

Bert King 1924-2012

King was born in Greenville SC and graduated from NCSU with a degree in Architectural Engineering with honors in 1949. He worked for Six Associates and Lindsay Gudger in Asheville then started his own firm in 1952.

He was Asheville's master Modernist, turning out dozens of beautiful homes that are still prized today. Services have not yet been announced.



### **News this Week:**



In August, TMH issued a National Endangerment Alert for Raleigh's 1950 Paschal House, a masterpiece by early NCSU School of Design faculty member Jim Fitzgibbon. Now, TMH has learned the Paschal heirs have solicited a proposal to deconstruct the house, so the clock is ticking on Raleigh's most important endangered mid-century modern. What can you do to save the long-empty and still-savable property? First, spread the word about the Paschal house via social media. Secondly, respectfully urge the family to lower the unrealistic \$3.3M price to attract reasonable offers. Overpricing the property (as it has been for five years) keeps it vacant and vulnerable. You can help influence whether this iconic home is saved - or goes "toes up" like the Catalano House did in 2001.



In August 2012, the National Park Service (NPS) issued an Environmental Assessment for disposition of the **Gettysburg Cyclorama Building**, a nationally significant structure designed by renowned architect **Richard Neutra**. The assessment was ordered by the 2010 U.S. District Court ruling in response to a lawsuit for the government's failure to comply with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) obligations in planning for demolition of the building. The Park Service has been trying to demolish the Cyclorama for more than 10 years and continues to break the rules in a headlong rush to get rid of out. This despite the best (and cheapest) alternative, mothballing the facility for future use. The Recent Past Preservation Network has accused the Park Service of preparing the assessment in a arbitrary way our of compliance with NEPA. **If this sounds long a boring, it is, but the building is definitely not.** Details here. - On September 17 the Phoenix Historic Preservation
  Commission voted unanimously to recommend Landmark
  designation for the endangered David and Gladys Wright
  House, designed by his father, Frank Lloyd Wright. The
  recommendation will go to the City Council in November. If
  approved by Council, Landmark designation triggers an
  automatic three-year delay on demolition. The huge numbers
  of letters and signatures definitely have an impact but the goal
  is at least 25,000 signatures as soon as possible. To add

- Pearce Brinkley Cease + Lee, Frank Harmon Architect PA moved up the Architect Magazine rankings this year. Pearce Brinkley Cease + Lee (PBC+L) ranked 15<sup>th</sup> up from last year's 23<sup>rd</sup> ranking, with Frank Harmon Architect PA coming in at 17<sup>th</sup> up from 21<sup>st</sup> last year. The rankings appear Architect Magazine's September 2012 edition and online. Architect is the official magazine of the national AIA.
