





Questions Answers

VERMEIL FLATWARE

Enclosed is a photograph of my set of pearl-handled Vermeil flatware and a closeup of the hallmarks on a fork. Curiously, some pieces in the set are unmarked. I would like to know the age of the set, the quality, where it was made, and the purpose for which it was intended.

B.B.B .- San Antonio, Tex.

Your flatware is gold-plated silver of German origin. The quarter moon and crown is the Reich silvermark which came into use in 1866, so your pieces date after that time. The mark was stamped only on pieces that had a silver content of 800/1000 parts—the standard for German silver (which is somewhat less than the English standard for sterling of 925/1000 parts silver). Sets such as yours were used for the dessert course.

Can you tell me anything about my blue and white scenic platter, measuring 17 by 11 inches? Written on the back is "The Narrows from Port Hamilton"; underneath are the initials W.R. B.M.G.—Lansdowne, Pa.



ENGLISH SCENIC PLATTER

The William Ridgway pottery of Shelton, Staffordshire used the mark W.R. from 1834 to 1856. Port Hamilton, so named by the British in 1854, was part of an island group south of Korea, and is now called Kyomon. Your platter therefore dates between 1854 and 1856.



AMERICAN FIGURAL CLOCK


My grandparents received this clock as a wedding gift in 1895. We think the figures and case are bronze. The face is marked "Mfg. by the Ansonia Clock Co., N.Y., U.S.A." Could it be much older than 1895?

You have a fine example of an American metal figural clock case. We would date it somewhat earlier than 1895, probably somewhere between 1878 and 1890.



ENGLISH BRAZIER

Your brazier is English dating about the middle of the eighteenth century. Such braziers were placed on marble-topped service tables, filled with charcoal, and lighted to keep serving dishes warm. The piercing of the bowl provided air for the charcoal to burn.




I recently inherited this handsome mahogany chair, but was unable to learn its history. Perhaps you could help. The seat cover had several layers of material including the original hand-woven linen. J.S.V.A.—Binghamton, N.Y.

It is American and was probably made by a Philadelphia cabinetmaker around 1765–1780. Chippendale-style splatback chairs such as yours were designed with either cabriole legs and no stretchers, or straight legs and stretchers, the latter preferred for dining.

CHIPPENDALE STYLE CHAIR

These plates were purchased from an antique shop in Baltimore that specializes in bronze. I sent them away for cleaning and the company returned them saying that they were gold. After cleaning, the marks "Tiffany Studios, New York 1708" were legible. Might you know anything about them?





TIFFANY BRONZE PLATES

Tiffany Studios was founded by Louis Comfort Tiffany in 1878 and continued in business until 1933, so your plates date somewhere between these years. Tiffany made decorative objects of brass, copper, and bronze, all of above average quality, but since the studios did not work with precious metals, your plates are probably not gold. More likely they are finished with a bronze spray paint which was often used on Tiffany pieces. The number "1708" is the pattern number.




"VICTORIAN RENAISSANCE" HEADBOARD

The headboard pictured is part of a three-piece set which belonged to my great-aunt. The wood could be cherry or walnut with maple inlays. The headboard is 8 feet 9 inches tall with a figurehead and plumes carved at the top. We would like to know where it came from and how old the set might be.





Notes for the Hostess BY DIANA BRYAN

Instead of packing away my large punch bowl after Christmas to await next year's eggnog, I decided this year to get more use out of it. When Don's boss and his wife came to dinner, I filled the bowl with four dozen roses-two dozen pink, two dozen red-using glass slag as an anchor. Now I plan to fill it with forsythia and luxuriant greenery and put it in the fireplace, which has just had its annual spring-cleaning. Last week, on this same new-ways-to-use-oldthings kick, I rummaged in the attic until I found the two large pitchers that were part of an old washstand set and I've filled them with spring flowers and placed them at either end of the sideboard. They decorate the dining room charmingly and leave the center of the dining table free for vis-à-vis conversation-something that elaborate centerpieces have always made a problem.

Now that the chill has gone out of the weather, I'm beginning to think of outdoor living again. I have quite a large collection of small folding tables for informal indoor dining, but they are not really practical for outdoor wearand-tear. So I was particularly taken with a set I saw at Altman's that have slate-like tops, and are impervious to almost anythingrain, alcohol, sun, heat. I'm going to use them for our summer barbecues and drinks served by the pool. I like the slate-topped ones because they seem to go especially well with our flagstone terrace, but they also come with tops covered in palomino leather-like plastic.

I've been finding all kinds of new uses for the electric knife I got as a birthday present. It cuts fresh pineapple beautifully, for instance, and takes the hard work out of one of my favorite desserts: I remove the outer skin and the inner core, then fill the gap with sherbet—we prefer lemon or lime—encase the whole thing with aluminum foil and leave it to season for an hour or so in the refrigerator. Then,

using the knife again, I cut it in tidy slices that make an attractive ending for a fairly heavy dinner.

The bamboo motif keeps cropping up in some of the most unexpected places. Madge Riffle had a small dinner party last week mainly to show off her new glassware with handcut stems simulating bamboo canes. She had water goblets, wineglasses, liqueur glasses—all



with the same motif. The effect was kind of a contemporary chinoiserie, and while she used them with her set of quite-modern white china, I think they would be equally effective with traditional patterns. She bought them at Tiffany's—where else?—and told me they also have iced-tea glasses and champagne glasses in the same pattern.

Every once in a while Don brings home guests for dinner on a moment's notice, and I have no time to prepare any complicated hors d'oeuvres. For just such an emergency I always keep on my grocery shelf a box of shrimp-flavored chips. They stay fresh indefinitely, and all you have to do is fry them in deep fat and watch them puff up into an exquisite snack. You can even fry them in advance, keep them in a paper bag, and heat them in the oven just before serving. I find they make a great side dish with a hot curry, too. They're made by the Southeast Foods Co., and you can get them in almost any gourmet food store.

LOOKING AND LISTENING

MAKING A LADY OF JAZZ

BY FAUBION BOWERS

In Bach's and Beethoven's lifetimes there was a close affinity between the music of the masters and the popular music of the day. While every greengrocer might not have whistled themes from Bach's fugues, serious composers frequently borrowed contemporary melodies, folk tunes, and dance music without the slightest scruple. Even "royal music" commissioned by a king was composed for the enjoyment of the people. too. But somewhere along the line, the music of the people and the classical repertoire separated, and, until our own day, one liked either, but rarely both.

Young people used to ask each other with intense interest: "Do you like classical music or jazz?" For a long time the wary would respond "classical," since it was not quite respectable among the classical contingent to admire jazz. After all, it was argued, jazz came from chain gangs, brothels, dance halls, and the dives of New Orleans and Chicago. One's musical status waxed or waned according to the degree of austerity and classicism one's taste em-

Things have changed. No longer is it just a matter of being "in" to be a jazz buff. No longer is it a star in your crown to "dig" late Brahms. Calm and eager acceptance of both jazz and the classics as well as an amalgam of the two has become the norm. Both kinds of music are now easier on the ear. and both, at least as of today, are being made from the very stuff of life as it is now being lived. Jazz. in the pure sense of the word, is a supremely American contribution to world culture (although its technical definition includes "European harmony, Euro-African melody, African rhythm, with Spanish, French, and West Indian spicings") but it has flowed effortlessly into the mainstream of world music.

Jazz did not lose its rather raffish reputation, however, until the historic concert wherein Paul Whiteman introduced Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue and "made a lady" out of jazz. Before this time, a number of interactions between music for the moment and music for all eternity had taken place. First, it was the highbrows who looked to the low for new life. Debussy delved into ragtime and cakewalks. Ever since World War I, Stravinsky had borrowed

bits of jazz rhythms and pieces of popular melodies for his music, climaxing his knowledge of the vernacular in the Ebony Concerto. Darius Milhaud in The Creation of the World composed in 1924, the same year as the Rhapsody in Blue, produced a work that might be labeled classical or jazz, according to which ear you heard

But from 1938-the year Jelly Roll Morton delivered his autobiography in five weeks of sung, spoken, and played sessions at the staid Coolidge Auditorium of the Library of Congress-jazz was officially in. So much so, in fact, that the intense intellectual did not dare not like jazz. Meanwhile on the pop-music scene, the classics became an inexhaustible source for borrowed or stolen themes. Take Blossom Time. When the first movement of Schubert's Unfinished Symphony was turned into "You are my song of love," and drummed incessantly into people's ears, many felt they had found the reason why the great man never had finished this work.

Today, however, something remarkable has come into existence-an equality between the two types of music. One former differentiation-"longhair"-has changed its connotation diametrically. The classical violinist with the pageboy bangs has marched offstage, while the rock 'n roll group is more likely to be wearing Bach-length or at least Lisztlength haircuts.

According to Gunther Schul--serious musician, jazz proponent, noted composer, and recent Ford Foundation "Artist-in-Residence" in Berlin where he composed a jazz opera-three streams make up the mainstream of today's music. The first stream is classical-the music which began 400 years ago, gradually losing its improvisational characteristics and becoming acutely formalized. The second stream is jazz. And the marriage of the two creates the third stream. It is this last "stream" in which most of today's musical fun is to be found.


More and more we are getting concerts where both kinds of music are performed in happy, easy co-existence. In January at the important International Festival of Visiting Orchestras, the Cincinnati Symphony, under the leadership of Max Rudolph, devoted

the second half of its program to works for jazz quartet and symphony orchestra. The soloists were the respected MJQ (Modern Jazz Quartet), whose mentor is John Lewis.

A composer writing in both the classical and jazz idioms as well as in the "third stream," Lewis studied music (and anthropology) at the University of New Mexico. After World War II, he joined Dizzy Gillespie's band as pianist, and composed for it his famous Toccata for Trumpet and Orchestra. Then, abandoning jazz temporarily, he enrolled in the Manhattan School of Music, and earned two degrees. Some years later, the Manhattan School canonized Lewis's MJQ, by presenting the quartet under the School's concert aegis. Perhaps his Jazz Ostinato is his most sophisticated example of the new jazz. Written for vibraharp, bass, drums, and piano, it contains in Lewis's own words, "Bartok tensions and Webern pointillism.

Between bouts of composing, Lewis also created another highly significant outfit for music of today-Orchestra U.S.A. This organization's thirty musicians, half of whom have been trained exclusively as classical musicians, and half of whom developed their talents as jazzmen, combine their diverse talents to produce some arresting work. Orchestra U.S.A.'s conductor, Harold Faberman, is at home leading either a jazz band or a symphony orchestra.

Another exciting new composer now making the scene is Donald Erb, currently a Guggenheim Fellow and composer-in-residence at Case Institute, Cleveland, Ohio. The highlight of the Notre Dame College jazz festival this year was his Concert Piece for Alto Sax and Stage Band. While the young jazz hounds in South Bend were jumping to this piece, another type of audience was applauding one of Erb's formal piano sonatas at Carnegie Recital Hall.

Among the Janus-headed performers of today who have also entered the "third stream." Friedrich Gulda, well-known Austrian pianist, is outstanding. Although violinist Joseph Szigeti occasionally played blues and ragtime on his otherwise highbrow Gulda makes a steady habit of it. One of his appearances this year on the Philharmonic Hall's "Great Performer Series" consisted of some Mozart and-so the advertisements read-"a little jazz, too . . .

On the other side of the coin, a large number of jazz groups are using the classics to good purpose. Bill Evans' elegant trio can make

Scriabin or Granados sound 1 the most scintillating of mode rhythms. Art Farmer and the I roque Orchestra, with its arser of brass and winds, can perfor Chopin in jazz rhythm with a briety that is nothing short of a tonishing.

All in all, thanks to the mate ing of recent and age-old tec niques and the meeting of your and old minds, listening to mus is capturing some of the excit ment and thrill usually associate with watching a sport event. Ja: has always been spontaneous an subject to the imponderables improvisation and chance. So ha athletics. Who knows how the ba will bounce or what the player wi do with it? The analogy seems t be working with both jazz and th classics. Jazz is stiffening its in tellectual spine. The accidental ha been returned to serious music cramming it with surprises. At the same time, those fleeting moments of jazz at its best are achieving a degree of permanence. The ver brief discography, below, will give you a varied sampling of some of today's directions and interchanges indicating how blurred the line between jazz and the classics has become. Nearly all the jazz musicians involved have had training in classical music, and in these performances the classicists are paying respectful attention to jazz. It would appear that a new vocabulary is in order-one which will lay to rest the passé connotations of the very words, "jazz" and "classics."







H&G's 1967 GUIDE TO PLANT PROTECTION

BY DR. CYNTHIA WESTCOTT

Garden pesticides have changed greatly in the past thirty-four years, but my advice has not. If you don't know what you are doing, why you are doing it, and when you should be doing it, then don't do anything. You can kill a plant in ten thoughtless minutes; it may take ten years or more for the same plant to die from neglect.

Caution was needed even when chemicals were relatively few and uncomplicated. Caution is vitally necessary today when some pesticides are so poisonous that a few drops on the skin can kill the operator, some have a very long residual effect, some may kill beneficial insects and wildlife as well as the target organisms, and some can be concentrated to lethal proportions in fish and shellfish. In planning the garden insecticide shelf, select materials that are safe for the operator exercising normal care, reasonably safe for wildlife if used as recommended, and nontoxic to the plants you wish to protect if used in proper dilution. Instead of buying economysized packages, purchase only as much as you need for a single season. It is extremely difficult to discard leftover chemicals. If they are flushed into a sewer, they may pollute a river and kill fish; if they are burned, they pollute the air. Current recommendations call for deep burial-but what modern garden has room to spare for disposal pits?

Many sanitary and cultural methods supplement the use of chemicals. The following calendar of operations is suggested for the Middle Atlantic States; work would begin somewhat earlier in the milder regions, later in colder ones. Treatment is limited to some of the more important ornamental plants in the home garden. In many cases, several different pesticides are listed so that you can choose whatever happens to be locally available.

Before opening any chemical, READ THE LABEL! There is a great deal of information on a label and every word has been approved by the United States Department of Agriculture before product registration was granted. Chemicals are sold in various formulations, but the label always gives the correct dosage for each type. Some chemicals safe for certain plants may possibly be toxic to others. Read the label for such precautions.

MARCH

Check the seed catalogues for varieties resistant to certain diseases. Most of these are vegetables, but wilt-resistant asters and rust-resistant snapdragons are offered by some firms.

Start seedlings in sphagnum, Vermiculite or Perlite to avoid damping-off.

Choose a sunny day to walk around the garden with a large paper bag and pruning shears. Cut off twigs bearing tent-caterpillar egg bands. Check arborvitae and other evergreens for the baglike houses of bagworms. Remove the brown galls of cedar-apple rust from junipers. Cut old peony stalks at ground level (this should have been done in October). Remove over-wintering, mite-harboring weeds around the rose garden, and clean up the debris in iris beds. Remove lilac canes killed by borers. Cut off lower branches of spruce killed by Cytospora canker, working only when the needles are dry.

Just before the buds break on scale-infested lilac, euonymus, and other shrubs, vines, and deciduous trees, have them sprayed with a superior miscible oil at a dilution recommended by the







manufacturer. Apply oils early in the day, when the temperature is 45° F. or above. They may possibly injure sugar and Japanese maples, beech, birch, walnut, and butternut.

If you have had trouble with Botrytis blight (black buds, gray mold) on peonies and tulips, spray as they come through the ground with zineb or maneb. Repeat every seven to ten days to bloom.

APRIL

Prune roses when the buds swell—late March or early April, depending on the season. Cut out weak and diseased canes and those harboring pith borers; cut the rest back to sound wood. To avoid cankers, make all cuts *just above* a good bud. If rose scale is present, spray with lime sulfur; otherwise a dormant spray is unnecessary for roses.

To control juniper and pine-needle scales, spray evergreens with dormant-strength lime sulfur before new growth starts. If shrubs are near painted surfaces, substitute a less effective oil spray at a dilution safe for evergreens.

Spray spruce with lindane for gall aphids, which cause swellings at tips of blue spruce, at branch crotches of Norway spruce. Use lindane, or malathion, for white bark aphids on pine.

Spray delphinium with Kelthane to control cyclamen mites. Discard severely crippled plants; make sure new plants are not deformed.

Watch for tent caterpillar nests, and wipe them out while small; never burn them out.

Spray pines with lindane or DDT for white-pine weevil. Cut out wilting leaders.

In late April, spray birches for leaf miners with lindane, dimethoate, Sevin, or malathion. Tree experts control birch miners with a systemic applied to the soil, but this is too poisonous for amateurs.

MAY

At the end of April or in very early May, start treating roses with an all-purpose spray or dust. Dusting is somewhat easier, usually less effective. The combination should include: Phaltan or maneb for blackspot; lindane, malathion, or rotenone for aphids; DDT, Sevin, or methoxychlor for chewing insects; and Kelthane, Aramite or Tedion for spider mites. Some combinations include Karathane for powdery mildew, but many rosarians prefer a separate spray of Acti-dione PM applied only when necessary. Some use dimethoate as a systemic for aphids, mites, and thrips, and some try more toxic materials. The sprayer or duster should always have an extension rod and deflector so that underside of foliage can be covered. The combination rose spray should be repeated every seven to ten days until there is a hard frost.

To prevent borer trouble, spray lilacs in early May, rhododendron, azalea, and laurel in mid-May, and birches in late May. Cover bark with DDT. The latter is highly toxic, and in some states is not recommended for amateur use.

For iris borer, spray with DDT, endosulfan (Thiodan) or dimethoate (Cygon) starting when leaves are 5 to 6 inches high.

In peak years, have oaks and elms sprayed for cankerworms and other caterpillars with lead arsenate, Sevin, or malathion. The microbial insecticide, prepared from *Bacillus thuringiensis*, may give fair control.

Spray pieris with Sevin or malathion when the andromeda lace bug hatches.

Spray pines with DDT, lead arsenate, or Sevin when sawfly larvae start devouring needles.

Spray boxwood for leaf miners before the orange flies emerge (May 10 to 20 near New York City) and holly when black flies of Continued on page 42





holly leaf miner appear. Use DDT or, possibly, dimethoate. Add a miticide to the DDT.

Repeat spray for birch leaf miner (see April).

Spray spruce, hemlock, and arborvitae with Kelthane or Tedion for spider mites. Sometimes a strong stream of water will suffice.

Spray yew with malathion to control taxus mealybug, forcing spray inside the shrub.

If necessary, grub-proof lawns with milky-disease spore dust (for Japanese beetles only) or with chlordane for many soil grubs.

To prevent leaf nematode injury to chrysanthemums, make tip cuttings; do not divide old crowns.

Spray gladiolus for thrips with DDT, Sevin, dimethoate, or

JUNE

Brown or tan crooked tips on ornamental pines are evidence of infestation by the European pine shoot moth. Break off such tips into a paper bag before the moth emerges to lay eggs.

Cut off rose and peony blooms balled by flower thrips. A dimethoate spray may help. Continue the weekly combination rose spray.

As azalea, rhododendron, and hawthorn lace bugs hatch, spray their respective hosts with lindane or malathion.

When brown areas appear in lawns in hot weather, check for chinch bugs. Spray with Diazinon or Sevin, which will also control sod webworms. (Or hot weather may be the cause.)

In warm, humid weather, sudden wilting of delphinium, ajuga, and other plants may be due to crown rot, caused by a fungus with white threads and tan resting bodies resembling mustard seed. Remove plants and surrounding soil. Treat area with PCNB (Terrachlor).

Dust phlox and other plants susceptible to mildew with sulfur, or spray with Karathane or Acti-dione PM.

Spray evergreens for bagworms with Sevin, Diazinon, malathion, or chlordane.

Spray ground and lower branches of yew with chlordane to kill adults of black vine (taxus) weevil. Arborvitae, hemlock, and rhododendron may also be attacked.

Spray mountain-ash with DDT or lead arsenate to prevent defoliation by the mountain-ash sawfly. Use the same spray, or Sevin, on pines for the red-headed pine sawfly.

For the mimosa webworm on honey-locust and mimosa (albizzia), spray with DDT, malathion, lead arsenate, lindane, or Sevin. Repeat twice at monthly intervals.

In late June, the first brood of the autumn webworm may make nests over ends of branches of various trees and shrubs. Cut out where possible.

When the minute yellow crawlers of scale insects appear on lilac, euonymus, and juniper, spray with malathion.

JULY

Spray for Japanese beetles at the end of June or beginning of July. Sevin is effective, safe for people and wildlife, but it is very toxic to bees, and may injure Boston ivy and Virginia creeper. DDT plus malathion, methoxychlor, or chlordane may be substituted. Weekly combination sprays will keep rose foliage intact; between sprays, handpick beetles from flowers.

Spray as necessary for repeat broods of lace bugs on rhododendron, azalea, and pieris (andromeda).

Use malathion for crawling stages of scale insects on trees, shrubs, and vines; also for whiteflies on azalea, ageratum, and other

flowers; and for aphids on chrysanthemum, delphinium, larkspur, lilies, nasturtium, and other flowers.

Remove galls from tips of blue spruce before they open to release aphids.

Spray asters and dahlias with DDT to control leafhoppers. Remove plants dwarfed by aster yellows, a virus disease spread by leafhoppers.

If boxwood and holly leaf miners were not controlled in May, spray now with lindane or dimethoate.

Watch for powdery mildew on rose, phlox, lilac, zinnia, and other plants; spray with Karathane or Acti-dione PM.

Watch for large digger wasps (cicada-killers) in lawns. Put chlorade or Diazinon into nests after dark and seal the openings.

Watch for dodder, a parasitic orange vine common on chrysanthemum, ivy, and other plants after midsummer. Cut out all affected plant parts. Be sure to clean up everything before dodder sets seed.

AUGUST

Spray with malathion for the tuliptree aphid and for crawlers of the tuliptree scale. Late in the month there may be another brood of the euonymus scale requiring malathion.

Watch for black blister beetles on asters and Japanese anemones; spray with DDT.

Continue the weekly combination spray on roses. If rose midge is present, turning tiny buds black and resulting in great reduction in bloom, spray ground and foliage thoroughly with DDT. Repeat in two weeks.

An additional treatment may be needed for azalea and andromeda lace bugs and for lawn chinch bugs.

Watch for giant hornets girdling lilacs and other woody shrubs, killing twigs and branches. Treat bark with Sevin.

Repeat treatments for powdery mildew. See July.

SEPTEMBER

The cyclamen mite becomes active again on delphinium in cool weather. Discard severely infested plants; spray with Kelthane.

Continue spraying roses, especially for mildew, and chrysanthemums for aphids and mildew.

If you are remaking a lawn, incorporate a chemical to kill grubs.

OCTOBER

Cut peony stalks at ground level and burn tops to destroy the Botrytis blight fungus and prevent wintering-over.

Cut stems of phlox and other flowering plants at ground level to eliminate stalk and European corn borers.

To control thrips, dust gladiolus corms after harvest with DDT, lindane, or malathion.

After a hard frost, clean up iris, removing old foliage, but leaving the new fans. This destroys some iris borer eggs.

Inspect tulip bulbs before replanting. Discard any showing small, hard, black resting bodies (sclerotia) of the Botrytis fungus. It possible, plant healthy new bulbs in a different location.

NOVEMBER

Do not prune back roses in autumn; wait until spring. Do not overprotect roses for winter, especially with materials that will keep canes moist and encourage cankers. Except in very cold regions, hilling up roses with soil is unnecessary if they go into winter in a healthy condition. Summer spraying is the best winter protection.

TERMITES—AND HOW TO KEEP THEM AT BAY

Even if they invade your house, you can stop them before they do serious damage

Like most of nature's threats to your sense of well-being, termites play ferociously upon your imagination. The mythology that has grown up around them makes them out to be insatiable little brutes bent on literally eating you out of house and home.

Undeniably, termites are bad actors. Their collective appetites are reckoned to cause over \$250 million worth of damage to houses and other wood structures every year. Yet they are by no means uncontrollable. Armed with an understanding of their ways and wiles, any homeowner can take steps to detect an infestation of his house before serious damage has been done. The following questions and answers, compiled by H&G, in consultation with termitecontrol experts, will tell you what you need to know.

What is a termite? It is a tiny wood-eating insect known to have been on earth for at least 250,000 years. Most of the forty-odd woodgnawing species in the U.S. are subterranean termites—the type you are most apt to be victimized by in your own house. (A comparatively rare type, the dry-wood termite, can survive above ground in the wood that provides its food. Fortunately this unwelcome guest is usually found only in southern coastal areas and Southern California; getting rid of it requires complete fumigation of a house, indoors and out.)

Like ants, subterranean termites are organized in a highly specialized caste system made up of workers, which do all of the wood-gnawing; soldiers, which guard the intricately engineered colony from its enemies (notably ants); winged reproductives, which emerge above ground periodically and establish new colo-


nies; and the king and quee whose reproductive prodigies a count for the tens of thousands of termites in each colony. It is a di couraging fact to homeowners that a queen may live for thirty years and keep producing successive larger batches of eggs for most of that time.

Can termites be seen by the human eye? Yes, indeed, contrart to the common misconception that they are microscopic in size. The measure between ½ inch and ½ inch. The workers normally are not seen, since they live under ground when not chewing on the interior of a piece of wood. I however, you should uncover ther with that best of wood-probin tools, an ordinary househol screwdriver, they will appear a milk-white, plump blobs.

The most likely time to spotermites is during the "swarming period, when the winged reproductives leave one colony to establish a new one nearby. Swarming usually takes place on a warm spring day after a rain. The swarmers unlike the workers, are black and lumpy looking with two sets o transparent wings. They are some times mistaken for flying ants which can be distinguished from termites by their nipped-ir "waists."

If you should discover swarming termites near your house, don't panic. These are not the wood-chewers, and spotting them does not mean your house is being seriously damaged. But you should accept the evidence of your eyes as reason enough to call a reputable termite-control firm to have your home thoroughly inspected.

Are termites found all over the United States? Technically, the answer is "yes, with the excep-Continued on page 52

tion of Alaska." But the infestation rate in Maine, Vermont, and New Hampshire is so low as to be negligible. And the rate is extremely thin in the Rocky Mountain states. As a rule, termites are found wherever the mean average temperature is above 45 degrees Fahrenheit. It follows that the farther south you go, the more prevalent they are. The rate of infestation is notably high in Gulf Coast states and Southern California.

Infestation is normally measured on the basis of the number of houses infested per thousand, and also by the number of years required for "substantial" damage to be done. In New York City and vicinity, for example, the infestation rate is considered to be eight per 1,000 houses, with about fifteen years needed for substantial damage to appear. In New Orleans and Los Angeles, by contrast, the rate is thirty per 1,000, and the period of time, four years. In Omaha, Nebraska, and Canton, Ohio, the rate is six houses per 1,000 and twenty years. In Memphis, 20/ 1,000 and six.

But remember, these are averages and useful only as a guide to the general probability of your house being attacked. For example, it is perfectly possible for a five-year-old house in the New York area to have been infested in its short life and to have sustained

damage. You may find a clue to the infestation rate in your locality by looking in, of all places, the Yellow Pages. The economic realities of termite control will be fairly well reflected by the number of listings for companies in the business of ridding you of the insects.

Is it true that termites are always found only in very old houses? Definitely not. Depending on local conditions, infestation can take place before the last nail is driven-or fifty years later. Consider, for example, what happened in one new subdivision built on a tract that was originally part woodland and part plowed ground. Among some of the houses built on cleared land in the wooded section, infestation took place within a few days. (Termites were already in the ground, of course, and seeking a new source of food.) But among the houses built within the plowed area, the earliest termite

invasion was five years later.

What, exactly, does a termite do? Termites eat wood. They feed on anything that contains cellulose, and wood is their most accessible and abundant cellulose source. But they will also chew away at rugs, books, clothing, curtains. Houses have become a favorite objective in modern times, not only because they have taken the place of dead trees as a prime food source in previously wooded areas, but also because a modern-day house provides the right combination of moisture and warmth to lure termites.

Where should I look for them? The first place to inspect should be the immediate vicinity of water- and drainpipes leading from the ground to kitchens and bathrooms. Equally likely are any earth-filled areas covered by concrete-such as steps, porches, or garage slabs. From these quarters, and from their subterranean nests termites spread out to whereve wood is accessible. They crawl up ward through openings in slab foundation walls (a crack nee scarcely be wider than the thick ness of a sheet of paper to admi termites). To cross open or e posed areas, they construct inge nious and easily identifiable mu tunnels through which they ca crawl to reach nearby wood joist or sills. So, as a practical matter you should inspect the entire p rimeter of your house, inside an out, keeping a weather eye out fo telltale tunnels and evidence seemingly decayed structural woo parts.

If your house is conventional ly constructed (that is, with basement or at least a convenien crawl space) this examination i best carried out from below. Prob sills and exposed wood parts wit your screwdriver; any more tha normal penetration of the poir may well indicate termites at work Where possible, remove any woo in contact with the ground, since this can provide an ideal termit raceway.

Even better, invite a profes sional termite-control man to hav a look. In most states his inspec tion won't cost you a cent; eve in areas where a charge is cus tomary, it will be nominal.







GOING PLACES, FINDING THINGS IN LA CÔTE D'AZUR AND PROVENCE

Mr. William Somerset Maugham once observed of the French that what makes them so difficult is that they are certain they can do everything better than anyone else: "Cook, paint, farm, love, govern. The fact that they are quite right about this most of the time is not a mitigating factor." Love and politics aside, the French certainly paint as well as anyone, farm better than most people, and no one could ever deny them their prowess in the kitchen. But if you would really know how passionately a chef can be wed to his spoon, you must go to France. A French restaurant in the United States can be a splendid thing, but somehow, by enforced exile, enough bloom is off the peach to make the difference. Great French food is something you must get from the bouche of the cheval. With this pleasant thought in mind, and lured by the offer of a villa on Cap Ferrat, I set off last summer to stuff myself like a Périgourdine goose with food, music, and just plain rubbernecking.

The quickest approach to Cap Ferrat is via Nice. There is a direct flight from New York, much in demand, and experienced travelers book it early. I did not, and had to go the roundabout way PHOTOGRAPHS COURTESY OF FRENCH EMBASSY



through Paris where the simple chore of changing planes is a traumatic experience. This is one of the things the Parisians do not do well, preferring instead to hustle you up and down endless ramps searching for mysterious officials who must stamp your tickets and stubs, inform you blithely that you may get your luggage or may not, que sera, sera, then dismiss you with a shrug perfumed with garlic and lemon verbena. Pale and shaken, I somehow found the plane for Nice, got on, and called for cognac, a panacea the stewardess knows all about. She keeps the bottle in her pocket. An hour or so later, I was in the Nice airport, (Continued on next page)



a pleasant place with-for an airport-an excellent restaurant and, since they are Niçois, an assiduously polite staff who handle you like cut glass. The car I ordered weeks ago was actually waiting, and off I went to traverse the entire length of the Promenade des Anglais, the only way to get through Nice without getting lost in back alleys. A boulevard, really, the Promenade ploughs alongside the sea, and if there were any Russian Grand Dukes left, there would be one at every corner. This was their favorite playground and their high jinks are still remembered with a true Gallic regret that no one since has ever thrown away so much money so gaily.

Twenty minutes from Nice. Cap Ferrat is off the road to Monte Carlo. If you don't watch your signs, vou'll end up with Princess Grace instead of on the Cap, which you enter with a quick lurch seaward into a labyrinth of winding roads and walled villas that leads down in circles to the village of St. Jean. Here there is a fairly new, chic, and not shockingly expensive hotel called the Voile d'Or, which is blessed with a good chef. There are other hotels and all manner of pensions, but the Voile is the most amusing, has the best plumbing, and a delightful seaside terrace for dining. Down the road to the right

is a plage where for two francs you can rent a mattress, and for two more, an umbrella, and spend the day in the sun. There is a little bar and restaurant, a swimming instructor, and a fleet of those odd boats that are run by pedals, like a bicycle. The beach is composed of tortuous little black rocks, so unless your feet are made of cast iron, it makes sense to buy the white rubber swimming shoes the village offers for American tender

Plunk in the middle of the village is Cappa's restaurant, famous for its bouillabaisse, and justly so. It is, of course, a dish you must truly love, for it should be eaten with aïoli, the mayonnaise infused with all the garlic the cook can beat into it. Although the flavor is ineffable, keep in mind that you're eating TNT. If bouillabaisse is not for you, have mostelle, a delicate fish quite like our pompano which the Cappas bake with herbs and bread crumbs. The wine of this particular country is Chateau de Selle Clos Mireille-amber and heady, and the restaurant does a very good Grand Marnier soufflé which they rush from their kitchen across the street high on one arm while the other halts traffic. A perilous voyage. For a good restaurant, Cappa's tariff is surprisingly reasonable, and as in most French restaurants today, service is compris. One should leave only chicken feed as a tip. Full of Clos Mireille, I left the old customary pourboire, a good one, which Monsieur Cappa accepted with a whacking of his withers and a happy shout of "PLUSSS," which I suppose meant that he was delighted and that I was an idiot. Thereafter, I perused the hill.


La vie en rose

My villa, half flowers, half house, came complete with Madame Monnet, a remarkable lady who has lived on the Cap since the day she was brought there, years ago, by the Duchess of Sutherland, a peeress who traveled with a staff of eighteen. Madame Monnet, who is as English as Cheshire cheese, was the tweeny. She married the gardener, had two children (now respectively a nun and a swimming instructor), divorced the gardener, and in the meantime was taught to cook by the Duchess' French chef. Today she is probably the best cook on the Cap and is not simply asked to bring her talent to various houses, but wooed. Along with a huge repertoire of complex recipes, she has also acquired a dossier of gossip that reads like Burke's Peerage, except that it is much funnier. This rattling of coronets in closets is due to Cap Ferrat being not only the prettiest point the French Riviera, but the gran est. It has been so ever since Kin Leopold II of Belgium winter there in a gigantic mansion wi one or another of his galaxy mistresses

The Villa Leopolda (now t property of the gentleman w makes Grand Marnier) is not op to the public, but anyone can vis any day but Monday, another fa tastic mansion, now the Musée l'Ile de France. This Italiana wedding cake was built by the Ba oness Ephrussi, née Rothschild, a residence and an eventual m seum which she willed to France The Baroness collected magni cence as the Collier brothers co lected newspapers, and the house was built not so much as som thing to live in as a frame-a kin of Tiffany setting-for her posse sions. They are all priceless (th Sèvres dinner service of 400 piece is supposedly the greatest in exis ence), completely heterogeneou and dazzling. After I had absorbe as much as I could, I repaired for air to the gardens, of which ther are four, all beautiful, all quit unrelated. They begin with a for mal French garden which sudder ly about-faces to become an Eng lish type, rather wild and wooll This in turn parts company to dro down to the sea in two versions Continued on page 6



one Spanish, one Japanese. A temple of Venus watches this quickchanging in complete serenity from a little hillock, and they say that the wraith of the Baroness still watches from a balcony, ready to screech at anyone daring to steal one of her lotuses. Once or twice each summer the Comédie Francaise comes down to play a charity

performance of Molière or Beaumarchais on the great terrace overlooking the gardens. The Baroness' tapestries and furniture are brought out to set the stage, the audience sits on little gold chairs, and it is all glitteringly gala. Since this is the highest point of the Cap, the wind can be as sharp as a hound's eyetooth, so unless it is a hot summer, wear woollies.

Down the road a bit from the Cap is Beaulieu, a pretty little town famous for two reasons: the patronage of King Edward VII of England and the Hôtel Réserve. If Edward and his ladies put the town on the map, the Réserve and its marvelous restaurant have kept it there. The food is not only luscious, but interesting in that it does not confine itself to being classically raffiné. The day I was there the speciality was paupiettes de veau Nicoise-a country dish. (In Ohio, my grandmother called the thing veal birds.) The paupiettes were stuffed with heaven knows what, then bathed in a sauce of tomatoes, wine, and green and black olives. Beaulieu, incidentally, is much given to water fêtes, the ballet, and sometimes the two in tandem. A floating stage is moored in the cove, the audience is disposed in a wooden amphitheatre on the shore, and ballerinas of the importance of Rosella Hightower bring their troupes and dance their heads off. A lovely sight by moonlight, the spectacle ends with bravos, a sibilant throwing of kisses, a bravura display of fireworks, and a snarl of traffic such as only the French know how to get into, and out of. I didn't try to compete, but sat safe and sound in a quiet café until Maman and Papa and Bébé had honked their way home.

Going north straight up the mountain from the Cap to the Grande Corniche, you end at Eze, a tiny, enchanting town built on a rocky needle with an ancient château hung on its tip like a finial. The château is now a restaurant called La Chèvre d'Or (it takes a goat's agility to get to it) with an unbelievable view and beautiful food at prices that will curl your hair. But I paid them, and for dessert had the chocolate cake, a plain-Jane name for a most unplain concoction of chocolate, rum, whipped cream, and black cherries. If you have any money left, it's fun to shop a bit afterward down in Eze. It is an artist's town, and you can buy very nice watercolors, still damp on the easel, for a song-or almost.

Still on the Grande Corniche, but closer to Nice, is La Chaumière, a restaurant noted for giving you a choice of only two things, steaks or mutton chops. Both are fabulous, and both are cooked in an open fireplace fed with olive wood and great sprays of laurel leaves, basil, and thyme. The perfume is somehow imparted to the meat in a way our barbecues know not. The centerpieces at La Chaumière are all still lifes made of vegetables (you may eat them if you like), and although you may have a cocktail, it is a risky choice There is one excellent wine, made by the owners-and always, in season, gigantic framboises served with thick cream brought to you in a milk can 2 feet tall.

Aïoli and bikinis

The Grande Corniche ends at Nice, and for anyone with acrophobia, high time. Heading Spain ward, you can now sweep through the entire Riviera, sampling its towns as you go. At Cagnes, ar erstwhile fortress-château is now a museum with constantly changing exhibitions of contemporary paintings and an important collection of Lurçat tapestries. Clustered around it like chicks around ar ancient hen are tiny shops, artists studios, and a mad jumble of very jazzy little nightclubs filled with beards.

From here on, the seaside playgrounds pop up like ducks in a shooting gallery: Antibes and Juan-les-Pins, then Cannes, a sizable city that seems to be built entirely of luxury hotels and grand apartments. Hidden away among the fleshpots is the restaurant of La Mère Bresson, a lady known far and wide for her superlative aïoli. She has won prizes for it, been decorated for it, and gives no one her recipe. But the garlicky

mayonnaise is yours for the ordering, along with her equally noted Aspic de Moules Rémoulade and Quenelles aux Écrevisses-the latter served with a sauce laced with Pernod. In the good old days, it used to be absinthe.

Then comes St. Raphael, a pretty place where Gounod com-

posed Romeo and Juliet and where, if you have conspired with nature, the Mimosa Festival may be in full, fragrant swing. You are now almost at the end of the Côte d'Azur, which bows out with a bang at St. Tropez, Brigitte Bardot's town. St. Trop, as the jet set calls it, must be seen to be believed. Stagily picturesque, its liveliest street curls around the port in a flamboyant jamboree of shops and cafés. This is a parade ground, a show-off place for jeunes filles and filles not so jeunes who are going to look like Miss Bardot or know the reason why. Some do, some don't, but all of them wear the Riviera national costume, the bikini, most of which, as sported in St. Trop, would just about cover a mouse. It's a very interesting parade indeed, but when your eyes begin to blur, it is soothing to have lunch at Les Mouscardins, a quiet, cool, and dignified restaurant with no hint of the razzle-dazzle at its front door. Wonderful melons and peaches here, tender little steaks, and a delicious rosé du pays. St. Trop is also a good place to stock up on espadrilles. They come in as many colors as there are bikinis. Even the men's styles have dash, and the prices are reasonable.

The Riviera is great fun, the sun is superb, and the people live to be a hundred. But the time has come to feed the inner man, which involves a run northwest a bit to Vence and Matisse's Chapel of the Rosary. The trip should be planned carefully, for the chapel, attached to a convent of Dominican nuns, is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays only for two hours in the morning and two in the afternoon. At first sight the interior of the little building seems almost the work of a precocious child. Then, after a

thoughtful ten minutes or so, ye realize that it is a masterpiece, room filled with a light that pou through the yellow, green, ar blue windows with a luminosi that is almost tangible. Two wa of white faïence are background for Matisse's black line drawing of St. Dominic, the Virgin an Child, and the fourteen stations the cross. The drawings are ve simple, very powerful, very mo ing. So is the chapel.

Down the road a bit is a sho that sells the pretty local potter After browsing there, I drove bad into town to visit the open marke The fruits and vegetables are ma velous (French farming!) and is the way a French housewi buys them. Each haricot vert scrutinized for perfection, the laid gently away in a string bag a though it were an emerald. In way it is: the prices are pure Ca tier. Off now to the next town, S Paul de Vence, and the celebrate Colombe d'Or restaurant, whe you lunch on the terrace under flicker of white doves and, unde them, pearl-gray umbrellas clu tered like elegant mushrooms. is helpful to be raging with hur ger, for this is a formidable me that starts with a charcuterie seven sausages, hot and cold ho d'oeuvres, and a bouquet of veg tables. If you fancy fish, there is wonderful loup (it does have wolfish expression) cooked wit burning fennel inside, like a little bonfire. Before or after lunch Monsieur Roux, the proprieto will show you his pictures. H owns one of the most compreher sive collections of modern pain ings in France.

Museum hopping

Using St. Jean-Cap Ferrat a a springboard, I found museur hopping to be very simple. Th Léger Museum is in Biot, near Ar tibes. Outside Antibes is the Châ teau Grimaldi where twenty year ago in the course of one summe Picasso painted twenty-three pic tures, made thirty-three drawings seventy-eight ceramics, a tapestry twenty-seven lithographs, tw sculptures, and finished with a doz en oil paintings on paper. The re sult of this summer of energy i all on display and never travels There is a museum of Picasso pot tery in Vallauris, the pottery cen ter, but for my money, hardly rea son to make the trip. The town is uncharming, flooded with potter and their pots, and jammed to suf focation with tourists buying ash trays. Just outside St. Paul de Vence is the Maeght Museum, and this is worth your money. The building was designed by José Luis Sert in a whirl of roofs and

walls that makes perfect sense: the windows capture the best possible light for the painted jewels inside —Braque, Miró, Derain, Chagall, Kandinsky, and Giacometti. In Nice, you can combine shopping with a trip to the Musée Cheret for Dufy and Matisse, the Musée Masséna for Berthe Morisot. The best perfume shop, incidentally, is the Palais des Parfums in the Place Masséna. Everyone, including the delivery boy, speaks scented, mathematical English.

Around the bend from the Cap is Villefranche, a hoppingly lively little town with a magnificent harbor that divides its favors between cruise ships, tycoon's yachts, and anything at all that floats and that you can catch a fish from. The Welcome Hotel lives up to its name by being very comfortable, modest in price, and fussy about its cooking. Luckily, I had a room on the port side with a balcony-a crow's nest for the passing show, a polyglot and fascinating mixture of bathers on their way to the plage, the town dogs, who are all clowns, sailors off their ship for a binge, sailors recovering from binges, fishermen comparing their catches, elegant people getting on and off yachts with mountains of Gucei and Vuitton luggage, and a man who sings what I suspect are highly risqué songs while riding a bicycle on its

rear wheel alone. Without ever alighting, he passes the hat.

At the entrance to the port is the Chapel of St. Pierre, a funny little building (from the outside) where for years the fishermen stored their nets. Then, ten years ago, the chapel was given to Jean Cocteau to decorate, and today it is the town's showpiece. Quite unlike the Matisse Chapel, it looks like a filigree of wonderful, rather amusing embroidery in pink and blue, green and cream. St. Peter is the protagonist in a series of scenes from his life, and while there is no lack of reverence in the artist's interpretation, there is a delightfully mixed bag of supporting characters-fishermen, fishergirls, gypsies, angels, and fish, the latter looking with goggle-eyed amazement at St. Peter walking on the water.

North to Provence

By now, July was almost gone, and it was time to kiss the Mediterranean goodbye and head west and north to Aix-en-Provence, one of the most beautiful cities in France, peppered with superbold houses (in the great days, the city had almost more nobility than hoi polloi), many with courtyards and fountains, and every one of them so irresistibly photogenic that they eat up film with a piranha's speed.

Aix is also the home of the annual Music Festival and many of the concerts are given in the inner courtyard of the old Archbishop's Palace. Tickets are difficult to come by, so it's safest—via your travel agent or the concièrge at the Hotel Roy René—to book ahead, far ahead.

On the ground floor of the palace is one of the prides of Aix, the Museum of Tapestries, hung to the gills with a collection of priceless eighteenth-century Beauvais weaving that was found over a century ago amid the cobwebs of the palace attics. The tapestries were probably hidden away to escape the looting of the Revolution, and obviously fared better than their owners, for whom the tumbrils must have come too soon. Around the corner from the palace is the Cathedral of St. Sauveur, a rich hodgepodge of styles that begin with the fifth century and end with the sixteenth. There is a beautiful Gothic cloister, a baptistry with a pool big enough to duck a sinner in, and, around the nave, twentysix Brussels tapestries hung like sumptuous wallpaper.

Aix, of course, was where Cézanne lived and painted, and his little house is kept as a shrine—nicely haunted, neighbors say, by the old boy himself, complete with beard and his dinner napkin tied around his head. The countryside


surrounding Aix is one Cézanno landscape after another, all star tlingly familiar, just as the whea fields and gnarled cypresses tha circle Arles makes you think you have strayed into a vast painting by Van Gogh. Arles, which is no far away, is the bullfighting center of Provence, with the old Romar arena the bull ring. Almost more Roman than French, the town is

full of picturesque ruins, including a quite usable theatre. This is also cowboy country, and if you are looking for something inspired by way of fancy dress, the shop are full of the regalia. The only hitch is getting into the pants which must fit like paint. Arles is



also the best place for the saffroncolored pottery Provence housewives couldn't keep house without. The color varies from town to town, but here it is a warm, almost stinging yellow that is very handsome. You can buy a little cocotte for an egg or an entire dinner service.

Up the road from Arles is Avignon with its much sung-of pont and its renowned Palais des Papes. The bridge is picturesque and the palace is endless—a regal tangle of courts and corridors, chapels and oratories and retiring rooms, all a bit chill except one, La Chambre du Cerf, which is frescoed in the most charming manner with hunting, hawking,

and fishing scenes. The Pope who commissioned it was either a mighty hunter or had a sense of humor.

Not far from Avignon is Les Baux, a crag-top village hung around the ruins of a fortress-castle. Almost, but not quite, a ghost town (about fifty people still live there), it is beset by visitors come to enjoy the panoramic view, to prowl through the ruins (this is for the surefooted only), and to bargain in the shops-of which there are several, all good-for faïence and enchanting dolls and quilted table mats made of Provence cotton in brilliant floral patterns. These are very special. Down in the valley, and even more special, is La Baumanière, one of the great restaurants of France. Having been warned in advance, I booked a table days before and dispensed with breakfast. The Martinis, which you sip on the poolside terrace, are a revelation (Maugham was right: when the French want to outdo everyone, they can), and even the ashtrays are elegant. I stole one. If there are two of you, order the gigot. This is a true baby leg of lamb with the bone removed, stuffed with minced kidneys and herbs, then baked en croûte-in a little

pastry overcoat. There are colless other things on the menu, superlative, but save room for pistachio, almond, and mocha cothat looks like a block of green jade. A little boy at their table caught me eyeing his interelish of this lovely confect blushed a little, then said in still very careful English, "It is all v good, but it is not for every da How right he was. Don't fawhen you get the bill.

Also a quick spin from Ai a tiny town called Noves and Baumanière's only local ri L'Auberge de Noves. If I had choose between the two, I wo be tempted to vote for L'Auber Nestled in a peach orchard, the looks like something out of a Fontaine fable. You lunch in garden, and you don't stop fo long time. Again, the choice is e less, but if it is your first tin start with the Plate of the Gard er-twelve cold vegetables, each a little cup, each with a dress designed as a perfect complem to it alone. Then have the ro duckling with a sauce made wine and six fresh herbs. Th pungency, which will astound y makes the usual orange or che accompaniment seem utterly l less. Order salad, again with her spinach mixed with whipped creand topped with toasted chee and a fantastic dessert-a prali mousse filled with raisins, soak in rum and served with a hot che olate sauce. If there is a bot left, ask for Châteauneuf-du-Par '55. The wine is mentioned hushed tones and poured like I uid rubies. I have never tasted an thing like it.

Au Revoir

The last day in Aix (I w finally hungry again), I drove to the Château de Meyrargu about ten miles from town for t restaurant's three great specia ties: the Pâté de Grives, which made of thrushes (somehow, y don't mind a bit); the filet of bee first grilled, then glorified wi butter, a whisper of garlic, and dusting of fresh thyme blossom and, for dessert, Crêpe Soufflé Ch telaine. This astonishing invention is a very delicate pancake glaze with grated lemon peel, the wrapped around a golden cloud lemon soufflé. How this is don only the chef and, of course, I Bon Dieu, know. Neither is telling

H&G's allmark House for 1967

A contemporary plan nriched by loving handcraft



Despite its protective walls, our Hallmark House offers a wide and welcoming entrance. A sense of arrival is created by the approach up the 13-foot-wide stone steps and through the 40-foot-deep courtyard to the monumental Mexican stone doorway. The double doors are wide enough to admit a wheeled vehicle, but a smaller door is cut in one of them for today's foot-borne.

his is the tenth house—the milestone of a decade—to be cited by H&G as a Hallmark House. Like its predecessors, it was chosen for two kinds of excellence—distinction of design, and its worth in human terms: the singularly personal felicity it affords the family who live in it. Built in a suburb of San Antonio, Tex., for Mr. and Mrs. Marshall Terrell Steves and their three sons, Marshall, sixteen, Edward, fourteen, and Sam, eleven, it was designed by O'Neil Ford, a contemporary architect with a profound interest in the past. His fervor is more than shared by the Steves, whose fascination with Spanish Colonial architecture, like that of so many Texans, is inherent. San Antonio was founded as a mission, the Alamo is its heart, and compared to Dallas or Houston, the city has a flavor all its own. Although the Steves had lived for years in a traditional house, when the time came for change, it was inevitable that their new house be an American hacienda—a house dedicated to preserving the crafts and cultures of the region called North of the Border. Because they have been Texans for generations and lovers of everything Mexican all their lives, the Steves (he is president of the HemisFair to be held in San Antonio in 1968) were enormously involved, in a personal way, with each detail of their house and everything in it. (Continued)

he most cogent reason for giving the Steves' house our Hallmark citation is because it is contemporary in the way it works and is lived in without conforming at all to the starker aspects of modern design. Much of it was built by artisans brought from Mexico, and the handicraft evident in the stone floors, brick vaults, roughly carpentered woodwork and irregular walls creates the effect of a house of antiquity rather than one less than four years old. In addition, because it has roots, the house provides a wonderfully warm and commodious background for entertaining and family life. Utterly hospitable to any demand, it is a beautiful house well armored with practicality. Its contemporary spirit is mellowed with endless enrichments from a day long past, and it offers the great gift of a series of outdoor areas-patios and courtyards-designed to heighten the pleasure of almost every principal room. Very large (14,000 square feet), elegantly sprawling, completely walled in from passers-by, it is built in three separate wings—one of bedrooms, one of formal rooms, one for entertaining—linked by a 100-foot-long gallery that plunges through the house like a great life-giving artery. Yet, despite its size, the house is so admirable a wedding of the romantic and the pragmatic as to be an inspiring source of ideas, all adaptable, wholly or partly, to smaller, less complex houses for families anywhere in the country. Since one of the most fascinating aspects of the house is the derivation of its architectural details and furnishings, H&G has asked James Norman, a close friend of the Steves and an authority on Mexican culture, to relate this part of the story. A resident of San Miguel de Allende, Mr. Norman is the author of "Mexican Arts and Crafts" and is also responsible for the newly revised "Terry's Guide to Mexico."

Exciting, yet comfortably intimate

t was so broad, eight horsemen could ride abreast along it . . . "Thus Bernal Díaz, chronicler of the Spanish conquest of Mexico, described the causeway-entrance to Montezuma's fabulous capital. Were Díaz around today he would be equally impressed and at home in the spacious gallery of the unique Spanish Colonial residence of the Marshall Steves in San Antonio, Tex. The Steves' hallway "is more than a gallery," says architect O'Neil Ford. "It is a dramatic avenue-room off of which the living areas extend like flags." It sets the atmosphere and links the exciting elements of this large yet comfortably intimate house which perfectly suits San Antonio with its 250-year history of cultural ties with Old Mexico. The massive walls, the high-ceilinged rooms, the richly tiled floors evoke a feeling of Spanish austerity combined with Mexican warmth. Every vista is a delightful reminder of the mellow culture south of the Rio Grande. Carved stone fountains, century-old doors, soaring archways, native artifacts, and piquant popular handicrafts from Guadalajara, Oaxaca, Michoacán, and Chiapas have been collected by the Steves and their friends with, as the Mexicans say, cariño or loving care.

Everything in the house has individuality, escaping the rigidity of mass-produced modular forms. No two doors, for example, are the same shape or size. The standard metal grilles of air-conditioning vents are replaced by fanciful carved stone grilles fashioned in Mexico. Nevertheless, imaginative designers have included the necessary conveniences for modern living. Hidden beneath the Mexican tile floors in the bedroom wing, for instance, is a radiant heating system. Although the entire house is surrounded by high Mexican-style walls, outdoors and indoors blend pleasantly because each room is flanked by a flower-filled patio or garden which serves as an out-of-door extension of the room.

The backbone of the house—the gallery

gallery, 100 feet long, sweeps off to your right and left to the fa ends of the house. The gallery is roofed by nine 19-foot high brick bóveda vaults surmounted by glass lante As the sun shines and shifts, these tiny cupolas entice streams of light into the gallery and create charming patterns of chiaroscuro on the walls and floor. Offering constant surp and invitation, a variet of rooms and outdoor areas open from each side of the gallery and at both its ends. Between the doors on the left hangs a paintin of three horsemen by Fred Samuelson.





An important factor in the easy livability of the house is its division into the three, and the four adjacent outdoor living areas as well, branch off the spining, there is a two-part wing with the boys' three bedrooms and two bat master suite, the other. The living wing is the core of the house. A two-story, sopens from one side of the gallery, and, from the opposite side, a brick-domed of kitchen and breakfast room. The third wing is basically an entertaining center with a guest room flanked—directly outdoors—by the swimming pool patio. The second clusters produces the effect of three houses under one roof. 
Swimming pool patio and mirador

A sweeping 42 by 57 feet, the pool patio is paved in unpolished Queratoro stone, a pleasant contrast in texture to the pool's black ceramic tile. The spiral staircase leads to the mirador (in Spain, a roof garden), half open, half sheltered by an open-raftered roof, and a lovely place to seek a breeze on a hot night. Weathered stone coping from walls was all brought from Mexico; door frames, rails, and lintels are crudely cut, lightly stained to emphasize the country-hacienda character of the house. For lunching and easy service, a door is handy to the kitchen.

The living room fulfills two functions. With its masonry walls, 20 feet high and 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet thick, it is baronial enough to share its loftiness with a balcony-library without stinting on headroom in either section. In cozy contrast to the rest of the room, the area beneath the balcony is a snug cave, complete with bar, and a nice spot for a drink with friends. The room's extra height is achieved by lowering the floor two steps down from the gallery, from which you descend through a dramatic proscenium-like entrance framed, like the windows, with deeply splayed reveals. Walls of rough white plaster and the handsome ceiling are further evidence of the Steves' fondness for hand-wrought details and surfaces: old railroad ties were fitted together like giant matchsticks, then supported by new cross beams and console brackets. The new wood was given a convincing, hand-made patina, so the entire ceiling looks as old as the hills. Very old indeed are the eighteenth-century fireplace, beautifully carved of cantera, the same stone that paves the floor, and the spiral stone staircase (it once spun its helix in a house in Puebla) leading to the library. Not so old, but very pleasant are the views from each side of the room—fountain patio on one side, Santiago patio on the other.

pining room, kitchen-and-pantry, and breakfast room are interlocked in a 1-2-3, side-by-side arrangement that makes for step-saving and smooth service. The dining room has a really splendid bôveda dome that, since the room is rectangular, must have taxed even the considerable skill of its artisan-masons. As in the bôveda vaults in the gallery, the central wedge of brick running in the opposite direction is inserted—rather like a segment of orange—for strategic support. Instead of a bôveda, the kitchen has a square, center skylight with splayed sides like the window reveals; a huge hanging lantern provides night light. The pantry is separated from the kitchen by a long peninsula counter—a good working arrangement that divides the cooking on one side from the service to the dining room on the other. Only a few steps away are the flower-arranging sink (faced in the kitchen's blue-and-white tiles), a laundry, a marvelous storeroom for silver, glass, and china, and a servant's bedroom.



Step-saving kitchen is arranged in a neat U with sinks at center, work-and-service counter at left, cook-top and ovens at right. For all its slickness of function, it is also a pretty room—a service rendered by a paving tile floor, walnut-finished cabinets, and yards of bright blue-and-white Mexican tiles.







At the west end of the house, the great gallery ends in a burst of sunshine that pours in from swimming pool court to the breakfast-barbecue room at the left and the game room structure. The game room is a fascinating room where the family not only plays cards, but enjoys a stantly changing exhibition of their collection of Mexican artifacts and folk art—all displayed wall of deeply recessed, illuminated shelves. The bedrooms:

privacy and individuality

Pleasantly remote and self-sufficient, the family sleeping area enjoys that inimitable kind of peace known as total privacy. (Even the guest bedroom at the other end of the house is cushioned from the game room and pool patio by a bath and a thick blanket of closets.) But within their confines, the bedrooms are anything but monastic. The colors are vivid, the wood, richly carved, the rugs, sumptuous. Mr. and Mrs. Steves each have a bath-dressing room; son Marshall has a room and bath; Sam and Edward each have a bedroom but share a bath. Storage, even for so large a house, is close to phenomenal. Lumped together, closets run for a total of 100 feet along one wall of all the rooms, and there is an additional 40 feet of storage-wall lining the hall in the boys' section of the wing.



Everybody knows azaleas. Along the Christmas-Easter axis, not even roses are in the azalea's league for either popularity or instant recognition. And certainly there is no pot plant on the florist's list that can hold a candle to it. Nevertheless, it is a far cry from the florist's cherubic bush to the airy and graceful starbursts of azalea bloom that illuminate the springtime landscape. And it is almost as far a cry from the conventional dooryard azaleas, which parade some of horticulture's brightest and most insistent colors, to the wild azaleas of the awakening woods. There, with the season's march all the way from the southern tip of the Appalachians northward to Massachusetts, the palest yellows, lavenders, pinks, burnt chromes, and outright oranges sing beneath leafless tree branches. While on the East Coast, the show reaches from Florida and Louisiana into chilly New England, on the West Coast the show runs only from northern California to British Columbia.

When the azaleas are well into their flowering, the rhododendrons begin. The line between the two is a difficult one to draw, since botanically all azaleas belong to the rhododendron genus, as their true names indicate. But the distinction between the two great groups is generally recognized by anyone who has seen them both.

The wild azaleas of both America's and Asia's temperate regions bear their flowers, for the most part, either before their leaves appear in the spring or as the foliage opens. Only a few flower after the leaves have developed fully. Nature has given us a score of congenial species, and plantsmen through the years have added many hybrids that can spread sheets of delicate color across the garden.

Whether you have a woodland you can call your own, or merely a clump of trees or a collection of a few large shrubs, a handful of wild azalea species chosen for adaptability to your regional climate can make the coming of spring to your landscape an adventure in shimmering color. Flowering, as most of them do, before any new leaves emerge on the landscape, they have the muted world of the new season all to themselves. In natural and naturalistic plantings, where almost all of the American species are most often seen at their best, they create a new layer of color for the eye—above the conventional wild-flowers and spring-flowering bulbs, below the early blossoms of the larger shrubs and small woodland trees.

A hopeful note for gardeners is that the regions, often fairly restricted, where the American azalea species are indigenous, do not by any means set the limits of the areas in which the plants will grow successfully. The azalea melting pot, so to speak, would boil most briskly around Washington, D. C., or a little to the south of there (as a matter of gratifying fact, one of the finest collections of azaleas anywhere is in Washington's National Arboretum). There are a dozen species that grow well in the Arnold Arboretum in northerly Boston, just as there are at least as many mostly different ones—that thrive in Callaway Gardens in southerly Georgia. (There is one, the white *Rhododendron occidentalis*, that is not only native to the Pacific Northwest, but that does not succeed in the east at all except in hybrid form.)

Probably the most appropriate use for the native azaleas and their natural hybrids is on the kind of woodland in which they had their origins—among and beneath the branches of tall hardwoods. But except in alkaline soils or regions where winter (Continued on page 203)





WE BOUGHTA VERY SMALL CASTLE. then the fun began"

EDITOR'S NOTE: Anyone who has ever acquired an old house will understand Mr. Baker's discovery that the little castle he bought in Wales was not just a place to holiday, but a whole new spare-time project. He is president of Baker Furniture, Inc.

ne Saturday morning forty years ago, a small battle raged in the backyard of a house on Fulton Street in Grand Rapids, Mich. Half-a-dozen twelve-year-olds were fighting with wooden swords, rake handles, and water bombs for possession of a 6foot-high wooden castle. The outcome was a draw between the attackers and the defenders, of whom I was one. That was not quite the start of my interest in castles. But it was probably the first milestone in the sequence of events that led up to our acquiring, two years ago, a little castle in Wales.

Castles have always fascinated me, not because they were romantic or noble edifices, but because of their functional purpose of defense. In early English usage, in fact, the word castle denoted merely a fortified place or fortified domicile, often little more than a wooden building on a mound ringed with a picket fence. At the time of the Norman conquest, there were literally hundreds of these wooden castles in England, and another two centuries passed before they were rebuilt or replaced by stone.

Long after the wooden castle in Grand Rapids had been abandoned to another generation of defenders, my weakness for castles persisted. On my first trip to Europe as a college student and on subsequent trips I visited every castle I could. During one of these treks, my wife and I were particularly intrigued by a miniature Bavarian schloss actually small enough to be livable in twentieth-century terms. Although definitely not available, it gave us the idea that somewhere there might be another of the same modest scale. Then in March of 1965 I (Continued)

spotted an ad in *Previews* announcing that a very small, very old keep in Pembrokeshire on the coast of Wales was for sale at a bargain price. The ad haunted me. I decided to make a quick trip of inspection. On my arrival in London, the local estate agent was notably unenthusiastic. He did, however, make an appointment for me to visit the castle, warning me not to expect much. But when I first glimpsed the tower of Roch Castle from five miles away, I knew I was sold. By 5:00 p.m. the same day, the deal was closed.

ack in the U. S. I laid these glad tidings before my family. That they were received with mixed emotions is an understatement, for Roch was truly an outpost and still is. To get there from London is a two-day drive, or a six-hour train ride to Haverfordwest, six miles away.

Roch was built around 1250 A. D. by a Norman knight whose mission was to protect the Flemish settlers from the raids of the Welsh to the north. His name was Adam de Rupe, which probably derived from the rock on which the castle was built, since "de Rupe" in charter Latin meant "of the rock." Soon it was changed to the Norman or French "de la Roche." Then in the nineteenth century, when only the castle and village still bore the name, the local citizens "anglicized" it by dropping the "e."

The walls are 6 feet thick, with many arrow slits and some windows that were installed in Tudor times. And because of the stout walls, the interior spaces are small and few. The main door takes you into the Guard room or barracks where the men at arms must have cooked, eaten, and slept. From there a stairway, built right into the thickness of the wall, takes you up to the main room or hall, in later years called the "court room" because the local judicial proceedings were held there. Not nearly as large as the name sounds, the court room is now our living-dining room. At one end is a tiny oratory or private chapel and a small alcove called a "solar," which we use for a study. At the other end is a miniature "modern" kitchen. The stone stairway continues to wander up through the thickness of the walls to small chambers at different levels. The largest of these we use as our bedroom, two others as guest rooms. In the tower are two more still unfurnished. In all, our living space is less than 2,200 square feet. ortunately for us, the plumbing—originally is stalled just after the turn of the century when the castle was restored from near ruin—was in relatively good condition. All we had to do was replated a few fixtures and fittings.

Steam heat had been added 1955, and it was possible, with the miniature oil burner and the few existing radiators, to thaw the castle in Just of the first year to a rather damp of degrees. After adding radiators are keeping the heat on all year to dry the walls, we have managed to hold the temperature to 70 degrees except in the winter months. Our British friends, of course, almost suffocate.

What electricity existed when v acquired the castle was operable, by dozens of additional outlets were needed. I was soon convinced that anyon who can successfully contend with British lamps, cords, plugs, receptacles, and points, can overcome anything.

Furnishing the rooms was a rea challenge, leading us down many path and posing fascinating questions. W wanted to do an authentic job, bu what could be called authentic? I 1250 when the castle was built, onl trestle tables, benches, coffers, an rush floor mats were in use. But sinc no ancient abode ever had furnishing all of one period, we decided to loo for things which might have been ad cumulated between 1300 and 1700 For chairs, we knew we ought to us only the earliest Gothic types, but we stretched that a little, in the interes of comfort, to include a few uphol stered Farthingales, and a "Knole" sofa. And since we couldn't bring our selves to dispense with drawers in the bedroom, we had to go to seven teenth-century chests-the earliest tha had drawers.


What we ended up with were mostly antiques (some fakes I'm sure) acquired during a year's combing of antique shops in London and the Cotswolds. The real fun began when I started to research castle's history. I had only evenings and weeks to devote to it and was confined at first Michigan. Yet, it was amazing how much I nd out about Roch in the Grand Rapids Public rary, 5,000 miles and 700 years away. When I time to get to the New York Public Library, Library of Congress, the Haverfordwest Liry in Wales, and the British Museum, the projbecame more and more fascinating. Soon a d index of all the various references to the tle or the families who had lived there became ecessity. Each piece of information opened up ther avenue and I found myself corresponding h innumerable museum people, librarians, and mbers of families who had once owned Roch.

lthough dozens of leads are still to be explored, I have learned a great deal about the original de la Roche family who owned the castle until around the end of the fifteenth century. en more fascinating, however, was the Walter nily who owned it for a hundred years before during Cromwell's revolution—and especially cy Walter, first mistress of Charles II. Hester apman, author of The Tragedy of Charles the cond in which Lucy Walter played a prominent rt, put me in touch with Frank Arthur, a British iter who is now preparing his second book but this very controversial woman, the mother the Duke of Monmouth. Inquiries in art circles out the possible existence of a portrait of Lucy to a visit to the National Portrait Gallery and ggested future visits to private collections.

How to TRANSPLANT YOUR HOME




EDITOR'S NOTE: Pulling up home stakes and moving halfway across the continent is a familiar pattern to American families of this generation, but in the last few years more and more have been moving halfway around the world. Today, some 35,000 American business executives and their families are working and living abroad. Add to them, families sent overseas by the foreign aid, technical assistance, university exchange and philanthropic foundation programs, and the total comes to several hundred thousand. Some count it the most exciting and stimulating experience of their lives. Others, within a year or two, ask to be transferred home. "A man will give any number of reasons," an international business counselor told H&G, "but almost always the real reason is his wife's failure to adjust to overseas living. She fails because she has gone off unprepared. She has no idea what to take, what to expect, how much is involved in setting up and running a household. And she doesn't appreciate the importance of finding out." To indicate a bit of what is involved, H&G asked Mrs. Booth Hemingway to lay down a few guidelines. A frequent contributor to H&G, Mrs. Hemingway lived as a bride in Havana, where her husband represented a large American corporation, and has since traveled with him to other assignments in Latin America, Europe, and the Near East.

'm off to Turkey" begins that word-game tranquilizer for restive children on long motor trips. "I'm off to Turkey and in my trunk I'm putting asparagus . . . Moving abroad is like that. When you tackle it for the first time, the sensible procedure seems quite obvious: you start with your basic furnishings and continue until you reach the limit of your weight allowance. But six months later when your household effects have finally arrived and been tested against the realities of overseas living, you discover that at least one basic—a washing machine, perhaps—having served its purpose as ship's ballast is useful for nothing more. And absurdly, the most welcome item (or the one most missed) is some little unsung gadget like a vegetable peeler, or some non-essential frill like the silver tea service that prompted your mother-in-law to ask, "When will you ever use that?" A really apt packing list for overseas may seem every bit as whimsical as asparagus, a boomerang, and castanets.

Just as illogical are the situations you run into when you start to set up housekeeping. Some people say it's often easier to get your bearings in a remote underdeveloped country where you expect everything to be strange, than in the big capitals of Europe where you are fooled by the familiar look of things. "West African supermarkets aren't too much different from those in the U. S.," wrote a young friend of ours recently, "except that it takes a lot of concentration to figure out what you're buying." But it can be most disconcerting to a new American

sekeeper in Rome to find she has to traipse around to five different hborhood food stores to pick up five basic staples (the Italians no word for grocery store)—or to an American family renting partment in Paris to discover that all the lighting fixtures have been oved and that the kitchen has a safe but no cabinets.

I have kept house abroad myself and loved it. But since I lay no n to expertise in worldwide housewifery, I have been talking to a c of foreign service and international business wives—women who lived in different parts of the world under widely different circumces—and I have tried to meld their recommendations into a coherconsensus. The specifics, naturally, vary with the country, the clic, and the job, but the basic approach that makes for a happy e overseas is universal.

What is the place like?

very first expedient is to learn as much as you can about the countrou are going to. This may seem to be stressing the obvious, but it nazing how many families arrive in Colombia not knowing that it is the best coffee in the world, or in Teheran, not knowing that lems never touch alcohol. It is also amazing how often you can Paris or London, to say nothing of Istanbul or Tokyo, without becoming aware of the hundreds of local mores that affect day-to-living. We are too busy sight-seeing and sampling the best restaus to find out how the electrical current works, or whether, in the tourist season, there may be a mildew problem. Hotel hopping is thing; setting up a home requires a very different set of facts.

Where do you get them? Most government agencies offer special fing courses for employees bound for overseas, and their wives are ally invited to attend some of the talks. Wives are not merely into the property in the prope

A crash program in the native language is another indispensable, if the language happens to be Swahili. Those competent interers in the Company's branch office are not likely to be around n you want to read a package label or tell the plumber what's wrong the kitchen faucets.

Where will we find a house?

s vital question may be settled before you start to pack, or it may abled until you and your family are on the spot, in urgent need of e place to lay your heads. Most companies and government agenlend a hand at house hunting. Some even provide houses they have t, bought, or leased on a long-term basis. But I know one young woman who had to supervise personally the building of a house in Nigeria while living—babies and all—over the local grocery store.

Sight-unseen renting can be very risky. You can't really expect a company in Chicago, for instance, to know that a nice-looking house in Managua stands directly in the path of the semi-annual flash floods. When a couple we knew were transferred to Japan, their Japanese counterparts persuaded them, by mail, to move into a brand new, Western-style house—"just what you are looking for." Brand new it was, Western style, too, but built on the Japanese scale. The 6-foot husband almost developed a permanent stoop before they could move to a place with high ceilings and doors.

In underdeveloped countries, on the other hand, it may be wiser to settle for housing geared to the tried-and-true local style of living. You can always light a charcoal stove, but an electric range with iffy current can be next to useless. A State Department wife who had been happy as a clam in Korea, keeping house in a one-room bungalow and cooking on the back porch, gave me a spine-chilling account of the palatial house she and her husband rented some years later in India. It contained every modern device she had ever heard of, but nothing worked.

Wherever you land—apartment or palazzo, finca, or villa, furnished or unfurnished—it is not the structure that will make you feel at home, but what you bring to it—the intangibles as well as tangibles.

What shall we take?

There isn't a country in the world where you can duplicate every gadget you have at home. But if you are unnerved by the prospect of giving up a few comforts and conveniences and succumb to the pack rat syndrome, you will only end up, as first-timers often do, by leaving behind the unobvious things that can do the most to enrich living abroad. Overseas wives soon learn, for instance, how much more important family traditions seem when you are temporarily uprooted, and how much more significant American holidays seem when you are "expatriated." The sophisticated young wife of an oil company engineer confessed that she had never felt any patriotic tingling about Washington's Birthday at home, but while she was living in North Africa, she had a compulsion every February 22 to bake a cherry pie. Every family's packing list should start with what I loosely label a "culture core." This would include all the portables that, to you, spell home: books, pictures, bibelots, the painting that has always hung in the living room, the Lowestoft bowl that always stands on the dining room table. Naturally you have to weigh the chances of damage to family heirlooms, but haven't some of them (the bowl, for instance) already survived

Many transplants cite their bits and pieces of Americana as the most satisfying possessions they have taken along—satisfying to their own families and enlightening to local (Continued on page 204)



A knowing designer transforms an ordinary house

ome people live as their houses dictate; others reshape their houses to fit the way they want to live. Decidedly one of the latter is designer Elaine Lustig Cohen who took a run-of-the-mill New York brownstone with average assets and liabilities, and by a limited amount of remodeling turned it into exactly what she wanted to meet her family's personal needs, and to please her own lively nineteen-sixties eye. Mrs. Cohen, who designs graphics as well as furniture and interiors, does a good deal of work at home, and so does her husband, Arthur A. Cohen, editor, publisher, author, and scholar of Jewish theology. As busy in her way as her parents is their seven-year-old daughter, Tamar. In addition to providing space for all her family's living, working, and entertaining, Mrs. Cohen also had to accommodate an art collection that could fill a small museum, plus some 10,000 books. Yet the architectural changes were kept under control.


"On the top and parlor floors, I ripped out everything," she admits, "but on other floors I only cleaned up the background—got rid of moldings, etcetera. In some places I left the eyesores and distracted the eye to something else."

How about all the books and paintings and working paraphernalia—did the house have enough storage space?

"No—it was meager and badly located. But instead of building new closets, we store things in wardrobes and cabinets all over the house."

The bulk of the books are stored in library stacks on the top floor. Party equipment is housed in cabinets on the living room floor. The linens for each bedroom are stored in the bathroom that adjoins it. (Continued)

The top floor is one of the two which were entirely gutted. Once seven little rooms, it is now a marvelously functional floor-through study for Mr. Cohen. At one end, the 10,000 books are arranged very professionally on standard steel library stacks, but Mrs. Cohen ameliorated their cold hard look by facing the ends with wood panels painted different hot colors. Carved wood object on stand atop file is a ceremonial mask.







New Ireland sculpture stands guard between Mr. Cohen's desk and the library area of the top floor.

The family's private zone

"Sometimes I use the cabinets to direct traffic—really to shape space."

As an example, Mrs. Cohen cited the crisply painted commercial file cabinet she and her husband use for correspondence. Together with a cabinet for phonograph records, it divides the library end of the top floor from the working and study area. Recently she moved the art books down from the library to a bank of shelves flanking the fireplace in the master bedroom.

"Art-book browsing is something you like to do in a leisurely way in the evening. But who wants to go upstairs at the end of the day just to bring down a book?"

The Cohens have not one music system, but two. The player and records for the larger housewide system are stationed, like the books, in Mr. Cohen's study, which is most convenient for him since he likes to play opera music while he works. But isn't it a chore to traipse to the top floor to put on the records they want to hear in the living or dining room?

"We don't like music to compete with conversation at dinner parties or in the living room. When we have a party with dancing, maybe twice a year, it's easy enough to put a stack of records on the top floor player beforehand.

The other set of hi-fi equipment is in the storage-wall of Mrs. Cohen's study on the third floor. Connected to that player are duplicate speakers in the master bedroom.

"On this floor I did very little beyond cleaning up—removing mantels, for instance—and a lot of painting out. Our bedroom was 'remodeled' almost entirely with color."

To Mrs. Cohen, contrast is vital—contrast between white and bold colors, between a wall of small objects and a wall almost bare except for one big painting. (*Continued*)





"When you move into a house that wasn't designed for you, there are some details you have to live with, some you have to disguise."

An awkward airshaft, that goes from the roof to a fourth-floor bathroom, is the first thing you see when you come up the stairs to Mr. Cohen's fifth-floor study. Instead of ripping it out (possible, but expensive) Mrs. Cohen faced the front of the shaft with panels of frosted glass, and set lights behind them at floor level. On the lintel above she stenciled a favorite Hebrew quotation: "It is not for you to finish the work; neither is it for you to desist from the work."

The exposed pipes for the tub in the master bathroom she boxed in, designing the box so that its interior could serve as a clothes hamper, its top as a counter for sculpture. In an empty corner on the other side of the room, she built a linen closet. The space between the windows she mirrored and framed with make-up lights, and across the windows themselves she installed shelves, filled them with plants and folk art.

"The only thing we ripped out of the old bathroom was the lavatory. We replaced that with a double lavatory and a marble counter."

The narrow, steep, boxed-in stairway that angles up from the entrance hall to the fourth floor was one of the more challenging liabilities of the house when the Cohens took over.

"Briefly, I considered rebuilding it. But a new stairs would take away some of our living space, so I decided to leave it and do everything I could think of to draw attention away from it."

What Mrs. Cohen did was to turn the stairway into an ascending art gallery.

Along the inside she built a false wall which she pierced with display niches for sculpture and folk art. The niches are lined at the top and bottom with translucent glass panels that conceal fluorescent lights. And as the stairway rounds the parlor floor, the niches are cut all the way through the wall so that the displays can also be enjoyed from the living room. Like the Cohens' paintings, they are changed frequently.

"When you live with art, you have to keep switching it around or it loses impact and you stop seeing it." The stairway you never notice

Mrs. Cohen's boldest visual effects and most dramatic use of space are on the first two floors. Except for the small room that is now the kitchen, the entire parlor floor was opened up to create one big sweep of space.

"One way to achieve visual impact is by a sudden change of scale. Another way is by a change of materials and textures. I also like to make quick shifts from

formal arrangement to fantasy."

There is no escaping the impact and exhilaration you feel when you have climbed the narrow stairs from the entrance hall and emerge into the high, wide, open living area. To your right is the living room, to your left, the dining room, and between them a good-sized "foyer" marked off from the other rooms only by a change of materials-a floor of bright blue tile, a huge cabinet of teak.

Sewing Studio

Now that sewing rivals cooking as a rewarding, creative, leisure pursuit, H&G believes it is high time this activity be given the inspiring ambiance it deserves. Accordingly we have planned a real studio or atelier that you can set up in any small room you have to spare. It is equipped for everything from the initial cutting to the final pressing, and gives you all the counter space you need to spread out in, as well as a wealth of drawers, cabinets, and closets for storing paraphernalia. Above all, it is a pretty room-bright and lively to sustain your enthusiasm for grappling with the intricacies of a ball gown or a French swag, inviting to settle down in for a relaxed session of hand-finishing.

We designed our studio for a space of 12 by 15 feet (the size of the average extra bedroom) and apportioned it, as kitchen planners do, into centers for separate activities—in this case, cutting, sewing, fitting, pressing, storage. One wall is devoted almost entirely to storage: at one end, a closet for the small supplies dressmakers call "findings" at the other, a fabric closet, and, in between, a high counter plus wall-hung cabinets, which double as a gift-wrapping center. (Continued)

Since a sewing room in action is usually a riot of color, we chose clean white for the background, accented it with H&G's Jade and Ultramarine (cabinet interiors are Jade, too). Tambour curtains at window and eyelet-embroidered panels in closet doors provide texture contrast to slickness of painted walls and woodwork, vinyl floor tiles, plastic-laminate counters. Bulletin board is a pre-scored particle board that comes with hooks, can be attached flat to wall without furring strips, and painted. Ceiling lights, tracks by Lightolier, vinyl tile by Goodyear.





Dewing Studio

The middle of the room is reserved for the cutting table, and along the opposite wall is the sewing center: a 6-foot-long cabinet for machine-sewing, flanked by a comfortable corner for hand-sewing and a mirrored corner for fitting. Next to that, at the end of the room is the pressing center.

We designed the generous 3-by-6-foot cutting table, made it a comfortable 36-inches high, and mounted it on lockable casters (for how-to-build instructions, see page 211). The top we covered with 12-inch-square vinyl tiles and with marking pen and transfer numbers laid out a 6-inch grid to help speed fabric measuring.


he portable sewing machine is housed in a compartment at the center of the long sewing cabinet. When you are ready to use it, you remove a small section of the plastic-laminate countertop and set the machine into a 3/4-inch-deep well that fits its base exactly and keeps it from vibrating and traveling. With the doors open, the compartment provides plenty of knee room, and a comfortable chair on a swivel base gives you freedom of movement.

The fitting center with dressmaker's dummy and three-way mirror is right beside you. And next to that is the pressing center, a metal cabinet, recessed in the wall, that contains ironing board, sleeveboard, steam iron, timer, and controls. You can set the timer for any period up to 30 minutes, so that if you are called away, the iron will turn itself off.

Next to a cutting table and sewing machine, the most important equipment in any sewing room is light, and that we have provided in abundance. On the ceiling are four continuous, current tracks (see previous page) on which lamps may be clipped wherever is most convenient. On two of them we set oversize bullet lamps with diffuser grilles, directing them to the work areas at the sides of the room. On the other two are shaded down-lights to illuminate the cutting table so that you are never in your own shadow. The hand sewing center has its own efficiency standing lamp, and within easy reach on the sewing counter is a transistor stereo tape player to give you music while you stitch.








If you don't have the space for a full-time sewing room, you can enjoy many of its benefits on a part-time basis by storing all your equipment in one spot in a bedroom or sitting room. For instance, we designed a sewingstorage center for a 20-inch-deep strip of space at one end of a 10-foot-wide family room. The space is partitioned into four cupboards. But the center partition extends only 16 inches from the back wall instead of 20, to allow space at the front for recessing the same pressingcenter cabinet we used in the full-time studio. The doors to the four cupboards open alternately to the left and the right so that the first pair, mirrored on the inside, can be angled to give a good back view. On the insides of the other pair are thread racks, pattern racks, magnetic bars for shears, a tack board. One cupboard is reserved for the dressmaker's dummy, skirt marker, and garments in the making, to be hung on pull-out racks. The second is for fabric storage, the third for the sewing machine, folding tables, and cutting board, and pressing aids. In the fourth is a battery of plastic boxes for findings. The metal door of the pressing cabinet we faced with plywood to match the cupboard doors, then finished them all by gluing on a new type of stock wood molding that is turned to resemble bamboo.



OFFBEAT WINES FOR DINNER FOR TWO

BY HUGH JOHNSON

Before I was married, it used to be my special joy to dish up dreamy dinners for two in an ambiance as near as I could get to the ideal: the vine-roofed terrace of summer; the flickering log fire and candlelight of winter. Some of them were quite successful.

Much to my surprise I now find that there is even more pleasure in a dinner for two conceived and executed by two. My wife, as you will have guessed, does the heavy work with the pots and pans. I see to the wine.

Some of our best dinners, complete with wine and delicacies that we could never afford to buy for whole dinner parties, have been organized this way. It may sound like a selfish approach to entertaining; but selfishness has its own special rewards. Besides the obvious pleasures, this is the sensible time to try out new wines and new dishes. No wife makes her first soufflé when there are six hungry people in the dining room; she perfects it first on her patient partner. There is a good argument for experimenting with unfamiliar wines and new vintages in the same way.

Nothing about a dinner for two should be routine. Forget your usual pre-prandial drink. This is the evening to try something you never started with before. From the huge list of refreshing, appetizing varieties of wine, choose a sparkling rosé, a well-chilled dry Madeira, a spicy Traminer straight from the refrigerator, or a sweet Sauternes iced to within an inch of its life.

Abandon the convention that aperitifs must be bone dry, and their accompaniments savory. Sparkling Italian Asti Spumante, which is deliciously, flowerily sweet, is no less appetizing for that. With crisp little amaretti—Italian macaroons—it makes a marvelously cheerful start to a dinner. So does champagne with the little tongues of sugary dry sponge from France known as champagne biscuits.


Allow time to enjoy the aperitif before serving the dinner—an extra ten or fifteen minutes to sit down together, relax, and look forward to the feast ahead. Taking an extra moment to put the apetif bottle, glasses, and appetize on a tray with a pretty cloth is wow worth the time. Anyone looking through the window would this there was a butler somewhere jut out of sight—and you will fealmost as if there were.

The only snag about arran ing the wine for a dinner for t is the inflexible size of the bott Nobody really knows whether t man who invented the standa bottle size-the fifth-had one pe son in mind or two, since one pe son usually wants rather less that a bottle; two people just a shad more. Hence the argument for t half bottle. Since many win which make good aperitifs-pa ticularly dry white wines-are al exactly what you want to go wi the hors d'oeuvre course, you w have drunk half the bottle before the meal (only one-and-a-ha glasses of wine each), and you wi still have the other half to go wi the shellfish, smoked salmon, me on, or whatever you are starting with. You are then free to have half bottle of red wine with th

In restaurants, where yo often find yourself eating a corpletely different meal from you companion, there seems to me to be no harm in drinking a corpletely different wine, too. It perfectly reasonable to have a habottle of red and a half bottle of white, instead of compromisin with a rosé, which goes less that perfectly with either delicate fis or red-blooded meat. The ideal, occurse, is for two to agree on what they are going to eat and drink but if they agree to differ on the food, it is only logical to do the same with the wine.

A real celebration for us (an the celebration rate is not ofte allowed to fall below one a month usually begins with a bottle of champagne—started before dinner and finished with the hord oeuvre—then continues with half bottle of a fine red wine with the meat course. If the champagn bottle is still not empty when it is time for the red wine, I recork in

Dinner-For-Two Cook Book

By Elaine Ross

When dinner is just for the two of you, it presents a rare chance to experiment with new or exotic dishes that would normally be ruled out by the presence of guests or children, and to pamper yourself with small luxuries which in family quantities would break the budget. Because of its small-scale nature, a dinner for two should be planned with care and served with finesse. A standing rib roast, a casserole or a batch of homemade soup that will be only half consumed are not good choices unless you have a passion for leftovers or a freezer that can board the excess. On the other hand, such expensive delicacies as a rack of baby lamb or a couple of tournedos, a few spoonfuls of caviar or a plate of pasta smothered in white truffles can be happily indulged in when there are only two for dinner. If you think in terms of foods that come in small portions or in pairs (seafood, eggs, kidneys, scaloppine, chicken breasts, sweetbreads) and of dishes that lend themselves to individual servings, such as stuffed vegetables and poached fruit, you will find you can

construct marvelously varied and adventurous menus. A little caution is needed when it comes to cutting down on quantities in standard recipes for four or six. It doesn't always work just to decrease the amounts, so unless you are experienced at this kind of culinary legerdemain, stick with dishes that are easy to figure out and eschew things like soufflés and tricky desserts.

The delights of a dinner for two go far beyond the pleasures of the table. They include all the appurtenances as well, from china, glass, and silver to flowers, candlelight, and wine, for if dinner for two is a rare event, it also rates as a special occasion. Now is the time to bring out the cherished objects you may have collected but never used, like antique dessert plates and Georgian wine rinsers (great for fruit desserts and cold soups). That goes for the wine as well. Take the advice wine expert Hugh Johnson gives on page 172 and break out that precious bottle of Château Mouton-Rothschild or luxuriate in champagne before, with, and even after dinner.

CELEBRATION DINNER

As this menu is designed to celebrate a raise or any windfall meriting a feast, it should be initiated with the finest champagne that the budget can handle. Drink the champagne as an aperitif and with the first course. A celebration calls for the best in the subsequent wine, and that means Burgundy or Pinot Noir with the steak.

Volga Artichokes

2 medium-sized artichokes 1/4 lemon 1-ounce jar black caviar

1/4 cup sour cream

Trim off the stem ends of the artichokes so that they stand upright. Slice off the top half of each and rub the cut portions with the lemon. Cook, uncovered, in well-salted boiling water to cover for about 30 minutes, or until the bottom leaves pull off easily. Drain upside down until cool enough to handle. Scrape out the hairy center choke with a spoon. Chill until shortly before serving time. Mix the caviar and sour cream and fill the center of each artichoke.

Lemon Steak

1 tablespoon oil 2 tablespoons butter ½ teaspoon dry mustard 2 8-to-10-ounce boneless shell steaks (or other tender steak), cut ½" thick Salt, freshly ground pepper to taste ½ lemon 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce 2 teaspoons minced parsley 2 teaspoons minced chives

Heat a heavy skillet just large enough to hold the steaks in a single layer. Add the oil, I tablespoon of the butter, and the mustard and stir over high heat for a few seconds. Season one side of the steaks with salt and pepper and place, seasoned-side down, in the skillet. Reduce the heat a little. Sauté the steaks for 2 minutes, turn and sauté the other side for 2 minutes longer. Remove the steaks and turn off the heat. Insert a fork into the lemon and twist the fork to release the juice into the skillet. Add the remaining butter and other ingredients and blend with the lemon juice. Replace the steaks, baste with the pan juices, and heat over very high heat for just a few seconds or until cooked as desired. Serve immediately. 

2 medium-sized pieces of seedless rye bread, crusts trimmed 2 teaspoons butter

Roll each slice of bread with a rolling pin to flatten it a bit. Spread the butter on the bread (if the slices are large, you may need a bit more), roll each piece tightly and cut each roll into 4 equal slices. Secure with toothpicks and bake in a 400° oven for 15-20 minutes, or until they take on some color. Remove toothpicks, and serve.

Crunchy New Potatoes

6 small new potatoes 1 tablespoon butter 1/4 teaspoon Lawry's Seasoned Salt Pinch Lawry's Seasoned Pepper 1/2 cup bran flakes, crushed

Pour into 2 well-greased 6-ounce custard cups. Gently place I macaroon on top of each. Bake in a preheated 300° oven for 25 minutes, turn off oven, open door, and leave the cake for an additional

half hour. Chill for several hours before removing the cakes from the baking cups. Serve with the macaroons on top.

DINNER BY CANDLELIGHT

As the name suggests, this is an elegant, turn-ofthe-century menu that might fit all kinds of occasions, besides showing you off as an incomparable cook. The romantic mood calls for a table set with your best china, crystal, and silver-plus wine, flowers, and the right kind of music. If that table can be set in front of a blazing fire or on a vinecovered terrace as the season may dictate, so much the better

BRAISED SWEETBREADS CHANTERELLE CUCUMBER AND PEAS CORN IN ITS OWN CREAM HAZELNUT ROLL FOR TWO

Braised Sweetbreads Chanterelle

1 weal knuckle hone

4-ounce can Swiss chanterelle mushrooms

2 large calves' sweetbreads (about 1/2 pound each, trimmed weight)

1 tablespoon vinegar

2 slices lean bacon, diced

1 small onion, minced

1 small carrot, minced

1 stalk celery, minced 2 tablespoons butter

3 tablespoons Madeira wine

1/2 teaspoon salt, or more to taste

Dash white pepper

11/2 tablespoons lemon juice

11/2 tablespoons minced parsley

Place the veal knuckle bone in a saucepan. Drain the can of mushrooms, pour the juices over the bone and add cold water to cover. Bring to a boil, reduce the heat, and simmer, covered, for 11/2 hours. Uncover, reduce the stock to 3/4 cup, and reserve.

Meanwhile, soak the sweetbreads in ice water for 1/2 hour, Drain and plunge them into boiling water to which the vinegar has been added. Reduce the heat, simmer for 5 minutes, drain sweetbreads, and plunge into ice water until they are cool. Carefully remove any fibrous matter or connective tissue from the sweethreads with a small sharp knife. Cut them in half, lengthwise.

Sauté the bacon with the minced onion, carrot, and celery in the butter in a heavy saucepan until the onions are yellow. Heat the Madeira, ignite it, and pour over the vegetables. Add the sweetbreads and mushrooms and sauté over medium-high heat until the sweetbreads have taken on color. Add the veal stock, salt, pepper, and lemon juice. Cook over high heat for 15 minutes, basting the sweetbreads constantly, until the juices are syrupy and the sweetbreads glazed. Sprinkle the parsley on top. Serve with Cucumber and Peas and Corn in Its Own Cream.

Cucumber and Peas

1 large cucumber, peeled, seeded, and cut into bite-size pieces 1 chicken bouillon cube, crushed 3 cup thawed, frozen peas

Put the cucumber and crushed chicken bouillon cube into a small saucepan. Cook, covered, over low heat for about 20 minutes, or until the cucumber is tender and translucent, stirring frequently, Add the peas and cook for 3 minutes, uncover and cook over high heat, stirring constantly, until the peas are cooked and the pan juices almost evaporated.

Corn in Its Own Cream

4 ears tender young corn 2 tablespoons butter Salt, pepper to taste

Cut the corn off the cobs, cutting through the top half of the kernels. Scrape off the remainder of the kernels and the milk with a spoon. Place in a small saucepan with the butter and cook, covered, over low heat for 5 minutes. Uncover, and continue to cook, stirring constantly, until the mixture is creamy and the corn very tender. Season with salt and pepper.

Note: This may be made a short time ahead and reheated.

Hazelnut Roll for Two

2 eggs, separated 1/4 cup sugar 1 tablespoon plus 1 teaspoon flour, sifted 1/4 cup apricot jam, softened 1/2 cup heavy cream 1/4 cup finely chopped toasted hazelnuts Confectioners' sugar

Grease an 8" square baking pan, line the bottom with waxed paper, and grease the paper thoroughly. Beat the egg whites until stiff, but not dry. Beat the yolks in a separate bowl with a generous half of the sugar until thick and light. Beat in the flour, fold in the beaten whites, and spread the batter in the prepared pan. Bake in a preheated 350° oven for about 13 minutes, or until the top springs back when pressed gently. Loosen the sides of the cake with a small, sharp knife, invert the cake on a piece of waxed paper, and peel off the top paper. Roll up the cake and cool.

When the cake is cool, unroll it and spread with the jam. Whip the cream until stiff with the remaining sugar, fold in the nuts, spread over the jam and re-roll the cake. Dust generously with confectioners' sugar.



DINNER AFTER A DAY IN TOWN

Whether it's a matinée, a go-round of the museum shows, or an extended shopping trip that has kept you in town, chances are you won't be home more than a few minutes before it's time to have dinner ready. Now is the time to fall back on a menu that can be cooked in advance, with just one part of the meal to prepare—Poppy Seed Noodles. They can be cooking while you change into something long and luxurious, serene in the knowledge that dinner is a fait accompli. If you keep a white wine on tap in the refrigerator (a California Chablis in a half-gallon jug, for example), a glass of it at the beginning of the meal would pave the way perfectly. Then, with the beef, a California Cabernet Sauvignon or a French St. Émilion.

SHRIMP ARNAUD MATROSEN BEEF POPPY SEED NOODLES TINY APPLE TORTEN

Shrimp Arnaud

1 tablespoon vinegar

1 teaspoon lemon juice

3 tablespoons olive oil

1 small bay leaf

SE & GARDEN, APRIL, 1967

Creole mustard (available in specialty shops)
Salt

1 scallion, including half of green, finely chopped

1 small stalk celery, finely chopped

1 tablespoon finely chopped parsley

1/2 pound cooked shelled and deveined shrimp

Combine the vinegar, lemon juice, and oil. Add mustard and salt to taste. Combine the scallion, celery, and parsley with the shrimp and toss with the dressing. Refrigerate for 3 hours.

Matrosen Beef

1½ pounds bottom round, cut into 1½" cubes
1½ tablespoons oil
1 medium onion, peeled and sliced
1 tablespoon vinegar
½ cup red Bordeaux wine
½ teaspoon sardellen paste (or anchovy paste)

1/s teaspoon dried thyme leaves
1 clove garlic, crushed
1 medium carrot, coarsely grated
1 medium apple, peeled, cored, and coarsely grated
1 stalk celery, sliced
Pinch coarse pepper

Pinch coarse pepper ½ cup beef consommé Salt to taste

Sear the meat in 1 tablespoon of the oil in a heavy saucepan or Dutch oven. Remove the meat and lightly brown the onion in the same pan. Add the vinegar, red wine, sardellen paste, bay leaf, thyme, and garlic. Bring to a boil, return the meat to the pan, cover, and simmer over low heat for ½ hour. Meanwhile, sauté the carrot, apple, and celery in the remaining ½ tablespoon oil for 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Add to the meat with the pepper and consommé. Cover and cook in a preheated 325° oven for 1½ hours, or until tender. Season with salt. Serve with Poppy Seed Noodles. Note: This may be made in advance and cooled. Skim off the fat. Reheat, covered.

Poppy Seed Noodles

1/4 pound fine noodles
4 tablespoons butter
1 small slice seedless rye bread or 1/2 large slice,
crusts trimmed
2 tablespoons poppy seeds
Salt to taste

Cook the noodles according to package directions and drain. Melt the butter and pour half over the noodles. Cut the bread into small dice and sauté in the remaining melted butter until crisp. Add the poppy seeds. Toss all together, season with salt, and serve immediately.

Tiny Apple Torten

6½ teaspoons butter
1 tablespoon sugar
Dash cinnamon
1 medium-sized apple, peeled, cored, and cut
into 10 or 12 slices
2 zwieback
1 egg
⅓ cup light cream
Confectioners' sugar

Dinner is a picnic when the table is a grassy slope, the butler a three-tier bamboo basket that nests everything inside—pâté, bread, cruditées, salmon steaks in little plastic boxes, lacquer plates, printed vinyl tablecloth, napkins, and flatware. Insulated picnic bag well packed with ice (or canned refrigerant) keeps white wine chilly.

Melt 2 teaspoons of the butter in a small saucepan and stir in the sugar and cinnamon. Add the sliced apple. Cover and cook over low heat for about 10 minutes, or until the apple is just tender. Cool for a few minutes.

Crush the zwieback to crumbs with your hands. Soften the remaining 4½ teaspoons of butter and mix with the crumbs. Press half the crumbs on the bottom of 2 well-buttered 5- or 6-ounce custard cups.

Beat the egg with the cream, add to the cooked apple and cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until the custard starts to thicken. Divide the apple-custard mixture between the custard cups, scatter the remaining crumbs on top, and bake in a preheated 325° oven for 20 minutes.

Let the torten cool for ½ hour, loosen the edges, invert onto individual plates, and leave at room temperature. Dust generously with confectioners' sugar at serving time.

DINNER IS A PICNIC

It's not too early to start thinking about a way to turn a summer weekday or weekend dinner into a change-of-scene party for two. Plan to take advantage of whatever local event gives you an excuse to get out-of-doors-concerts or Shakespeare-in-the-park, summer theatre, a championship tennis match, the races, a horse show-and have a picnic dinner before (or after) the happening, in the park or some suitably rural spot. If you plan on traveling a distance, or are going to wait awhile before you eat, you will want an insulated bag and plastic bags filled with ice (or Skotch Ice) to keep your food and wine good and cold. A California Pinot Chardonnay, well chilled, is an ideal match for salmon. And don't forget to carry along a breadboard and knife and the essential corkscrew.

BRAIDED BREAD

BAKED SALMON STEAKS WITH ANCHOVY SAUCE

CRUDITÉES

PEARS À L'ORANGE

Country Pâté

¼ pound cooked tongue
¼ pound raw chicken livers
1 small onion
1 tablespoon minced parsley
1 teaspoon prepared mustard
1 teaspoon powdered ginger
¼ teaspoon powdered thyme
¼ teaspoon powdered cloves
¼ teaspoon cinnamon
⅓ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
1 small clove garlic, mashed
3 tablespoons pistachio nuts
Salt to taste
½ teaspoon unflavored gelatin

1/2 pound boneless veal

Grind the veal, tongue, chicken livers, and onion together, using the fine blade of a meat grinder. Add the next ten ingredients, and work thoroughly with your hands until the mixture is well blended. Put in a deep 2½-cup baking dish, cover, and bake in a preheated 350° oven for ¾ hour, or until the pâté shrinks from the sides of the dish. Pour off any excess juice. Pierce the surface of the pâté with a fine skewer. Dissolve gelatin in 1 tablespoon water and spoon over pâté. Weight and chill for several hours. Serve in the baking dish or unmold and wrap in heavy aluminum foil.

Braided Bread

1½ tablespoon (½ package) granular yeast
1½ tablespoons sugar
1½ tablespoons vegetable oil
1½ teaspoon salt
1 egg
2⅓ cups flour (approximately)

Dissolve the yeast in % cup warm water. Stir in the sugar, oil, and salt. Beat the egg lightly, reserve 1 teaspoon, and add the remainder to the yeast mixture. Stir in 2 cups of the flour. Place the remaining flour on a board, turn the dough out onto it, and knead until all the flour is absorbed and the dough is smooth. (If the dough is still very sticky, knead in a bit more flour.) Place the dough in a large bowl, cover, and let it rise in a warm place for 2-21/2 hours, or until almost tripled in bulk. Punch the dough down, cut it into 3 equal pieces and shape each piece into a rope about 11/2" in diameter. Braid the pieces together and place în a 41/2"-by-81/2" loaf tin. (These tins are available in metal and foil.) Cover the tin lightly and let the dough rise in a warm place for 1-11/2 hours, or until doubled in bulk. Dilute the reserved egg with a few drops of water and brush the top of the risen dough. Bake in a preheated 375° oven for 25 minutes, raise the heat to 400°, and bake 5 minutes longer, or until the bread is golden. Remove from the tin and cool on a rack.

Baked Salmon Steaks

2 salmon steaks, each weighing about ¾ pound and ¾" thick ⅓ teaspoon salt Dash pepper 2 teaspoons melted butter 2 teaspoons lemon juice 4 sprigs dill

Place each salmon steak on the center of a piece of heavy-duty aluminum foil large enough to enclose the fish loosely. Sprinkle the fish with salt, pepper, butter, and lemon juice, and top with the sprigs of dill. Fold the foil to enclose the fish completely. Bake in a preheated 400° oven for 30 minutes, or until the fish flakes easily when tested. Close the foil, chill, and serve each portion in its foil package.

Anchovy Sauce

1/4 cup sour cream
1 teaspoon anchovy paste
11/2 teaspoons grated lemon rind
11/2 teaspoons minced parsley

Blend all the ingredients. Add more anchovy paste if desired. Serve separately with the baked salmon.

Cruditées

Instead of a salad, take along an assortment of crisp raw vegetables to munch—cherry tomatoes, cucumber, fennel, celery, radishes, scallions, leaves of endive—and shakers of seasoned salt. Or you may make an extra quantity of anchovy sauce and use it as a dunk.

Pears à l'Orange

3 pears, peeled, cored, and thinly sliced 2 tablespoons sugar 3 tablespoons Curação 1/4 cup orange juice



Anniversary dinner is a succession of surprises. It starts with a first course, Tomato Coupe, kept under cover in an appropriately shaped dish, and continues with Breast of Chicken Véronique, discreetly hidden in a white-and-gold fireproof porcelain casserole on a warming stand. The centerpiece is a pyramid of presents to be opened at the end of the meal; each box holds a small but special gift.

Sprinkle the pears with the sugar. Pour the Curação and orange juice over the fruit and place in an airtight container. Chill for 1 hour.

ANNIVERSARY DINNER

Or birthday dinner or any similar landmark that calls for a special and elegant meal. Once more the menu is planned so that the bulk of the cooking can be done ahead of time, giving you the opportunity to get out of the kitchen and into a long at-home gown.

The rich, deep-flavored dryness of a fine white Graves such as Château Carbonnieux or its California equivalent, Sauvignon Blanc, would be magnificent with this menu.

TOMATO COUPE
BREAST OF CHICKEN VÉRONIQUE

Tomato Coupe

2 medium tomatoes ½ small avocado, diced 1½ tablespoons French dressing Salt, pepper to taste 2 slices bacon

Peel the tomatoes, cut off the tops, scoop out, drain, and dice the pulp. Invert the tomato shells to drain. Toss the diced avocado with the diced tomato pulp and the French dressing. Add salt and pepper. Fry the bacon until crisp, drain, and crumble. Fill the tomato shells with the avocado mixture, sprinkle the bacon on top. Chill for 1 hour before serving.

Breast of Chicken Véronique

3 tablespoons butter
1 large whole chicken breast, split in half
lengthwise
6 medium-sized mushroom caps, quartered
1 tablespoon flour
½ cup light cream
2 tablespoons dry white wine
½ cup diced ham
Salt, white pepper to taste
½ cup seedless grapes, fresh or canned
and drained

Melt 2 tablespoons butter in a large heavy pan. Brown the chicken over medium heat and transfer to a casserole. Melt the remaining butter in the skillet, sauté the mushrooms over high heat for 3 minutes, remove them with a slotted spoon and scatter them over the chicken. Reduce the heat and stir the flour into the butter and juices in the skillet. Cook the roux for 1 minute, then gradually add the cream and wine, stirring constantly. Cook until the sauce is thick. Add the ham, cook an additional 2 minutes, still stirring, then season with salt and pepper. Pour the sauce over the chicken and bake, covered, in a preheated 350° oven for 35-40 minutes, or until the chicken is tender. Uncover the casserole, scatter the grapes on top and bake for 10 minutes. Note: This casserole may be made ahead, refrigerated, and reheated, but the grapes should not be added and cooked until 10 minutes before serving.

Ginger Scone

1/2 cup flour
1/4 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon sugar
Pinch salt
21/2 tablespoons butter, softened
1 egg yolk
1 tablespoon heavy cream
2 tablespoons drained, preserved ginger, finely minced

Mix the flour, baking powder, sugar, and salt. Cut in 2 tablespoons of the butter with a pastry blender or 2 knives until the mixture forms fine crumbs. Beat the egg yolk and the cream together lightly and stir into the crumb mixture until the dough holds together. Divide the dough in half, and pat out each half to a 5"—6" circle. Place 1 circle on a greased baking sheet or pie plate and spread with the remaining butter, then with the ginger, leaving a ½" margin of dough uncovered. Place the other circle of dough on top and seal the edges with a fork. Bake in a preheated 450° oven for about 15 minutes, or until golden. Cut into 4 wedges and serve hot or at room temperature, or bake in advance and reheat before serving.

Frozen Mousse in Punch Cups

2 tablespoons ground pecans 1 teaspoon grated dark, sweet chocolate 1 teaspoon minced candied fruit 1 tablespoon crème de cacao 1 teaspoon orange juice 1 egg, separated 2 tablespoons sugar 1 teaspoon grated orange rind ½ cup heavy cream, stiffly whipped ¼ teaspoon cocoa

Mix the pecans, grated chocolate, candied fruit, half the crème de cacao, and the orange juice. Beat the egg yolk and sugar until thick and light. Stir in the remaining crème de cacao and the orange rind. Fold in the stiffly whipped cream. Beat the egg white until stiff, but not dry, and fold into the cream mixture. Pour half the cream mixture into 2 punch cups, spoon some of the pecan mixture on top, and cover with the remaining cream mixture. Sift the cocoa over the mousse and freeze for 4 hours, or until firm.

Note: This mousse may be made as long as several

weeks ahead and stored in a freezer.

1 egg white

1/4 cup sugar

1 teaspoon potato starch

1/8 teaspoon pulverized ammonium carbonate (available at drugstores)

Beat the egg white until it forms moist peaks. Gradually add the sugar, beating all the while, until the sugar is dissolved and the mixture is thick and glossy. Sift the potato starch with the ammonium carbonate and fold into the meringue. Spoon the meringue into a pastry bag fitted with a plain round opening and pipe 16—20 mounds, spaced 1½" apart, on a buttered cookie sheet. (Or, drop the mounds from a teaspoon.) Bake for 20 minutes in a preheated 200° oven, turn off the heat, and leave in the oven for 1 hour to dry.

SUMMER DINNER ON ICE

"On ice" means banked in the refrigerator, awaiting your return from a Sunday afternoon jaunt and a probable battle with traffic. So soothe your nerves and keep your cool by whisking out a delicious meal that has been prepared in advance (even the table could be pre-set). The palacsinta, the only dish that needs the hot breath of the oven, can be done as much as a day ahead, refrigerated, covered, and popped in the oven to bake while you are eating the main course. If they have been refrigerated, increase the baking time by a minute or two. The palacsinta suggest an unusual theme for this dinner: a full-bodied white Hungarian wine-Balatoni Furmint, Keknelyu or Szurkebarat. A California Johannisberg Riesling would be a good alternative.

Vegetable Juice Frappé

1½ cups vegetable juice cocktail

2 teaspoons catsup

2 teaspoons Escoffier Sauce Diable

Mix all the ingredients, freeze ½ cup of the mixture, and chill the remainder. Remove from the freezer ½ hour before serving. At serving time, chop the frozen juice and put half in each of 2 Old-fashioned glasses. Pour in the remaining mixture, stir, and serve immediately.

Cold Poached Halibut, Dill Sauce

1/2-3/4 pound fish heads and bones
1 small onion, coarsely chopped
1 carrot, scraped
2 sprigs parsley
2 peppercorns
Salt
1/4 cup dry white wine
2 small individual halibut steaks
2 tablespoons dill, stems removed
3 tablespoon sour cream
1 tablespoon mayonnaise
1/2 teaspoon lemon juice

Put the fish heads and bones, onion, carrot, parsley, peppercorns, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 11/2 cups water, and wine in a saucepan. Bring to a boil, reduce the heat, cover, and simmer for 1/2 hour. Uncover, raise the heat, and cook rapidly until reduced to two-thirds. Strain into a shallow skillet just large enough to hold the halibut in a single layer. Remove and reserve the carrot. Bring the stock to a boil, add the fish, and reduce the heat. Cook the fish in barely simmering liquid for approximately 8 minutes, turn carefully and simmer for 5 minutes longer, or until the fish flakes easily. Cool a little, then remove the skin and bones. Cool the fish in its stock. Drain and place on individual plates. Slice the reserved carrot thinly and place overlapping slices down the center of each steak. Tuck a small sprig of dill under 1 of the slices on each steak. Chop the remaining dill and combine with the sour cream, mayonnaise, and lemon juice. Add salt to taste. Serve the sauce separately.

Palacsinta Tik Tak

8 dried apricot halves
3 tablespoons apricot jam
1 egg
1/4 cup flour
1/4 cup milk
Butter for frying
1/4 cup ground or very finely chopped walnuts
Confectioners' sugar


Simmer the apricots in water to cover for 20 minutes, or until very tender. Drain, mince, and mix with the apricot jam.

While the apricots are cooking, prepare 6 palacsinta (Hungarian crêpes). Beat the egg with a whisk, add the flour, and beat until smooth. Gradually pour in the milk and ¼ cup water and continue beating until the batter is smooth. Heat a 6"—7" heavy frying pan over high heat and then brush the bottom of the pan with just enough butter to coat it. Ladle about 2 tablespoons of batter into the pan, tilting it so that the batter covers the bottom. Cook until slightly brown on the bottom and dry on top. Turn with a spatula, cook the other side for a few seconds, and tip out onto a plate. Spread with a portion of the apricot mixture, roll up, and place in a buttered oven-to-table baking dish.

Just before serving, place the palacsinta in a preheated 450° oven for 3 or 4 minutes, or until piping hot. Sprinkle with walnuts, dust copiously with confectioners' sugar, and serve immediately.

LATE-LATE DINNER

If you have a vernissage or similar early evening event on the week's schedule, it is often more relaxed to serve dinner late for once, rather than try to rush it through. In this case, you might have cocktails and some fairly substantial appetizer first, and serve the main dinner courses afterward. As you will be eating late, you certainly won't want anything too heavy, and the menu should be planned so it can be assembled and left in the refrigerator. Just before the coquilles have finished baking, pop the Caraway Melbas in the oven for a minute or two. Keep the vinaigrette dressing separate and add it at the last minute. Don't fill the pineapple shells until just before you sit down at the table. With this dinner, a gentle and refreshing wine is called for. Pouilly Fuissé, or the even more refreshing Portuguese vinho verde, cooled in the refrigerator while you are at the show, would slip down easily.

SEAFOOD COQUILLES
HEARTS OF PALM VINAIGRETTE
CARAWAY MELBAS
PINEAPPLE IN A PINEAPPLE SHELL

Seafood Coquilles

11/2 cups diced, cooked lobster or shrimp, or combination of both

1 shallot, minced

2 tablespoons butter

1/2 lightly beaten egg

1/3 cup sour cream

1/4 teaspoon anchovy paste

11/2 tablespoons drained capers, chopped

1 tablespoon freshly grated Parmesan cheese

1 tablespoon fine dry bread crumbs

2 teaspoons melted butter

Sauté the seafood and shallot gently in the 2 tablespoons butter for 3-4 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from the heat. Beat the egg into the sour cream, add the anchovy paste, capers, and half the cheese. Mix with the sautéed seafood and shallot and heap in 2 coquilles or individual baking dishes. Sprinkle seafood mixture with bread crumbs, remaining cheese, and melted butter. Bake in a preheated 425° oven for 15 minutes, or until piping hot.

Note: The coquilles may be prepared a few hours ahead and refrigerated until baking time.

Hearts of Palm Vinaigrette

To offset this rather rich dish, serve a salad of canned hearts of palm, drained, and tossed with a sharp vinaigrette sauce.

Caraway Melbas

4 very thin slices seedless rye bread 1 tablespoon soft sweet butter 1½ teaspoons caraway seeds

Place the bread on a baking sheet, spread carefully with butter, and sprinkle with caraway seeds. Bake in a preheated 325° oven for approximately 25 minutes, or until dry and crisp. (Baking time will vary depending on the dryness of the bread and the thickness of the slices.)


Pineapple in a Pineapple Shell

1 ripe pineapple 3 tablespoons sugar (or more to taste) 1 tablespoon white crème de menthe Mint leaves (optional)

Cut the pineapple in half lengthwise, cutting straight through the fronds, and trimming off any unsightly tips. Scoop out the flesh with a sharp knife, leaving a thin shell. Cut out the core and dice the flesh. Place half the pineapple in a small saucepan with 2 tablespoons of the sugar. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until the sugar dissolves. Cover and continue cooking until the fruit is tender. Combine with the remaining fruit and sugar. Stir in the crème de menthe. Chill until ready to serve, then spoon into the pineapple shells. Garnish with mint leaves, if desired.

QUICKIE DINNER

If you have to make a theatre curtain, plan a dinner that can be whisked in on a tray, the debris whisked out before you leave. Since there is scarcely any last-minute preparation, there's



no problem organizing the tray setups in a matter of minutes. You could go one step further with the advance preparation by packing the rice salad in two custard cups, chilling it for several hours before unmolding it onto individual plates, then adding the scallops. This is a light menu, but heavier fare is likely to make you feel drowsy. A good American champagne, as dry as you can find, will put you in a festive mood.

SPIKED MADRILENE
BAY SCALLOPS WITH MUSTARD SAUCE
CURRIED RICE SALAD
BLUEBERRY PUDDING SMITANE

Spiked Madrilene

1 can consommé madrilene
½ teaspoon lemon juice
¼ teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
Dash liquid hot pepper sauce (Tabasco, Frank's,
Pickapeppa)
¾ cup red Bordeaux or Burgundy wine

Combine the first four ingredients and bring to the boiling point. Put half the wine in each consommé cup and fill with the seasoned consommé.

Bay Scallops with Mustard Sauce

11/2 tablespoons oil

1 pound bay scallops (or sea scallops cut in half)

2 teaspoons sugar

2 teaspoons French's mustard

1 tablespoon wine vinegar

2 tablespoons sour cream

2 teaspoons minced parsley

1 head endive

Heat the oil in a heavy skillet. Add the scallops and cook over high heat, shaking the skillet constantly, until they begin to lose their translucence. Remove from the heat immediately, pour into a bowl, cool, and chill. Shortly before serving, drain the scallops of any juices that may have collected. Mix the sugar, mustard, vinegar, sour cream, and parsley. Pour over the scallops, toss well, and transfer to 2 individual plates. Garnish with endive leaves.

Curried Rice Salad

For shopping information, turn to page 186.

2 teaspoons salad oil
1 teaspoon wine vinegar
½ teaspoon curry powder
1½ tablespoons chutney, minced
1 small tomato, peeled, seeded, and chopped
¾ small green pepper, cut into julienne strips
1 cup cold cooked rice
Salt, pepper to taste

Mix the oil, vinegar, curry powder, and chutney. Combine with the tomato and pepper, and toss with the rice. Season with salt and pepper. Chill for several hours before serving.

Blueberry Pudding Smitane

2 cups blueberries
2 teaspoons cornstarch
½ teaspoon cinnamon
4 tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon grated orange rind
1 egg, separated
⅓ cup sour cream

Mix the blueberries with the cornstarch, cinnamon, 2 tablespoons of sugar, and the orange rind. Pour into a small baking dish and bake in a preheated 375° oven for 10 minutes. Reduce the heat to 350° and bake about 25 minutes longer, or until the berries are cooked. Mix the egg yolk, sour cream, and remaining 2 tablespoons sugar. Beat the egg white until stiff, fold into the cream mixture, and spread over the berries. Bake about 20 minutes longer, or until flecked with gold. Serve warm or at room temperature.

with a special champagne stopper nd put it back in the refrigerator or later in the evening. There is ever much difficulty in finishing it fter coffee.

If, on the other hand, we tarted the meal with a still white rine, there would be no need to nish it the same evening. Good hite wine, recorked and refrigerted, will not deteriorate notice-bly for two or three days.

In this sense white wines are lmost always hardier, more restant to opening and subsequent orage, than red. It is tempting rovidence to keep even white ine for longer than a few days, ut I have known a very rare and xpensive German trockenbeerenuslese, as sweet as honey, to keep condition for a whole month fter opening. Considering the rice of the bottle-over \$30-it as just as well-I could go on oling out priceless thimblefuls to eserving visitors instead of havng to concentrate all the enjoyent into one session.

The comparative delicacy of ne red wine means that this is the ine to buy in half bottles. These ave another advantage. Wine ges quicker in smaller containts, so half bottles are usually bund to taste a year or two older nan full bottles, and that, in this ge of quick turnover, is all to the ood.

On the other hand, if you need ed wine for cooking as well as rinking, a half bottle will not go ery far. It is better to open a fth. If a dish is worth making ith wine, it is worth using a good rine, best of all the same wine you re going to drink with it.

Unfortunately, the most fanous names of all and the wines ou would never squander in cooking, the first growths of Bordeaux and the Grands Crus of Burgundy, re not often listed in half bottles. In Château Mouton-Rothschild's amous label the comparatively mall number is quoted, but I have eldom seen one of them. Halfneasures are therefore not readily vailable for really "hang-the-exense" drinking.

The best course, if you have a nagnificent bottle for two people o drink, is to plan your whole eveing's arrangements around it. If were going to devote the evening o one really wonderful red wine, would go easy with the hors oeuvres, as well as the aperitif nd the first wine. This is the place or a half bottle of champagne or vhite wine—perhaps a Meursault, Chablis Grand Cru, or a Califoria Pinot Chardonnay. I would teep the menu less varied than sual and start with something uite close to the main courseâté, for example, rather than fish.

Then with the great wine, a simple expensive steak, half a broiled chicken, or a small rack of young lamb. Then cheese. It is amazing how quickly the whole bottle disappears. For this occasion I would use my biggest wineglasses, polished to the utmost brilliance.


One of the most memorable (if disastrous) of such dinners that I have ever had, in fact, was built around a great white Burgundy—Le Montrachet 1953. We started with some asparagus in butter and the Montrachet itself, no other wine. The next thing I was aware of was a strong smell of burning from the kitchen. We had been so rapt by the marvelous scent and the delicate strength of the wine that the chicken under the broiler had gone up in smoke!

Even everyday dinners for two, as opposed to these occasional flights to the moon, can be kept on a mildly celebratory level by having wine on hand in the house. Half-gallon jugs of California Mountain red or white, the latter in the refrigerator, can add the extra touch of a two-wine meal—a wine for each course, every day. These California wines are particularly suitable for keeping open for a week or so; their comparatively high alcohol content keeps them safe and sound.

The adventurous character of a dinner for two also allows you to be uninhibited in your choice of wine. Look along the shelves of your wine and liquor store for oddities; it is often the way to come across something unusually good. For example, buy the oldest red wine you can find. It may conceivably be past its prime, but at least it will make a change-we drink far more wine before its peak than after it. If you do find a very old bottle, it is as well to ask the store manager where it has been all its life. If it has been next to the radiator or standing up on a shelf, it will be a poor risk, but under proper storage conditions, it may well have become that all-too-rare thing, a really mature wine.

Freed from the sense of responsibility to guests you can experiment without restriction. Try wines with names you have never heard of. Follow up anything which has intrigued you; names like Bull's Blood, Tiger Milk, Pipi d'Ange. Remember, though, that oddities should always cost less than famous names, not more. If a wine is completely strange to you, it is a great help to taste it with another wine, one you do know, as a yardstick to see where it fits in. Alone, its unfamiliar taste may strike you as being either much better or much worse than it really is.

Mary's Chicken Soup

1 pint strained chicken stock

2 tablespoons pastina

2 tablespoons butter

2 tablespoons flour


1 egg yolk

1 tablespoon grated carrot

Bring the stock to a boil. Gradually add the pastina, reduce the heat, and simmer for 5 minutes. Melt the butter in another saucepan over medium heat. Stir in the flour and add the stock slowly, stirring constantly until the soup thickens. Remove from the heat. Stir a little of the hot soup into the egg yolk, then pour the mixture back into the soup. Cook for a few seconds over low heat being careful that the yolk does not curdle. Pour into the soup bowls, sprinkle the grated carrot on top, and serve immediately.

CASTLE HUNTING IN LITTLE ENGLAND YOND WALES



One of the serendipities of travel in this all-too-stereotyped world is the discovery of small pockets that have managed, magically, to preserve their own distinctive character and charm. Such a pocket is the part of southern Pembrokeshire known as Little England Beyond Wales, where Roch Castle stands (see page 142). Unlike the more famous and familiar regions of mountainous northern Wales, it is seldom visited by Americans, despite its manifold lures-a fascinating history; a wealth of ancient castles, each with a story to tell; sandy beaches and tiny fishing villages; a green, serene countryside; and simple but comfortable hotels and motels.

Pembrokeshire, a peninsula that pokes like a dragon's snout toward Ireland, was held by the Romans, raided by the Vikings, invaded by the Normans, and to this day is split by an invisible line running from west to east-the ancient Landsker, or chain of fortified castles established by the Normans to protect their slim gains and the Flemish settlers against the Welsh to the north. The line, which was made up of both major and minor fortresses, virtually isolated those behind it from the Welsh culture and language. They

became anglicized and their domain was dubbed Little England Beyond Wales. Today, although many of the castles are in ruins and others, like Roch, are private ly owned and cozily domesticated the traces of a troubled past are still there for the seeking.

How to get there, what to see

Starting from London, it is not hard to find the way to Little England Beyond Wales, for Route A40 leads northwest to the Cotswolds (with a slight detour north of Cheltenham, you can break the journey by an overnight stop at a wonderful old inn, the Lygon Arms, in the picture-postcard village of Broadway) and then over the border to Monmouthshire and on to Haverfordwest, in the heart of Pembrokeshire. Here the Mariner's Hotel, a hostelry since the seventeenth century, makes a good headquarters for castle hunters.

Haverfordwest-a busy. sprawling market town with three medieval churches-is dominated by one of the major Landsker fortresses, a thirteenth-century castle currently in the process of restoration. It is very helpful to plan your tour with the aid of a detail map of the area (Pembroke #151) and

guidebook to the main castles and ruins. Both can be bought at White's bookshop at the top of Dark Street, and if you are in the nood for shopping, the Haverfordvest Pottery on High Street makes and sells handsome dinner services n brown-and-white or pale glazes. Across the way, Country Clothes as not only clothes, but local potery and all kinds of handcrafts. n Gerald Oliver's bits-and-pieces intique shop in Albany Terrace on St. Thomas' Green, you might turn ip a battered but authentic Georian silver knife box or some simiar memento. Picnics go hand-inand with castle hunting, and the reengrocers and bakers on Bridge treet have tempting windows full f fruits, vegetables, and such English delicacies as fresh-baked teak-and-kidney pie. (For more uxurious, après-castle dining, here is Chez Gilbert, a small resaurant with French regional ishes prepared by an expert

From Haverfordwest, you can pick almost any point of the comass and discover an inviting vilage, a brooding ruin, or a wellcept castle. Take the road northvest to St. David's (it covers sixeen miles and seventeen hillsortunately miniature ones) and ou get a glimpse of Roch Castle on the right, perched on a pre-Cambrian rock outcropping like a ierce eaglet. The road winds past he sandy beach of Newgale, the iny harbor and fishing village of Solva to the city of St. David's, ated as a city by virtue of its fine

Norman cathedral, but actually a quiet, hilly, sea-gazing village. Its claim to fame rests on St. David himself, the patron Saint of Wales, for it was here he introduced Christianity to the Celts in the sixth century and founded a See (by the twelfth century, St. David's was so highly regarded that two pilgrimages to this obscure spot equaled one to Rome). Viking raiders burned down the first simple monastic church, and on its site was built the present cathedral—an impressive edifice of local purplish sandstone with great late-Norman arches and a nave roofed with gray Irish oak. To the west of the cathedral are the ruins of the Bishop's Palace, built by Bishop Gower in 1340. (The Bishops of St. David's were powerful, strong-minded men, and wealthy enough to build themselves a series of convenient country seats, among them Lamphey Palace, a small-scale version of the palace at St. David's, and the castle of Llawhaden, both south of Haverfordwest.)

When ruins pall, the Grove, an old but modernized hotel, can be counted on for a reviving cup of tea. Before starting back, you might take time out to wander around the steep streets with their fine old houses and investigate the antiques in the Corner Cupboard and the local pottery and quilts in the Craft Shop.

Southeast of Haverfordwest lie three of the most interesting of the ancient ruined castles—Carew,



Manorbier, and Pembroke. Carew and Manorbier were built by Gerald de Windsor, a Norman who married a local girl, Nest, daughter of Prince Rhys ap Gruffyd. He received the lands as part of her dowry from Henry I, with whom this famous beauty had been more than a little friendly. Carew and Manorbier were residential castles, rather than fortresses, and designed for the kind of hospitable largesse popular in those days.

Manorbier, the more romantic of the two, is a true model of a Norman baronial residence with its moat and drawbridge, and neighboring church, mill, dovecote, pond, parks, and groves. The castle is on a rock in a valley that looks over a little inlet and out to sea. Although privately owned, it is open to the public from April 1 to September 30, a time of year when the gardens within the walls are at their best.

Carew, on a grander scale, was remodeled and improved by Nest's descendants and had its heyday during the reign of the Tudors: a three-day tournament held in 1507 for Welsh knights and their retinues drew 600 guests. You can get an idea of the scale of the entertaining from the remains of the banquet hall with its enormous mullioned windows, the work of the Elizabethan Sir John Perrott. Near the castle entrance is an even older symbol of Welsh history, a Celtic cross of the ninth century. decorated with interwoven scrolls and inscribed in Latin to "Maredudd the king, son of Edwin." Carew can be seen weekdays (and Sundays during August) for a small fee.

Pembroke, west of Carew, was the first and most formidable of the Landsker fortresses, and for centuries the seat of the Earl Pembroke and the center of po (one Tudor king, Henry VII, born here). Ruined but partirestored, the castle is famous its Wogan, a natural limes cavern 50 feet underground wis subterranean passage leading the harbor, and a huge circ vaulted keep with walls 75 high and 19 feet thick at the tom. Pembroke Castle is ope the public; admission is about cents.

After Pembroke, other ca (and there are more in neigh ing Carmarthenshire) would b anticlimax. This is a natural at which to turn back toward land, stopping overnight at Belgrave Hotel in the medi town of Tenby, now a lively side resort. Little remains Tenby's castle, but there are n Georgian houses and a Tudor chant's house on Quay Hill, ov by the National Trust. You find woolen honeycomb spreads in the old market, po in the Tenby Pottery Shop amusingly named Upper Street. A short ferry ride awa Caldy Island, where Cister monks live in a Norman Ab tend their flower and veget gardens, and make perfumes, pourri, and woven fabrics that sold in town.

From Tenby, you can tal different route back by drivin Cardiff and crossing the Sever Bristol, Bath, Stonehenge, then on to London by Route through some of England's p tiest countryside.

How can I be sure of picking a good termite-control company? This is an important question, since the termite-control field is itself infested with fraudulent operators. As with any other household investment, you should deal with a well established firm. Size and local or national reputation are both good guides, and a quick check with your local Better Business Bureau will eliminate much anxiety. But to proceed with complete confidence, you should be aware of what a reputable operator's services comprise, of what he can and cannot do.

No legitimate termite operator pretends he can eliminate termites forever; he is not, in the commonly understood sense, an exterminator. His objective is to place a barrier of toxicant beneath and around your house through which termites cannot pass. Those isolated above this chemical barrier die for lack of moisture; those below it are cut off from their food supply and will be forced to move elsewhere.

A reputable termite company will furnish a contract which provides for establishing the chemical barrier, for any necessary structural alterations, and for dollars and cents protection against any future termite damage (up to any sum varying from \$5,000 to \$25,000, depending on the operator). He will also, through his written contract, guarantee the contents of your house against damage, and he will reinspect the premises at least once a year.

Should I expect a full explanation of the termite-control man's strategy? You certainly should, because a description of the work to be done is another form of protection against fraudulent operators. A conscientious contractor will make certain a chemical barrier chokes off all possible entrance areas. He will treat the ground around and under your house by applying the toxicant with special pressurized equip-ment. He will also, when necessary, drill holes at close intervals in foundation walls and concrete slabs in order to inject the toxicants that ensure the integrity of the chemical barrier. Finally, he will make all necessary repairs, and leave your house sound and uncluttered.

How much should termitecontrol treatment cost? The national average for treating a singlefamily house is in the neighborhood of \$165, according to one nationwide termite-control company. But this figure does not really reflect the wide range of conditions encountered. If, for example, a considerable amount of structural damage has been done, or if the construction of your house is unusual, the termite-control man's price will of necessity be higher. Too, there are normal regional differences in cost that may affect your expenditure.

How much inconvenience will a termite-protection treatment cause? As a rule, practically none. Where damage (by the subterranean type) is minimal and the infestation light, treatment will require the efforts of one or two men for a day or so. Obviously, if damage is great, structural repairs will take more time. If you are unlucky enough to attract the dry-wood variety of termite, however, you will need to vacate your home completely while total fumigation is carried out.

Can I buy protection against possible future termite damage? Yes. Whether or not you have had a termite infestation, you can contract for annual inspections and control. The average national rate for such service is less than \$20 a


year, but varies according to local conditions.

When buying a house, new or old, make sure the property is termite-free. Nearly every state requires that a termite inspection be made before a house changes hands.

If I'm planning to build a new house, can I have "built-in" ter-mite protection? Termite control is easiest and best achieved before a house is built. For a relatively small sum, the ground on which your house will stand can be pretreated with the necessary toxicants. Most good builders in heavy termite regions will pre-treat the site. But don't take it for granted. Insist on this service. The FHA requires pre-treatment, but this again is a requirement that depends for its enforcement on regional FHA alertness. So always ask before buying a new house.

POVVER EXPLOSION

Remember the patient horse? Only yesterday, his hooves swathed in gunny-sacks to protect the turf, he used to draw the mower across the lawns of the town's leading citizens. It took one world war to put that particular horse out of business and enclose his power in an iron and steel package. Then it took a second war to develop the shopmen's skills so that they could make motorized tools—especially power mowers—part of the householder's vocabulary. In anything like its present shape and status, the power plant that has taken so much of the drudgery out of landscape care is barely a generation old. Indeed, the gasoline engine of the late nineteen forties, opposite page, looks essentially very much like today's engine that is hidden away under a streamlined housing. You will, with luck, never see it exposed in quite this way, with its fuel tank and pump, its air filter, its spark plug, its muffler all projecting from the crankcase like warts on a frog. Least of all will you ever see its connecting rods flexing nut-and-bolt fingers to juggle mowers, saws, sweepers, tractors, tillers, and the rest with apparent ease. But how the package has changed, and how its functions have proliferated!

The power explosion spawned by World War II put a new face on garden upkeep. In the following years, small engines like this one removed all the heavy labor from even the largest backyard—not to mention the small ones. They have been so refined and developed as power mechanisms that they can be started by your grandmother and operated by your grandson. If a horsepower race has developed in certain kinds of mechanical equipment, at least operating noise levels have been reduced proportionately, new ways of performing old-fashioned tasks have been perfected, and new functions, unthought of twenty years ago, have been added.

Anything like reliable figures about the prevalence of home-style power equipment are lacking. But the number of motorized lawn mowers of one type or another runs into the tens of millions. Cultivators and tillers probably rank next numerically (not counting farm-size models) and the accretion of backyard tractors now amounts to tens of thousands annually. Regionally, the snow blower is becoming a recognized member of the suburban family of equipment. And even such esoteric devices as lawn vacuums, power sprayers, and chain saws are available at the corner store. Therefore, a few sensible questions arise:

Are all these power tools necessary? Once a piece of household equipment for either indoor or outdoor use has proved demonstrably useful, it soon becomes indispensable. Certainly the time saved by power equipment in the garden can be put to good use elsewhere. Tractors, which most homeowners do not really need, are most often in the same class as high-fidelity radio components, pleasure boats, and sports cars: you don't need them, but they can be a joy.

Do power tools do the old jobs better and are they safe to use? Along with engines that are quieter and start more easily go cutter bars and reels that can manicure a lawn as few hand-propelled machines were ever able to do. Until fairly recently safety was shirked in the interest of performance, but now safety is receiving the honest consideration of most manufacturers. Safety guards around cutting parts, better balance of the machines themselves, automatic controls that either stop or inactivate the machines when manual guidance fails—these are but some of the factors that are no longer being ignored, especially in lawn-mowing equipment. As the use of power equipment increases, so does the awareness of its possi- (Continued on page 202)



bilities (with risk of accident among the possibilities). So rules have been promulgated by the industry, standards have been established, warnings conspicuously displayed on the equipment itself. Enclosures for moving parts serve the more important purpose of keeping toes away from blades, fingers out of wheels and gears, clothing away from oil and grease. And if penalties have not been provided for failure to meet standards, competition will take care of the situation.

Is modern landscape-maintenance equipment well designed? On that score, we have little to say. Streamlining comes and goes-as if a streamlined housing made any difference to a machine incapable of going faster than three miles an hour! Clutter at least is currently regarded with disfavor and the good old reds are holding their own as favorite colors. More encouraging perhaps than design is its cousin, quality. Once glossed over in the power equipment field, quality is now respected by all but the fly-by-nights, a few of whom will always be with us. Perhaps not surprisingly, the best engineered and best built equipment also appears to be inherently the best designed.

How long will a good power tool last? There is no pat answer. Appearance is but one rather undependable criterion, as is price. Lawn mowers in the upper tier of price ranges for a given type of mower will, however, last at least a dozen years of regular duty if given an annual checkup. In the mid-range, expect at least five years before the trouble of making repairs becomes too burdensome. Bargain tools may last a full season of home-style use, or they may not. We could devise a rough rule of thumb on the basis of some experience and a little paper work: allow \$30 to \$40 a year for each year of the power lawn mower's life expectancy. (The difference between an inexpensive mower and a good one may lie in the quality of work it turns out and the lack of trouble you will have keeping it in good order.) Regardless of inherent quality the yearly cost of the mower will vary surprisingly

Simple tractors, with a mower attachment, will cost approximately two and a half times as much (we said it was a rule of thumb). All the other landscape implements are intermediate—in both cost and the needs they fill. Some people can put one to the most productive use, some another.

How do you select power tools First, evaluate your needs-a rat er casual process these days, since power mowers are taken for gran ed and tractors are rapidly invaing the realm of sporting good But if you have a home orchard, power spray rig may be godser number one. If you are a vegetab fancier, a cultivator will seem a important. If you make a point entertaining on your lawns an terraces, a power vacuum sweep will prove itself virtually indi pensable, although you may no believe this until you have act ally used one for a season or tw Whatever you need, however, th sources for obtaining the too have not changed essentially many years. Some of the most re utable manufacturers sell solely chiefly through franchised deale and distributors. Others with e tablished dealer organizations al sell through hardware stores, d partment and chain stores, an garden centers. The less well-e tablished brand names are foun in the discount houses as well : the usual garden-supply outlets. I the latter cases, service is seldor provided after purchase. Or if se vice is provided, it is often inferio to the point of frustration. The f miliar answer is still valid: th best brand to buy is one handle by the most reputable dealer your community. A brand that ha returned a fair profit to a reliabl store for ten years or more is likel to prove a safe investment for you

How much upkeep do modern pou er tools require? The first need i for careful attention to fueling lubrication, and minor adjustmen routines-most of which you ca well take care of yourself. The sec ond requirement is for regula sharpening (for mowers) and en gine checkups once a year. If yo have taken care of your routine, the work you ask a mechanic to do wil not be taxing. If, for example, you "run out" or drain all fuel from the tank and carburetor at season' end (as you should), your mechan ic's task will not include replacing fuel lines and carburetor part come spring. If you dress you rotary mower blades with a file each time you use the machine you may not need to replace blade more than once a decade. I you keep your tools under cover (not a plastic wrap, which car trap moisture, but in a reasonably airy garage or tool shed), you will double the life of your tool, or halve its annual maintenance cost.

Where does the law of diminishing returns set in when it comes to using power tools? To that queson there is no complete answer. he average household can profitly use a power mower. The garn enthusiast may prefer to use other power tools at all, or he ay regard mechanical virtuosity pure pleasure. In that case, he Il no more object to paying a ousand dollars for a tractor rong enough to push a stone wall

down than someone else would object to owning a boat, building a swimming pool, or joining a country club. If you accept the idea that husbanding a decorative landscape is a worthy objective in its own right, then no criteria in the world apply-except those of personal inclination or, as a last resort, common sense.

The species should be chosen th care in order to obtain a od combination of spring colors one suited to the landscape in hich they are to appear and to ur own taste. Buy them in full wer if you can, and either with wrapped earth ball or in contains, so they may be transplanted thout check or shock. Give them humus rich soil, which need not especially deep, since all rhodendrons are shallow-rooted. over the earth around them and er their roots with a light leaf ulch, which should be left on in e autumn and renewed annually natural leaf fall does not take ere of the cover. See to it that ey do not lack for water during e summer, when root competion from surrounding trees may e severe. Above all, unless you ish to achieve an effect of massed drifting color, do not crowd the ants. Their free, open, and alays graceful growth habit is most ppealing when the placement is casual as to seem natural.

The flowering time for azaleas inges over at least four months, ith one species picking up as anther leaves off. The earliest native flower anywhere in eastern nited States is R. nudiflorum, alled Pinxter flower, whose paery pinkish blossoms, opening ell before the leaves, are among e loveliest foils for the yellows f the earliest daffodils that open oincidentally. It flourishes from lassachusetts to Louisiana, surving both deep winter cold and eavy summer heat. The latest to

flower is probably R. prunifolium, the plumb-leaf azalea of the far south, which regularly flowers there in July, sometimes producing its apricot-red blossoms as late as August or September.

In between these two, more or less in order of blossoming, are such fine native species as R. vaseyi, with a range as great as any; R. atlanticum, white tinged with pink, native to the midsouth; R. canescens, the white or pink sweet azalea of the far south; R. speciosum, the pale red Oconee azalea, also of the far south; R. roseum,

originally from the Blue Ridge Mountains and now spreading north and south; lovely blushwhite R. arborescens, its tubular flowers coming after the leaves; R. austrinum, the lovely yellow Florida azalea of the deepest south; R. calendulaceum, the vivid flame azalea that is as close to red as any native species and that is found everywhere between Pennsylvania, Ohio, and Georgia; R. viscosum, the white swamp azalea of the north and mid-south, blooming into July often as late as the first flowers of R. prunifolium. Most of these species appear naturally with flowers of varying shades of the basic color. In addition, many of the species appear to have hybridized naturally. Some, of course,




have been developed by plantsmen. Seen one with another, all exhibiting the plant growth habit and foliage characteristics of the predominant species, they constitute a wondrous collection of shrubs.

Two non-native species, which cannot be overlooked, are so splendid in the time and color of their flowering that few people have ever tried to improve upon them (none successfully). R. mucronulatum, whose papery purplerose petals are the earliest of all, comes from Korea. R. schlippenbachii, the "royal azalea," is found in several parts of Asia; its huge pink peerless flowers open along with the leaves in mid-spring.

It is doubtful that any private woodland, or any garden other than one maintained by a horticultural institution, could boast more than a score of the many variants in flower at any one time. The National Arboretum has a remarkably inclusive collection of native as well as exotic species, hybrids,

and horticultural varieties, incl ing literally hundreds, both ex green and deciduous. The evolving Callaway Gardens, Pine Mountain, Ga., is build up a collection in a wooded sett that will have few equals w its plantings, drives, and paths fully matured. Other fine coll tions are at Biltmore, Ashevi N. C.; in the gardens of Wint thur, Wilmington, Del.; at Morris Arboretum in Philadelp and in Boston's Arnold Arboret (near the northern limits of den hardiness for most azaleas a rhododendrons).

Some garden centers will o ry in stock one or two of the m dependable or familiar wild s cies-along with the more fla boyant bright-colored evergre types that you find everywhere rhododendron country. A few go nurseries may be able to sup upwards of a dozen. And from o or more specialists it will be p sible to obtain all those m tioned above.

ways the best plant. The ality you bought at the nursery season will show up now. And quality you buy this spring y show up forever. Within a en plant species in a given price nge (and from nursery to nursprices can vary greatly) you pick a gem or a lemon. Obusly, it behooves you to pick gems. If you have near you a iable nursery-preferably, of irse, one that initiates or "grows its own material-the task will relatively easy. Adopt the same w-me attitude that rules in the permarket when you thumb the of a cantaloupe or tap a ash. In the nursery you draw de the branches of a tree to amine the attachment to a nk or the straightness of the der. In a bush, you look for nmetrical growth, or for good d initiation (if the plant is in d), or even for the quality or or of the flowers if flowering has gun. Naturally any tree or bush it is ready to flower should be rchased either "container own" (in pot or tin can) or B&B, alled and burlapped-i.e., dug d wrapped in a tight earth ball). either case, the plant may be wed without undue risk, even en in full flower.

If you are not familiar with best characteristics of the ecies or variety you are about to y, ask the nurseryman (if you ow his word to be dependable) look up the essential points in a od reference book. If you are dering by mail from a catalogue, ur choice among individual ants will be limited to the opns catalogued. That is to say, improved variety or an individ-I specimen plant may be specialnoted (perhaps at a special ice). This may be the preferred oice; depending on your estiate of the dealer's reliability.

The basic point, of course, is pick the best plant you possibly n under the conditions of purchase that prevail. Make a casual choice and you can blame no one if you get a casual result.



Second weekend

Lawn curb. When we are not trying to make our turf grow more vigorously, we are trying to restrain its growth. The principle of checks and balances seems to cover lawn care (or would the legal term "adversary system" seem a more appropriate term for what applies during the season?). Fortunately, however you define it, there is a solution to the pulling and hauling that goes on between the plants that will not thrive where you want them to and those that grow where they shouldn't. To each his own. So place a plastic or metal edging strip between the turf, where you want it, and the garden, where you don't. The best and only permanent metal curbing material is rolled steel, of substantial thickness. But such material is costly (about \$2.25 per running foot, delivered and laid). You can move the decimal point two places to the left on that cost figure for corrugated aluminum or plastic strips. Both are durable enough, but the first, being light in weight, will bend beneath the tread of a good-sized cat, while the other tends to crack when trod on, especially in cold weather. The answer, obviously, is to set the strips deep enough so that they either will not get bent or, although bent, will not become unsightly. The difficulty, judging by the usual results, lies in cutting a slot deep enough to accommodate the strip throughout its length. One small stone in the cut, or a crossing root, can prevent the curbing from attaining the proper level without a bend or break on the upper edge. So here is a suggestion that works, albeit somewhat clumsily. Make the principal cut with a sharp half-moon edging

tool along the line you wish to follow for the season (or until you change your mind). Then, just to make sure you have a clear, clean, deep, wedge-shaped cut, follow the edger's spoor with a hand ax whose edge is expendable. (Do this when the soil is moist and your slot will stay open.) Now when you unroll your edging material, it will slip easily into place, to whatever depth you wish. A second set of swipes with the back of the ax will chung the earth up against the curb and your job is then completed.



Third weekend

Azaleas for groundcover. Usually the shoe is on the other foot, and you think about the groundcover plants that would go well with azaleas. But right now daffodils should be reaching their peak in most temperate gardens, and while the first show needs no background cover of other plants, when the flowers are gone and the foliage begins to brown, relief will be needed, despite the other bulb flowers you may be blessed with in May. So we suggest azaleasthe mid-spring deciduous species -as groundcovers. Azaleas are not, of course, groundcovers in the strictest sense of the word; they don't creep, crawl, or trail. But when scattered through any planting, especially in the light shade of burgeoning woods, they will certainly take your mind off the fading bulbs. Then they will take over the burden of beauty on their own (and you may have to find groundcovers for them). One thing at a time, however.

In general, the wild azaleas, particularly the American ones (page 141), are too tall when mature to play second fiddle to spring bulbs. When they are small, say 18 inches high and as much in graceful spread, they are groundcovers of the daintiest and most satisfying sort. One caveat: don't plant them too close together. Set them in small groups (one to three plants each) casually spaced through the area concerned. Eventually the bulbs may encroach on the azaleas' roots. But by that time the bulbs will surely need division and the azaleas may be large enough to outgrow the groundcover status.

Reading notice. A.G.L. Hellyer, editor of Britain's Amateur Gardening, has teamed with watercolorist Cynthia Newsome-Taylor to produce Shrubs in Colour (Doubleday, \$8.95) -altogether a lovely book. The line drawings of G. R. Kingbourn are informative rather than pretty, but the color work is splendid and the text useful. Made in and for Britain, but at home on any American reference shelf.





In keeping with the large dimensions of the living room, the impressive ceiling consists of the hand-hewn railway ties which came from a Texas hill-country railway abandoned a half-century ago. The furnishings in this room represent a cross-section of Spanish Colonial: fanciful chests, carved chairs, a coffee table fashioned from a tailor's work table, and hand-loomed draperies from Mexican weaving centers.

The dining room, with its marvelous ceiling, a shallow arch of bóveda-bricks, is spacious and simple. Dessert and after-dinner drinks present no problems for two people. Sweet, heavy wines-port and Madeira-can be kept open for much longer than table wines without spoiling. Even some light sweet wines (like the trockenbeerenauslese I mentioned) keep quite well in the refrigerator.

Liqueurs, of course, are the hardiest standbys of all. They come to no harm after years of standing undrunk in the liquor cabinet. For a change from the usual little sticky eggcupful, try your favorite liqueur in a highball glass, poured over lumps of ice. Cointreau is quite magically

fresh and orange-like drunk in way. Traditionally, crème menthe has always been pour over crushed ice and drunk w a straw, but the on-the-rocks te nique is as good, or better becar it gives you the benefit of the sc as well.

If you are a nut about gardening, it can be a wildly exhilarating experience overseas. Recently I met a veteran of years of living in Asia who hadn't yet recovered from having to leave a lovingly nurtured garden just when it was about to bloom. Another friend muses about the courtyard pot garden that gave her a marvelously green outlook in a stark and arid land. Also, growing vegetables when you have enough ground can provide you with a safe supply of the greens that might be suspect in the marketplace. I still dream about the perfect heads of lettuce and the world's parsliest parsley that I grew in Cuba, which was the only place I've ever had orchids growing outside my kitchen door. So pack your favorite small garden tools, but go easy on the big mechanical pieces unless you have found out that they are necessary and can be serviced.

If I seem to have neglected basic furnishings and equipment, it was wholly intentional. More first-timers abroad take too much or the wrong things, or useless things-than too little. Half the fun of moving abroad is acquiring furniture on the spot, then enjoying it when you move back home again. Every foreign service family I ever encountered cherishes things they have had made overseas: chests and tables in Hong Kong, wrought-iron chairs in Peru, contemporary furniture in Chile. carved screens in Kashmir. To some countries, however, you might do well to take springs, mattresses, and pillows, but stick to foam rubber which is less subject to mildew and insect life.

I know a woman who shipped all her carpets to Iran, but that was an extreme case of panic. Many other countries also have wonderful indigenous floorcoverings, ranging from wool rugs to sisal mattings, that are much more suitable and better looking on the local scene than American wall-towall. In the tropics, floors are usually left bare.

Linens are another story. In some parts of the world you can't find any bed linens suitable for our kind of beds. And American bath towels are a must. I just sent a whole trousseau of them, on special request, to a Swedish bride who had gone to school here and wrote that American bath towels were the one thing she couldn't match at home. And although every foreign service wife you meet wants to show you the ravishing

Will moving abroad be g for the children?

To most families assigned to eign posts, this is the most cri question of all. But to comper for your natural concern, there tremendous blessings. Child are the world's greatest amba dors. When they are old enoug go out and play, they will be ones who will help you n friends. And they will become darlings of the servants and tra men. Our mailman in South Ar ica would not have let a weel by without at least once carry our giggling two-year-old are the block in his mail sack.

Toys and games will hav be pared down, like all the res your possessions, but not, ples on an arbitrary, what-is-easiest pack basis. Don't rule out the things-a tricycle or scooter help a lot to bring a strange nei borhood into focus. And de overlook the minutia. Jacks, balls, miniature cars from the Five-and-Ten are great to dole out from time to time, not only to your own children, but to neighborhood small-fry as well.

When you get there

You will hardly be settled before you make a dismaying discovery: every American home abroad, far from being a man's castle, is in effect a goldfish bowl. In no time at all everyone in the neighborhood knows what you eat for breakfast, how you wash dishes, how many pairs of socks are in your children's wardrobes. And whatever you do is presumed to be typical of all 195,000,000 citizens of the U. S. While you are living abroad, everything from the objects on your coffee table to the way you pass a plate of cookies becomes a gesture in American foreign relations. It is largely the servants, of course, who broadcast the newsand they do it in as minute detail as our TV commentators report on the private lives of the astronauts.

Must you have servants?

The answer is: probably, yes. Yet delightful as it may sound to have six or seven people to wait on you, when the chips are down, most Americans, having been spared the experience of coping with servants, would actually prefer not to have them around. But, if for no other reason, you will probably need a servant to do the marketing. American commissaries do not exist in every overseas post (or you may not be privileged to buy from them). Even where they do, fresh produce has to be bought every day at a market which opens soon after daybreak. The early comers get the best selection and the best quality, and bargaining over prices is the rule since the vendors are also the original producers. The whole procedure can be great fun, but time-consuming and sleep-robbing.

But why do you need six servants to do what one woman can do at home? The answer to that is: their generally low physical stamina. As a result, many countries have built up traditional divisions of labor as binding as those of American labor unions. In South America, I once had a maid who came in three times a week just to wash the chandeliers and mirrors. If Maria tried to walk the baby, which was strictly Gloria's job, we had a domestic revolution.

Then there is the matter of hours. In some countries, especially in the tropics, the help works in split shifts, coming in the morning, leaving for the afternoon and returning at night. "In India, I had seven," one woman told me, "but if I wanted to run downtown to do an errand in the middle of the afternoon, I would suddenly discover there wasn't a soul around to watch the children."

Some local customs you can't fight, and shouldn't try to. Do not be dismayed by time-honored conventions such as the "cut" the cook expects when he does the marketing. But let him know that you are onto the rules and not to be taken in. A friend of mine while living in Cairo had been studying Arabic, unbeknownst to her cook. Every week he would add up the bills aloud in his native tongue, then give her a much higher total in English. One day, to his dumb wonder, she pointed out the discrepancy. They got along fine after that.

Between foreign assignments, a young consular wife makes a point of hoarding copies of *House & Garden* and certain other magazines. "Before we go off to our next post," she explained, "I'll comb through them all and clip every picture that shows how something is made—curtains, bookshelves, or watercress sandwiches." Like the rest of us, she has found out that it's a great deal easier to convey what you want of servants by a picture than to try to explain it in faltering Portuguese.

In the former colonial countries you will be introduced to two sets of customs and conventions—the indigenous and the imported. There is a foreign service legend: "If you go where the Dutch or the Germans have been, everything will be very clean. If you go where the French have been, you will find wonderful cooks. If you go where the English have been, everything will be orderly and operate on schedule. If you can find a place where they all have been, you will be in heaven."

Any family is lucky to have a chance to move abroad. From overseas you can look at your own country with new perspective and objectivity, re-evaluating hitherto unquestioned blessings with more appreciation. But the families who are happiest are the ones who forget about the things "you can't get here," and take advantage of the ones they know they could never get anywhere else. They are imaginative and adventurous about adapting local products and produce to their own uses, usually ending up with houses that are more colorful and more personal than the ones they left behind.







The care and safekeeping of

TABLE LINENS

How to keep them spot-free and crisply laundered

Brides too often stash away their beautiful trousseau linens, letting them see the light of day only on very special occasions. This unnecessary hoarding is usually prompted by fear of what continual laundering and ironing might do to them. Table linens do need frequent laundering, of course, but there is no danger if you know how to launder them and, most important, when and when not to administer first aid after the inevitable accident.

In this day of automation most households are equipped with up-to-date washing machines and dryers, with their myriad settings for fabrics of varying weights and fibers. Machine-washing will do an excellent job if you follow the directions and settings recommended for delicate fabrics.

Hand-washing is highly recommended for small, fragile, and dainty linens such as cocktail and tea napkins, sheer cloths, embroidered or lace-trimmed cloths.

Should you send table linen to an ordinary commercial laundry? The answer is-hardly ever, unless your laundry is an unusually good one and makes a specialty of "hand" work. Most laundries have a penchant for folding linens askew, inside out, and for excessive starching. And it is only the exceptional laundry that will not use strong bleaches and will separate white and colored linens. Even though natural linen and cotton are durable and stand up to hard use with amazing aplomb, continual bleaching and starching will take its toll.

Washing

That old cliché-"washes like a handkerchief"-is surely one of the great non sequiturs, as nothing is more loathsome than washing handkerchiefs. Natural linen and cotton table linens, however, do launder the way handkerchiefs are reputed to. Moreover, frequent washing not only does the fabrics no harm, it improves them, making the linen and cotton bloom and become more lustrous. Before laundering, it is wise to spot-treat stains. Once the linen is wet all over, it will be difficult to locate the stain, although it will show up when the material is dry, and if ironed, may be set permanently.

Remember that while it is not always possible to treat stains the moment they occur, it is not a good idea to allow them to stand for any length of time. If you cannot treat

them immediately, sponge them with cool water only. (See stainremoval chart, page 218.)

Before either hand- or machine-washing, wet the spots, then gently rub thick soap or detergent suds directly on the area. Take care not to rough up the fibers with too vigorous rubbing. For very stubborn spots, a soft welllathered brush is excellent. Then, if washing by hand, flush the sudsy water through the whole piece. Otherwise, put it in the machine at the proper setting. Hand-washed linens should be rinsed at least three times-preferably more. Under-rinsed linens will encourage scorch marks when they are

Colored linens, especially when new, should be washed separately. A mild, perborate bleach may be added to remove some stains. Be extra careful when machine-washing not to put dark or deep colored linens in with light cloths, lest the color of the linens bleed, and they collect lint.


Most linen experts agree that linens washed in water with Calgon Water Conditioner added are brighter and crisper because the dirt is held in suspension in the water and does not redeposit on the linen.

Drying


Drying at too high heat is as damaging as washing in too hot water. Automatic dryers set too high literally bake linens, blasting in wrinkles which weren't there in the first place. While there is no substitute for sunshine and a brisk breeze to put freshly laundered table linens in an easyto-iron condition, gentle automatic drying can almost duplicate these conditions. Remove table linens from the dryer before they are completely dry. They will iron far more easily then than later when they must be sprinkled and rolled

Ironing

Ironing, that bugaboo of most housewives, is a bit of a bore, but it goes fast if done promptly when table linens are evenly moist (not soaking), with the iron set at the proper temperature. To increase the luster, first iron the wrong side, then the right side. Embroidered or lace-trimmed linens should be ironed face down on Turkish toweling to bring up the Continued on page 218

design, then again on the side protected by tissue paper. Colored linens seem to change hue while being ironed, but they will return to their original shade when cool and dry. Napkins should be pulled into shape before ironing so they are as nearly square as possible and the corners will meet when folded. When ironing large tablecloths, vary the folds. Fold loosely, then iron up to the fold, but do not crease. Center creases should never be ironed into formal dinner cloths. Be sure to allow freshly ironed linens to dry thoroughly before storing to prevent mildew.

When to consult professionals

What about your banquet cloth and your highly ornamented or delicate or valuable old table linens? The safest, and, in the end, most economical, method is to send these to professional linenlaundering specialists. Their work is expensive, but worth every penny as it restores the linens as well as cleaning them. Most large cities have such specialists. Smaller cities seldom do, but it is worth sending the linens out of town. Some of the importers of fine linens also have a special service for laundering the linens they sell.

These highly skilled laundresses (they are usually women) prefer that you do not use any firstaid methods on fine and valuable linens. If you have an accident, try to get the linens to them promptly along with complete information on the nature of the

A few tips for keeping linens in good condition: • When drying, do not hang by the corners, but fold over the line . If linens freeze while being dried outdoors, handle gently, thawing indoors away from heat, or the fabric may crack • When storing white and colored linens not used frequently, keep them away from light and as airtight as possible . Do not store white linens in cedar-lined chests, drawers, or cupboards as the cedar fumes will yellow the linen . If you have the space, roll cloths on mailing tubes or on rolls made of strong brown paper before storing.

Stain-removal Chart

Alcoholic beverages Soak or sponge immediately with cold water, then with mixture of cold water and glycerine (available at drugstores). If stain persists, rinse for a few seconds with vinegar.

Blood, egg, meat juice Scrape off. Soak in cool water. Apply unseasoned meat tenderizer to stain, keeping warm and moist. As soon as feasible, rinse out with warm water. Repeat as necessary.

Candle wax Rub with ice cube. Scrape off excess wax. Place cloth between several layers of facial tissues and press with warm iron. Pour boiling water through stained area from wrong side. Sponge with alcohol if wax dye stains remain.

Chocolate, gravy, catsup Scrape off excess. Soak in cool water. Then treat as recommended below for lipstick.

Coffee or tea, without cream Soak fresh stains in cool water. Rub spot with liquid detergent shampoo, rinse thoroughly, and pour boiling water from a height of 1 to 3 feet through the stain.

Coffee or tea, with cream Soak in cool water. Rub area with glycerine to remove grease. Rinse thoroughly in warm water. Rinse thoroughly with boiling water, poured from a height of 1 to 3 feet.

Fruit Soak in cool water. Apply liquid detergent shampoo and wait for 15 minutes. Rinse, then repeat if necessary. A powder or hydrogen peroxide bleach may be used on white or colorfast linens.

Lipstick Sponge with cleaning fluid. Rub with glycerine to loosen grease. Apply liquid detergent shampoo and let set for 10 minutes. Rinse thoroughly in warm water. Pour boiling water through stained area if lipstick dye remains.

Mildew Remove at once. Make a paste of soap or detergent and chalk and pre-treat stains. Wash at once. Dry in sun or under sunlamp. If stain persists, bleach in sun with paste made of lemon juice and salt or sodium perborate bleach. Rinse thoroughly and dry. If fabric is colored, test first on a corner before proceeding.

Mustard Rub glycerine lightly between hands, working into stain. Rub soap or detergent into dampened stain and wash. If stain persists, sponge with rubbing alcohol or diluted bleach.

Wine Follow directions for alcoholic beverages. If stain persists, rub with liquid detergent shampoo. After 15 minutes, rinse.

NOTE: All treated areas should be rinsed in water conditioned with Calgon to ensure thorough removal of treatment substances and help prevent rings from forming around the treated area. Then wash the entire piece in warm, soapy water.
