Architecture Awareness Month All around the State

Architecture Awareness Week will be celebrations held across the state and aimed at engaging the populace in vital, exciting ways -- engaging our past, current and future clients in a new kind of dialogue to inform them about the indispensability of the architect...and at the same time teach us as architects how to better serve those for whom we work.






Thomas A. Thompson, AIA




Gary L. Brothers, AIA
