"Come to Snowmass: Be in Harmony with Nature"

In case you have not heard, AIA Colorado is planning their 1992 Centennial Design Conference at Snowmass Village, Colorado, October 9-11. "Architec-ture / Environment...Man in Harmony with Nature" is this year's theme put to-gether over the past year by Program Chair, Sam Caudill, FAIA of Aspen. Sam has called in some markers and gathered the best environmentalists in the country. He is an advocate of the environment and has worked hard to make this year's centennial conference a special one.

First off, most importantly, you don't have to get "gussied" up. The dress is casual and there will be an official "tie cutter" at all events to cut off your neck tie or bow tie if you dare to wear one. Even the Design Awards dinner will be tie or bow tie if you dare to wear one. Even the Design Awards dinner will be casual (you don't have to buy your wife a new dress to wear - think of the mon-ey you will save). Bring your walking shoes for Friday's break out sessions. Af-ter an exciting welcome and theme setting film on Friday morning at the Confer-ence Center, you will be "trucked off" to Aspen in buses to the base of Ajax Mountain. From here, you will ride the gondola to the top of the mountain for lunch and for your first ever seminar at 11,000 feet. After that alpine adventure, you will walk to either the Given Institute, Wheeler Opera House or Aspen Cen-ter for Environmental Studies (ACES) for your afternoon seminars. And, the first 25 who sign up will be bused to the Rocky Mountain Institute for a presen-tation by Amory Lovins -- their place will not hold more than 25.

At stops to be designated, the buses will pick you up for your trip back to Snowmass Village to hear a presentation by Nat Reed on the roofdeck of our Conference Center. Next will be THE grand Opening Reception for the Exhibits. Then dinner on your own and a good night's rest.

All of the events planned for you on Saturday will be at the Snowmass Con-ference Center and Silvertree Hotel. Lunch with the exhibitors will give you time to visit the exhibits, judge their displays, check off your checklist for prize drawings and chit chat with your colleagues. The finale of our conference will be the installation of the 1993 officers, announcement of the Design Awards, Firm of the Year and Architect of the Year. If you haven't celebrated too much, you may want to join us for Sunday brunch before you take the relaxing trip home.

Brochures with registrations have been mailed, look to past issues for information about the speakers, study the schedule, and sign up SOON! Let us hear from you. If you have any questions, have not received your conference brochure, want to sponsor an event, or sign up for a booth/table, give us a call.

By car: From Denver to Snowmass Village is a scenic 4-hour mountain drive (190 miles). Take I-70 west, then Highway 91 south through Leadville, continue south on Highway 24, turn west onto Highway 82 over Independence Pass (a bit "gnarly" in spots) through Aspen to Brush Creek Road, 6 miles to the Village. Or take a 4-hour interstate drive. I-70 west to Glenwood Springs (170 miles), turn south on Highway 82, 40 miles to Brush Creek Road. Drive 6 miles up to the Village. From Glenwood Springs to Snowmass Village is 40 miles east on Highway 82, about a 45-minute drive. Turn up Brush Creek Road to the Village, 6 miles. From Grand Junction to Snowmass Village is about a 2 1/2-hour drive via I-70 to Highway 82. Turn east out of Glenwood Springs, 40 miles to Brush Creek Road. Drive 6 miles up to the Village.

ASPEN CENTER FOR ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

The Aspen Center for Environmental Studies is a private non-profit environmental education center located within the Hallam Lake wildlife sanctuary. Their goal is to educate people to be environmentally responsible. ACES is open year-round and provides a variety of natural science programs for people of all ages and interest levels.

Elizabeth Paepcke founded ACES to preserve this area as a wildlife sanctuary and to foster education about the environment. In the 1800's Hallam Lake served Aspen residents as an amusement park and as a source of ice during the community's early mining years. Establishing the sanctuary was a way of continuing the tradition of Hallam Lake as a place people could use and enjoy.

THE GIVEN INSTITUTE

Located within the heart of the famous skiing and recreation community of Aspen, Colorado, is the Given Institute, a conference center maintained by the University of Colorado School of Medicine. Completed in 1972, the conference center has hosted seminars and laboratory workshops with participants from medical schools, public agencies, hospitals and research institutes. AIA Denver continues to plan for its Architecture Week to be held September 19th through the 26th. The Annual Design Awards celebration (Denver Doodle Two) will be held on September 26 with Paul Goldberg of the New York Times as the guest speaker. Plans are "emerging" with the Emerging Impressions program being sponsored with UCD. Membership presentations continue on August 6 with the Urban Design Group. The Nominating Committee for the AIA Colorado 1993 Board of Directors will meet on August 3.

Colorado South Chapter AIA has prepared a draft of the revised bylaws for review by the Board, after discussion of them began at the June Board Meeting. The October membership meeting is targeted for approval. Randy Thorne will serve as the South Chapter representative to the State Government Affairs Committee, replacing Walt Burgess, who has served for the past several years.
