"The Ultimate Amenity, the key to a quality that goes beyond . . . is the full involvement of a talented architect." So says Author Philip Langdon in the September 1984 issue of *The Atlantic Monthly* in a 28-page article on current building in America. Talented architects in the AIA have always known that! But it is nice to see it in print, nonetheless. And those of us in the Western Michigan Chapter/AIA have the chance in the months ahead to be as fully involved as our talents and interests allow — through committees formed by WMC/AIA earlier this year — in several cities in Western Michigan.

Charrette '84: Benton Harbor "On Target" is planned by the Chapter for the week-end of October 12, 13, 14. Modeled generally upon the successful charrette held in Kalamazoo several years ago in conjunction with the MSA Convention, Charrette '84 is aimed at giving opportunity to WMC/AIA architects from all 11 countries of our Chapter to voluntarily assist the City of Benton Harbor in its development. Architects from the Chapter area will be co-leaders of the various teams

developing and presenting concepts and ideas appropriate to Benton Harbor; it is planned that Charrette '84 will focus attention on Benton Harbor's historic past, her rich natural physical resources, the beauty of the area and potentials for the future. It is believed that in the years ahead Western Michigan Chapter/AIA can be seen as having made a significant contribution to the development of Benton Harbor. The 1984 WMC/AIA Annual Meeting will be held in conjunction with Charrette '84 in Benton Harbor; speakers will include Dr. Walter Browe, President, Lake Michigan College, local historian Harold Atwood, speakers from the Chamber of Commerce, the City of Benton Harbor, a local church group, and Jeff Butzbach, CPA, who will give a presentation on rehabilitation tax credits. Following the charrette it is planned that a report will be prepared of the results of the work and presented to the City of Benton Harbor as well as to all participants and sponsors. The WMC/AIA Urban Design Assistance Team/Benton Harbor Area/1984 committee has made the arrangements for Charrette '84; Christopher Brooks, AIA, is Chairman of this committee.

"Ultimate Amenity" envisioned for Benton Harbor is envisioned also for Kalamazoo, and WMC/AIA members are working on it. Nelson Nave, AIA, is Chairman of the WMC/AIA Urban Design Assistance Team/Kalamazoo Area/1984; a priority is the revision of current plans for two rail overpass bridges which fly in the face of good planning for downtown Kalamazoo. To preclude an irreversible planning error the committee aims to inform and through the work of "talented architects" "fully involved" to insure "ultimate amenities" for Kalamazoo which are not now envisioned by present administrators and present commissioners.

Kalamazoo architect Richard Schramm, AIA, is 1984 Chairman of WMC/AIA Energy Committee and is organizing architectural presentations by members of the Chapter for Kalamazoo Center. The Chairman has called for presentations to be "short, sweet and excellent." And Battle Creek architect Randy Case, AIA, as 1984 Chairman WMC/AIA Historical Preservation Committee, arranged for the showing — in connection with the Marshall, Michigan, twenty-first annual Historic Home Tour — of the WMC/AIA traveling architectural exhibit "Celebration of 125 Years of Architecture in Southwestern Michigan." The exhibit was prepared by members of the Chapter and, in addition to the Marshall showing, has been on exhibit during the past year in Dowagiac, Kalamazoo and St. Joseph; the exhibit is scheduled to move on to both Battle Creek and to Olivet College before it is "retired" to the Kalamazoo Public Museum permanent collection.

ASSOCIATES COLUMN/DC

October is an important month for associates interested in the organization and procedures of the Detroit Chapter and the MSA. On October 11, at 5:30 p.m., at L.I.T. the Detroit Chapter will hold its Annual Meeting. This is an excellent opportunity to voice your concerns regarding Chapter policy and obtain a first hand exposure to the election process. During the MSA Convention at RenCen on October 25 at 8:00 a.m., the associates and *only the associates* are going to nominate from the floor and vote into office an associate member to the MSA

Board of Directors. It is imperative that all associates concerned about their future in the profession attend both of these functions. It is your opportunity to make a difference and take pride in our professional organization.

Of the 29 respondents to the 1984 Associate Member Survey issued last spring, 56 percent are AIA Associate Members. The survey also shows 76 percent are architectural interns, with 52 percent employed by architecture-only firms.

The majority (86 percent) obtained professional degrees between 1979 and 1983, with 14 percent completing school between 1974 and 1978.

Salary range for the average intern, the survey shows, is \$16,000 to \$19,999 although 17 percent earned \$24,000 and above. It is important to note that none of the respondents in that range is employed by an architectural firm.

Less than half of the respondents (44 percent) planned to take the ARE in 1984 and of the remainder, 52 percent will fulfill intern requirements and only one person did not intend to become licensed.

Of association services offered, respondees rank professional development highest, followed by employment referral services, technical advice, periodicals and publication, and fellowship. Library services, legislative activities, insurance and other benefit packages are rated least important.

Volunteer service on committees is low, the survey shows, as only 10.3 percent have served on committees. Although 85 percent of the respondents were not enrolled in the Intern Development Program, the majority felt the AIA could assist most associates with more guidance with respect to the IDP, integrate them into the mainstream of state and local chapters, and provide employment referrals. Copies of the complete survey are available through the Beaubien

House.

By virtue of the opening for an associate on the board of directors at the Chapter and State levels, it appears there is promise for the future. The future begins with your participation at these meetings in October!

In anticipation of associate involvement in this year's annual meeting and MSA Convention, there will not be an office tour this month. Our next tour will be at Harley Ellington Peirce Yee Associates November 8, at 6:30 p.m. For reservations and further information on the tour or activities this month call 965-4100. NEWS FROM UNIV. OF DETROIT

Dean Bruno Leon, FAIA, from the School of Architecture at UD, informs us that UD has received full five year accreditation effective January, 1985. This is the fifth consecutive full accreditation given the School of Architecture since its inception as a separate academic unit at the University of Detroit.

Also, at the 20th Anniversary alumni dinner held last April a special Nautilus Medal was established. This medal is given to individuals who have contributed significantly to the development of the School of Architecture in terms of creativity. It covers three categories: faculty, those associated with the school but not faculty, and alumni or other professionals. The first medals were awarded to the faculty composed of Bob Camblin of Houston, Prof. John Loss of the Univ. of Maryland, Prof. Louis Michel of the Univ. of

Kansas, and Prof. Jerzy Staniszkis of the UD. Another individual, Patricia Martinico, was also awarded a medal for her creative input into the organization and spirit of the school. This July, Pat was also appointed Assistant Dean for Administration of the School of Architecture.

Prof. Jerzy Staniszkis and Dean Bruno Leon also established the first study program in Firenze, Italy. Plans are being formulated to establish this program on a permanent basis with the collaboration of the Governor of the Province of Tuscany. This program is being established as the second European program of the School of Architecture. The other program, which is an exchange program with the Warsaw Polytechnical Univ. in Poland, is the only exchange program in the USA with an Eastern bloc country, and is now entering its fourth year.
