ELEVATOR SAFETY

The Michigan Elevator Safety Board met November 8, 1989 and requested we clarify R408.8639b of the Michigan Elevator Laws and Rules, which reads: "The entrance to the machine room shall be not more than 25 feet from a hoistway door." The interpretation of this rule is as follows: the machine room shall be 25 feet or less walking distance from a hoistway door. 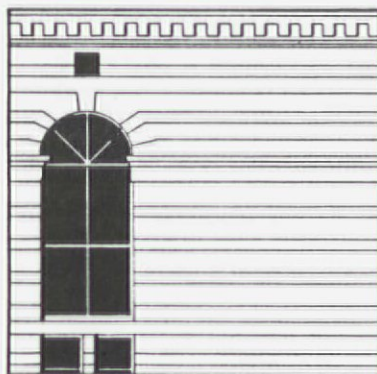

LOUIS G. REDSTONE

*From Israeli Pioneer to
American Architect*

Detroit Chapter member, Louis G. Redstone, FAIA, latest book recalls the experiences of a talented man with many distinguished professional achievements. This autobiography, published by Iowa State University, is more than a personal saga or a story about a long and productive life. Like many others before and since, he came to the U.S. possessing only ideas and energy, and a willingness to work hard.

Redstone begins the story of his life by recalling his days as a six-year old learning the Hebrew alphabet in the city of Grodno, Russia. This image was still clear with him some 35 years later when he received a master's degree in architecture and urban design from Cranbrook Academy of Art. He recalls his early youth in Grodno, the escape to Palestine, and the pioneering work and upbuilding of the state of Israel. There are many recollections of the frustrations and struggles as well as the joys of a young immigrant man adjusting to a new culture in America in the 1920's.
