


HEPPLEWHITE CHEST

I inherited my chest of drawers from my mother's family who came from New England. The front is curved. Can you tell me when and where it was made? R. H.-Allenhurst, N. J.

Your bow-front chest of drawers is in the Hepplewhite style

and was probably made in New England in the late eighteenth century. Hepplewhite chests of drawers have either a bow front or straight front-the latter by far more plentiful. The valanced base curving into French bracket feet is a feature of this style.

AMERICAN DRESSING STAND

Enclosed is a picture of a "Primping Table" with a marble top. Could you tell me its origin and what period it represents?

K. O.—Richardson, Tex.

Your American Victorian dressing stand provided with candle arms, designed in the classical taste, probably dates around the 1840s. The general lightness of effect is a pleasing feature of your piece.



REGENCY STYLE ARMCHAIR

I would appreciate any information you can give me about my new armchair that's inlaid with brass. C. M. S .- Washington, D. C.

Your armchair with brass inlay is in the English Regency style, dating around 1810-1815. Inlaid brass was favored as a decorative technique. Another feature of this style is the arms without armposts that end in

huge open volutes resting directly on the tops of the legs. Also characteristic are front legs shaped in bold concave or saber curves, called saber legs.

GERMAN CHOCOLATE SET

Here is a picture of my chocolate set. The mark on the bottom of the cups says "Mignon Z. S. & Co. Bavaria." Any information will be appreciated.

Your chocolate service was made at a porcelain factory started by Zeh, Scherzer & Co. in 1880 at Rehau, Bavaria, Germany. Your mark is one of their earlier ones. Continued on page 10






GERMAN PORCELAIN MARK


ENGLISH ÉTAGÈRE



Bourbon A woman's guide to a man's drink -or is it?

I remember the first time I tasted bourbon. It was at a party given in London by a visiting American journalist, and for me it was a case of instant rapport. Brought up by the Royal Navy on Plymouth gin, I'd never thought of hard liquor much beyond Pink Gin, so that bourbon, that quintessentially American liquor, spun me into a whirl of images as I sipped the golden drink. My host wanted to know what I thought of it, and with a head full of pictures of rich velvets and luxurious settings, I came up with "voluptuous," which hardly seemed right for a drink, yet how else explain the rich, round quality that only bourbon has?

In New York I discovered Old Fashioneds and loved them for a time, and Manhattans, partly because as a gin and bitters girl I couldn't cope with martinis, and partly because I was enchanted to find that it was Winston Churchill's mother, Jennie Jerome, who had the mixture of bourbon, sweet vermouth, and bitters served for the first time at a reception in New York in the 1870s.

It was not long, however, before I was drinking bourbon just with ice and the kind of soda that is simply bubbles, not a real mineral water, which would have distorted the taste. I began to suspect something I have found to be true. Once a bourbon drinker, always a bourbon drinker, for bourbon claims allegiance on first acquaintance and demands an everlasting loyalty. I also began to notice that among women I was very much in a minority. Unless I joined like-minded gentlemen, I would drink my bourbon alone, in a sea of martinis and Scotch. Bourbon was considered a man's drink, and I was invariably asked if I wouldn't prefer something else.

If one considers bourbon's early days, it isn't surprising that the ladies of the time preferred a glass of Madeira, or even a little rum punch, and habits stick. Irish and Scottish colonists had experimented with rye and corn in an endeavor to get a local supply of usquebaugh, "the water of life"; but it wasn't until 1789 that the Rev. Elijah Craig, seized with an attack of genius, made a whiskey using corn with a little rye and barley malt and the fine limestone water from a local spring, and produced bourbon. The drink was named for Bourbon County in what was then Virginia, and the County was named for the French Royal family as a thank-you for helping the colonists gain their independence. Later this became Kentucky and bourbon dropped the word "county" from its name. It was a man's drink, all right. It was a heavy, 100-proof spirit, splendid for the soldier, and fine for the man who worked hard, long hours out-of-doors, but not very suit-

able for what has come to be known as the cocktail hour.

It wasn't until after the Second World War that bourbon's popularity began to grow. Bourbon distillers have a disarmingly simple explanation for the upswing. The whiskey, they say, has improved considerably over the last twenty years, taking advantage of both modern distilling methods and of the distillers' own shrewd appraisal of modern drinking tastes. The overwhelming percentage drunk today is a lighter type, 86-proof and aged in the barrel for at least four years. And slowly, but surely, it is ceasing to be a man's drink, which is not to say the gentlemen are going to abandon it. Bourbon, as befits our age, is going unisex.

President of the Bourbon Institute, Vice Admiral William J. Marshall (ret.), estimates that today 40 percent of all bourbon drinkers are women. Many of them still take their bourbon in the form of mixed drinks, but Women's Lib moves irresistibly on, and more and more take their bourbon in its highest form, as bourbon and branch, which is to say, bourbon and water, branch simply meaning water from a small stream, hence purer.

This is a far cry from the days when distillers were afraid that putting "sour mash" on their labels would turn women off, as sour would mean something gone bad. All sour mash means is putting some of the undistilled liquid from the previous day's fermented mash of grain into the next batch, giving a continuity of flavor and character to the brand since distillers culture their own yeasts, and they are a big factor in making one bourbon taste differently from another.

The barrels in which it is aged for four, six, eight, or twelve years add a magical something to bourbon. Made of white oak and charred on the inside, they are never used again for bourbon, but are sold to distillers of other whiskeys, such as Scotch and Irish. No one knows exactly why charred white oak barrels mellow and turn bourbon the color of red gold. It may be the caramelized sap under the charred surface. It remains a mystery with a glorious outcome.

Bourbon also has the distinction of being a drink that can only be made in the U. S., in the same way as cognac can come only from the Cognac region of France, and Scotch whisky can't be made in England, or anywhere but Scotland.

For all its spreading fame as a drink, cook-book author James Beard says bourbon as a cooking spirit isn't used half enough. It leaves, he says, a flavor more haunting than any other. He suggests puffing dried fruits, peaches, pears, apricots, and prunes in hot water, then marinating them in bourbon for a different sort of compote. Or making Brandied Cherries with bourbon instead of brandy, and he reminds us that it was the flavor of peaches cooked with bourbon that caused Southern Comfort to be born.

Try flaming a **Steak au Poivre with bourbon**, he suggests, and when you feel that hamburger has exhausted all its possibilities, mix a little bourbon with the seasonings, broil to the degree of doneness you prefer, and flame with bourbon.


Mr. Beard also believes that bourbon has produced the most elegant drink in the world, a **mint julep**, and that his friend from childhood, Mary Hamblett, makes the best ever. She puts the ice in a canvas bag and whacks it with a mallet until it is powder. To solve the problem of touching the glass while frosting it, she uses a handled glass mug. She strips the

Then she fills the mug, an 8-ounce one, almost to the top with the powdered ice and pours bourbon in until the glass is full. If this thought alarms, pour in 3 to 4 ounces according to taste. Stir with a long-handled spoon until the glass has a really thick frosting, decorate with mint sprigs, and sip slowly.

Poet and playwright Andrew Glaze, who came to New York from the South, enlivens holidays with his Highball Ham, which is ham basted with equal parts of bourbon and ginger ale. The meat has delicious flavor and the kitchen odors are sublime, but Andy winces at the thought of bourbon and ginger ale as a drink, preferring bourbon and branch. Bananas Flambéed with Bourbon is the result of a collaboration between the poet and his wife, dancer Adriana Keathley Glaze. It was her banana recipe, his bourbon. Peel and halve lengthwise 4 firm bananas, sprinkle with 4 tablespoons of sugar, and sauté in 4 tablespoons of unsalted butter until lightly browned on both sides. Transfer to a serving platter, warm 1/4 cup bourbon, flame the bananas, and serve blazing. And as for Christmas cake the Glazes buy theirs, or make it, 2 months ahead of time and pour 3 ounces of bourbon over a 2-pound cake every 2 to 3 weeks. They keep it wrapped in cheesecloth and aluminum foil between anointings.

Jane Moss Snow (Mrs. Davis W. Snow) is a bourbon and branch drinker, too, and has a fine, free, imaginative hand with bourbon in the kitchen. She uses it in place of other spirits and also in place of wine, both fortified and not. For blanched Seckel pears, she puts the pears in boiling water for 5 minutes, peels and cores them, and cooks them until tender in a syrup made of equal parts of sugar and water flavored with cloves, nutmeg, cinnamon, and a little lemon juice, then adds bourbon, a cupful to about 14-16 pears, and poaches them for 5 minutes longer. They keep well, refrigerated, and make a wonderful dessert with ice cream, whipped cream, or whatever. She does a Rum Pot with bourbon, using soft fruits as they come into season, and Bourbon kidneys make her Sunday lunches a joy forever. She sautés onion in oil and butter until soft, quickly sautés halved lamb kidneys, adds flour (a tablespoon for 6 kidneys), cooks for a minute or two till brown, pours in bouillon, then 1/4 cup bourbon, and paprika to taste, cooks the lot briefly, stirring, and sprinkles the dish with chopped parsley. It has to be done quickly to avoid over-cooking the kidneys.

Bill Marshall, who also prefers his bourbon with branch, these days bottled spring water, is a rare man in the kitchen, a truly original cook. He livens up Cream of Shrimp soup and Lobster Bisque with a handsome dollop of bourbon, and turns onion soup into something special by adding about 2 table-spoons of bourbon per serving. For a **sour cream dip**, he adds a tablespoon of bourbon to a cup of sour cream, a teaspoon of chopped dill, garlic salt, and ½ teaspoon lemon juice. He enhances a roast turkey by pouring a cup of bourbon into a walnut stuffing and pours ¼ cup of bourbon over a duckling stuffed with orange segments.

I like to flame my own version of Boeuf Bourguignonne with ½ cup bourbon before adding the wine and I recommend designer Cecilia Mendoza's neat trick for supper



Awalk with perennials

By William B. Harris

We are nearing the end of our walk with the various genera of the lovely flowering plants we know as perennials. The many that everyone knows, such as Delphinium, Dianthus, Gaillardia, Gypsophila, Helleborus, Peonies, Phlox and the like seemed too obvious to include. If a garden were to contain only the genera listed plus the obvious ones-well, let's not dwell on nineteenth-century glory. The basic point is that a great number of these decorative perennials are not only known but are grown in this country commercially. So they can be found. Some of them are undoubtedly old and respected friends of yours; others, I hope, are new.

LOBELIA (lo-bee'lea-uh). Everyone knows the lovely annual called Lobelia, but not too many gardeners are aware that there are many other species in this genus, most native to the eastern United States, one a delightful blue perennial. Nothing special in soils is needed to grow it well, but it does like moisture and light shade. Plant in spring only.

LYCHNIS (lick'nis) Catchfly. A large genus of the Pink family, some of whose species have been cultivated for centuries. The best are sunny border perennials bearing large heads of brilliant flowers (Lychnis is from the Greek for lamp) from late May through July. Plant in spring or fall.

ah) Loosestrife. Creeping Jenny. Another genus containing many species although few are for the garden because they are weedy. They are widely distributed in the North Temperate Zone. And one, L. punctata, the Circle Flower, from Asia Minor, is a beaut. Planted in full sun or light shade it blooms June-July

and puts on a great show. Plant in spring only.

MACLEAYA (mack-lay'a). A genus of two species, both garden subjects, but the unpracticed eye can hardly tell one from the other. These stately plants can't be beaten where a bold planting is desired. Foliage is sculptured and quite lovely. "Blooms" come in showy clusters of seed pods, excellent for drying, Isolate a planting on a lawn or put it by frequented paths and these 6foot plants make a sensational show. Grow them in big pots or tubs for use on the terrace. They like a rich soil, which should be deeply prepared (2 feet) and given lots of water. Plant in spring or fall.

MERTENSIA (mur-ten'see-a). These herbs from the North Temperate Zone are generally low-growing, and make excellent subjects for the rockery, border, or in beds in light shade. The flowers are mostly blue and appear on racemes. Plant in spring or fall.

PAPAVER ORIENTAL (papaye'var or-e-en'tal) Oriental Poppy. These strong poppies from the Mediterranean now come in an unusual and beautiful range of colors, thanks to the hybridizers. As the plants go dormant in July (the tops dry up) it is best not to have too many in a group, but such a hole can be filled with annuals. Orientals grow in nearly any soil, but preen themselves in a deep loam, and they have a hearty distaste for transplanting. It is very important to plant the crown 3 inches below the surface. Mulch plants the first winter to prevent heaving; after that, do nothing at allthe finest instruction in horticulture. All varieties flower in June and range from 2½ to 3 feet in height. Fall planting only.



physostegia (fie-sos-tee'-gee-a) False Dragonhead. A genus native to North America consisting of only three species. They are excellent in a wild garden or sunny border. Flowers appear on terminal spikes from July to September. Plants should be dug and divided every two years. Plant in spring or fall.

polemonium (po-lee-mow'nee-um) Jacob's ladder. A genus of about twenty species mostly native to North America, with a few from Europe and Asia. This is a very hardworking and hardy group of plants—some are useful in the border, others in the rockery. They flourish in

a soil that is neither very wet nor dry. They like any rich loam and full sun. Plant in fall or spring.

PULMONARIA (pul-moenay'ree-uh) Lungwort or Blue Cowslip. The name is derived from the Latin word for lung. Indeed, one old tale relates that the plant was thought beneficial in the treatment of lung disease. The Royal Horticultural Society's Dictionary of Gardening says that "the species are difficult to distinguish and interbreed promiscuously." Promiscuity plants is not all right with me, so I recommend only one species, angustifolia, a bright blue 10inch plant, which must be propagated by division in early spring. Plant in spring or fall.

PYRETHRUM (pie-reeth'rum) **Painted Daisy.** Pyrethrum is the very old name for this daisy from Persia. Botanists now call it *Chrysanthemum coccineum*, but by any name it is one of the useful and rewarding perennials in the border. Plant in full sun in ordinary soil about a foot apart, but only in spring.


RUTA (rue'ta) Herb of Grace, or Rue. A genus of about forty species from Eurasia and the Canary Islands. They consist of shrubs, subshrubs, and perennials whose leaves generally exude a pungent odor. Ruta is called Herb of Grace because it was associated with repentance. Only one species, graveolens, called Blue Beauty, has garden value. Plant in spring or fall.

SALVIA (sal'vee-a) **Sage.** A very large genus of showy annuals and biennials—and a few hardy perennials. They are natives of many countries—hot and cold. Most gardeners know the annuals. Plant in spring or fall.

SENECIO (sen-ee'si-o). A very large genus of over 1200 species found throughout the world, few of which have garden value. But I don't know why so few gardeners grow doronicum varieties—they have big, bold, leathery green leaves, and their 2½-inch flowers, orange or yellow, are delightfully shaggy. Senecio is truly hardy. Plant in spring or fall.

SIDALCEA (sigh-dall'see-uh) False Mallow. A genus of about eight species, natives of western North America, with flowers similar to Hollyhock. Indeed, one species is sometimes called wild Hollyhock, but the spiked form is quite different. The named varieties are propagated by division; they should be separated and replanted every three or four years for best results. Plants do well in full sun in ordinary garden soil; irrigate thoroughly in dry weather. Plant in spring or fall.

SOLIDAGO (sol-i-day'go) Goldenrod. A very large group of plants, mostly North American, that everyone knows because Goldenrod is such a common thing in autumn. Its pollen was long considered a major cause of hay fever, and it still is by those who do not know that ragweed, which sheds its pollen the same time of year, is the cause of most of that suffering. "Why should I grow Goldenrod? It's a noxious weed," is the reaction most American gardeners have-until they see the gorgeous varieties the English have hybridized from this common American plant, which actually is a right pretty thing in itself. The Goldenrods are obviously very hardy and easily propagated by division. They should be grouped in the border with perennial asters, which bloom in August and September, the months that must be bridged with plants like these to keep a perennial border



if it has moisture. Blooms keep exceptionally well in water. The various species and varieties seem to have all the best attributes you look for in herbaceous plants. They bloom grandly in May and June, but continue to flower intermittently during the summer if irrigated. Plant in spring or fall.

valeriana (va-leer-ee-ay-na) Perennial Heliotrope. The many species of this excellent genus are literally spread all over the world, but only a few are hardy in cold northern climates. One, V. officinalis, is a great border plant. It is widely used in England, but not known well in the U. S. Plant in spring only.

WERBASCUM (ver-bass'kum) **Mullein.** A huge family of mostly biennial species originating in the Mediterranean. Man has spread them all over the Northern Hemisphere. There are a few hardy species. English hybridists have done wonders with both biennial and perennial forms. The wooly foliage makes them interesting border plants; flowers appear on well-branched spikes.

Verbascum likes well-drained soil and grows best in full sun. Plant in spring only.

VERONICA (ver-ron'i-ka) Speedwell. Another very large genus of useful plants. The shrub species, however, are all from New Zealand and are hardy only in the warmest U.S. zones. They are widely used in Southern California. The perennial species are rather broadly distributed in the North Temperate Zone. They are varied in form, and many of them are excellent garden plants. Faded flowers should be cut back to promote new bloom and growth. Perennial border forms, once established, should not be moved. Plant in spring or fall.

You won't, of course, grow varieties of all the perennials we've talked about in this series, which started in the October 1971 issue and continued in November. But many gardeners, after reading of plants they only vaguely know, resolve to grow them—next spring. If they don't, what of it. Contemplation, it has often been said, is at least half the joy of gardening.

in color until chrysanthemums show. Plant in spring or fall.

stokesia (sto-key'zee-uh). A hardy American perennial in the form of the annual Cornflower (it also bears a resemblance to asters) is a highly decorative border plant and good for cutting. It needs full sun and is not fussy about soils. There is only one species. Plant in spring only.


GETWAN (too'kree-um) **GETWANDET.** A large genus of about 150 species, few of them worthwhile in gardens. A few dwarfs, however, are very valuable, for they can be used as miniature hedges. *Chamaedrys* is probably the best for this purpose and entirely hardy. It prefers a well-drained location in full sun. Plant in spring or fall.


Showy species of North American and Asiatic origin make up this genus, but only a few are used decoratively. Flowers are pea-like. Most garden species bloom in June or July on 3- to 4-foot stems. Plant in spring or fall.

TRADESCANTIA (trad-eskan'tee-a) Spiderwort. Before

the hybridizers took over T. braeteata and T. virginiana, the two hardy species of this native North American genus, about all one could say in their favor was that they were interesting. They are lovely today. But because they were namby-pamby for so long very few gardeners grow them, and fewer even recognize them now that they have been so remarkably transformed. The plants are strong, the long, narrow leaves very beautiful, the flowers most unusual in form and color. The blossoms close on a hot day by midafternoon, but a fresh crop opens shortly after dawn each morning. All varieties grow to about 24 inches in sun, about 30 inches in half shade. Tradescantia is a perennial that deserves far more attention. Plant in spring or fall.

TROLLIUS (trol/le-us) **Globe-flower.** A fine genus found throughout the temperate regions of the Northern Hemisphere, having lovely large globular or buttercup-like flowers and attractive dark green leaves. It should be used in a moist, partially shaded location and thrives in rich soil with plenty of humus. Trollius does well in full sun, too,

The Navy

Of course Mr. and Mrs. Keller of Rockville Centre, Long Island, were pleased when their son chose the Navy after college. Especially proud because he received a commission as an officer. But financially, the Kellers—like many parents—missed the boat. They didn't realize the Navy might have paid for their son's college education through the Navy-Marine NROTC program, the Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps.

The NROTC Scholarship pays a student's full college tuition, cost of textbooks and instructional fees, and a monthly subsistence allowance. All this could be worth as much as \$12,000, depending on which of the more than 40 colleges and universities with NROTC units he chooses.

NROTC students spend their college years in a normal course of study, with the addition of Naval Science courses. They also attend scheduled drills and summer training.

And upon graduation, they are commissioned as Navy or Marine Officers on active duty (the minimum service requirement is presently four years).

If you think your son can qualify, talk it over with him and the Navy Recruiter in your area. It just might be that if he's ready for college, the Navy or Marines is ready to send him.

orating and living. Always an influence—the love of our heritage today is stronger than ever. The American desire to preserve what's good of all periods is as active in Texas and California as it is on Long Island and in Massachusetts. This concern takes many forms—conserving the land, reviving old methods and crafts, recreating gardens of another era, making precise historical restorations, or just updating old houses rather than building new ones. In some cases individuals with dedication and guts find both federal and foundation money to support such ambitious restorations as the whole towns we show beginning page 76.

hese as-they-were restorations are just one part of the story. On a less historical level we've put together a portfolio of houses kept for their good points but updated, each in a different way. One individual stripped an old Stanford White "cottage" down to the shell inside, then filled it room by room with color and pattern and white floors, thereby getting rid of what she didn't like in a Victorian house but maintaining what was good looking. A couple on the West Coast preferred not to disturb the coziness of their Monterey-style house with its low ceilings, cool bare floors, thick stucco walls that kept out the heat. To update the house, they relied not on slick modern furniture but on a large collection of paintings by American artists of the sixties-some very big, all very colorful. An actor and his family found an old barn for a weekend house and insulated it with a polyurethane foam that dries in forty-five secondsbringing the cost of the heating equipment to two eighty-five-dollar heaters and the foam, an important technique that could mean lots of old barns could be made livable for a decent price.

irectly opposed to living with traditional objects and furniture but with modern comfort and flair is the kind of angle on living expressed by the new factory-built modular house that arrives by truck with interiors that are sleek, new, clean, with no associations and no memories. This modular house, though not out of the past, is right in the middle of the American tradition with its implied attitude that when there's a lack there's technology to fill it. In this instance technology creates more space and more house for the money than traditional construction methods allow. But efficiency has existed throughout American history, as the story of our Shaker Communities prove, and out of the past come as many good ideas for doing things as our modern gadgets provide. In Fredericksburg, Tex., over a hundred years ago women were figuring out how to cook ahead for the weekend so that when they arrived at their Sunday Houses the time could be spent visiting rather than cooking. The Weekend Cook Book, page 82, has recipes that were good then but would work just as well today, whether you stay in your apartment in town or go to a modular house in the woods. What updating tradition means, and what the contents of the issue add up to is that today we still need the charm of old familiar things combined with comforts and conveniences we've become accustomed to. For everybody, the balance is personal, not just charm for its own sake or comfort without style, but a bit of both.





THE BRIGHT BEAT OF COLOR AND PATTERN continued A firm believer in the philosophy of color and pattern as unbeatable fresheners for an old house, Mr. Clarkson gave Mrs. Gardner exactly what she wanted for a living room-aflower bed. 




"When we were doing the inside, we just used what we had in the barn and the one next door. The hayloft came from next door. The stairway up to it and the spiral staircase, 5. from the master bath room, 4. to the master bedroom, 3. are chestnut, so rare, and we found it all over the place. Henry made the stairs without nails just as they would have been done when the barn was built in 1820 What's incredible about this barn," continues Mr. Wager, "is the enormous mileage we got out of the space. We have four bedrooms and bathrooms. The master bedroom is in the silo. My daughter's room, 6. is in what used to be the old farm-implement room. My son Marc, who's seven, has a bunk room downstairs off the pool 2. (The pool terrace is rather fun, wood rounds set in sand and peastone, the way it's done in Chile.) Then there's the loft, 1. We've had a whole crowd of children up there at Christmastime.'



"I originally built the stairway leading to the little platform in my bedroom for the bed, but then I changed my mind and put the bed down in a corner by the windows. many limitations for hanging paintings—the walls aren't big enough or the ceilings high enough to cope with lots of our big pictures. But what everyone says who comes here is that it doesn't look like a big white-on-white, California museum house filled with contemporary paintings," says Mrs. Rowan. For visitors to the Rowans', being close to the art offers an intimate contact that larger rooms and higher ceilings wouldn't. 

Superbly restore that weathered

Colorful American crafts

Superbly restored, this Bucks County landmark has the recaptured youth of a house that weathered the American Revolution (and much more) to find itself, over two centries later, far handsomer than it ever had been and infinitely more livable. Built in for stages dated 1736, 1750, 1780, and 1961 (the year it was modernized and its ne kitchen added), painter-muralist Richard Neas's farmhouse is called Partridge Run because "half the partridges in Pennsylvania seem to be born hereabouts and they never leave." Along with the birds, which he likes, Mr. Neas loves comfort and has it. He also a stickler for the crafts and furniture of the period. The dining room, below, would have pleased even Thomas Jefferson with its original pine flooring, oxblood paint, Windson chairs jacketed in a print long called "Upholsterer's Check," its table set with slipwar and delft. The garden, opposite page, is also very much of the period—a "countrified parterre" with flower beds fringed with herbs. "Exceedingly practical. I cut both







AMERICAN CRAFTS continued Guesthouse, left, although new, is built in the style of a Pennsylvania Dutch barn. A few steps down from the front door is the swimming pool with its fieldstone wall and waterfall-an improvement on nature produced by a circulating pump. A bedroom in the main house attic, top right, has its original scrubbed pine flooring, a treasured twig chair, and on the bed, a beautiful Amish quilt. The entire first floor of the guesthouse is a bed-sitting room, right, with the bed snugly tucked away in a recessa wonderful way of using a Colonial trick to keep warm as a means of making the room look less like a bedroom. 

Expert Joseph Carreiro of Cornell University talks about new modular building

Before this year is out, families will be moving into the first of the "Operation Breakthrough" housing that has been going up on nine sites scattered across the country. Some will be apartments-rentals, cooperatives, or condominiums. Some will be single family houses, rented or owned by the occupants, and most will consist of factory-produced modules hitched together at the site. All have been built under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development program that Secretary George Romney started two years ago to bring modern technology to the building industry and up the quantity of housing available to people of all income levels.

Used extensively by the participants in Operation Breakthrough was a study of modular housing by the Department of Design and Environmental Analysis at the College of Human Ecology, Cornell University. ing Block," that first study has been followed by a second outlining a whole system of modular building. Here the chairman of the department, Professor Joseph Carreiro, explains just what modular housing is, how it works, and how it will affect the cost of building.

Professor Carreiro, what exactly is meant by "modular housing"?

Modular housing, sometimes called "systems building," is housing made up of a series of components-two-dimensional or three-dimensional-that are built in a factory, then shipped to the site where they are set up and fastened together on a previously prepared foundation.

What do these components consist of?

Some are boxes, some are panels. A component can be a complete bathroom, a kitchen, a storage unit, or simply an interior or exterior panel. These are assembled into building industry they are usually called "modules," although strictly speaking, the word module means merely a unit of measurement.


What do you mean by boxes?

I mean a large hollow cube with doors and windows cut in the sides. The boxes can be open at one end, both ends, top, or side. The ones used in Habitat at Montreal's Expo'67, for example, were open at the top. When you put the six-sided type together, you get a double floor and double walls.

How big are they?

Anywhere from 30 to 70 feet long and 8 to 10 feet high. In most states the width is limited to 12 feet by the highway constraints that set the maximum width for truckloads. But some states have already liberalized the maximum to 14 feet.

What is the difference between modular



he advantage of modular construction is that the longer you produce a system, the more efficiently you can do it and the more economies you can achieve"

struction costs is represented by the utilities—plumbing, heating, wiring, etc.—and the interior finishing and cabinetwork. Modular construction includes all of these.

You mean the wiring and piping is built into the boxes?

Into some of them. Modular construction usually involves two kinds of modules—"wet" modules, which are bathrooms or kitchens and include all the necessary plumbing, heating, etc., and "dry" modules that simply enclose space for living rooms, dining rooms, or bedrooms. There has even been talk of a wet unit that could be replaced after ten or fifteen years. One big builder of modular housing says he would take the old

one as a trade-in and supply a new one, which he would install in half a day. rior finish, and exterior finish will all be incorporated. In the modular system we designed at Cornell we have combined boxes and panels to take advantage of the best of both types of modules.

Are any of these modular systems in production now?

Ours isn't yet. But at least a dozen manufacturers are producing three-dimensional modules as well as panels, and the number is growing tremendously fast. One manufacturer's modules include individual controls for central air conditioning, double-glazed windows, sound-resistant double walls and floors, wall-to-wall carpeting, and tiled bathrooms, and all surfaces except the doors are prefinished. Four of these modules create a two-or-three-bedroom apartment.

Are modules always shipped by truck?
About 99 percent of them are. But one manufacturer has shipped some by rail. Oth-

ers are exploring shipment by water, which would get away from the width limitations imposed by highway constraints. One day I expect we will see modules transported by helicopters—those (Continued on page 98)

A THREE-BEDROOM MODULAR HOUSE THAT ARRIVES BY TRUCK

As these and the following pages show, modular housing can fulfill its potential for excellence in design, taking advantage of up-to-date systems technology. But always, and finally, the merit of design in building must be measured against man; good design in a house must be a design for living. This is what sets the house, below, called Triad and produced by Hodgson Houses, apart from many modulars and other prefabs. It is a house that understands human needs—and transmits an awareness of contemporary life styles. Changeable, mobile, easygoing people need room to move in, and room to be alone. This house, designed by architect Edward M. Coplon, is composed of two modules; the living areas, in one, are free-flowing. The other, a bedroom wing, is closed off, quiet. Between the two, Coplon inserted a glass-ended entry-dining unit. This simple separation/connection explodes the otherwise constricting dimensions of the modules and imparts a great sense of space to the house. For House & Garden, designer Tom Britt took the prototype, and with all-white flooring and minimum furniture, visually stretched the spaces to seem larger still. Furnishings: Simmons and affiliates—Bloomcraft, Moreddi, Raymor, Selig, Simmons Ltd.





Outside, left, and in, the house is all white, magnifying the illusion of space. Designer Britt wanted the interiors to complement the spare lines of the architecture, so he used only necessary furnishings. "In the living room, for example," he says, "there are no chairs, no end tables, no lamps, no curtains-nothing you don't really need." The result, this page, is a wonderfully open space for entertaining. A pair of banquettes, by Selig, draw people close to the fireplace; bar, by Moreddi, can be propelled anywhere. 








So many modulars look too "packaged," too cramped. In this house, the three living areas—living room, dining room, and entry—are fused into one sweeping space (see plan, left), divided only by a freestanding closet box. White vinyl tile covers all floors, further uniting these spaces. The entry and dining areas are one unit—with tall windows at each end—which architect Coplon inserted between the two modules of the house. This unit is fully open at the side toward the living room, virtually doubling that space. From the doorway of the master bedroom, opposite page, bottom, there is a marvelously free, clear view through all three spaces and on out the windows

to the outdoors. In the dining space, foreground, chairs, by Simmons Ltd., stack against the wall when not in use. The matching table becomes a pedestal for a still life of vases and for a sculpture by Porter, Betty Parsons Gallery. Striped painting is by Gene Davis, Fischbach Gallery. The library-guest room, above, at one end of the bedroom wing, is a cozy place to be alone with music or a book. It also attracts overflow guests from a large party, who want a quiet place to sit with a drink. ALL EQUIPMENT IS BUILT IN AND READY TO GO

Like most modulars, this house includes insulation and utilities-wiring, heating, plumbing—and major kitchen equipment and bath fixtures, plus finishing outside and in. Exterior is aluminum siding with a baked-on enamel finish; interiors are spray painted. Cost? Under \$15,000. This cost does not include laying of the foundation, transportation (up to a 400mile radius from the Berwick, Pa., plant) of the modules, and setup at the site. Nor, of course, land cost. Still, a conventionally built house of the same size-three bedrooms, two baths-would cost three times as much. When could you have this house? It takes about one month from order to complete delivery-local builders put in foundation; Hodgson does the rest.



Modules slide off the two trailers onto jacks and then onto foundate Utility connections are made, then last finishing touches. It take two men just one day to complete setup of the house; Hodgson also has a service staff that can make any adjustments—or replacements—at the site if necess

All the furnishings in the house have pure, simple shapes: shaped by material-smooth, lightweight plastic; and shaped, too, obviously, by function-and by their very ability to be moved, rearranged, easily taken care of. In the kitchen, below left, sleek table and chairs can be pulled out for dining or moved back during cooking, washing up. The convenient L-shaped work area branches along two walls to enclose a range and double sink. Above and below the counters are plenty of drawers and shelves, all preplanned in the module. As the house was set on cinder blocks, the area devoted to basement stairs (see plan, previous page) was adapted to accommodate washer and dryer. The bedroom wing is private. Bedrooms open off small hallways, which with the two baths, act also as noise buffers. In the master bedroom, opposite page, top and bottom center, the Simmons bed was centered like an island in the white space, anchored at





its four corners by pairs or stacking tables. Behind, two huge closets virtually fill the entire end wall. Two shaped canvases are by Anthony Tortora. The middle bedroom, above, with only a bed and a cluster of tables, is almost cell-like in its simplicity. The modular package provides the master bath, opposite page, bottom right, with shower, toilet, and wall-length vanity, plus storage beneath. (A linen closet is near the guest room.) "Crystal" by Chuck Hinman, Multiples. Another full bath with tub, opposite page, bottom left, is shared by other two bedrooms. Silkscreen is by Jack Youngerman, from Pace Editions. 

"We planned a garden that put new life into old land"

A Colonial garden in plan and spirit, but not confined to eighteenth-century planting, was a key part of the Bradburys' restoration. He made the plan, she made the plant list, and we cite only the mainstays of her more than 100 flower varieties. Even before they moved into their house they double-dug and manured the flower beds they envisioned. They also planted a framework of evergreens because "it's important that a garden be lovely in winter." The top soil had been sold off some years back, but they moved and fertilized the barnyard grass and gradually made a lawn without seeding. Mr. Bradbury used the rocks his shovel struck under the sod to build a terrace. He also added the studio, porch, and garage and stained all the shingles "to marry the old and new." A special sense of harmony in color, texture, and scale is everywhere apparent. "We like a quiet garden, no sharp drama, no clash of reds and yellows," Mrs. Bradbury says. "The only time the garden pulses with color is at iris time." She likes subtle blues and grays, uses soft cameo pinks throughout, and groups purple pinks in one area. She likes lemon vellow on her palette but chrome yellow as a mixer in a garden. Her husband says, "If a color isn't right, up it comes. At first I thought she had springs on the roots of those plants." Now that the garden is established it takes care of itself-almost. "You can't tell me weeds don't think; they always come up next to a plant they resemble," and "Never again would I garden under maples. Something is always coming down." Though they do nearly everything together, Mr. Bradbury insists "My wife is the gardener. I'm the handyman"-an ideal combination for any restoration plans.




HOW TO STENCIL A ONE-OF-A-KIND. PROOM WITH quilt patterns and ray paint

A big beautiful bath floats in the center of a beautiful bedroom, left. A pretty way to live flattered with powdered pinks and baby soft blues with everything glowing like a peaches-and-cream complexion. Part of the charm is prettiness underfoot—a painted floor blanketed with crisp color. The basic 1-2-3 of it comes in a new stenciling kit, so easy to use that you can even stencil curved shapes. What turns effort into fun are flexible stencils (1) made of vinyl that you can use alone or combined together as shown, spray painted with Krylon Spray Paint, quick color that comes straight out of a can. Stencil borders (2) and (3) outline the bed's headboard. A flower stencil (4)

edges the floor. Patchwork quilt design (5) combined with the triangles is the main stenciling that goes all over the floor, flows up the sides of the bathtub frame, stairs, and onto the platform around the bed. A butterfly stencil (6) touches the corners of the mirror. All this stenciling excitement you can do yourself without a lot of know-how or experience.

Here's how the quick stenciling works: First plot the allover

design by laying stencil patterns on the floor, lightly sketching around cutouts with a pencil, making sure all is centered and straight. Next, frame stencils with 6 inches of heavy wrapping paper taped on with masking tape. The stencil is then ready to be sprayed; to hold it flat to the floor, spray the back of the stencil with Krylon adhesive. Let it stand for a minute then lay the stencil face up on the floor, following the lines you have drawn. Last, spray with color. Before you zip off the stencil and move on to the next square, pause for two or three minutes to let paint set. The Krylon Spray Stencil Decorating Kit (there are three different kits available) is designed by Lemeau for Borden, \$5.98. 
IN WACO, TEXAS

1 CLASSIC REVIVAL HOUSES

RESIORED In Waco, a group of women, led by Mrs. Maurice

Barnes, a doctor's wife with a taste for history and a talent for writing, have stirred the whole city to saving and restoring architecture and developing the potential beauty of this one-time international cotton center. And there is more to this story than turning crumbling Victorian mansions into elegant museums. Through citizens' enthusiasm and local government efforts, Waco has been designated one of 150 Model Cities in the nation and one of 16 authorized to go city-wide, with a \$45 million program funded by the federal and state governments. Old houses are being rejuvenated, a new cultural and convention center just completed. There will be a green belt running through the heart of the city along the Brazos River banks, waterfront marinas to open up the joy of water sports, and a little village—a sort of Williamsburg in miniature—to capture the spirit of the old frontier. An enthralling Texas Rangers museum, Fort Fisher, has been created down by the river where Rangers stayed in 1837, and extensive refurbishing planned for one of Waco's national landmarks, the 1870 suspension bridge by John Roebling, architect of the New York Brooklyn Bridge. Add to this: five great nineteenth-century houses rescued from becoming dilapidated tenement buildings, some to serve as tourist attractions, others as working houses. All this activity, this "little renaissance" as people in Waco call it, will not only make a more handsome place to live, but bring new prosperity, too, new importance to a city that sank sadly after the Depression. 












buildings that are far from architectural gems. Mrs. Nalle rescued Earle Napier Kinnard House, above center, built about 1858. The Nell Pape Garden Center, above right, serving four garden clubs in the city. It dates back to 1873. McCulloch House, left, is next on the list for restoration. Says Mrs. Barnes, "It's in bad condition, but no worse than any of the others when we first got hold of them."



"Do your work as if you had a thousand years to live and as if you were to die tomorrow," said Mother Ann Lee to her early Shaker disciples. Suggestive of a Zen koan, this one of the founder's many sayings seems strangely prophetic of Hancock Shaker Village in western Massachusetts, a commune that lasted 170 years. Only twelve years ago did this enclave established in 1790 finally cease to function as the home of a decimated "family" of the United Society of Believers in Christ's Second Appearing. Yet today half of its twenty-two buildings have already been restored by a group composed for the most part of local lifelong friends of the Shakers as a permanent "thousand-year" conservatory of their inspiring work and design tradition. Hancock is now the largest Shaker museum in the Northeast.


Paradox was the essence of the Shaker accomplishment in architecture, furniture, and handcrafts that look so amazingly modern today. Turning their backs on beauty, the Shakers achieved a unique kind of beauty. Revering work as a spiritual exercise, they devised uncount-

able work savers, anticipating generations of efficiency engineers. Deliberately cutting themselves off from "the world" around them—the emerging America of the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries—the Shakers created a style of design that was more purely, more exclusively American than Philadelphia (Continued on page 95)



IN FREDERICKSBURG, TEXAS

3 FRONTIER HOUSES REVIVED

In the hill country of Texas, 70 miles northwest of San Antonio, there is a little "city of steeples" called Fredericksburg that is surprisingly old-world in character. It has become even more charming through the preservation and recent revival of a novel tradition: miniature Sunday Houses for intown weekend living. The Sunday Houses, with their pared-down simplicity, light house-keeping, and emphasis on good times with friends, are now as

sed. Early settlers on scattered farms and ranches sed. Early settlers on scattered farms and ranches sept miniature houses in town where, as a contemorary ranch wife and Sunday House owner put it, families could rest after market day, young folks ould go courting, and everyone could go to church and picnics the next day." Today people come from a far away as Houston to enjoy the pleasures of mall-town weekend living. Because houses are so mall and serene and simple, chores are minimal, and even meals are prepared ahead to keep all tasks mort and good times long. (See the Weekend Cook took, next page.)

Some of the early weekend houses were built the 1870s of wood with two rooms and a sleeping oft. Others are log and limestone houses, built on own-lot grants by the German pioneers who founded redericksburg in 1846. The colony included farmrs, skilled carpenters and masons, furniture makers, ilversmiths, intellectuals, and the leader, Baron von leusebach, who drew up a lasting peace treaty with ne Comanches. From the very beginning, Fredericksurg people took pride in the town they planned and uilt-the wide streets, the shops and public buildngs of stone from nearby quarries, the octagonal Vereins Kirche or community church now renewed nd surrounded by a garden honoring the pioneers nd the hill country's own former President and Ars. Lyndon B. Johnson. But as so often happens, nany of the early private houses lost their original haracter through years (Continued on page 89)

IN THE FREDERICKSBURG, TEXAS SUNDAY HOUSE TRADITION

Weekend entertaining should be as serene and simple to accomplish as possible; after all, the main purpose of the weekend is for the hostess as well as her guests to relax, wind down, and enjoy a change of pace. If food for the weekend is carefully thought out and prepared so that lastminute work is pared to the minimum, time can be spent with friends—not bending over a hot stove. The weekend and picnic fare that the old South Texans took to their Sunday Houses in Fredericksburg (see pages 80-81) was the epitome of what successful, streamlined weekend food should be-delicious and hearty, but for the most part prepared at home in advance. These portable menus and recipes from Sunday House people and their friends are cases in point and give you ideas for easy-riding, easy-to-prepare food with a German accent and a country heartiness just right for weekends anywhere. In the old days, families carried their picnics and meals in crocks and wooden Sunday boxes stashed under the buggy seat. Today these are supplemented by a variety of equipment from hampers to insulated carriers to bowls covered with tea towels. And the picnics and gatherings, often impromptu, are joint efforts with two or more people contributing their favorite dishes. Shared work and fun -half of which comes from not knowing quite what to expect-is a good idea for any weekend gathering whether it be at home or on the road.

PICNICS

Pienie I

Three Ring Salad

3 tomatoes or beets 1 onion 1 green pepper Salt, freshly ground pepper, sugar

1/2 cup vinegar 1/3 cup water 1/4 cup sugar 2 tables poons vegetable oil

Slice the tomatoes or beets, onion, and green pepper into rounds and arrange in layers. Season each layer with salt, pepper, and a little bit of sugar to taste. This should be done 3-4 hours before serving. Mix remaining ingredients for dressing. Pour over salad just before serving. The dressing travels well in a screwtop jar. Serves 4.

Corn and Cactus Salad

4 cans Mexicorn 1/4 cup drained, diced, canned cactus, or diced green pepper (Canned cactus is available at Mexican specialty stores. La Victoria and Clemente Jacques are 2 brands.)

6 tables poons red wine vinegar 1 medium red onion, diced 1/4 cup honey

Mix all the ingredients together and chill before serving. May be prepared 3 days in advance and kept refrigerated in a screwtop jar. Serves 12-16 people.

Ozonas

These pecan tarts are named for a little town in west Texas.

1/4 pound butter or margarine 13 ounces cream cheese 1 cup flour 3/4 cup brown sugar (packed) 1 egg, lightly beaten 1 large tablespoon butter 1 teaspoon vanilla 1 cup Texas pecans, chopped

Cream butter, cream cheese, and flour together thoroughly. Line muffin tins with the mixture: for a cookie, line toy-sized muffin tins; for dessert tarts, use a medium-sized tin.

Blend brown sugar, egg, butter, vanilla, and pecans. Fill

lined muffin tins with the mixture. Bake in a 350° oven for 25-30 minutes. Lower heat to 250° and bake 10 more minutes. Cool before removing from tins. To carry for the weekend, leave in the tins. Makes 48 toy-sized tarts, or 16 dessert tarts. May be made 2-3 days in advance.

Peach Sherbet

3 cups sugar 3 cups water 6 cups peeled and crushed ripe peaches 41/2 cups half and half 2 teaspoons vanilla

Bring sugar and water to a boil, then cool 1/2 hour. Mix in peaches, half and half, and vanilla. Strain and freeze in ice cream freezer. Makes 1 gallon.

Mrs. Smith often combines the purée and sugar syrup and freezes this mixture up to a year, thawing and combining with cream to make ice cream as she desires.

1 package active dry yeast or 1
cake compressed yeast
1/4 cup warm water
1 cup (1/2 pound) cream-style
cottage cheese
2 tablespoons sugar
1 tablespoon instant minced onion
2 teaspoons fresh dill weed or

1 teaspoon dried dill weed 1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon sait

1/4 teaspoon baking soda

1 egg

21/2 cups sifted flour

Butter

Coarse salt, optional

Dissolve yeast in warm water (lukewarm water for compressed yeast) in a large bowl. Heat cheese just until lukewarm and stir into yeast mixture. Blend in sugar, onion, dill, salt, baking soda, and egg and mix well. Beat in flour gradually, scraping down sides of the bowl, then beat vigorously about 20 strokes. Dough will be sticky and heavy. Cover with a clean towel and let rise in a warm draft-free place for 1 hour, or until doubled in bulk. Stir down dough. Butter a round 6-cup baking dish, and spoon in dough. Cover with towel and let rise in a warm, draft-free place for 45 minutes, or until doubled in bulk. Bake in a 350° oven for 50 minutes, or until loaf is golden and makes a hollow sound when tapped lightly. Brush top with 1 tablespoon butter, remove from dish, and cool or serve warm. Can be cut in quarters, then each quarter sliced. If desired, brush with butter and sprinkle with coarse salt before

baking. Freeze or wrap in plastic wrap for 2-3 days.

Prune Cake

1½ cups sugar
3 eggs, well beaten
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 cup buttermilk
1 cup corn oil
1 teaspoon each cinnamon, cloves,
allspice, and nutmeg
1 cup mashed cooked prunes
1 cup chopped pecans
2 cups flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
Shortening for greasing pans

Add sugar to eggs and beat well. Slowly add oil. Dissolve baking soda in buttermilk, stir into egg mixture with spices, prunes, pecans, flour, and baking powder. Grease a ring pan 9 inches in diameter and 4 inches deep and pour in batter. Bake in a 350° oven for 40-45 minutes. Cool and spread with icing if desired. This cake freezes well or keeps in a tin up to 2 weeks.



1 quart white undistilled vinegar 1 cup water

1/2 cup pure salt (not iodized)

Pack okra into 4 or 5 sterilized pint jars as tightly as possible without bruising. (If you bruise them, the pickles won't be crisp.) To each jar add 2 heads of fresh dill, or if using dried dill seed, put 1/2 teaspoon in bottom of jar and 1/2 teaspoon on top, a red and a green hot pepper, and 2 cloves garlic.

Bring the vinegar, water, and salt to a boil and pour into the jars to cover okra. Seal jars. Okra should be ready after 2 weeks. Serve icy cold.

Chess Pie

2 cups sugar 1 heaping tablespoon flour 1/2 pound butter 4 eggs 1/2 teas poon vanilla

9-inch unbaked pie shell

Mix sugar and flour together. Add to butter and cream until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time, beating after each addition. Stir in vanilla and pour into unbaked pie shell. Bake in a 300° oven about 1 hour, until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Wrapped, it will keep well in refrigerator for 2 days.

Spiced Tea

Fricadelles

by Miss Penny Perry, who learned this at London's Cordon Bleu School of Cookery.

5 ounces stale white bread, crusts removed

Milk

1 small onion, finely chopped

1 pound finely ground veal

2 ounces pork fat, minced

1 teaspoon chopped fresh thyme or

1/3 teaspoon dried thyme
7-8 teaspoons cold water

7-8 teaspoons cold water Salt, freshly ground pepper, paprika

Flour

Oil or butter

Tomato Sauce (see recipe below) 2-3 tablespoons sour cream or

yoghurt

8-10 black olives, pitted

1 lemon cut into eighths

Soak the bread for 1/2 hour in enough milk to cover well. Squeeze dry in a linen towel and crumble into a bowl. Mix in the onion, veal, fat, and thyme. Knead together very thoroughly, adding the water little by little. Season well with salt, pepper, and paprika. Shape into small balls about the size of a marble and roll lightly in flour. Sauté quickly in oil or butter until browned. Arrange in a deep ovenproof dish and spoon over the tomato sauce-enough so it just covers the fricadelles. Bake in a 325° oven for 15-20 minutes. The meatballs and sauce may be prepared in advance, frozen separately, then thawed

and put together before baking.

Just before serving, reheat the meatballs. Add the sour cream and shake the dish gently to mix the sour cream in without breaking the meatballs. Serve hot, garnished with the olives and lemon wedges. Serves 6.

Tomato Sauce

1 tablespoon butter

2 tablespoons flour

1 cup stock

1 pound tomatoes or 1½ cups canned tomatoes

Bouquet garni

Salt, freshly ground pepper, sugar

Melt butter in a heavy saucepan. Stir in flour, cook 1-2 minutes over low heat. Add stock, stir, and bring to a boil. Halve tomatoes and squeeze to remove seeds. Strain juice from seeds, reserve. Add tomatoes, bouquet garni, a pinch each of salt, pepper, and sugar, and the juice strained from the seeds. Mix well, cover, and simmer ½ hour. Pour through a strainer, pressing to extract juice. Adjust seasoning. Sauce may be frozen.

Sauerkraut Salad

1 #2½ can sauerkraut, washed and drained

½ cup each chopped celery, green pepper, onion, and carrot

3/4 cup sugar

1/2 cup vinegar

1/3 cup corn oil

Mix the sauerkraut and chopped vegetables. Mix the sugar, vinegar, and oil and pour over the sauerkraut. Keeps well stored in a tightly covered jar and refrigerated several hours before serving. May be kept refrigerated for up to 2 weeks. Serves 6-8.

Creamy Lemon Sherbet

34 cup fresh lemon juice 2½ cups sugar 1½ quarts milk

Mix juice and sugar. Slowly stir in milk. Freeze in 2-quart ice cream freezer. Makes about 2 quarts. Serve day it is made or store in deep freeze.

in a hurry. She beats eggs with bourbon, 1 tablespoon for 2 eggs, until they are light, then combines them with mushrooms sautéed in butter for a mushroom omelette with a difference.

United Nations Assistant Editor Mirtha Stengel likes bourbon in a black bean dip. In a chafing dish, she heats together a can of condensed black bean soup and a cup each of tomato sauce and grated sharp Cheddar cheese, then stirs in ½ cup bourbon. She serves it warm with corn chips.

Mrs. Janet Weithas, who is currently finishing a wine and liquor cook book, performs miracles with bourbon and beef in her **Potted Roast**. She browns a 6-pound boneless chuck roast all over in its own fat and sets it to simmering for 3 hours in a Dutch oven with a cup each of beef stock and bourbon and 2 tablespoons of dried onion soup mix. Note please that no salt is needed. From time to time she turns the meat so that the whole roast cooks in the sauce. Mrs. Weithas serves it to about eight with boiled potatoes and red cabbage.

My own celebration of the great American spirit is to unite it with the great American berry. I put a pound of cranberries on to cook with a cup of sugar and ½ cup of water and cook over very low heat until the first berry pops. Off the heat, lift the berries into a jar with a slotted spoon and reduce the syrup to about half, add to the jar with a cup of bourbon, and wait 3 months before using as a relish or with ice cream.

of continuous use and well-meant improvements. The Rodolph Smiths' house had been vacant for several years. The house Mr. and Mrs. George A. Hill III restored-with the help of architectural consultant Albert Keidel, who is credited with much of Fredericksburg's self-awareness and preservation-was jammed up against a filling station on Main Street. They had to open a sealed-up fireplace and buy an abandoned cabin in the country for materials to replace a deteriorated log wall in the bedroom.

Some of the Sunday House serendipities are hand-hewn rafters discovered under turn-of-thecentury ceilings and marvelous medieval-style Fachwerk-a German equivalent of Tudor half-timber construction. These Texans are also searching out and putting to use well-made local antiques: scrubbed plank tables with Sheraton or Biedermeier legs, graceful daybeds, huge schranks with bone instead of metal escutcheons (schranks are called armoires in the nearby Alsatian community of Castroville), native wood and hide chairs with knob finials, kitchen safes with punchwork tin panels that let the air in and keep insects out and are handsome enough to go in a living room, samplers with German sentiments, patchwork, pot-

tery, and ingenious kitchen tools. "These people made things they had to have to exist, but they couldn't live without beauty," one admirer said.

By comparing notes with other preservation-minded people throughout Texas, these Sunday House families and their friends are also working with the Witte Memorial Museum in San Antonio to assemble a Texas Decorative Arts exhibit in September 1972. Some of the best pieces of Texas furniture in the museum's collection will be handreproduced for sale. In Fredericksburg a visitor can see examples of German-Texan craftsmanship at the Pioneer Museum, the old Kammlah House. Or see oldstyle Texas "swept" gardensherb and flower beds set in hard neatly broomed earth, with no grass at all. Or sample the heritage of fine breads and pastries at Fredericksburg's two bakeries. Or in August at the County Fair hear German bands and try the local smoked sausage, peaches, and a wide variety of hearty dishes. And on any Saturday at six in the evening hear the church bells, still called Abendglocken, ring out one by one and then in unison to welcome all who come, and come back again, to this well-kept community with a joyous pride in its heritage.





Hot Curried Fruit

Melt sauce and pour over mixed fruits. Bake in a 350° oven until thoroughly hot. May be made 2-3 days in advance. Heat before serving.

Rum Chocolate Country Style

6-ounce package semisweet chocolate bits

1 square (1 ounce) bitter chocolate

8 eggs, separated

1/4 teaspoon salt

2 tablespoons Myers dark rum

Grated chocolate

Melt chocolate over hot water. Beat egg yolks until thick and light, mix in salt, and add to chocolate. Blend in the rum. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry and gently fold in chocolate mixture. who started the Historic Waco Foundation with three people ("It was called the Heritage Society then. There were just three of us all interested in Texas history: one a former mayor of Waco, Roger Conger; Mrs. Barclay Megarity; and I and we used to meet once a month upstairs in the library."), has supervised the restorations of three great old houses with funds from the Cooper and other foundations. More and more people have joined in. Mr. Ferris Megarity has been a special source of encouragement. Mrs. G. H. Pape has not only given major financial help toward two houses but also is busy planning marvelous tree-filled roads all around them.

The daughter of former Texas Governor Pat Neff, Mrs. Frank Wilcox, donated furniture from her father's Early American and Texas Collection. Mrs. Spencer Brown revived the Cotton Palace Pageant (a great annual event when Waco was a cotton center), which has become part of an elegant social weekend drawing more visitors and more enthusiasm for restoration. Mrs. George Nalle rejuvenated one of the prettiest old houses, offered it as a meeting place for faculty from Baylor University, and put a student couple in it as custodians. Her energy never faltered, even when vandals smashed every one of the Victorian glass windows in the house, and the local council surrounded the place with a complex of new roads swirling from a concrete cloverleaf. Mrs. Edward Bolton helped to revitalize a graceful riverside mansion, establishing it as a focal point for the spring art show and Brazos River Festival and Pilgrimage. The Bolton Foundation has contributed to three of the house restorations.

Miss Ida Morris gave her family's cherished antiques for three houses, with a great deal of silver, rugs, and other accessories. Mrs. George E. Wolfe specialized in the flower arrangements for all the houses, which are filled with furniture of the period, carefully and painstakingly selected by Mrs. Barnes.

Helping to reinforce public opinion about the value of saving Waco's architectural heritage and trying to improve the quality of urban life in general has been a team of architects and city planners under the direction of a sociologist from Tulane Uni-

versity, Mr. James Miller. "This city, like most cities in the na-tion," he declares, "has never been involved in the human side of services. People have always seen that as either the county's responsibility or the United Fund's responsibility or the nice volunteer groups' burden. Our community renewal program has changed that focus entirely. It is very heavily involved in both the humanitarian part as well as the physical part, and despite people's negative feelings about federal aid-Waco has always been conservative about outside help -this has been one time that the total city has pretty well gotten behind a program to achieve the environment we all desire."

For Mrs. Barnes, it all seems a long way from the days when she used to give slide lectures to clubs explaining the history of Waco's houses. She has seen the Heritage Society grow into a healthy organization, under the chairmanship for many years of Mr. Robert E. Davis, and watched with some pride the success of her decorative arts classes. They provide funds to do many things for the houses. "We started so timidly with twenty-five people and now we have a waiting list and seventeen men enrolled in the evening session."

She adds: "I wanted to make Waco a prettier place to live. I had a dream that one day we would restore five houses. As time went along I began to get much more ambitious. Now I'd like to do two or three more. I have such visions-hanging baskets in the streets, the beautification of downtown Waco, flowering things all around the historical landmarks. We have three national landmarks and now twelve state plaques, they're rather special, from the Texas Historical Survey Committee and awarded to architecturally important old buildings. The key to these restorations? First for a town to restore anything it takes a few very dedicated people. Secondly, it takes the services of a very competent, knowledgeable restoration architect. Thirdly, if not first, it takes lots of money. But more than anything it's dedication and hard work on the part of a few people. I've had lots of pleasure, lots of heartache, lots of frustration, and lots of angerall sorts of human emotions through this work. But I guess I'll never retire."

It was a determination to preserve this unique heritage that spurred to action the restorers of Hancock Village. When word got around that the last two Shaker Sisters still living there were preparing to move away and the Society of Believers was about to put the 1,000-acre property on the market, a group of concerned citizens in the Berkshires rounded up relatives, friends, neighbors, and a few museum directors-thirty-three people in all-and negotiated a loan from a local bank. Incorporating themselves as Shaker Community, Inc., in 1960, they bought the property directly from the Shakers for \$125,000, exactly half the original asking price. Several larger offers from commercial developers had been turned down because the Shakers were willing to sacrifice the money in order to help the restorers achieve their aims. The next step was to raise money for the rehabilitation of the various buildings that had been constructed there over the decades from 1790 to 1894. Chief among them was the Round Stone Barn, the most famous Shaker building in the U.S. Repeatedly during the sixties, that structure, by then about to collapse, was shored up on an emergency basis until a thoroughgoing restoration was facilitated by a special gift from Mr. and Mrs. Frederick W. Beinecke and the cooperation of the George A. Fuller Company in performing the construction work at cost.

Now underway at Hancock is the building of a brand-new visitor's center designed by architect Terry F. Hallock of Pittsfield. "It is essentially a modern building," says Mrs. Lawrence K. Miller, president of Shaker Community, "but it incorporates Shaker architectural details because we wanted to show how compatible they are with modern design."

Mr. Hallock, official architect of the restoration, has supervised the work on all the buildings except the latest to be rehabilitated—the Ice House. Architect for that was a young man who had just graduated from Columbia School of Architecture—James Tobin. Says Mrs. Miller, "He came up here originally as a student with Professor James Fitch and became fascinated

with Shaker design. The Ice House was his first job after he got out of school—he even worked on it manually. I think it is so gratifying to know we have young architects today who are both interested and trained to save America's important historic buildings."

Superficially, early Shaker architecture resembles the woodframed clapboard houses and churches built all over New England during the same period. But there are subtle differences. And, like all Shaker design, the distinction of Shaker buildings arose directly from Shaker religious philosophy. For instance: beadings, moldings, and cornices "merely for fancy" were strictly forbidden as superfluous and distracting, therefore never used. That regularity and order were among the Shakers' highest values was reflected in the placement of windows and doors with a precision almost classical. Since the only allowable form of "beauty" was utility, buildings were carefully designed to fit their intended functions. In the case of a Shaker dwelling intended to house a "family" of thirty to a hundred members sworn to celibacy, this meant providing separate but equal quarters for both sexes-which led naturally to architectural symmetry. Shaker houses as well as Shaker meeting houses had double entrances. The Shaker doctrine of perfection prompted a quality of workmanship in architectural detail that was on a par with fine cabinetwork. And the Shaker view of work as a religious ritual resulted in strictly utilitarian buildings-such as Hancock's Machine Shop on page 78-of the same style and quality as Shaker houses

The Round Stone Barn at Hancock was probably not the first round barn in America, but in 1826 when it was built it was the largest (270 feet in circumference), the most inventive, and in later years the most influential. Its anonymous designers not only worked out an exceptional labor-saving plan for their purposes-storing hay and housing fifty-two head of cattle-but they took full advantage of the naturally sloping site, building the barn on three levels, each of which could be approached directly from the ground. Among the ingenious details of its origi-

nal or revised versions (it was remodeled after a fire in 1864) were cattle stalls radiating from a central manger, which cut down the daily work of distributing feed; a twelve-sided multiwindowed wooden superstructure that provided clerestory light; an octagonal frame shaft rising from the floor of the hay mow to a louvered cupola topping the structure, which provided extra ventilation for the hay. During the last decades of the nineteenth century, the Round Barn was widely publicized in farm journals as a model of efficient planning and widely copied, in wood, on the new larger farms of the Middle West.

To furnish the restored buildings at Hancock Village, Shaker Community, Inc., has collected furniture and other artifacts made in almost every one of the eighteen Shaker communes that once flourished in the U. S. Although there were some regional differences among Shaker furniture, there were more similarities since its makers put great store by uniformity, which to them signified spiritual unity. As with their architecture, the Shakers' disdain for superfluities led to pared-down designs of singular delicacy and lightness. Yet their passion for perfection produced exceptionally sturdy construction. Some Shaker craftsmen, it is said, believed their designs originated in heaven and were conveyed to them by the angels.

Probably the best known are the rocking chairs like those in the World's Parlor on page 79, although rockers were not widely used in Shaker houses. In fact overindulgence in that worldly comfort was frowned upon-only one rocker was permitted in a retiring room or dormitory for four. But rocking chairs as well as other types were sold widely by mail, especially by the Shakers of New Lebanon. Once established, the basic rocking chair design changed only in details, but there was considerable variety in scale -broad sturdy chairs for largeframed Brethren, narrow chairs for little old ladies.

Inventive details distinguished the Shakers' armless chairs from somewhat similar slat-back American chairs of the same period. For instance, the back legs of the Shaker three-slat

"tilting chairs" were equipped with a ball-in-socket device that allowed the Brethren to tilt their chairs back from the table without danger of falling over backward themselves or having the chair legs collapse under them. To clear the floor for sweeping, three-slat chairs were simply hung up on the wall on wooden pegs that studded the perimeter of every Shaker room. But dining chairs with only one or two slats were often designed with backs low enough to let the whole chair be pushed under the table between meals. Spindle-back chairs for desk or other work somewhat resembled comb-back Windsors, but they usually had what no Windsor did: a revolving mechanism in the base.

The Shakers' passion for order-epitome of the place-foreverything-everything-in-itsplace rule-led logically to a proliferation of storage furniture, usually a combination of drawers and cupboards. (It seemed so obvious that somethings fit better in the one, some in the other.) And their related passions for cleanliness and labor saving prompted them to have most of these storage pieces built in. Incorporated in the Brick Dwelling at Hancock, according to the elder who supervised the construction, were 245 cupboard doors and 369 drawers. Clearly the Shakers belonged to the closed-door school of storage: Only utensils that were in constant use were kept in plain sight.

In spite of the general tendency toward uniformity, Shaker tables show tremendous diversity because each was designed for a specific function, specific circumstances. One of the circumstances was the communal life style that called for Believers to work together. So the sewing tables, for instance, often had drawers that opened from either side, and kitchen tables like the one on page 79 were long enough for several Sisters to share.

"You must not lose one moment of time," Mother Ann Lee told her followers, "for you have none to spare." So the Shakers

used all their wits to devise ways of saving labor and thus saving time (which they could then spend presumably in more labor). Among their myriad inventions: window sash that could be removed for washing; windowshade rollers set into the plaster walls and controlled by ingenious wooden wheels. The circular saw is said to have been invented by a Shaker Sister (the Shakers rarely took out patents on their inventions-"too worldly"). In her eyes, the Brethren had to work far too hard with straight saws for what they accomplished.

From its beginnings in America in the 1770s, the Shaker sect has consistently advocated ideas that many people call new in the 1970s: living in communes; granting an exalted status to women (theirs is a Mother-Father God); stripping the indoor "environment" to its bare essentials. But their dedication to celibacy inevitably checked their expansion—forecast, in fact, their eventual extinction.

Today there are only fifteen Sisters left (no Brethren) and two surviving communes-one in Canterbury, N.H., the other in Sabbathday Lake, Me. (A member of the latter group, Eldress Gertrude M. Soule, is an honorary trustee of Hancock Village.) But the vitality of the Shaker tradition and spirit remains unquenchable. A contemporary friend of the Shakers and student of their culture gives testimony: Toward the end of an exhausting day he had spent trekking up and down stairs and from building to building with an elderly Shaker Sister, he said to her, "Sister Emma, you must be tired."

"I am," she admitted, "but I'll get over it. I always have."

HOW TO REFRESH

CARVED Carved furniture often lies unloved in a dusty attic, unwanted (and inexpensive) in a dusty shop, because the rescue work seems daunting. Even if all it needs is a simple cleanup, gleam-up, and rewaxing, you think of those curlicues and sigh. If a carving is broken or missing, you know you need professional help and figure the cleanup will also have to be done by an expert, and at prices as fancy as the carving. We talked with John Torretta of Antique Refinishing Corporation, and as we watched him bring a Jacobean chaise longue back to its original beauty and usefulness, we gleaned these at-home tips: Go to a professional if you need wood carved, but do the rest of the work yourself if you want. Household cleansers such as Spic and Span can be used if you are

careful not to let the furniture stay wet and are extra careful with veneers. Brushes are better than cloth to get into carvings. Wear gloves; work on a dry day in an airy room.









To clean carvings: With scrub brush and 0000 steel wool, wash down a carved piece with a cleaning solution, such as Spic and Span. Alternate the scrub brush and steel wool, using a circular motion to get into all the curlicues. Use a cloth to dry as you work, being careful not to let water remain on any one spot. Do not scrub the piece so hard that the original finish is scraped. Repeat steps until a fresh dry cloth comes clean. With a large camelhair brush give the cleaned piece a good buffing to remove any remaining particles of dust, wool, or lint. Let piece sit overnight to dry thoroughly if you plan to shellac or wax.

To blend in any repairs: If carvings have had to be repaired or any missing parts replaced, make sure the new wood and joints are smooth. Use sandpaper—#80 garnet finishing sandpaper, then finer #120. To make the old and new wood a uniform color, tint the new wood with a mixture of water and dry color pigment such as H. Behlen's watercolors. Mix color in a cup or jar, stirring till all pigment dissolves. Use an artist's brush, preferably sable. Practice on scrap wood first to ensure exact







color desired. Then apply to new wood until the repair is scarcely discernible. Use as dry a brush as possible. Rub when dry with steel wool to smooth any change in the wood grain that might be caused by touching exposed wood with water.










To restore the old gleam: Apply a shellac mix sparingly with a good oxhair or camelhair brush. For dark wood, solution can be one part orange shellac, one part clear shellac, two parts alcohol; you might want to add a touch of your dry color pigment. Use a rapid circular motion. If solution froths up a bit, work it in lightly with your brush. Use very thin coats, or one coat may be enough. When thoroughly dry, and working as always only on a dry day, use cheesecloth dipped in a solution such as Qual-A-Sol to soften and mellow the shine. Cheesecloth should be wet but not dripping; if it is too dry, it will pull. Pad back and forth, lightly. Let dry and go over piece gently with 0000 steel wool.



To wax carved furniture: Get a ready-made liquid wax, a dark one for dark furniture. Or combine Butcher's paste wax, black Japan color, and solvent in a jar (a common professional ratio is 5 parts wax and 3 parts Japan color to 8 parts benzine). Keep windows open while working. Japan color will bring out the irregularities and character of the wood but should not change its color. Rub wax on with clean folded cheesecloth. Then use a camelhair brush to get into all the crevices. Buff with fresh cheesecloth till piece gleams.

What is the essence of the modular housing system you designed at Cornell?

As I mentioned earlier, our system combines panels and boxes. The boxes would be wet units primarily but instead of being stacked one on top of the other or side by side in a long row, as in some existing systems, they would be spaced apart. Ceiling panels would be used to span the space between, and that space would become the living room. There would be no limit to how long the room could bethe only limit would be the structural capacity of the panels.

Would the panels and boxes be sold separately?

Ultimately, perhaps, but in the beginning you would buy the whole package and use the individual modules essentially to capture space. The boxes give you two finished sides and with the panels you have a ceiling. Then you just close in the ends. Our report shows four quite different ways to use the concept for a variety of housing all the way from single-family detached houses to row houses, town houses, and high-rise apartments. By differing the arrangement, for instance, the same house could serve the needs of a young couple without children, a couple with small children, a middleaged couple with five teenagers, and a retired couple.

What materials is modular housing usually built of?

Until very recently, most modular units were of conventional wood-frame construction. Our system-we call it "second generation" design-is based on a steel frame or chassis on which you can hang anything you want. You can stick to conventional construction-hang wood 2-by-4s on the steel chassis-and the whole business will look absolutely conventional, but it will be more rigid and easy to work with. You can also hang on the steel frame anything you want in terms of appliances, heating systems, etc. One of the problems you have when you are putting a lot of modules together is fitting. Steel is a precision material while wood is not-it's a live material.

Actually the idea of the steel frame was borrowed from the automobile, which starts with a chassis to which you add a basic body pattern. Most people don't realize, when they look at three or four different models of a car, that they all have the same chassis. The body package is absolutely identical, but the models look different because of different interiors, different paint, different trim. You are getting the production economies of spreading one chassis over three or more price levels. In our modular system we are proposing the same thing.

What kind of labor do you need for modular housing?

The beauty of modular construction is that you do not need skilled labor. One of the leading manufacturers in the field today started out with sixty-five employees taken right off the neighboring farms. These people quickly learned to take a 2-by-4 that was painted red on one end, put it over a red mark on an Ibeam, then put another I-beam against it, and hit it with an automatic nailing machine. This kind of construction does not require skilled plumbers either. In fact, I predict that in five years 50 percent of the employees in these factories will be women. We don't identify women with the construction industry, but under factory conditions, a good deal of the work is not heavy work. As a matter of fact, a good deal of it requires a certain kind of sensitivity that I think women have.

But aren't the labor unions going to resist?

So far, they are not resisting. A very important national contract was signed about a year ago between a leading manufacturer and the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners that accepts what is called mill labor–factory workers at factory wages—into the union and also permits them to work on the installation of the houses at the sites.

How do you know this unskilled labor is going to put a house together right?

Well, just think about how houses are built today. Housing is the only industry that has gone through the industrial revolution without becoming industrialized. We are putting houses together the way we always did—a bitsand-pieces approach involving a sequence of operations by inde-





pendent contractors. You know, something like eleven different building trades have to work on a 5-by-7-foot bathroom, each largely undoing the work of the others. Four years ago, for instance, I built a house on a site close enough to where I was living so that I could check on the work twice a day. But just after the masons had finished the foundation, I had to go away on a three-day trip. Meanwhile the carpenters arrived. When I got back from the trip, I found they had framed in the house using the plans the masons had left for the foundation, and the whole house overhung the foundation by 2 feet. They had to rip it all

Do you think conventional methods of building are going to disappear?

No, I'm not suggesting they will disappear. But I believe that it's going to be more and more impossible for this type of building to satisfy the bulk of our needs. Like most craft-produced objects, craft-produced houses will be available only to those who can afford custom-made shoes, custom-made suits, custom-made automobiles. In this country there are enough affluent people who want highly individualized houses and can pay the price to keep the remaining supply of craft workers busy. But who is going to take care of middle-income families? The answer to their needs is the new technology.

When houses are built in factories, who puts them up on the site?

Local contractors or builders prepare the site, prepare the foundation, supervise erection of the units, and the finishing. The job goes very quickly. The builders make smaller profits, but the number of houses they can put up in a given time makes up the difference.

Does modular housing require a special kind of site?

No. It can be built anywhere and it can make more efficient use of the site. One of the things we did in our second Cornell study was to look at modular housing in relation to the land in our area around Ithaca, which has a lot of hillside sites. Usually hillsides are avoided for building but they are really ideal because they provide everyone with a

beautiful view, sunshine, and fresh air. Modular houses can be designed to cascade down the hill and at the same time maintain as much of the environment, the natural environment, as possible. This takes a minimum of foundation work-the houses can be supported on posts. Making use of hillside sites is one way to get at land costs.

Is modular construction restricted to multi-family housing or can it be used for single-family houses, too?


Certainly modular construction can be used for single-family houses. But for the next several years I believe the bulk of the demand for modular units will be for multi-family housing, the kind young people are more likely to want. The kids reaching marriageable age today are much more mobile, much more independent than the generation that built up suburbia after World War II. They are going to move around for the first five or six years, and what they want are apartments close to urban centers. But these modular units can be just as effective for single family houses.

Will it be possible to achieve any kind of variety or individuality with modular housing?

Most people think mass-production always results in a standardized, repeated, and unchangeable product. But eventually I believe industrialization of housing will achieve the economies inherent in standardization yet offer a surprisingly wide range of possibilities. That may sound like a contradiction but I don't think it is. The automobile is far more standardized than most people realize, yet it offers a wide range of variations. With the continued use of the computer, for instance, we are going to find that we can get more and more variety without losing any of the advantages of standardization. Industrialization should not mean sameness. Look at the houses we build by conventional methods. Are they any more varied? The big developers offer you perhaps six different choices that vary only in details like the type of roof or the placement of the garage.

Will modular construction greatly lower costs?

LAN FOR COLOR in your vegetable garden. Rhubarb chard, left, has midribs and veins of translucent ruby red, grows to a height of 18 inches. Like regular Swiss chard it sprouts leaves practically as fast as you can cut them.

The color is as spectacular in a salad as in the garden and it's good cooked, too. Orange-gold is another new vegetable color, this time in beets. BRING TOGETHER AN ECOLOGIST, A GARDENER, A FLOWER ARRANGER, AND AN

ILLUSTRATOR and the result is bound to be interesting. In the present instance the result is a book, Wild Wealth (Bobbs-Merrill, \$20). The ecologist, Paul Bigelow Sears, contributes a chapter on the ways in which plants, animals, and man influence and depend upon one another. Marion Rombauer Becker, the gardener, devotes her section to growing and using plants and above all enjoying the wild wealth presented to us by unaided nature. Frances Jones Poetker, the arranger, makes a no-nonsense approach to the question of using plants in the house. Nothing could be simpler than her instructions for making a dried arrangement: Place your live materials in a vase with water, then just leave them alone and let them dry. Scattered through the book are the drawings of Janice Rebert Forberg, each illustrating one of the author's points and each a work of art in its own right.

ATALOGUE TIME is dead of winter. No gardener's life would be complete without a stack of them to pore over, dream about, and learn from. Informative as they are, probably the greatest idea garden catalogues convey is availability. Everything in a catalogue may actually be planted, grown, and brought to flower and fruit in your own garden. It is just a question of space, time, and money. So the list that starts out to include everything you've never tried before gets cut in half and then half again. But never mind: If something you really want to grow has to be left off this year's order, there's always another year, always another heap of catalogues. Our 1972 catalogue list starts with the superabundance of seeds, plants, and gardening materials offered by George W. Park Seed Co., Inc. (Greenwood, S.C., 29646). It's free for the writing. Wayside Gardens (Mentor, Ohio, 44060) prices its catalogue at \$2, which is a bargain for the wealth of information it has to offer. White Flower Farm (Litchfield, Conn., 06759) asks \$2.50 for its spring list. Alphabetically arranged and illustrated with elegant line drawings, it is really a garden encyclopedia. Another \$2 catalogue, one designed for anyone seriously interested in orchids, comes from Lager and Hurrell (426 Morris Ave., Summit, N.J., 07901). It is a huge and tremendously varied list with explicit growing instructions for every type of orchid. Iris, even more flamboyant than orchids, are the specialty of Cooley's Gardens (Silverton, Ore., 97381). Its catalogue is free and handsomely illustrated with color photographs. When it comes to roses, Jackson & Perkins (Medford, Ore., 97501) offers its catalogue free to prospective buyers.


LIKE A COLUMN FROM A RENAISSANCE PALACE. the stem of the tree lantana, below, makes an architectural underpinning for the plant's spreading top. But the carved look is simply the result of twisting three plant stems together. The process is begun by planting three rooted cuttings as close together as possible, giving them best conditions for quick growth, twisting and tying them together as they grow. Twisting must be done while plant tissues are soft and flexible, otherwise cracks will appear. Ties are best made with stretchable plastic strips, but even so should be changed often to prevent cutting into the rapidly growing stems. As the three stalks grow together to form a single one, it ought to be tied to a stake to make sure it stays upright. Growing tips should be pinched off to cause branching at the height you want the head of





the plant to be. Once the head has begun to spread out a single tie just below the branching point will keep the stems from separating. Any plant with a

woody stem, like rosemary, bay, or hibiscus can be trained the same way.





about whether we can produce truly low-cost housing by any method, any more than General Motors could produce a \$300 automobile that was anything but a bicycle with sheet metal on it. But industrialization should help eventually to lower the cost of housing. Today, for instance, the costs of conventional building are increasing on an inclined plane that's just going off into space. But as conventional building costs continue to go up, the cost of modular housing will flatten out. The advantage of modular construction is that the longer you produce a system, the more efficiently you can do it, and the more economies you can achieve. When a manufacturer has built up his volume until it crosses the point where he has paid off his capital investment, you should be able to see some really appreciable differences in cost. There are also a number of costs that are not directly related to construction. Land is one, financing is another-very big factors in the cost of a house, and modular housing is going to affect those, too. If you use the land more efficiently you will, in effect, lower the cost of land per living unit. If you can put up houses faster you'll reduce the cost of financing. For example, if a builder can complete a year's job in six months: not only would he save six months' interim financing, but he would make that money available to somebody else. Then interest rates would drop because the cost of money is directly related to its availability.

What about architecturecan modular housing hope to have any esthetic quality?

There is nothing in the concept of modular construction that keeps it from being architecture. We must also look at these houses in terms of how well they really work. Houses can frustrate people. Houses can be the sources of irritation. Older people, for instance, are going to need essentially maintenance-free environments, particularly older people who can still live alone.

How about human needscan they be met, too?

A house must meet human needs-not only the need for efficiency but psychological or emotional needs as well. At Cor-

nell we are as concerned about them as we are about esthetics or technology. In our department we have three kinds of specialists: a design group; a human factor group (social and behavioral scientists); and a materialsand-technology group. It really takes the three groups working together to turn out a satisfactory design for a house. We start with a specific problem, which is looked at very carefully by the behavioral scientists. They set up performance specifications that will answer the problem. Then the designers take these specifications and, working with the materials specialists, come up with some alternative proposals. We build those full scale, then we analyze the extent to which they meet the performance requirements. If necessary, we re-

Could you give an example of this?

Well, we have one faculty member, a very capable woman, who has been doing extensive research over the past fifteen years on efficiency in the kitchen. She has done studies on the proper height for mixing, the proper height for resting elbows, the differences in women's heights, etc. So she designs a kitchen that is absolutely the most efficient kitchen you could come up with. Then we say to her, "We agree with your technical solutions, yet there are situations in which we may prefer a less efficient kitchen but one that is more human." I had that problem when I designed my own house. As I looked at the kitchen plan I thought, "Well, I have seven children. I don't want the most efficient kitchen if it's going to keep the children out." So I added 21/2 feet each way-5 extra feet altogether. But I knew what I was gaining for that slight loss of efficiency: I was gaining the human advantage of having room enough for the children to be in the kitchen with their mother. That's the kind of trade-off we've got to make. The aim is not just efficiency, and it's not just esthetics, and it's not just economy, and it's not just to take advantage of technology. What we're really interested in is people, and providing an environment in which they can be more human.
