
Barker Rinker Seacat & Partners, Architects, P.C., has announced four new, full-fledged partners, including Phil Lawrence, AIA.

PROGRESSION...ASCENSION...PAUSE



The Young Architects' Forum of Denver sponsored 'heir second annual CMU design charette on Saturday, August 6. The competition was held on the 16th Street Mall.

The purpose of the competition is to help educate the public about architects and let them see, first hand, some aspects of the design process. Many people stop by during the 4-hour charette time and ask questions and share their opinions. During the last half hour, we have spectators vote for the "People's Choice" award.

Each year the competitors are given three basic concepts which they must depict using only the masonry units provided to them. This year's terms were "progression," "ascension" and "pause." Each team had 180 concrete masonry units and 80 bricks, which were donated by Valley Block and Lakewood Brick Company. Upon completion of the days activities, volunteers from Annunciation Housing Partnership pick up the donated units and use them for construction projects throughout the year. Annunciation Housing Partnership is a non-profit group which builds cooperative housing for low income families.

The event is a lot of fun and the public participation is very inspirational. We hope to get even more people to participate in next year's event.


