





Austrian vase

We would like some information about my mother's vase. It is green glass on the outside and cobalt blue on the inside, with a silver overlay in a floral pattern and a pound sterling mark on the base. S.C.—New York, N.Y. Your vase is an example of European case glass probably made by Loetz of Austria, about 1900. Generally, the engraved silver deposit pattern, which enriches the case glass, was done in the United States.

New York tea service How old is this tea set? On its bottom is "The Van Bergh S. P. Co., quadruple plate, Rochester, N.Y." F.B.—Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. Your tea service probably dates around 1900. The Van Bergh Silver Plate Com-



pany, founded in Rochester, N.Y., in 1892, merged with Oneida Community Limited in 1926 and moved to Oneida, N.Y.



Meriden trademark

I have a silver bread tray with this mark on the back. On the front is a picture of two Chinese Buddhas. Do you know the tray's age? B. McB.—Brownsville, Tex.

The Meriden Silver Plate Company, which made your tray, was organized at Meriden, Conn., in 1869 and merged with the International Silver Company in 1898. It remained active until about 1938. Your mark was first used in 1921.

Banister-back chair

A visit to the Bayou Bend Collection of the Museum of Fine Arts in Houston will be a feature of the Antiques Holiday Tour held in connection with our antiques show this year. This maple armchair made in New England c. 1700-1725 is part of the collection. Can you tell me something about its style? B.H.-Houston, Tex. In America, this type of chair is called a banister-back chair. Each banister is one half a round banister and in the majority of cases the flat side of the banister was placed in front as it was more comfortable to lean against. This particular banisterback chair, from the carved cresting to the Spanish feet, is a notably fine example.

Renaissance sgabello

I bought this chair at an estate sale. It looks terribly old. I would appreciate any information about it. N.T.—New York, N.Y. This distinctive and popular type of Italian Renaissance carved wood chair is called a sgabello or stool chair. Your fine sgabello probably dates from around 1550-1600. Judging from the surviving copies, the sgabello found its way into the entrance halls and libraries of many American houses.



I am interested in learning the history and age of my plate, which has a map of Long Island



and the Long Island Sound on it. I know it is over 75 years old. A.C.B.—Olympia, Wash.

Your platter with map is a typical example of a class of souvenir pieces manufactured for sale at summer resorts, which was the principal production at the Hampshire Pottery at Keene, N.H., toward the end of the 19th century. Your mark is one of the marks used on these pieces.



Dutch cream jug

I recently inherited this silver cow creamer with a hinged cover having a border of flowers centering on a bee in relief. Can you tell me where and about when it was made?


L.B.-New York, N.Y.

Your silver cow-shaped cream or milk jug with its tail looped to form the handle was made in The Netherlands about the 1860s. English examples of the time of George II, 1727-1760, are not very common, but the modern ones, which are mainly of Dutch manufacture, are still relatively plentiful.

NOTES ON NUTRITION FOR YOUR FAMILY'S HEALTH



BY ELOISE R. TRESCHER, RD

To many mothers' dismay, young children are often suspicious of the food placed before them. They feel it, they ask "what is it?" They say "why?" Adults are now becoming just as inquisitive, but for substantial reasons, rather than whim. And it's about time. They too want to know *what* they're eating, and why. They're probing more, reading more labels, digging deeper into the world of nutrition. Here are answers to some questions that frequently come up and that I consider important as well as pertinent to today's table for well-balanced nutritious meals.

What is the nutritional value of honey?

One of the best reasons for eating honey is that it tastes good. A second is that it is a concentrated source of calories. I've listed a

comparison of the energy value of honey, syrups, and sugars. It depends on how many calories you want to sweeten your meal.

In amounts usually eaten, perhaps one to two tablespoons, the mineral and vitamin contributions of these foods are insignificant.

Although butter and margarine supply vitamin A, deep green and deep yellow vegetables and liver contribute a greater amount of this important vitamin. All animal fats contain cholesterol, while vegetable fats are cholesterol free. In certain cardiovascular disorders, it is wise to choose fat from those that are polyunsaturated. These are, in order of descending importance, safflower, corn, soy bean, and cotton seed. In general, the more firm or solid the fat, the higher the degree of saturation. The average American diet is rich in cholesterol and saturated fat. Remember that butter, meats, egg yolk, *Continued on page 20*



cream, and whole milk contain both cholesterol and saturated fats. Coconut and palm oil are cholesterol free, but they are rich in saturated fats and they should be avoided by those with atherosclerosis or heart disease.

What about vitamin E? I've read the claims of its strengthening muscles, including heart muscle, decreasing the incidence of heart attack. Is all this true?

Many of the claims such as those in the questions have arisen from the misinterpretation of research on experimental animals. For example, muscle wasting, or dystrophy, occurs in most animals with severe vitamin E deficiency. Because of this, vitamin E has been tested as treatment for many diseases of the muscles in man such as muscular dystrophy. Results have been negative. The muscles of patients with muscular dystrophy contain normal amounts of vitamin E. (It should be remembered that different species often bave different nutritional requirements. For instance dietary ascorbic acid is necessary for guinea pigs, monkeys, and man; while rats, dogs, chickens, ducks, geese, guinea towl, and pheasants do

not need the vitamin in their diet.)




What scientists do agree on is that dietary vitamin E is available in generous amounts in a diet chosen from the four food groups.

Dietary vitamin E is widely distributed in foods such as animal and vegetable fats, whole grain cereals, meats, fish, poultry, eggs, milk, legumes, nuts, and fruits. A deficiency of dietary vitamin E in humans is improbable. For those who wish more information on this subject there is a special report "Supplementation of Human Diets with Vitamin E" in the October 1973 issue of Nutrition Reviews, with Vitamin E. in the October 1973 issue of Nutrition Reviews, Volume 31, Number 10.




What is the nutritional value of yoghurt?







Does rare meat have more protein than well-done meat?

Not at all. If meat is cooked on a rack until well done, more fat is likely to be expressed as "drippings" than is lost in rare meat. The more fat discarded the lower the calorie value—but the protein value is unaffected.

What is the difference between whole-grain rice and the refined white rice that we Americans consume?

Calorically there is little difference among brown, refined, and enriched white rices. Both brown and enriched white rice, however, are nutritionally preferable to refined, unenriched white rice. Brown rice contains three times the fiber content of the white rices, and more calcium, phosphorous, sodium, potassium, riboflavin, and niacin, while enriched white rice contains over twice as much iron, one-fourth more thiamin, and one-third less niacin than brown rice.

Do you think patients get adequate nutritional direction from their doctors?

Nutrition is a relatively new science. Although many medical schools now have a chair in nutrition, many more do not. The scien-

"Calorie needs are reduced as we grow older...balance the energy you eat against the energy you use" tific knowledge of nutrition is so vast it is a science in itself and it is difficult to incorporate more than an appreciation of it into an already full cur-

riculum. Your doctor may refer you to a nutrition specialist. Why does a person over thirty have to eat less to maintain

the same weight as when she was twenty?

This is simply because calorie needs are reduced as we grow older. As we get older we usually do not exercise as much as the young, we are not as active. If we take in more calories than we need for the energy we put out, we'll gain weight. You must balance the energy you eat against the energy you use. And since you are not exercising as much you need fewer calories.

It might help to know just how many calories we do need, and so I have listed the *daily* calorie allowance for adults. My source for this scale is The Recommended Dietary Allowances, revised 1973, of The Food and Nutrition Board of The National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council.

19-22	3000	2100
23-50	2700	2000
51 plus	2400	1800

If a woman is pregnant she should add 300 calories daily, and if actating, 500 should be added. Since men are usually larger than women they can eat more. If calories are chosen from four food groups—milk and milk products; vegetables and fruit; meat, fish, poultry, eggs, and cheese; bread and cereals, whole grain or enriched—in recommended amounts, protein, mineral, and vitamin needs are likely to be met.

Is ginger ale the quickest way to counteract low blood sugar on an immediate basis?

Orange juice is perhaps the quickest food way of counteracting low blood sugar. Other fruit juices and soft drinks containing sugar are a close second.

SOME NOTES ON GOOD LOOKS AND GOOD HEALTH



Seven ways to care for your skin from noted dermatologist Dr. Albert M. Kligman

BY CAROLINE SEEBOHM

The human face is a fascinating thing. It can speak volumes. It can inspire poetry. It can launch a thousand ships. We may forget a name, but we rarely forget a face. "We have," says Desmond Morris in The Naked Ape, "the most subtle and complex facial expression system of all living animals. By making tiny movements of the flesh around the mouth, nose, eyes, eyebrows, and on the forehead, and by recombining the movements in a wide variety of ways, we can convey a whole range of complex mood-changes."

It is hardly surprising, then, that the look of our faces should play such an enormous part in our lives. Right from its first wrinkled, bumpy, pink appearance on this earth, the face is in the limelight.

"People differ more in facial skin than in any other biological facet," says Dr. Albert M. Kligman, professor of dermatology at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. "They differ more than they do in their intelligence or in their instincts. No two faces are alike. When we study the skin of forearms, there are similarities between people-but we are highly differentiated animals as far as facial skin is concerned."

It is therefore difficult to generalize about facial skin, which is unfortunate since we care more about our faces looking good than any other part of our bodies (figures coming a close second, I would think). Oily skin, dry skin, Northern complexion, Mediterranean complexion-Dr. Kligman recommends the following seven things to keep every face looking its best:

Clean your face with mild soap, cleansing milks or creams in moderation. Twice a day should be enough. Your face is cleaner than you think. Too much cleansing over the years can cause damage.

Occasional mild massage with a gently abrasive cloth or cold water stimulates the blood flow in facial skin and helps it to look its best.

• Keep the surface of your skin smooth with emollientsmost moisturizers and creams do the job. Emollients will keep the skin's surface in its best condition, but will not retard the aging process.



W hat happens in aging skin is that the fibrous substance of the skin itself deteriorates, mainly through exposure to sunlight, and the cells, which normally come off one at a time, come off in big clumps, so that the skin can look dry and scaly. Moisturizers and creams can smooth the outside surface of the skin and reduce friction (particularly important in winter and when resting the face against pillows at night).

Keep your face as protected as possible from sunlight. Wear hats and use protective creams. Too much sun causes wrinkling and fine lines. Keep your hands away from

your face as much as possible, to avoid wrinkling the skin and further irritating any blemishes you may have. Remember this when watching television, working at a desk, or reading. Continual changes in expression can cause wrinkling, too, particularly around the eyes, when the skin is expanding and contracting thousands of times a day. If you were never to smile, never get angry, never grimace, never laugh, and stay in the dark,

your skin would stay as smooth as a child's—but what kind of a person would you be if you lived like that?

G Keep the temperature of the rooms in your house down, and the humidity high. This is particularly important, of course, in winter. The lower the thermostat, the better for your complexion. It's good for your furniture and the energy crisis too!





A GARDENER SPEAKS HIS MIND

Alliumsthe edible and flowering onions

BY WILLIAM B. HARRIS

Allium is one of 200 genera in the family of plants that includes about every bulbous one you can think of (Glory-of-the-Snow, Daffodils, Tulips, Lilies) and a surprising number of herbaceous perennials ranging from Daylilies to Yucca. If you care that the family's name is Liliaceae, you are one gardener in a million, for few of us have the inclination to move so deeply into botany. Allium itself is a very large genus-some 280 species have been described, and more seem to pop up in some plant hunter's bag every two to three years. Seven are edible and five of those are important foods. The majority of the remaining species are useless; many are the kind of weeds you wouldn't dare put on a compost heap, for their seeds would be ready to germinate about the time the compost was ready to spread. Collectors of this genus, however, have found fifty to sixty species with garden value, but of these not more than twenty can be found in commerce and not all of them in one catalogue.

The various species of Allium have much in common. They are found in most parts of the northern hemisphere; none have appeared south of the equator (North America has seventy species). They all grow in light, sandy soils in a warm location, so that is the way to grow them well in a garden. All can be moved at any season by the home gardener, but suppliers deliver them only in the fall or very early spring when the bulbs are dormant. All can be raised from seed, which is not a particularly tricky business, but it takes about three years to see flowers. The scapes (or stems) of the flowers vary widely in height-from a few inches to 4 to 5 feet, but the flowering heads all have the same form. They are umbels-a bell-shaped flower made up of many small ones on individual stems (pedicels), each having more or less the same length. Some are as large as baseballs, others pleasant little puffs, only a few differ in shape. These umbels tend to get papery as they age and thus make dried flowers,

but few hold their color well. Like any bulbous plant (some species grow from rhizomes, a thickened root), Allium will "run out" in a few years if gardeners with an overdeveloped sense of neatness cut off the leaves before they dry. Another common trait is that the leaves of nearly all species when cut or crushed smell of onion, a fine zesty smell-except perhaps the odor of boiling onions. (If our TV commercials mean anything, they are telling the world that we Americans are obsessed with cleanliness, and odorless persons and households, but it is a fact that objectionable odors are killed only by superimposing a stronger pleasant one, or by sprays that deaden one's sense of smell.) Those who object to the smell of decorative Alliums need only to keep from cutting or breaking their leavesonly one species has flowers that smell oniony (very faintly); the rest of them have pleasant scents. The onion odor from the ends of cut scapes disappears as soon as they are plunged into water. It is hard to find a catalogue offering Allium that even hints at this characteristic. Do-not-mention-characteristics-without-sales-appeal is normal in salesmanship. Another problem common to the decoratives is man-made; their nomenclature is a mixed up mess. The few varieties in commerce all seem to be true to descriptions, but every so often a firm will catalogue what it believes is a variety never before offered. Collectors tell me that half the fun of collecting Alliums is waiting to find out if new varieties from a catalogue, a botanical garden, or another collector are new to them.

The names of the edible species of Allium are all agreed upon. A. cepa is the onion of the vegetable garden and commerce regardless of variety, which are legion. That delight called shallot is A. ascalonicum. (Home vegetable gardeners who have had difficulty with these should remember that unlike onion sets, which are planted an inch below the surface, shallots are Continued on page 44

planted so shallow their little stringy top shows above ground level.) The fine vegetable known as leek and used far more abroad than in America is A. porrum; chives, which make a great edging plant, are hard for cooks to do without. They are the species A. schoenoprasum. The toothsome Welsh or green onion of spring is known as A. fistulosum-and it is one of the parents of the Spanish onion. Rocambole or sand leek is mostly uncultivated in the United States. It is A. scorodoprasum, a garlic of medium flavor whose bulbs form underground and on the top of its stem-a mature clump of it produces enough bulbs for most families; it is very hardy. Then of course there is garlic, A. sativum, of which the poet Homer must have been redolent, if he ate it as much as he talked about it. Garlic has a long growing season, but I have raised bulbs of respectable size in Litchfield's Zone 4 climate. And there is no doubt about the names of the Allium that are despicable weeds, formerly almost impossible to eradicate but which today can be killed by strong herbicides like 2-4D.

As space does not permit discussing all the decoratives, I have chosen only those that are found in American catalogues. In the 1920s and 1930s there were apparently a dozen or so small firms in California and the Mountain West that offered choice native varieties to affluent Eastern gardeners, but their founders and businesses, as far as I can find, are gone, and if their places have been taken, I know of none-but would like to. The literature on Alliums is skimpy, but the large gardening dictionaries and encyclopedias carry the botantical names and descriptions of many. There seem to be no monographs on the genus. But Louise Beebe Wilder, America's finest writer on the subject of gardening, which she practiced so well for so long, tells of her experiences with Allium." I have shamelessly used some of her material (the following quotes are from Mrs. Wilder). I have firsthand experience with about six of these decoratives.

A. aflatunense. This species is said to have purplish-lilac blooms in most catalogues, but it is elsewhere described, probably more accurately, as lilac with darker ribs. The scape is about 30 inches tall, topped with 4-inch globes. It keeps well in water and is said to in demand. In Elizabeth Woodburn, special make a satisfactory dry flower, which I doubt, so far as color is concerned. This native to central China blooms at the end of May and is hardy in Zone 5. Cost is about 50c per bulb.

A. caeruleum (Blue Globe Onion). Really hardy-Zones 2-3. It is usually listed under its botanical synonym, azureum. The deep blue, 2-inch balls appear on stems about 2 feet tall in early June (catalogues give the height as 3 feet). If you get one that is a deep sky-blue with a dark blue line through the middle of each flower, you may have what Nicholson, the British botanist, identifies as azureum, which he claims came from Siberia about 1830; no one else seems to have seen this blue line, or at least thought it important enough to argue about. This is a good cut flower and if you like a washed out color, dry it. They sell for about \$2 a dozen.

A. cowanii. This species can't be found in any of my sources and the chances of it being a duplicate are good, but some firms list it. A Mr. James Cowan, who collected plants from Mexico and Peru in the first part of the 19th century, does have a genus (Cowania) named after him, and it could be

that a friend tossed this name to him as a compliment (one should not name a plant after oneself). The catalogue says it originated in the Mediterranean, which to me makes it nonhardy in these parts -but maybe it did come from a similar climate in Mexico, one of Mr. Cowan's hunting places. One catalogue says it has "large heads of pure white flowers, in all respects superior to neapolitanum," which could be true, for it sells for \$1.75 a dozen, far more than neapolitanum. I'd assign Zone 7 hardiness to it-that's the zone rating of A. neapolitanum.

A. elatum. This species comes from Bukhara, a very cold and dry country, and it seems prudent to give it a Zone 3, or very hardy rating. Blossoms are called "large" by all authorities, but I suspect its size is somewhat smaller than A. giganteum, which I have seen up to 7 inches in diameter, probably greenhouse-grown, for the largest heads in our garden have been about 5 inches. It has broad shiny green leaves; scapes grow to about 3 feet, and it is supposed to flower in late May, but I'd guess early June. Color is lilac-pink. Prices seem to range from \$1.75 to \$2.50 Continued on page 47



each, which usually means that the more expensive bulbs, offered by the quality firms, are much larger.

A. giganteum (Giant Onion). This impressive bright blue beauty is widely catalogued, and well it should be, for it is a great bulb to plant in the middle of the shrub border or in a place of honor by itself with a suitable background. The 4-foot scapes are extremely strong and woody and will break over only in very exposed locations where they should not be planted, because they are hard to keep straight when staked-they grow too fast to keep the scape from kinking at the ties, regardless of how loosely made. Hardiness is rated Zone 5, but we do all right with it on a southern exposure in Zone 4. Prices run from \$1.75 to \$2.50 each, depending upon the bulb size, information few nurseries supply. This is not criticism, for all contend with Holland crop conditions and some years top-quality bulbs just are not as large-they are top-quality for that year.

A. karataviense (Turkestan Onion). So you know where it came from. The leaves are broader than a tulip's, dark green, flatand mottled purple. Mrs. Wilder says the leaves "arch over to touch the ground, are almost oblong and thick in texture. They are perhaps of more value than the flowers, which, although forming a round ball on 8-inch stems, are of unconvincing color." Well, the color is a pinkish-white, not very convincing, for by the second time you've looked at it the sun has flushed out the pink, but the flower does stand on strong stems. It probably shouldn't be planted in a border, but a place in a rock garden is satisfactory; it remains a feature for a long time, for its "seeding is decorative, and its leaves do not die as quickly" as others. This is a Zone 5 plant; prices run from \$4.25 to \$6 a dozen.

A. moly (Lily Leek or Golden Garlic). This species has a mixed nomenclature. It is really A. aureum, a discovery of Mrs. Wilder's that authorities have so far ignored, for all of them call it moly. That word, Mrs. Wilder found, was the generic name given "by the old writers to the race we now know as Allium." She was never able to find a source except in Homer's Odyssey, where it probably was meant by him to be allegorical, for he endowed the plant with magical properties. Ulysses walked, under its protection, into the "sties" of Circe, where his companions were all transformed into

swine. Alfonse Harr, botanist and poet, says that many people who have Allium aureum in their gardens do not know that it is to this 'assiduous vegetable" that their astounding good fortune and prosperity can be ascribed. It seems to follow that those who do poorly at the races or investing in stocks have been relying on rabbits' feet instead of Golden Garlic. The flower heads of moly are goldenyellow, star-shaped, and loosely formed. Scapes are about 10 inches tall. Lucky or not, it's a very nice plant; put them together in clumps rather closely. Although it comes from southern Europe, it is a very hardy Zones 2 to 3 plant. And it is rather inexpensive-prices range from \$1.50 to \$2 a dozen. Even top-quality bulbs are rather small.

A. neapolitanum (Daffodil Garlic or Naples Onion). This nice white variety is definitely a Zone 7 plant; Dr. Wyman reports that in Zone 5 its hardiness is not reliable. The variety A. n. grandiflorum, used in Europe by florists, has a larger head and its stem at 12 inches is a bit longer than this species'. "Large white flowers have greatest purity, save for the rosy stamens, and gather into loose heads like a bunch of pear blossoms." Mrs. Wilder says she lost neapolitanum many times in Bronxville, but also kept it over "more than one winter," so careful gardeners should do as well in Zone 5. Of course, anyone can grow it in a greenhouse or indoors to get its nicely fragrant, long-lasting flowers. Bulbs seem to sell in the \$1 a dozen range.

A. rosenbachianum (Rosenbach Onion). Who was Rosenbach? Well sir, I discovered that his name was General Nikolai O. von Rosenbach, a governor of Turkestan, but I don't know when he governed. As his name is not in the Eleventh Edition of the Britannica, I can only conclude that he's lucky to have had an onion named after him. And he's not in Mrs. Wilder's long list of Alliums, either. In America the scape grows to about 4 feet. Flower heads are large, the flowers starry and dark violet, which is another way of saying purple. Dr. Wyman calls it "an excellent and most handsome species for drying the flowers," and it is true that the darker the color the better any flower holds its color when dried. It is rated as Zone 5, which means that if protected in Zone 4, it will probably come through the winter. Costs range from \$5 to \$7 a dozen.

September is a burgeoning time. Rooftop gardens, backyard patches bloom copiously; the stores have a wide variety of fresh produce. This is a time for feasting, for conserving, for being grateful for the generous rewards of nature.

It's an American tradition to celebrate this bounteous season with county and state fairs. I think it would be fun to **have a county fair party**—banners, bunting, flags, the works! To take advantage of the daylight, I'd start the party fairly early in the late afternoon and benefit from the outdoors. Friends will be invited to bring their own, home-grown, potentially prize-winning produce to be exhibited on bunting-trimmed tables set up outside—rare melons, perfect tomatoes, out-of-the-ordinary vegetables, lush fruits that will be "judged" later by a committee.

For the early comers, a half-keg of beer on ice and lots of buttery popcorn, pretzels, and old-fashioned peanuts in the shell. Nondrinkers will enjoy icy schooners of root beer. There'd be horseshoe pitching, darts, tugs of war, Indian wrestling, any nostalgic sport. Before the actual dinner hour I plan to add applejack drinks and hard cider for more clout, to be served with cheese and crackers. During the drinking hour it would be fun to have band music, live if there's a rentable one or on records—there are a great many to choose from.

What else for such a party but the groaning board, buffet style, checked tablecloths, heavy crockery and the like. For a spoof, the main dishes could be "prized" with merit badges—a blue-ribbon ham glazed with syrup and honey, an extravagance of garden vegetables in separate dishes, a cauldron of mashed potatoes or new potatoes, baked beans redolent with ginger, molasses, mustard, and salt pork. "Prize-winning" breads in abundance too—anadama, honey wheat, cornmeal—all homemade or approximations thereof, to be slathered with sweet butter from tubs. What's a cooking contest without preserves served from the original jars—apple and quince butters, bread-and-butter and watermelon and cantaloupe pickles, end-of-the-garden relish, whatever may be found or made.

In addition, there would be another "prize" table of cakes and pies and an offering of ruby pink sass (rhubarb) and applesauce to surfeit the appetite for old-fashioned foods. You might even be daring and serve fresh milk to wash it down, as well as plenty of coffee and cider.

For a smaller group, stew in a pumpkin is fine harvest fare and looks great. Marvelous from now to Halloween. Fill with a favorite beef stew recipe, adding corn, cubed sweet potato, and a cup or so of Marsala. Cover with the pumpkin lid and bake until the gourd is soft, the stew hot. Serve right from the pumpkin. All that's needed to round out the meal is a hearty bread for gravy sopping. A fitting finish could be deep-dish fruit pie, fruit turnovers, or jelly-glazed baked apples plus cheese.


A great American idea LET'S BRING THE METRIC SYSTEM HOME TO AMERICA

Next to champagne, France's great contribution to civilization is the metric system. But it all began when the U.S. set up a system of decimal money.

On April 29, 1778, two elderly gentlemen stood before the Academy of Sciences in Paris. They embraced, kissing each other on both cheeks, and the normally staid and sober academicians erupted into cheers. The embrace was a bit awkward, to be sure, since one of the men was American, unaccustomed to the French mode of salutation. He was Dr. Franklin of Philadelphia, only American member of the Academy, in France on a diplomatic mission for the brand new United States of America. Older of the two, and more fragile, was none other than Voltaire, humanist, satirist, and a leading proponent of the ideas set forth in Jean-Jacques Rousseau's Social Contract. Rousseau himself would have completed a brilliant triumvirate, but he, unfortunately, lay dving in his Ermenonville retreat.

France flipped over Franklin. A theorizing scientist, he was also a down-to-earth mechanic. Having figured out the nature of lightning, he went on to figure out a way of preventing lightning damage to buildings. In France, his paratonnerre (lightning rod) was the marvel of the age, used on public buildings everywhere. One of the leading apostles of Rousseau's democratic ideas, he was a prime mover in the American colonies' rebellion against British rule. He was famous, too, for having a way with the ladies.

So the enthusiasm at the Acad-

emy of Sciences was well justified. The meeting symbolized the whole spirit of the age: American practicality and European intellect combined would recreate the world. And, in point of fact, that

is just about what actually happened. The ferment sparked by such men as Franklin and Voltaire resulted in two successful revolutions, creation of the United States Constitution, and—something the world needed even more than new systems of government—a new, universal system of measurement.

Having won its revolutionwith a big Franklin-wangled assist from France-the United States proceeded to the meat-and-potatoes task of establishing its own mode of everyday life. First in the new system of things came money. Away went the awkward British coinage, with its 12 pence to a shilling, 20 shillings to a pound, and a 21-shilling guinea just to complicate things a bit more. American money, it was decided, would be based on the decimal way of figuring things. The idea had the simplicity of genius: Nobody has ever failed to understand the mathematics of ten cents to the dime, ten dimes to the dollar.

Perhaps it was because Franklin, enjoying his well-earned retirement, no longer concerned himself with public affairs. Perhaps it was because Thomas Jefferson, the other scientist among the Founding Fathers, was too busy with other things. Anyway, no thought was given to changing our ways of measuring anything other than money. The American people were left with the incredible clumsiness of a 12-inch foot, a 36-inch yard, a 5,280-foot mile, a 16-ounce pound, and all the rest of it.

So the ball bounced back to France, which had just begun its *Continued on page 56*



own revolution. Liberté, egalité, fraternité: These were the watchwords, and Talleyrand, that redoubtable statesman, chose to emphasize the fraternité. As a means of promoting brotherhood among nations, he proposed the establishment of a universal method of measurement. The Revolutionary Assembly accepted the idea and turned to Franklin's old friends in the Academy of Sciences to imple-



ment it. A committee was set up but had no sooner begun its work than things got rough in France. Heads, including those of some of the scientists, began to roll, and it was not until 1795 that the Committee on Weights and Measures was able to make a report. Whoever said that a camel is a racehorse designed by a committee could not have been aware of the system of weights and measures developed by the Special Committee of the Academy of Sciences. The metric system, as it was called from the beginning, has all the beauty of sophisticated simplicity. It begins by taking a cue from American money, with all units divided or multiplied by tens. With a stroke of pure genius it ties the measurements for weight, volume, and heat to the same common thing: a cubic centimeter (about the size of the end of an ordinary toggle light switch) of pure water. And, in a gesture of amity toward England, the committee made its basic unit of length, the meter, so close to the English vard hardly anyone could notice the difference.

Classicism was another watchword of the time, so the various measuring units have classical names. Basic unit of length, the meter, is divided into thousandths (millimeters), hundredths (centimeters) and tenths (decimeters). Moving upward from the meter we have tens (decameters), hundreds (hectometers), and thousands (kilometers). The same milli-, centi-, kilo- prefixes are used with the gram for weight; the liter for volume, and the calorie for heat energy. For everyday use, though, the deci-, deca-, and hecto- divisions are ignored. In length measurements, for example, anything between a centimeter and a meter is given in centimeters; between meter and kilometer, in meters.

For temperature measurements, the committee adopted a scale designed by the Swedish scientist, Celsius. This, too, has the simplicity of genius, with the freezing point of water as its zero, water boiling point as the hundred mark. Originally called Centigrade, the temperature scale was renamed for its inventor, Celsius in 1948.

Although the French Assembly accepted the metric system with enthusiasm and made it the law of the land, people were slow to begin using the new weights and measures. It was not until 1812 that Napoleon proclaimed mandatory use of the system, with allowance for a few popular deviations. Meanwhile, several other nations had seen the benefits of the French measurements and adopted them for regular use. Not so the U.S., however. Relations with France had deteriorated since the Revolutionary times and now French ideas were not being well received.

Scientists, though, were keenly aware of the advantage of doing their figuring by the decimal method. They accepted metrics with enthusiasm, in the U.S. as well as the rest of the world. Two other professional groups in this country also saw the advantage of using decimals but were not daring enough to really go metric. These were engineers, who began measuring in tenths of a mile and tenths of a foot, and machinists, who divided the inch into tenths, hundredths, and thousandths for their exacting metal work. So for more than a hundred years we have had four systems of measure-Continued on page 58

ment in daily use: metric, engineers', machinists', and man-inthe-street (English). All of these are different and mutually incompatible: A tenth of a foot is not an inch; a tenth of an inch has no recognizable relationship to a foot; a centimeter does not relate to either, etc. Is this the "American practicality" of Franklin's time?

A case might be made for the proposition that generations of American school children have grown up hating mathematics simply because of the confusion in their minds about everyday measurements: a foot divided into 12 inches, each in turn divided into halves, quarters, eighths, sixteenths and so on; a square foot with 144 square inches and an acre with 43,000 (or thereabouts) square feet. Is it any wonder we have trouble figuring the number of square vards in the kitchen floor?


The blessed simplicity of counting money would, you might think, make us all realize the advantage of using decimals for other things. But, like children imagining fearsome creatures in the dark corners of a familiar room, people have frightened themselves about the metric system. The bogey is the prospect of having to "convert" one set of units into the other and. like most bogevs, it exists only in imagination. When we begin using metric measurements, all the conversion will have already been done by the people who make the measuring tools. The rest of us have only to switch yardsticks and pay no attention to how many centimeters there may be in an inch or how many ounces to a kilogram.

For example: Everyone who has driven an automobile in a foreign country has felt a brief shock upon noticing a speedometer reading of 85 or thereabout. The shock passes quickly, though, with the realization that 85 kilometers per hour is only a moderate speed. Your own sense of velocity and the speed of passing traffic tell you that, and there is no need to translate the figure into miles per hour.

When the U.S. finally comes around to going metric there will be occasion for a few jokes, no real difficulties. A woman on a reducing diet might get a laugh by declaring she was "down to 75." Of course, 75 kilograms is still

pretty hefty. And it might amuse some people to say it was time to turn the air conditioner on full blast because the temperature had gone up to 32. Since normal body temperature is 36 on the Celsius scale, discomfort at 32 is to be expected.

There are no real problems in-



volved in changing equipment, either. On weighing scales and other gadgets that indicate measurements on a dial, it is only necessary to change the figures on the dial itself-the rest of the mechanism stavs just as it was. Centimeter rules instead of foot rules, meter sticks instead of vardsticks-these are inexpensive, simple to make.

Maybe we love the compounded confusion of our various measuring systems too much to change. But the rest of the world-even old England-has long since switched to the unified decimal way of measuring things. Since we started it all with our money, it would seem only fitting for us to go the rest of the way. Adoption of the metric system might even be a most becoming way of observing our bicentennial. Ben Franklin, who helped to get the whole thing started, would be for it.

Walls are chalk-white, or covered with fabric; floors are painted; windows have shutters to block the sun. Dark finishes were stripped from furniture and wood was bleached or lacquered. Now, "it's a symphonic statement of the 19th century," he says, eclectic as the Victorians who gloried in world empire were, eccentric, and never a cliché. "The first minute I saw my house," he says, "I felt that I'd been there before. It reminded me of my grandmother."

AVICTORIAN HOU

Antique Chinese Hawthorn porcelain jars were the color key for the living room. The teak furniture, now lacquered, is Burmese, made in the 1800s for export to the West. Filigree shows Victorian fascination with Oriental elegance. The form—note table legs, 1—demonstrates the delight in furniture fantasies. Upholstery is a design by Cimonetti, based on the vases. Temple finial, 5, and figures, 2 and 3, are from Siam; screens, 5, are North African but have the same lacy lightness. Even the outside of the house, 4, shows a liking for lace.



Outside, the house is Carpenter Gothic, a hybrid that evolved when local 19th-century workmen chose style and details from published books of plans and mixed them at will. Somehow, gingerbread, pointed windows, and gaunt Victorian house shapes are a harmonious whole, which Mr. Braswell treats with respect. "Nothing is the way it was born," says his associate Ward Willoughby, "but it's all sympathetic." New redwood siding is stained an old brown emphasized with white. Perennial borders join the interior color scheme: lemonyellow forsythia, blue and white hydrangeas.





Like yesterday, the house, 2, is full of intricate detail. Like today, it is casual and very easy to keep. The Bavarian chairs in the dining room, 6, are reputed to come from Meyerling. The wood, carved to resemble twigs, has now been lacquered to resemble ivory, a very Victorian kind of triple entendre. The old Welsh dresser, bleached mahogany, is also a hybrid: The eagle is probably a patriotic American late addition to the faux bois on top. Easels, one on either side of the room, hold paintings that can be changed for 20th-century flexibility. Baskets on open shelves, 5, keep plates clean between parties. Mr. Braswell likes to entertain, everywhere in the house. The kitchen, I, was designed for sitting around. A big penin sula keeps guests from underfoot, encourages them to chat. For weekend homework there is the "browr study," 3. Walls covered in army canvas, glove leather on the Eastlake furniture, a thousand yards of milliner's ribbon woven into a screen, it is a cozy winter room, a place to listen to music and to sketch. At the top of the house, three bedrooms (two for guests), still Victorian, still with a difference. "To be a designer," says Mr. Braswell, "you have to be able to enter and share somebody else's dream." This is his own dream, "and it's different from any work I've done before."

A huge fourposter bed, covered with eiderdown, dominates the master bedroom, 1. The posts are turned cores of mahogany logs carried from the West Indies by sailing ship, for ballast. Once here, their outsides were stripped away for fine veneer. A tiny single guest room, probably once a sewing room, 2, has a chair from East Anglia and a carved twig Bavarian bed, both bleached. Pillows covered in faux tigre continue the Victorian foolery. The wallpaper is a textural print. The colors throughout are muted, earthy, with suddan bold accents. Prints from Africa, each slightly different, are used for headboard and bed covers in the third bedroom, 4. Above the bed, paintings lean on a narrow ledge, lit from below by lights that also serve for reading. Wide window overlooks the property and an 18th-century barn does not show from the front, 3.

Glorious barden color Spring miracles from bulbs

to plant now through December

eptember through December is the time to set bulbs in your garden to flower in spring—or in a pot in your refrigerator to bloom indoors. A bulb is a miracle, an encapsulated embryo flower packaged in its own plain brown wrapper, carrying its own food supply and time clock, easy to grow, asking only a cool launching pad for its reliable rocket-thrust of color. **In a garden**, most bulbs also multiply. Tulips and hyacinths rarely match their first year's opulence, but many will repeat.

Some general pointers: Buy the best, order early, plant promptly. (If planting is delayed, store in open bags in a well-ventilated cool place; in the deep South, refrigerate twelve weeks before planting.) Set tulips out last, even after Thanksgiving in warm spells, in midwinter in the deep South. Plant bulbs tip up, twice as deep as they are round, about 3 inches down and 3 inches apart for small bulbs, twice that for large ones. Figure on four large bulbs per square foot in a fertile bed, one per foot if naturalizing daffodils in a lawn or meadow. Use 1 teaspoon bonemeal in the bottom of a bulb's planting hole or 1 pound per 100-foot row. If soil is stodgy, loosen it with sand or compost. Plant tulips 7-12 inches down if moles, mice, or winter-heaving are a problem. After a bulb blooms, snap off its energy-sapping seed pod before it can develop, but do not cut or mow foliage until it is yellow and no longer building food reserves. For winter bloom indoors: 1. For each 6-inch pot, figure on 1 quart growing medium, plus shards or pebbles for drainage and fill with three to five daffodils or hyacinths or six to seven tulips or ten to fifteen muscari. Barely cover bulb tips, water thoroughly, drain, and leave at room temperature for a week or more to initiate root development. 2. Move pot to refrigerator or other dark area with temperature 40-50 degrees for ten to fourteen weeks. Keep potting medium moist to the touch. (A cold garage, trench, or basement window-well is good if pots are well mulched.) 3. Move pot out of storage about a month before desired blooming time-for Valentine's Day, plant and chill by mid-October, take out in January if bulbs have sprouted and roots show through drainage holes. Put in dim place, 55-65 degrees, for a week or two. (Each temperature change simulates nature.) 4. When sprouts are 3-4 inches tall, move to room temperature and window light to bring them into bloom.

Grape Hyacinths

Blue, white, violet-blue, 6 to 10 inches, grasslike leaves. Muscari resemble steeples of blue beads or tiny upside-down grape clusters. They self-seed, tolerate shade, and thrive in city garden containers.



Yellow, white, bicolor, orange, buff-pink, 3 inches to 2 feet tall. Narcissus is botanical name for all daffodils, twelve basic types including trumpet, small and large cupped, doubles, jonquilla, tazetta (Paper Whites). Some will naturalize indefinitely in drifts except in heavy shade of evergreens.

or take advantage of records that come with instructions. Shipboard horse racing with a felt turf, dice, and movable mockups of horses would recall the trotting events so dear to fairs. Penny pitching, a wheel of fortune, "guess the beans in a jar"—any simple or elaborate county-fair amusement could keep the party going. Of course, it's traditional to have a finale of fireworks, but if they are outlawed in your community, you can have a roaring bonfire and a lusty group singalong instead.

Fruits and vegetables right from the garden are so beautiful, come in so many glorious colors, so many shapes that they are to be enjoyed for their visual appeal as well as their taste. For decoration, spray them with Pam to make them glisten. It won't hurt their edibility a bit.

Great vegetable go-togethers: fat bunches of scrubbed radishes, leaves and all, nestled among patty pan squash and baby eggplants; a pyramid of tomatoes, orange and red sprigged with fresh basil, and greeny white scrubbed scallions; red and maroon cherries and Brussels sprouts overflowing from a hollowed out, huge Savoy cabbage.

Mushroom baskets make smashing containers for garden centerpieces or wild flower bouquets, sprayed brown or any color you choose. Any interesting basket, wooden bowl, old kitchen piece filled almost at random with produce, field flowers, and grasses can be a delight to the eye.

Who can bear to let all this beneficence just wither and fade away? I put up foods compulsively for later enjoyment and to avoid wasting any of the fresh produce that comes my way. I like to set a jar of special preserves at each place at an informal supper party—a gift to take home. Putting special labels on the jars they become substitute place cards.

Put up the unusual and hard-to-get: herb jellies, basil for veal or beef, tarragon with poultry, rosemary and lamb, horseradish with cold meats. Follow the mint jelly recipe on the bottled pectin label, substituting the herb of your choice. Dried herbs can be used too, but in smaller quantities. The basic taste of the tisane will tell. Vegetable colors can give a different "green" to each variety as well as an appetizing tint. Rose geranium jelly and rose hip jam were classic with the Sunday roast chicken of my grandmother's day. They are still delicious as are wild grape conserve with game and green grape and mint jelly with wildfowl.

Have you ever thought of:

Making your own herb vinegars, single flavors, mixtures, and a strong garlic parsley? Or making your own herb mustards?

Giving personalized labels as gifts to friends who do their own canning and having some made for youself to use at Christmas time on all your own gifts?

Saving and collecting odd crocks and jars for gift packaging? Using reproductions of antique bottles for gift vinegars? Freezing herb butters in individual ice trays?

Drying fruits such as apples and pears?

Using seed packets as place cards for a harvest party? Pooling garden excess and having a one-day sale, the proceeds to go to your favorite charities?

Method: Separately blanch carrots sliced in thin rounds, string beans, fennel, cauliflower and reserve the liquid.

In a fondue pot add homemade bouillon, canned bouillon, bouillon made with cubes, or liquor from cooking vegetables and bring to a boil on the stove. Place pot on burner in the center of the table and keep at low boil over medium flame.

Arrange the carrots, string beans, fennel, and cauliflower in separate dishes. Provide a selection of the above garnishes and sauces for the meat to be dipped into after cooking in bouillon. Serves 6. After the meat has been used, broth takes on a zesty flavor and can be sipped as a soup with the addition of egg whipped into it to scramble or accompanied by an egg poached in the simmering broth.

HERB CHEESE FONDUE Crusty Bread Kirsch (served as a coupe de milieu when guests are halfway through fondue)

Cheese, for the original **Cheese Fondue**, is usually melted in wine with additional seasonings. Heat in a wide shallow pot and provide guests with three-pronged forks to spear crusty pieces of bread to dunk in cheese.

Ingredients: 1 clove garlic; 1½ cups white wine (Neuchâtel is good); 1 tablespoon lemon juice; ½ pound diced Switzerland Swiss cheese; ½ pound diced natural Gruyère cheese; pepper to taste; nutmeg to taste; 3 tablespoons kirsch mixed with 1 tablespoon cornstarch; fresh chives, chopped; 2 loaves Italian or French bread cut into 1-inch cubes (each cube should have crust on one side).

Method: Rub inside of pot with cut garlic clove. Discard garlic. Place pot on stove, add the wine and heat over medium flame until wine is warm

but not boiling. Add lemon juice and cheese by handfuls, stirring constantly

with a wooden spoon until cheese is melted and the cheese-wine mixture has the appearance of a light creamy sauce. Add pepper and nutmeg to taste. Let mixture come to a boil. Pour in the kirsch and cornstarch mixture and allow to boil another 15-30 seconds. Sprinkle mixture with chives. Remove pot from stove and put on lighted burner on top of table. Adjust flame of burner so fondue continues bubbling lightly. Provide each person with a basketful of bread cubes. Serves 6.

FONDUE BOURGUIGNONNE Fillet or Top Sirloin (Cubed) Béarnaise Sauce Lemon Wedges

For **Fondue Bourguignonne** the pot should be metal and heavy bottomed to prevent oil spillage. Each guest should have two forks; one to cook with and a cool one to eat with.

Ingredients: 2 cups herb flavored oil; 1 cube bread; 2 pounds lean fillet or top sirloin, cut into ¾ inch cubes; 1 cup Béarnaise sauce; lemon wedges.

Method: In a metal fondue pot heat oil until hot; test with a cube of bread; if it browns in 1 minute, the oil is the right temperature.

Spear a beef cube, dunk it into the hot oil and cook to taste. Transfer meat to another fork and dip it into the Béarnaise sauce or sprinkle with lemon juice. Serves 4.

CHOCOLATE FONDUE Grapes, Pineapple, Orange, Strawberries, Tangerines, Red Apples or Angel Food Cake, Pound Cake, Macaroons, Lady Fingers

APPLE-RAISIN CHUTNEY

From the book *Gournet Gifts* From Your Kitchen (Macmillan) by Ceil Dyer.


Ingredients: 5 pounds tart, crisp apples, peeled, cored and chopped; 1 large, mild, purple onion, peeled and chopped; 1 large clove garlic, minced; 1 small slice fresh green ginger, chopped fine; 4 cups dark brown sugar; 6 cups vinegar; 2 pounds seedless raisins; 1 tablespoon each salt, white mustard seed, curry powder; 1 teaspoon cinnamon.

Method: In a large deep kettle place apples, onion, garlic, green ginger, sugar, vinegar, raisins, salt, mustard seed, curry powder, and cinnamon and cook stirring over moderate heat until sugar has dissolved; boil gently 45 minutes to 1 hour, or until thick, fragrant, dark. Ladle into hot jars and seal. Makes about 8 ½-pints.

CUCUMBER RELISH

From Edna Lewis, author of *The Edna Lewis Cook Book* (Bobbs-Merrill).

Ingredients: 1 quart cucumbers, washed and finely chopped with





pepper, onion, and celery and cook uncovered 10 minutes; do not brown. Add tomatoes, olives, capers, pine nuts, wine, and sugar and simmer, uncovered, 30 minutes. If mixture has too much liquid, boil rapidly to reduce it. Add salt, pepper, and parsley. Spoon into crocks or earthenware jars. Chill. Makes 6 cups. Keeps 10 days in refrigerator.



Pickled Pears from Charles Mount. Ingredients: 10 pounds small pears, firm with stems intact; water; 10 cups sugar; 1 quart white vinegar; 2 tablespoons whole allspice; 8 pieces cinnamon stick, about 2 inches each; 2 tablespoons whole cloves; 1 lemon, sliced thinly.

Method: Wash pears carefully; prick skin of each pear all around in about 6 places with fork tines (pears can be peeled; it requires slower cooking). Place pears in enamel kettle; cover completely with fresh water. Bring to a boil; boil gently about 10 minutes. Remove pears and drain. Clean enamel kettle, add sugar and vinegar, bring to a rolling boil; reduce heat to gentle boil, add all spices tied in a cheesecloth bag, lemon slices, and pears. Cook gently until tender; do not overcook. Remove spice bag, reserve cinnamon sticks. Place pears in hot sterilized jars, add lemon slices and cinnamon sticks. Bring liquid to another boil, pour over pears, lemon, cinnamon. Seal jars. Makes 24 ½-pints.

TOMATO CHUTNEY

From Edna Lewis. Ingredients: 4 cups tomatoes,

peeled and seeded; 1¼ cups vinegar; 1¼ cups sugar; 2 tablespoons sea salt; 1 tablespoon dry ginger, ground; 1 tablespoon garlic, finely chopped; 2 teaspoons chili powder, ground; 4 tablespoons tamarind pulp; 3 tablespoons green ginger root, sliced thin; 2 tablespoons green chilies, sliced thin. *Method:* In a large pan add tomatoes, vinegar, sugar, sea salt, ginger, garlic, and chili powder and cook gently over medium low heat until thick (about 1½ hours). Remove from heat, stir in tamarind pulp, ginger, chilies. Cool. Fill sterilized glass bottles with chutney, seal with cork top. Makes about 8 ½-pints.

PICKLED PEACHES

From Emalee Chapman. Ingredients: 16 pounds clingstone peaches; cloves; 1 quart mild vinegar; 7 cups sugar.

Method: In a large pot pour boiling water over peaches. Drain, peel peaches, stick 3 cloves in each.

In a separate pan boil vinegar and add sugar; stir until sugar is dissolved and bring to the boiling point and boil again for 10 minutes. Add peaches to syrup, boil 10 minutes. Remove peaches from liquid and place in sterilized jars. Boil syrup another 15 minutes, pour, boiling hot, over peaches. Makes 4 quarts.

PEACH CHUTNEY

From Barbara McGinniss who is writing *Claustrophobic Cooking* for cooks with small kitchens.

Ingredients: ½ cup onion, chopped; ½ pound raisins; 1 clove garlic; 4 pounds fresh peaches, peeled and cut in small pieces; % cup fresh ginger, peeled and chopped; 2 tablespoons red chili powder; 2 tablespoons mustard seed; 1 tablespoon salt; 2 cups cider vinegar; 1½ pounds brown sugar (do not use free-pouring type).

Method: Put onion, raisins, and garlic through a food chopper. Place mixture in deep kettle and add peaches, ginger, chili powder, mustard seed, salt, cider vinegar, and brown sugar and boil for 1 hour, or until the chutney is a rich brown color, and rather thick. Pour while hot into sterilized jars. Makes 3 pints.

FRUITED VERY HOT RELISH From Barbara McGinniss.

Ingredients: 2 quarts (4 pounds) ripe tomatoes, chopped and peeled; 2 cups pears, chopped; 1½ cups apples, chopped; 2½ cups onions, chopped; ¾ cup hot cherry peppers, chopped; 4 teaspoons salt; 3 tablespoons mixed whole pickling spices; 1¼ cups sugar; 2 cups cider vinegar.

Method: In a deep kettle place tomatoes, pears, apples, onions, cherry peppers, salt and mix well. Cook mixture uncovered 1½ hours, or until reduced by ½. In a cheesecloth bag tie spices and add to mixture. Stir in sugar and vinegar. Cook mixture uncovered 1 hour, or until quite thick. Remove spice bag, discard. Pour relish into hot sterilized jars. Makes 6 pints. ■

Cooking for one or two can be as much fun as cooking for a crowd, maintains Henry Creel, who derives great pleasure from this kind of menu planning, shopping, and cooking. Here he shares some recipes (from a cook book he's writing) for food, simple to prepare, delicious, and healthful. Many can be used as unit building blocks for expanded servings when guests arrive. When doubling or trebling recipes, check seasonings and cooking time.

Lamb Steak with Tarragon Cream Gravy Zucchini Cheese Casserole Brownies

LAMB STEAK WITH TARRAGON CREAM GRAVY Ingredients: About 10 ounces

Ingredients: About 10 ounces lamb (a slice from leg is suggested); ½ clove garlic, minced; salt and pepper to taste; 1 teaspoon dried tarragon, pulverized; 1 medium onion, in quarters; 1 teaspoon flour; 3 tablespoons boiling water; 1 tablespoon heavy cream.

Method: Preheat oven to 450°. Place lamb in a shallow roasting pan and rub the meat with garlic pieces and sprinkle with salt, pepper, and tarragon and add onions to pan. Roast meat for 10 minutes. Reduce heat to 350° and cook another 20 minutes. Remove lamb and set it aside. Pour off any excess fat from the roasting pan and add flour. Stir and mix well. Add the water, blend well and dissolve the brown particles on the bottom of the pan. Add more water if the gravy is too thick. Stir in the cream, test for seasoning and serve over the lamb.

ZUCCHINI CHEESE CASSEROLE

Ingredients: 2 tablespoons butter or margarine; 1 clove garlic, minced; 1 small onion, sliced; 1 zucchini, medium size, sliced thin-

ly; salt and pepper to taste; ¼ teaspoon oregano; 4 ounces stewed tomatoes; ¼ cup sharp Cheddar cheese, grated.

Method: Preheat oven to 400°. In a small flameproof casserole melt butter or margarine and sauté garlic and onion for 3 minutes. Add zucchini, salt and pepper to taste and oregano and cook covered for 10 minutes. Add tomatoes and place in oven for 15 minutes. Uncover casserole and add cheese; return to the oven until the cheese is melted. Serve immediately.

BROWNIES

Ingredients: 2 squares unsweetened chocolate; ¼ cup butter; ½ teaspoon vanilla; 2 eggs; 1 cup sugar; ½ cup flour; ½ teaspoon baking powder; ½ teaspoon salt. Method: Preheat oven to 350°. Melt chocolate and butter in top of a double boiler and stir in vanilla.

In a bowl beat eggs lightly and gradually beat in sugar, chocolate mixture, flour, baking powder, and salt. Pour mixture into greased 8-inch round cake pan, bake 25 minutes. Allow to cool and cut into squares. Makes 8.

Wrap extras in wax paper and freeze.

Individual Meat Loaf Sherry Kraut Rice Pudding

INDIVIDUAL MEAT LOAF Ingredients: ½ pound round steak, ground; 1 egg; ¼ teaspoon rosemary, pulverized; salt and pepper to taste; 1 slice white bread; ½ red apple or 1 stalk celery; ½ medium onion; 1 slice bacon.

Method: Preheat oven to 400°. In a mixing bowl break meat into tiny bits and add egg, rosemary, salt and pepper.

Crumb bread in a blender, add to seasoned meat. Add apple or celery and onion to blender, blend 1 minute, add to meat mixture, mix well, form into ball.

Line a small skillet with aluminum foil and place meat loaf in center; cover with bacon and bake for 45 minutes.

Melt the butter in a small pan and stir in the flour. Cook 1 minute stirring.

Strain ½ cup broth and stir it into the butter and flour mixture. Continue stirring until sauce is smooth and lumps dissolve.

In a small bowl mix the lemon juice and egg yolk together. Add a small amount of the sauce to the lemon and egg mixture and mix together well. Add this to the remainder of the sauce. Cook 1 minute and serve over chicken.

CORN MEAL CRÉPES Ingredients: 1 tablespoon flour; 2 teaspoons corn meal; 1 egg yolk; 2 tablespoons milk; salt to taste; 1 teaspoon melted butter.

Method: Place flour and corn meal in a bowl. In a separate bowl beat the yolk and milk and stir into the dry mixture. Add the salt and melted butter and mix well.

Spoon into greased crêpe pan and cook until brown on both sides. Serve hot.

ENDIVE AND BACON BRAISED *Ingredients:* 1 endive, about % of a pound; 1 strip bacon; salt and pepper to taste.

Method: Trim the endive and peel off the outer leaves. Wrap the bacon completely around the endive lengthwise and place it in a small casserole. Salt and pepper the wrapped endive and cook covered over a flame tamer until the endive is tender.

GARDEN BREAKFAST OR LUNCH

(Vegetables and Egg) Ingredients: ½ teaspoon oil; ½ cup rutabaga or turnip, cubed; 1 small onion, sliced; 1 carrot, sliced; ½ tablespoon green pepper, diced; salt and pepper to taste; 1 egg. Method: Cover the bottom of a small casserole with oil and add in layers, separately, the rutabaga or turnip, onion, carrot, green pepper. Salt and pepper to taste.

Cover the casserole and simmer on top of the stove until the vegetables are tender (20 minutes).

Uncover the casserole and break the egg on top. When egg is set, serve immediately.

Variations of vegetables may be used to good advantage in this breakfast or light lunch.

Never-before buying guide to 31 important California wines

arlier this year a last bastion of wine snobbery crumbled when two of France's leading gastronomic critics, Henri Gault and Christian Millau, were quoted in Newsweek as having come out in praise of California wines. Not so long ago they had dismissed them with Gallic scorn as "science-fiction bever-ages." Now, after a tasting trip to the Napa Valley, the verdict was -a complete volte-face. Americans, they conceded, were capable of producing some very great wines, especially in the realm of the Cabernet Sauvignons, some of which rivaled the finest Bordeaux. At a private tasting in Paris, a Beaulieu 1969 Private Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon costing \$6.30 was voted a peer of Château Petrus 1967 selling in America for \$80. The supercritics also had kind words for Gallo's Hearty Burgundy, calling it hard to beat at the price-\$1.30 a fifth.

This is no surprise to those of us who have been enjoying and talking up California wines for the last decade. The progress in those years has been spectacular, as rivers of money have gushed into new and old wineries, and quality has been boosted by increased plantings of the top grape varieties in microclimates specially suited to them. The efforts of the more dedicated winery owners and winemakers to improve their wines have put competitors on their mettle. As a result, today you can count on finding something good at every price level, from the dependable and very drinkable generic jug wines to limited bottlings of extraordinary value.

Varietal bottling is the name of the game, and more and more a standard practice, as American wine drinkers become increasingly conscious of, and more curious and savvy about what they are buying. Although California law requires only 51 percent of the name grape in a varietal bottling, with more grapes available many wineries are using from 75 to 100 percent. They no longer have to blend for economic reasons. If they do, it is by choice-for consistency of taste, to supply the acidity or fruitiness that might be lacking in a wine, or to make it drinkable earlier. Best of all, they can now hold for longer

the reds that need bottle age, instead of releasing them before they are ready, to meet the demand.

In the future, you'll be seeing some unfamiliar names, as vintners opt to bottle varietally wines they have mainly used for blending, such as Merlot, Carignane, Ruby Cabernet, French Colombard, and Flora. This opens up a whole new field of exploration. It is fascinating to taste a bottle from one winery against another and discover how the region where the grape was grown, the method of winemaking, and the aging can affect

ed whole and uncrushed to yield a very fruity, fragrant wine that can, in fact, must, be drunk while still in its infancy. Both the Beaujolais Primeur and the Beaujolais Nouveau (Primeur is marketed and drunk before the end of the harvest year, Nouveau two or three months later) have been a huge success in America since they made the New York scene three or four years ago. California vintners have obviously taken to heart the advantages of having a deliciously drinkable young red wine that can hit the market fast. Last year a

Recently, both Sterling Vineyards and Louis M. Martini came out with a varietal Merlot, a grape mostly blended with Cabernet Sauvignon to add softness and fruitiness. Sterling's estate-bottled 1969 and Martini's nonvintage blend of 1968 and 1970 were interesting examples of different approaches to a new varietal. The Sterling Merlot I found round, soft, and fruity, with a very Cabernet flavor, while Martini's was a harder wine that could take more age.

Last year Sterling also bottled a Merlot Primeur right after the harvest, borrowing the Beaujolais system called carbonic maceration in which the grapes are first fermenthandful of wineries experimented with Nouveaux made from Zinfandel, Gamay, Merlot, and Ruby Cabernet, and it looks as if this will catch on. Certainly the Sterling Merlot Primeur was a joyfresh, full of fruit, with more acidity than the young Beaujolais.

In every way, the prospects for the adventurous wine drinker are getting brighter and brighter. Soon you will be able to choose from not just half a dozen, but fifteen or sixteen different red varietals, as many white, and a correspondingly larger range of rosés. There will be considerable diversity among the wines, in quality and price, according to the style of the winery and the region in

which the grapes were grown-the cool climates of Napa, Sonoma Santa Clara, and Monterey or the warm interior San Joaquin Valley

The San Joaquin Valley has been noted mainly for a high pro duction of Thompson Seedless and other grapes that bear heavily in baking heat, the majority of which are used for dessert and fortified wines and brandy. Aristocratic delicate varieties such as Caberne Sauvignon, Pinot Noir, Pino Chardonnay and Johannisberg Riesling like it cool. The sturdie types like Carignane, Barbera, Gri gnolino, Petite Sirah, Zinfandel Chenin Blanc, and French Colom bard can take higher tempera tures. Some of the varietals grown in the Valley, among them Ruby Cabernet, Emerald Riesling, Flora Gold, and Royalty, were specially developed for the hot climate by the University of California's De partment of Viticulture and Oenol ogy at Davis by crossing two exist ing varieties to make a new hybrid

The University program has been going on for over forty years and to date only a handful of crosses have made it. Two of the most successful have been the Ruby Cabernet, a cross between Cabernet Sauvignon and Carignane, and Emerald Riesling, a cross between Muscadelle and White Riesling and the grape that goes into Paul Masson's popular proprietary wine, Emerald Dry.

While most effort has gone toward table grape varieties suited to hot regions, new varieties are also being bred for the cool coastal counties that would be equal in quality to the traditional varietals grown there, but capable of bearing more heavily. Practically all of these are Cabernet types, among them a white Cabernet. According to Professor Berg of Davis, while a hybrid may have a Cabernet parentage, it develops a character of its own, as Ruby Cabernet has done.

"It's difficult to describe some of these new wines," he told me, "because they really taste different. To me one of the chief pleasures of drinking wine is continually to encounter new tastes and experiences, and we expect that out of our breeding program will come some entirely new types. 

ture is in these varietals. All the time we are widening the range of California wine, as well as improving the quality."

The new varietals do taste different, and though to my palate they lack the finesse and complexity of the best of the established varieties, with a tendency toward coarseness, no doubt they will improve as more wineries experiment with methods of vinification. While I find the reds from the San Joaquin Valley more successful than the whites, which are rather neutral, lacking fruitiness and acidity, a common fault in hotclimate white wines, I have been impressed with what happens when grapes are grown in cooler

regions. Ridge's 1970 Ruby Cabernet, from a half-acre vineyard on its Monte Bello mountain property, is a fantastically big chewy wine with a lot of tannin that could well age for another ten years, while the 100 percent Flora 1971 of Souverain in the Napa Valley is a light, well-balanced white, with a fruity, flowery bouquet that would be a most appealing summer wine.

What we will be seeing within the next two or three years is a bigger and better selection of inexpensive wines in the medium price range, between the generic blends and the top premium varietals, wines that will cost from around \$1.69 to \$3.

Red and rosé varietal wines

Barbera

A robust, dark-red wine made from a grape of northern Italy. Rather tart and acid when young, it softens and deepens with age. Winery names to look for: Louis M. Martini, Buena Vista, Sebastiani, and, among the small wineries, Bargetto, Heitz, and Pedrizetti.

Cabernet Sauvignon

California's best red wine. The classic Bordeaux grape does exceptionally well in the cool regions of Napa, Sonoma, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz,

Monterey, and San Benito counties, producing wines of considerable complexity, rich color, medium to full body with a characteristic, easily recognizable bouquet. Cabernet Sauvignon has a high degree of tannin and needs aging, although it is often blended with Merlot or Cabernet Franc to soften and mature it earlier. Cabernet Sauvignon differs considerably from one winery to another. Some make 100 percent varietals or set aside part of the wine for longer aging in cask and bottlethese are distinguished from the regular Cabernets by being listed on the label as "Private Reserve," "Vintage Selection," "Harvest Selection," and so on. Rosé wines are also made from the Cabernet Sauvignon grape. Winery names to look for include: Almadén, Beaulieu, Beringer, Freemark Abbey, Chappellet, Heitz, Charles Krug, The Christian Brothers, Louis M. Martini, Paul Masson, Robert Mondavi, Inglenook, Mirassou, Oakville, Concannon, Souverain, Sonoma Vineyards.

Carignane

Until recently, this prolific and widely planted grape was mostly used for blending, but is now being bottled varietally. Carignane can vary, according to the winery, from a light, young wine to one that is full-bodied, deep in color, and full of tannin. Wineries that bottle Carignane are Simi, Ridge, Fetzer, David Bruce, and, among Valley producers, M. LaMont.

Charbono

A medium-bodied, full-flavored wine from another northern Italian grape. Bottled varietally only by Inglenook and the small Davis Bynum winery. Gamay (also Napa Gamay, Gamay Noir) and Gamay Beau jolais

The grape called

Gamay or Napa Gamay has now been identified as the true Gamay Noir that makes the wines of Beaujolais in France, whereas the Gamay Beaujolais is actually a relative of the Pinot Noir. The wines are very similar, light and lively with a berrylike aroma, and they can be made both as reds and rosés. Red Pinot

A light, soft, pleasant if unremarkable wine from a grape that is actually not of the Pinot family, but a southern French variety. Varietally bottled only by The Christian Brothers (as Pinot St. George) and Inglenook (as Red Pinot).

Royalty

A Davis hybrid that makes a medium-bodied, soft, and fruity wine with a very dark color, mostly used for blending, but varietally bottled by Weibel and Valley producers like M. LaMont and Franzia.

Ruby Cabernet

This most successful of the Davis hybrid reds produces a wine with light to medium body, a fair amount of tannin, and the characteristic Cabernet Sauvignon aroma. In the hands of a fine small winery such as Ridge, this can be a surprisingly big and complex wine. Other wineries producing Ruby Cabernet: Barengo, M. LaMont, Royal Host, Ficklin, Heitz, Inglenook, San Martin.

Zinfandel

A uniquely California wine that varies considerably in price, quality, and character, depending on where the grapes are grown and the wine made. The majority of Zinfandels are made for current drinking-light, fresh, lively

young wines with an appealing raspberrylike aroma and a glowing color. An aged Zinfandel is a totally different wine-dark-colored, full-bodied, and intensely fruity. There are also Zinfandel rosés and lately certain wineries have experimented with a white Zinfandel. Chenin Blanc

(also called Pineau de la Loire, Pineau, and sometimes. erroneously, White Pinot, as it is not a Pinot grape). One of California's most popular and widely bottled varietals. Soft, light, and mellow with a delicately fruity aroma, it can range from dry to medium sweet, according to the winery. Chenin Blanc is produced by many wineries, among them: Almadén, Beringer, Chalone, Chappellet, The Christian Brothers, Cuvaison, Inglenook, Charles Krug, M. LaMont, Louis M. Flora

Another Davis hybrid, a cross between Semillon and Traminer, and a light, refreshing fruity wine with a spicy overtone. Bottled varietally by a few wineries: Davis Bynum, Parducci, Souverain, Z-D Wines.

Emerald Riesling

One of the earliest Davis hybrids. A clean, light, tart wine, sometimes with a hint of sweetness. Winery names to look for: East Side, M. LaMont, Paul Masson (Emerald Dry), Pedrizetti, Royal Host, San Martin.

Folle Blanche

A crisp, dry, tart wine with high acidity and a clean finish made from a grape of the Cognac region of France and bottled varietally only by Louis M. Martini **French Colombard** or **Colombard**

A minor and less expensive white, mostly used for blending because of its high acidity. It can range from a rather neutral, undistinguished wine to one that is deliciously fresh and clean with a fruity varietal aroma and flavor. The Château Souverain 1973 Colombard Blanc is a good example. Made by a small number of wineries such as: Cresta Blanca, Foppiano, Inglenook, M. LaMont, Parducci, Souverain,

Winemasters' Guild, Z-D Wines. Gewürztraminer and Traminer

Two Alsatian grapes (Gewürztraminer is a superior, spicier variant of the Traminer) that in California make very pleasant wines with a distinctive, flowery, spicy fragrance and a fresh, crisp fruitiness. Winery names to look for include: Almadén, Buena Vista, Heitz, Charles Krug, Inglenook, Louis M. Martini, Mirassou, Robert Mondavi, Sebastiani, Simi, Wente, Z-D Wines. Gold

A Davis hybrid that produces a sweet wine with a pronounced Muscat aroma and flavor, best served well chilled. So far, only Royal Host seems to bottle this.

Green Hungarian


Another white mainly used in blending. It can vary from dry to semi-dry, with light to medium body. Although not one of the best varietals, the wine can be pleasantly clean and fresh. Winery names to look for: Buena Vista, Cresta Blanca, Souverain, Sebastiani, Weibel,

Winemasters' Guild. Greu Riesling

Despite the name given to this grape in California, it is not a Riesling, but the Chauché gris of France. The wine, however, is light, soft, and faintly spicy, with some resemblance to a Riesling and should be drunk young. Winery names to look for include: Beringer, The Christian Brothers, Cresta Blanca, Cuvaison, Inglenook, Korbel, Charles Krug, Sonoma Vineyards, Souverain, Weibel, Wente.

Johannisberg or White Riesling

One of California's top whites, a deliciously fresh, fruity, flowery wine, softer and fuller than the German Rhine and Moselle wines made from Riesling grapes with a high acidity. Lately, Wente, Beaulieu, and Sonoma Vineyards have made a limited supply of Riesling Spätlese from lateharvested grapes shriveled to concentrated sweetness by the Botrytis cinerea, the "noble rot" of Europe. Winery names to look for include: Almadén,



Today, more Chardonnay being aged in oak and the uality of the wine is being onstantly improved. Sauvignon Blanc

This white Bordeaux grape is used alone and in combination with Semillon to make a wide range of wines from dry to the sweet dessert types. The sweet version is often labeled Sweet Sauterne or Haut Sauterne or give a Château designation, such as Château Beaulieu, Château Concannon. Château Wente. Sauvignon Blanc, grown in the Loire as Blanc Fumé, makes one of California's most interesting white varietals, a clean, dry wine with a distinctive earthy flavor. Among wineries making a dry Sauvignon Blanc are Beringer, Concannon, Fetzer, Oakville, Wente. Sometimes the dry wine is labeled Blanc Fumé (Almadén), Fumé Blanc (Robert Mondavi, Beringer, Eleven Cellars), and now Pouilly Fumé (Charles Krug), to distinguish it from the medium-dry or slightly sweet.

Semillon

A rounder, softer wine that when blended with Sauvignon Blanc tempers its dry earthiness. A dry Semillon is made by Almadén, Beaulieu, Concannon, The Christian Brothers, Charles Krug, Inglenook, Paul Masson, and Wente.


Sauvignon Vert

A clean, dry wine with low acidity, Sauvignon Vert is mainly blended in generic jug wines, but a handful of small wineries like Thomas Kruse, Nichelini, Sutter, and Trentadue bottle it varietally.

Sylvaner or Franken Riesling

While not as distinctive and elegant as the Johannisberg Riesling, this less expensive varietal of the same family is a light, fresh, young wine with a flowery fragrance. It is usually labeled Sylvaner, Sylvaner Riesling, or sometimes, rather confusingly, Riesling. Winery names to look for include: Almadén, Beaulieu, Inglenook, Charles Krug, Louis M. 

Memories and recipes from the Peking childhood of Cecilia Sun Yun Chiang

EDITOR'S NOTE: Memories of the food she enjoyed in her childhood and a belief that others would share her enthusiasm for it led Cecilia Sun Yun Chiang to open "The Mandarin," her renowned restaurant in San Francisco's Ghirardelli Square (another "Mandarin" will open soon in Beverly Hills). Mme. Chiang was born and brought up to a luxurious life in an ancient palace in Peking and "even as late as 1949, I had never cooked anything myself, although I had eaten and been exposed to the finest cuisines all my life. Chinese gourmets sel-dom ever cook," she explains, "their knowledge is acquired by watching and eating." In a new book, The Mandarin Way°, written in collaboration with Allan Carr, from which the following excerpts are taken, she shares her memories and brings to life the customs and cooking of a nowvanished way of life.

Some of my earliest memories are of the festivals which fill the Chinese calendar. Indeed, almost any occasion seemed to be an excuse for a festival or feast. And the most important was the Festival of the New Year, with its symbolism of rebirth and new life. This occurs at the first moon, at the end of January or the beginning of February, according to the lunar calendar.

For at least five days before the Festival of the New Year, the house was alive with preparations. Tsao-chün, the kitchen god, whose picture normally hangs above the stove, had been suitably propitiated, his mouth stuffed with sweetmeats so that he would speak no ill of us when he reported his findings to Yü Huang, the Jade Emperor in heaven; the house had been swept and garnished, and the time for the New Year's Eve feast had arrived.

All stores and even markets were closed for a full week, and it was more than ever necessary to have an ample supply of food in the house. My mother's foresight in pickling and preserving meats, fruits and vegetables now came into its own. Chinese cabbages, crisp and white, were laid away in the cold cellar; watermelons, carefully arranged so that air could circulate between them, lay like bulging vases in neat rows, and large, curiously flat-shaped persimmons were embedded in snow, to be eaten with a spoon, like some exotic sherbet. And great earthenware jars held pickles of all kinds.

As young children we were, as a matter of course, never admitted to the kitchen. That was the domain of the ta shih-fu, the head chef, who was inclined to tyrannize over the household, although the majordomo was nominally Lao Li, who had been a family servant for many years. The kitchen was in any case a dangerous place for a child. Razor-sharp cleavers, and hot fires, would be too much of a temptation for young fingers. While the rest of the house hummed with activity, we were being dressed by our wet nurses in fur-lined clothes, embroidered fur hats with earpieces, and quilted embroidered shoes, all homemade. We could always tuck our hands into the opposite sleeves and keep them warm inside the horseshoe cuffs which came down beyond our fingers. I find I still do this to this day whenever the



weather is cold, even though have no cuffs to protect me.

My father always seated himse first and was also served first. W children sat at a separate table u til we grew up, and unlike our of ders we were not allowed to ta morsels from the dish. Each of was handed food on a very sma plate, and had to ask the serva behind our chair, an elder sister our mother, if we wanted som thing in particular.

The dishes on this special occ sion were well qualified to offs the cold: a pork shoulder, "re cooked" in soy and wine to t quintessence of its flavor, of a su culence and aroma to whet the a petite; a whole chicken, baked clay, to retain all its tenderness a delicacy; and a firepot, typical northern China, in which all kin of foods, specially prepared in th same shapes and sizes, are put in a broth. The pot has a central con through which the heat rises fro glowing charcoal underneath, an as the liquid simmers, everyon seated around the table, which circular, puts his choice of ingred ents into the pot. The food loo delicious even before it is cooke for the chef lays out the plates an artist composes a picture. E erything possible is round; shrin balls, all kinds of meat and fis balls-as we say, "round for toget erness." Dried mushrooms, as sul tle as truffles, steamed and se soned, join transparent noodle (fan-tzu) and a variety of veget bles to add an infinite range to th aromas rising from the soup. Lotu seeds, steamed with dragon ey and dates, and simmered wit dried kuei-hua flowers, from th Chinese wild olive, were tradition al ingredients of the desserts.

As we drank the steaming broth or tasted the textures and flavor of meats, mushrooms, the slipper transparency of the noodles con trasted with crisp winter cabbag or lotus root, we could turn ou

neads from time to time to see hrough the windows the snowlakes softly falling, which gave an added zest to the feast before us.

Outside, in the darkening lanes, oung shop assistants with lanterns vere running hither and thither eeking out those who had failed o pay their bills. Everyone was expected to pay his debts before the ear's end, just as every shopkeeper expected to claim his due, but fter midnight, by custom and tralition, a truce was called. And hus the lanterns continued to dart bout, and those who could not, r would not, pay went into hidng, or were brought guilty and hamefaced into the glow of the ights.

A large fish, cooked whole, glisening with sauce, and lying on its elly as though still swimming, ow made its appearance: somene, doubtless, had had to break he ice to get it from the river. Of ll the dishes, this was my particlar favorite. The fish was first ried a little, then simmered with vine, soy sauce, a hint of garlic, inger, scallions, and just enough vater to make a sauce. The result vas a dish of ambrosial delicacy. t also signaled that dinner was oming to an end.

After the feast we would sit up ntil midnight, watching with leepy eyes the flickering of tall, plendid candles, shou-sui, for at he stroke of twelve we knew we yould be one year older (the Chiese, like racehorses, are one year lder at the first of the year, whatver the birth date may be). This ustom is called shou-sui or watching the year steal away." irecrackers rent the air, for a appy New Year, or as some beeved, to chase away evil spirits, s we were firmly and finally caried off to bed-some of us still wake in anticipation of the excitenent of the coming morning.

My father, like all Chinese parnts, used to hide money, wrapped p in red paper (ya-sui ch'ien) for he children to find on New Year's Day: inside each package, we ound he had written a lucky adge and had put in a sprig of everreen as well, as a good omen.

The house was gay with red lecorations: ornaments of red paer in the shape of Chinese char-

acters, red scrolls brushed with lucky poems hanging from the ceiling beams; and the red camellia, the New Year flower in northern China. To these were added sweetscented yellow narcissus in bowls filled with colored pebbles; blackstemmed pink flowers, known as mei-hua; heaven bamboo, t'ienchu, red of berry and with bamboo-like leaves; and the flowering plum, filling the air with fragrance, its yellow flowers the color of beeswax. In the south, in Canton, the orange and pomelo are favorites at this season, their golden color symbolizing wealth and good fortune.

Foods especially associated with New Year's Day included chiaotzu, delicate little dumplings fried to a golden brown on one side and stuffed with savory meats, which were considered essential as a beginning. Three or four courses followed, such as hen's eggs poached in chicken soup; thin pancakes, intricately rolled in reverse curves to give them their name, ju-i, like the Chinese scepters they resembled, stuffed with eggs and meat; yuan-hsiao, tiny marblesized balls made of glutinous rice, white or dark and shiny with sugar. Nien-kao, rice cakes sometimes filled with date paste or black sesame seeds and flavored with dried kuei-hua flowers, were a temptation to youngsters, especially when they were colored with vegetable dyes to look like jade. (In the region of Shanghai, my mother's home, they are usually of a pink color, rich and sweet. There they are sliced, fried lightly or steamed.) Another kind, ning-p'u nien-kao, was sautéed with meat and vegetables, or cooked in a soup. The custom was to eat everything in pairs-two eggs, two ju-i, two yuan-hsiao, two nien-kaosince couples are considered lucky. This also applied to the gifts exchanged at this time: friends and relatives sent servants with tiered lacquer containers in which were canisters of tea, two kinds of preserved fruit, two hams, two chickens; and the boxes could not be sent back empty: twin gifts would weigh them down in return, and red-wrapped money for the servants as well.

tinued for fifteen days. On the second day, formal calls were paid on relatives and friends, in strict order of precedence: the lower in rank or age calling on the higher or more senior. Like other families of our sort, we kept open house, and tea and delicacies were offered to every caller. Pointed olives were placed on the lid of each teapot, because they looked like taels, the Chinese money, and ginkgo nuts were displayed for the same reason. Relatives brought us presents of money, wrapped in red paper, and there were innumerable dinner parties, which we attended in our best clothes.

For the first ten days of the festival my sisters and I wore in our hair charming velvet flowers threaded on a fine wire, a specialty of Peking, although the exchange of visits continued up to the climax of the celebrations on the fifteenth day, the Feast of Lanterns. Noise, color and flickering lights are forever associated in my mind with that day, when we all set out at twilight with paper lanterns, made in every conceivable shape: a goose, a lotus flower, a carp, a magpie, a phoenix, a lion—painted in brilliant hues; and all the while the rattle of firecrackers roused us to an ever higher pitch of excitement.

After all these festivities, the remaining days of the first moon were something of an anticlimax, although snowflakes still offered the diversion of snowballs and sliding on slippery courtyards, just as the first thaw held out the promise of warmer days. Childhood memories are brief, and it was not long before we were looking forward to spring.



of egg to which the salt has been added. Sprinkle all over with sesame seeds and deep-fry rapidly about one minute—in hot cottonseed oil.

SHRIMP AND SNOW PEAS (Wan-tou Ch'ao Hsia-jen)

Ingredients: ½ pound large raw shrimp or prawns; 1 cup cormstarch mixed with 1 cup water; 4 ounces snow peas; 2 tablespoons vegetable oil; 1 tablespoon Chinese rice wine or dry sherry; pinch of salt.

Method: Shell and devein the shrimp, and coat lightly with the cornstarch-and-water solution. Prepare the snow peas by picking off both ends and removing the stringy fiber. Heat a wok over high heat and put in the oil, making sure that the surface is covered with a film of oil everywhere. When it is hot, put in the shrimp, and while rapidly stir-frying, add the wine and salt. Add the snow peas last, as they cook very rapidly, and in one minute, or less, all will be done. Speed and dexterity are essential in a dish of this kind, in which the elements are so fragile that overcooking will produce a tasteless, amorphous mess instead of a delicacy for the gourmet.

WALNUT SYLLABUB (Ho-ťao Lau)

I have called this a syllabub rather than a soup (as it is sometimes translated) because a hot liquid of nut purée, dates and sugar, with milk and a touch of cognac, hardly qualifies as a soup in Western terms, and the consistency should be that of a flowing custard.

Ingredients: ½ pound walnuts; ¼ pound preserved dates; 1 tablespoon condensed milk; ½ cup sugar (or more, to taste); 1 teaspoon cornstarch; 1 tablespoon cognac. Method: Shell the walnuts and remove the skins by soaking in hot water to cover for thirty minutes. Drain and then bring the walnuts to a boil in enough fresh water to cover, simmer for five or six minutes, and drain again.

Soak the dates for half an hour in two and a half cups of cold water, then drain. Bring to a boil in four cups of fresh water, immediately reduce the heat, cover, and simmer for about half an hour. Allow to cool, drain, reserving the liquid, and remove the skins and kernels.

Put the date pulp and walnut into a blender with a cup of th date water and blend until smooth Pour the purée into a saucepa and slowly stir in the condense milk. Then add the remainder of the date water, about two cups of cold water, and the sugar, an simmer, bringing gradually to boil, stirring constantly to preven sticking or burning. Immediatel reduce the heat to a simmer, ad the cornstarch (blended with little water), and cook until th syllabub begins to thicken. Ad the cognac, and serve while ho The syllabub should be served i bowls and is eaten with a spoor

All the stirring and mixing has to be done by hand in our house hold, as we did not know of th electric blender, and it is just possible that the results were better since one controlled the preparation at each stage. The introduction of the cognac was an embed lishment of my father's and is centainly an improvement.

STEAMED FISH

(Ch'ing Cheng Yü)

Ingredients: 1 rock cod, carp, see bass or red snapper, 2-3 pounds; 4 scallion tops, 4 inches long; 3 slice fresh ginger root, ¼ inch thick garnish: 4 scallions, finely shred ded, and fresh coriander.

Ingredients for sauce: 2½ table spoons cottonseed oil; 3 drops ses ame seed oil; 3 or 4 drops light soy sauce; dash of Chinese cooking wine.

Method: Make incisions ¹/₄ incl apart on both sides of fish. Arrang the scallions on a platter, and lay the fish on its side on top; stick the slices of ginger into the incision nearest the head.

Place the platter on a rack in a wok or roasting pan (having brought some water in the pan to the boil first). Cover, and stean for seventeen to eighteen minutes

In the meantime, mix the cottonseed oil with the sesame seed oil, soy sauce and wine, and cool for two to three minutes to blend the flavors. When the fish is ready to be served, pour the sauce over it, and garnish with the scallions, shredded lengthwise, and some chopped coriander. The fish thus prepared has just sufficient seasoning to bring out, rather than mask, its delicacy, and in that respect is typical of the restraint of the northern Chinese cuisine.

Ingredients: 3 bars imported milk chocolate; 3 bars imported bittersweet chocolate; ½ cup light or heavy cream; 2 tablespoons brandy, rum, or liqueur of choice; 1 large bunch black grapes; 1 pineapple cut in half and sectioned; 2 oranges, peeled, sectioned, and membrane removed; 1 pint whole strawberries; tangerines, peeled, sectioned, and membrane removed, 2 red apples, thinly sliced; or a selection of cakes cut into bitesized cubes: angel food cake; pound cake; macaroons, lady fingers.

Method: Break chocolate bars into small pieces and place in a saucepan. Add light or heavy cream, brandy, rum, or liqueur. Stir mixture over low heat until chocolate is melted and smooth. Pour mixture into fondue pot, light candle-warmer. Serve a tray of the fruit, or angel food cake, pound cake, macaroons, and lady fingers for dunking. Serves 4.



eally red are tulips. There are lots of other red flowers, of course, but none can equal the dazzling brilliance to be found among Darwins and other tulip classes. All in all, these springtime favorites give just about the best money's worth to be found in the plant world. Tulip bulbs are relatively inexpensive, easy to handle, and, given anything like favorable conditions, flower year after year with little attention. Perhaps it is the broad-petaled flower cups; perhaps the vibrant clarity of the colors themselves, but the icy whites, glowing yellows, luscious mauves, and inky purples of tulips have a carrying power unequaled by other flowers. And those super spectacular reds! Their season begins in early spring with the glowing scarlet species tulip Fosteriana. It goes on with early single varieties like Brilliant Star and Dr. Plesman. Color climax comes with Darwin and improved Darwin varieties such as Paul Richter, Dover, Holland's Glory, and Flying Dutchman (see page 108). Tulip season ends with the consummately graceful lily-flowered varieties. Queen of Sheba is a magnificent yellow-edged red in this class. Used in clusters among peonies, tulips are a center of attention while



peony buds are developing, drop their own petals before those begin to unfold. In the peony bed, *above*, lily flowered tulip Red Shine is in full bloom while leaves of early daffodils ripen beside it. Spreading foliage of the perennial plants conceals tulip and daffodil leaves as they mature, and the bulbs stay right where they are to flower another year. Beginning in September, nurseries and garden shops will be offering a large selection of tulip varieties. Be sure to get yours early before the cream of the crop is snapped up. Those clever scientists at the United States Department of Agriculture have discovered that mosquitoes will no lay their eggs in water with a surface area of ½-inch square or smaller. We can take a cue from this to prever mosquitoes breeding in small containers of standing water. All you have to do is divide the water surface int ½-inch sections. Half-inch hardware mesh will do the trick as long as it remains in contact with the water surface. This is easy enough as long as the rain barrel—or whatever the container may be—has a constant water level. Where the water moves up and down, the trick may be a bit more difficult, but some sort of float ing arrangement should not be hard to make. Come to think of it, this explains why pebble-filled pools dom breed mosquitoes: Pebbles break up the surface of the water just enough to discourage the bloodthirsty pest



nother indoor growing season is just around th corner. For most of us it won't be a new seaso unless we have a new plant or two to add to th window sill or greenhouse familiars. This year's novel -one that will probably become a permanent part of the collection of everyone who tries it-might well b the cape primrose, Streptocarpus. A native of Sout Africa, streptocarpus has been cultivated a long tim but is only now beginning to be popular with home ga deners. A close relative of African violet, it is a some what bigger plant but takes the same kind of care Flowers, left, blue, violet, pink, or white, are conside ably larger than African violets, with stems long enoug for cutting. The plants like a cool, humid atmosphere plenty of light as long as it's not hot sunshine, and car not tolerate soggy roots. They are ideal for growing in large terrarium, and flower sporadically throughout th year. Leaf cuttings root quickly, but growing plants from seed is more difficult. A. roseum grandiflorum (Rosy Onion or Bigflower). Scapes grow to about 18 inches; its soft rose flowers are star-like and form about a 3-inch ball. The variety is given high marks by some observers for drying, but the color seems to be too soft to be satisfactory for this purpose, but it does keep well in water. It blooms in June. If it has liked the season, bulbs will appear on the heads, nice little garlicky things that can be used, so you may be torn between cutting the bloom for indoors and saving the fruit for the kitchen; if left, the bulbs will fall off and make new plants-which means that neglect can cause the plant to become a pest. But they are worth growing; the price is up to \$2.50 a dozen. Although the species originated in North Africa, it is perfectly hardy in Zone 5, and in parts of Zone 4 with protection.

A. Schubertii (Schubert's Onion). Named after a Munich physician, G. H. von Schubert (1780-1860), who traveled extensively in Egypt and Palestine, this species is said to be rare, which is hard to believe, for it is in commerce; it is more likely to be scarce because it is not known and it carries a fat price-about \$2.50 each. nice. Scapes grow from 20 to 24 inches, and the rose-red ball is large. It is from Palestine and I'm guessing that it has Zone 5 hardiness, for I have not tried it. It blooms in June.

A. sphaerocephalum (Globeheaded Garlic). Do not confuse with chives. Wilder gives it short shrift, "A tall, rather coarse species for the border or the wild garden.

. . It flowers at midsummer, but these giant chives are rather tiresomely ubiquitous." This species, as you would expect, gets high praise in catalogues. It probably has Zone 5 hardiness, but as it is native to Britain, I rather doubt it.

As already noted, there are many, or nearly so, decorative Alliums, most with enticing descriptions. Collecting them might be amusing, if only because it is a game of chance insofar as the catalogues are concerned. I've collected very many plants, not only to see what they looked like, but to determine if I liked them. If I take up horticulture in my next reincarnation, maybe I won't be so catholic in my taste, which would require a change in temperament or personality. And this might be a good idea, too. Who knows? I might even collect Alliums.




