CHAPTER OFFICE TO EXPAND FIRM REFERRAL SERVICE

Several years ago, as a membership benefit, the Chapter initiated the practice of maintaining referral lists of CCAIA firms who do work in various categories. Although member firms have received commissions through the distribution of these lists, some of the lists, such as Residential, are extremely long. One recipient of this list commented that there was little difference between it and the Yellow Pages.

Because of requests from potential clients, we would like to have a Work File in the office for each member firm choosing to participate. The File would contain a brief firm profile with information such as: name, address and phone number of firm with contact person(s), location of branch offices, when organized, names of principals, services offered, recognition/awards/places published, with copies of articles and a firm brochure, if one exists. In addition, for each referral list on which the firm wishes to be placed, we will require the names and addresses of at least one building in that category. Photos will be requested, but not required.

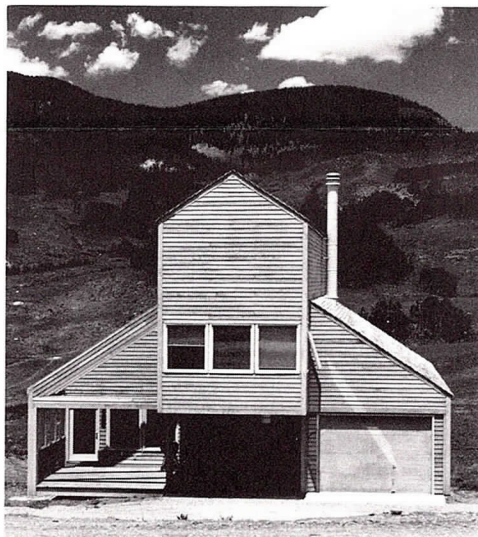
When these files are established, the referral lists will be updated and will serve as indexes to these files. The files will be available by appointment to members of the public during our regular office hours.

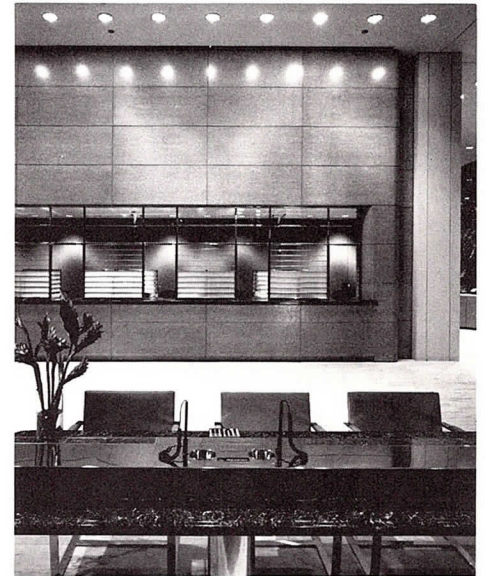
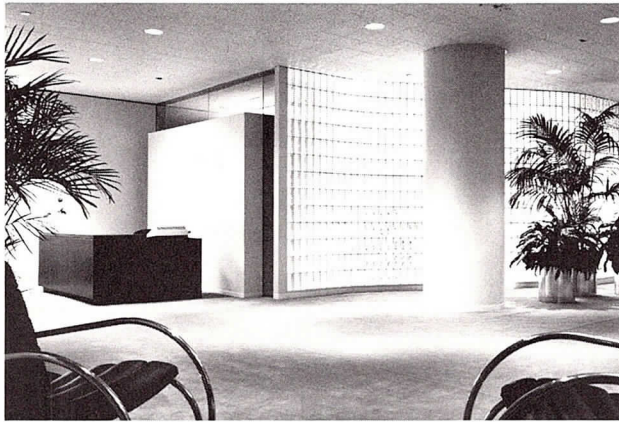
