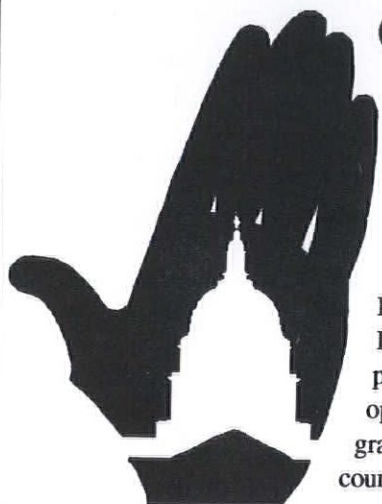

ON THE CUTTING EDGE OF A DYING PROFESSION

For more than 20 years, the AIA Grassroots Annual Leadership Conference has provided component presidents, presidents-elect and executives with the opportunity to enhance their leadership skills, provide grassroots input on AIA initiatives, and share ideas with counterparts from around the country. Grassroots 1996 was no exception.

Grassroots 1996

Over 600 AIA leaders convened in Washington D.C. this past January to discuss the status of the Institute and consider the future of the profession. As your 1996 President I was privileged to have the opportunity to attend my fifth Grassroots. I was accompanied by president-elect Steven Walsh and Executive Vice President Joe Jackson along with the leadership of the state's four local components. The dialogue was extensive and stimulating.

One conversation that I found to be particularly disturbing was an observation by the president of AIA Boston commenting that "we are on the cutting edge of a dying profession." Perhaps many of us have entertained this thought before, or perhaps it may seem to sound as a cliché. Unfortunately, with the radical changes abounding in the profession, this comment is probably closer to reality than we would all care to think. The leadership of the AIA has been working to provide course correction. However, in my opinion, our fate is truly in our own hands. We have an opportunity and obligation to seize our fate by becoming leaders and offering strong direction in our communities. As Arthur Gensler, FAIA stated in his keynote address - we must *commit* ourselves to our beliefs as opposed to merely complying with someone else's beliefs. I challenge each of you to commit yourselves to getting the profession back to the front of the room as opposed to simply being followers of the pack.

On another note I am pleased to announce the re-organization of AIA Colorado is continuing smoothly. As a member of this organization, you will be receiving a survey in the upcoming month requesting your input to more exactly shape the role of our organization.

The survey will be designed to solicit your opinions with little time investment. I look forward to your participation in this first stop of our collaborative planning effort. The survey will be followed by a planning retreat in May to include the Boards of all five state components. Our end product will be a three to five year plan for the organization.

Statistics compiled by national AIA suggests that AIA Colorado is ranked as the 17th largest component in the country in terms of members. Our growth rate this past year is ranked as the tenth fastest component. This statistic is most certainly a reflection that AIA Colorado has been very active providing an important service to the profession. On the other hand, our membership of approximately 1,200 architects represents only 39% of the total resident architects in the state. The positive news is that our market for attracting new members is quite good.

Finally, the 1996 AIA Colorado Board has determined the following five programs will be featured this year:

1. The creation of a Leadership AIA program intended to educate interns and young architects of the importance of community and how to become active and meaningful participants in their respective communities. AIA Colorado has applied for a grant from National to assist in developing this unique program patterned after similar programs initiated by local Chambers of Commerce around the country.
2. The continued pursuit of bringing architecture into our K-12 schools. Initial thoughts suggest following the curriculum developed this past year by the South Chapter.
3. An intense integration and invitation of interns and associates into our organization. We have identified these members of the design community to be the future of our organization.
4. Establishing a mini-grassroots to introduce ourselves to state and local government processes.

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE TRACKS LEGISLATION

Your Government Affairs Committee is very active at this time of year. The Legislative Sub-committee meets every Friday morning while the legislature is in session to review all new proposed legislation in the state. They determine any immediate response (testifying before committees, writing position papers, lobbying legislators, etc.) needed between our monthly committee meetings, with input and advice from Jerry Johnson, our lobbyist. We are closely monitoring a bill to create a state fire code and many bills affecting property rights and planning approval processes throughout the state.

The architect's licensing law will be up for sunset review the summer of 1997. It ends in 1998 unless it is re-enacted in the 1998 legislative session. Prior to that review we will be formulating AIA Colorado's positions on all aspects of the law, and developing our strategies supporting its renewal. We are at work on this now through our Licensing Law Task Force. They are organizing the multitude of issues and concerns to focus on over the next year as we prepare for the sunset review hearings.

We are interested in hearing from you regarding any concerns you have about the licensing law. Some issues include: minimum requirements for licensure and IDP for Colorado, continuing education, use of the term architect (or a derivative form), enforcement and powers of the board, licensing of corporations, use of Associate AIA or AIA by our association members who are not licensed in *this* state, requiring a professional degree in order to qualify for the exam, etc. If you have any comments or concerns about the licensing law please contact me at 303/820-3613, Tom McKenzie, AIA (303/388-4601) or Joe Jackson, Assoc., AIA (303/446-2266 or 800/628-5598) as soon as possible.

We are in the formative stage of organizing a Mini-Grassroots for 1997 during the legislative session in January. Joe Jackson, Assoc. AIA, has experience doing this in California and the committee and Board is enthusiastic about the idea.

We meet the second Friday of each month at 2:00 PM at the AIA Colorado offices. Jerry Johnson, our lobbyist, attends the meetings, and we have a strong core of committee members who have been active for many years. We are also seeking new members, and the meetings are open to all members. ♦
