On the cover: A delightful example of the new turn decoration is currently taking, the "garden room" in Mrs. Clive Runnells' Hobe Sound, Fla., house is a pretty paradox; quiet, restrained, but sparkling with gaiety; beautifully simple. unpretentious, but without a vestige of austerity. These are qualities, a "look," if you like, engendered by four blossoming trends: the new dominance of vividly patterned fabric; the growing prevalence of painted furniture (there is only one unpainted wood piece in this room); lots and lots of white combined with off-white (not for dazzle but to cut the intensity of the bright flicks of color); and the casual use of contemporary furniture as if it were traditional -steel and glass tables as partners for squashy, country-cousin loveseats, contemporary Danish chairs (at card table) treated to bright cushions and a painted finish. Conspicuously absent are such once-fashionable notions as bold color clashes on a sweeping scale, the element of shock, of trickiness, theatricalism. In their place is a refreshing blend of purity and sparkle, all the more arresting, in Mrs. Runnells' room, because it brings up-to-date things she has had in one house or another for years. The sofas, despite their new chintz, are old friends. The painted green chairs were once white. Older still is the Moroccan rug, the wonderful plaster stag-once a pet of Syrie Maugham's-and, ageless and superb, the Chinese porcelain pineapples on the mantel. WEDGWOOD BLACK BASALT

We recently acquired this black, ribbed cream pitcher and sugar bowl. Both are marked Wedgwood. What can you tell me about them?

H. B. F.—Indianapolis, Ind.

They are black basalt made by Josiah Wedgwood & Sons, Eturia, Staffordshire. In 1768, the famous English potter perfected a kind of pottery he named black basalt. It was considered one of his major achievements. The popularity of black basalt waned, but was revived by the company in 1900. Your table pieces date around 1918.



SCOTCH TALL CASE CLOCK

My in-laws sent this clock to us from Scotland. It had been in their family for many years. "Alexander Brand, Edinburgh" is inscribed on the face. How old do you think this clock might be?

S. M. J.—Merion Station, Pa.

Alexander Brand is the name of the maker of the movement of your clock; he worked in Edinburgh from 1711 to 1757. The case must be the work of some unknown cabinetmaker living in Edinburgh during those years.






The label on my rosewood square piano reads, J. P. Hale & Co., New York, and the serial number is 616070. When 1 bought it twenty years ago, it had an ebony finish. I would appreciate any information you can give me on this piece.

Joseph P. Hale established his piano factory in New York City about 1865. He was very successful and in time his factory produced 100 instruments a week. From the style and serial number of your square piano, I would date it circa 1870–1875.

The brunch Carol Simpson gave in honor of her weekend guests had all the style and sumptuousness of an old-fashioned hunt breakfast. Refreshments began with the usual Whiskey Sours and the various vodka with juice or consommé combinations. There was also a surprisingly good new drink (new to me anyway): a frosted Old Fashioned-really a frozen Old Fashioned-just light enough for a midday tipple. Small tubs of sweet butter and jars of Greek honey were placed on each table, too. Seconds were passed-and rarely refused-to prevent our trouping back to the buffet table.





Here are your Room Service directions:

How to make draperies with turn-back lining.

Place drapery fabric and solid color lining right sides together. Sew one edge. Smooth out fabric to half of width, iron. Baste to make sure layers stay flat together. Smooth out balance. Sew edge. Sew top. Remove basting. Turn drapery right side out. Hem bottom of lining. Blind stitch drapery hem. Iron flat. Sew pleat tape to heading.

How to make a four-poster and drape it with ready-mades.

For this you may need a man handy with tools. Make posters of 3" x 3". Headboard and tester of "4" plywood with 1" panel moulding applied. Attach rods and hooks on inner side of tester to hang ready-made draperies. Paint four-poster in two contrasting colors from Devoe's Library of Colors.

How to make a Roman Shade.

Cut fabric to window size. Allow 2" for side hems, up to 3" for bottom. Have thin brass rod cut width of shade. Use extra inches at bottom to attach rod for firmness and weight. Buy Roman Shade tape and traverse cord. Apply tape and install shade according to instructions in leaflet that comes with tape.

How to make a fabric screen to hide a radiator.

Cut section of fiberboard 22" wide and length from ceiling to floor (minus 1½" top and bottom to allow for frame). Buy extra draperies (in longer length than used for windows). Cut off top pleating, let down bottom hem and press. Stretch fabric over one side, lap around, staple to back. Frame section in 1" x 2" clear pine, stained or painted. Support fiberboard section in back with 1" x 1" struts. Tack 1" x 2" strips to ceiling and floor (6" in front of radiator). Nail screen to strips.

How to upholster walls with a panel print.

This pattern is particularly adaptable to wall covering as there are two repeats of the printed panel in the fabric width. Cut sections of fiberboard or plywood 2" less than width of fabric, and the length from floor to ceiling. Wrap fiberboard with fabric and staple to back (center design carefully). Nail covered sections to wall with finishing nails. For narrow panels at end of room, split fabric and proceed as above.

How to cover cracked walls with fabric.

Nail lengths of lath stripping vertically to wall 18" apart. With staple gun attach fabric to strips, stretching tightly from one to another. Nail lath strips, painted to match one of your fabric colors, on top of first strips to hide staples. Add painted moulding at ceiling and floor.

china, they are good-looking enough to sit in the open, but you could place them inconspicuously on shelves or in nooks. Their blend of oils and herbs disperse just the right amount of uncloying fragrance while absorbing odors. They are called Air Caddies and I found them at Bloomingdale's.

Discovered the other day that a wonderful place to buy candles is a religious supply store. They carry many sizes and many different qualities-votive lights to fat, high, altar candles, slim tapers to large, glass-enclosed sanctuary lights. The latter look marvelous when set in the midst of a bowl of greenery and, of course, they burn on and on and on. The biggest altar candles are often just the right size for those very modern fat candlesticks. The most expensive church candles are made of pure beeswax-worth the extra cost because they smell so good and are so creamy and luxurious looking. And the unbleached beeswax tapers called "black" candles have that lovely natural maple color. I understand that, lacking a religious supply store handy, you can often order candles through a local parish.

The only thing more depressing than lukewarm "hot" hors d'ouvres is cold eggs and bacon. To avoid serving them at a company breakfast requires a constant stream of help running between the kitchen and the guests. However, a grand solution for me is the excellent new hot tray designed by George



Briard. It is actually a well-andtree platter with a deep depression on each side—primarily meant, I am sure, for a small roast and accompanying vegetables. But it is just the right size for our large Sunday breakfasts as well as for piping hot goodies at parties.

After a considerable round of parties over the years, Don and I have come to the conclusion that live music makes an incomparable contribution to their success. The music may be an accordion or a full-fledged dance orchestra, a

strolling violinist, or a Spanish guitarist. And by the way, a lively local high school or college combo can usually be booked quite easily to provide music for a dancing party.

A friend of mine has an entrancing centerpiece she often uses with her checked gingham place mats for informal luncheons. It is a round raffia basket, the lid of which is a small garden of field flowers all




wonderfully contrived of colored raffia. About 12 inches across and 5 inches high, it can be both the center of attention or hide hot rolls. Once she even used it as a kind of Jack Horner Pie—a cache for small surprise birthday presents. She tells me her sister sent it to her from Halls, 1114 Grand Ave., Kansas City, Mo., 64106,—it provides instant spring at any time of year.

A dear old lady whom we annually visit always keeps lavender and verbena sachets in her guest room beds. She removes them just before the beds are turned down at night—leaving the sheets delicately scented and the guest feeling cherished.

Tips from my party-food file, hot hors d'oeuvres department: Deepfried okra rings (cut the okra into half-inch-thick slices, dip in corn meal, and fry). Deep-fat-fried, extremely thin circles of eggplant—thin to the point of being chips. Canned tamales, unrolled from their wrappers, cut up into bite-size pieces, and heated in Tacos sauce.

I often like to use hurricane shades indoors as well as out because I have found that drafts often make my candles gutter messily on the dining table. So I'm doubly delighted with my new glass candlesticks that came with their own hurricane shades. I got them in blue, to blend in with my blue dining room, but they also come in green, amber, or smoke glass. You can even tuck small flowers in the candle cups if you want.





HOW GOOD IS YOUR WATER?

With today's conditioners, even the best water can be made better—for spotless cleaning, tastier cooking, pleasanter laving

Suddenly, all across the country, we are acutely water-conscious. We are aware of ruinous floods in some places, severe drought in others. There is a growing concern about water pollution, and until recently we were appalled by the eerie spectacle of household detergents spewing into our waterways and slithering downstream in billowing, meringue-like clouds.

Although household water consumption amounts to only a tiny fraction of our national needs—industry and agriculture consume the lion's share—it is a crucial fraction. Fortunately, today's scattered emergencies are spurring an accelerated national effort to maintain a water supply that is both plentiful and safe.

But safe water may be far from ideal water. Water is an essential tool for everyday living. Regardless of its quality, it is a medium that must be put to work in dozens of household tasks—in cleaning, laundering, cooking, bathing, shampooing, drinking, ice-cube making, car washing. But how well your water supply assists you in performing these many functions depends literally on what condition it is in.

There is no such thing as "pure" water. As the greatest solvent known to man, water tends to dissolve particles of nearly everything it comes in contact with. First, while it is still rainfall, it picks up pollutants from the air on its way to earth, cleansing the air of smoke, dust, and gases. Then, as it runs its course through the earth or into lakes and rivers. water dissolves such minerals as limestone, calcium, magnesium, and iron. By the time water reaches your house, it contains these and other minerals in variable degrees, depending on local conditions.

Studies have determined that four out of five homes in the United States are supplied with "hard" water. Water is considered hard when it contains sufficient amounts of calcium and magnesium to produce a gummy soap curd. The most readily identifiable sign of hard water is the ubiquitous

ring around the bathtub. This is not "dirt," as commonly imagined, but a residue of calcium and magnesium, together with the soap which these minerals consume as they isolate themselves from the water. And until their demand for soap is satisfied, absolutely no suds or lather is produced.

The unhappy consequences of this soap-and-minerals conspiracy are many. Greater amounts of soaps and particularly detergents are necessary in hard water to perform their cleaning job. And the more soap required, the more soap curd is formed. It is this soap curd which is the real hard water culprit. It irritates sensitive skins, dulls hair, clouds and films china and glassware, works its way into clothing and fabrics when laundered, causing grayness, stiffness, and excessive wear. Experts reckon that the hard-water minerals and other impurities which lodge themselves in the fibers of clothing when laundered cause them to wear out 20 to 40 per cent faster than they do in soft water.

Hard water also precipitates a build-up of lime and other mineral deposits in hot water pipes, sometimes clogging them completely and making repairs and replacement necessary. This same lime scale can cover the heating elements in water heaters, thereby increasing fuel costs because of the reduced ability to transfer heat through the lime scale to the water.

Traditionally, most American families have accepted the water that reaches their houseeither through city mains or from a well-as a precise, unchangeable substance: If the water is soft and free of offensive odor and color, you're in luck; if the water is poor, so is your luck. Today, such fatalism has been outmoded by the growth of the water conditioning industry. A considerable range of equipment is now available to soften water and filter away objectionable tastes and discoloration. Like air, water can be conditioned to overcome any local problems and to provide an auto-

matically controlled quality standard of your own choosing. The specific, everyday benefits of such conditioned water are remarkable for their scope and variety. For example:

The money-saving advantages of conditioned water are real and substantial. Studies by government agencies and universities agree that a family of three using soft water can save at least \$8 or \$9 a month-on soaps, detergents, bleaches, and bluing in laundering; on shampoos, lotions, and even men's shaving creams (without abrasive and soap-consuming minerals in water, many men find that a razor glides smoothly even through a lather made with ordinary soap). And with mineral and chlorine tastes removed from water, it takes less coffee or tea to achieve an even better flavor; some restaurant owners claim a coffee savings of 25 per cent. And fabrics free of soap-encrusted mineral deposits not only wear longer but look, and, in fact, are, cleaner

The cooking advantages: Conditioned water boils faster than hard water. Certain vegetables, notably peas and beans, retain their color, hold their true taste, and remain more tender. For these reasons many quality canneries use conditioned water for processing foods before canning.

The cleaning advantages: The greatest drawback of hard water is its persistence in working at cross purposes with you when you are trying to get things clean. Chrome fixtures always seem to have water spots on them, as do stainless steel countertops, dinnerware, pots, and silver pieces. This is because hard water, as it evaporates, leaves visible deposits of minerals as a sure sign of its hardness. When you wash kitchen or bathroom floors, these deposits form a dirt-catching film which not only prevents a vinyl or tile surface from ever being really clean, but also makes it necessary to scrub more often. With conditioned water, all such surfaces are spotand streak-free because no residual impurities are left.

Conditioned water leaves no ring around the bathtub—an advantage worth untold hours of scouring in a family with young children. Nor does conditioned water leave stains on plumbing fixtures. Such stains as have accumulated usually disappear after mineral-free water has been introduced into a house. Moreover, the flow of soft water through rusty or lime-scaled pipes eventually will flush away the sediment; the same cleansing action will take place

in hot water tanks—and even in the tea kettle.

The health advantages: Soft water is generally conceded to have a salutary effect on skin, scalp, and hair because the major irritants-primarily the gummy soap curd caused by calcium and magnesium-have been eliminated. When a family switches from hard to conditioned water, it must adapt to a new slipperiness in the water. This is nothing more than perfectly clean water, with none of the accustomed soap curd which tends to adhere to the pores and make the skin feel sticky. Many women with conditioned water in their homes report that they shampoo their hair themselves before going to the hairdresser, since a soft water shampoo not only removes all dirt but leaves no deposit of soapy film, as hard water does.

The maintenance advantages: In addition to clogging pipes, hard water contributes to leaky faucets; its mineral deposits are an abrasive which, over weeks and months, cause wear and leakage in washers. No such problems occur with conditioned water. Similarly, dishwashers and laundries are less prone to mechanical breakdowns because they do their jobs effectively with mild soaps and detergents which are not corrosive; they do not cause metal parts to deteriorate, as do the harsher detergents necessary in hard water.

Assuming one is interested in having conditioned water in his house, how does he get it? There are many types of water softeners and conditioners—from small manually operated units with changeable filters to fully automatic systems that not only soften water, but also may filter out tastes, odors, and turbidity (cloudiness).

As a long-range investment calculated to provide you with the full benefits of conditioned water, an automatic system is the wisest choice. Basically, these systems consist of a cylindrical tank, similar to a hot water tank, containing a combination of synthetic resins through which plain tap water passes. In so doing, the calcium and magnesium elements that cause hardness are transformed by what is called an "ionic exchange" into sodium. Periodically, the softening resins must be "regenerated" by running salt brine through the tank. The minerals which cause hardness are flushed away in the salt brine. Then the softening process starts all over again, automatically.

The cost of an automatic water conditioner depends in part on the size of your family and its





The notes of a happy housekeeper

Here begins my favorite month of the year—October. All through the hazy quiet days of September I've been waiting for that final burst of beauty that comes only in October. In a brief week or two, the glory appears—golden elm, flaming maple, and brilliant pin oak, showing off their colors against the blue sky. It's a time of ending and beginning, the flamboyant richness of summer giving away to the fury of winter.

I was alone in the vegetable garden this morning and I thought about how much we'll miss it when the freeze comes. Only the chard will remain after those first freezing days, and we think the frost improves it. We will have a fine stand of Indian corn this year and pumpkins for Halloween, too. As I picked our dinner I made a mental note to save all the remaining parsley and chives. They can be coarsely chopped and put into small plastic bags for the freezer, a bit of summer freshness and flavor for a winter meal.

We made a very useful discovery the time we ran out of dishwasher detergent on a Sunday morning with a large load of breakfast dishes to be washed. We had to improvise. We rinsed and loaded the dishwasher as usual, added a teaspoon of scouring powder and a tablespoon of ammonia, shut the door, and pushed the button. The results were spectacular. Every dish was sparkling clean and so was the inside of the dishwasher. So, ever since, we have used this method once or twice a month to thoroughly clean the machine. It prevents a film of grease from accumulating on the agitator blades, walls, and bottom of the dishwasher, which in turn can make spots on the dishes.

We are really enjoying this summer's collection of rocks and pebbles. Instead of just picking up "pretty" shells and rocks, we decided to do our beachcombing with more purpose. Tom concentrated on finding interesting large rocks, the best of which are now used as doorstops. His other specialty was medium-sized stones of the kind that have a sort of black-and-white tweed look. These have a rough surface and work beautifully as knife sharpeners. One now sits on the kitchen counter and serves this useful purpose while looking quite decorative. The children and I collected pebbles. We picked up most of them at the water's edge where they're worn smooth, and tried to find as many black ones and white ones as we could. Once home, we put them in the bottom of the trays the house plants sit in and also used them as a groundcover in the garden where there are a few scrawny spots-around the bases of the trees, for instance, and where the faucet sometimes drips.

I like to begin bringing the house plants in for the winter about this time of year-a bit earlier than some indoor gardeners do, but it is my theory that the plants fare better if they can get used to being in the house before the heat is turned on. I fix up a sort of firstaid station and beauty shop on the terrace and go over each plant carefully as I move it in. First I discard those that have gotten gawky and tired-looking; only the best-looking plants pass inspection. These I trim and prune and give a good bath to remove the summer dust (the garden hose with the nozzle adjusted to the finest spray possible works well for this). I loosen the surface earth in each pot and add some fresh potting soil containing vermiculite. As a final touch I give them a light feeding, and then in they come to their favorite spots in the house.

I opened the door the other morning to find our postman looking very perturbed because of the smashed and tattered package he held in his hand. A friend of my mother's had made some sweaters





for the children, wrapped the package in what she thought to be sturdy paper and string, and sent it off. As it progressed through the postal processing and delivery, it got beaten and banged until the




sweaters were almost spilling out of the box. Fortunately, they were intact, but the postman told me that far too many packages arrive this way because they are not wrapped to withstand the rigors of modern mechanical mail handling. He gave me some very good tips about wrapping the right way: (1) Always use a box plus heavy corrugated board all the way around it, taped or tied firmly; (2) wrap the box with heavy wrapping paper, and cover all seams with wide, gummed paper tape (but not masking tape, the P.O. says); (3) label complete address of both sender and destination, cover the label or lettering with transparent tape to protect from rain en route, and use zip code whenever possible.

While shopping for bed linens several months ago, I discovered a new kind of mattress pad that has turned out to be quite wonderful. It is made of Fiberglas Beta yarn—soft, smooth, and absorbent, and

apparently indestructible. Our pads have proved to be shrink-proof, are still free from lumps and matting after countless washings. What's more, these mattress pads are said to be non-allergenic and fireproof. I got one for each bed in the house (they come in several sizes, both fitted and flat), and I really don't need more than one apiece because they can be washed and dried quickly while the beds are airing.

Tom loves gadgets, and while sometimes his fancy is caught by something silly, most of the contrivances he brings home are so useful we wonder how we ever got along without them. 
the oldest child, as chief baby sitter, sees that the herd goes upstairs (boys do sound like a herd on the stairs) and supervises it until bedtime.





AUSTR

Editor's Note: Dal Stivens, a well-known Australian novelist and short story writer, lives in Sydney with his wife and two children. An amateur naturalist with a particular interest in animal behavior, his hobbies include travel, theatre, conversation.

Americans visiting Australia often experience a shock of near recognition. It seems like home, and yet unlike home. Australia is big, sprawling, almost as large as the continental U.S.A., and Sydney, the fourth largest city of the British Commonwealth, rears a spectacular skyline on a harbor and bridge as radiant as that of San Francisco. Leave the cities for the outback or bush, as Australians call it, fly over smoky blue hills and brown plains, and the second shock of recognition comes. This is not America of today, but the American West of a century ago. True, the chocolate-brown aborigines have been dispossessed of their tribal lands (just as the American Indians were), and much of the pioneering is over except in the remote north where cattle are still grazed on unfenced ranges by cowboys who rope and brand in the open. But as American travel writer Richard Joseph said when he was in Australia recently, "It's a true geographical and emotional frontier. Things can be done by the man who wants to do them, and if life gets too sticky where you are, you can always pull out and go somewhere else."

Recently, I traveled fairly widely in huge empty Northern Territory, which is twice as large as Texas, but has only 27,000 white inhabitants. Most of them live in Darwin, the capital on the blue waters of Beagle Bay, and in Alice Springs, 1,000 miles to the south in the red Arizona-like center of semi-desert sprinkled with gray acacia scrub. The further I moved out from the towns in the Territory, the more friendly, relaxed, and courteous the people were. Some of the largeness and the simplicity of the natural environment seems to have rubbed off on them. There is an absence of pretentiousness, of keeping up with the Joneses.


Even in the large, prosperous inland towns you find this same easeful air. Australians still have space. Over half of Australia's people live in the east (Continued on page 64)





coastal towns and cities, yet outside even the big cities men can drive comfortably to work, or reach a trout stream or a golf course within a few minutes. Shortly after leaving an air-conditioned airport you can be over eucalypt-clad mountains with sandstone outcrops-so wild and fierce that if you survived a crash landing, you might die of starvation before you were found. It has happened.

Australia's older major cities reflect its early colonial history. The prosperous wool trade in the years after Waterloo gave New South Wales and Tasmania some of our finest houses. Englishmen of taste and wealth took up grants of land outside Sydney and in northern Tasmania where they built fine homesteads, usually of two stories, with porticoes or long colonnaded verandas and broad eaves, using honey-colored sandstone and bluestone or warm brick which was often painted white. The native materials-stone, brick, and timber, particularly cedar-the craftsmanship, the climate, the way of life all fused together to produce an indigenous architecture. The bright, hot Australian sun demanded that the rooms be tall and cool, the walls thick, and the verandas and porticoes wide. Working inside these imperatives, using Georgian and Regency elements, architects of the day-such as John Verge, designer of Elizabeth Bay House in Sydney (1832), Camden Park at Camden (1831) and Denham Court at Ingleburn (1832-33), and John Lee Archer who built Saundridge at Cressy-created a succession of superb houses.

Most visitors start their Australian travels in Sydney, the oldest Australian city. Its climate is much like Florida's but perhaps more favored because some (Continued on page 66)



50 inches of rain fall throughout the year.

Architecturally there are three Sydneys. The first, the colonial city of Lachlan Macquarie, the building governor of the early nineteenth century, is preserved in a small enclave in Sydney's heart. Parliament House and the Mint in Macquarie Street -the two surviving wings of the Rum Hospital (so-called because it was built by three colonists in return for a monopoly of rum) - are austerely charming if not great architecture. The wide verandas, colonnaded on two floors, have affinities with British colonial buildings in warmer countries, particularly India. The clean, chaste St. James' Church in King Street and the nearby Hyde Park Barracks in Queens Square, both essentially eighteenth century in feeling, are among the major works of Francis Greenway, the convict architect. Some of the best Greenway buildings are to be found some distance from Sydney. At Windsor, 35 miles away and magnificently sited on a hill overlooking the Hawkesbury Valley, is the mellow red-brick church of St. Matthew, the best preserved and possibly the finest of Greenway's creations. Liverpool, 21 miles from Sydney, has his Old Hospital; also St. Luke's Church, unfortunately spoiled by the addition of an ill-designed chancel.

To see early colonial houses, it is worthwhile going to Parramatta, 15 miles from Sydney, and the second oldest settlement. Experiment Farm Cottage (1798) and Elizabeth Farm (1794) are both examples of simple, unassertive early colonial single-story buildings with hospitable verandas on slim pillars, louvered shutters, low shingle roofs, brickwork, and white paint.

The second, inner Sydney (now rapidly being demolished to make way for the third, modern Sydney) has a distinctive character of its own-that of the opulent Victorian Renaissance and Gothic Revival. Gothic Revival is an acquired taste. I have a warm feeling for the romantic Victoria Markets and the restless and comical Town Hall in George Street, both ostentatiously Renaissance. (But, then, I like the Law Courts in London with its Renaissance form and Gothic detail and even the Albert Memorial.) The Renaissance buildings of the Customs House, the Museum, the Lands Department, the Department of Public Works, and the General Post Office were built over a twenty-year period by James Barnett, who shared some of Macquaries's vision for public building. During that time, Sydney acquired its two neo-Gothic cathedrals: St. Mary's and St. Andrew's. The latter was designed in part by Edmund Blacket, considered by some a better Gothic Revivalist than Pugin, designer of the Houses of Parliament in London. To Blacket also goes credit for the handsome Gothic Revival Administration Buildings and Great Hall of Sydney University.

Today, many of these ebullient Victorian buildings are being pulled down and replaced with rather characterless, aseptic window-walled skyscrapers. Many of these glass egg boxes are not even efficient. Only recently have architects begun to follow Brazil's lead and use sunshades and louvers to achieve grace of line or harmony of color. There has been no over-all planning for city renewal, but there are exciting proposals for unified redevelopment of two districts, The Rocks and the Circular Quay area. And the magnificent conception of the Opera House by the Danish architect, Joern Utzon, may (Continued on page 248)

loved everything we saw. It was uncanny. Your editors might have known us. We love a contemporary look, but with the coziness of a traditional feeling. And that's just the way this house struck us. We both love lots of color, too. All those reds and blues and yellows are wonderful. You don't usually think of a man reacting much to color, but my husband has loved color ever since he went to art school as a youngster.'

"Seeing the house with all its rooms put together is really what sold us," continued Mr. Karofsky. "As time passes," said Mr. Karofsky, "we'll be living more and more out there, too. In a few years, when our youngest son goes off to college, we'll sell the house in Newton and take a small apartment in Boston for our in-town base. My wife and I were going

to go on a trip around the world this year, but this house is much more tangible. We can easily enlarge someday if we want to. When we have grandchildren, we will need extra bedrooms and . . .



The perpetual joy of a masonry floor is ease of maintenance. Yet beautiful masonry materials-ceramic tile, mosaic tile, quarry tile, marble, terrazzo, slate, brick-are more often ruined by careless or too-drastic cleaning methods than by hard wear. It seems perverse, to say the least, to give a handsome durable floor other than the best care when the approved methods for keeping it clean are so much easier-on you as well as the floor.

The bête noire of all masonry floors is an indiscriminate use of too-harsh alkaline cleaners which you can never rinse off completely as you would rinse the suds from a china plate. On the other hand, except in heavy traffic areas, clean water and a clean mop will do a splendid job. At most, you need nothing stronger than a mild detergent. Strong cleansers attack not only the dirt; they can mar the surface of the floor, eventually leaving pits, scratches, and abrasions which attract additional deposits of dirt, not to mention the fact that they dull the color of the

Routine care

Regular once-a-week care need not, as a rule, be more complicated than a thorough vacuuming followed by a "wiping up" with clear water, then a going-over with a clean dry mop to remove excess moisture. For a more complete clean-up in the traffic areas, a once-over-lightly with a mild soap or detergent (depending upon the material) followed by careful rinsing and a dry mop-up will keep the floor as bright as it is

An important procedure in the care of masonry floors which should be made routine is the immediate wiping up of spills. Although slate is practically nonabsorbent and therefore more or less immune, any other type of masonry is vulnerable to permanent staining by liquids that are not mopped up before they have a chance to become absorbed. Even in the case of glazed ceramic tile. which is itself immune, the grout may become discolored. Since neglected spills may eventually call for costly restoration jobs (which are seldom 100 per cent satisfactory), set an example for your family by swooping down on every splash the second it lands. Reward the children whenever they remove the evidence in record

time, and if a guest accidentally offends, calmly mop up with no reference to Mrs. Craig. In no time, you will have family and friends trained to react automatically.

Sealing a new floor

Most manufacturers and builders advise sealing the surface of a new masonry floor, although a few manufacturers maintain that for their particular products, sealing is not absolutely necessary. In the case of glazed ceramic tiles, for instance, the tiles themselves do not require a sealer, but it does protect the grout. Unless quarry tile is sealed, however, the joints tend to "dust" or "powder" which is a nuisance and extremely hard to control once it has started. In any event, sealing is a procedure which should be done before a new floor is walked on, and, since you cannot take for granted that the contractor will seal the floor unasked, be sure to bring the point up and insist that he does.

To pre-seal a floor properly is a highly technical job and should be handled by a trained person. If your favorite do-it-himselfer insists on it, use every wile at your command to get him to desist before he starts, for the mileage you will receive from a professional sealing job is worth far more than the job will cost. A sealed surface will repel dirt, dust, and moisture. It will resist acids, alkalies, oil, food, beverages, most inks and medications as well as the vet untrained puppy or toddler-that is, the sealing will deter immediate absorption although the liquid should nevertheless be wiped up as soon as possible. A seal also acts as a cushion against wear and should be renewed periodically.

No need to wax

Generally speaking, waxing a masonry floor is superfluous: it does nothing to improve some materials and may actually be harmful to others. For instance, there would be no point at all in waxing slate or unglazed mosaic tiles, since you would only be masking their naturally beautiful matte texture. Nor would there be any point in waxing glazed ceramic tile which has its own permanent gloss. If you were to wax terrazzo, you would soon discover that the wax stays on top of the masonry and "walks off" almost at once. Waxing does not in the least enhance the smooth surface of marble and

since it is so smooth, may make it slippery, therefore dangerous underfoot. Waxing white marble will turn it yellow—and not the pleas-ant mellow yellow that comes from natural aging.

Some people do wax quarry tile, although, if the floor has been sealed, the wax serves no useful purpose except to build up a high gloss which will completely obscure the soft, lustrous patina that is its distinguishing feature. If wax you must, use a self-polishing liquid wax of the type you would use on vinyl tile. A solvent-base wax or wax-cleaner (fine for wood) is not good for quarry tile and a paste wax would be extremely difficult to buff without leaving a few dangerous slippery spots.

Each of the six different types of masonry floor materials also has individual characteristics that call for slightly special or at least individual treatments for specific problems. (For all aspects of the care of brick, see page 240.)

Ceramic tile

In washing ceramic tile, either the glazed type or the unglazed mosaic, use a mild synthetic detergent rather than soap. The latter leaves a greasy residue which is well nigh impossible to rinse away and builds up very fast. Mildly abrasive powders may be used on ceramic tiles for ground-in or longstanding grime, but before you use an unfamiliar cleaner, particularly on glazed tile, try it out on an inconspicuous spot, e.g., behind a door. (This would be wise in the case of any type of masonry floor.) A few highly acidic cleaners have been known to leave whitish etched markings on glazed ceramic. Whatever cleaner you use, rinse and rinse, then dry-mop excess moisture.

Before cleaning a tile floor, it is a good idea to start by dampening the whole floor so that the water will prevent the grout material from absorbing the cleaning agent. Repeated applications of cleaners without dampening the floor first are likely to discolor the grout material.

Big news on the grout market is a new variety that is practically stainproof. If you are installing a new tile floor, be sure to ask for it as the word is that it will wear indefinitely without changing color.

Apart from the grout, a glazed ceramic floor is practically impervious to penetration by

stains unless it is scarred or pitted. Unglazed mosaic tiles, however, are susceptible to stains. If you should acquire an older house with mosaic floors that have been abused, make an effort to find out from the previous owner what caused the stains. For a major stain-removal project, you will need a specialist, and if he is armed with full information, he will be able to do a far better job. Small stains may be dealt with as follows:

Iron rust: Wet stain with warm water. Sprinkle with a thin layer of acid-type powder cleaner. Scrub to mix; allow to stand for several minutes; scrub again, then rinse with warm water. If iron rust stain persists, repeat procedure, allowing cleaner to remain on as long as two hours.

Ink: There are many types of ink, but for plain writing ink apply a thin paste made by adding sodium hypochlorite disinfectant to a porcelain cleaner. If ink spot persists, make a 1/4-inch-thick poultice of the paste and leave on until dry. Any resulting brownish stains may yield to the treatment for iron rust, above.

Oil: Scrub with a mild soap and water solution; rinse. If spot remains, make a paste by adding water to a water-soluble alkaline powder such as Oakite. Spread like poultice over affected area and allow to dry. Brush off, then wash with clean water and dry.

Paint: Apply a non-flammable liquid paint remover or trisodium phosphate (Ajax, Comet). Allow to stand, remove with many rinsings of hot water.

Lime and hard-water deposits: Wash surface with solution containing 2 cups of vinegar to each gallon warm water, then rinse thoroughly with clean warm water.

Quarry tile

Mild soap and water is suggested for cleaning this material. To remove common household stains, treat as for ceramic tile.

Slate

Slate laid in its natural cleft form will show scratches less than a slate floor with a sand-rubbed finish. For the first few weeks all slate shows marks, but gradually they disappear. Since the sealer may wear off a slate floor in the high spots or traffic lanes, turning the material a lighter color, the floor may need to be rubbed down. and resealed periodically.

Because slate is non-absorbent, most stains can be removed by the appropriate solvent or cleaner without fear of leaving a mark. For instance, you can safely Continued on page 263







# PERMANENCE AND CHANGE

In today's fast-moving, fast-changing world, we all long for something that can be counted on to stand still. A sense of permanence is essential to security and serenity, and the one place we can ensure permanence is at home.

The seeds of permanence are sown with your selection of a site or a neighborhood to live in, and they flourish with the affection you develop for a beautiful view, with the satisfactions of working on your own land, of watching a shrub or a sapling you have planted grow to maturity. A sense of permanence emerges from the care with which you plan your house or plan to live in it, from the comforts and pleasures you create for each member of your family, from the furnishings and bibelots you collect over the years to fill personal needs or bring personal delight.

But people change, or they should. And as they change, their needs and tastes change—not only the fluctuating tastes of young people, but mature tastes as well. For even the most independent spirits reflect to some degree the taste of their time, and the taste of the time is always changing. A house from which all change is barred looks not merely old-fashioned, but obdurate, insensitive, dead.

Where do these conflicting needs for permanence and for change leave us? In H&G's opinion, the answer to both lies in the word *continuity*—the art of judiciously preserving the best of the past as you move toward the future.

A slow, smooth, graceful movement, however, is never quite so easy to bring off as an impulsive leap. It takes, first of all, a healthy confidence in your own taste, the strength of your own esthetic convictions. And since everything must have a beginning, assuring continuity requires a canny eye for appraising the life expectancy of the new. This means the ability to judge it solely on its merits for you, remaining equally impervious to the mere novelty of a modern design or the popularity of a currently fashionable traditional style. It also means being able to predict for each new acquisition its long-range possibilities after your present need for it has passed.

Obviously continuity is dependent upon quality (of materials, construction, finish) as well as upon care (it is well to remember that cleanliness is the best preservative: air-borne dirt can wear out some things as fast as hard use).

Above all, continuity calls for a sensitive appreciation of the things you already own and have lived with, countered by a lively imagination to see what a big difference one small change in them can make. For it is the relatively small but frequent changes that give permanence its vitality. Continuity, in fact, might be defined as permanence continually renewed.



# A HOUSE THAT TIME CANNOT WITHER, NOR CUSTOM STALE

# CASA CONTENTA

An indignant and wily foe of calculated obsolescence, Mrs. Clive Runnells has put her enemy to rout many times during her life, and in no house more implacably than in Casa Contenta, her winter home in Hobe Sound, Fla. Designed in the Mediterranean style by architect Kemp Caler, the Casa is a rambling, winged curlicue, painted for coolness, in the Portuguese manner, the pale blue of a faded hyacinth—a pretty pallor that ends at the front door. Under-roof, Mrs. Runnells cares not at all for pastels, and with the help of interior designer William Baldwin (he has worked with her on four houses, is starting on a fifth), she has strewn her rooms with deep clear blues and pinks and greens, pert as flowers and foliage against white walls. Fresh, sparkling, gay, this lacquering of fabric and paint hides a secret: practically everything in the house Mrs. Runnells has had for donkey's years. All she does is keep her possessions healthy and blooming, a feat simpler than it sounds and as rewarding as sustaining a friendship.

Acquisitive as Pooh, she never stops buying furniture, fabrics, bibelots, rugs—what have you. If she can't use them at the moment, she stores them away, either for her children or for that possible next house that may be looming somewhere on her bright horizon. But rarely in her life has she bought anything she regretted or, depending on its importance, does not cherish. She has that rare form of intuition that senses when something will stay in style—or will not. Inherent shoddiness, however gilded, she skips by on the double, and halts for nothing unless it stores, deep down, the inimitable kernel of quality. (Continued)

# THE LIVING ROOM'S TREASURES

Casa Contenta's principal living room is a bit statelier than its garden room, which you see on our cover.

Nevertheless it is an open-arms kind of room geared for comfort and coolness. All the furniture came from Mrs. Runnells' former Hobe Sound house except the two scarlet Chinese hatboxes, recent acquisitions put to dashing use as end tables. All the coverings, however, are new, and although the pattern of the print was changed (it used to be butterflies), the deep blue is a repeat. Mrs. Runnells finds it cool, calming, and a nice color to have around. Among her more important treasures are the porcelain foot warmers on the shelves over the sofa and the two filigree lamps—all of them trophies of a shopping spree in Japan.

Mrs. Runnells owns nothing that, as far as she can predict her future tastes, she is likely to tire of. Enormously sentimental, she often has curtains and bed trappings, when they wear out, copied in the identical fabrics rather than new ones (this is where her storehouse serves her well). "Something that is really good once, is always good," she insists. She likes change, but only to perfect a room that, in her eyes, has never been quite finished. When the final touch has been added, a sixth sense tells her so, and she has learned from "fussing too much" to leave perfection alone. In Florida, however, Mrs. Runnells does not live in Mycenaean splendor. Casa Contenta is a lighthearted house built for fun, sun, entertaining, relaxing, and, as tropical houses must be, endurance. Every fabric in it is of cotton, and the Moroccan rugs are as tough as the goats that sired them. There are conventional curtains in only two rooms, for in Florida shutters are better. Lovingly, she deprecates some of the furniture (none of which she is about to part with), saying it is right for the Casa—"It's a holiday house!"—but for nowhere else. Which could be. But there are more than enough treasures to give the house character and, as far as simpler chattels are concerned, enough loving care, superb upkeep and renewal to make Mrs. Runnells succeed where Ponce de Leon failed.

As though a giant had picked it up and set it down, the living room's bay window group was transplanted in toto from the old house. Newly re-covered, fresh as paint, the sofa and chairs hug the bay like a snug wheel with an early modern coffee table for a hub. Brand new are the Moroccan rugs, the eyelet embroidered curtains bases and an effective one-piece way of bringing light up to the proper level without tables.

# GUEST ROOM: "MEXICAN HAYRIDE"

Mrs. Runnells' tag for one of her guest rooms was prompted by the fact that the furnishings, although charming companions, are so diverse: iron beds from Spain, Victorian chairs from her mother's house in Philadelphia, Moroccan rugs, Mexican bric-a-brac. Bedcovers, skirts and canopies are exact copies of former trappings caught in a fire in her former house.

# THE DINING TERRACE

Almost a cabaña, the poolside dining terrace can, and often does, seat fifty guests at a flock of fold-up storable tables. At other times, it is used as a porch, even in windy, rainy weather when the canvas curtains are pulled and anchored to the floor. The aluminum furniture, repainted, re-covered, came from the old house, as did the "rafraîchissoirs," old pets of Mrs. Runnells that once cooled wine in France. Reformed, they now make admirable Floridian homes for begonias and ivy.







# DRESSING ROOM-HIDEAWAY

Every house, Mrs. Runnells believes, should have its ivory tower. Hers is her dressing room, a queen-sized compound of bath, mirrored closets, massage salon, and snoozing spot: She naps on an old French daybed under the wing of a favorite painting by Jack Davidson. The pink fabric is one of her darlings; re-cut, the curtains are from the old house. New rug, designed by a French artist and woven in Mexico, was found in a shop in Phoenix, Ariz.

# ROUND-THE-CLOCK BEDROOM

"I live in my bedroom," says Mrs. Runnells. Which means she does all of her desk work, most of her reading, and a great deal of chatting in a very personal climate of Eden that existed in a former bedroom and was simply re-created. Here is more of the prized pink chintz, and its strié pattern is copied in paint on a chest of drawers. On bed and chaise is a floral partner bought in Paris twenty years ago and still going strong. ("The French know their business!") Over the chest, a special delight: an Austrian mirror etched in German with every woman's question: "Mirror, mirror on the wall, who is fairest of us all?"

# HOW LONG WILL MODERN LAST?

The talent for creating a home with a satisfying sense of continuity depends in large measure on the ability to appraise the new-the ideas, the materials, the designs of today. What are their chances of survival? How can you tell the difference between passing fashion and timeless style-between the long-chance experiment ("let's see how it will work") and the enlightened solution to a problem squarely faced ("why did no one think of that before")? Contemporary design, like contemporary history, is a rather bewildering forest that is often hard to see for the trees. In both cases, the best guesses about the future are sometimes made by looking backward, so in order to answer the question, "How long will modern last?" we might well start by asking "How long-and how well-has it lasted?" And we are not rushing history when we ask that question today, for the first modern houses built after World War II are now almost twenty years old, the lifetime of the average mortgage.

Modern houses were built long before the war, of course—including the "prairie" houses of Frank Lloyd Wright. But their numbers were infinitesimal compared to the Dutch Colonial, Tudor, and "modern" Georgian designs that crowded most architects' drawing boards. And for a decade or so before 1937, the majority of modern houses (apart from California where a contemporary style was gradually evolving from an indigenous tradition) reflected the International Style that had been transplanted from Europe and South America and never quite taken root. Well planned and well built

as many of those early modern houses were, their blocky contours look oddly old-fashioned to us today.

On the other hand, many of the modern houses built immediately after the war look shabby—partly because shortages, labor scarcity, and zooming prices precluded their being really well built, partly because their designers failed to appreciate the problems of maintaining some of the materials that contributed to the modern look. Such failures, of course, were not confined to houses of contemporary design: similar miscalculations brought about the early obsolescence of many a traditional house. But for a truly unprejudiced look at the staying power of modern, we should stay away from the known failures and turn to houses that were acclaimed unqualified successes when new.

Recently H&G visited two such houses—one built four years before Pearl Harbor, the other, four years after V-J Day. Both are still owned and lived in by the people for whom they were designed and neither has yet been substantially remodeled. The earlier house is the one John Yeon designed for Aubrey R. Watzek at Portland, Ore. The other is the famous glass house that architect Philip Johnson designed for himself in New Canaan, Conn.

In plan, design, and materials the two are as far apart as they are in geographical location. But each represents the early, if not the first, use of certain ideas that we have since come to take for granted and other ideas that even today seem so new it comes as a shock to realize they date back so many years.

# THE HOUSE OF WOOD-1937

Built entirely of wood, the traditional native material of the Northwest, the Watze house marked two innovations in the use of wood: The exterior was sheathed not in shingles or clapboard siding, but in flush horizont boards of Douglas fir, and most of the room were paneled in wood—in itself an old ide but at that time almost forgotten.

The Watzek house turned its back on the street—a highly unorthodox procedure for those days. What is more it was built around an enclosed courtyard, a semi-sheltered out door room of the kind that is still news toda (See "A House Divided," September, H&G an "A House of Surprises," August, H&G.) And the only door in what appeared to be the frowall of the house opened into the courtyat (and still does) where a covered loggia led the house itself.

At a time when "bringing the outdoors in was a brand new and daring phrase, this hou was painstakingly oriented to two, sharply co trasting outdoor views—an intimate vista the planted courtyard and a big dramatic view of Mount Hood, 50 miles away. It was the views—plus beautiful materials—that we used in lieu of decorative ornament.

The glass areas of the house clearly preshadowed today's glass walls and the share identity of walls, windows, and/or doors. each room, a series of rhythmic, modular glass.





After sixteen years of waxing, the brick floor has acquired a satiny sheen, a deep cordovan glow.

Meanwhile the hefty girls presiding over the space—a sculpture in

papier-mâché by Elie Nadleman—have been immortalized in the 12-foot-liigh replica that stands in the foyer of the New York State Theater at Lincoln Center.

Since the cabinets that screen the sleeping area are only 6 feet high, you get a generous view of treetops even in that direction. All electrical

outlets are set in floor, and lights, except for one waist-high lamp, are hidden in black cylinders placed on the floor, where they are almost invisible.



At dusk when the glass walls reflect the surrounding trees, the house becomes a transparent mirage.



panels, extending from ceiling to waist height or from ceiling to floor, included some fixed panes, some that opened as doors or casement windows. But when all were closed, you couldn't ell (still can't) which were which.

The numerous inventive details—sliding ouvered screens at some of the windows, planter beds recessed in the floor, compartments for adio and movie equipment concealed by sliding wall panels—were not matched even in modern houses until years later.

The Watzek house was one of only five American houses illustrated in the 1949 edition of a European book on modern architecture. To see how the house looks today, please urn to pages 188-191.

duilt of glass and steel, the building materials of the machine age, the Johnson house was evertheless acclaimed by some critics as one of the most romantic houses of the postwar eriod. An oblong box with four glass walls, ach pierced with a central glass door, it possesses a precise symmetry rare since the houses of Palladio. More important, it brought the autdoors in to the ultimate degree. Sitting intide the house was (and is) like sitting outdoors with greenery (or snow) on every hand, yet being at the same time blissfully protected from ind, rain, cold, or any other discomfort that hight vitiate a wholehearted delight in nature.

This was one of the first houses to consist actually of one large room, with the living, dining, cooking, and sleeping areas marked off by furniture arrangements, freestanding storage dividers and, in this case, a large circular brick chimney enclosing a bathroom. It was also one of the first houses with a wholly open-to-view-kitchen—a chest-high line-up of counters, cabinets, and appliances that turned an elegantly deceptive walnut back to the eyes of guests.

Reviving an ancient custom with the impact of a modern innovation, the floor from one end of the house to the other was paved with brick. And a new-old grandeur of scale was achieved by doors that reached clear to the 10½-foot-high ceiling (a dramatic measure that recently has begun to be widely emulated).

Even in such a house, the glass would have to be screened occasionally, but conventional curtains, when closed, would have muffled it in fabric, and when open, would have bunched clumsily at the corners. The architect's solution, brand new at that time, was a series of free-hanging fabric panels that could be pulled across the glass individually on a series of four ceiling tracks.

When it was built, the glass box created such a stir that an important consideration in its design was often overlooked: Even though planned to meet only the limited needs of a bachelor, it was never intended to be a complete, self-contained house. "I knew I could live in a glass box only if I had someplace else to put the things I didn't know what to do with,"

says the architect-owner. The "someplace else" was the almost windowless brick guest house. As a pair, the one transparent and one opaque house foreshadowed the multiple house that began to appear only a few years ago. (Since completing his own house, architect Johnson has adapted the same basic ideas to houses for families with children.)

The house of glass was first published in H&G in October, 1949. To see how it looks today, please turn the page.


### THE SEEDS OF SURVIVAL


As revolutionary as these two houses may have seemed when they were built, each incorporated certain traditional elements that gave it roots in the past, and in consequence a sense of time-lessness. Each house was specifically designed for its site and even more significantly, the site—in the form of the views it afforded—was integrated with the design of the house. Inevitably, as the site has matured, the house has mellowed. Both houses were marked by a high degree of quality—in materials, construction, and meticulousness of detail. And since the materials were on the whole easy to maintain, both houses have been well preserved.

The only conclusion we can draw from these case histories is that excellence—whether in a Greek temple, a Renaissance palazzo, a Federal mansion, or a modern house—will endure. The older it gets, the brighter it glows.


ew changes have occurred in the Johnson house since it was built, other than dditions made either to complete the original plan or to create an extra source of delight. The furniture, most of it designed by architect Mies Van der Rohe, was bready nineteen years old when Mr. Johnson moved in, so chairs and benches ave been reupholstered in a shaded creamy beige leather. A rosewood dining able that could not take the strong sun in the southwest corner of the room has been replaced by a table with a marble top. And there have been additions and abtractions among the sculpture. The only major remodeling has been in the uest house. The wall was removed between two of the three bedrooms and the whole space was transformed into a kind of muffled inner sanctum where an automatic rheostat magically controls lighting hidden above the new columned ouble-domed false ceiling. When you switch the control lever into one of its five r six positions, the light slowly waxes or wanes, apparently without human aid.

n a newly made pond at the foot of the steep slope behind the house,

Mr. Johnson a few years ago built his *folie*, an arched pavilion

of cast concrete that is a tour de force of false scale. From the house it
looks elegantly lofty, but only a rather short adult can stand erect in it.

Not until you walk around to the back of the house do you discover its most dramatic façade—
the elegant portico outside the two-story living room—and its strong vertical lines are even more impressive now that the Douglas firs and western red cedars native to the site tower over the shallow pitched roof. Perimeter planting has flourished with little coddling, for outside the courtyard only native plants were used.

Ever since it was new, the house has had a look of permanence because it was so closely related by design and materials to its natural setting. Foundations, retaining walls, steps, and chimney were all built of native shale which frost had broken up into varying thickness.

At the left of this grassy walk at end of bedroom wing is a vine-draped private entrance to courtyard.





The sheltered ambiance of the courtyard has been kind to the more exotic plants and trees used there: flowering crab, magnolia, Japanese maple, oleander in tubs. Flower

beds are supplemented by pots of
daffodils and tulips in the spring, fuchsias,
geraniums, and dahlias in the summer.

Covered loggia leads from front door, past the pool (beyond railing) to entrance door at corner where courtyard wall joins house.

Almost nothing has been changed in the Watzek house, not even the furniture, most of which was specially designed for the rooms by Mr. Yeon, who also designed the landscaping as well as the house itself. "The house was built when my mother was living and is larger than I would build for myself today," Mr. Watzek says. "But it has been an easy house to keep up because of the extensive use of wood-the oak floors, the paneled walls. And the windows are easy to wash because the panes are so large." The living room paneling of noble fir (a native wood that grows high in the Cascade Mountains), although it was finished only with colorless wax, has not darkened with the years, but remains its original golden honey color. And the whole house has retained undiminished the qualities that have endeared it to its owner from the beginning: "simplicity, warmth, openness -with plenty of light and sunshine flooding the rooms."

One of the great delights of the house is the unfolding sequence of varying spaces as when you turn from the low-ceilinged hall into the expansive 14-foot-high living room, right, which was carefully designed on an axis with Mount Hood, 50 miles away.



At the other end of the living room, above, a deeply recessed smaller window offers a contrasting, small-scale view into the courtyard. Sliding wall panels near fireplace (at the right) conceal compartments for record player, record storage, film projector, and screen.



As you turn down the hall in the opposite direction, you face the big
three-sided window of the dining room, below, and watch it widen until the
mural of trees and wild flowers extends clear across the width of the room.

Wood-paneled walls here are painted white, the canvas
covered plaster ceiling, a warm coral. Original built-ins
include recessed buffets on both sides of room.



### THE TRUE MEANING OF

# comfort

The essential question of comfort is: how to survive most pleasantly, once we are born. Birth is emergence into light, cold, noise, hostility, and manners. Comfort is ease, intimacy, warmth, the sense of being protected and loved. The summum bonum of comfort is probably the womb. Second best: the nest, the cave, the home, whatever shelter the creature finds or builds to protect himself from the inclemencies of nature, to please his mate and to propagate his species. "If nature were more comfortable," a heroine of Oscar Wilde's exclaims, "we would not need architecture." Comfort is better understood by women, as any woman knows who has had to reorganize a bachelor's quarters.

I dislike women who claim not to need comfort; they are cold and unmotherly or else hypocritical. I distrust those who like it but who are unable to create it; they are like those species of blackbirds who, too indolent to build their own shelters, usurp the nests of other fowl. "Le style est la femme même." The comforts of a home are the very extension of a woman's warmth and hospitality. Luxury can be bought by wealth, but the creation of comfort entails time, diligence, planning, imagination, a sense of fitness, a capacity for love. I think that one of the reasons why twentieth-century America has developed the highest standard of comfort in history is because its women have had such a strong voice in demanding it. They are assisted, of course, by the miracles of technology, and by the democratic ideal that all beings are created with an equal right to comfort.

### The discomforts of luxury

Whereas comfort means being without need and may involve survival, luxury offers enjoyment beyond physical well-being. In botanical terms a "luxuriant" plant is one in which the organs of nutrition are more developed than the organs of reproduction: the plant eats more than it needs to thrive and reproduce its species. Luxury usually entails formality, and it can be extremely uncomfortable, as it was at the court of Louis XIV. Two thousand fresh tuberoses were planted daily in the gardens of Fontainebleau, but, for dearth of facilities, the courtiers relieved themselves in corridors and out of windows. Some 500 men were engaged in the preparations of the king's luxurious meals, but his food arrived stone cold because of the lengthy ceremony of its service. Madame de Maintenon sweltered in summer and froze in winter because the King refused to put shutters on her windows: they would have spoiled the formal symmetry of his architecture. "We shall all die of symmetry!" she exclaimed. She was a woman and understood comfort. Marie Antoinette, in the 1760's, found the relaxation that Madame de Maintenon had longed for by building Le Hameau and dressing as a milkmaid. For what happened two decades later, see Flaubert's definitions: "Luxury: the downfall of great states . . . Comfort: the greatest invention of modern times."

The very word "comfort" is a relatively new invention. Its present sense is only two centuries old in the English language. Originally derived from the two Latin words con and fortis (with strength), it was used in England from the twelfth to the eighteenth centuries in a strictly spiritual sense. It meant moral aid and sustenance, spiritual support, as in the sixteenth-century translation of Isaiah: "Comfort ye my people," and in the psalm "I will praise Thy name, O Lord, because thou art so comfortable." You only gave comfort to or were comforted by those you loved. But sometime in the 1760's the word "comfort" fled the realm of spirit and entered the street, the drawing room, the dwelling. When, in 1775, the influential linguist Dr. Johnson writes about "the comforts of a warm home," and when Boswell enters in his journal that Child's is his favorite club because it is "dusky, warm, and comfortable, with a society of citizens who talk politics very fully," we know that the word is firmly established in its new, materialistic sense. It now means well-heated, well-bedded, wellfed, well-sheltered. From England it invades the Continent a few decades later, and it is described in the nineteenth-century Larousse, with peevish chauvinism, as "that word which the English borrowed from us, and which we have recaptured."

Words arise as new desires need to be described. The new, physical sense of the word "comfort" was a concept of the Enlightenment and of the democracies that followed it. It expressed that intense quest for earthly happiness which characterized the eighteenth century. It flourished with the growth of the natural sciences, with the new concern for mankind's health, with medicine's revolutionary endorsement of bathing the body. Wesley's preaching that "Cleanliness is next to godliness," was crucial to the development of "confort moderne." The new sense of comfort thrived on Rousseau's optimism: man, being born good, de-

serves comfort, and behaves best when most at ease. Equality, liberty, informality: in the very decades when the word took on its bodily meaning, a new class of men toppled the ceremonious hierarchies of baroque courts, and requested that their own comforts replace the luxuries of an elite.

### Padded status symbol

Few single commodities reflect the leveling, democratic character of comfort better than the armchair. Throughout the Middle Ages, the chair with a backrest had been the luxurious prerogative of kings and bishops; serfs and petty nobles alike huddled on backless benches and stools. At some seventeenthcentury courts, no two nobles could sit on armchairs in the same room: it was a prerogative of the man with the highest title, and an usurpation of this privilege led to long courtly vendettas. The padded, rounded armchairs made available to the rising middle classes of Europe in the 1750's was a status symbol as powerful as the ownership of a car in the 1910's, a yacht in the '30's, or a private movieviewing studio in the '60's. It was also the first chair since Greek times designed with a concern for the contour of a man's body, a concern crucial to our twentieth-century commodities. The new eighteenthcentury armchair must have given its owner both the old and the new sense of the word "comfort." It gave him physical comfort for his spine such as he had never enjoyed, and the moral support of knowing that he had a new place in the social hierarchy. "You, too, can be seated like royalty!"

A few months ago, a French magazine still ran an advertisement claiming that a certain make of upholstered sofa had "confort Anglais." Having originated the modern sense of the word, the English speaking nations enlarged the concept. Since civilization began, whatever empire has been most powerful, be it Rome, Persia, Byzantium, or France, had set the world its style of luxury. But as world leaders, England and the United States began an important precedent: instead of setting the fashions of luxury to subservient nations they have modeled its standards of comfort.

As the world's first industrial power, the fate of England depended on giving the masses physical well-being to keep their good will. To a rising class of factory workers and industrialists the new nineteenth-century comforts meant the paving of streets, improved methods of heating, gaslight, and plumbing, the cheap mass manufacture of upholstered furniture and textiles, the control of disease by

vaccination and antiseptics. A German traveler, as early as 1820, remarked that "the English think that soap is civilization." Physical comfort, by Victorian times, had become a moral category, and the Victorians were understandably smug about it. A definition in the 1883 edition of Crabbe's Synonyms runs to this effect: "Comfort, that genuine English word, describes what England only affords. Comfort must be sought for at home, pleasure is pursued abroad."

Charles Dickens' American Notes, his travel journal, vividly expresses the discomfort of a nineteenth-century Englishman in venturing "abroad." Although the United States was destined to inherit and vastly improve British standards of comfort, it seemed a raw and uncomfortable frontier in the 1850's to a Victorian accustomed to punctilious manners, substantial upholstery, and a diligent class of domestic servants. Dickens was appalled by the bare furnishings of the best American houses, by the familiarity and paucity of America's servant class, and by the general informality of American manners, "marked by a prevalence of the two odious practices of chewing and expectorating." He sums up: "... American customs, with reference to the means of personal cleanliness and wholesome ablutions, are extremely negligent and filthy."

It took a century before another Englishman, Alfred North Whitehead, could write about the United States that "its diffusion of comfort among the masses is one of the highest achievements of civilization." By the time that judgment was made, the United States had taken England's place as the leading political power and had replaced it as the world's most comfortable nation.

### The American Revolution

Since that shift of authority has occurred, the United States has revolutionized previous standards of comfort in three major ways: (1) Automation is steadily shrinking the small gap between the need and its fulfillment. Comfort is now immediate relief, immediate supply. (2) In the servantless society which Dickens predicted for us, comfort is increasingly geared to women's needs rather than to men's. (3) Mass-produced comforts are being brought to a major part of our population at the price of a disturbing anonymity. For if advertising gives any clue to our national desires, the creature comforts of the 1960's must be "distinctive," "distinguished," and "unique" to be desirable.

The first two points have in common that womblike principle which is the essence of all comfort. At night, twentieth-century men and women increasingly demand silence, (Continued on page 254)

# BRIGHT IDEAS FOR BORROWING

Rooms and corners of rooms that designers create for exhibitions can be a mine of inspiration if you learn to look at them the right way. Representing as they do flights of imagination uncircumscribed by the demands of a particular client or house, they are not very likely to fit your own needs

and tastes ready-made. But after you have enjoyed your first impressions and noted how each designer has met the challenge of the exhibition committee's assignment, look again. Study the color combinations, the use of materials, the decorative accents. These are the elements you can borrow and adapt to your own, probably quite different, needs. To demonstrate the technique, H&G attended the Tour of Décor put on every few years by

the Women's Board of the San Francisco Museum of Art and devoted this year to rooms for cooking and dining, some in the museum, others in Ghirardelli Square—an exciting new shopping center in a remodeled

chocolate factory. Stimulated by the inventive settings, we came back with a notebook of ideas for decorating, kitchen planning, menus, and entertaining, many of them several steps removed from the main theme of the show.



Kitchen planner Janean designed a new-fashioned German kitchen with slender Gothic windows and dark cabinets, beams and moldings set against white walls and ceilings. Her utensil: the fluted Bundt pan (used in German baking) on the preparation counter framed with spice drawers, BELOW. Borrowable ideas: a rolling cart, LEFT, with butcher-block top, racks for wine on one side and slatted shelves for cheese and fruit on the other, planned to recess in a space vented to a basement or the out-of-doors.







## A NEW WINDOW TREATMENT is like a new face

### FLOATING MOSAIC

Of course the mosaic in Mr. and Mrs. Harold Watkin's Kentfield, Calif., pool does not really float; it is supported on concrete legs, yet seems light as a lily pad. The errant jets keep the mosaic pattern shimmering even when the pool is empty. This multicolored oasis in the midst of an oasis was one of those happy afterthoughts that indeed transformed a pretty but unexceptional swimming pool into a year-round joy. And when the pool is swarming with swimmers, the island supplies both a convenient handhold and a pleasant conversation center. The mosaic top itself was designed and executed by Ray Rice. ### UNDERCOVER GARDEN

This one is not really under cover, neither is it actually roofed, but it is enough of both to become an immediate delight to the beholder. So what more natural (once you have thought of it) than to curve a narrow reflecting pool at the garden's apron into the wide covered porch? You may pay five cents to put a good idea to work—or five thousand dollars. You may pay nothing except the effort of doing something a little differently from the way you, or for that matter anyone else, would normally do it. A good idea can have two, three, or four dimensions (in the landscape, time is one of the most important dimensions of all). Whatever it is and whatever results from it, the impact on the people exposed to it must be immediate, unmistakable, and understandable. A good idea will wear well—if it does not, you will quickly be tired of it and its usefulness will be ended. Best of all, it will work even better in an old garden than a new one.


Once your idea is put into effect it must attract immediate attention in order to accomplish its purpose of transforming your garden, yet it should not be simply a show stopper. Too luminous a highlight could blind you to the rest of the garden's merits. And an inappropriate object, however valuable or however successfully it might grace another setting, would surely diminish the garden it was supposed to enhance. The ideas —and their embodiments—on these and the next two pages meet all the tests we can think of: some of them surely are spectacular, some are merely beautiful, some are fanciful, some are pleasant amalgams of all these qualities with a strong dash of practicality added. Perhaps best of all, each has alternatives that could seem equally inspired.

### ONE GOOD IDEA continued





One is for show, so to speak, and one to grow on. What would have been a too empty forecourt in the California house of Mr. and Mrs. William L. Keaty was transformed by a shallow but wide brick-walled water garden beneath and about a stylized shell-like fountain. It takes but a few clumps of papyrus and comparable plants to make the big pool a garden, only a simple symmetrical jet to make the little pool a fountainplus, of course, a perfect sense of proportion and design. Perhaps the reason this patio adornment commands more attention than many similar water effects is that it comprises two wholly dissimilar constructions—one, the quite conventional brick circle, the other a quite conventional but equally simple fount in its midst. ### THREE-DIMENSIONAL WALL

Kempner's house in Houston, Tex., is textured by the shadow traps created by spaces between the bricks. The curves form fine plant niches, and the whole wall both conceals and glorifies the entrance.

#### WHEEL WITHIN WHEEL


This is the nether millstone—but one designed to help turn apples into cider, not grain into flour. ### CONCRETE CUTOUT


The difference between this garden wall on Long Island, N. Y., and a similar wall with a conventional doorway in it is akin to the difference between the sound of laughter and the snarl of rush-hour traffic. Not the friendliest of unadorned structural materials for a garden wall, poured concrete can be a delight when handled with imagination. One of the secrets of making a successful doorway in a solid wall, quite apart from the design of the arch, is to enclose it completely-top and bottom, as well as sides. Another is to be sure that it frames a view-or even a mysterybeyond. Both these points are involved in the almost universal popularity of the Chinese moon gate. 

Architects and landscape architects are looking today with reawakened appreciation at the ancient material that has been called "the best prefabricated building component ever invented by man." Brick, in addition to its sound structural virtues, offers rich visual assets: a range of mellow natural colors; textures that invite the play of light and shadow; a capacity for composing fascinating patterns that resemble weaves of giant strands of yarn. Here and on the next two pages are some of the delightful ways that brick can be used.








n use for at least 5,000 years, brick has served almost every style of architecture from Roman and Byzantine through Regency and Victorian. Today it is being employed increasingly in contemporary houses, both for solid structural walls and in the form of veneer over a structural framework. Because of its rich decorative quality, brick is also growing in popularity for indoor use, and in the garden it seems to have a natural affinity for plants and trees.

The warm natural color of brick comes from the earth itself, from the clay that is shaped and baked (traditionalists say "burned") to form the hard blocks. Since clays differ in color as soils differ, they produce bricks in beige and yellow and in tones shading from off-whites through darkest grays as well as in endless nuances of pinks and reds. A New Englander who has fallen in love with a shade of California brick may feel momentarily frustrated by the fact that brick is rarely shipped over long distances. But this geographic limitation has its esthetic aspect: Products of the earth look best on the land from which they came.

The over-all color of brick masonry is especially beautiful when bricks of several related tones are mixed at random. The blends sold by brick companies usually contain several shades to a load, or you can order equal quantities of different shades and make your own blend. It is the blended colors, along with the rough-weathered finish, that attracts many people to antique or used brick. Today, you can also get bricks finished on one face with a tile-like glaze in one of several clear, bright colors.

The rich and varied texture of brickwork has two aspects: The first is the texture of the brick itself, which can be made smooth or rough in a variety of ways, such as toolscoring, sand-molding, water-striking. The second aspect is the larger-scale texture of the finished masonry, which varies according to the mortar technique. The mortar joints can be made flush with the bricks, concave, overflowing, or scored. And still bolder textures can be created by recessing or projecting individual bricks or whole rows or courses. When you stand close to a brick wall or pavement, you can see clearly the complexities of such textures, but as you move away, the complexities dissolve into a subtle softness that no simple flat surface can achieve.

The facility with which brick can be used to create an almost limitless number of patterns is due partly to its range of sizes, partly to its shape. The standard American brick measures 8 by 3¾ inches by 2¼ inches thick. But the handmade Colonial-style brick is 10 by 4 by 3 inches, and the Norman and Roman styles are still longer. Add to the variety of patterns suggested by these various sizes the fact that the six faces of brick offer three different shapes (see above), each of which can be set either horizontally or vertically. You can also get bricks in squares and in an assortment of decorative forms that serve as the building blocks for classic architectural moldings in designs similar to wood moldings. Rugged texture can be given to a wall by recessing the mortar joints. For deeper texture, several rows of handmade Colonial-style bricks in this garden wall are recessed and top is stepped back or corbeled. For safety underfoot, steps and walk are paved with smooth bricks laid with flush joints.



Rhythmic shadows on the corner of a house are produced by quoining—i.e., slightly indenting every fourth row of bricks. On the slope of the corbeled chimney where it narrows in girth there is a switch of the exposed brick face from the "stretcher" to the "shiner."







# It takes very little to MAKE YOUR LAUNDRY PRETTY



The last bastion of the antiseptic, sterile look, banished long since from today's cock-of-the-walk kitchens and bathrooms, seems to be the laundry. A puzzling fact, when you consider that none of the activities that take place in the laundry today pose any threat to decorative materials and delicate colors. There are no fumes to cloud the walls, no grease to spot the floor—only the fresh clean presence of soap and water. And since the room is more likely than not to be small, it takes very little in the way of decoration to make it gay and inviting. Pastel equipment offers one starting point. But surrounded by color and pattern, standard white equipment can make as pretty a splash as a white-lacquered table or a white-covered sofa in the living room. Color on the floor, brightly painted cabinets, pretty wallpaper, even the simplest of curtains—each by itself can go a long way to make the laundry a room to linger in. And this, as a bonus, can increase the room's utility by suggesting that the laundry would be a pleasant—as well as the most efficient—place to mend the clothes as they come and go. Above all, a sparkling laundry—whether it is located next to the kitchen, near the bedrooms, or en route to the garage or porch—is a room whose door can always be proudly left open.

# HAPPY MARRIAGES OF WINE AND MEAT

While the pairing of wine and meat, like all good marriages, ultimately a matter of individual choice and preference, there a some well-established guidelines that can contribute greatly to the happiness of the liaison. The rule of thumb about serving a red win with a red meat, for example, is generally a sound one when you a having a roast. Yet the dicta about what goes with what are more r laxed these days. While you would usually choose a light red to a company a veal roast, some people drink, with perfect assurance, white with this delicate meat. Similarly, with a boiled beef dish such as pot-au-feu, you might prefer the freshness of a white to the boo of a red. And although a perfectly roasted filet should certainly accorded the compliment of a fine Burgundy, Bordeaux, or premiu American red, it would be folly to lavish the same wine on a har burger or a beef stew, where a modest European wine or an Ame can Mountain Red would be much more appropriate and compatib So, common sense is the best guide to follow when picking a wine f a dish. The following chart, while listing the established marriag of wine and meat, also indicates where other choices are just as good





### Roast Meat Cook Book

By James A. Beard

he eighteenth-century wit who remarked, "Heaven sends us good meat, but the devil sends cooks," probably had reason for his quip. Although roasting is the earliest known method of cooking meat, it is by no means the easiest. Even in America, a country of meat-eaters with a reputation for raising some of the world's best beef, a perfectly cooked roast is still something of a rarity. For while our improved kitchen equipment has made roasting as much a science as an art, a really fine roasting cook must still be blessed with (or acquire) the practiced eye, sensitive finger, and the uncanny intuition of the exact moment to take the roast from the oven that characterized the traditional rôtisseur. Variations in cuts, grades, and sizes of roasts can all affect the end result, and the charts that time a joint by weight

are not only fallible, but practically useless. In addition, the cook should be skilled in giving the meat the almost imperceptible seasoning that makes the telling difference in flavor and texture.

The days of the turnspit were perhaps the golden era in roasting. There are few gastronomic delights to equal a spitted joint, brown and juicy, roasted to a turn. The secret of roasting is the even circulation of heat on all sides of the meat, at which the spit excels. If you don't have a spit (many ovens are now equipped with them and there are excellent rotisseries on the market, both electric and gas), roast your joint in the oven on a V-shaped rack set in a shallow pan or on the rack of the broiler pan. But never use the conventional, misnamed roaster, a deep rackless pan that stews the bottom of the meat in fat and juices as the top browns.

## ROASTING TEMPERATURES FOR OVEN AND MEAT

There was a time when roasts were put into the oven at high temperature and roasted for ½ to ¾ of an hour, at which point the heat was reduced and roasting continued until the meat was considered done. Today we find that slower cooking at one temperature makes for more even-textured, even-colored meat. You can in fact roast at temperatures as low as 180° or 200° with astonishingly good results. At these temperatures, of course, your roast will require from ⅓ to ½ again more cooking time.

Certain roasts may be cooked more quickly than others. For example, a leg of lamb can be cooked at 350° or 375° if you watch it carefully. Pork is best if roasted at 300°-325°, with a generous amount of cooking time, and basted to give the skin or crackling a nice flavor and texture. Veal should be roasted slowly and not be overdone. With veal, try to gauge the point where it is juicy with just a bit of firmness in it, rather than letting it go on to the stage where it is stringy and dry. Mutton, if you are fortunate

enough to find a source for it, should be very well aged and cooked in the same manner as lamb.

There is no reason for cook books, meat thermometers, and various public agencies to perpetuate the idea that an inner temperature of 140° will yield rare beef. Inevitably it will be medium rare or even medium. If you wish to have truly rare beef, remove the roast from the oven at 120°-125°. Allow it to rest in a warm place for 15 minutes—this is nothing more than a slight cooling process—so it will become a bit firmer and easier to carve. Rare meat is pink from the outer fat to the bone or center—not bloody, but juicy and pink (or red, according to your definition of color). If you want your beef "bleu" it should come out of the oven a few degrees before reaching the rare stage.

Lamb should be removed from the oven at 130°–135° if you want it rare, as many people think it should be. If it is allowed to reach 160°, which is often prescribed for "pink" lamb, it will be an unappetizing gray-brown color and, for some of us, ruined. The same temperature can be used for a saddle of lamb or a boned and rolled shoulder. Baby lamb, on the other hand, should be roasted until it is barely pink—to a temperature of about 150°—for best results. Again, allow your roast to rest for 10 minutes or so before carving. Veal should be roasted to an internal temperature of 150°–160°. This temperature ap-

plies to the leg, shoulder, and saddle.

Stuffed breast of veal should be roasted to 170°, because it is a strangely textured cut of meat which requires rather long cooking to make it tender. Pork must be roasted to a temperature of 165°–175°, to the thoroughly cooked stage, for a variety of reasons. It is safer to eat (although trichinae are killed at a much lower temperature), it is easier to carve, and, quite simply, it tastes better.

If you can find a meat thermometer with a full dial, ranging from 0° up, by all means buy it. It is preferable to those that key various cuts of meat to certain temperatures. Do not leave the thermometer in the roast, but insert it only long enough to check the temperature from time to time. Some ovens, however, have a thermometer attached on a cable, which you insert and leave in the roast, and this gadget is extremely efficient. You can set the alarm for the desired temperature and check no further.

It is equally important to take the internal temperature of a roast before you place it in the oven if you want to time it properly. Obviously a roast with an icy interior will take longer to achieve the prescribed temperature than one that has been removed from the refrigerator for a period of time. It is surprising what 2 or 3 hours at room temperature will do to start the roast on its way.



### BEEF ROASTS

### Prime Rib Roast of Beef

A standing rib roast is best if it is large—at least three ribs. If you want a smaller one, my advice is to broil it as you would a steak. A five-rib or larger roast can be magnificent when presented at table. Have it cut short, and, if possible, well trimmed and tied so that carving will be easier. Never worry about leftovers, for few things are as delicious as cold roast beef. It may even be frozen after cooking and stored for several weeks.

Naturally, the roast should be either USDA Choice or Prime. There is a great difference in butchers and their treatment of a roast of beef. Some do not age beef long enough. If you have a co-operative butcher, try to order your roast a fortnight or so in advance, in order to let it hang for an extra amount of time.

To prepare the roast, score the fat and rub it well with freshly ground black pepper. Also rub some of the pepper into the flesh and on the bone side. Place the roast on a rack, rib side down. Roast at any of the following temperatures, without basting:

 $200^{\circ}$ —approximately 30–35 minutes per pound.

300°—approximately 15–18 minutes per pound.

325°—approximately 13–15 minutes per pound.

For rare beef, the inner temperature should register 120°-125° when the thermometer is inserted into the thickest part of the meat without touching the bone.

Salt the meat during the last 15 minutes of cooking and after testing the temperature a final time. Place the roast on a platter, this time resting on its broader flesh side. Allow the meat to settle for 12–15 minutes before sending it to the table.

You may serve the pan juices with the meat or a Bordelaise or Périgueux sauce (see page 236). Horseradish is considered a must by many, as is mustard, but if you are doing justice to your roast by drinking a fine claret with it—such as an Haut-Brion 1952—you will certainly forego either of these condiments.

With the roast serve oven-browned potatoes, small buttered new potatoes, or Potatoes Anna.

A second vegetable might be braised onions in Madeira or yellow turnips with mushrooms.

#### Roast Sirloin of Beef

Ask your butcher to give you a roast from the sirloin or shell, from which he cuts steaks. This is the short loin and contains some of the most expensive meat on the market. However, the fat is more perfectly distributed than on a rib roast, and the meat carves beautifully. Roast as you would a Prime rib roast. Also carve as you would a rib roast, or you may rest the sirloin on its bone side and cut straight down.

Serve with Potatoes Anna or sautéed potatoes, and perhaps petits pois. If you would like a sauce for the beef, serve one of those suggested for rib roast, or a Béarnaise. Drink a good St. Emilion—a Château Cheval Blanc or an Ausone.

### Rump Roast of Beef

This cut is not as well known in the United States as it is in Europe. However, it can be flavorful and tender, and if correctly cut, slices beautifully at table. It is not as butter-tender as the previous roasts, but it is excellent in texture and makes an interesting change from the usual cuts. The roasting rules are the same as for the rib roast. Pepper the meat well and rub with a small amount of salt. Roast on a rack to an internal temperature of 120°-125°, salt well, and let stand for about 15 minutes before carving. A Sauce Madère would go well with this roast.

Serve with jacket potatoes and an excellent salad. Drink a good Beaujolais, a Fleurie, or a California Pinot Noir.

Flavor variations for these roasts:

- 1. Rub the roast well with rosemary and pepper before roasting.
- 2. Rub garlic in the fat and flesh and along the bones before roasting to perfume the roast lightly.

### Roast Filet of Beef

In these days of small kitchens, limited storage space, and quick cooking, the filet is an ideal choice for a dinner party and lends itself to a great variety of flavorful preparations. The cut itself is expensive, but there is no bone and little fat.

Filets weigh 4-10 pounds or more and have a coating of kidney fat on one side. This is easy to remove, as is the membrane underneath.

Before roasting, remove the small end of the

filet (the "filet mignon") and save it for a tiny sautéed or skewered steak.

### Filet of Beef Wellington

Cream cheese pastry or brioche dough
Butter
1 pound mushrooms, finely chopped
Salt, pepper
1 filet, about 6 pounds, well trimmed
½ cup cognac
Foie gras or mousse of foie gras
1 egg, separated
¼ cup cream

Prepare the pastry (double or triple your usual recipe) and chill it well before rolling. Melt ¾ pound butter over low heat, add the mushrooms, and let them cook very slowly, stirring occasionally, until the water in them has evaporated and they have turned quite dark. Add additional butter if the pan appears to be dry. Add salt to taste and a few grinds of pepper. Set aside.

Trim the filet and rub it well with butter. Roast on a rack in a 325° oven until it has reached an internal temperature of 120° (it must remain rare through the second stage of cooking). Remove from the oven, flame with cognac and season with salt and pepper to taste. Allow to cool thoroughly.

Roll out the pastry to fit the filet—you will need enough to envelop it and to overlap on the underside. If you have some pastry left over, cut it into decorative shapes for the top of the crust.

Spread the foie gras or mousse of foie gras over the filet. Then spread the mushroom mixture on the pastry, roll up the filet in the pastry, trim it and seal the edges with egg white. Turn the pastry-covered filet over so that the overlapping edges are on the bottom, and place on a piece of aluminum foil. Transfer to a rack. Decorate with the pastry cut-outs, securing them with water or egg white.

Beat the egg yolk and cream together and brush the pastry well with the mixture. Bake in a 425° oven for 10 minutes. Reduce the heat to 400° and bake another 10 minutes. If the crust needs further cooking (it should be golden and cooked through), reduce the heat to 350° and cook a little longer.

Serve the filet with sauce Périgueux, tiny green beans, a purée of carrots with butter or braised celery. Drink a Chambertin or Gevrey-Chambertin.

### Flamed Roast Filet of Beef

5-6-pound filet
Olive oil
1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
1½ teaspoons salt
½ cup cognac, heated
Chopped parsley

Rub the filet well with oil and freshly ground pepper. Place on a rack in a roasting pan and roast in a 350° oven for 45–50 minutes, or until the meat thermometer registers 120°–125° (for rare). Brush with oil occasionally, if necessary. Salt the roast and let it rest for 10 minutes. Remove to a hot platter and blaze with the heated cognac. Sprinkle lavishly with chopped parsley.

Garnish the platter with grilled or baked tomatoes and watercress. Serve with sauce Périgueux (see page 236) and asparagus Hollandaise.

#### Marinated Filet of Beef

6-8-pound filet
1 cup Japanese soy sauce
3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
2 tablespoons chopped fresh ginger,
or 1 tablespoon chopped candied ginger,
washed free of excess sugar
½ cup sherry
¼ cup peanut or olive oil

Trim the filet well. Combine soy sauce, garlic, ginger, and sherry in a large bowl. Rub the filet thoroughly with the oil and place it in the bowl. Turn a number of times, and let it marinate for several hours, turning once or twice.

Place the filet on a rack, and roast in a 350° oven for 45-50 minutes, or until the meat thermometer registers 120° (for rare). Baste with the marinade several times during the roasting. Remove from the oven, and let it rest for several minutes before serving on a hot platter. Pour pan juices over the filet.

Garnish with broiled mushrooms and watercress and serve with wild rice and toasted almonds. Drink a Châteauneuf-du-Pape.

### Elizabeth David's Savory Stuffed Filet of Beef

3 large onions, thinly sliced


1 filet, about 7 pounds

6 tablespoons olive oil
4 tablespoons butter
2 cloves garlic
18 pitted black olives, coarsely chopped
½ cup chopped cooked Virginia or country ham
Freshly ground black pepper, salt
1 teaspoon thyme
2 egg yolks, beaten
2 tablespoons chopped parsley

Sauté the onions in the oil and butter until just limp, then add the garlic, olives, ham, I teaspoon pepper, thyme, and I teaspoon salt, and cook until well blended. Stir in the beaten egg yolks and parsley, and cook for about 3 minutes.

Cut the filet not quite through in rather thickish slices, and spoon the stuffing between slices. Run a needle and string through the middle of the filet, or tie it securely. Place on a rack, brush with oil or butter, and roast in a 300° oven for about 50 minutes, or until the internal temperature is about 125°. Let it rest for 10 minutes. Salt lightly, and place on a hot platter with a garnish of watercress and tiny glazed carrots.

Serve with a Sauce Bordelaise and tiny buttered new potatoes, and drink a Hermitage.



### LAMB ROASTS

For years lamb was the most unpopular meat in the United States, and no wonder. It was mostly roasted until it was gray-brown in color, stringy in texture, and rather tallowy in flavor. The recent upward swing in lamb consumption is clearly due to the fact that pink and even rare lamb has now become popular and the meat therefore is more palatable.

For the most part the lamb we get in this country is a well-matured animal which, in the prime or choice categories, is tender and flavorful. There is also a certain amount of baby lamb available at fancy butchers around the country, but this brings premium prices at all times.

The choicest cuts of lamb for roasting are the baron (the saddle together with the legs), the saddle, the leg or gigot, the rack, which makes an excellent roast for a small dinner party, and the crown. The boned and rolled shoulder is ideal for spit roasting.

Lamb, to be pink, should roast to 130° on the meat thermometer and rest for 10-15 minutes before being carved. Taking 130° for a norm, you can adjust the temperature up or down, according to your own taste.

### Rack of Lamb Persillé

The rack is best if roasted at a higher temperature than the other cuts and basted often. A rack should be served at once.

1 rack, about 6 chops 2 cloves garlic, very finely chopped ¾ cup bread crumbs ½ cup finely chopped parsley Butter Salt, freshly ground black pepper

Ask the butcher to cut the rack so that you can carve right through the chops without having to struggle with the bones. Trim it and wrap the bone ends of the chops with foil. Blend the garlic, the bread crumbs, and parsley. Rub the roast well with butter and freshly ground black pepper.

Place on a rack in a roasting pan, and roast in a 375° oven, basting every 10 minutes. After about 20 minutes, test for internal temperature. If it is near 130°–135°, remove from the oven. Blend the degreased pan juices with the crumb mixture, salt the roast and spread an even film of the crumb mixture over it. Dot with butter, and return to the oven until the mixture has browned nicely and the rack is done.

Serve with sautéed potatoes and broccoli au buerre noir. Drink a light red Bordeaux.

### Crown Roast of Lamb

This is a very attractive roast when properly trimmed and tied. You may have a smallish crown roast or one made with a double rack. Allow about 2 chops per person.

Fill the center of the roast with a ball of foil to keep the crown in shape during roasting, and cover the bones with foil or cubes of fat to prevent them from charring. Season the roast well with freshly ground black pepper and tarragon, and roast on a rack in a 325° oven, allowing about 13–15 minutes per pound for pink lamb. With a crown it is difficult to take a reading on a meat thermometer.

Let the roast stand for about 10 minutes in a warm place. Remove the covering on the ends of the ribs and replace them with paper frills. Fill the center of the crown with any of the following: 1. Tiny new peas mixed with tiny onions, well

- buttered.

  2. A rice pilaff mixed with finely cut and quickly
- sautéed lamb kidneys.

  3. A purée of chestnuts, with braised chestnuts
- as a garnish.
- 4. Braised chestnuts and Brussels sprouts.
- 5. Sautéed mushroom caps sprinkled with tarragon, parsley, and chives.
- 6. Cracked wheat.
- 7. Wild rice and almonds.

Serve the pan juices, or anchovy-flavored Hollandaise sauce or a Béarnaise sauce, substituting fresh mint for the tarragon in the latter.

Also serve a Bibb lettuce salad tossed with diced cooked beets. Drink a modest Bordeaux wine such as a Château Grand Puy Lacoste or a Cos d'Estournel.

#### Saddle of Lamb

The saddle is sometimes called the double loin or double rack. The best saddles are cut from the loin. Ask the butcher to remove all excess fat and the long, flat flank sections. The saddle should then be rolled and tied so that it looks trim. Rub well with freshly ground pepper, a little salt, and a bit of rosemary. Place on a rack and roast in a 325° oven, allowing about 12 minutes per pound, until the internal temperature has reached 145°. Salt again just before removing from the oven. Let stand for 10 minutes in a warm place before carving.

Remove the strings which hold the roast together and with a sharp knife cut the meat in long, thinnish slices parallel to the spine. Run the point of the knife along the bone to loosen the slices. Repeat on the other side. Turn the roast over and remove the small filets on the underside. Slice them in rounds. Serve each person a long slice and one or two of the small slices from the filet, with some of the pan juices.

Potatoes Anna and lightly sautéed zucchini are excellent with this. Drink a good red Chassagne-Montrachet.

#### Variation:

Season the saddle well with rosemary and a little garlic. Roast as directed. Broil or roast at least one lamb kidney, trimmed and soaked in milk for 1 hour, for each serving. Carve the roast and garnish it with the kidneys and the rounds of the filet. Sprinkle with chopped parsley, buttered crumbs, and salt to taste. Serve with Hollandaise sauce seasoned with garlic and finely chopped anchovy filets to taste.

#### Roast Leg of Lamb

Have the leg cut without chops attached and with the shank bone left intact, not cracked as one finds so often. The leg should be well trimmed and all excess fat and the membrane removed. Rub it with freshly ground pepper and a touch of rosemary and place it on a rack in a shallow pan. Roast in a 325° oven until it registers 130°–135° when tested with a meat thermometer. Salt well 15 minutes before removing from the oven. Allow to stand about 10 minutes before carving.

Serve with the pan juices and tiny buttered peas. Drink a very light red wine—a Moulin-àvent, young and fruity, would be extremely good.

#### Garlie-Studded Leg of Lamb

Peel and sliver 4-5 cloves garlic. Make incisions in the leg with a very sharp pointed knife (such as small French paring knife). Force the slivers into the incisions and rub the roast well with pepper and a touch of rosemary or tarragon. Place on a rack and roast as in the previous recipe.

Serve with white beans, blended with the pan juices, and a bit of peeled, seeded, and finely chopped fresh tomato. Drink a Chinon or a Bourgeuil.

#### Variations:

Provençal I: Cut 4-6 cloves garlic into slivers. Make fairly deep incisions in the leg and alternate garlic and anchovy filets in the incisions (you will not need to add much salt to this anchovied leg). Roast. Serve with a ratatouille and drink a Châteauneuf-du-Pape.

Provençal II: Make incisions in the leg and stuff with garlic, pistachio nuts, and anchovies, pushing them deep into the incisions. Rub the leg with a touch of thyme and summer savory and roast. Salt lightly and serve with a gratin of eggplant. Drink a well-chilled Tavel.

### Gigot Made to Taste Like Venison

This dish used to be a 4-day affair. However, a new product on the market called Instant Meat Marinade short-cuts the time.

1½ cups red wine
Juice of 1 lemon
6-8 peppercorns, crushed
2 envelopes Instant Meat Marinade
5-7-pound leg of lamb
3 cloves garlic, slivered

Combine the wine, lemon juice, peppercorns, and Instant Meat Marinade. Place the lamb in the marinade, and run a fork through the meat according to directions on the package. Make incisions in the leg and insert the slivered garlic. Remove the leg from the marinade after 15 minutes and place on a rack in a broiling pan or shallow roasting pan. Heat the marinade in a pan.

Roast in a 325° oven, basting every 20 minutes or so with some of the heated marinade. When the internal temperature has reached 135°, transfer the leg of lamb to a hot platter and allow to stand for 10 minutes before serving. Combine the pan juices with the remaining marinade and cook down by a third. Strain and correct the seasoning. Serve with the lamb.

Also serve a purée of chestnuts blended with butter and nutmeg and beaten with a small amount of cream, or braised turnips. Drink a Gevrey-Chambertin or a California Pinot Noir. Note: If you make a regular red wine marinade, marinate the leg for 4 days before cooking.

#### Shoulder of Lamb

A boned and rolled shoulder may be treated in any of the ways suggested for leg of lamb. It is an ideal roast for a rotisserie or a spit because of the absence of bones.

### VEAL ROASTS

Veal is the most difficult of all meat to find in its best state. When it is young and whitish-pink in color, it is unbelievably good. Unfortunately, this is as hard to come upon in the United States as brontosaurus filets! Most of the veal we get is almost baby beef, of a rather dull, ashes-of-roses color. If you have a good Italian butcher or a butcher who supplies local meats, you may find a source of fine veal. A certain amount is being developed around the eastern seaboard under the name of plume de veau. It is superb white veal, carefully tended and accordingly expensive.

The double loin, which corresponds to a saddle, and the loin (sometimes called the tender-loin), which is a boned rack, are the best cuts for roasting. If you can get young white veal in your community, the rump makes a delicious roast, and the cut which corresponds to the eye of the round in beef is also excellent.

Veal should be roasted covered with foil or cooking parchment for part of the time. Sear it first or brown it under the broiler and then cook it slowly. Overcooking robs the meat of its juiciness and makes it tasteless. Veal needs seasonings and additives; without them it can be dull fare.

Ask your butcher to bard the veal and tie it securely. This keeps it moist and juicy. Have a well-seasoned sauce with roast veal.


### Saddle of Veal Prince Orloff

This classic dish is tricky to make, but the effect is impressive if you are giving a large dinner party.

Saddle of veal, trimmed and tied Bacon slices Salt, pepper 2 or more cups Sauce Soubise Slices of truffle Grated Parmesan cheese

Wrap the saddle of veal with the bacon slices, tying them securely, and place on a rack in a shallow roasting pan. Roast in a 325° oven, basting with the pan juices from time to time, until the veal reaches an internal temperature of 165°-170°. Season with salt and pepper a short time before removing from the oven.

Transfer the saddle to a hot platter or board and remove bacon. With a very sharp knife remove both filets by running a knife around the bone. Cut each filet into scallops large enough for individual servings. Brush the bone section of the saddle with Sauce Soubise. Replace the scallops, brushing each one with Sauce Soubise and placing a slice of truffle on each. Reassemble carefully so as to make a perfect saddle. Then spread the entire roast with Sauce



Soubise, and sprinkle lightly with grated Parmesan cheese. Place under the broiler or in a very hot oven for a few minutes to glaze. Arrange a row of truffle slices along the center of the roast, and place on a hot platter with a garnish of tiny braised onions and potatoes. Serve with a string bean purée and drink a Médoc of a fine year.

#### Sauce Soubise

3 fairly large onions, finely chopped 1 cup rice 3 cups chicken stock 1 teaspoon salt White pepper 2 teaspoons sugar 2 tablespoons butter

3-4 tablespoons heavy cream

Cover the onions with water, bring to the boil, and cook for 6 minutes over medium heat. Put the rice and stock in a saucepan and bring to a boil. Add to the onion mixture with the salt, pepper to taste, and sugar, and pour into a well-buttered casserole. Bake at 350° until the rice is very soft and rather mushy. Purée the mixture, reheat with the butter, and stir in about 3-4 tablespoons heavy cream. The sauce should be thick and rich. To make sure it is thick enough, let it cook down a little before adding the butter and cream. Makes about 2½ cups.

#### Roast Rump or Leg of Veal

Roast the meat on a rack in a 325° oven, allowing about 22 minutes per pound, until the internal temperature is about 165°. Baste occasionally during the roasting. Before roasting, place a veal knuckle in a roasting pan and brown it under the broiler or in a 450° oven. Sprinkle the knuckle with flour and brown that as well. Transfer the bone and its juices to a deep kettle and add 1 quart water, 1 cup white wine, 1 teaspoon tarragon, I small onion stuck with 2 cloves, 1 clove garlic, and 1 small carrot. Cover and simmer for 2 hours. Strain through a piece of muslin or linen. Add 1 cup dry white wine and reduce the broth by 1/3. Correct the seasoning. This sauce may be served as is or with these variations: Thicken sauce with beurre mani\u00e9 and add \u00e42 cup finely chopped sautéed mushrooms.

Add 12 finely chopped anchovies and 1 tablespoon capers


### Ham-Larded Loin of Veal

8–10 strips country ham or Smithfield ham, about 6"–8" long and 3s" thick Medium dry sherry Double loin of veal, boned and tied Ham fat, bacon, or fat pork Salt

½ cup currants, soaked in 3 tablespoons sherry

Soak the ham strips in 1 cup sherry for I hour and insert them in the veal with a larding needle. If you have a whole ham, cut the fat in thin slices from the top to cover the veal.

If ham fat is not available, cover the top of the roast with bacon rashers or fat pork. Roast on a rack in a 425° oven for 30 minutes. Reduce the heat to 350°, cover with a piece of foil or parchment, and continue roasting, basting occasionally with sherry, until the roast reaches an inner temperature of 160°–165°. Remove the bacon or ham fat and the foil for the last 45 minutes and baste the roast with the pan juices and additional sherry, if desired. Salt to taste.



Remove the roast to a hot platter and allow to stand in a warm place for 10 minutes. Skim excess fat from pan and add currants and additional sherry to taste to the pan juices. Heat thoroughly and serve with the roast.

Potatoes, thinly sliced and baked in a shallow dish with broth and butter, like scalloped potatoes, are a perfect accompaniment. Also serve with a purée of carrots dressed with butter and a touch of marjoram or summer savory. Drink a good Médoc with this roast.

### Roast Rack of Veal

Rack of veal
Butter
Tarragon, freshly ground black pepper, salt
White wine
1 cup fresh bread crumbs
1/4 cup chopped parsley

Rub the veal well with butter, tarragon, and pepper and place on a rack in a roasting pan. Roast in a 400° oven for 20 minutes, basting with melted butter and white wine. Reduce the heat to 325°, cover the roast with foil, and continue cooking until it reaches an internal temperature of about 155°-160°.

Mix the crumbs with ½ cup butter and the parsley. Salt the roast to taste and then spread it with the crumbs. Increase the temperature to 375° and return the roast to the oven to brown nicely. Serve with the pan juices, sautéed potatoes, and artichokes with a Hollandaise sauce. Drink a Meursault.

### PORK ROASTS

Pork is a versatile meat that lends itself to complementary seasonings and tastes even better cold than hot. Pork should be thoroughly cooked, but it should not be overcooked. Cook to an internal temperature of at least 160° to be safe, and to a maximum of 180°.

#### Roast Fresh Ham

The pork leg cut or fresh ham is quite versatile. It may be cooked either boned or with the bone in. Because of its size, it takes time to cook perfectly in an oven set for 325° or 300°. The

fat covering eliminates the need for basting, but an occasional basting with red or white wine or broth does help the flavor and keeps a delicious moisture in the meat.

Rub the roast well with sage, freshly ground black pepper, and touch of garlic. Place on a rack in a shallow pan. Roast to an internal temperature of 175°. Remove from the oven, and allow to stand for 15 minutes in a warm place before carving. Serve with Lyonnaise potatoes, sautéed apple slices, and Burgundian Mustard.

### Burgundian Mustard

2 tablespoons finely chopped sour pickle 1 tablespoon finely chopped sweet pickle 1 cup Dijon mustard 1 teaspoon cognac

Blend the finely chopped pickles thoroughly with the mustard and add the cognac. If sealed in a jar, this will keep for several days.

### Fresh Ham, Italian Fashion

1 fresh ham, boned
3-4 sprigs Italian parsley
3-4 stalks fresh basil or 1½ teaspoons dried basil
2-3 cloves garlic
Salt, pepper
White wine
Beurre manié
Chopped parsley and chives

Stuff the ham cavity with the parsley, basil, and garlic. Rub with pepper. Tie securely. Place on a rack and roast in a 300° oven, allowing about 25–30 minutes per pound and basting well with warmed white wine. Salt about midway in the cooking time.

When the roast has reached an inner temperature of 175°, remove to a hot platter. Skim the excess fat from the pan juices and combine with enough additional white wine to make 2 cups. Reduce this slightly, and thicken with beurre manié (small balls of flour and butter kneaded together). Add chopped parsley and chives to the sauce. Serve the pork with this sauce, potatoes puréed with cream and butter, and broccoli sprinkled with Parmesan cheese. Drink a sparkling white wine or a champagne.

### Fresh Ham, Norman Fashion

1 fresh ham, about 8-9 pounds, boned Nutmeg, white pepper, ginger Sweet cider Salt ½; cup calvados or applejack 1 cup heavy cream 4 egg yolks

Rub the roast well with nutmeg, pepper, and a touch of ginger. Place on a rack in a shallow roasting pan, and roast in a 325° oven, allowing 25 minutes per pound, until meat thermometer registers 175°. Baste often during cooking with sweet cider, slightly warmed. Salt 15 minutes before removing from oven. Flambé with warmed calvados or applejack. Remove to a hot platter, and skim excess fat from the pan juices. Heat juices and combine with heavy cream mixed with egg yolks. Stir until nicely thickened and smooth, but do not allow to boil. Correct the seasoning. Serve the pork with this sauce, buttered noodles, sautéed salsify, and candied apple rings. Drink sparkling cider, if available, or a fine Alsatian wine.

### Pork Made to Taste Like Wild Boar

1 fresh ham, boned and tied
3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
12 peppercorns, crushed
½ teaspoon nutmeg
Pinch ground cloves
1 teaspoon thyme
1 bay leaf
2 strips orange peel
1 large onion, sliced
Red wine
Oil
Salt
Beurre manié (optional)

Rub the ham well with the garlic, peppercorns, nutmeg, and cloves and place in a large, deep container with the thyme, bay leaf, orange peel, onion, and enough red wine to cover. Marinate for 4-5 days, turning it at least once each day.

When you are ready to cook the roast, remove from the marinade, dry thoroughly, and rub with oil. Place on a rack in a very shallow roasting pan, and roast in a 325° oven, allowing 25 minutes per pound. Baste with the strained marinade from time to time. Salt about midway in the cooking time. When the roast has reached 175° on the meat thermometer, remove to a hot platter. Add the pan juices to the remaining marinade. Cook slightly, and taste for seasoning. You may thicken this with beurre manié if you wish. Serve with the roast.

### Roast Loin of Pork

Probably the loin of pork is the most popular cut, and the best for eating cold. This constitutes the entire rack and is usually sold in one piece or divided into rib end or loin end. You may cut the ends from the loin and roast just the rib chops or the loin chops. The bones should be cracked and the roast tied so that the carving process is easy. A loin of about 4 pounds will be ample for 4 persons, with some left for another meal.

Rub loin well with freshly ground black pepper and a little thyme, and place on a rack in a shallow pan. Roast in a 325° oven, allowing about 25 minutes per pound, until the interior temperature registers about 170°. Salt well, remove from oven, and let it rest for 10 minutes. Skim off excess fat from the roasting pan, add a cup of hot stock or broth, and let the mixture come to the boil. Simmer for a few minutes. Serve with the pork. With this have boiled potatoes lightly whipped with butter and heavy cream and well seasoned with salt and pepper and sautéed apple slices. A good rosé wine is in order here, or, if you prefer, champagne.

1. Insert 2 or 3 garlic cloves in the pork and rub with thyme, freshly ground pepper, and salt. Roast as directed. About halfway through the roasting process, baste well with red wine. Continue basting with the pan juices and additional red wine until the roast is cooked. Serve with sautéed onions and tiny new potatoes. Drink a light red carafe wine.

Variations:

2. Rub a 5-pound loin with a bit of sage, freshly ground black pepper, and a little nutmeg. Place on a rack and roast in a 325° oven for 2 hours. Remove from the oven and pour off excess fat from the pan. Add to the pan 4–5 apples, cored, peeled, and cut into thin slices. Sprinkle with 1 tablespoon sugar. Return the pork to the oven and continue roasting until thoroughly cooked. Remove the roast. The apples should be soft by this time. Add 1 cup cream, bring the applecream mixture to a boil, and blend. Correct the seasoning, and serve with the pork. With this have sautéed cabbage.

3. Rub a 4-5-pound loin of pork with garlic. Place it in a bowl and add % cup Japanese soy sauce, % cup sherry, 2-3 halved cloves garlic, and 2 tablespoons chopped fresh ginger or candied ginger. Turn the roast in this mixture, and let it stand for 3-4 hours, turning several times. Place the loin on a rack and roast in a 325° oven, basting from time to time with the marinade. Remove from the oven when the meat thermometer registers 170° and allow to rest for 10 minutes. Serve with broiled pineapple and a barliev casserole.

4. Rub the loin with garlic. Cut a deep incision lengthwise along the top of the roast, parallel to the bone. Insert slices of truffle, cut about 1/4" thick, letting them overlap. Tie the roast very tightly and sprinkle lightly with freshly ground black pepper and a bit of nutmeg. Place on a rack and roast in a 325° oven for approximately 25 minutes per pound, or until the roast registers 170°. Baste several times during cooking with Madeira or sherry. Half an hour before it is done add 1/2 cup stock or broth to the pan and baste again with wine. Salt the roast to taste. Remove to a hot platter and let it rest 10 minutes before carving. Heat the pan juices, after removing excess fat, and add 1 tablespoon finely chopped truffle. Serve with a purée of chestnuts and braised endive. Champagne is delicious with this.

#### Crown Roast of Pork with Sauerkraut

The crown is sometimes made with two rib ends of the loin and sometimes with the entire loin, which makes a most spectacular roast. Wrap the ends of the rib bones with foil to keep them from charring. Rub the meat with freshly ground black pepper, a bit of sage and rosemary, or just sage and garlic. Make a heavy cushion of foil to fill in the center of the crown while roasting. Place on a rack and roast in a 325° oven, allowing about 25 minutes per pound. Baste from time to time with white wine.

While the roast is cooking, wash 3 pounds sauerkraut, and place it in a kettle lined with strips of bacon. Add 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper, a few juniper berries, and enough white wine to barely cover the sauerkraut. Bring

to a boil and simmer. A half-hour before the roast is done add a Polish or a garlic sausage to the sauerkraut and let them cook together. When the roast has reached an internal temperature of 170°, remove it to a hot platter. Discard the foil and replace with paper frills.

Remove the foil from the center, fill the center with the sauerkraut, and garnish with slices of the sausage. Serve with boiled parsley potatoes and a salad of Bibb lettuce and grated beets. Drink a fruity Alsatian wine such as a Gewürztraminer.

#### **Roast Smoked Loin of Pork**

Smoked pork loin is a great delicacy. When purchasing it, ask how much cooking it needs. Some types require a full 30 minutes per pound at 300°, while others, because they are hotsmoked and therefore practically cooked, require mere reheating, or about 12–15 minutes per pound at most.

Treat a smoked loin exactly like a fresh loin of pork. Baste with white wine or sherry during cooking. Remove from the oven, and allow to rest for 10 minutes before carving. Serve with buttered new potatoes and the sauerkraut given in Crown Roast of Pork with Sauerkraut.



### SAUCES FOR ROASTS

#### Quick Basic Brown Sauce

3 shallots or scallions, finely chopped
3 tablespoons butter
1 cup red wine
10½-ounce can beef bouillon (not consommé)
1 teaspoon tarragon
Pinch thyme
Salt, pepper
Beurre manié

Sauté the chopped shallots or scallions in the butter. Gradually add the wine and bouillon. Let it come to a boil and add the seasonings. Cook down for a few minutes. Add beurre manié to thicken to taste. Let simmer for a few minutes and strain.

### Rordelaise Sauce

Add a little poached marrow to the brown sauce. Correct the seasoning and add a touch of chopped parsley.

### Sauce Diable


Add 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard and a few dashes Tabasco to the brown sauce. Stir well.

### Sauce Périgueux

Add finely chopped truffles to the brown sauce.



5-6-pound filet
Butter
5 white truffles, grated
Freshly ground black pepper, salt

Cut the filet in 6-8 slices, not quite through, and butter each one well. Grate the truffles and add an equal quantity to each cut. Tie the filet well and rub it with softened butter. Also rub freshly ground pepper into the filet.

Roast on a rack in a 350° oven for about 45– 50 minutes, or until the meat thermometer registers 125°. Baste several times with butter or the pan juices during the roasting. Salt to taste. Serve with pan juices and fondant potatoes. Drink a Vosne-Romanée.

Note: This particular filet can be done with a barding of fat trimmed from a cooked Virginia ham. The result is a delicious change from any roast filet.



### HOW TO TAKE CARE

### OF BRICK

As ancient and familiar as brick is, few modern householders are experienced in the care of a brick floor in a living room, a brick wall in a kitchen, or a brick counter adjoining an outdoor terrace barbecue. Here are a few of the problems that may arise with various types of brick construction, and the solutions recommended by the Structural Clay Products Institute.

### Crumbling mortar

There are two things that can go wrong with exterior structural brick: The foundation may settle and cause zigzag cracks in the mortar, or the mortar itself may become flaky and start to crumble away. Mortar is mixed "on the job" and the mason may have been careless about the recipe. Whatever the cause, crumbling mortar joints should be "tuck pointed"that is, the old mortar should be cut out to a depth of 3/8 inch to 1/2 inch and replaced with a newly mixed mortar. In a short time, the new joints will weather to match the old ones that are still sound.

#### Painted brick

Some people like to paint brick once, then let the paint slowly weather away. Others like to keep brick well covered with paint, periodically renewed. No matter which effect you prefer, make sure only a masonry paint is used. This is a water-based cement concoction designed to let the brick breathe through the paint coating. If brick is completely covered with a paint that makes a watertight film, moisture can build up behind it and cause damage.

### Outdoor cooking areas

Brick used around cooking pits or barbecues may become fat-spattered, and since brick is porous, staining may result. Rain and sun will wear away or even out most stains. But if some persist and disfigure the face of the bricks, scrub with a stiff bristle brush, a good scouring cleanser, or clean wet sand. If your outdoor fireplace is partially protected by an overhang so weather can't bleach out stains, you might have the cooking and serving areas cleaned every few years by a professional steamcleaning service.

### Fireplaces

The inside of the chimney should be checked every year or so, to make sure that excess carbon deposits don't block the draft. This is particularly important if you cook in your fireplace, for layers of grease can build up inside the chimney and cause a fire. The brick facing around an old fireplace is often covered with smoke and grime which can be removed with a stiff bristle brush and scouring powder. Stains may also be removed by sprays available at masonry supply houses.


New brick fireplaces are usually cleaned immediately after they are built. The mason uses a weak solution of muriatic acid to remove any mortar stains or chunks of mortar which have been spilled and hardened on the face of the bricks. These lumps are removed with a wooden paddle; metal tools should never be used in contact with acid. But acid cleaning is recommended for red brick only. In the case of light pink, buff, or gray bricks, it is best to check with the manufacturer as to the most appropriate solution to use, since the wrong preparation may leave a greenish stain that will not come off.

### Brick floors

Like brick walls, brick floors need to breathe in order to prevent a build-up of damaging moisture. If you are installing a new brick floor, be sure to ask the mason whether or not there is a vapor barrier underneath the brick. If there is, you can safely seal the floor with varnish or shellac. If there is no vapor barrier-or if you are not sure-it is better to finish the floor with a low-solid-contact wax. Some people use nothing at all-simply keep the floor clean by sweeping.

### Interior walls

In a new house, brick walls need no finish once they have been cleaned by the mason. If old brick walls have been exposed by knocking off a plaster coating, some bricks may have to be replaced and the joints "tuck pointed." If the wall is really disfigured and stained, steam-cleaning or a light sandblasting may be necessary. Once the wall is clean, it may be















The monastic sleeping area beyond the walnut cabinet-divider has been enlivened by a new acquisition—a brightly painted sculpture (of automobile body scraps) by John Chamberlain.

"The kitchen" — a counter-high line-up of equipment and storage — has been augmented by a second oven and by a mobile white-plastic-topped walnut cabinet (at right). The latter usually stands directly behind the glass front wall of the house, but a few of the sliding fabric panels screen it from view.






Originally, the bathroom, enclosed in the round brick chimney, was wholly lined with cork except for the concrete floor of the open shower. A few years ago, the walls were resurfaced with leather tiles and the floor with mosaic tile, turning the whole room, in effect, into a shower room. (The guest house bathroom has been supplemented by a sauna designed by the architect, Reino Aarnio.)





In the guest house, the sliding panels of fabric serve not only as curtains, but as screens for bookshelves and storage. Like the fabric panels in the main house they operate on four ceiling tracks—a custom-installed device that is now available as a standard fixture (page 255).





The doors of the guest house, too, are full floor-to-ceiling height. Leverlike door pulls were specially designed and custom-made, but similar pulls have since become standard. In this room, an art-gallery-entrance-hall, Mr. Johnson tried out carpeting as a wallcovering before he decided on its use in halls of the New York State Theater in Lincoln Center.

The false-scale pavilion on the pond has four "rooms" in which guests can loll on floor cushions and feed the ducks. Ceilings are elegantly finished with gold leaf; roofs, clearly visible from the house above, are embellished with a chamfered design.





### MUSIC IN TWO DIMENSIONS IN A 21-INCH BOX

Lewis Freedman, the new, young, and earnest director of New York's educational television Channel 13, or WNDT, likes to tell the story of how, recently, his station showed some silent film classics. The only musical accompaniment -unobtrusive, he thought-was a piano. Nonetheless, complaints poured in by telephone: "The music's too loud." During a later rerun, when the operator suggested to discontented callers that all they had to do was turn their sets down, fresh complaints came in: "The picture's too blurry." The point of this story may be that people are funny, but its moral is more profound: how closely eyes and ears are related, and how much they depend on each other in the process of understanding.

Anyone in the theatre knows from experience that if the lighting is dim, audiences cannot hear, and if the lights are too glaringly bright, a slight cough on stage is magnified; a pin drop is a little explosion. At the Metropolitan Opera House, where so many of the scenes and sets are dimmed—

predawn castle turrets, dungeons at midnight—the problem of relating and proportioning sight and sound is tricky. For all the bellowing, even the best singer needs illumination to expand the resonance of his voice.

The old-fashioned way of attending a concert was to close your eyes and nod your head in time to the music. It was thought, at least when I was growing up, that you could hear better if, like the blind, you saw nothing. Certainly today, the sight of a Sviatoslav Richter, the great Soviet pianist, closing his eyes in the middle of a sometimes difficult, sometimes emotional passage gives credence to this idea. Radios and records teach us differently. Most people, you surely have noticed, turn on or put on music and, with nothing to watch, leave the room. They begin their household chores, settle down to a good book, initiate conversation, or meditate on their own faraway thoughts. There is far less inattention in a concert hall where the experience of music is direct and immediate, thanks to the assist of the eye. Most people do not turn on TV and leave the room. It would seem that Richter's eye-shutting is not in the last analysis to hear better, but to concentrate on performing. It increases his tactile sense, so that the feel of the keys in his hand is more secure and more finely attuned. The externalization of his inner hearing is not distracted by the sight of how he is doing it. In short, for the listener-viewer, the eye is a guide, focus, and interpreter for the art of musical understanding.

In no other field is the relationship between eyes and ears more vital than in the field of television. The potential of TV's multitudinous channels for disseminating classical music and revealing it properly to mass rather than select audiences is enormous. An artist such as the pianist Vladimir Horowitz, for instance, could fill a concert hall nightly from now until summer, but his one program scheduled for television this winter will reach more people in an hour than he has played to in all his career. Maria Callas has neither the voice nor the strength left to appear as often and in as many places as her fans may clamor for her, but television has become the answer to these demands. Like it or not, TV is both creating a cultural boom and responding to it.

This is especially true of educational television in all its divisions, subsidiaries, and ramifications. National Educational Television, or NET as it is abbreviated, is a producing and distributing house of culture with a hundred stations scattered major-city throughout the nation and dependent on it for their cultural material. These stations are linked into Eastern, Western, and mid-Western networks, and reach, it is conservatively estimated by pollsters, 90 per cent of TV's total watching public, or roughly 6,000,-000 viewers.

The technique of televising music is, in a sense, the art of teaching viewers how to listen. To present music as a visual experience, that is, to show sound, is a discipline requiring superb expertise. In the early days, when



serious music was first and very. very rarely televised, mistakes were many. The viewer was often imprisoned by a stationary camera in a fixed position. Producers believed that all they had to do was to put the camera in the equivalent of a good seat and just reel away. But TV is a substitute experience by its very nature; its life is the action of the camera. Occasionally in the old days some producers attempted a more adventurous approach. While the trumpets in the Eroica symphony blared away, the camera showed us the boom boom of the tympani. The effect was incongruous-not that the drums weren't there, but it was misemphatic to show them at that particular moment. At other times the camera would wildly scan one section of the orchestra while a melody sang sweetly off in another section. Eventually it would be located, only to be taken up by another set of instruments in another spot. And the camera's search would resume. Happily, these gross errors are gone, along with their era. But much still remains to be done toward focusing the eye of the camera on the sound of the music.

### The camera vs. the eye

The basic question is, how can you put music in a box-"a breadbox," as David M. Davis, NET's director of Boston Symphony telecasts, calls it. The box renders everything flatly two-dimensional on an approximately 21inch screen. As for sound, alas, the reproduction of the 4-inch speaker does not compare favorably either to high-fidelity stereophonic records, or radio. To say nothing of the difficulty of cramming a hundred-man orchestra into this space, the natural barrier between TV and music is demonstrated by the modest example of the string quartet-only four people with their music stands and instruments. Surely these should fit and pose a minimum of problems. The technicians assure us otherwise. If you establish the camera shot from a spot comparable to the ideal center seat of a concert hall, all you get on the screen are the music stands. The players' faces appear when they lean forward or towards one another for the closeness required by ensemble niceties. But even in this fleeting togetherness, the formal black and white of their dress photographs poorly, as does the unfortunately harsh glaring white of the music paper on the

On educational TV, producers with a high spirit of experimentation solve much of this

problem by using four cameras, one to each instrument. Thus the camera achieves what the eye can do in a concert hall: watch the playing intimately and follow the technique of individual instruments in detail. An expert cameraman directed by a genuine musician such as Allan Miller, for instance, can actually exceed the perception of the average eye and ear at a chamber music concert. Television can give a greater sense of closeness, can underscore a melody, a harmony, a nuance which might be missed if the eye were not directed to it and thus able to help the ear to hear.

Televising music is, obviously, different from televising sports, for which the camera goes where the ball goes. The ball of music is more elusive, and the rules lack Hovle. While the fundamental principle is, "where the tune is, there goes the camera," this rule is best observed in its breach. The camera cannot move with every trill and frill of elaboration, nor should it be fixed for long stretches in a single spot. Either way, eye muscles begin to ache with strain, and the ear becomes confused. But the camera can rightfully move to a player's hands, face, instrument, ensemble, and even to the players of an undermelody. The camera captures a highlight, or underscores a soft, unnoticed halflight. The need for a camera closeup on an actor's face, so that you can better hear what he is saving and better see what he is feeling, has always been accepted. Now this co-ordination between camera and performer is being explored in music. So seriously is the problem being faced that one branch of music, opera, holds an annual "World Congress for Opera on Television." This year particularly, the interpretive function of the camera and its relationship to both music's meaning and its performance are being exploited. TV's illumination of music-paralleling perhaps the psychological advantage of lip-reading, even to those with normal hearing-is rapidly turning into an art.

### The human factor

One conflict remains: the performer himself. With TV cameras stationable anywhere in any number, the frontal, concert hall type performance is too static. Ultimately musical performers will have to be trained in the type of performance called for by TV, much in the same way they now take stage deportment and practice their bows and gestures. Educational TV has already begun to make inroads on the blandness of



Another aspect of the second Sydney is the terraced hou of the old inner suburbs which architect Walter Gropius consered the city's architectural treasures. Most were built frabout 1880 onwards, and embellished with balconies rich in caliron lace. Verandas and balconies had become popular in A tralia during the eighteen thirties and forties and had led twidespread use of graceful cast-iron columns, balustrades, a railings brought over from England as ship's ballast—and American travelers today, reminiscent of New Orleans.

Once despised, the old houses in the inner suburbs of P dington and Woollahra are now being cherished and restored like to walk through Paddington or around The Rocks, wh there are old streets of houses with cast-iron lacework and rounded windows and simplicity of the late Victorian peri Fortunately, some of these lovely buildings will be preserved the plan to redevelop the area.

While some Australian cities had to cultivate their beau Sydney had beauty thrust upon it. The Harbour is a gr drowned valley whose steep sandstone ridges and rough bould strewn troughs are blanketed with eucalypts. Suburban hou have been restricted mainly to the tops of the ridges and to seaside escarpments. There are still masses of wild bushland a a richness of animal and bird life. This unique and enforce union with nature has influenced the design of the better modhouses. The steep slopes, the vistas of blue water and feather topped eucalypts, are as integral a part of the house as the wa and roofs and rooms. The same integration is seen in the gard themselves, in the mingling of the indigenous and exotic. Ev spring, Sydney is the Azalea City, and its showpiece is the 2 yard-long Azalea Walk in the Royal Botanic Gardens. The la scape design of the 60-acre Royal Botanic Gardens on the l main, with their century-old buttressed trunked Moreton I figs, is a legacy from Lachlan Macquarie's wife, Elizabeth, admirer of the English landscape gardener Lancelot (Ca bility) Brown. The wide splashes of green lawn and curv walks were planned to beguile the eye and feet to the rugs foreshores of the Harbour.

### Australia's Capital

Canberra, the Federal Capital, 160 air miles from Sydn is completely different from any other Australian city. L Washington, Chandigarh, and Brasilia, Canberra is a plant city. Although Australia's cast iron is perhaps the most var and imaginative in Sydney, it is also a distinctive feature the later cities of Melbourne and Adelaide. Melbourne's in suburbs are still clustered with cast-iron decorated houses a terraces built from 1860 to 1890. Linden in St. Kilda is a joydessay in filigree iron lace on a house of simple lines. Como Toorak, with its Georgian-influenced form and veranda a iron-balustraded balcony, is even more beautiful.

Both Melbourne and Adelaide were laid out on the popul gridiron plan. This gave Melbourne spaciousness, fine stresuch as Collins, and a splendid boulevard, St. Kilda Road. I the plan also gave equal emphasis to every street, so that, I most Australian cities, Melbourne lacks a civic focal point.

Adelaide, by far the most charming and eye-pleasing

Australian cities because of its wide tree-lined streets and the homogeneous character of most of its public buildings, was one of the first cities to be planned with a green belt. A green wedge of park land, divided by the River Torrens, separates the city from the suburbs. With a population of only 600,000, Adelaide is still a city to walk in.

The tree-lined boulevard of North Terrace shelters a wealth of Victorian public buildings, and the colonnaded and shuttered historic Ayers House. Only a short walk away is North Adelaide with its early Victorian buildings. But it is the late Victorian houses, ranging from the subtly restrained to fantasies and follies, that give the city its special flavor of gaiety.


Adelaide has hot summers, and its gardens resemble those of the French Riviera with the emphasis on bougainvilleas and succulents. (Melbourne, on the same latitude in the Southern Hemisphere as San Francisco is in the Northern Hemisphere, has a cooler climate that favors deciduous azaleas and rhodo-

Almost as typical as the blue gums and Sydney red gums in Australian gardens and bushlands are the acacias (wattles) whose cascades of perfumed blossoms range from the palest cream to the richest orange. Many lovely native flowering shrubs either grow wild or are increasingly cultivated-waratahs, hakeas (or needle bushes), bottle-brushes, leptospermums, Grevilleas (spider flowers). Some of the most beautiful are the delicately petaled members of the boronia family-the boronias proper with four starry pink or white petals and the ruelike fragrance, the bell-like correas, the wax flowers with five petals, and the zierias with four.


### Australia's cuisine

In a dozen Sydney hotels and restaurants you can order a bouillabaisse as splendid and intriguing as that of Marseilles, as well as fish such as John Dory and pearl perch prepared and sauced in the manner of Brittany and Normandy. Queensland mud crabs Creole style are a gourmet treat which all visitors should try. Steak Diane originated in Australia.


You can also buy paintings in Australia, and by overseas standards the prices are low, even for works by such worldrenowned Australian painters as Sidney Nolan, Russell Drysdale, and William Dobell, the distinguished leaders of a vigorous school whose works are regularly shown in the capital cities. Works by some of the younger and less well-known painters are exceptionally good buys. So are the totemic paintings on bark by Australian aborigines which are eagerly sought here and abroad. They are priced all the way from \$5 to \$150 or more. Aboriginal art has some similarities with (Continued on the next page)



bushman art-the same verve and spontaneity. The approach is primarily intellectual: the artists applying the ochres, pipe clays, and charcoals are not concerned so much with the decorative and beautiful as with the invisible world of their sacred myths. At the same time, only artists who have quickened to the grace of a leaping kangaroo or the nervous, high gait of an emu could capture them with a few simple lines.

You will need to be somewhat cautious, however, in buying aboriginal art. Inevitably, there has been commercial corruption of some of the art of Arnhem Land, the 34,000-square-mile reserve in the far North that is the source of the best bark paintings, although work from Oenpelli, Grotte Eylandt, and Milingimbi has been only moderately affected. Yirrkala, also noted for carved wooden figures, shows more changes, but good work still comes from there.

In addition to bark paintings, you can buy other aboriginal works such as boomerangs, spears, bone vases, didjeridoos (drone pipes), and grass baskets. But don't bargain on getting a genuine return boomerang or a stone axe: they are rare hand-made artifacts. Four sources for bark paintings and other aboriginal handicrafts that I can vouch for are the Aboriginal Museum and Art Gallery at Darwin; the Methodist Mission, Milingimbi, Arnhem Land; the Church Missionary Society, 93 Bathurst St., Sydney (Oenpelli and Groote Eylandt barks); and the Department of Aboriginal Affairs, 132 Grenfell St., Adelaide. Geoffrey Spence of the Darwin Museum supplies museums all over the world, and will try to meet your requests. Alan C. Fidock, the school teacher at Milingimbi, is also very helpful and represents

an outstanding artist, Malangi. Browsing through the junk shops, you may occasionally discover some early colonial cedar furniture, Georgian silver, copper, and pewter, but the greatest shopping rewards are for the lovers of Victorian furniture and other antiques. Somewhat easier to ship home are the plates, salad bowls, ice buckets, salt and pepper sets made of attractively grained Australian woods. Blackwood, mulga (an acacia) mountain ash, silver ash, and Queensland maple are among the finest woods used for these purposes as well as for contemporary furniture.

I usually advise my friends from overseas to buy Australian opals. They come in polychromatic variety with meteorlike gleams of red, green, yellow, orange, and milky blue. The black opal from Lightning Ridge in New South Wales, finest of all, has a dark

heart which throbs with fiery color. Opals cost from about \$23 a carat to \$230 a carat for the now scarce black opal. Opals from Coober Pedy and the greenfired stones from Andamooka—both in South Australia—are growing in popularity.

Australian semi-precious stones such as petalite, chalcedony, agate, jasper, rhodonite, amethyst, prase, rose quartz, bloodstone, fossil wood, and topaz are set in bracelets, pendants, pins, and cuff links. Golden-lace agate, an unusual opalized agate from southern Western Australia, is a mustard-yellow opaque gem with a black spider-web pattern. Fossil wood, from 150,000,000 years ago,

has interesting graining, ranging from pale straw to dark chocolate brown. Baroque jewelry from the better shops is a must for anyone with an urge—or an obligation—to return home with things Australian.

Australia, as Australians frequently complain, is not tourist-minded. The discoveries have to be made by the discriminating. But, perhaps, the country is all the more rewarding for that.

privacy, and darkness, control of temperature, the total pliancy of all surfaces to their bodies. If these placentalike conditions are lacking, they resort to the artifices of medications, ear plugs, masks, or vibrating machines to sink into a precious oblivion. By day, the automation of modern comfort makes us grow increasingly impatient. With electronic ovens, thermostatic heating, frozen TV dinners, dehydrated soups, and the headache pills that work "fast, fast, fast," the gap between the want and its fulfillment becomes continually narrower. Although the maturity of the individual has always been measured by his ability to wait for the fulfillment of his desires, technology seems to be dragging the human race in the reverse direction, back towards a level of infantile impatience. Technology conspires to bring us back to that ultimate state of comfort: a womblike condition in which our desires are perpetually foreseen and constantly fulfilled, in which our space is instantly contoured to our needs.

And that formidable client, the American woman consumer, is modeling her commodities on increasingly female principles. I sat in my Eames contour chair the other day and read advertisements which praised a latex-foam mat-"with air-buoyant comfort tress that adjusts instantly to your every curve"; a stretch bra that "breathes with you for greater comfort"; an electric iron "shaped to contour a woman's hand for greater comfort." How far can we go in our search for curved, maternal space? One anthropologist predicts that the rational end for the human race, in its search for womblike comfort, is to live suspended in water.

### Search for uniqueness

Comfort for All was the title of one of our most popular women's publications at the turn of the century. "Uniqueness For All" would make a fast-selling title for a periodical in the late twentieth. The most novel aspects of contemporary American comfort are the revolts against its mass-produced anonymity and the search for distinction, personality, and character. This ironic twist in the history of a word is an inevitable result of our leveling process. For the luxuries of an elite-be they bathrooms, frigidaires, automobiles, air travel, or hi-fi's-are fated in a democracy to become the comforts of the masses. And many of the commodities which are being distributed to millions in the United States today, like color television, are so extraneous to our physical well-being that they are not really comforts but luxuries. We find ourselves in a paradoxical position: although our nation still has poverty pockets tragically devoid of the most basic commodities, the motto of our present aspirations is no longer "Comfort for All," but "Luxury for the Many."

The phrase "comforts of

home," which the nineteenth century so idealized, only retains its desirability in the 1960's if it is qualified by an important new set of adjectives. We are being told that kitchens should be "inspiring," that bathrooms should be "dramatic," that housewives should be "creative," that bath towels should be "an experience in luxury," that bedspreads should be "boldly-textured and colorclued to you," that rugs should be "intriguing" and that vinyl floors can look Moroccan, Roman, or Aztec. We are urged to buy "uniquely aged" whiskeys, kit-chen-sink fixtures with "a sculptured look," cabinets with "rich heirloom quality," refrigerators decorated by pop artists for "a custom air," Fords "quieter than Rolls-Royces," and we are told to feed our pets "the aristocrat of cat foods." Comforts having been depersonalized by mass-distribution, luxuries have become the goal of our aspirations. Our simplest conveniences, be they nylon coats, polyethylene gloves, vinyl floors, or acrylic plates, strive to emulate such old-fashioned "distinctive" luxuries as furs, leather, marble, mosaic, tile, alligator, tortoise shell and Meissen china. We can look forward to the day when technology will make the democratic, simulating comfort undistinguishable from the aristocratic, exclusive luxury, and when the metamorphosis of one into the other will be complete.

The physical sense of the word "comfort" is shifting in its value because its physical demands have been fulfilled and taken for granted. North Americans have achieved that state of informality, equality, and physical well-being which the Enlightenment thinkers envisioned and which gave the word its materialistic meaning. We have been called "the affluent society," "the overweight society" and perhaps our greatest luxury is the luxury of waste. We advocate abundance, excess, and gigantism. As the largest amount of surplus grain in history rots in our warehouses, the


posters on our highways scream out: "Longest Motel Beds i Town! Triple Scoop Malteds! A the French Fries You Can Eat Two Foot Long Hot Dogs! Han burgers Bigger than in Texas! We are not comfortable anymore but luxuriant, like those plant which eat more than they need t thrive and to reproduce. And the luxuriance tends to make us ex tremely uncomfortable. One of th most sought after conveniences of the 1960's, a luxury which will be come a mere comfort in a decad is the at-home sauna bath in which Americans strive to sweat off th excesses of their collective abun

King Cyrus of Persia travele accompanied by four cartloads boiled water from his sacre spring. Louis XIV, who may hav understood comfort less well tha any other great monarch of hi tory, preferred to be accompanie by his crystal chandeliers. And recent census states that 19,00 Americans have equipped the cars with telephones. The physica objects of comfort have alway been relative. They are more r lative than ever today, when w have reached a state of uncomfor able luxuriance.

This may be a good time return to the older and less m terialistic sense of comfort. A mor lasting sense of it is to be found the common parlance of this mo hospitable of all nations, when the phrase "make yourself cor fortable" is interchangeable wit the words "relax, make yourself : home." It is also found in suc simple and poignant words as "sl makes me feel comfortable . . she makes me feel uncomfortable For comfort is a psychological a titude, an atmosphere of accep ance, ease and love created on by individuals. Luxury can l bought. Comfort must be create Luyury can be pure matter, th substance of which the shelter built, its rareness or its quantit Comfort is, in part, the harm nious proportioning of the spainside that shelter. In even great part, comfort is foresight; it created by an individual who ca foresee the needs of other person in that shelter before their need even felt. 



## Digger's moon: Both time and temperature are right for turning the garden earth

The earth revolves around the sun at a speed the seasons cannot quite keep up with. Thus the air temperatures in October, which should be similar to those of late February and early March, are actually more like April's. The ground temperatures lag even farther behind the season, so that the soil a spade's depth below ground is as warm as in June-and as mellow. These conditions are almost ideal for the practitioner of gardening's oldest rite-digging. Conditions are right for the digger because the air is cool enough to keep the sweat out of his eyes as he works, and because most of the other urgent chores about the garden have been done. Days are shorter, to be sure, but full moons come closer together this time of year, and the leisurely practice of moonlight digging can be one of the year's great pleasures.

Conditions are right for the garden beca the earth is usually still light, mellow, and enough to be worked without risk of harm eit to the digger's back or to the soil's own phys structure. (The risks of substantial damage soils worked in early spring may be great, es cially if they are oversupplied with clay parti or are waterlogged.)

What part earth-turning plays in your year program, spring or fall, depends, of course, what kind of garden you have. How you do turning depends on your gardening bent, y physical condition, and the nature of your group Some gardeners, for good and sufficient reashave the digging done for them and their inte in this discussion will be academic and sedent at best. For others, the choices of methods




The relatively primitive heavy shovel, with footrest on handle and arrowshaped blade, has given way to the modern fork, shovel, and straight spade.

implements are as varied as the tasks to be done.

It is assumed that all major lawn construction has already been done. If for some reason it has not been, then heavy commercial tilling is probably in order. Able-bodied and well-conditioned amateurs can rent big tillers in many areas and operate them effectively with a little practice. Generally, however, big jobs are best contracted for. Growers of vegetables may well wish to do their fall earth-turning on the same basis-except that small vegetable patches are scarcely worth hiring a tiller for. Ground that has been long under cultivation, and is now friable and of proper texture, should be reworked as little as possible except to "fold in" long-range supplements (compost, for instance) or turn under cover-crops (say. winter rye sown in late summer).

New land—that is, land in sod or heavy covercrops—can stand a more vigorous turning than earth currently well cultivated, but even such land is best left rough, to be broken down by winter frosts, or to hold and absorb winter rains without impairment of soil structure or harmful erosion.

The manual tools of the digger's trade have not changed fundamentally over many centuries. Some of the spades and hoes, opposite page, are still in use in Europe and other parts of the world. Modernization has come both in material and design—the kind of steel used for the cutting heads, the turning and shaping of the wood handles. And with tools both old and new, the principles of use, below, remain the same. As you can readily see (as if you didn't know), the digging tools are of two main sorts: the (Continued on next page)



spade tools, which require a thrust and levering stroke, with the unturned earth as the fulcrum, and the hoe tools, which call for a chopping and drawing stroke. Of the two, most people seem to regard the spade as the most adaptable to turning earth, both new sod and old loam. For deep heavy work, that may be correct. But in the average garden, if there is a limit to the depth of cut required and to the physical strength to achieve it, a digging hoe may well be the best tool to use. Historically, the hoe has had the edge over the shovel since plowing was first done with a crooked stick.

Best of the sod busters, in our opinion, are the four-tined digging fork, the round point shovel, and the digging hoe or mattock-in that order. The best of the loam turners are the square-bladed spade, the digging hoe, the pointed shovel, and the fork. Whether your spades, shovels, and forks have long or short (with D-shaped grip) handles is purely optional and arguable. Some gardeners are strong advocates of the one; an almost equal number favor the other. One thing is certain: the heavy steel-strapped nursery spade is not for earth turning, but it is indispensable for cutting big earth balls and opening holes when transplanting trees and shrubs, also for rock work, where it is convenient to have a spade that can double as a crowbar without snapping the handle.

The digging hoes (the true mattock or grub hoe is too heavy for clean sod turning) have midlength handles, shorter than the ordinary light garden hoe, longer than the pick mattocks. One excellent digging hoe, with a curved blade 6 or more inches wide at the beveled cutting edge, bears the somewhat medieval name of grape hoe. Also called an eye-hoe, because the tapered handle fits into a large tapered eye in the blade, this type has a slightly curved handle that is oval in section and marvelously shaped for the human hand. The blade is heavy enough to cut through turf or root-free sod (when filed sharp), yet light enough to swing easily with but

little practice. An even lighter and sharper type (see also page 261) has a long straight handle, two blades of differing width, and a balance as fine as a tightrope walker's. The trick, of course, is to take it easy. Watch any good professional tool-wielder and you will see what we mean.

The same easy-come, easy-go policy is even more important with the shovel clan. Lean on them with your foot, lever the load loose, then, and only then, lift and turn as required. And don't hurry. You will finish the job quicker, enjoy it more (yes, we mean enjoy) if you savor its fine points without haste.

A word about the selection and care of digging tools: As to quality, buy only the best. Digging tools-all of them-have cutting edges and are made of tempered steel. Some have thinner blades, finer tempers than others. But all are cutting tools that should be kept as suitably sharp, job for job, as your favorite secateurs. All the digging tools except the pressed steel bargains have beveled edges. The bevel should be retained. Wheel grinding is seldom suitable for such implements: the most serviceable sharpener is a mill file. stroked against the bevel and at only a slightly steeper angle than the bevel itself. File lightly before each substantial use.

More serviceable even than a sharp tool is a clean one. Cleanliness is especially important to spades and shovels, with which the down stroke can be made immeasurably more difficult if the blade has been pitted by rust as it surely will be unless the whole blade is wiped clean and lightly oiled after each use.

One eminent plantsman, who learned his digging in the barracks-like bothies of England, always kept a pair of old trousers hanging just inside the door of his tool house. He used one leg to wipe earth and mud from his digging blades. He used the other leg, impregnated with machine oil, to keep the blades rust-free. Even a woman gardener, nowadays, should be able to make a similar arrangement for keeping tools in shape.

remove paint with paint remover, grease with a good strong synthetic detergent or benzine, gum with turpentine.

#### Marble

Most experts feel that this splendid material should be treated with the same respect you would give to any fine furniture finish. When cleaning marble (with detergent and water), it is best to wash, rinse, and dry small areas at a time rather than allowing the whole floor to remain wet for a long period. Also be careful not to scratch the marble with the metal parts of the mop. If you have a floor with problem spots, you will find excellent Marble Cleaning Kits at building supply stores.

One thing to be especially careful about in connection with a marble floor is wrought-iron furniture. It should never be left on the marble floor of an outdoor terrace exposed to the elements since rust stains "bloom" under iron. Sometimes these can be eradicated by a rust stain remover—there are several on the market, but the safest bets are those sold by marble companies.

Polishing marble is not for amateurs. It requires patience, hard work, proper materials, and a thorough knowledge of the material. Call an expert.

#### Terrazzo

This type of masonry, composed of approximately 70 per cent marble chips and 30 per cent Portland cement, combines both porous and non-porous materials, so stains or potential stains should be attacked as soon as possible. The best methods are as follows:

Fresh grease: Use an absorbent material such as chalk, blotting paper, or cotton.

Gum, lipstick: Use solvents such as carbon tetrachloride (keep your head turned away and be sure there is plenty of ventilation).

water requirements, and on the complexity of the plumbing work involved. (It is always recommended that a conditioner be connected to your plumbing system at a point which ensures the full benefit of both hot and cold conditioned water throughout the house -in kitchen, laundry, and all baths.) Under normal circumstances, the cost of a fully installed system should run between \$375 and \$450. Manufacturers point out, with considerable basis for their claim, that a good water conditioning system will in fact pay for itself over the long haul through everyday savings in detergents, fuel bills, plumbing repairs, and the replacement of clothing and other fabrics.

Several leading manufacturers offer a plan through which a water conditioning service can be leased, with the option to buy later. (In some cases, manufacturers will apply toward the total purchase price a part of the rental already invested.)

Like any other sound mechanical improvement in your home, a water conditioner has both personal and practical assets: It provides you with water as close to the ideal as possible for all purposes, and at the same time it increases the dollars and cents value of your house.

#### Notes for October Gardeners

Ere the "long sobs of autumn's violins" are heard, let us haste to police the yard



#### First weekend

Reverse bicolors. It is easier to associate Paul Verlaine with the mournful accents of the declining year than with daffodils-but let the one remind you of the other. It will soon be too late to get the daffodils of your choice, not because the autumnal sobs are getting longer, but because supplies of choice narcissus varieties are getting shorter. On the assumption that your staple ordering is all completed (planting also?), we suggest a kind of daffodil for special accent planting that may be new to you-and may also still be in stock: the "reverse bicolors. The narcissus varieties so named are all either of trumpet or largecup form, and their distinguishing characteristic is a perianth that is or becomes darker than the trumpet or cup. In other words, for the followers of classified lists, the reverse bicolors are generally listed under classes Id and IId. So in addition to the all-yellows, the allwhites, and the ordinary bicolors with white perianths and colored centers, you have a few-still a very few-of a fourth group. The latter consists of some of the most dramatic, romantic, and costly of all daffodils. The minimum price is likely to be around \$1 per bulb. The maximum (which only the wild-and-woolly fancier would pay), around \$18 each. But once you have grown some of these (always in a featured position, since they are too valuable to mix with others where their effect might be lost), you will be well and truly hooked. Start with a half-dozen of the least expensive. Then another year it will be easier to invest more (invest is a reassuring verb).

While a few varieties show strongly "reversed" colors as soon as they open, most tend to start with flowers of a more or less uniform shade, with trumpets exhibiting perhaps a deep-toned edge, but generally fading as the flower reaches its peak. In other words, the d group of the division may be closer to the a group before its

trumpet color fades out.

Whatever they are genetically, the reverse varieties will fascinate you. Here are three. Try 'Binkie' (pale yellow, with a white cup, and easily the least expensive of all), 'Spellbinder,' a lemon and white trumpet only a little more costly than the first, and 'Nampa,' which costs only twice as much as the second. You could get half-adozen each of these three for what many a husband or wife would willingly pay for a spouse's birth-day present.



#### Second weekend

The impeccable ball. In spring, you can get away with sloppy gardening techniques. The year is on the rise; plants are eager to grow; mistakes on the gardener's part tend to be soon hidden by the garden. Not so in autumn. Mishandled plants go into winter mishandled, and they may not recover. This is especially true in the case of transplants. And most especially it is true in the case of plants dug with a ball. The whole purpose of digging and moving plants with an earth ball around the roots is to keep the essential roots from losing contact with the soil and thus drying out before growth can be re-established in the new location. Theoretically there is only one way to dig a plant with a good earth ball and that is with a good earth ball-cut clean and unbroken in mass (unshaken, as plantsmen say). But many a hastily dug and badly loosened ball is moved in spring without critical harm to the plant, which has all the seasonal benefits going for it. In autumn, though, the same careless digging would almost certainly prove disastrous.

Avoid such practices as chopping rather than excavating around the root ball, and prying rather than cutting it free. Follow the rules. Dig a clean trench around the ball—at least a spade's width for small balls, big enough to stand and work in for deep balls. Before you excavate, make sure

roots have been cleanly cut around the perimeter of the ball (thrust your spade down first, parallel to the b ll's circumference and at right angles to the root to be cut). Then, having cut-and undercutthe root mass until you are sure no straggling root is going to hold and tear the earth loose as you lift, rock the ball back, push a halfrolled square of burlap beneath, rock from the opposite side, and draw the rest of the burlap through. Now, tie the burlap tight, lift the ball by the ball, not the plant stem, and reverse the whole process in the new hole. Compli-cated? Not especially when you get used to it.



#### Third weekend

Mr. and Mrs. Clean. Everybody, including us, talks about the importance of an autumn clean-up in the garden. And most peoplenot including us-take that to mean spraying the roses and raking and burning the leaves. More important than most ordinary sanitation procedures (spraying, taking leaves off the lawn and, heaven forbid, burning them) is the simple business of removing the litter that has surely accumulated in some of the right places and almost all the wrong ones. Under shrubs, for instance, the ordinary litter of the garden year will do no harm-may even remain to break down and nourish the plants, to protect the shrub roots. and to conserve moisture. And clean leaves will do little harm until they mat down (and, on lawns. stifle the grass). But the danger even with presumably clean vegetable litter in the autumn is that many a malign insect may take shelter beneath, and many a harmful spore or bacterium may find a protected place in which to multiply, or rest, or both. So, spray, by all means, when spraying is in order. Roses, for instance, must be sprayed if black spot is to be controlled-although mildewed leaves will have done their worst. All leaves infested with black spot

must be removed, lest this most damaging of all rose diseases be given a safe winter harbor. Dea leaves around clumps of day-lilie will do the day-lilies no harm what ever—may, indeed, provide some protection against frost heaving on each set of slugs another yeat whole races of slugs another yeat may mean a decimate crop of pansies or petunias in new summer's borders.

Peonies, of course, are notor iously susceptible to a form of botrytis blight that prevents opening of flower buds. The spores of this infection spend the winter if and on dead peony stalks just above ground level. If you cut of all dead peony foliage just below ground level (being careful not the tharm new bulbs), the risk of infecting new growth next spring will be considerably minimized.

Squat, stoop, and squint: that is our motto. The rest is largely a your finger tips.



#### Fourth weekend

Upstaging plants. If you greenhouse is ideally oriented your main axis runs north-sout (for an even-span type), or th principal bench space receives fu south or east light (lean-to type) in either case, if you erect staging or stepped-back shelves, facing th east-south quadrant, you will mak possible the maximum use of winter daylight for the larges number of plants. But what of the remaining space in the green house between such staging an the sunlight? To settle simply for the single level of a bench it scarcely enough. To erect anothe staging area, similar to the firs but to sunward of it, would be t misarrange the plants on the new staging (they would slope th wrong way) and cut the light from the plants on the first staging. Be sides, just one layer of plants, s to speak, would leave a great ga overhead. A single shelf above th bench is not satisfactory either.

Here is a suggestion: Suspend plants (true basket plants and others that could prosper in hanging pots) at various vertical levels and at various horizontal points above all sunward benches, and above head height over all aisles. Leave enough space between plants so some sun would always slope through (remembering that winter suns shine at a very low angle) and would always provide moving light as well as points of shadow for all plants below and beyond them. This arrangement may give your greenhouse a lopsided look, especially if it is an even-span structure with the ridgepole running north to south. But most greenhouses are unhealthily traditional in the disposition of benches and plants anyway. A little variety will improve the general effect. Improve the condition of the plants, too, for that matter. Improve the condition of the winter gardener-which is perhaps most important of all.

Reading notice: Frederic P. Lee has revised his superb and definitive Azalea Book (Van Nostrand, \$12) to the assured joy of all lovers of the last word. A Washington, D. C., lawyer, Mr. Lee is one of the finest amateur plantsmen in the United States, and his book, considered with the current editions of Clement Bowers' and David Leach's separate massive works on the proper rhododendrons, covers this large combined genus like a geodesic dome. Mr. Lee's is no how-to-do-it book, by the way—even though it and Mr. Lee could tell you how.

Anna N. Griffith has done in A Guide to Rock Plants (Dutton. \$5.95) the same kind of service Patrick Synge offered in his Complete Guide to Bulbs a couple of seasons ago. The only drawback to both is that both were written in and for the British Isles first of all. But so thorough is the rock-plant coverage, so up-to-date its taxonomy, nomenclature, and orthography, so knowledgeable its text that no American rock gardener can afford to be without it. An unoriginal testimonial, this, but true. And the illustrations are handsome and useful.

"Yep," agreed John. "We have fun those nights. We stay up very late and we play games."


"They're okay," Mark admitted. "Once we get upstairs, no one interrupts us or asks us to do anything."







the concert hall style. On several stations, with tact and perseverance, producers are leading artists to a more fluid type of showmanship, increasing their awareness of what close-ups can mean to their projection of a musical passage. Gradually, by mutual co-operation between cameraman and artist, the magic of contact between performer and auditor will be heightened.

Meanwhile, this is altogether a splendid season for those looking forward to serious music visvalized in the home. For those who have never had a chance at the big time of great music and superlative musicians, the schedule for 1965-66 is real cause for celebration. For those who have shied away from music on television for fear of its being boring or inept, this season is a good time to give it another chance. You will be surprised at how effective the televisation has become toward helping you achieve a greater understanding and in enhancing the sheer pleasure of good music well performed.

#### This season's agenda

This year NET with its vast subsidy from the Ford Foundation, is presenting a Festival of the Arts with dazzling emphasis on important music. One of its two most astonishing highlights, well worth watching for, will be Leopold Stokowski conducting the works of Charles Ives-that strange turnof-the-century American genius, an insurance man by trade, whose music was more modern than any of his contemporaries, and whose radicalism and dissonance are still not too easy to accept. The other is the first televisation of the French musical miracle play. This primitive religious opera is 700 years old, the oldest real music extant in the Western hemisphere.

Educational TV also has independent stations, such as New York City's WNDT, that dispatch Videotapes of music to other stations on request. Under the guidance of Lewis Freedman ably assisted by ex-conductor, Allan Miller, the program for this 1965-66 musical season is stunning. One innovation has been to make this "Beethoven Year," the first of a series of "one-composer" years in


which a total view of a single musician will be presented. Every aspect of Beethoven will be treated, from his personal letters— picayune and querulous—to the self-sublimating, divine last Quartets. Educational television, already within its short span of existence-WNDT is three years old, NET only twelve-has expanded indelibly the value and beauty and grasp of music. The master classes with Lotte Lehmann and Casals, the fireside recitals where a master musician stops and explains why he does what he does and how, the closeups of great stars such as Leontyne Price, all are famous among cognoscenti and the would-be knowledgeables of music. This year the coverage increases in bulk, in quality, and most of all in technical excellence.

The commercial channels, too, are lining up a series of musical spectaculars, and CBS heads the list. Pablo Casals, the cellist, will be profiled again, this time at the age of eighty-nine years. So will Isaac Stern, that man with a violin and a way. A 90-minute evening at Lincoln Center's Philharmonic Hall with soprano Victoria de los Angeles and Leonard Bernstein has been readied, and Bernstein again will be instructive, informative, explanatory, and decorative with his orchestra and piano and personality at the New York Philharmonic Young People's concerts. David Oppenheim, clarinetist de luxe, will serve as a musical guide, taking Stravinsky back to all his European hauntsto where he lived and composed his familiar masterpieces; to where Sacre du Printemps was booed and hissed; to where his version of "The Star-Spangled Banner" (banned in Boston) was first played-with a finale of Rudolf Nureyev dancing the original Petrouchka. Of course, Ed Sullivan and NBC's Bell Telephone Hour can be counted on to present the latest musical furors, be they tomorrow's Callas, Sutherland, Van Cliburn, or an as yet unknown, unheard sensation.

Television, however antipathetical to music it may once have seemed, is providing us with more this year than ever before in its history. And it is presenting music with ear-and-eye intelligence.
