounds in restaurants where two people can have an excellent and satisfying meal for the price of \$2 or \$3 and where a bottle of good Austrian wine, a Gumpoldskirchner or a Nussberger, costs no more than a dollar. Two delightful restaurants in the old part of the town and off the tourist beat are the Goesser Bierklinik and the Griechenbeisel. Viennese restaurants are on the whole gemütlich rather than ele-

gant, and the famous Viennese cuisine with its dumplings and its strudels, is essentially bourgeois. A dish of plum or apricot dumplings lightly powdered with sugar and roasted bread crumbs makes a pudding that is superb even if homely. If you have a good digestion, you'll enjoy the typical Viennese fare of braised beef and Krautstrudel, the venison cooked in sour cream and the baby chicken fried in batter and served with cucumber salad.

You appreciate this hearty fare most after a strenuous morning of sight-seeing in one of the fabulous galleries of Vienna. You might visit the Kunsthistorisches Museum, one of the greatest picture galleries in Europe, or the Albertina, which houses a unique collection of 150 Dürer drawings, or the Liechtenstein and the Harrach Palaces which are again open to the public.

Baroque in a playful vein

For all their splendor, the Viennese palaces too have a certain Gemütlichkeit about them. Vienna Baroque, brought to perfection by Fischer Von Erlach and Lucas Hildebrand and seen at its best in buildings such as the Kinsky Palace with its magnificent carved staircase, and Prince Eugene's summer palace, the Belvedere, with its splendid terraced gardens commanding a view of all Vienna, has none of the heroic proportions that characterize Italian Baroque. The angels in the Belvedere Gardens, holding wreaths of flowers and delicate wrought-iron lanterns, or playing with dolphins, look just like chubby, happy little boys. The giant figures supporting armorial crests on those immense portals typical



of the Viennese palace are strong, muscular men who might have been modeled from the porters who in the old days used to gather around the cathedral waiting for jobs. The goddesses on Donner's fountains have the same earthy charm. They are women of flesh and blood with none of the overlifesize quality of their Roman counterparts. Even Schönbrunn, for all its 1,441 rooms and its rococo extravagances, nevertheless reminds us that Maria Theresa, the greatest of all Austrian empresses, was essentially a gemütliche woman, while Emperor Franz, who lived in the Biedermeier period, insisted on giving this vast palace the air of a country house by painting it yellow with green shutters.

Architectural beauty in Vienna is not confined to palaces. The so-called cottage quarter, a favorite residential suburb, abounds in delightful modern houses, while the council houses in the working class districts, which were built long before the war and at the time served as a model for the rest of Europe, are large, airy apartment houses surrounded by gardens. In the last ten years, 230,000 apartments have been built in Vienna-no mean achievement for a country which, until seven years ago, was under the military occupation that followed World War II.

Life in Vienna is gay and lively, and you will enjoy yourself whether you are sleeping at one of the luxurious hotels on the Ring, or at one of the many more modest but excellent hotels where a room with bath will cost as little as \$4 to \$6 a night. One of Vienna's greatest charms is that the country is at its doorstep. The vine-covered slopes of the Kahlenberg and Leopoldsberg hills; the old villages with painted houses and cobbled streets so close by they could almost be considered suburbs; the lyrical beauty of the Vienna woods which in spring surround the city with a haze of blossoms and pale green larches-all near enough to be available to the people. Every city dweller can spend his summer evenings in the country. The rich will drive up to dine at Cobenzl or at the Fischerhütte on the Kahlenberg. The workman will take his family to one of the little Weinstuben on the Danube. But all classes will converge on the wine suburb of Grinzing to drink the Heurigen (new wine) sitting on trestled tables under pergolas of vines, while the violinists and zither players— among them Karas of "The Third Man" fame-play all the popular melodies. I defy even the most sophisticated person to resist the charm of Grinzing. By the end of the evening he will find himself joining with the rest in the chorus of "In Grinzing beim Wein." I myself have been to Grinzing frequently, but each time I find myself asking for the song every tourist requests: "Wien, Wien nur du allein, sollst stets die Stadt meiner Traume seien" (Vienna, Vienna, you alone remain the city of my dreams").
