The 1951 Henry and Anne McDonnell Ford II Addition, aka Halcyon Lodge, 436 Gin Lane, Southampton, Long Island NY. Philip Johnson did a Modernist addition for Henry Ford, the automaker. The house was last sold in 2006 to 436 Gin Lane LLC (O. Scott Bommer). Bommer also purchased the property next door. The entire property is for sale, but Bommer has also applied with the Southhampton Architecture and Review Board to have the entire house demolished. The first hearing is this Wednesday, February 12. Sally Spanburgh leads the petition here to call against demolition.
