MEMBER SPOTLIGHT GARY CONGDON, AIA

I am a member of AIA because... It is a badge of honor and demonstrates to the general public that I care about the profession and have dedicated myself to staying abreast of our changing issues.

I graduated from Georgia Tech in 1973 and moved to Las Vegas to start my career. Many people have asked me why and my reply has always been the same. I saw opportunity here and decided I would rather be a small fish in a small bowl, than a small fish in a huge aquarium (ATLANTA). My decision proved to be the right one as I opened my own practice in 1979. I have had the pleasure to work on many different projects ranging from public works, offices, restaurants' churches and industrial. Twenty one years ago I joined Leesak Architects as they expanded into Las Vegas. That was an important move that expanded my practice and capabilities. Today, I am President of the company with 40 employees in two offices. Our current work includes hospitality, restaurants, offices, golf clubhouses, industrial, and military work.

What is the most important thing you have learned? The most important thing I have learned is that Architecture is a group effort. It takes a team of talented people to make a project a success. An architect has to be

a leader and be knowledgeable about all aspects of a building's design.

If you could change one thing about the architectural profession, what would it be? If I could change one thing about our profession, I would allow changes in the laws that would restore Architects as the Master Builders. General contractors have usurped much of our authority and have assumed that role even to the point of taking the lead on design build projects. We, as a profession, have allowed that to happen.

Where will the profession be in the next 5 to 10 years? In the next 5-10 years I believe our profession will become more specialized than today, and I believe we will become more subordinate to contractors. This is an area the AIA needs to address. We are not selling a product, but are providing a service.

Where will you be and what will you be doing in 20 years? Where would I like to be in 20 years? Hopefully I will still be alive and healthy enjoying more golf and sailing.

AIA LAS VEGAS PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE JON SPARER, AIA

OCTOBER IS A SCARY MONTH - BUT NOT WHY YOU THINK

October is a scary month, yes it is the time for ghosts, goblins and skeletons. It is also near our end of the year at AIALV and as we on your board take stock of where we are as a chapter, we are facing some scary facts.

Back in 2004, prior to the big recession, our AIA Las Vegas Chapter had 646 members. This included 346 Architects, 147 Associate Members and 153 Allied Members. During the recession, our membership dropped to an overall low of 356 members. We lost a lot of members for a variety of obvious reasons; including architects leaving the state, losing jobs and not maintaining membership. All understandable. Fortunately, our chapter had sufficient funds in our accounts to 'ride out the storm'. This was possible because our Las Vegas chapter hosted the AIA National Convention in 2005. Hosting the National Convention is a huge commitment and responsibility, but if done successfully, can be very profitable. The Las Vegas AIA National Convention was a huge success! Our chapter was able to generate and save some very good income for a rainy day. That nest egg has sustained our chapter for the years during and since

the great recession.

The good news is that we have weathered the recession and now the town is busy again. No matter which side of town you look, there are new buildings going up......I for one, am so glad to see all the construction all along the I-215 corridor as well as throughout the town. The Nevada State Board of Architecture, Interior Design and Residential Design has been adding licensed designers to our roles consistently every month, and designers are moving back to town because we have always been a great city to live, work and play.

As I said, this is the good news.....the bad news is that our current membership numbers have not come back to pre-recession membership numbers. Our current members include 252 Architects, 86 Associate Members and 110 Allied Members. As you can see these numbers are still 7% lower than before the recession.

This truth is especially frustrating for us on the board because at our Strategic Planning Retreat in December of 2015, we identified and declared one of our goals in our 2015-2020 Strategic Plan to be: "To increase membership by 75% by 2020". This equates as an increase to our membership to 788 members by 2020.

Since you are reading this, I assume that you are AIA members and I thank you for your commitment to our chapter and our profession. What can you do to help us achieve this goal of 788 members by 2020? I am glad you asked.

You are the best ambassadors for our chapter. Talk to your friends, colleagues and peers about why you are members. Do you attend our meetings?..... invite them to join you. Did you participate or attend the CANstruction?.....tell others about that really fun and worthy event. Have you ever attended





AIA NEVADA EXCELLENCE IN DESIGN AWARDS CALL FOR ENTRIES

The AIA Nevada Excellence in Design Awards program is open to all AIA Nevada members who are licensed in the state of Nevada for projects located anywhere in the world, and to AIA members from other states who are licensed in Nevada for projects located in Nevada.

Submittal Categories:

- **Built Architecture** Any project that has been completed since January 1, 2013, including commercial, pubic works, residential, hospitality, interior architecture and all completed projects of any kind.
- **Unbuilt Architecture** Projects that have been commissioned or projects designed as a part of a competition but have not yet been built or may never be built.
- Collaborative Achievement Projects that were conceived, designed and constructed by a collaborative team and that demonstrate the teamwork and cooperation required for the successful execution of excellence in design.



2018 AIA NEVADA DUES INCREASE

The primary focus of our state Chapter, AIA Nevada, is legislative advocacy, which includes monitoring and taking action on legislative issues and working closely with our lobbyist, Mike Hillerby (Kaempfer Crowell). The state Chapter also represents all members in Nevada at regional and national conferences and business meetings. And, the Chapter works with the NSBAIDRD to provide C.E. programs that allow AIA members to achieve the credits they need in order to maintain their license in Nevada and other states. Income sources for AIA Nevada are limited, with only dues income from architects being the major revenue for the Chapter. (Associate and Allied Members do not pay dues on the state level.)

This year, due to decreased membership, AIA Nevada is anticipating a deficit of approximately \$7,000 at the end of the year. The Chapter simply cannot generate enough dues income to offset the cost of operations and services.

In 2013 AIA Nevada Dues were \$200.00 per architect member. In 2014, the Nevada Executive Committee voted to reduce services provided through the state Chapter and also reduced the dues amount to \$120.00 per architect member. The \$80.00 difference was reallocated to the local Chapters, AIA Northern Nevada and AIA Las Vegas. Each year since that time, AIA Nevada struggles to generate enough revenue to cover operations costs. This year with the projected shortfall of \$7,000.00, the AIA Nevada Executive Committee voted to increase the state dues from \$120.00 per architect member to \$150.00 per architect member.






PROTECT YOUR LICENSE

I spent four days the second week of September in Boise, Idaho at the Council of Landscape Architecture Registration Boards (CLARB) annual meeting. I attended the CLARRB meting because I am a member of the Nevada State Board of Landscape Architects where we oversee the licensing of landscape architects in Nevada. The focus of our meetings was on the protection of licensure across the nation. There

is a move among legislatures to deregulate licensing boards. One of the main bills being introduced, especially in the west, is the Right To Work bill... This bill was introduced at the 2016 Nevada Legislature but never made it out of committee. The bill will come back in the 2019 session... The basic premise of the bill is that you cannot prevent someone from earning a living. Board regulation and licensing is viewed as a deterrent to earn a living because of the years of education, experience and costs that are required to obiain a license. This is not specific to landscape architects. The Department of Labor is currently evaluating 32 occupational boards in 55 states and territories from designers to realtors to medical professionals.

One legislator was asked how the landscape architecture profession would be regulated if there was no board of licensing. His response was, "Let them use YELP." This shows the ignorance that many have about landscape architects. The focus of landscape architecture licensing is to protect the health, safely and welfare of the public who use professionally designed landscape spaces every day...whether they realize it or not. Many of you are licensed and governed by a regulatory board. Become aware, get involved, help educate and protect public heath, safety and welfare by protecting your license.. You worked very hard for it.






