These proposed changes place unreasonable legal and economic burdens on the architect. So, the AIA has published its response to "Contracting with Architects: A School District's Perspective." AWAKENING TO RESPONSIBILITY

Redefining Architecture

AIA Colorado will host the 1993 annual design conference at the Broadmoor Hotel in Colorado Springs on December 3 and 4 of this year. The event is titled **AWAKENING TO RESPONSIBILITY** and will focus on a reshaping of attitudes and practices to embrace the concept of sustainability for a more responsible built environment.

We are increasingly aware that architecture and planning have evolved in ways that threaten the survival of our natural environment as well as the quality of our buildings and cities. We must therefore awaken to the concept of *ecological sustainability* and embrace justice, not only for the natural world, but for the social and economic worlds as well.

This will be a joint summit on these concerns shared by the entire profession of building design and the College of Architecture and Planning at the University of Colorado. The conference will also include an invited submission of visionary and creative projects from throughout the region which demonstrate whole-system, interdisciplinary approaches to the design or influencing of sustainable habitats.

Government Affairs Committee in Action

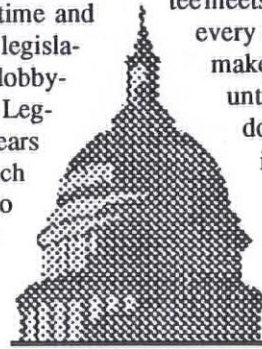

ECOLOGIC PERCEPTIONS AND ARCHITECTURE

Our society is at a critical crossroads. The technological wonderments that provide gratifying convenience, comfort and sybaritic pleasure have been at the exploitation of our planet's finite petro energies, renewable and non-renewable resources.

Architecture with its structure, systems, infrastructure and elements of its interior causes an aggressive demand upon materials and products derived from and sustained by petro energies. In concept, design and specification, it is virtually impossible to escape from petro technology and petro energy used in extraction, processing, packaging, storing, handling and transporting.

In a serious environmental concern the sincere call has been made for the use of natural and renewable materials but for the most part such materials use petro demand from source to point of final placement. For example, petro machines on site excavate and move earth and perform multitudinous tasks during the construction process.

A total ecologic perspective is needed in the first creative thoughts about architecture. Every facet of concept — every decision in planning and design — every item of specification — every initial and lifecycle ecologic and every human biophysical, psychoneural and behavioral response is part of the ecologic equation.

An ECOLOGIC DIGEST is being prepared for the upcoming AIA Colorado environmental conference in December. It will address the concerns expressed in this article. A basic intent of the DIGEST is to broaden the base of information and practice of architecture and interiors into new ecologic and biologic design opportunities.

The ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCE GUIDE produced by the national AIA Committee on the Environment is of notable value. Subscriptions are advised.
