# HOW TO MAKE THE PRETTIEST HAMMOCK ALOFT 

Simplest of all beds in the air, the sea hammock has been around since the days of Lord Nelson. Still simple (but pretty enough for Lady Hamilton) is this smartened-up. backyard 36 -inch by 78 -inch version that anyone who can operate a sewing machine can make in a day or so. If you like, you can order all the components in a kit ( $\$ 12.50 \mathrm{ppd}$.) from the Jensen-Lewis Company, 156 Seventh Avenue, New I ork, N. Y. Or. if you prefer to do your own shopping, this (ard all prices are approximate) is what you will need:

- $2^{1}{ }_{3}$ yard- of 50 -inch heary-duty sailcloth duck at $\$ 2.20$ a yard. If you use the kit, you will have a choice of twenty-four colors.
- 7 yards of $21 / 2$-inch white bullion fringe at 25 c a yard.
- 3-foot lengtly of ${ }^{1}$-inch steel drill rod at 60 c.
- $20=2$ brase grommets at 5 e each.
- Approximately 60 feet of 14 -inch braided cotton (or nylon or manilal sash cord at 3 c a yard.
- 2 steel rings. 2 -inch size. at 10 c each.
$\cdot \underline{2}=4 \mathrm{screw}$ hooks at 10 c each.
Cut the fabric lengthwise so that the width is 43 inches: turn in raw edges ${ }^{1}{ }_{2}$ inch. Nake a 3 -inch fold on each long side to form the drop ralances and stitch the edge of the fold to create a beaded edge. Then turn a 3 -inch hem at the head end and sew a row of stitching ${ }^{3}+\dot{4}$ inch from the fold. This forms a pocket for the drill-rod stress bar. At the other end, follow same procedure and substitute a length of rope instead

of steel bar. Now you are ready to appliqué
Cut out flowers (or birds or butterflies or anything you find amusing) from heavy cotton fabric and applique them on the hammock in any design you fancy. When sewing them on, a zigzag stitch around the outside edge is best, to avoid porsible fraying.

Next come the grommets. If you can't horrow a grommeting tool, a kit including the tool, twenty-four grommets and full instructions can be purchased at a good hardware store for about $\$ 2.50$. Place the grommets 4 inches apart and 1 inch in from edges at head and foot ends of hammock-inside the stress-rod pocket at the head and inside of the roped 3-inch hem at the foot.

Now lace the hammock rope alternately through the large steel head-and-foot rings (placed 2 feet away from lrammock) and the grommets, using a continuous rope. Start at the first grommet with a large knot and finish the same way at the end. When hung, the head of the hammock will have a tant edge and the foot will fold into pleats. All you need is Iwo shade trees, or one tree and a corner of the house, or simply two posts strong enough to support you when youre air-borne.

## HOW TO BRING YOUR HOUSE UP TO DATE

Keeping your house in tip-top condition
makes it more comfortable to live in and protects your investment potential

The principal incentive for spending money on your house is to increase the comfort and pleasure it gives to your familywhat better purpose could there be? But a second reason-and a good one-is the recognition that while you are making your house more livable, you are increasing its value in case some future day you may want to sell it.

When you live in a houve for a long time, you often simply adjust to it* minor flaws: the hall closet that won't open when it rains, the doors that swing open -ilently under no one"s hand When owners of such a house have to move, it can be quite a shock to find that these lived-with inconveniences are major draw backs in the cold eye of a potential buyer. To him. something as relativels trivial as a adgging step means the house may fall apart at any minute. Even architectural assets such as high ceilings and big rooms may be lot on him when he see a bathtuh standing on little feet

One day you might have to sell your house in a hurry. Many of the remodeling projects you had planned to do may be still only a gleam in your eye. If this -hould happen, the first thing to find out is how much you can get for the house as is. \ou may find that improvements costing just a few hundred dollar: can be completed in time to increave the value of the house tremendously. A real estate agent is the best person to advise you on these matters.

Even if you are not plamining to sell your house in the near future, it will pay in the long run to keep it well-maintained. Small ex pense= for minor repairs may obviate larger expense= later.

## The outside

I new coat of paint is an olvious first step in -prucing up and preserving a house. But before paint. ing. look for any repair that
should be made first. A sagging shutter newly painted still looks like a sagging shutter, so have it straightened. Porches. especially those with wood floors, should be kept level and worn boards replaced as needed. It's a good idea. too. to straighten steps and add new supports to make them firm underfoot. You will want to fill cracks in concrete walks and in the joints of any masonry walls.

Remember. the front door is an important architectmral fea-ture-repaint it or. if it has become warped. replace it. New hardware should be considered. since nothing is more discouraging than having to -truggle to get into a house. New lighting fixturefor a porch or by the front doot may also improve the first impression that the house makes on your guest--or on a potential buyer

## Wiring

The amount of power required to service a house ha- almo-t quadrupled in the last twentr vears. If the wiring in your house ha- not been updated in the last seten or eight rears, the chances are that it is inadequate. Blown fuses, insufficient light. woblly television reception. lights that dim when a major appliance is turned on are all indications that you don't have enough power. You should also have enough circuit- to allow for night lighting of drivewars and terraces. Inadequate wiring is more than inconvenient-it is unsafe.
A representative from vour local power company can examine your house and tell what is needed to bring it up to date. The wiring itself chould be checked to see if its insulating covering is worn-a sure canse of fire. Even if you do not need to rewire (thi, can be fairly expensive). it might he a good idea to replace old-fashioned switch plates with tap switches.

foumight also consider burying the power line leading into your house. Too often these heary black cables. draped from a pole to the side of the house, spoil a pleasant view. (Underground cables are also safe from high winds, falling trees, sleet and ice.) A built-in telerision antenna will make your house look neater. Your house doesn't need to be an electric marvel. but do make sure it is adequate by today's standards. both for convenience and safety.

## Heating

How is a heating sytem judged? A potential buyer will usually ask the following: How much are the fuel bills? Ind what is the fuel? Few people today want to live in a house that is heated with coal. (Only 10 per cent of the houses in this country still use it.) If it has been a long time since your furnace or boiler has been checked (it should be done at least once a year), call in a heating man and let him examine your equip. ment. He will probably have to make an adjustment or two and replace some small parts. He may
aloo recommend that ducts or pipe- be in-ulated. old thermo-tats be replaced. the furnace or boiler thoroughly cleaned.

## The bathrooms

Each year plumbing fixture manufacturers offer new designs and new colors. Ceramic tiles (see page 126). the classic building material for bathroom floors and walls, are being made in wonderful new shapes and patterns.

Vaturally your bathroom: have all the facilities. but worn floors. sad-looking walls and inadequate lighting can create a tired atmosphere that no amount of hot water rushing freely out of faucets can overcome. This does not mean that you have to strip the room bare and start from scratch. Sometimes a new coat of paint on the ceiling. replacing a tile or two on the floor. or installing a new lighting fixture will alleviate the drabness. You might replace old faucets with newer de-igns. You can cover a small chip in a porcelain fixture with a special porcelain paint. Especially if you should have to sell your house, the bathroom is a place you can make small improvements that will count a lot.

american military drum
Could you tell the approximate age of this drum I recently acquired? Except for ropes and leather pulls, it is original with natural maple shell, red hoops, shield and eagle decoration. Inside it is labeled "Trilham Kilborn, successor to George Kilborn, No. 7 Cinton Aie.. Albany, N.Y."
G.A.S.- Vorthampton, Mass.

Since William Kilborn's shop was located at 7 Clinton Avenue between 1864 and 1869 , your drum must have been made during that time. The Kilborns were drum makers from 1839 to 1891. William succeeded his father George in 1860. The eagle and shield mark it as a National Guard drum of the late Civil War period.

sileraton mireor

Our oak carrying case holds two decanters, has a brass lock with hallmarks and the words "The Tantalus" on it. What does it mean? G.C.-Syracuse, N.Y.

The word tantalus, so appropriate here, is the name of a Greek God whose peculiar puni-hment for an offense against Zeus gave us the word tantalize. Your locked decanter was made between 1890 and 1910 .

Is the mirror shown in the enclosed photograph properly called Sheraton?
R.E.-Middletown, N. Y.

Yes, it is a Sheraton mirror made in this country between 1800 and 1820 . Mirrors like this one are sometimes referred to as tabernacle mirrors because shape and design of frame somewhat resemble a niche or recess common in church architecture.

american transitional sofa
Can you tell us the style and age of this couch? We think it was made around 1860. L.T.H.-Belmont, Mass.

Your sofa is transitional, marking the shift in style from the American Empire to the early Victorian. As such it dates between 1840 and 1860. It was probably made by a cabinetmaker who specialized in sofas. There were several excellent craftsmen in Boston at that time who made this type.

I will appreciate your comments on the age and style of this walnut lowboy which is a family heirloom.
M.P.H.-Harrisburg, Pa.

The lowboy is an excellent example of the Queen Anne style. The cabriole legs with pad feet are characteristic. It was made by a Pennsylvania cabinetmaker about 1720-1750.

This mark is on the back of a twelve. sided plate with oriental design. It has been in the family for seventy-five years. II here was it made? II.S.- Poland, Ohio

Your plate was made by Joseph Heath \& Co., Tunstall, Staffordshire. He operated a pottery from 1829 to 1843.

Did this large coffee grinder have a brass eagle on lop originally? It is marked "Star Mill, Philadelphia: Henry Kroem. ner, Maker." N.IF.-Glendora, Calif.

Yes, the lid of the canister probably had a brass spread-eagle finial. Henry Kroemner was a leading manufacturer of grocery store coffee grinders, both counter and floor models.

IF'hat are the origin and age of ny clock? Leken-Herstal is written on the face. It has been in my family for close to hundred years. O.T.C.-Plainvie

Yours is a Belgian clock of the wag-on-the-wall type. made at LekenHerstal near Liége. The design is like others made in England about 1830-1850. so presumably it was made at about the same time.

## Going places, finding things in Belgium

In this small and civilized country that has contributed so much to the intellectual life of Europe, you will delight in the great paintings, the crafts and the unsung yet excellent food

EDITOR'S VOTE: Doone Beal, in private lije Lady Marley, is a frequent contributor to H\&G's travel column. Though London is her home, she is an experienced but non-jaded globe-trotter, and her keen eye for the decorative and art treasures of the countries she visits is matched by her cultivated and adrenturous taste for their cuisine.

Belgium is one of the gateways to Europe, but all too often it is treated solely as that by people who are presing urgently on to the further-flung.

For example, anybody whose mental image of the country is all Flemish flatness would get a big surprise to find in the Ardennesits easternmost province-a landscape as dramatic as that of the Black Forest. Those who imagine all gastronomic temples to be indigenous to France might be even more surprised to discover. in the handful of Brussels" best restaurants (and, indeed. in some provincial ones). cuisine equal-and on occasion. superior-to that orer the border.

The fact that the Belgians attach ju $\rightarrow$ as much importance to the ceremony of food as do the French strikes you as soon as you settle into one of the better restaurants; you are served, immediately and quite automatical-
ly. a sliver of fresh pâté to toy with while you order your meal. The Belgians understand the art of "keeping the appetite," and this idea. I thought, could well be applied to home entertaining when one guest (or the food) keeps the party waiting beyond the peak of appreciative hunger.

The Bruxellois sit down to the business of ordering lunch at 12:30 and emerge to continue the business of the day at 3:00 in the afternoon. which signifies not so much gluttony as a certain reverence for the stomach. But it presents a problem for the visitor. Although the shops stay open until $7: 00$ in the evening, the churches. galleries and museums close in summer around 5:00, and in winter at $4: 00$. So a choice must he made between art and gastronomy, but make it a decisive one-that food is too good to gulp down.

The top restaurants are not cheap (up to $\$ 9$ a head, including wine). but on the other hand I have rarely eaten better. The basic French cooking is applied to an adventurous variety of food. In the fall. which is the best time to go to Belgium, râble de lièvre (a very distant relation of jugged hare) is one of the standard dishes; so is chevreuil (baby venison) cooked in chambertin;

And you should venture on such intereating gastronomic sidetrack- as smoked salmon baked in a feuillet of pastry, or kidneys sautéed in butter and then flambeed, at the last minute, in gin. Thi- dish or method -known as Liégoise-is simplicity itself to prepare and very subtle in taste.

In the old. lower part of the city are the restaurant- with the most atmosphere: Épaule de Mouton and Filet de Boeuf, both in a narrow side street off the Grand Place. In Crand Place itself are the two nicest. in my opinion: Le Cygne and La Couronne. facing each other but both so quietly buried in the façade of fifteenth-century buildings that one would hardly know them to be restaurants at all. Le Cygne is the larger of the two-voluptuously comfortable, with open fires and an open grill. ithe Couronne is small and narrow, more intimate, decorated with Flemish antiques.

11so in the low part of this split-level city are the magnificent Town Hall. the Guild Houses of the Grand Place hung with golden insignia of bakers, brewers, cabinetmakers boatmen and tailors. which proclaim it essentially a burgher's city. Cars rumble over the cobbled streets alongside the trams. In the evenings, a festival seems to be perpetually going on: Crowds jostle each other along the sidewalks of the Boulevard tdolf Max before brightly lit stalls selling frites (part of the national diet) and hot. vanillascented pralines and toffee apples. The scene. in fact. engages all the senses: Loud-peakers playing popular music, ineritably Twists. compete with the more sanctimonious melodies played on an electric piano by a Salvation Army lady who seems to be permanently encamped inside one of the shopping arcades. Ind over it all is a cormeating explosion of lights.

## The upper city

Quite different from all of this is the modern. upper city of streamlined boulevards and discreet. expensive shops. The Silver Grill, the Savoy and the Carlton are among the good eating places. The most splendid view is from the Place Poelaert at the Palais de Justice over the rooftops of the old city. The skyline is punctuated by the dome of Votre Dame de la Chappelle where Breughel is bur.
ied and the spire of the Town Hall. landmarks now joined by the eight silvery globules of the Atomium, which looks rather like an aban doned plaything. This curiou.looking edifice is about the only bailding remaining from the 1958 Exhibition, and many Belgians are understandably ritical of the waste of money and effort on anything so e-centially temporal. Some of the split-level globes will eventually house permarent exhibitions, and inside the topmost one is the inevitable look-out and res. taurant. Hlas the sensation of being su-pended in space gave me a distinct feeling of vertigo-especially as wintry gales were making the place sway ever so slightly. I came quickly and thank futty down to terra firma, deciding to pur-ue instead the trappings of an older and more solid civilization.

## Brussels shops

A visit to the little bar called Le Cerf, on Grand Place. could send one hot-foot in pursuit of the type of antiques with which this. an original and unaltered fifteenth-century house. is furnished. The mellowness of natural oak tables polished only with age. the lovely old green and amber glas- the amplitude of the furniture are tremendously attractive, even somewhat elegant. Unfortunately. shopping for antiques in Brussels these days is no longer par-port to a bargain. The shops in Place du Sablon such as Costermans have some lovely furniture, French as well as Flemish. but none of it is cheap. In the surrounding district that takes its name from the square you may fare better but the beat chance of all is to catch an auction. Galeries Giroux. 43 Boulevard du Régent. is one of the best known salesrooms. for paintings as well as furniture and decorations. Back in the Sablon quarter, La Vieille Galerie d’Art, 12 Rue de Sis Jeune-Hommes, hav a permanent exhibition of up-and-coming French and Belgian painters.

Brussels is very much the hop window of Europe. and to this extent you can find imports from Sweden, Denmark, Germany, Great Britain, France and even Hong Kong. but none so advantageous a buy as they are in their countries of origin. The delicately colored Belgian crystal goblets, however, justify their stiffish price, and there is a good -election of them at De Backer \& Van Camp. 73 Rue Royale, and (leos expensive) at Buss, 85 Marché-aux-Herbes. Lace is a natural, but keep away from the

souvenir slops if you are making a serious purchase. Among the speciali-ts, Madame Foiret at 17 Rue St. Michel is both reliable and knowledgeable on a subject very nearly as intricate as the workmanship that goes into it. Well-made leather blotters and book-covers are another good buy, and so is wrought iron: Henry Mathieu at 36 Chausée d'Etterbeek has pretty antique reproductions, or you might try La Ferronière d'Art in Rue du Marché for a broader selection.

Oddly enough, the thing I coreted most was one of those immensely heary saucepans that I saw a chef wielding with both hands. They are positively essential for making perfect sauces that have both eggs and cream in them. or for the subtle saute that stars on the heat for hours without ever sticking or burning. They are not on sale at the regular hardware stores. but my chef friend gave me the address where the professionals go: Chez Pommier, in Rue de Bouche.

levies in the Groeninghe Museum (incidentally one of the best appointed little museum: I know). which contains Memling's egg-shell-textured " Annunciation." Van der Goes" "Death of the Virgin." and the weird almost diabolical "Last Judgment" of Hieronymus- Bosch. Outside, the cobbled streets were quiet and empty; the canal waters glacial, steely and reflective under the thick little stone bridges.

I was delighted to find the Begumage deserted, too. Probably more often photographed and painted than any other part of the city, this convent enclosure of whitewashed houses now belongs to an order of Benedictine nuns. In former days, unmarried daughters of the gentry led a life of quiet, lace-making refinement at the Beguinage. What an oasis it must have been in Bruges lively, prosperous fourteenth cenfury. when the city was among the most important in Europe and the Dukes of Burgundy made the Prinsenhof one of their most illustrious headquarters

In Bruges as in Brussels, the pleasures of the table are equal to those of the eve. The two best restaurants are the Pannier d $\mathrm{Or}_{r}$ in
the Market Place, and the Dur de Bourgogne. whose bay windows overhang one of the prettiest stretches of the canal. I asked the patron there for hi- most typical dish. His suggestion of "waterzooid" sounded unbeguiling. It turned out, however, to be a most delectable concoction of chicken cooked with cream (and sometimes with fish as well). served in a soup plate in the manner of moulds marinière. In the kitchen, afterwards. I was shown how the chicken is cooked in strong stock with plenty of parsley and lemon juice. to which is then added quadtities of very thick cream and finalby some egg yolks. (That was where I came upon the thick saucepan.) As with all Continental cooking, the question of measuremont simply does not enter into it Call is method, with a spoonful of soft butter added here, a pinch of paprika added there, as the mood dictates.

Antwerp. for a long time the cutthroat trading rival to Bruges. is also its antidote and in a way its complement. It is a great spanking. spacious city whose cathedral spire and huge ships cranes are silhouetted against the sty. Diamond-cutting and the Continued on page 33

quick turn-around of ships are what count in its present-day life. So are shop- and cabarets and cafés (La Rade, the Criterium, Le Gourmet sans Chiqué and a string of Chinese restaurants head an endless list).

As befit- a city that prides itself on being the metropolis rather than the capital, its rich old buildings are more solid, more sober than those of Brussels. (In its heyday as a city of the Hanseatic League, it was in any event more important.) The merchants of the time were as much concerned, one feel. with the business and brass of the day as they were with decorations. Even Rubens' opulent, fleshy beauties owed a lot, surely, to good living. His house just off the Veir is an example of the somewhat bucolic Flemish taste refined by his appreciation of the Italianate. A third essential is a willingness to be pleased - a talent for enjoy ing the small effect rather than slaving to produce a big one, an appreciation of the present moment for 11 s wo sake alone. ■ The act of being pleased, says drama critic Walter Kerr in his new book, "The Decline of Pleasure," should be so easy, as easy as falling off a log. Burt in the next chapter he admits that falling off a log may not be easy after all if you have held yourself so rigid for so long that you dare not let yourself so. ## The fine art of summer

 living How to make your terrace an enchanting party spot"Steep thyself in a bowt of summertime," said Virgil-and the image is still enticing nearly two thousand years later. Although you'd need a bowl as big as a bathtub to follow his suggestion to the letter, on a terrace you can approximate the sensation nicely, summer-day in and summer-day out. Whether your terrace is as big as a dance floor or a mere scrap of space off your kitchen, you can turn it into sunmer headquarters-a peaceful haven for doing just plain nothing as well as a stage for all your summer parties. For with children home from school, and friends continually dropping by for a dip in the pook or a look at the garden, entertaining becomes a constant component of summer days. On a terrace. you can give a party at the drop of a hat. You can expand your guest lists. since this extra outdoor room. where the sky is your ceiling and the rest of the garden your walls, gives you far more space, both in fact and in fancy, than any room of the lrouse. And your parties can be much more informal and easy to cope with than in winter.

The type of terrace you have, of course, will influence the nature of your entertaining. The most familiar type-a large paved area close to the house-such as the terrace on our cover-usually presents no problems since the kitchen is likely to be near enough for you to organize a meal in much the same way as you would a meal in the dining room. The only extra equipment you will need is a tea cart or a fleet of sturdy tray's to transport everything outdoors. On such a terrace, your parties might range from quite formal suppers with lots of little tables skirted to the ground in pale linen cloths topped with your best china, to a very informal barbecue with everyone in shorts sittiug wherever they find a perch.

A tiny terrace attached to the house-perhaps off the kitchen or bedroom-offers other opportunities. lou can turn such a terrace into an intimate second dining room for breakfast or quiet dinner-for-two. And again, you can use the kitchen as your center of operations and whisk the meal outdoors to a prettily set table. But a terrace removed from the house-perhaps by a pool, a lake or a tennis court-calls for quite different logistics. This is the spot for your nost casuat parties. and the menus and service should be as simple as you can make them. You might prepare everything ahead of time and carry it from kitchen to terrace in baskets, or you might set up a barbecue and cook part of the meal on the spot.

Whatever type of terrace you have, you can give it just as much individuality. comfort and attractiveness as your indoor rooms partly by what you plant around it, partly by what you set upon it. The fourth chapter of H\&G's Terrace Story (see April, 1962 ) outlined what to plant around a terrace; on pages 88-91, you will find bright assemblages of pretty and practical accessories to make jour terrace inviting from dawn to dusk.

 you hate to leave"She really lives in her kitchen," a friend onee said of Mrs. Maurice Rotival, and as soon as you see the kitchen in Mr. and Mrs. Rotival's house in Woodstock, Conn., y ou can understand why. Nothing about it is run-of-the-mill. It is not merels a workroom. It is, in fact, an open-plan suite that offers almost everything you need for around-the-dloek living exeept a bed. And the captivating atmosphere. reminiscent of a carnival whth its joyous riot of eolor and embracing sense of welcome, makes everyone who sets foot there want to linger.

Coming through French doors from a flagstone poot-side terraee, you enter first a small garden-sitting room. Walk up three steps and you will be in a great space, opposite page, with a high, raftered ceiling, walls of creamy white and wonderfully juxtaposed accents of deep, soft rasplerry red and the palest lime green. as the working core of her kitchen (see plan. below). To this core she added a huge, two-level space for day-long living. On the lower level is a sitting room with sofas, deep-cushioned chairs and a collection of Sunday paintings by Mr. Rotival's father. These are mounted on the cabinet doors of a storage wall to look like a miniature art gallery. On the higher level, at the end of the dining area, is a very complete home office with a long sweep of work-surface. a double file and a telephone. At this efficient headquarters Mrs. Rotival spends a great deal of time every day doing the paper work and planning for her many community activities.

The cooking center, right, in the original strip, is a wonderfully eass spot to work in since everything is within arm's reach. Against one wall is a four-burner, double-oven stove with work counters on both sides and handy eye-level open shelves for spices. jars of sugar, flour and the like. Directly opposite is a long work counter with a maple chopping-block inset. and adjoining this, the main preparation and washing-up counter, below. At the far end of the working kitchen. beyond a narrow counter that wraps around the stairs to the basement. is another pleasant spot to eat in-a tiny room-unto-itself where the Rotivals have breakfast and enjoy the view through the wide windor to the terrace, the pool and the garden ber ond.

Just as the second car has lost its spurious role as a status symbol to become a practical necessity, so the second house is fast assuming a major place in many families lives. Rather than contend each year with the where-shall-we-go-this-summer dilemma and the scramble to pack and transport vacation paraphernalia, more and more families have recognized the wisdom of building their own vacation houses. It may be a big, family-size house like the one that the Fletcher Ashleys built on a cliff in Ogunquit, Me., right, or it might be as small and inexpensively built as the country hideaway of California designer John Carden Campbell, which you will see on page 102. But large or small, the true vacation house is no longer a makeshift, rough-and-ready cottage. It is a second bona fide house planned for year-round enjoyment

This is a natural outgrowth of today's shorter work week, longer and more flexible vacations, faster transportation. Now that super highways and airplanes put us within easy reach of once remote woodlands, lakes or seacoasts, we can savor, all year round, that sense of renewal and refreshment that nature so unfailingly provides

To live up to its billing, a vacation house should, of course, be soundly constructed, comfortable in any weather, and also contain the amenities and small delights that smooth routine and enrich leisure. The expense can be amortized in a variety of ways. Some families rent their houses during part of the summer season, thus reducing the cost of having it available for weekends the rest of the year. Other people divide the cost and the periods of occupancy among several branches of the family. Mature couples often plan their vacation house as a permanent home for the future when they will have retired.

Whatever its cost or size, the second house can be an enlightening adventure in livingas these two vacation houses clearly attest.

Ayone who ever spent a childhood summer rambling among the rocks by a wild seacuat. diviov-
ering the treasures of the tide pools or wading in the surging waves, can imagine the delight of architect Fletcher Ashley's four young daughters with the house their father built in Ogunquit, Me. Dubbed The Rockhouse, it perches high on a cliff that punges 30 feet down to the Atlantic below, commanding superb views from every room and from the decks that surround it. On the big rear deck that extends out over the rocks, you might think you were on a ship, with nothing in sight but the expanse of sea and an occasional lobster boat. But from the screened porch and the smaller deck that hugs the house (see the plan, above), you survey the ancient rocks and magrificent pines.

A sliding glass door opens directly from the entrance walk into a iving room so big und co carefree it seems less like a room than a large and delightful recreation area. The oppo ite wall composed entirely of sliding glass doors opens the room to the porch and deck. At the right of the front door is a series of folding birch doors that close off the kitchen section. The length of the living room serves as a buffer between the girls rooms at one end and their parents' at the other. Mr. and Mrs. A. hley sown quarters include a spacious bedroom, dressing room, the bonus of a screened sleeping porch. Continued on page 101)

A HOUSE THAT LOOKS OUTWARD

The pleasures of this house by the sea are by no means confined to summer. Often on stormy winter weekends Mr. and Mrs. Ashley drive to "The Rockhouse" from their home in Lexington, Mass., an hour and a half away, for the exhilaration of watching the snow swirl over the cliff while they bask in the secluded warmth of the hearth fire. Whatever the season, the ruggedly handsome fireplace and the warm redwood ceiling add visual excitement to the sweeping expanse of living room.

At the other end of the room is the dining area. The space between that and the fireplace was deliberately left uninterrupted and uncluttered to allow plenty of room for year-round ping pong. But with the game table out of the way and the glass doors opened wide to the porch, the Ashleys have a wonderful, flowing indooroutdoor space for summer parties.

Thanks to the central location of the kitchen, Mrs. Ashley need never be isolated from her family and guests while she cooks. And she can serve the food right over the kitchen counter that doubles as a buffet for the living room. But after meals, the folding birch doors banish the kitchen from view and turn one whole wall of the living room into a sleek expanse of light, bright wood.

## A house that looks inward to its own outdoor haven

Ae demand for second houses has grown, vacation sites have correspondingly shrunk, but lakeside cottages, cheek by jowl, or dune bungalows in close parade rarely offer the seclusion so highly valued in a vacation retreat. This ubiquitous problem was neatly side-stepped, however, by the house that California designer John Carden Campbell built for himself on a 60 -by-60-foot lot in the foothills of the Sierra Nevadas. Instead of looking outward, his house turns inward to face a glass-walled court that brings the outdoors into the very heart of the building. Open to the sky and lush with plants and flowers in pots and tubs, the court is like an enchanting garden. Yet it is an inseparable part of the house and through its glass walls you can see the whole 32 -by-40-feet of interior as one flowing space-a continuity which is emphasized by the use of the same flooring throughout. The walls and ceiling as well as the floor are all of 2-by-6-inch tongue-and-groove white fir planks, nailed to a post and beam framework, and the whole structure rests on ready-made concrete piers. As a happy result of this simple construction, the architect was able to build the house for approximately $\$ 7,800$. Since the court brings light and air to the whole house, there are only four exterior windows. Two at the front are fitted with obscure glass jalousies that let in air but screen from sight a neighboring house. At the back, glass doors flanked by a pair of clear windows take in an unobstructed view of lush green val ey and rolling hills which you can see through the court as you come in the front door. Ang with sunlight and air, the inner court also endows the house with remarkable flexibility and automatically defines the four corners as separate areas (see plan, left). Folding wood doors that pull across from house walls to court walls close off one end of the house entirely to form a sleeping area that is divided by more folding doors into two separate bedrooms. Each has a window to the court as well as one in the outer wall.

In this inward turning house, host and guests can relax in perfect seclusion, yet they are only a short distance from more active vacation pleasures. Within a few miles are lakes and mountain streams for swimming and fishing and slopes at 7,000foot altitude for skiing. Round about are dozens of Gold Rush villages where Mr. Campbell has prospected with signal success for some of the treasures that give the house its individuality. An antique French. carving hangs over a contemporary Danish sofa-bed in the living room where an old. Dutch iron stove is ready with a cheery an!swer for evening chills. In the dining area, a Navy mess table is paired with a French country chandelier and the bedrooms are like small art galleries filled with lively color.

## You can make any room a guest room

Few words of welcome or solicitude can make you feel as wanted in someone else's house as a pretty, thoughtfully appointed guest room. If you have a room you can keep sacrosanct to that end, fine. But, as you will see on the following seven pages. almost any room in the house can be made, pro tem, into a guest room that you, or anyone else, would love to stay in. Strip it of extraneous trappings, add the amenities you look for yourself when you go on a visis. and don't forget the ones you could cheerfully dispense with that to some people are practically necessities.

Even if you don't smoke, remember the people who do, and set out the ashtrays-lipped to hold a burning cigarette and bigger than a fifty-cent piece. Since millions of people read in bed (or they'd never go to sleep), provide your guest bed with a good reading light and set out a few new looks and a cross-section of magazines. If rou live in the country, don't forget that city dwellers are apt to be cold-blooded. This means plenty of blankets on tap or, for its versatility in supplying ans desired degree of warmth, an electric blanket.

$T$he familiar necessity for including dining furniture in the living rooni proves a bright asset in this lighthearted room. For the dining area, abloom with color and sparked by treasures of little price, blithely sidesteps the limitations of its dining roonr role to play a two-way game-performing around the clock as a recreation corner for the living room. Its simple strategy is based on furniture that bears no inhibiting label: "reserved for mealtime only." Instead of the standard buffet. there is a pair of tall chests, right, with a shelf between. The small drawers are just the right size for silver. The long ones hold plate mats and napkins, and there are enough drawers to spare for playing cards. games and even the small toys the children use in the living room. The shelf between the chests, when cleared of its bright freight, makes an ample serving center. By the same token, the roomy round table and vinyl-covered swivel chairs are, visually and practically, good companions to the living room furniture. The chairs are comfortable enough for hours-long sessions of chess or Summit, the challenging cold-war game spread out on the table, opposite page. (For more of today's fascinating new games, turn to page 117.) Over the table, a lamp witlı a plastic shade folded and fluted in the airy manner of Japanese Origami, sheds light that is soft enough for dining. yet clear enough for games.

Above all, the exuberant colors and the spontaneous scattering of gay accessories testify brilliantly to the more-fun-than-money spirit of the room. The 6-by-9-foot cotton rug, with its stripings of HsG 's Tangerine and other heady reds and pinks, packs a roomful of excitement into its small area and sets a theme that reverberates in the Tangerine of the armchair and curtain borders. in the bright ceramic wedges that top the small chairside table and in such pretty fantasies as the masses of paper flowers blooming in baskets atop the chests. Editor's note: Pure pleasure, as IV alter Kerr defines it, is "that intoxicating state in which the whole man finds himself centered on, and in, a sensation of having just been born and having just been sel free and having been born for the freedom he is feeling." As drama teacher, Broadway director, playwight, and, since 1957, drama critic of the \ew Iork Herald Tribune. Mr. Kerr's own work has been focrsed upon a venerable source of pleasure, which undoubtedly accounts for the thoughtful, finely textured argument of his new book "The Dectine of Pleasure" published by Simon and Schuster. The following in junction, designed to preserve the purity of pleasure is a condensation of the chapter litled "The Prohibitions That Become Freedoms." The twentieth century has relieved us of labor without at the same time relieving us of the conriction that only labor is meaningful. Although we assume ourselves to be a people possessed of unusual npportunities for leisure, we are actually occupied in more and more work.

Work-minded as we have become, we are not yet wholly unaware of a world that exists, or was meant to exist, apart from work. We have, for instance. a memory of pleasure: Fragments of idle and delightful hours freely squandered when we were younger come back now and then to haunt us. We are vaguely aware that an uncorrupted pleasure awaits us somewhere. if we can onty learn to forgive ourselves for taking it: we sense that the taking is both possible and desirable.

The habits that keep us alive are the habits that keep us unhappy.

The one thing. really, that stands between the mind and its pleasure is its powerful drive, developed over the long struggle for survival. toward possessing and devouring whatever promises it pleasure. The mind grabs out at goodness to be able to feel its presence in the fist. after which the treasure is hoarded in the attic; it is in the fist and in the attic that it loses its charm.

Have you ever noticed that, of six or seven books hing about on the living room table. the one you own is the one you will defer reading? You may offer several most plausible reasons for this state of affairs. The fact that it is owned means that it needn't be read just now: It can be read at any time (which very often means that it will never be read at any time. and the longer it is owned the stimmer are its chances). The books that are not owned - that are borrowed or rented-ought logically to come first on any virtuous man's list. I should give my earliest attention to a book that has been borrowed in order to return it at the earliest possible moment. shouldn't I? But do 1 reatly read it now out of consideration for the friend who has loaned it, racing to get it back to him? Or do I read it now and forget to get it back to him for months and months? Similarly: I am simply hehaving sensibly if I first pick up the lending-library book that is costing me fire or fifteen cents a day. But just what was it, earlier this afternoon, that made me pluck that volume from the lending-library shelf when I knew perfectly well that l had a new and unread book of my own at home?

The painting I own is the painting $I$ should need to be born again. with new eyes. to see. I loved it once. of course, or I should never have made such a sacrifice to seize it and carry it home. For a day or two my delight in it seemed almost to be increased by the exhilaration of my onning it. Lately, though, it is only a visitor who has never visited me before. or who has not visited me very often, who sees it. I do indeed continue to point it out. to answer questions about it. to show it off-and in doing these things I glance at it. But no glance could be more glancing. MI eyes flicker, familiarly. across its surface with some pride, some animation. some honhomie; but not with love. The painting does not still me. On the contrary, I am to be heard babbling away
for as long as seems socially suitable, after which I go mix the drinks. And when no visitor is there, the painting is not there, either. I pass it a dozen times a day as though it were a nondescript stranger. I own it. It is mine.

Is there something about permanence, or the promise of permanence. that is opposed-in essence-to the experience of pleasure?

This may, in a strange way, be so. The contemplative act. the sustained and loving surrender of attention to something no more than intuitively known, yields its profound gratifications only at the price of certain peculiar sacrifices. I suppose "sacrifices" is itself a peculiar word to be applying to the beginnings of pleasure: Surely the search for delight should be the one search of our lives that ought to be conducted with abandon, without thought of restraint. without giving up anything.

To put a finger on the "thou shalt nots" that circumscribe, and thereby protect, the possibilities of pleasure, we are forced to turn to the contemplatives who have most assiduously analyzed the nature of the act they are performing. These are of course the religious contemplatives, those who have spent their lives rather than their Sunday afternoons attempting to perfect a kind of knowing. The object of their knowledge is, to be sure, quite different from the object the rest of us are normally after: They are preparing themselves for an intimate, immediate experience of Cod, whereas most of us will be content with an intimate, and immediate, experience of creatures like ourselves and the common earth we walk.

What have these professed contemplatives to tell us about the possible guarantees of a possible happiness. apart from the fact that all infusions of joy are bound to be separated by long dark nights? The first thing they have to tell us is that there are no guarantees. We are unable to force the experience. Unlike the force we apply to the universe when we are intent upon wresting from it its working secrets, the Th power we exercise now is a simple power of sensitivity-of being able to respond rather than ravage. We are engaged in an act of submission. of invitation, of biding our time imtil the forsythia blomms. Armed attack will get us nowhere, which is why the party that everyone tries to make "go" is the party that will leave everyone's nerves shattered. and why the determined evening of quiet with a rewarding book will so often undermine its rewards and make the duiet intolerable in direct proportion to the vigor of its determination. We cannot oursclves ereate what rerreates us. We can only lay ourselves open to friendly invasion. aware that we are subject to the most extraordinary impresions of pleasure and equally aware that the visitation comes from without, touching the within of its own volition.

This sounds rather as though we were tathing about an oriental quietism, a passive drowsing in which both iutelligence and feeling abdieate their seat- in the human parlia-ment-and as though we were utterly helpless in our pursuit of pleasure because pleasure must come as an accident. In point of fact, we have all had experiences of unbidden pleasure, surges of something close to ecstasy that came with
as little warning as a car hurtling out of a driveway.
It is also clear to us that such experiences are so rare as to offer us no real hope in the dilemma of our dailiness. Renewal must either come oftener or be dismissed as having no sustained role to play in the rhythm of our lives. If, as the religious contemplative is entirely dependent upon a stirring of God, I am entirely dependent upon the stirring of a Monet-I can do nothing to improve the painting, no honing of mine will make its shaft pierce me deeper-am I altogether impotent? Can't I help?

?I can help by learning how to keep my helpful hands out of things. This is a more active procedure than it sounds. Out of the goodness of our hearts, or of gratitude for favors not yet bestowed, or perhaps in the hope of being invited again, we feel a powerful urge to bring to the feast an imposing bottle of wine or a carefully selected ornament to be hung on the wall. This creates complications. The host has a wine of his own; dare he serve it now (it is the only suitable wime) or must he honor the donor by breaking out his, thereby destroying the scheme for the dinner? When an ornament is obviously expensive, or even obviously good. must it be hung on the walls that one means to live with and that one had so wistfully wished to display as personal? Some guests are nuisances because it is impossible for them to be guests. They are hosts and hostesses eternal. and in many mansions.

The contemplative act rigoronsly requires that all who seek its benefits come empth-handerl. It is sery hard for Cod or for Daumier to put ans thing into a closed fist. Sheer delight must always begin in sheer disinterest. so that there shall be room for all of it to cuter. So corners dare to be marked "reserved."

It does not make a great deal of difference what kind of thought preoseupic- a man: an! preoccupation, even with the object at hand. place- cataracts over his eres. If the preoccupation in extermal. busy with matters umelated to the experience, the defeat of the experience is automatic. If the preoccupation is directl! concerned with the matter of ones pleasure-if ones thoughtful mind is centered on the party or the painting-virtualls as much static is threatened.

Perhaps in order to get the most out of an experience I take great pains to "bone up" on the experience. I read the play sarefully before I go to see it. I read the long introductor? eritique to a elassic hefore exposing meself to what the auther has written. I read program notes at a concert. I learn all I can ahout the background of someone I am geing to meet. in order to tre alle to dran him out about his "major imterest.." The result is that 1 never do ser or hear what is happening: I see or hear. or perhaps am dismayed nut to see or hear. "hat I have read.

We might pause at this point. to offer sympathy to the newly met stranger who is ataced all the "right questions" in order to put him at his ease. He is being asked to deliver his standard lecture about himself (and his work) and his weariness is immediately tramparent. What he realls wanted to meet was you. What he realh wanted to talh about was anthing at all-even the weather-but not the so intelligent subjects that have been introduced. (Continued on page 1601

## Give featured plants the cas:y, casmal look of portability

 Some decorative effects require a plant to look movable without actually being movable. If the container is small, you may find a happy solution by hanging it from an overhead beam or eare, such as the three baskets of donkey-tail sedum (S. morgani(anum) that adorn without disturbing the sand bed in the Pasadena courtiard Above. The reason the cedur. opposite page, is less portable than it looks is the weight of the earth around its roots (in the case of this simple reducood tub. 250 to 350 pounds, depending on San Fran. cisco's rainfall). In a planter like that beside the cedtur. potted plants may be rearranged for caried effects.There is no plant shelf like a terrace. A terrace is flat: it is stable; it is waterproof; it is big. It makes pot gardening all but mandatory. And few gardeners can resist the temptation to place at least a few plants somew here about the paved area-to frame a flight of steps. to set off a doorway. to mark a boundary, to give emphasis to a vista. Plants are easy to care for on a terrace. on almost an assembly line basis. They can be grouped for easy watering. fertilizing and spraying against common pests and ailments. Abore all, you can change pot plants as easily as you can change your mind-and as often.

If you can ascribe one outstanding virtue to the practice of pot gardening, that rirtue is spontaneity Even with containers so big that you can scarcely move them without risking a slipped disc. you can achiere a satisfyingly impromptu look. And the more you experiment with pot gardening, the more ways you dis. cover to give a sense of lively rariety to what may properly be called your terrace landscape.

You can put big plants-the kind of shrubs and small trees that are most often seen with their roots firmly planted in the open ground-in big tubs, and place them where their seeming portability adds special interest to the natural beauty of the plant ( see cedar, opposite page). You can put little plants in little pots and place them wherever a dramatic color accent, a swift burst of fragrance. a softening touch of leaf or stem will be most welcome. Or, you can step across the thin line that separates pot gardening from planter gardening and put several plants in a single fixed container or plant bed for what amounts to a true garden effect. You can get these small-scale garden effects by combining species that are essentially pot plants by nature. There are literally hundreds of such plants, when you stop to review them. and you can combine them beautifully in what are nothing less than super dish gardens such as the dramatic examples at the bottom of page 122 .

While there is almost no limit to the number of ways you can use plants and plant containers to beautify your terrace, there is a rery definite limit to the number of liberties you can take with the routine of pot plant care. Without the buffering action of ahmost unlimited soil that surrounds plant roots in the open garden, your terrace pots are especially vulnerable to sudden and rapid drying out during hot spells or when swept by drỵing winds, bathed in over-friendly sun. Good drainage is essential for pot plants, lest summer rains literally drown the plants. As for further specifics of pot practice, let the rest of the story speak for them.

A pot plant needs less justification for its presence in the random context of terrace living than almost any thing else except friendship and hospitality. And while you can't make anything very earth-shaking out of a pink pelargonium, you can't overlook it either if it is within view at all. The same is true in one degree or another of every plant that can be stuck into a pot or box and set down where it will catch your eye and rejresh your spirit. For example, eight or nine pretty pots. chosen for harmony of both color and scale. give warmth and casual charm to a rather formal Alight of terrace steps, 1. An entirely different effect is achieved by the bronze leaf rosettes of evergreen Eurya ochnacea in an Italian ring pot beside a woods path, 2. Here, special interest is given an adjacent picnic terrace by placing a single potted plant in a setting where plants are growing naturally all around. Ascending plant boxes. 3, jollou a Vew England farm stair to form an unusual and effective balustrade. Less primly, dish gardens of small succulents trim a stair in the Los Angeles Arboretum, 4. One inspired example of pot gardening in excelsis is the casual insertion of a 4 -inch pot, 5, in place of an edging block. And of course the old-fashioned strauberry jar, 6, needs neither introduction nor apology, even when it is filed uxith Sugar Plum perunius instead of jruit.

Sometimes it pays to carry coals to Veucastle. It first glance it might sound ridiculous to say that the balcon rail, 7, above, cried out for fite pots of geraniums.s to make it attractive. Yet in a strange way, it did take those five pots to turn a serene and lotely garden picture into a gay and exciting one. Of coltrse, you hate to hate the eye and the imagination to see that magnificent stonework and luxuriant euonymus and wisteriar rines are not after all, quite enough. But given that much head start, the pots made all the difference. Similurly, an even dozen small potted flowers, 8, with a tubbed camellia for baker's measure, add the final fillip to a beautifully planted Pennsylvania terrace. If the plants go out of bloom in the big tree's shade, you replace them in a few moments. For a most unusual garden that is ald pots and nothing else, turn to "Cardener's Month," page 152



## The new excitement of ceramic tile

Opposite:
The Spanish-Moorish custom of paving a floor and a fireplace hearth in the same tiles is as effective in Mr. and Mrs. Calvin Goodrich ${ }^{\circ}$ s house in Southern California as in a Majorcan villa.
The 8-inch-square tiles were made in nearby Mexico. Some are plain, others are marked off in triangles. When the two types are laid side-by-side, they produce a two-toned geometric pattern in shades of beige and brown. A similar effect could be created with standard-sized squares in other closely related colors. Tile by Latin America Mosaico Company. Architect: Smith and Williams.

A tiled niche (shades of Venice) is created by paring the walls and ceiling of a very American built-in bar. The pebble-shaped tiles in pink, heige and gray are flat, glazed and factory-mounted on foot-square paper sheets to simplify installation. Grout for joints can be tinted to match doors and adjacent painted. walls or left natural white. Tile by Amsterdam Corp.

- We have little excuse for relegating ceramic tile to the bathromm. in spite of the fact that today's new designs and colors can give that roum a brilliance it hasn't known siuce Pompeii. For ceramice tile is murh wider in decorative scope, and its history is as scmerable and as intricate as the family tree of civilization. Almost 4,000 ycars ago, thre stylish Cretans were using faience-inlaid walls as a background for their elegant painted furniture. At the same time and subsequently, the Chinese, the Persians, the Syrians and the Romans were all tile happ!-and with reason, for ceramic tile was, and is, one of the handsomest of building materials.

The Moors, when they built the Alhambra, probably brought the use of tile to its zenith. The influence of this one building on Spain and the Mediterranean countries has remained unequaled, and is still to be seen in our current preoccupation with Spanish architecture, furmiture and the tiles that go with them. The Victorians were equally appreciative of tile. Some of the elaborately tiled Moorish-patterned floors in their entrance halls and conservatories were wonderful and not at all incongruous companions for their tasseled and convoluted furniture. The growing popularity today of the tile-paved atrium or inner courtyard (a Roman concept) is further evidence of the marvelous versatility of tile.

The custom of framing fireplaces with Delft tile began in serenteentlıcentury Holland, swept over Europe, enjoyed a great sogue in Colonial America, was revived in the late nineteenth century during the Eastlake period, and can be found today in any number of contemporary houses. These quaint blue and white tiles are charming partners for furniture of almost any design-coutemporary as well as Flemish or Chippendalc.

The successful use of ceramic tile, however, depends as mnch on proper installation as on choice of design. You can't walk into a department store and buy tile by the package. Either you or your architect must ohtain the material from a tile contractor who will also lay it in its place. Any tiles larger than 2 inches square are usually mounted piece-by-piece. Smatler sizes are factory-mounted on l-foot squares of paper. These sections are appliect to the wall or floor. the paper washed off the face of the tile and the joint. fillect with grout.

Once the tile is laid, the joints, usually gray or white, form an all-over pattern. If you like, the grout can be tinted to matels the tile, or pate tiles can be accented with grout stained a rivid color.



The picture-que paving so loved by Capo di llonte artisans is recreated in a dining room with 8 -inch-square Italian tile- laid in a framing of teak to form an under-table island. Tiles are painted with sunbursts of blue. green and yellow, then heavily glazed. Four tiles are needed to complete the design, sixteen for the entire island. Tiles by Flavia.

## New tiles with new flair



A handsome, easy-to-care-for frame for a fireplace is composed of blue and white tiles patterned with stylized flowers in a latter-day version of old Delft workmanship. Each tile is 6 inches square and $1 / 4$ inch thick. The joints are white and the perimeter wood molding is painted to match the blue of the tile. Early Delft tiles were used in the same manner, and in pre-central-heating Germany, ceramic tiles were applied to the surfaces of huge stoses. Tiles by Richard-Ginori.


Straight from a Roman atrium-in design, at least-is this small reflecting pool bordered with tongue-shaped ceramic tiles, 5 inches long, laid with white grout to accent the unusual shape. Bands of loops are casy to make with an automatic rug hooking needle, Left. You set gauge on needle for size of loop you want. Working from buck of rug, needle brings through just enough wool to make loop of proper length (see below). You can leate loops intact or cut them for a chenille look. Furniture by Dunbar.


A distinctly individual accent rug, such as the hand-woven creations imported from Scandinavia or Morocco, can contribute as much exciting color and design to a room as a painting or a wall hanging. But if your budget cannot be stretched to cover a one-of-a-kind rug and yonr talent does not stretch to weaving or hook. ing one. you can. nevertheless. create an accent rug with a made-to-order look for a surprisingly small expense or effort. Designer J. Frederie Lohman, at the request of $\mathrm{D}_{\mathrm{u}}$ Pont, has created a series of embellishments you can add yourself to any one of a gromp of nylon, cutpile area rugs by Patcraft, all under $\$ 25$ apiece. A color-banded rug embellished with virid lacing makes a bold, appropriate accent for contemporary furniture in a living room. Rug is made up of three 27-by-48-inclu rugs, in this case in three neutral tones-a white one for the center and a black and a gray, each slit in hall. for the two borders. (II hen slitting rugs. be careful to cut evenly between two rous of tufting.) To assemble bands, insert grommets 4 inches apart and 2 inches in from the edge of each rug with a grommet machine, ABOvE. (You can buy one together with a supply of grommets at a harduare store.) Then join rugs together with bright red wool tupe laced back and fortli shoelace style through the grommet holes. Furniture by George Tamier.



A scalloped border of dark brown felt dotted with oversize buttons trims a pale sandstone arear rug for
a study. Border is actually the extension of a mat, 60 by 84 inches, that backs the whole rug. Attach the mat to the rug with double-fuced tape so it can be removed easily when the rug is cleaned.

## WINE AND FRUIT-

the perfect summer companions<br>By James A. Beard

It seems quite natural that wine and fruit should be happy together. After all, wine is the fermented juice of a fruit. Epicures have long delighted in the combination, whether it be a ripe pear from the orchard and a glass of red wine, or a fine bowl of raspberries laved with port. Brandies, also, being the distillation of wines, go well with almost all fruits.

Now that the summer fruit season is here, we can indulge in the fun of some matchmaking, remembering that the harmony depends on how well the fruit and wine agree. The particular flavors should enhance each other and blend subtly.

Some wines, such as Chablis, are too dry and flinty to make pleasant accompaniments for fruit. Some fruits, notably those of the citrus Camily, do not go well with wines. (These are happier with a touch of one of the brandies.)

And now to matching up some good dining partners.

## Strawberries

These red, juicy berries, usualty the first fruits of summer, go well with many wines-light reds, whites and rich dessert wines-either served as an accompaniment or added to the lerries as flavoring.

## Figs

Figs are as delectable as a first course as they are for dessert, and wine goes well with them at either time. Fresh fig: with prosciutto are one of the taste treats of a summer and make a perfect beginning for a luncheon. Allow 3-1 figs per person. Peel them. slice and top with strips of prosciutto: or serve whole peeled figs wrapped with strips of prosciutto.

## Melons

Of all summer fruits. melon is probably the most cooling. It is juicy and crisp. It often appears as a first course sliced with thin slivers of prosciutto. or plain. For dessert. it is excellent alone or in combination with other fruits. The many tarieties of melons all take kindly to wines-either a white wine that is not too flinty and sharp. or light red wines or rosés. And for dessert. sweet wines are often an exotic touch.

## Peaches and nectarines

The peach almost demands wine as an accompaniment. but it is sery selec. tive. Sweet dessert wines and fortified wines. such as port, sherry and madeira, do not enhance its flavor. The classic choice for peaches is champagne. Interestingly enough, red wines are also good. and eren some of the brandies.

Nectarines. if thoronghly ripe, are a good fruit to eat from the fruit bowl. but they are probably more pleasing when poached in a plain vanilla-flavored syrup.

To poach. peel the nectarines. learing them whole. Make a sugar syrup by bringing $1^{1}$ º cups sugar. $1^{1} 2$ cups water and a 1 -inch piece of vanilla bean to boil in a skillet and cooking 5 minutes. Add the nectarines (this amount of syrup is enough for six) and poach them gently over a low flame. turning occasionally and spooning the syrup over them so they poach evenly. When the mectarines are tender but still firm. relinove to a serving dish and cool.

Peaches can be poached in a similar syrup, or. for wine-flavored peaches. substitute ${ }^{3}+\frac{1}{\text { cupe }}$ red Bordeaux wine for $3 / 4$ cup of the water and omit the ranilla bean. Tou may add more wine to the cooled syrup before serving if you wish..

2 pounds chicken necks
5 pounds chicken backs

1 pound chicken gizzards
1 egg white and shell
Put the chicken necks and 2 pounds of the backs in a kettle with the water, salt, onion and parsley. Bring to a boil, lower the heat and simmer 2 hour-Taste for seasoning and simmer a further ${ }^{\text {t}}$ ? hour. Remove from heat and strain. Return the strained broth to kettle with the remaining clicken backs and the gizzards. Simmer 2 hours. Strain the broth and cool. Skim off all the fat and clarify the consommé. To do this, strain the broth through a fine linen towel. Beat an egg white until frothy and add eggy white and egg shell to the broth. Return to the heat and cook a few minutes, beating with a rotary egg beater. Strain again through the towel, which has heen wrung out in cold water. The cag white and egg shell gather all the impurities together and make the soup perfectly clear.

Serve the soup wery hot in demitasses. If yon wish an aecompaniment, freshly made Nellia toas sprinkled with Parmesan cheer and heated in the oven is a delicious flavor and texture contrast.

## Cold Trout à la Turque

8 good-sized trout, cleaned
W' hite wine court bouillon
Garnish: fresh cooked asparagas tips.
lemon baskets of wilted cucumber salud
Poach the trout in the court bouilfon for $10-12 \mathrm{~min}$ utes or until they test done but are still firm. Cool. Trim the tails and remove the skin. Arrange on a serving platter or platters. Yon may, if yon wish, elarify the court bouillon, add a little extra gelatin if necessary. chill liquid until on point of settit $\underline{g}$ and coal the trout with it, adding any desired garnish such as dill, tarragon, or parsley. Surround with chopped set aspic, tiny cooked asparagus tips and hollowed-out half lemons filled with wilted cueumber salad. serve with bowls of sance lerte and Green Jayonnaise.

## Sauce Verte

$11 / 2$ cups ralmuts
1/2 cup chopped chives
1/ cup chopped parsley
2 tablespoons chopped tarragon

## Melbaed English Muffins

Slice 8 Engtish muffins thin, as for Melba toast. Toast them, butter lavishly and put in a warm over to dry out and crisp a little. These make a niee change from hot hread or rolls.

## Salade Rachel

1 celery root
2 good-size:l bluck truffles
6 artichokes. cooked
6 small nete potatoes, boiled
3 poonds asparagus, cooked but still crisp
Romaine or Bibb letruce
Homemade mavonmaise

Peel the celers root and ent into fine julienne atripe. It may be used raw or blanched for 5 minutes in boiling water and then drained.
(ut the trufles in slices and then into julienne atrins. C.ut the artichoke bottoms away and irim them neatly. (hon may use frozen artiehoke hearts and cook according to directions on the package.)

Peel and slice the potatoes. Cool. Trim the stalk of the asparagus neatly. Cool.

Arrange a hed of romaine or bibls lettuce on a large decorative salad server, and arrange bouyu~1 of the celery root, asparaqus, sliced potatoes and artichole bottoms or hearts on top of the gree - Camisls with the truffes and seme with a good lomemade mayonnaise.

## Frozen Raspberry and Macaroon Mousse

[^7]Poree the rawplertios and blend with the rgar. Adi the mataroon crumbs, salt and frammese. Blend with the cream, pour into a mold and freeze until mushy. \is well and freeze nutit solid.

Serve chilled muscadet with a touch of cassis as an apéritif, plain chilled muscadet with the luncheon.

This is a do-it-yourself party. Just provide plenty of food and let the teen-agers fend for themselves. It may seem like bedlam, but they will enjoy it.

## Individual Heroes

You'll need a sizable stack of split hero loaves and a mound of butter. Next to the loaves place platters of sliced salami, ham and bologna. sliced cheeses, sliced onions, tomatoes and pickles, hot peppers and greens. Keep cooked Italian sausages hot in a chafing dish. Let each guest make his own hero.

## Grilled Cheeseburgers

## 3 pounds ground beef

I pound grated Cheddar cheese
3 tablespoons catsup
$1 / 2$ cup chopped onion
I tablespoon salt
1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper Buttered buns

Vix all ingredients, except buns, and form into 4-ounce patties. Pile them between sheets of waxed paper or foil and place on a platter or board next io the grill. Have an equal amount of buttered buns. Appoint a grill monitor to keep guests moving.

## French Frankfurters

These French franks should be prepared in the kitchen and sent out to the party in relays.

With an apple corer make a hole the long way through individual French rolls. In each one put a good dab of butter. Place the rolls in a $350^{\circ}$ oven to heat for 12 minutes. Meanwhile, heat frankfurters. Brush each frank with mustard and slip it into a hot roll. Serve at once. A tray of assorted relishes is a nice addition.

## Hot Potato Salad

3 pounds small new potatoes I pound bacou
3 large onions, chopped very fine
1/2 cap vinegar
6 scallions, chopped very fine
Salt, pepper
12 hard-cooked eggs
Cook the potatoes in boiling salted water until just tender. Plunge into cold water and peel at once. Cut into quarters while still warm.

While the potatoes are cooking, fry the bacon until crisp. Remove the Lacon and crumble it. Add the chopped onions to the hot bacon fat and cook until just faintly colored. Add the vinegar, chopped scallions, salt and pepper and blend. Pour this sauce over the potatoes and toss well. Garnish with crumbled bacon and quartered hard-cooked eggs.

Great for teen-age terrace parties: a two-level serving cart that wheels easily, a portable charcoal grill and electric table oven for the budding chef, a big insulated cooler to keep a slew of solt drinks on hand. Colorful and practical: paper plates and napkins patterned like bright bandanas, giant candy-striped straws, insulated Thermo tumblers for sodas.

## Ise Cream Sundae Bar

Use large containers of ice cream and ice cream dippers. Provide a bar with fresh raspberries and strawberries. crushed and sugared, a variety of jams and preserves in bowls, bananas. chopped pecans. chopped almonds. chopped pęanuts. chocolate syrup, whipped cream and cherries-both maraschino and candied.

Serve brownies and sugar cookies. too.

## The Drinks

Arrange tubs of ice (washtubs are good for this job) filled with cold bottled drinks. Fill large insulated jugs- the type with spigots-with lemonade made from lemonade mix with a few drops of raspberry syrup added for color. Fill more jugs with orange juice made from orange concentrate.

## Cervelat Salad

What we call cervelat in this country is not the same as the French cervelat sausage. Here we substitute knockwurst.

## 6 knockwurst

1 medinm onion, finely minced
6 sour pickles or sweet gherkins, thinly sliced
$11 / 2$ tablespoons. Dijon mustard
1 cup mayonnaise
3 tablespoons sour cream
Romaine
Chopped parsley, chopped glerkins
Hard-cooked eggs, halved
Cook the knockwurst, cool and skin them. Slice rather thinly and combine with the onion, sliced pickles, mustard and mayonnaise. Toss well. Add the sour cream and toss again. Arrange on a bed of romaine and garnish with chopped parsley and chopped gherkins. Surround with halved hardcooked eggs.

Serve with thin buttered pumpernickel.

## Cold Barbecued Loin of Pork

5-6-pound pork loin roast
Drv mustard, tlivme
$1_{2}$ cup sherry
$1 / 2$ cup Japanese soy sauce
3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
2 tables poons grated fresh ginger, or 6 pieces of candied ginger cut into slivers
18 -ounce jar apple or currant jelly
1 tablespoon soy sauce
2 tablespoons sherry
Have the roast boned and tied. Rub with dry mustard and thyme. Make a marinade of the ${ }^{1}$.2 cup sherry. ${ }^{1} 2$ cup soy sauce. garlic and ginger and $^{2}$ ser pour over it. Let the pork marinate for ahout 2 hours. turning it several times as it waks. lou may let it stand all night in the refrigerator and roast it early in the morning if you wish.

To cook, remove from the inarinade and arrange a meat thermometer in the thickest part of the roast. Cook at $325^{\circ}$, allowing about 25 minutes per pound. Baste with the marinade. When the thermometer reads $175^{\circ}$. the fork is done.

Welt the jelly in a heavy pan over a medium flame and when it is bubbly. add the 1 tablespoon soy and 2 tablespoons sherry. Let it cook down for a minute or two. stirring constantly. Spoon wer the pork and cool in a chilly room. Do not refrigerute unless the day is excentionally hot.

Garnish the platter with sliced tomatoes, thinly sliced onions and sliced cucumbers. Serve with Horse-radish Applesauce.

## Horse-radish Applesauce

Combine 2 cups applesauce and 6 tablespoons fresh grated horse-radish or 4 tablespoons botled horseradish, drained. Blend well and chill. Vary the amount of horse-radish to make the sauce hotter or milder.

## Hot Fava Beans with Fresh Herbs

4 pounds fava beans (Italian broad beahs)
6 tablespoons olive oil
1 tablespoon butter
3 cloves garlic, finely minced
$1 / 2$ cup minced onion
Salt and pepper to taste
1 tablespoon chopped parsley
2 tablespoons chopped fresh basil
Shell the beans and cook in boiling water until just tender. Drain. Heat the oil and butter, add the garlic, onion, salt and pepper and cook 3 minutes. Add the beans and toss well. Add the parsley and basil, toss again and serve at once.

Note: These beans may be served cold. Simply add more olive oil and a little vinegar.

## The Drinks

To make a Summer Cocktail, fill a large wineglass with ice. Add 2 tablespoons of raspberry syrup or Framberry lifueur, 2 ounces of Lillet, 1 ounce of eau de vie de framboise or kirsch. Stir and fill the glass with Perrier water.

During the meal. drink a good chilled Alsan̄an Riesling or Traminer. Serve chilled kirsch or framboise with the coffee.

## Shrimp Aillade

3 pounds tiny shrimp
Tomato wedges, hard-cooked eggs, blach olives 4 cloves garlic, chopped
l1⁄2 cups fresh basil leaves
Salt, freshly crached black pepper
6 ripe tomatoes, peeled, seeded and chopped
I cup olive oil
Tabasco
Lemon juice
Chopped parsley
The tiny Iceland shrimp are much better than laryer shrimp for this dish. In many fine food stores in New York they come ready-cooked and frozen in blocks. The ready-cooked Pacific Coast tiny shrimp are equally good. In the South and Midwest, your best choice is the smallest fresh shrimp you can find; poach them until just done (about 2 or 3 minutes), shell and clean.

Arrange shrimp in an attractive serving dish. Garnish with tomato wedges, halved eggs and French or lialian black olives.

Serve with a boat of aillade. To make aillade, purée garlic and basil in a blender or pound to a paste in a mortar. Season with salt and pepper and mix with the chopped tomatoes. Gradually beat in oil, add a dash of Tabasco and a tittle lemon juice. Let mixture stand 1 hour to mellow and blend flavors. Sprinkle with parsley.

## Sweetbreads Albert

1 leek, well-trashed
3 stalks colery
1 green pepper, seeded
2 small carrots, peeled
6 shallots, chopped very fine
3 tablespoons oil
Salt, pepper
2 cups white wine
4 pairs sceetbreads
1 tablespoon cornstarch
3 egg yolks
Juice of 1 lemon
Chopped parsley
Cut the leck, celery, green pepper and carrots into fine julienne strips and saute with the shallot- in oil until lightly colored. Arrange the vegetables on the bottom of a deep saucrpan, season with salt and pepper to tants and add 1 cup white wine. Arrange sweethreads (unblanched and uncleaned) on the regetables and cover. Simmer the swethreads and vegetables for $1 / 2 / 2$ hour over medinm heat.

Remove the sweetbreads and cool them between wet towels. Drain the vegetables and save the kiquid. Measure 1 cup of the tiquid, atd the remaining 1 cup white wine and the cornstarch. Sinumer until slightly thickened.

Clean the sweetbreads, adding the membranes and trimmings to the drained vegetables. Purée the vegetables in an electric blender and add to the thickened white wine broth. Beat the eqg yolks lightly and add. Cook slowly, stirring constantly, until the broth thickens, but do not let it boil. Add lemon juice and ta-te for seasoning.

Slice the sweetbreads and place them on a hot platter in the oven for a few minutes to heat through. Pour the sauce over them, reserving some in a sauceboat to be passed separately. Carnish the platter with chopped parsley.

## Nutted Ala

Ala is the brand name of a cracked wheat prod-uct-a delightful change from other cereal dishes. It is particularly complementary to the sweetbreads. Follow directions on the package of ala. (For 8 persons, you will have to double the recipe.) When the ala is done, add 1 cup toasted pecan halves and 4 tablespoons melted butter. Mix well.

## Summer Salad

Leaf lettuce or oak leaf letuce. 6 scallions
1 heaping tablespoon fresh tarragon leaves
Salt, freshly ground black pepper
1 teaspoon dry mustard
Olive oil

## Lemon juice

Wash the greens and dry them. Cut the scallions very fine and chop the tarragon. Blend with salt and pepper to taste, and mustard. Add $1 / 2$ cup olive oil and 1 teaspoon of lemon juice. Blend and let stand for one hour to mellow. Add more oil and lemon juice (to taste) and tors with the grcens at the last minute.

## Spiced Crawfish

These tasty shellfish are available in Louisiana. Oregon, Wa;hington. Wisconsin, Vinnesota and many other parts of the country. They may sometimes be ordered from good fish merchants in other areas, and are often shipped by air direct to the customer. If crawfish are not available. substitute small lobsters or large shrimp.
2 quarts red uine (a good California bulk uine is excellent)
1 quart water
3 bay leares
4 cloves garlic.

1. cup Tabasco

2 tablespoons salt
3 sprigs parsley
6.8 uchole allspice

1 teaspoon turrayon
0.8 dozen cracfish

Bring the wine, water, bay leaves, garlic. Tabasco, salt, parsley, allspice and tarragon to a boil in a deep pan. Lower the heat and simmer 10 minutes. Add the crawfish and cook $8-10$ minutes or until just done but not mushy. Drain. (Save the bouillon. it can the the base for a fine bisque.)

Allow $12-16$ crawfish per person and serse chillecl. l'rovide small picks to extract the meat. They are best without sauce, but you may add a howl of French dressing or mayonnaise for dunking if you wish.

## Whole-Wheat French Loaves

2 cakes or packages yeast
2 cups hukewarm water
11/4 tablespoons salt
1 tablespoon sugar
4 cups coarse whole-wheat flour
2.4 cups uhite flour

Cornmeal
Disoolve the yeast in the warm water and stir in the salt and sugar. Add the whole-wheat flour a cup at a time. beating it in with a wooden spoon; or use the dough hook on your electric mixer at low speed. Idd enough white flour to make a smooth dongh. Cover the dongh with a towel and let stand in a warm spot to rise until double in bulk.

Turn the dough out onto a floured board and shape it into two long French-style loaves. Arrange on a baking sheet heavily sprinkled with cormmeal. Let rise for 5 minutes. Sla=h the tops with a knife. brush with water and place the loaves in a cold oven. Heat oven to $400^{\circ}$. Place a pan of boiling water in the oven and bake the bread until crusty, about 40 minutes.

## Coeur à la Crème

28 -ounce packages cream cheese
1 cup sour cream
Fresh strmeberries, or fresh strun berry preserves French bread or brioche loaf

Blond the cream cheese and som cream together to a smonth paste with a fork. If the mixture is too firm. add a little heavy cream.

Line two small for one good-sized) heartshaped straw or reed haskels or porcelain molds with cheescloth. Press the cheese mixture into the molds. Place them on a rack over a bowl in the refriperator and let them stand for seseral hours.

Unmold onto a chilled serving dish and surround with fresh strawherries. Serse with fresh berries or preserves. French bread or brioche.

The orange souflle, however, must be kept in the refrigerator or buried in a bowl of ice.

## Raw Fava Beans

Fava beans (or broad beans) are in the market a good part of the summer. They come in long broad green pods and are delicious eaten raw with salt. Simply break open the poct- slip out the beans and dip them in a bowl of coarse salt.

## Radishes

Arrange white and red radishes on crushed ice. Serve with sweet butter: or wrap each radish with an anchovy fillet fastened with a toothpick.

## Warm Brioche with Preserves and Cream Cheese

Many French bakeries make a specialty of fine brioche. Or, you may make your own.

Have a choice of several fine preserves. Try black currant, ginger marmalade. pure apricot, damson plum and raspberry, quince honey and pear butter. Serve with crean cheese.

## Empañadas

These delicious little turnovers may be filled with all sorts of savory tidbits. One of the best fillings is a mixture of chopped green chilis, olives and ham bound with egg; other stuffings can be leftover brandade de morue, Jack cheese, chopped meats, or the roast beef hash mixture given below.
21/4 cups flour
3/4 cup lard
1 teaspoon salt
$1 / 2$ teaspoon freshly ground blach pepper
Dash Tabasco
Ice water

1 medium onion. chopped
2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
$1 / 8$ cup olive oil
1 pound roast beef hash
1 tablespoon chili powder
1 tablespoon chopped parsley, or fresh cilantro if available

## Beaten egg

Blend the flour, lard, salt, pepper and Tabasco with as little ice water as needed to make a firm dough. Chill for an hour in the refrigerator. Roll out on a floured board and cut into rounds as small or as large as you like.

Saute the onion and garlic in the oil. Add the hash and the rest of the ingredients and blend well. Place a spoonful of filling to one side of each round of dough. Fold the rest of the dough over the filling to make a half circle or turnover. Seal the edges with a little water and make indentations by pressing the tines of a fork into them Brush with beaten egg and bake in a $375^{\circ}$ oven until nicely browned. This will take about 12 minutes.

## Sole en Escabeche

3 tablespoons butter
$3 / 4$ cup olive oil
Flour
6 small fillets sole
Salt, pepper
1 onion, thinly sliced and separated into rings
1 green pepper, cut in thin rings
1 clove garlic, finely chopped
$1 / 2$ cup orange juice

## Chopped fresh cilantro

## HOW TO CARVE S'NEAK

Summer or winter, outdoors and indoors, steak rates as America's farorite meat. Many people prefer the robust steaks such as porterhouse and sirloin. Which taste best if cut at least 2 inches thick, broiled quickly and then sersed in manageable portions. Here. James A. Beard, $\mathrm{H} \& \mathrm{G}$ s expert on meat cookery. show how to carve a porterhouse and a flank steak for London broil. Unlike roasts, steaks are carved with the grain of the meat as the fibers are tender and short. Although a board is recommended for carring, a stainless steel platter. heated to sizzling to keep steak hot, may be more attractive at the table.

HOW TO CARVE FLANK STEAK FOR LONDON BROIL
Flank steak, the economical cut used for London broil, is boneless and fat-free, but has a coarser grain than more expensive steaks. It should always be broiled rare and sliced very thin. Properly carved. a flank steak yields four to five servings. As London broil is carved in long narrow strips, you will need a long knife with a thin, sharp, flexible blade for slicing the meat.


Holding flank steak firm on board with two-pronged carsing fork. start cutting at small end of the flank steak.


Hold knife blade at an angle almo-t parallel to board. Cut off first slice at end of tlank.


Continue carving at same angle, cutting with grain of meat and slicing very thin


With knife and fork, transfer slices to serving plate (four to six slices per perisun, depending on appetite. menn)

## Pots-they're all pots...

Lntil you legin to think about it, the idea of a garden consisting of nothing but pot plants seems like a tour de force. But the more you consider the matter, the more sensible it seems-at least in principle. For the surest way of reducing garden care to the simplest production-line routine must surely be to grow everything in pots. To grow only part of your plants in pots would be no answer. of course-you would have to grow all of them that way in order to reap the full benefits of pot culture. Nost notable of these inherent benefits is the freewheeling portability of pot plants. Among the subsidiary benefits (and we make no attempt to rank them) are such others as the relative low cost of quantity production: the ease of watering. fertilizing. spraying; the economy of space needed to de: selop mature plants: your ability to time flowering periods by controlling growing conditions: the improved standards of flower and foliage quality possible when you have free choice of plants for display. (There are also a few drawbacks to pot gardening. For example, you can kill a pot plant by neglect in about half the time it take to neglect a plant to death in the open garden.) There is no neglect in the garden pictured on these pages. Every plant you see, except for the trees, was grown and now thrives in a pot. While the over-all plan was carefully thought out and permanent. the plants are constantly changeable and thus always appear in the peak of condition.

That is the beginning of the period when, in temperate climates. the spring shoots of trees and shrubs have stiffened and matured sufficiently to provide material from which cuttings may be taken and rooted in a cold frame to make new plants. It should not need repeating here that to root cuttingsfrom your own or friends' plantsis one of the most satisfying and inexpensive ways for patient gar deners to increase their stock of favored plants. Sometimes it is the only way to obtain specimens of especially rare trees and shrubs. (You beg or swap to obtain propagating material. This is the gardener's equivalent of horse trading. and until you have mas tered it, you are still in horticultural kindergarten.)

We are not concerned here with the details of the rooting process (which can be accomplished in a half-and-half mix ture of vermiculite and perlite, in a moist, shaded. polyethylene enclosed box). What is of immediate concern here and now is the way you keep your cutting mate rial in crisp. viable condition from the time you sever it from the parent branch to the time you actually place it -trimmed, dusted with rooting hormone powder-in the moist rooting medium. For the temporary shelter of a number of cuttings. tine a galvanized bucket with several thicknesses of wet newspaper and place an inch or two of moist peatmos- on the bot tom. If there is a lid handy. so much the better for keeping the sun from the shoots. In this humid reservoir, cuttings will remain turgid for hours. If you are a cutting collector. keep either a corered bucket in the trunk of your car or at the very least a few polyethylene freezer-bags, which alone will keep a few small cut-

In a real pinch, and when you are far from home. stop at a road side ice-cream parlor. buy or beg a few cardboard containers (pint. quart. half-gallon, gallon) and sneak some paper towels from a service station washroom. Moisten the towels to hold humidity in the containers. Poke a couple of breather holes in the lid so the cuttings won't rot. Or, if you can lay hands on polyethylene. stretch a piece of it over the container with a rubber band. Such an expedient has been known to preserve succulent cuttings in turgid condition during a week of high way driving in June warmth. In one case, the total cost for five containers was the price of one ice-cream cone--hought for good will, but relished nonetheless


## Second wecliend

Tin-can capers. Container plants are far more than just a merchandising promotion-they present a new way of putting good plants, in good condition. in the hands of gardeners at almost ans season of the year. Of the mans types of containers-paper, plastic, metal-in which bushes and even fair-sized trees are sold these days, metal cans are perhaps the most reassuring, because they alone are durable enough to permit plants to be actually grown in them for more than a season. When you buy a can-growi plant from a dealer, you can be pretty sure it is as well established as it looks. But if you botch the transplanting. where are you?

How do you unzip a plant in a gallon can without either disturbing the very root system the container was intended to pre--erre or cutting an ugly qash in your hand? Ordinary pliers äre of no avail. The old-fashoned canopener, though fair enough in principle, is too frail in practice Sewing shears will cut oue container and one only. Pruning shears will cut the metal hint may never again cut anything else. Conventional tin snip. will cut
the container metal as thongh it were butter. But the wide blades will soon begin to bind. to the detriment of the plant roots.

Our suggestion: a pair of duck-billed (or parrot-beaked) smips, with narrow twisted badethat will cut curves and work in confined space. With this useful tool (about $\$ 3$ or $\$ 4$ at your local hardware store). you can cut vertically down the side of your container, turn just above the bottom disk and cut transwersely to free the whole unbroken ball of eartli and roots with almost no bloodslied and no damage to the plant.


## Third weeliend

Prettiest vine. There are bolder, tougher, rangier, denser vines than clematis, but none more beautiful. Above everything else, the clematises are flowering plants, some of them lovely enough to compete on that account alone with any garden plant of ordinary proportions. After that, they are vines. Their flowers, varying with the species and the season, include all types from elouds of small florets to blossoms as big as dessert plates. The first bloom (on C. alpina, a slight and graceful plant with violet petals, or C. montana rubens, a wildly rampant, small-flowered rose-red) comes in early May. The last flowers of the year are likely to be the silvery clouds of C. paniculata, or perhaps C. vitalba. Bit after the flowers are gone, most of the clematis species display seed pods of extraordinary complexity and often dramatic beauty. As if all this abundance were not cnough, at least one speries- $C$. armandi-is evergreen.

Splashiest of the whole tribe are, of course, the hybrids that bloom from midspring to early summer. They reguire care to grow well, but they are wortl it. They bear, for the most part, names of the most devatating elegance, but they are so beautiful that you really don't mind the names: Perle d'tzur, Ramona, Duchess of Edinburgh, Belle of Woking, Mme. Edmuard Indré and (believe it or not) Mrs Cholmondeley. Parenthetically, wo note here that many of the clematises produce flowers on growth made the current year, oo may be pruncd in early pring, while others flower on las year's hoots, so must not be pruned till after flow cring. (Any inference that most clematises need ammal prunitg to remain in productive hape is quite correet.) As to which kinds
should be pruned which way, better eheek a good reference book or a nurseryman specializing in these plants. For an unsafe generalization: Early large-flowered sort-are likeliest to bloom on last year's shoots; later flowering ones. on this year's shoots.


## Fourth weeliend

Oills and evens. There is no logie (probably, for that matter, no truth) in the generally accepted belief that groups consisting of odd numbers of plants look more effective in the garden than groups consisting of even numbers. Yet there is such a common belicf and it does seem to be accepted by most gardeners. The reason, if there is a reason, probably lies in the matter of perspective and its relation to the third dimension. By definition, a threedimensional effeet reguires, at the very least, three-ness. Whereas two-ness cannot, by any stretch of perspective, convey a real sense of depth. Traditionally, the minimum crowd consists of three (anything less, while companionable, is bound to fall into a single plane). In the placement of plants, a three-dimensional effect is especially important when space or plant inaterial or both are limited. And the plan that consists of tri-angles-singly, or in multiplesresults finally in a livelier garden. with greater sense of movement. than a planting that was coneeived as pairs. rows or squares.

We're not sure that there is any very profound message in the foregoing. But from the depths of a misspent life
divide your overgrown permuial clumps in threes and five ${ }^{\circ}$ rather than two's and four's.

But pa-sion dependupon an inflexible rule: Let there be a first time.

## Good versus heautiful

To put a philorophical platitude as simply as posible: A rudi mentary distinction mut be made between the "good" and the "beautiful" aspects of any one object. It is easy to say that all things are both good and beautiful at once. and that these qualities exist in nature simultaneously. It is not possible. however. to enjoy what i"good" about a thing and what is "beautiful" about it at the same moment. A pear in good: To know its goodnes I must eat it \& pear may be beautiful: To know itbeauty I must not eat it. I must resolutely refuse its goodness. I must let it alone

Goodness yields itself to use: The reanon I am ju-tified in calling a pear "good" in that when 1 do use it, when I eat it. it proses to be good for me. But in the proce ess of eating it, of u-ing it up. I am of course destroying all of the properties that enabled me to call it "beautiful." lt is the nature of use to benefit by de-troving, transforming In order to build a house or a fire I must de-troy what is pleasing about the trees with which I build.

Non it is true that eating a pear or having a roof to shelter me give- me a certain kind of pleasure: My will to be fed. my will to be warm and drs. the insistent demand of my practical appetite is satisfied. But if we have nerer tired of repeating. even in the hour of our accumulation of crust- that man does not live by bread alone it is because he does in fact. possess yet another appetite: an appetite for the untouched, for the sirginal if rou will. for that primary, natural. urmolested radiance in the presence of which his aggressive will i- quieted and only his mind is pleased.

The contemplative act. then. requires rot only that we come to the party with empty hands but that we allow them to rent quietls in our lap, for the whole of it
duration. That this posture i- not entirely passise should be plain enough. It takes some effort to drop the tools of our work. It takes some courage to quiet the energy of our wills. A third condition which is imposed upon us is that we be willing to sustain this posture of alert restraint for as long as the occasion requires to fulfill itself. that we do no more than "riew with continued attention" until the informing experience can make its own inroads upon us. There i- a fourth. Wie mu-t be prepared, after all our preliminary sacrifices. to come atay emptyhanded. with nothing left to us but a memory of delight. an increase of well-being so deep and -o central and to invisibly distributed throughout the peyche that it carnot eren be located. let alone measured and codified for future use.

Te kill in our pleasures the effect we expect of them: tranquillity. composure, that unruffled expansion of being we are inclined to call happiness. Serenity is what is asked for. whether after a walh around II alden or an afternoon at the Vational Gallery. We have come face-to-face with a knowledge that ha- not resisted us. has not had to be wrestled with: it has bles-ed $n$ - with its easy amplitude. and not exen asked to be remembered on its next birthday: having neither to contend with it nor to take care to memorize its formula for future reference. we can do little more than rest content in itenjoring it- eelf-satisfring splendor for so long as the splendor lasts.

## The hasic fallacy

To regain some delight in ourselves and in our world. we are forced to abandon. or rather to reverse. an adage. A bird in the hand is not worth two in the brsh--unles one is an ornithologirt, the curator of the Museum of Natural History, or one of those Italian vendors who supplies restaurants with larks. A bind in the hand is no longer a bird at all: It is a specimen. it may be dinner. Bird- are birds only when they are in the bush or on the wing: thein worth as birds can be knouin only at a discreet, generous distance.

To make a kind of poin, we must learn to live with the fact that nothing "good" is going to come of pleasure. Delight is probably the one thing in the world that may honestly be said to be its own reward: we must not ask that it do the washing, too.
