Dogtrot House, was designed by <u>Edward Durell Stone</u> and has been lovingly maintained over the decades by just two owners. This was Stone's final work to outwardly emulate Wrightian detailing, a practice that began with Stone's visit to <u>Taliesin</u> in 1940. The owner needs our help.
