It was a memorable event. You shared in and created the visions of education in architecture for Colorado. Now, only final accounting awaits the conclusion of this year's design conference and that outlook is good. Over 300 attended the conference and awards celebration, not including almost 30 children who participated in the Saturday afternoon Architecture for Children workshop by Jane Blackstone. We were pleased to have the largest group ever of exhibitors for a design conference and our largest sponsorship participation. Our special thanks go to Ken Fuller, FAIA and the Education fund.

Morning plenary sessions provided the broad overview of issues. The portrayal of Thomas Jefferson by Mr. Clay Jenkinson (special thanks to Jeff Limerick, AIA for this one) was a surprise that ended too soon, after a deliberate beginning.

You had to be there to understand, but one set of videotapes of that and of all the main speakers and presenters are at the AIA Colorado office, which has already received numerous requests for them. University of Colorado President Dr. Judith Albino gave us confidence and cause to look forward to CU's commitment to architectural education. She spoke of a collaboration with AIA that could become a model for relationships between the University and business & professions. TAFT Architects' design presentation was highly praised. This event was sponsored by the DeVon M. Carlson Lectureship Series. They reminded us of clarity in design vision that can also come from a collaborative team effort, and they later provided thoughtful insights at the Roundtable on Architectural Education. Michael Graves, FAIA presented his recent and new projects and discussed their derivation. Adele Santos, AIA inspired our imaginations about the future of not only architectural education, but how it will change practice.

Afternoon breakout sessions provided a focus on special topics with an opportunity for our own continuing education and opportunities to participate in discussions. One afternoon highlight was the OLD Elitches Gardens Re-use Design Workshop by Jim Burns of TAKE PART from San Francisco. The process of participatory design, including neighborhood residents, was reported the next day on the front page of the Denver Post business section. Jim demonstrated why he is a regular consultant on projects with Charles Moore, FAIA and how a public and professional partnership can create better architecture and urban planning.

BEWARE - IF YOU ARE DOING BUSINESS OUTSIDE OF COLORADO

Today, more than ever before, architects and engineers to survive are pursuing work and projects beyond the confines of the boundaries of Colorado. This is good. However, if, for whatever reason, you are doing business as a corporation or a professional corporation there are a number of potential pitfalls -- disastrous pitfalls -- that MUST be addressed and taken into consideration.

The most obvious is the licensing laws of other states. Many states, as Colorado, only recognize individuals to practice architecture. These particulars must be addressed on a state by state basis.

The basic premise of whether or not you, as a design professional can enforce the contract you have entered into with your client may become critical when the account becomes "PAST DUE." We have all developed a false sense of security that at least we can file a Mechanic's Lien and collect our fees, eventually. Mechanic's Liens are statutory in nature, and are strictly administered. Attempts have been made by all the architect's state societies to have architects included with the Mechanic's Lien statutes.

However, if your firm practices in a corporate manner, you may find that enforcing collection may be impossible. Many states, if not most states, require that a foreign corporation (a corporation not incorporated in that state) must register and obtain an authorization to do business at or before the time it performs business or provides services in order to file a lawsuit -- even a lawsuit to enforce an otherwise valid lawsuit.

Therefore, depending on the monetary involvement, the prudent corporation must determine the laws of each state and determine whether to ensure your firm's ability to collect and prosecute actions to collect your fees. ♦

DOCUMENTS CORNER

- AIA has advised us that G605 and G606 have been withdrawn from distribution. It seems that these documents are no longer appropriate for most practitioners. Also, various changes in laws and regulations have made them obsolete.
- AIA Document G703 - "The Contractor" Client Billing System software allows you to bill clients without spending days preparing job invoices. You just enter the information for the new billing period and it is automatically calculated and printed onto AIA Documents G703/CR, the Application and Certification for Payment. The system also prints out the information needed to complete the cover sheet AIA Document G702. This system requires an IBM PC or compatible with a hard disk and a wide carriage dot matrix printer with condense capability. Cost: \$399.95 for non-members, \$359.95 for AIA Members (this is a 10% discount). Call AIA Order Department at (800)242-4140 to ask questions or order. - New MASTERWORKS Specifications Editing Program Introduced by AIA:

AIA and the ARCOM Masterspec Support Center have introduced a software program to assist specifications writers in editing MASTER-SPEC sections faster and with greater accuracy. It is designed to enhance project specification preparation by editing multiple sections simultaneously and incorporating portions of the text into report documents. The program uses WordPerfect Version 5.1 Macros and displays a series of screen menus to indicate the operations that may be selected by the user. Among the available printing functions is a "smart" pagination feature, which scans the line immediately before and after a page break to ensure that part or article titles do not appear alone at the bottom of a page. THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT OF 1990

- Many, if not most, projects now in design in architects' offices are required to comply with the ADA standards. Exceptions include: residential, federal government, religious and private club facilities.
- The ADA guidelines are derived from and look like ANSI, but have some drastically new features, like Areas of Rescue Assistance 4.3.11. Don't be fooled--ANSI does not meet ADA.
- Building departments have no responsibility to enforce ADA. Some are stamping "Not Reviewed for ADA." UBC does not meet ADA.
- No approvals: There is no one who can officially approve any action you or your clients take regarding ADA. Make your best judgement; tighter definitions to some of the more loosely-defined provisions ("Readily Achievable") are likely to come in the form of court case decisions next year.
- Enforcement: Individuals with disabilities (VERY broadly defined) may file suits against building owners for discrimination under extended civil rights law.

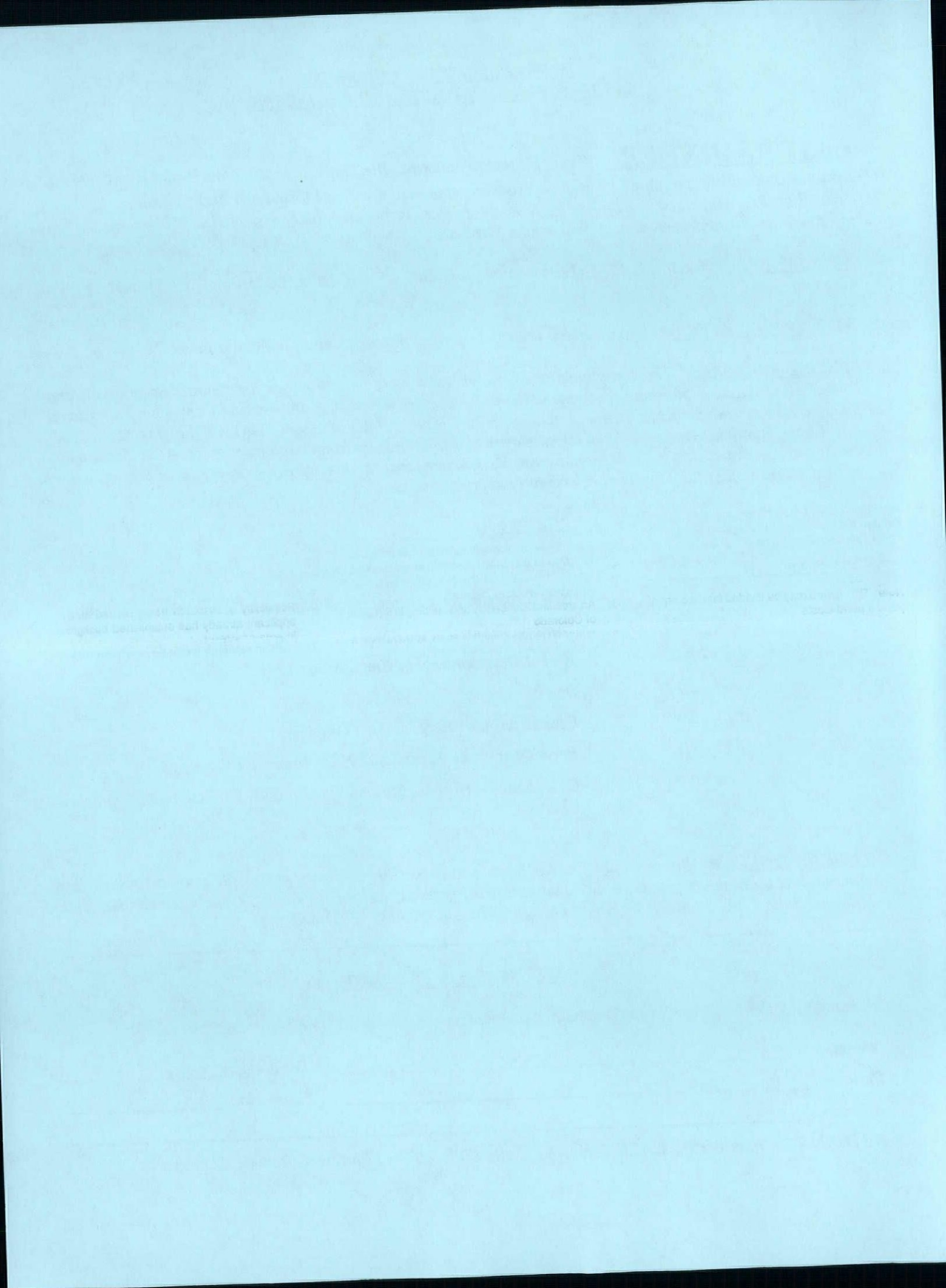
