The American Institute of Architects may bestow a fellowship for achievement in architecture on members who have notably contributed to the advancement of the profession through outstanding accomplishments in one or more areas of design, science of construction, literature, education, service to the profession, public service, historic preservation, research, urban design, government, industry, or architectural practice.

A fellowship in the American Institute of Architects is so distinctive an honor that its bestowal is a serious responsibility. For this reason, the Institute requires that the achievements of each nominee for the honor be carefully considered by the nominators and by the Jury of Fellows which awards the honor. The nomination for advancement to fellowship is made by members who know the nominee well. The Jury of Fellows, consisting of six distinguished members of the Institute, studies and evaluates the achievements of each nominee under consideration. The Jury is not permitted to deny an advancement until the denial has been voted upon at three separate annual meetings.

The Jury of Fellows may obtain its own evidence of the standing and achievements of a nominee, by written communication or otherwise. The Jury must rely largely on the representations made to it by members who have had close association with the nominee. For that reason, the greater responsibility for merited advancement lies with the nominators, sponsor, and references of the nominee. The nominators should feel certain that the nominee's achievements have sufficient distinction to make them notable contributions to the advancement of the profession.

### **WSA-AIA State Organization**

The Wisconsin Society of Architects of the American Institute of Architects (WSA) with over 650 members is the state component of the national organization representing architects and related professionals in the state of Wisconsin. Members from private firms, corporations, industry, government, and education join together to maintain and represent excellence in architecture, the profession and to the public. This is accomplished through the many programs the WSA offers its members.

WSA membership offers many different opportunities for education and career development. The WSA is striving to help in advancing each individual's architectural skills, professional understanding and career opportunities.

With offices located in Madison, WSA is directed by an Executive Committee which sets priorities of the organization and initiates new programs. The Executive Committee consists of 17 representatives from the state's four local chapters. The president and vice-president of each chapter automatically are members of the Executive Committee. Five Directors-At-Large are elected by the state membership from the local



chapters through an at-large election. The four primary officers of the Executive Committee are selected by the Executive Committee itself — from the membership roster of the WSA.

There are in excess of 45 standing commissions, committees, and short-term tasks force which recommend and execute policies, plans and produce programs. Membership on these state groups is drawn from the WSA membership.

When professional architectural expertise is needed by national, state, or local government bodies, members are nominated from the WSA to serve on such committees.

A full time staff headed by an Executive Director, located in Madison, handles day to day operations and is available to all Wisconsin members as a liaison to the AIA and as an information center.

The WSA is composed of four chapters, each having its own Executive Committee and accompanying committees and programs pertinent to its part of Wisconsin and its communities. Emphasis of the chapters is on participation and special events tailored to their needs through local meetings and seminars. All members have the opportunity to affect the direction of their profession and produce progress in many areas.

# What is the American Institute of Architects?



The American Institute of Architects (AIA) is the national professional society of the architectural profession in the United States. It has over 36,000 members who are licensed architects.

The AIA's national headquarters and staff are located in Washington, D.C. It has 50 regions and 250 component chapters across the nation, and a number of Women's Architectural Leagues. Student chapters are active at many colleges and universities.

The professional society has three major missions:

- to maintain and improve the competence of today's practitioners,
- to create a sufficient supply of well-trained practitioners for tomorrow, and
- to represent the Institute before professional and industry groups, government, and the public so that good design is encouraged by law and demanded by the community.

Institute programs are financed through members' dues and include a continuing concern with architectural design, structure, and materials; business and production aspects of architectural practice; architectural education and research; urban design; public affairs; governmental affairs; inter-professional and industry relations; and other subjects of interest and importance to the AIA's membership and to the public.

The AIA's programs and activities are guided by its officers, directors, committees, and members, and are carried out by its members and staff at the national, regional, and local levels.

### THE AIA'S BEGINNINGS

The American Institute of Architects was founded in 1857 by a

small group of architects who met in New York City, in a building near Trinity Church on Broadway, to explore ways of improving their profession.

They had much to do. By all accounts, architecture was at a low ebb, and really did not exist as a profession in this country. Until the middle of the 19th century, according to one writer, architecture in the United States was "the trade of carpenter-builders and the game of gentlemen-amateurs".

The architects who met near Trinity Church wanted to improve their public status and do something about the unbridled competition between architects which then prevailed. The result of their meeting was a resolution to form a professional society. Richard Upjohn, architect of Trinity Church, was elected president of the new organization.

Raising the ethics, standards and competence of the architectural profession was no easy task for the founders of the Institute. There were no architectural schools and few books. Adult education for young practitioners was unknown. But, the new organization overcame these problems one by one, and soon the AIA was issuing technical publications. It later added standard documents on such important matters as contracts and owner-architect agreements. In 1913, the first issue of The AIA Journal was published.

In 1899, the AIA moved to Washington, D.C., occupying the historic Octagon House, which it subsequently purchased. Built starting in 1798 and completed in 1800, the Octagon served as the temporary White House after the British burned the presidential mansion in the War of 1812. The Octagon was the AIA's national office until after World War II when the Institute moved

to a new headquarters building behind the Octagon House. The Octagon was then opened to the public and has since been designated a National Historic Landmark.

In 1969, additional restoration was undertaken.

### THE AIA TODAY

Membership in the AIA is open to every licensed architect who is a citizen of the United States and can satisfy his local AIA chapter and the Institute's Committee on Membership that he has the necessary professional qualifications.

The Institute is vitally concerned with architectural education and training. Professional schooling of architects begins with five or six years of study in an accredited school or college of architecture. Then, three years of internship in an architect's office are required. It is now mandatory that architects take rigorous written examinations to be licensed or registered to practice in all states and territories. The National Council of Architectural Registration Boards serves as a clearing house for state licensing boards in this regard. In 1940. the AIA helped to organize the National Architectural Accrediting Board. Today, there are 63 schools of architecture in the United States accredited by Most architectural NAAB. schools have AIA student chapters. There is close cooperation between the AIA and the faculties of the colleges and schools which are members of the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture.

Members of the Institute may be recognized by the use of the letters "AIA" after their names. The letters "FAIA" after an architect's name signify that he is a Fellow of the AIA, an honor bestowed for achievement.

## 1981 DIRECTORY OF ARCHITECTURAL FIRMS



#### INTRODUCTION

If you are contemplating the construction of a building, be it a small porch addition to a home or a multi-million dollar medical school, your first step should be to contact an architect who is the single professional who is equipped through training and experience to guide you through the entire building process. The roster that follows this article has been developed to provide you with an alphabetical listing of architectural firms in Wisconsin who have at least one principal who is a member of the Wisconsin Society of Architects and affiliated with the American Institute of Architects. Only those firms that completed the necessary questionnaire are listed.

In recent years the economics of construction have changed the context with which construction is undertaken. Inflation, high interest rates, fluctuations in labor and materials supplies, and other factors have all increased the cost and complexity of new building construction. Architects, as leaders of the building profession, have responded to these problems with innovative approaches in the delivery of their services. This article attempts to provide an overview of the important features of the three major delivery processes now available in procuring architectural services. It is important to note that the discussions of these different approaches are simplified.

No matter which approach is followed, the owner should draw on an architect's expertise early in the planning process. An architect can help develop the program, define the building requirements, minimize costs, expedite construction, provide innovative design input, and coordinate the entire building process in order to provide the owner with the most economical building in the least amount of time. Architects are also well equipped by training and experience to provide guidance on which project delivery approach is best suited to the project's needs. This choice can be a major factor in determining the cost and quality of the project.

#### DESIGN - BID - BUILD

This is the traditional method used in a vast majority of buildings. The architect is retained to prepare detailed design and construction documents. When the final design and construction documents are approved by the owner, they become the format for soliciting contractor's bids and awarding a construction contract. During the construction process, the architect acts as the owner's agent, administering the construction contract and monitoring the progress and quality of the contractor's work as provided by the contract between the owner and the architect.

This approach has numerous advantages including:

 It is a reasonably straightforward and administratively simple process.

- It maximizes the owner's involvement in decisions pertaining to the project.
- It provides a firm cost figure prior to the beginning of construction.
- During the construction process it insures that the owner's interests are looked after by a knowledgeable professional.
- While there are admittedly numerous variations to this approach, its use is most generally accepted and basic.
- 6) Through the process of time, standard form contracts, procedures, and court decisions have evolved which provide specific guidance to the use of this process.

#### CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT

In its simplest form, Construction Management is a specialty service where the owner pays a fee to a construction manager for managing the project. This service is most often in addition to contracting with an architect. Different versions of Construction Management occur which can provide confusion to those who are new or not familiar with the changing building industry. Some architectural firms include construction management (CM) among their professional services. Others add it only when projects are complex. Either way, in some situations an experienced construc-

tion manager can provide the designer with detailed cost information specific to the project on cost, labor and market conditions, availability and delivery schedules for equipment and materials, and construction technologies. The owner usually contracts with both the architect and the CM, allowing all three parties to work together in a team approach, permitting the owner control in design and construction quality and giving the owner assurance for adherence to budget and time scheduling.

#### **DESIGN-BUILD**

In the two delivery approaches previously discussed, the architect normally maintains its separate identity and its role as the owner's agent. In design-build, this is not the case. Instead, the architect is part of a firm or partnership that both designs and constructs the projects. The intent in this kind of delivery system is that the owner develops a single-point responsibility i.e. a single entity responsible to the owner for design, construction, time scheduling, and a guaranteed maximum price. Since in many instances the design-build entity is required to maintain a guaranteed maximum price in

changing costs markets, the owner's program and control may have to be tailored to enable the design-build team to build and buy at a cost which is within the guaranteed maximum price. One of the primary distinctive characteristics of a design-build approach is that the architect designing the project is a part of the design-build firm, as opposed to the architects traditional responsibilities acting solely as the owner's agent.

#### SELECTING THE BEST APPROACH

Not all of these delivery approaches are suitable for every project. The choice between these approaches, and between the many possible variations to each approach, is best made with the guidance of an architect. The architect's familiarity with local construction practices, market conditions, and the owner's specific requirements, priorities and constraints can provide the best guidance regarding the delivery approach to be used.

In working with your architect multiple variables will be identified which will determine the best delivery approach. Considerations of cost, occupancy date, design control, construction quality, financing, etc. all should be taken into account in determining with your architect the best approach for the project.

We encourage your review of the following roster to provide you with architectural firms who should be contacted in the early stages of planning in order to assist you with some of these decisions. The itemization of services shown on the attached roster reflects recent work. A particular firm may offer professional services in other fields which have not been listed by virtue of their education, experience and staff. # SUMMARY: HOW TO GET FEDERAL WORK

The Federal law requires that for every A/E project with fees in excess of \$10,000, a notice must be advertised under Section "R" in the Commerce Business Daily (CBD), published by the U.S. Department of Commerce and obtainable by writing the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402, Tel. 202 - 783-3238.

For almost every project two Standard Forms (S.F. 254 Architect/Engineer and Related Services Questionnaire and S.F. 255 Architect/Engineer and Related Services Questionnaire for a Specific Project) must be submitted.

The S.F. 254 can be submitted on an annual basis, once to each Federal agency office. These agencies maintain an active file for each submitting, firm and will "pull" the S.F. 254 when you respond to a specific project announcement.







# Getting Into Architecture

If you're reading this section, you're already pretty sure you want to be an architect.

If you know that much, there is probably a lot more you want to know. It all boils down to one question: What are you letting yourself in for?

The quick answer is hard work, long hours, a fair amount of frustration, and — if you can get it all together — real satisfaction. Because with the right mix of talents and personality, there can be no satisfaction quite like the satisfaction of coming up with a beautiful solution for a complex problem.

That's what architecture really is — creative problem-solving. The problems involve a lot of complicated input. — physical and psychological needs of the user, legal and economic constraints, practical and aesthetic considerations. Developing a design solution that meets all those needs as well as the essential challenge to the architect.

Architecture offers career opportunities across the board — for men, women, whites, minorities, there aren't any barriers to the person with ability and determination. (Many schools of architecture are making special efforts to recruit women and members of minorities, and a lot of firms are particularly eager to hire female and minority graduates.) And the field includes both professional roles for full-fledged architects, which we'll discuss in a moment, and para-professional specialties for individuals who qualify as architectural technicians.

Technicians are becoming more and more important to the profession. They perform such tasks as writing specifications, estimating costs, building presentation models, operating computers.

Preparing for a technician role usually involves a two-year program, offered in various forms by community colleges and other schools around the country. Entrance requirements, curricula and other details vary from state to state and school to school, so check them out locally.

For more information, you might want to read a pamphlet called "A Program for Architectural Technicians' Training," put out by the AIA Department of Education and Research.

If you want to go the professional route, however, you need to know what's involved: What does it take to be an architect?

The thing that will define you as a professional architect is a registration certificate, which allows you to practice the profession legally in the state or states where you are registered.

Your registration certificate tells the world that you completed architectural school and spent important time as an intern-architect (or gained an equivalent education by spending more years on the job), and then passed a stiff comprehensive exam designed to measure your professional judgment and ability. Because your work as an architect will directly affect the public health, safety, and welfare, your registration is a necessary assurance that you have the ability and knowledge required to practice the profession responsibly.

### AFTER REGISTRATION, WHAT?

Most people picture an architect at a drawing board, drawing. Many architects do draw, at least part of the time. But even those architects who are deeply involved in building design must spend some of their time away from the drawing board. And the higher the architect rises in the firm, or the larger the firm grows, the more time the architect spends making presentations, dealing with clients, picking the best way through the intricacies of budgets and building codes and coordinating and managing the work of others.

As a profession, architecture offers a multitude of possibilities. Architects can be found working for government agencies, institutions, and corporations where they coordinate the work of other architects and manage sizeable building programs. They can be found working in real estate development and construction management, or putting their experience and ability to work in volunteer programs like ACTION or many Community Design Centers in American cities.

Many architects will tend to specialize in a particular type of building or a particular aspect of architecture; some will build entire careers on such specialties. Others discover they would rather teach architecture than practice; or they may combine the two; some move into architectural research or history. And with the arrival of the computer, many architects have found a whole new area open to them.

#### **GETTING THERE**

Nobody ever said it was easy to become an architect. It takes several years of study in a college or university offering a professional program in architecture; a period of internship during which you build professional judgment by dealing with real, as opposed to academic, problems; and that rigorous registration examination mentioned earlier. If you're in high school now, it's not too early to start preparing; if you've already finished college, it's not too late.

#### HIGH SCHOOL

If you are in high school, this is the time to do the groundwork. To get ready for studying architecture in college, you'll want to spend time on the basics — communications, mathematics, social sciences and scientific reasoning (physics and chemistry courses are good). On top of that, keep in mind that your college years are going to be filled with design and technical courses; it's a good idea to

get in as many humanities courses—languages, history and the like—as you can during high school. If you can, try and work in elective courses in art and business. You might even take a drafting course, but be careful with this one. Most high school drafting courses are brief technical courses providing you with a beginner's skill on the boards and not much more. Don't get the idea that drafting is architecture. At times drafting can be dull, but it is only a tool that architects use.

You can also use your summer vacations to good advantage. Try to land a job related to the practice of architecture or the construction of buildings, even if it's just a slot in the mailroom of an architectural firm or a job on a construction site. Your aim, of course, is to learn something about the profession of architecture and the building of buildings, and seeing it close up—maybe even getting your hands dirty in construction—is a good way to do that. And in the bargain, you may be able to pick up some useful experience.

### CHECKING OUT SCHOOLS OF ARCHITECTURE

While you're at it, start checking out architectural schools. There are about a hundred of them in the U.S. and Canada, and choosing the one best suited for you is going to take a little doing. You'll want to consider each school's emphasis, the specific architectural program it offers, its location, cost and the availability of financial assistance, the resources of the school as related to your interests, and — might as well be realistic about it — your chances of being accepted.

There is some help available. A list of accredited schools of architecture is available from the American Institute of Architects or the National Architectural Accrediting Board. These accredited schools offer established and well-regarded programs that

make applying for registration just that much easier. Catalogs from the schools can give you a good idea of educational philosophies, programs, and admission policies. Visits to schools you consider the best help fill out the picture. And you'll want to talk to friends, recent architectural graduates, and practicing architects; they'll have some good advice.

The Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture publishes a number of documents you will probably find useful. Among them is a book entitled Architectural Schools of North America, which has a statistical review of ACSA member-schools - including all the accredited schools plus others, many of which are new and won't be eligible for accreditation until they graduate a class. Incidentally, that first class will be considered as accredited. The book outlines the types of programs the schools offer, their enrollments, tuitions and the general approach of each school.

It's important to know how a school approaches architecture, because you need to find a school that matches your particular aims. And don't worry if you can't decide on anything more specific than wanting to be an architect. Many schools have quite flexible programs, and you can discover the options and make the choices as you go along.

Getting into the architectural school of your choice depends on your basic intelligence and your interests in and out of school. Admissions officers look at your whole record and try to judge the chances of your success in architectural school. Very few architectural schools are legally required to accept anyone who qualifies for college entrance; nearly all are quite selective. Many do require College Boards Scholastic Aptitude Tests; but so far there doesn't seem to be a really effective aptitude test specifically for architecture.

### STARTING YOUR PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

Although each school of architecture has a different special curriculum thrust, most of the basics are similar. Since the core of architecture is that complex design and problem-solving process, the core of most architectural curricula is a continuous series of design courses, or studios. You'll have one of these studios nearly every semester you're in architectural school, and because you're learning about other facets of architecture and design as the years go by, and since you put it all together in the design process, each design studio is generally more complicated than the one preceding it. You'll begin with small individual building design projects and end up handling large-scale single- or multibuilding complexes in dense urban situations. Some of the other subjects you'll probably be studying (either as courses or integrated in design studios) are structural systems (principally heating, cooling, and mechanical systems), architectural history and theory, basic design and graphics, freehand drawing, architectural materials, professional practice techniques and processes, contract law, site planning and urban design. You might take elective courses in landscape and botany, city planning, psychology and sociology, computer applications, business, and so on and on.

The schools are all structured somewhat differently, too, although most fall generally into two different formats.

One is the traditional five-year program leading to a Bachelor of Architecture as the first professional degree. In these schools, you enter the architecture program directly and work your way through a curriculum which is typically structured, yet has a degree of flexibility to allow elective courses. In some schools there might be two or three (or more) basic "paths" through the curriculum, allowing you to focus

on a particular design, technology or management-oriented facet of architecture. The five-year programs generally relate directly to today's expanded practice roles, and if that's what you know and want, the five-year program is the most direct way of getting there.

The other basic format is a six-year program leading to a Master of Architecture as the first professional degree. This is popular with a lot of students because of its greater flexibility and wider range of options. It is particularly good for entering students who might not be certain they want a career in architecture, but who want to find out what it's like while checking out other possibilities.

What makes this possible is the way most six-year programs are set up. They generally conform to a 2+2+2 format, in which the first two years are devoted to general university requirements and introductory architectural courses. The second two years provide a fundamental grounding in architecture and, usually, an appropriate exposure to related environmental design fields. At the end of four years, most schools award a non-professional bachelor's degree in art, science, or environmental design. The final two graduate years usually allow a wide variety of in-depth options, some oriented toward professional activity, others toward research. In some progressive schools, you can pretty much design your own program. You may want to fully develop skills that will make you immediately useful in architectural practice. Most students take this approach, but a growing number are in joint degree programs and research programs relating architecture to other fields. This kind of specialization is leading to a new breed of architects involved in a broad range of multidisciplinary professional activities.

Most six-year programs are flexible enough to allow students to transfer in at various points. Most transfer stu-

dents are junior- and community-college graduates entering at the third year level, occasionally with a few credit deficiencies which need to be made up. Some, however, are students who have a bachelor's degree in another field. They can enter at the graduate level, but usually have a substantial number of deficiencies which may mean an extra year or more of study. For these students, the extra time usually doesn't matter; they have decided they want a career in architecture no matter what it takes. If you're such a special case, you'll have to write to the schools that interest you to find out just how they can help you put together a course of study which will give you a first-rate architectural education.

Combining architectural study with the college work you have done if you already have a bachelor's degree can lead to some interesting combinations and some interesting careers. Think of the possibilities in a combination of business administration and architecture, or sociology and architecture, or psychology and architecture. Some colleges and universities have set up programs that make just such combinations possible.

While you are in school, you will find it valuable to join the local chapter of the Associated Student Chapters of the AIA. This is a good way to broaden your architectural knowledge by sharing information and ideas with your peers, and by joining them in seminars, lectures, and workshops. It's also fun.

#### INTERNSHIP

Your five or six years in architectural school will earn you a professional degree in architecture, usually a Bachelor of Architecture or a Master of Architecture degree. And then you'll find out just why graduation is also referred to as commencement. No matter how long and hard you feel you have worked, you're only just beginning. You still have up to three years

of internship between you and the registration exam.

This period of internship is important. It's important because it is required for taking the registration exam, but also to give you a chance to gain realworld experience and develop the judgment and sense of responsibility that is the mark of a professional of any kind. Through internship, you will have the opportunity to develop that important habit of continued learning. For an architect, learning must be a lifelong process which does not stop at the end of the formal education period. You will also be able to round out and expand knowledge relevant to the practice of architecture.

Professionals are currently working on ways to improve this internship period and thus give you a further boost toward your objective of becoming a highly skilled and capable architect. A new internship program being designed will make it possible for you to have direct access to the best possible advice and continuing education resources the profession has to offer while you're in the internship years.

As an intern-architect in this new program, you'll be responsible for making your own decisions about your career objectives and your related strengths and weaknesses. The new program will mean you will be able to concentrate on converting your weaknesses to strengths through a combination of on-the-job learning, continuing education, and other professional development activity.

All of these experiences, together with those acquired during your formal education period, will be recorded in a development record which you will maintain throughout this entire period. Principally, the development record will serve as a guide for you, as you make your own choices and decisions in acquiring the exposures and experiences in nearly all aspects of the practice of architecture. At the end of internship, the portfolio will aid greatly

when you are being considered by a registration board for examination and licensure.

And along the way, your "professional advisor" (who will be assigned to help you through your internship years) will help you evaluate your portfolio and tell you what's missing. Your advisor will also give you advice on overall career options, immediate job opportunities, continuing education and other available learning opportunities, and anything else you feel you need. This includes advice on preparing for the licensing exam. The preparation is your responsibility, and it involves getting as much experience as possible, filling in gaps or correcting your weaknesses by taking formal continuing education courses, plus a good bit of plain old-fashioned cramming as the exam draws near.

You'll hear a lot more about this new internship program in the near future. It might also include the creation of local and national organizations especially for intern-architects, offering strong peer group linkages and additional programs and activities.

### **EXAMINATION**

One thing you will find helpful as you approach the registration exam is a book called the "NCARB Test Guide." Published jointly by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards and Architectural Record Books, this handbook for candidates gives a detailed look at just what the Professional Exam is like.

What it's like, is hard. It's a two-day, four-part exam that is graded by machines; you either pass it or you don't.

With that grim note out of the way, let's look at the exam a little closer. It is a standard exam prepared by NCARB; although the same exam is used in every state, only the state in which you take it can grant your registration. Through NCARB, how-

ever, you can gain reciprocity — that is, you can obtain a license in other states because you had the right preliminary education and experience qualifications and you passed the exam and received the license in the first state. States have reciprocal registration agreements through NCARB. This way you won't spend your entire professional life taking registration exams.

The Professional Registration Exam is not a test of academic knowledge. NCARB assumes you have all that if you have an accredited architectural degree. Instead, the Professional Exam is designed to test your ability to put that knowledge to work and actually make decisions.

The exam is given in four sessions spread over two days, for a total of 16 hours of examination. These sessions cover four specific areas: environmental analysis, building programming, design and technology, and construction. The exam tests your ability to make strategic decisions on major environmental issues or projects; to synthesize basic general knowledge; to exercise environmental value judgment; to understand the architect's responsibilities to the public, the client, and the profession.

There are a few specific eligibility requirements. Applicants for the Professional Exam must be of good character, at least 21 years old, hold an accredited first professional degree in architecture and have three years experience behind them.

There is an additional NCARB examination which precedes the Professional Exam for all others, including everyone from graduates of non-accredited architectural programs to those who have no formal education beyond high school. It is known as the NCARB Equivalency Exam, and unlike the Professional Exam, it is a test of academic knowledge. It is designed to test technical and academic knowledge in the field of architecture which is equivalent to what one would have

learned in architectural school — architectural history, theory and principles of planning; construction theory, structural design, environmental systems; and architectural design and site planning. It is given in three parts over two days in twenty hours of evaluation.

Check with your state architectural registration board for more specific information on which exams you must take and pass before registration can occur.

#### ON TOWARD PRACTICE

So there you are: diploma on one wall, registration certificate on the other, and a large collection of knowledge, ideas and skills ready to be put to work. You've already found out about the hard work and long hours, experienced some of the frustrations, and most important, tasted some of the satisfaction of being an architect.

As a full-fledged professional, you will find it useful to become a corporate member of the AIA. AIA is the professional organization for architects in this country, and it provides its members with a wide range of practice aids, continuing education programs and technical information. AIA membership is a way to keep abreast of current trends, share knowledge and experience with other architects, and help your chosen profession make its voice heard on national, state and local issues.

Although architecture has its good times and bad times as the nation's economy fluctuates, the future is generally good. The statisticians have concluded that the last thirty years of this century will bring as much construction as the world has already seen. And on top of that, graduates, interns and registered architects are moving into so many new ways to use their architectural training, and architecture itself has taken on such a broad meaning, that the profession's long-term prospects are favorable.

### The Brochure: A Checklist

Michael C. McAneny, AIA

The design of a marketing brochure is a continuing concern for most architectural firms. Most find changes in the scope or direction of their work, increasing diversification or specialization of their practice, their need to keep a brochure current and, of course, their costs associated with producing such a sales tool are all major factors which render the brochure an ongoing area of interest.

The following is a checklist of items, in no particular order, which should prevent the omission of an area deemed important in the preparation of a brochure.

- Biographies of Principal(s). Short resumes of the education, honors received, registration, professional experience, etc. of the firm's key personnel.
- 2. Biographies of Staff. Very brief resumes of professional staff, usually limited to educational and registration qualifications.
- 3. Photographs of Principals, Staff or Office. Range from individual photographs of principals to group shots of professional staff, most often with a section of the office in the background.
- 4. History of Firm. Range from brief summaries, citing key events, to lengthy more detailed descriptions of the firm's past experience and organization.
- 5. Client List(s). A list of past or continuing clients, usually limited to company or corporate names in non-residential work. Frequently arranged by specialty or type of client, i.e., commercial, institutional, government, restoration, housing, interiors.
- 6. Prior Client List. A list of clients for whom services were performed before the firm was organized. Usually limited to the experience of principals in prior professional associations.
- 7. Reference List. A list of those persons, most frequently past or continuing clients, who can be counted upon to speak well of the firm's work. Frequently accompanied by the person's company and title.
- 8. Project List(s). A list of projects accomplished by the firm. As with client

lists, frequently arranged by specialty or type. Most listing include the project's location, construction cost and date of completion.

- 9. Photographs of Work. Photographs, predominantly black and white for reasons of cost and the desire to de-emphasize color statements, of all or selected completed projects. Frequently accompanied with descriptive information such as reduced floor plans or sections. Some photographs are printed and bound while others are loose and interchangable.
- 10. Flexible Emphasis. While overall format of brochure remains constant, interchangable project lists and photographs allow brochure to be adapted to the particular interests of a prospective client.
- 11. Specialist Emphasis. Strongly states, through photographs, lists, history, philosophy, etc., that firm specializes in only one type of work. Work areas seen were viomedical, church and interior design.
- 12. Statement of Philosophy. A description, usually brief, of the firm's subjective attitudes towards architecture, shelter, design, client relations, etc.
- 13. Problem-Solution Format. A format incorporating a brief statement of the client's program, the problems it or the site presented, the theoretical solutions developed by the firm and the completed project.
- 14. Developmental Sketches. Preliminary sketches or drawing intended to display the firm's problem solving or conceptual techniques.
- 15. Photographs of Models or Renderings. Predominantly black and white, photographs of models or renderings of work not yet complete or "on the shelf"
- 16. Recent Awards. A list of awards received by the firm such as AlA design awards, Good Neighbor awards, competition awards, etc. Jury comments are frequently included.
- 17. Press Clippings. Reprints or copies of newspaper or magazine articles which favorably publicize the firm or its projects.

- 18. Letters of Commendation. Copies of letters from satisfied clients, public officials, etc., which could influence a prospective client in his selection process.
- **19. Work In-Progress List.** A list and description of projects in pre-construction phases.
- 20. Question and Answer Format. An approach under which the firm answers hypothetical questions posed by a prospective client concerning design philosophy, project management, past project experience, etc.
- 21. Financial Reference. The identification of a party or parties who will vouch for the financial stability of the firm.
- 22. Service Emphasis. An approach which emphasizes basic services rendered, with examples, rather than completed projects.
- 23. Project Flow Chart. A graphic representation of how a typical project progresses through a firm from its inception to its completion.
- 24. Consultant List. A fist of consultants the firm has worked with or regularly employs. Frequently included were structural, mechanical, electrical, civil and site engineers, landscape architects, estimators, acoustical specialists, traffic engineers, food service specialists and library planners.
- 25. Bulletin Approach. Most frequently with larger firms, a form of update which tells of new projects, recent awards, or staff promotions. Typically a mailed supplement to the main brochure.
- 26. Physical Format. None larger than 8½" x 11". Most bound in some manner (i.e., 3-ring, comb, staple). Some were fold-out with pockets for either current or specially directed projects. One contained in a file folder with name of firm printed on tab.





# Wisconsin Architectural Archive Report

by Orval Lilyequist

Since the article about the Wisconsin Architectural Archive appeared in the January 1980 issue of the Wisconsin Architects a number of important events have taken place at the Archive. We should start with the fact that both the Milwaukee Public Library and Mr. Thomas Eschweiler received awards from the Milwaukee Art Commission in appreciation of their contribution in preserving the artistic heritage of the Milwaukee community for their efforts in establishing, promoting and maintaining the Wisconsin Architectural Archive. Not only has the local community expressed its appreciation and interest but the Archive is receiving an increasing number of requests for material from many areas around the country. Some are interested in knowing how we got started and what our techniques are for processing architectural materials: other inquiries have been concerned with particular architects and buildings. Some of these requests have come from as far away as Colorado and Washington, DC.


It is gratifying to report that more and more Wisconsin architects are becoming aware of the Archive and are cooperating with us. The following collections have now been processed to the point where they are ready for use: The Eschweiler Collection, the Dick and Bauer Collection, the Alfred Siewart Collection and the Mark Pfaller, Sr. Collection. Partially processed are: The Kirchoff and Rose Collection,

and the Herbst and Kuenzli Collection. Also in the Archive awaiting processing are collections from Brust and Zimmerman, Roger Sutherland and Maynard Meyer. There has not only been an increase in the number of collections deposited, but an increase in reference use by architects, students and historians. We are also beginning to establish exchange programs with the other archives. The Milwaukee Art Center's Prairie Archives and the Wisconsin Architectural Archive have been exchanging materials which better fit each others collections. We are now in the process of working out a duplicating plan with the Chicago Art Institute for material that each has that might be of interest to the other.

An exciting event scheduled for this November is the meeting of the Midwest Archives Conference in Milwaukee. This group of distinguished archivists, historians and librarians will meet for three days in Milwaukee November 6, 7 and 8. One session will be devoted to architectural archives and Russell Zimmerman and I will appear on that program. Alan K. Lathrop of the Northwest Architectural Archive with the University of Minnesota who was so helpful to us when the Wisconsin Architectural Archive got underway and Mrs. Shirley McArthur of the Milwaukee Northpoint South Historic District will also participate. The meeting itself will be held in the Milwaukee Public Library near the Archive and there will be a

tour of the facility afterwards. The Milwaukee Public Library and the Wisconsin Architectural Archive will also co-sponsor a reception at the library for the conference attendees. To further mark this occasion a number of drawings of Milwaukee motion picture theaters will be featured in a balcony exhibit at the Milwaukee Public Library.

It would be misleading to imply that all is well with the Archive. Candor demands that we also relate some of our problems and these, of course, are financial. It has been explained previously that the Milwaukee Public Library provides only the space for the facility and the services of a student intern. The Wisconsin Architectural Archive Board is responsible for raising funds to support the work of the Archive. It urgently needs the support of all Wisconsin architects and the allied trades in helping raise funds so that the Archive can embark on more ambitious programs of processing collections both in-house and yet to come. Architects, builders, students, preservationists and urban historians have found the Archive extremely useful. It will become even more so when other collections are given and accessed. Processing takes money and while all sources of revenue are being pursued by the Wisconsin Architectural Archive Board, we very much need the expression of financial support of the architectural community so that we can go to others and ask for their support.

# Energy Management Material

Energy conservation check list applicable to industrial, commercial and institutional buildings:

#### LIGHTING

- 1. Turn off lights when not in use.
- 2. Use timers to control lighting cycles.
- 3. Mark panels and switches so guards can monitor lighting.
- 4. Turn off parking lot lights after last shift.
- 5. Restrict parking to specific lots so lights can be kept off in unused lots.
- **6.** Install photoswitches on lights that remain on at night.
- 7. Put timed shut-off switches on lights in transformer rooms and similar closed-off areas.
- 8. Turn off all electrical signs.
- 9. De-energize some light fixtures.
- 10. Use lower wattage light bulbs.
- 11. Replace incandescent fixtures with fluorescent.
- 12. Replace incandescent bulbs with self-ballasting mercury or sodium bulbs.
- 13. Clean light fixtures on regular
- 14. Reduce lighting in material storage areas except where required for production and security needs.
- **15.** Reduce lighting in all corridors, etc.
- **16.** Make maximum use of sunlight for heating and lighting purposes by opening blinds or drapes on bright days.

### PROCESS RELATED

- 1. Turn off process exhausts when not in use.
- 2. Schedule work so process exhausts are used less.
- 3. Improve efficiency of exhaust systems by redesigning hoods.
- 4. Cut down on process use of hot water (rinses, etc.).

- 5. Check hot water systems for leaking valves and faucets.
- 6. Use plastic spheres for insulation on hot liquids in open top tanks.
- 7. Determine efficient "hold" temperatures on process tanks during overnight and weekend periods.
- 8. Reduce temperature of processing fluids (e.g., use of cooler water in industrial washers).
- Shut down gas burners in process equipment versus idling burners when not in use.
- Survey air tools and spray equipment; upgrade to reduce usage of compressed air.
- 11. Eliminate compressed air leaks.
- 12. Turn off machinery, test equipment ovens, etc., when not in use.
- 13. Unplug all small electrical tools such as soldering irons when not in use.
- 14. Replace oversized motors with ones of proper size.

#### HEATING/AIR-CONDITIONING

- 1. Turn down heat during day to 65°-68° (depends on system).
- 2. Turn down heat at night and on weekends to 60° (depends on system).
- 3. Turn down heat in unused areas to 50° or below.
- 4. Use minimum heat in warehouses and storage areas.
- **5.** Segregate special operations that require more heating or cooling than surrounding areas.
- Keep doors closed to unheated or uncooled areas such as corridors.
- 7. Keep heaters clear of obstruc-
- **8.** Seal thermostats to prevent individual adjustments by unauthorized personnel.
- 9. Install timers to control heating cycle.
- 10. Shut off chiller during winter months if possible.
- 11. Close loading dock doors when not in use.

- 12. Use dock curtains when unloading trucks.
- **13.** Use air curtains at doors that must remain open.
- 14. Make maximum use of sunlight for heating and lighting.
- **15.** Inspect and repair insulation, weather stripping and caulking.
- **16.** Install additional insulation especially on ceilings.
- 17. Investigate more or better pipe and duct insulation in unheated areas.
- **18.** Install storm windows or cover with plastic.
- 19. Install insulating glass in win-
- 20. Consider Infra-Red or other spot heaters in small work areas where general heating can be reduced.
- 21. Clean heating and cooling heatexchanger coils and fans on a regular basis.
- 22. Replace inefficient boilers with new more efficient units.
- 23. Use small automatic steam generators/hot water boilers at remote locations requiring steam/hot water.
- 24. Clean boilers more frequently.
- 25. Adjust burners regularly for maximum efficiency.
- 26. Preheat combustion air with flue gas.
- 27. Check steam traps, lines, regulators and valves regularly for leakage.
- 28. Reduce make-up air during day.
- 29. Eliminate all make-up air at night.
- 30. Seal ventilation controls to prevent unauthorized adjustments.
- **31.** Turn on ventilation only when required.
- 32. Use heat recovery units on exhausts.
- 33. Clean or replace air filters on a regular basis.
- **34.** Supply colder make-up air to laboratory hoods.
