

With this issue the Missouri Architect completes its first year as the Official Journal of the Missouri State Association of Registered Architects, While it was not a complete year of publication because of being published on a quarterly basis, with the first issue published in May 1953, it does represent the rounding out of the current year. It is hoped to stimulate the amount of Advertising to the extent which would warrant the publication on a monthly basis. This is somewhat problematical but is being pursued consistently. With a circulation of almost 1500 copies each issue, and addressed to those whom we feel should be reached with this publication, it is noteworthy that a great many of our readers are not now reached by any of the nationally circulated magazines covering matters of Architecture and Building.

We mention here a fine Regional Meeting of the American Institute of Architects at Des Moines, Iowa on October 14, 15, 16, which was very well attended, and thoroughly enjoyed by all those attending. Many fine seminars, discussion panels and other programs of interest was participated in by members from all the Chapters. Of particular interest was the buffet luncheon trip to the Art Center. A notable and well executed concept by the Saarinens', as well as the group of dormitories at Drake University; a later development by Eero Saarinen, very nicely handled. The trip with Kenneth Wayne, Resident Architect on this work, was enjoyed. School participation was well handled by Leonard Wolf of Iowa State. Less interesting was the defeat of Missouri by the Iowa State football team, enroute home via radio. Mention here of all the Iowa Chapter, and particularly those who were most active in formulating to interesting a meeting, including some fine luncheons and interesting trips for the attending Ladies.....and "Ruthie"....here words fail me!

Letter from the President

Dear Fellow Architect:

Within the next few days you will receive from our Secretary your application blank for membership in our State Association for 1954. I feel quite confident when you realize that in the short period of less than two years that we now represent approximately two thirds of the registered men throughout the State that you will want to have your name on our roll for 1954. To those you who are already members of our Association, we thank you and sincere trust that you will immediately return your application card for the coming year. It is only through membership and interest that we can function. We are quite proud of the record we have made so far and have more very ambitious plans for the coming year. Please bear in mind that less than two years ago no organization of this kind existed to represent you and to take of your needs. Some of our accomplishments are

- 2 The establishment of this Publication called "The Missouri Architect of which this is the third issue. Do you realize that the mailing list this Publication now includes all the County Superintendents of Schoot throughout the State, the County Officers and many others? Your problems and our problems are going to be aired in this Publication to the extent of informing others of the existence of the architectural profession. Luther Willis of Kansas City acted as Editor for our first two issues of the Publication and now Bob Everitt is acting as Co-chairman with him and they are doing a marvelous piece of work on a man siz job. We want your help, your suggestions, and your cooperation for feel we are really going places in representing you and your profession.
- 3 Another accomplishment of our State Association is the formation of very active Grievance Committee. Bob Elkington of St. Louis is Cheman, Ray Voskamp of Kansas City is Co-chairman. They are off to fine start but they will need the help of all concerned.
- 4 Paul Buchmueller of Sikeston is Chairman of the Publicity Committee Joe Shaughnessy of Kansas City is serving as Chairman of the Membe ship Committee, another big job that is being very well handled.
- One accomplishment of which we are very proud was the creation of Architect's Day last May in Jefferson City. About fifty five or sixty members gave up one day of their time to join in the fellowship of to occasion. It was an opportunity for all to discuss our mutual problet. We also come up with some very definite ideas for the betterment of profession for the coming year. As usual, those who attended got a great deal out of it those who did not, in our opinion, were decided the losers. This is now established as an annual affair and next year is our hope to have five or six hundred for this function. From the enthusiasm that was expressed, I believe we can do it. Do you realize that the Honorable Laurance M. Hyde, Chief Justice of the Missouri Supreme Court thought enough of our organization to serve as main speaker for the luncheon; that Mr. Hubert Wheeler, Commissioner, part of Education of Missouri, together with Dr. George D. Engleha Director of School Building Services, Division of Public Schools, ga

up an afternoon of their time to conduct a forum on school planning. These men were so highly pleased with the program that we had offered that they attended the dinner that evening as our guests and The Honorable Phil M. Donnelly, Governor of Missouri, was our very special guest for that evening. We feel that we have made some very important strides in bringing our profession to the attention of the public on a state wide basis.

We have quite an extensive educational program that we hope to conduct next year mainly through the medium of The Missouri Architect. Some of them are as follows -

- (a) The aims and objects of your State Association.
- (b) Creating interests and incentive for the architects in training so that they will feel they have a part in this group.
- (c) Pertinent explanations relative to the Registration Act. In fact, through The Missouri Architect you will be informed as to what is going on in your profession throughout the State. We feel it has a very definite need but it also requires your support.

When you receive your 1954 membership application, may we also ask that you return it promptly together with your check in the self-addressed envelop. We feel that the dues are exceptionally low and that this amount is very little to ask for you to contribute to your profession. Please bear in mind that the men that are trying to keep this State Association going are contributing very much more, not only in time, but in money. We receive absolutely no reimbursement and when you receive your membership card, analyze the amount of work that went into its make-up on the part of our Secretary - then multiply this by a thousand. His salary so far for doing this job for the past two years has been zero as it probably will remain for some time to come. Your Officers and Directors are meeting every two months and giving up at least a full day of their time plus considerable pocket money to drive to either Jefferson City, St. Louis or Kansas City. Are we asking too much of you in the way of dues? I feel that orchids are due to two of our committee chairmen. After having served as Directors for a year, they then have been paying their way to attend our meetings to help organize committe work. refer to Bob Elkington and Paul Buchmueller. Incidentally, Paul Buchmueller caught the two A.M. train to Jefferson City and was on time for our Officers Meeting in Jefferson City. He then had to wait over until six o'clock to get the train back from Jefferson City to St. Louis and thence on home to Sikeston. I don't know when he got home but would appear to me that he put in about a thirty hour day to help all of us have a better State Association. Again - are we asking too much for your help and cooperation in joining our Association?

Some of the things that I believe it would be well to instill in ourselves for the coming year is contained in the following excerpts from an address given by Second Vice-President of the Institute, Mr. Howard Eichenbaum, at Alexandria, Louisana on April 18, 1953 -

"The years have proved that we are too prone to fall into a lethargy and contentment with ourselves and our past achievements."

"At present, as in the past few years, we are enjoying a prosperity very similar to that period of the 1920's just before the crash in '29."

"What can we as architects do to improve our services to the client and the general public?"

"I am hoping to stimulate our thinking toward giving our clients a more complete service."

"We are embarking on a costly public-relations program, but one bad job by one architect (and by bad job I don't mean poor design, I mean incompetent practice) -- one bad job, and all the public-relations money or program cannot repair the damage in the community where it occurs."

"I am fearful that in our enthusiasm for new design and keen appreciation of the esthetics we have overlooked the backbone of the architectural profession--working drawings and specifications."

"If we always keep Service as our watchword, I have no fear for the future. But if we begin to make architectural service a commodity and submit our services to barter and the Midway selling of the barker, I am fearful we may join the ranks of those extinct but once proud carriage makers."

There is a great deal of food for thought in the above.

Violations Procedure

Procedure to be followed by members in reporting violations of the State Registration Law.

This procedure has been suggested by the State Board of Registration for Architects and Engineers. The Missouri State Association of Registered Architects is in full agreement with it and will cooperate with the Registration Board in its implementation.

Preliminary reports of suspected violations of the Law are to be made directly to the Registration Board, Box 184, Jefferson City or to the Co-Chairman of the Grievance Committee of the Association, currently Bob Elkington or Ray Voskamp. The Registration Board will look into all reported violations, whe ther the report is anonymous or not. In cases where a preliminary survey indicates substance to the report and the desirability of further inquiry, the Registration Board will ask the Grievance Committee of both the Architects and Engineers State Associations for a list of men qualified to assist in this investigation. The Board will then appoint a preliminary inquiry committee consisting (in the case of an Architect) of two Architects and one Engineer, and (in the case of an Engineer) two Engineers and one Architect. The man under survey will be advised by the Board of the appointment of this commit tee and will be requested to meet with them and provide the information requested. The Inquiry Committee is to make a report to the Registration

Board and the Grievance Committee of the State Association. If the Inquiry Committee or the Grievance Committee believes such action justified, actual formal charges, properly sworn to, will be filed by one of the members of one of these committees. The Registration Board will then conduct the formal trial of the case.

It is believed this procedure will accomplish the desired results in the best possible way, since it will:

- (a) Prevent any publicity to the charges until they are formally filed.
- (b) Correct many unethical practices quietly and unobtrusively.
- (c) Relieve any individual of liability for malicious charges.
- (d) Assist the Registration Board in the administration of the Law.

Each registered architect should consider himself a committee of one to do everything possible to continually improve the practices of the profession.



"Nova"

Astronomers refer to a new Star as a "Nova" and Ye Ed wishes to announce a "NOVA" in the professional Associations. We of the Founders Group hope that it will be indeed an outstanding "Star" in its service to the Profession of Architecture and the Allied Arts. A great amount of work has gone into the perfecting of by-laws, and aims and ideals, in arriving at the organization of "The National Association of Registered Architects" which had its beginning as follows: The first letter received by the Association, and addressed to its President Harold A. Casey was sent by car from Jefferson City, Mo. to Moberly, Mo. thence by Wabash R. R. to Des Moines, Iowa where it was delivered to President Casey twelve hours later. Preceeding the sending of this letter, which was the Official notice that the National Association of Registered Architects was now a Benevolent Corporation and a non-profit Institution for the advancement of the Architectural Profession and the Allied Arts, herewith is a resume of what transpired before;

After about a year of preliminary work in establishing the groundwork for the National Association of Registered Architects, the Court Order for its Incorporation was given on Columbus Day, October 12th, 1953. The Charter was filed with the Recorder of Deeds of Cole County, Missouri on Oct. 13th., 1953 and the Charter was granted on October 14th., 1953. President Casey received the before mentioned letter Friday evening October 16th., 1953 at 11:05 P.M. It may be of interest that all the Architects concerned in the organization of this Society for service to the entire Profession have served and will continue to serve without recompense of any sort until the expiration of their respective terms. No director of the aforesaid Association will receive compensation either for time spent, or trips to and from whatever meetings have been, or will be held, in perfecting the plans for service to the Profession.

A very fine meeting at Des Moines, Iowa, after one of the evening sessions of the Regional meeting of the American Institute of Architects, was well attended by members of the Missiour State Association of Registered Architects. The meeting was somewhat informal, and several guests were invited to attend. The hour being late not much time was given to Association matters, but President Casey did announce the Incorporation of the new National Association of Registered Architects, which has been in process of becoming a Corporate entity for some time, as mentioned above. The Founders Group of this Association are looking forward to great things to be accomplished under the by-laws, ideals, and fresh approach to a great many matters which should concern all Architects, at the Registration Level. The Association will in no way compete with The American Institute of Architects, as representative of the great mass of practising Architects, but will instead, help to work out many of the problems confronting the Profession at the Registration level, and thus in a sense augment the very fine work done by the Institute along the Professional and Ethical level. The Institute represents the "Honor Society" of the Profession and is the final mark of approval - the Standard to which most of the Profession strive to attain, and to belong to the Institute is the goal of most of the new members completing school. The National Association of Registered Architects hopes to actively supplement the work of the Institute, in matters which do not conflict with the present procedure. Educational and Ethical Standards will be adhered to, insofar as is possible to command them. It is noted here, that one of the first resolutions adopted by the Founders Group for the National Association of Registered Architects was the approval of, and with unanimous vote, the high standards of The Institute and the Administration of its affairs from the beginning, and expressing the

hope of co-operation with the Institute, in the work of the Association, with particular reference to Members and young members being received to the ranks of the Institute where qualified.

AROUND AND ABOUT

Because of a great amount of space devoted to the Roster and to much other pertinent information the Around and About column will be somewhat skimpy. Probably this is all to the good. We should like to mention here the splendid efforts of the entire group which have sponsored the formation of the National Association of Registered Architects. These Architects have spent time and money in many trips to Jefferson City in forming the organization, directing its polich making, by-laws, and completing the tremendous amount of pre-organization work necessary before the Incorporation of such a society could become a reality. Our hats are off to the entire group, and we foresee a long and useful career for this group. A special salute to Senator McCawley for his usual unselfish interest and wise counsel.

An article by our esteemed mentor and guide Senator McCawley will be forthcoming in the next issue. This article will be of interest to all the Profession, and will be entitled "Use of your Seal". We look forward with interest to many other articles which will follow from the pen of Senator McCawley and others.

We note that the Architects of the area will be allowed to display photographs or renderings of their work in the new State Office Building in Jefferson City.
