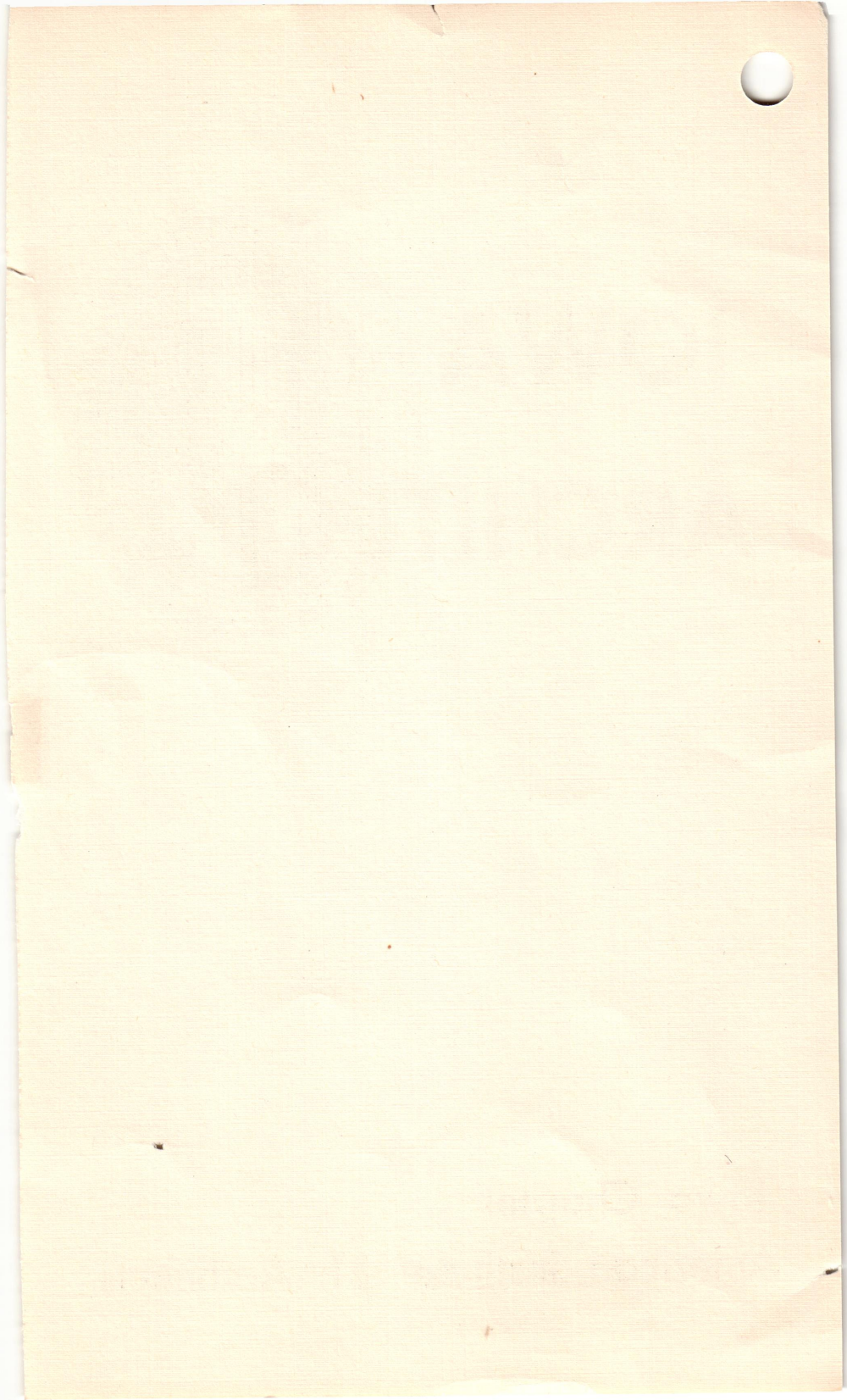

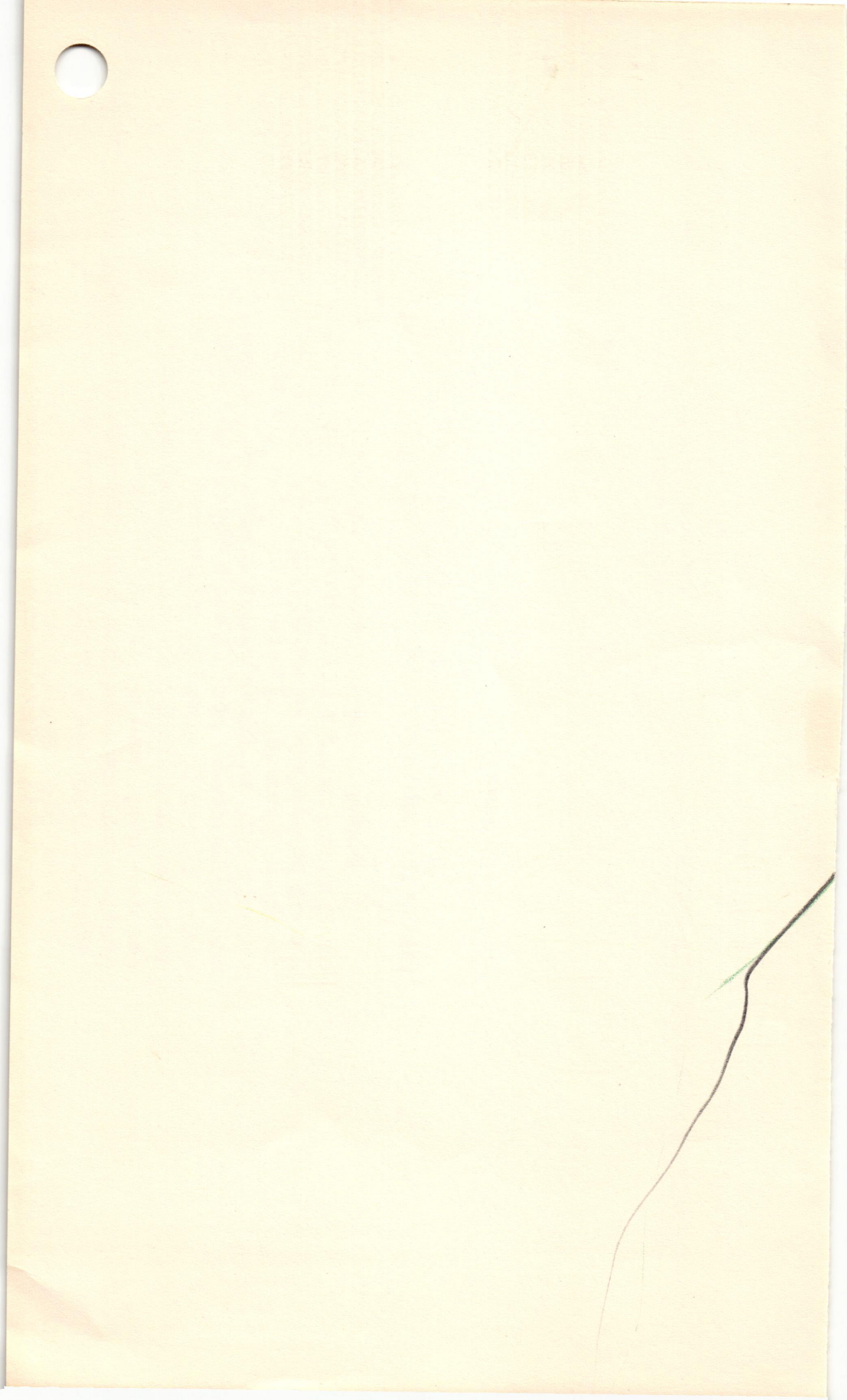
The first part of the report is devoted to a description of the  
 experimental apparatus and the method of measurement. The  
 results are then presented in the form of a series of plots  
 showing the variation of the measured quantity with the  
 independent variables. The theoretical curves are also  
 shown for comparison with the experimental data. The  
 agreement between the two is found to be very good.  
 The error in the measurements is estimated to be about  
 5%. The conclusions drawn from the experiment are that  
 the measured quantity varies as the square of the  
 independent variable. This is in agreement with the  
 theoretical prediction.

Dear Mr. Savage:

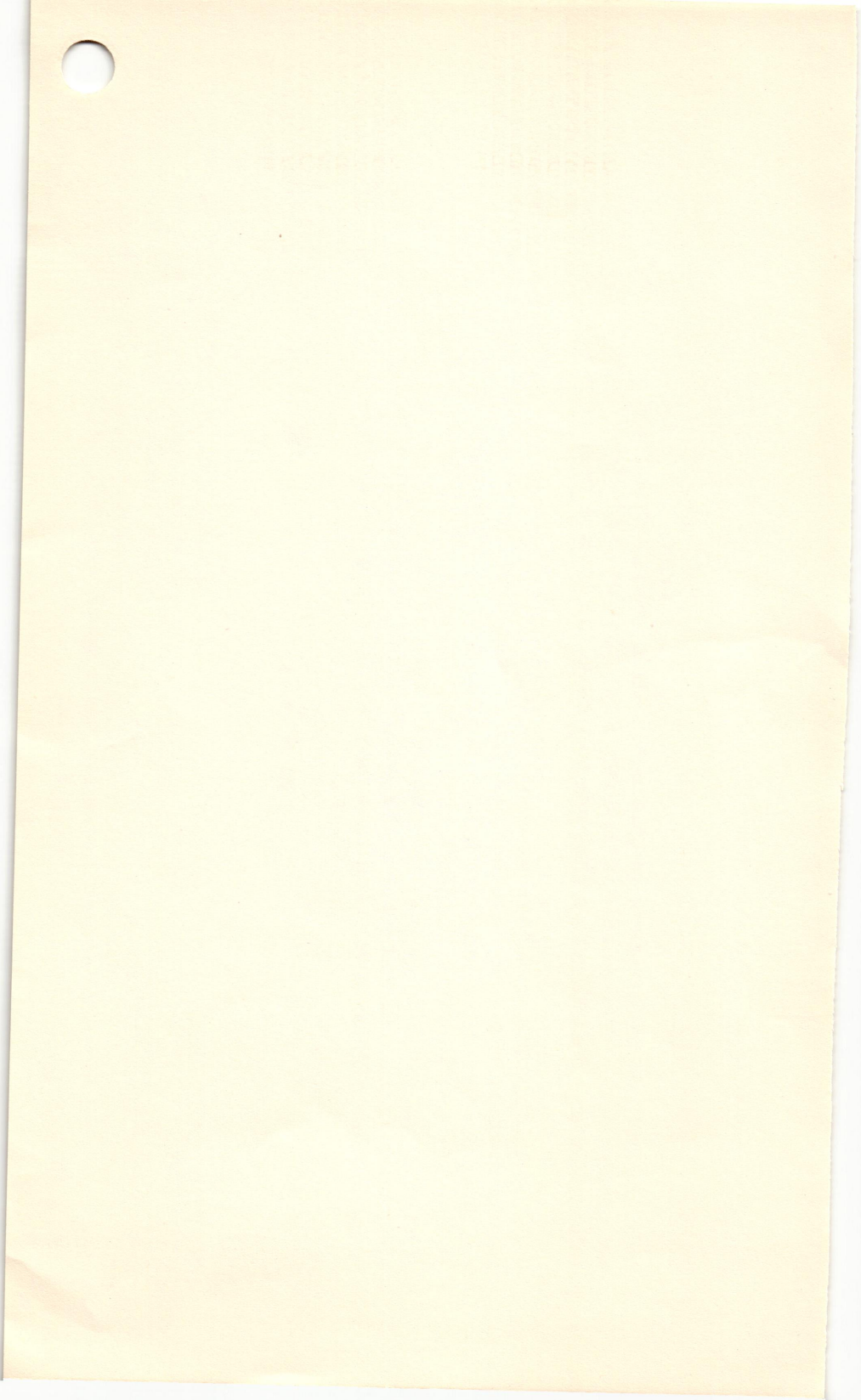
It is very gratifying to know that your Chapter is undertaking the publication of a chapter organ.
