PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

1981, a year of re-evaluation of the AIA. On the local level, a year of education for all members in a number of subjects. The Illinois Council's direction will be reviewed. Nationally, the California Council has started a re-evaluation of Institute purpose. Our challenges are:

NATIONALLY

A review and investigation of the future principles and purpose of the AIA has to be accomplished. At the 1980 convention in Cincinnati the California Council approved a resolution which will require this investigation to be completed within two years. The Chicago Chapter tried, but failed, to have passed a resolution which would require a fiscal strategy for the National AIA in 1980. Perhaps the California Council resolution will accomplish a portion of our concern as to how funds are being allocated.

Leadership has to be developed on a local and state level to bring representation from a large component into the National AIA. The task is great since the political arena of Washington requires participation in time for many years to go forward in a prime leadership position.

ILLINOIS

The Illinois Council purpose, its responsibilities to member chapters, and its future role will have been reviewed in December. Four representatives from the Chicago Chapter and the ICAIA representative will meet to review fiscal strategy as well as the role of Illinois Council. The legislative effort on the state level is important and should continue, but why does it have to cost so much to perform this service for our local chapter? In addition, the CCAIA has to take a greater role in participating and setting the direction of the ICAIA. This is not only limited to participation but, also, providing legislative

support by moving Chicago representatives toward our viewpoint.

CHICAGO

1981 brings a new Executive Director and a program based on education as determined by the Long Range Planning Committee report in mid-1980. The following are in the planning stages:

Seminars established to bring architects, on all levels, together to review subjects which will be of interest to all segments of our membership.

Four lectures to be presented with speakers who will bring interest and controversy.

A quality assurance committee is being formed with the ultimate objective of reducing the amount of claims against architects. Participation in a Chapter-sponsored program will be limited to AIA architects and will increase understanding as to the causes of design and building failure. A quality Assurance Founcation will be established to act as a clearing house for exchange of information concerning techniques and practices which can be used to enhance quality assurance.

Through your participation, the AIA can be made an association to benefit all architects in all areas of practice. I welcome your thoughts, comments and help in the next year.
