Good Design

AS I'M SURE YOU CAN IMAGINE, in putting together a magazine called Ocean Home six times a year, we spend a lot of time perusing the portfolios of top architects. These artists, engineers. designers, thinkers, and dreamers are unspeakably skilled—and never mind how creative they are. Not only do they consistently surprise us, the admiring public, with their profound concepts, but they actually bring their ideas to life in locations and climates. that are too many to mention here. (Take, for example, the home on our cover, which was designed by Barnes Cov Architects for a homeowner in Ouoque, New York-it's truly a modern marvel.) That idea got us wondering: With so many different kinds of coastal destinations out there, what are the most desirable—and sometimes necessary—elements of an ocean home in the minds of those who design them? Elsewhere in this issue, you'll find reports on home design—who knew that wallpaper was poised to make a comeback?—and top travel spots. Jet-setting writer Paul Rubio recently returned from a once-in-a-lifetime trip to the Seychelles ("Islands of Zen," page 106), an island chain in the Indian Ocean off of Africa's east coast. Andrew Conway traveled to Bermuda ("Beautiful Bermuda," page 62), returning stateside with plenty of tips to help you plan your own escape



to the island. And I recently made a return trip to Virgin Gorda in the British Virgin Islands, where I staved for the second time at Rosewood Little Dix Bay ("Little Gem," page 64). Little Dix remains at the top of my list of favorite travel spots-I hope you'll be inspired to plan a visit there yourself, or to any of the other incredible destinations we cover in this issue.

A Whale of a View

On North Carolina's Bald Head Island, two architects have designed an allegorical structure to satisfy their clients' exuberant natures—and frame some very fine vistas. By J. Michael Welton

TO GET TO BALD HEAD ISLAND, slip by ferry across North Carolina's Cape Fear River, hop aboard the requisite golf cart (no autos allowed on the island), scoot along a five-mile trail through a maritime forest, and, finally, turn right and climb a 40-foot-high ridge. There it is: the oceanfront home called Castello Dello Balena, or "Castle of the Whale."

At 4,500 square feet, comprising four bedroom suites and a dining room the size of some homes, this house is big. But that may be its least important feature. "You can't find many places with 270-degree views of the water," says Chris Lokey, the home's master builder. "[The house] is sitting on some of the nicest views on the east coast."

From the house's dining room, the coastal plain of Bald Head known as South Beach languishes in the distance. Out on the water to the left are Frying Pan Shoals, where offshore waves kick up as high as 10 feet. Farther left still is East Beach, which is home to some of the wildest surf on the island.

The home was designed by Wilmington-based architects Dietsche & Dietsche to take full advantage of its elevation. "The clients bought two lots, and at first, they thought they'd build on one and sell the other," says Anna Dietsche. Then, her husband Chuck stepped up with a pair of divergent scenarios: "The first one showed a house on one lot and the other open," she says. "The second one showed a house on both lots, stretched along the dune ridge, so every room has a view of the ocean."

Three bedroom suites and a garage occupy the ground level, while the kitchen, dining room, master suite, and office/studio are located above. Some compare the home, stretched out upon the ridge in three sections, to a whale's body. Its head would be to the left where the kitchen is situated, its stomach about midway down where the massive fireplace sits, and its tail composed of the garage wing with master suite and office atop.

The whole idea, says Chuck, was to satisfy his clients' need to express their exuberance for life. "The [clients were] rational and romantic," he says. "I interpreted [their house] as Moby Dick." But he didn't overlook the site's basic strength, however, especially from the widow's walk atop the tower that connects all three of the home's sections.

"It's got the best views of the entire island," Anna says. dietschedietsche.com.

Reclamation Project

This isn't your grandma's wallpaper—bold new patterns and color are resuscitating this design touch. By David Eisen

ASK ANYONE what they remember most about Grandma's house, and they'll inevitably recall the ghastly wallpaper that adorned one or more rooms. But like many remnants of yesteryear, what goes around comes around. Luckily for this generation, today's wallpaper prints are nothing like they used to be, according to Long Island-based interior designer Marlaina Teich (mtdny.com).

Teich is a wallpaper convert. "I remember the first house I purchased; I spent hours removing layers of old wallpaper that the previous owner applied," she says. "I swore I would never use wallpaper again."

Her tune has since changed. "Today, wallpaper is one of the hottest trends in décor," Teich says. "The designs and textures are so varied; it makes it simple to make a statement."

"I think we are now past the paint

and Ikea stage, and people want something bolder and singular for their space," says Jee Levin, a creative director at Trove (troveline.com), a NYC design house she founded with Randall Buck specializing in wall coverings.

"The trend to customize home furnishings and wallpaper is definitely strong right now," says Buck. "People want to have something

completely unique in their home."

Wallpapers of the 1960s and '70s were characterized by floral designs, geometric shapes, and metallic foils. "Let's not forget the flocked papers, as well," Teich adds. But today's wallpaper is a far cry from that of 50 years ago.

"The differences in today's [wallpaper looks are in the colors used, as well as the play on scale," Teich says. "Small-scale patterns are given a whole new translation by being shown in an oversized proportion. Grandma's metallic foil paper may cause some to cringe. but when the metallic is shown as a subtle interplay with color and pattern. it can look like a piece of art."

Wallpaper placement is as much a concern as aesthetic appeal; knowing when to go big and when to exercise restraint is key. "I love wallpaper as an accent in the bedroom, behind the headboard or in a powder room, where you can be a little crazy with color or pattern," says Teich. She is even open to affixing wallpaper on the ceiling in the dining room, giving the space an intriguing allure.

There's also the matter of application: Though it might sound easy enough to apply wallpaper oneself, it's better left to a pro. The wall first needs to be prepped and smoothed to avoid bubbling. If you are applying lightcolored wallpaper against a wall that has deep color, the wall needs to be primed to neutralize the darker color. "The last thing you want to do is start all over," Levin says.

Boston Pops

Boston chef Lydia Shire combines two of New England's most beloved foods into an airy culinary creation you won't find anywhere else.

FOR ALMOST FOUR DECADES, Lydia Shire has been involved with some of America's finest restaurants-from Boston's venerable Parker House to the Four Seasons Beverly Hills—but she still exhibits the wide-eyed wonder of a child in a candy store when discussing one of her favorite dishes on the menu at her current establishment. Towne Stove and Spirits in Boston's tony Back Bay neighborhood.

"I love popovers!" Shire exclaims before launching into an enthusiastic description of exactly how to eat one. "Take a freshly baked popover and poke it open. As the steam escapes, put in maximum butter-the butter must dribble down your chin

when you bite into it—then drizzle Lyle's Golden Syrup from England on the popover."

The idea of combining lobster with a dash of sweet syrup doesn't come naturally to most chefs or diners, but it makes sense to Shire, who says the Maine lobsters she uses at the restaurant already have a natural sweetness. Guests obviously agree, since Shire admits that the Lobster Popovers have become so popular she wouldn't dream of taking it off the menu...or leaving her proximity to the ocean.

"I love our seashore—[residents] are spoiled! I would not trade in New England for any other part of the country," she says. towneboston.com. —Lisa Rogak

Lobster Popovers SERVES 6

POPOVERS

- 2 large eggs, beaten well
- 1 tbsp. melted butter, plus an additional 6 tbsp.
- 1 c. whole milk
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 c. all-purpose flour, sifted

In a large bowl, beat all ingredients very well with a whisk or blender. Refrigerate at least an hour or overnight covered with plastic wrap.

Preheat oven to 400°. Set muffin pan in oven to heat. Melt 6 tbsp. butter. Remove chilled batter from fridge and stir. Divide melted butter into 12 muffin tins and quickly pour in batter. Put pan back in oven with a cookie sheet underneath to catch any drips. Bake for 20 minutes.

LOBSTER


2 1-lb. lobsters, cooked, with meat removed 1 stick butter ½ c. Jack Daniels Honey Whiskey Chopped chives Juice of ½ lemon Lyle's Golden Syrup

Ten minutes after placing popovers in oven, melt half stick of butter in medium. skillet over medium-high heat. When it foams, add lobster chunks and give pan a guick shake. Add Jack Daniels and cook for a few minutes. Remove lobster with a slotted spoon; cook the sauce for a few minutes, then add lemon juice. Remove from heat and add lobster. Sprinkle with chives or chopped curly parsley; let sit.

To serve, remove popovers from oven and set one on a plate. Poke a hole in the tops with a sharp knife and place a teaspoon of butter in the popovers followed by a couple tablespoons of lobster. Drizzle Lyle's Golden Syrup into the holes and serve.



Made in the Shade

Keeping cool in the outdoors is only as good as your cover. By David Eisen

PLANNING YOUR OUTDOOR space might come second to designing your home's interior, but when the time does arrive, the right composition of shading elements can make or break the scene.

"Outdoor areas of the home are very important in setting the feel and tone of the entire house," says Gail Green of New York's Gail Green Interiors. "They are a prelude to what one will see on the inside. Cheerier appointments on the exterior correlate to a lighter, airier feel in the home."

A smartly positioned umbrella in a color scheme that either matches or sets off the corresponding landscape can transform the outdoor area into a comfortable, pleasing retreat. After all, an umbrella or other shading element can be as much a piece of furniture as a chaise lounge or Adirondack chair.

Against a coastal landscape, Green favors umbrellas, fans, and awnings with more subdued colors, like beiges, whites, and soft blues. "Natural colors, as opposed to vibrant ones, which are better suited for year-round warmer climates such as Florida, set a more modern tone, being more recessive."



That said, it always depends on the homeowner's taste, and outdoor staging shouldn't contradict the interior. "The outdoor should be consistent with the indoor," Green says. "If the house is colorful, so, too, should be the outdoor furnishings. There must be continuity."

Many suppliers today are manufacturing shade elements that turn any outdoor space into a comfortable haven. Tuuci (tuuci.com), a manufacturer of parasols, pavilions, and lounges, is one of the leaders in the market. The Miami-based company's Ocean Master Max Cantilever (pictured above) is a polished and anodized marine-grade canopy structure that extends from an

oval-shaped mast and provides shade over tables and chairs.


If you are seeking a bit of Southern California style for your outdoor space, Santa Barbara Designs (sbumbrella. com) takes design inspiration from the exotic umbrellas of the open-air markets of the Mediterranean. The company fashions umbrellas under an array of collections, using materials like teak, mahogany, aluminum, and stainless steel.


Of course, durability is as much a concern as aesthetic appeal. Today's best umbrellas are made of acrylic and are solution-dyed to ensure that colors are locked in, says Hans Galutera, a designer with BG Studio International, headquartered in New York City.

While Galutera often employs umbrellas as a shading element (he appreciates their portability and flexibility). whenever possible, he also employs natural elements, such as trees, vines, and pergolas to provide cover from the sun, not to mention some privacy. "They have a dappling effect and create shade and light that is artistic," Galutera says. "When designed right, the backyard becomes artwork."

THE GET HAIKU FAN

The Haiku Matrix Composite fan is the perfect way to keep your outdoor space cool and comfortable. Blissful Bermuda

Coral pink beaches, rainbow-hued villas, and emerald green golf courses are just a few of the kaleidoscopic colors of Bermuda. By Andrew Conway

WHEN THE BRITISH sailing ship The Sea Venture wrecked on a tiny island in the Atlantic in 1609, England's loss quickly proved to be a fortuitous accident. Once the "dreadful storme, an Hell of Darkness," as one of the survivors wrote in his diary, had passed and most of the ship's complement sailed on to the fledgling colony of Jamestown, Virginia, a few adventurers remained and settled what is now the beautiful island of Bermuda.

Four centuries later, this lovely subtropical archipelago of 181 islands that are warmed by the Gulf Stream has cast off its turbulent beginnings and become a magnet for jetsetters and honeymooners seeking a fun, relaxed, romantic, and sophisticated escape.

Located 650 miles off the coast of North Carolina, an easy two-hour flight from many U.S. East Coast cities, Bermuda successfully blends luxe hotels and resorts with top-notch dining, golfing, spa-going, and shopping in an alluring vision of coral pink sand beaches, rainbow-colored villas,

and emerald green golf courses.

No need to hire a car for exploring, as taxis, buses, and ferries are both plentiful and reasonably priced. The island's original railway track, linking the East and West Ends of the island, is now a wonderfully scenic walking and cycling trail, and several island cruises operate from Hamilton, Bermuda's bustling capital.

Not surprisingly, the island's

unique and iconic pink sand is the major draw. The best beaches lie along the south shore; Elbow, Church Bay, Horseshoe Bay, Jobson's Cove, and Warwick Long Bay beaches are all gorgeous settings to sink your toes in the powdery sand, swim in aquamarine water, and enjoy a sunset cocktail.

Little Gem

On Virgin Gorda in the British Virgin Islands, Rosewood's Little Dix Bay packs a big punch when it comes to luxury. By Lindsay Lambert

THERE'S SOMETHING MAGICAL about Rosewood Little Dix Bay on Virgin Gorda in the British Virgin Islands. Perhaps it's the way the resort's villas, rooms, and suites tuck into a lush, hilly landscape overlooking the Caribbean Sea. Or the noticeable lack of TVs and other outside distractions. Or the way the moon hangs over the tree-lined crescent beach at night, giving the place an almost "lost"-like quality. Half the fun of staying here is figuring out what's so special about it.


Little Dix debuted in 1964 after its founding by financier and philanthropist Laurance S. Rockefeller. Today, the resort continues to welcome guests—a large percentage are repeat visitors—who appreciate its laid-back luxury and subtle sophistication. Plus, a \$25 million update by current owner Rosewood means that the resort now has more to offer than ever before.

Little Dix's waterfront location lends itself to aquatic activities, like scuba diving, water skiing, sailing, windsurfing, fishing, and snorkeling. More earthly options include tennis, hiking along Cow Head Trail, private picnics on nearby beaches, and sunning on Little Dix's own three-quarter-mile stretch of sand. Yoga, Pilates, and exercise facilities are also available, and Little Dix recently debuted new fitness retreats, allowing guests to learn and practice wellness philosophies and fitness techniques-from low-impact stretching sessions

to high-intensity Kettlebell workouts-taught by experts.

Arguably, the most popular spot at Little Dix is Sense, A Rosewood Spa, thanks to its dramatic clifftop setting and Caribbean-style services. Many treatments use botanical resources that are grown or produced locally. Sense is so serene and stunning that a chaise by its infinity-edge pool overlooking Sir Francis Drake Channel is prime seating, even on days when guests' itineraries are devoid of spa services.

Also distinguishing Little Dix from its competition is that food here is actually good. Romantic beach dinners and picnics are a must, but even standard fare here is anything but. Three restaurants—the Pavilion, the Beach Grill, and the Sugar Mill-offer vast buffets, casual lunch options, and fine entrées, respectively. In 2012, to coincide with neighboring Anegada's annual Lobster Festival, Little Dix launched a lobster meal plan, allowing seafood-obsessed guests to enjoy different iterations of the crustacean at every meal. Passenger traffic can be heavy, as The Baths are a popular stop for cruise passengers, but at





Ahh, Anguilla

If you're looking to experience island life that's off the beaten path, head to little-known Anguilla. By Teri Borseti

CARIBBEAN LOVERS looking for something a bit more than a typical island getaway should consider Anguilla. The tiny island (just 35 square miles) with a population of 15,000 is one of the most northerly Leeward Islands in the Lesser Antilles, and it's anything but typical. In fact, just getting there requires a 15-minute boat ride from St. Maarten, or a 15-minute plane ride from St. Barts.

Once on the island, you won't find chain restaurants or stores, and there's no public transportation. Here, small-town island life, light traffic, lush landscaping, and gorgeous beaches make it the perfect place to relax and forget about the world. Leave your stress behind and enjoy the sun, along with walking on the beach, biking, hiking, sailing, and golfing.

Unlike many vacation destinations inundated with new construction projects, Anguilla has precious few. The newest condo development, Zemi Beach, located at Shoal Bay East, includes 73 traditional Caribbean-style units with modern overtones. The 1,000-foot Zemi Beach itself has been named among the best beach in the world by The Discovery Channel.

The new single-level one-, two-, and three-bedroom condos offer a little slice of heaven, and the limited number of residences adds to Anguilla's exclusivity. Every residence has a water view and its own private infinity plunge pool and deck.

Julio Bautista, construction representative for Trust Hospitality Management Company, says he's proud to say the condos are being built with less than one percent imported materials. "We're using the best possible technology and materials available, and the development is being built [to be] as sustainable as possible," says Bautista.

Residents will enjoy 24-hour concierge service, as well as access to a luxury spa, juice bar, state-of-the-art fitness center, and outdoor yoga terrace. There will also be three on-site beachfront

restaurants and a beach deck with a full bar. Prices of the residences range from \$608,000 for 1,200-square-foot units to \$2.9 million for 3,700-square-foot units.

Anguilla has a tropical, though rather dry, climate. The terrain is mostly flat, making it ideal for biking. The island has 33 beaches, numerous salt ponds, and a small rainforest on the north side. Though free of large animals, look for lizards, Caribbean hermit crabs, a variety of sand pipers, the Mangrove cuckoo, and dolphins.

Most eateries on Anguilla enjoy ocean views. Locations to have a cocktail or enjoy steel drum, reggae, and calvpso music include The Viceroy, Elvis Beach Bar, The Pumphouse, and Gwen's Reggae Bar & Grill. Catering to visitors with a penchant for all things arts related. Anguilla also boasts 15 art galleries, as well as the Mayoumba Folkloric Theater, which features a traditional Anguillan theater for showcasing singing and dancing. zemibeach.com.

Sitting Pretty

Not all airline seats are created equal. By Paul Rubio

AIRLINE ADS CAN BE so seductive. They feed off nostalgia for aviation's glamour years and somehow convince us that fun and fancy in the air have returned. However, that golden image of a comfy flatbed, a private suite, a lively bar, beautiful passengers, and pampering from smiling flight attendants hardly matches reality, even when booking a first class seat. Thankfully, a bit of homework and an excellent online resource, Seat Guru (seatguru. com), can help predict your next inflight experience and temper-or raise-your expectations.

Economy's Multi-Class Act Consumers beware! Airlines are adding more classes, such as "economy comfort," "economy plus," and "premium economy." These are often basic economy seats with a few extra inches of width (distance between arm rests) or pitch (distance indicating legroom). Do not confuse them with business class seats. Seat Guru's Economy Comparison Charts highlight the minor differences between the new and old incarnations of cattle class, and indicate amenities such as a laptop power plug or a personal TV on some flights.

Down to Business In general, there are four types of business or first class seats: suites (private enclaves with flatbed seats), flatbed seats (completely horizontal), lie-flat seats (positioned with 180 degrees of incline), and recliner seats. Seat Guru's Business and First Class Comparison Charts offer vast comparisons between airlines and aircrafts in terms of seat type, pitch, width, and accompanying amenities. Consider, at the very least, a lie-flat seat for long-haul flights.



Airlines and Aircraft Seat Guru maintains a full catalogue of airline seating charts for various aircrafts, with detailed plane layouts. It's possible to search by airline, aircraft, or flight number to get full details of a plane for specific travelling dates. Seat Guru also highlights which seats to avoid due to minimal overhead space or proximity to the galley. Don't assume because an airline has upgraded some of their business class seats that it holds true for all their planes.

Land of Confusion There's plenty of confusion when it comes to terminology in the front cabins. Most airlines offer a business class separate from first class, while some combine them. To make things more complicated, post-merger United Airlines offers "Business First," "First," and "Business"-all of which are completely different seats, ranging from 38" to 78" in pitch. By offering detailed seat information, Seat Guru helps flag these differences, so six-foot-tall (and taller) travelers get comfortable seats.

how one ocean home varies from the next, and he or she will likely tell you it's all by degrees—the sun's orientation, the view, the water, the specific location, geography and topography, and adjacent sites and structures, not to mention the array of building materials being incorporated into the project.

Pacific Northwest

LOCATION: Seattle, WA
ARCHITECT: Gregory J. Bader
Principal, Bader Architecture

Most important consideration in a coastal architecture project: Protection against the elements—harsh sun, corrosive salt air, high wind velocities, including horizontal wind-driven rain and sand—on a year-after-year basis.

Unexpected or unique architectural elements you've used: Copper finials and weathervanes, lightning rods, reclaimed English chimney pots, reclaimed timbers, gambrel roofs with oval inset windows, widow's watches, turrets, motorized outdoor "blackout" blinds, and elevator access to roof observation decks.

A common myth about coastal architecture you've proven wrong: That aluminum windows are all-protective against the harsh elements. In truth, they often exhibit the same number of issues as wood or vinyl. Aluminum windows have been known to sweat, fade, leak in high winds, and crack at corner joints, allowing wind-driven water to penetrate the wall structure if not properly counter flashed.

Your favorite coastal home project and why: The Shingle Style home (pictured) overlooking Lake Washington conjures up the casual elegance of summers away from the hustle and noise of the city. With its cedar shingles and battered stone foundations, it seems timeless and perfectly complements the lay of the land.

An evolving coastal architecture trend: While traditional waterfront homes in Washington State tend to be of cedar shakes, shingles, or rustic lapped planks (cedar being a locally farmed building material), some newer homes are being built in the iconic International Style, often characterized by the use of broad sheets of flat cement board siding, steel post and beam structure, and the latest rain-screen type of walls that breathe but don't allow moisture to enter.

A no-no in coastal architecture: Unprotected wood beams and beam ends, especially those that are structural. Another is not exclusively using stainless steel connectors, including nails and screws.

A project that best represents your individual coastal architecture style: A Mediterranean-style home (pictured), situated on the shores of Puget Sound, and the Shingle Style home. Each attempts to maximize the views to the water and provide unique vantage points from different parts of the home at different times of the day. I like both homes because they are of a size that one's focus is not only on details at hand but also on a procession of spaces and moods.

An idea that still has a client talking: The painting out of electrical switch plates and trim rings around "can"-type recessed ceiling fixtures. It is something seemingly so simple, yet can be of high visual impact.

A beach on which you would love to own a house: The beach at the southern end of Camano Island, located in the San Juan Islands between Seattle and Victoria, B.C., one of the few beaches in the region that isn't rocks or dark green sand but actually gorgeous white sand. The adjacent high bank makes access to and from the beach a bit daunting—a climb of more than 100 steps—but it does provide for dramatic views.


I love designing coastal homes because: ... of the unique challenges of providing access to key views, to structural challenges, to sun exposure and weather, to relationship to neighbors, to applying an owner's stylistic preferences.

The Northeast

Most important consideration in a coastal architecture project: Waterfront houses are inherently vulnerable to extreme weather associated with the sea, so the primary design objective is the use of materials and forms that will both protect the house and enhance the ageing process.

An unexpected or unique architectural element you've used: We have used rustic stone wall construction in many of our projects, which is usually unexpected in modern design. This method involves the use of large stones, windows set deeply into thick walls, and opaque stone walls interrupted by large areas of glass transparency.

A common myth about coastal architecture you've proven wrong: A particularly persistent myth concerning coastal architecture is the need for huge terraces and many balconies facing the water. Because the terraces and balconies have furniture and handrails, the view from inside the house becomes occluded. Our solution involves lowering the terraces sufficiently to remove furnishings and handrails from the view line of sight, and designing recesses large enough to accommodate seating into the façade in place of overhanging balconies.

Your favorite coastal house project and why: A house on the island of St. Barts in the French West Indies. The site is high, with 270-degree views from east through south to west, and the walls are aligned such that interior and exterior spaces are always focused on the view.

An evolving coastal architecture trend: We think waterfront house design is moving away from emphasizing size and elaborate detailing toward a concern for creating an intimate, subtle dialogue between the built environment of the house and hardscape, and the natural environment of the land meeting the water.

An overused element or no-no in coastal architecture: Too many unused balconies and outdoor terraces whose furniture and handrails interfere with the view.

A project that best represents your individual coastal architecture style: A project in the Hamptons on the ocean where the public spaces and master bedroom are raised up in a superstructure that hovers over the dunes and lower part of the house, which contains guest and recreation rooms.

An idea that still has a client talking: In a cliffside house in Costa Rica, a bridge that extends from the entry of the house and cantilevers over the cliff, providing a sitting area suspended 100 feet above the ground and facing the sunset.

A coastline (or beach) on which you would love to own a house: The western coast of Mexico, south of Zihuatanejo, which affords spectacular, elevated views of the Pacific and its sunsets and 35 miles of untouched white beaches, bordered by palm trees.

We love designing coastal homes because: Besides the beauty of the site, there is generally more willingness by the client to be more adventurous architecturally and to provide the resources to use superb materials, including large areas of glass. This combination of ingredients is exceptional to this segment of residential design.

LOCATION: Connecticut ARCHITECT: Peter Paulos and Philip Hubbard Partners, PH Architects ph-archs.com

Most important consideration in a coastal architecture project: It's all about the context. You have to respond to all of the elements of the site: the view, the water, the orientation, the adjacent sites and structures. The trick is to let the house become what it wants to become and what the site wants it



to become, not what your architectural training wants it to become.

An unexpected or unique architectural element you've used: There are those days when you want to let in the cool ocean breezes and smell the "jasmine air," and we often use cupolas with motorized windows to take full advantage of such days. This allows the homeowners to open the doors and windows and draw the air through the house and out of the cupola. The cupolas also introduce a wash of light to the upper-story walls and ceilings.

A common myth about coastal architecture you've proven wrong: We have seen many contemporary coastal homes that just seem too forced. We've taken time-honored elements of architectural qualities of proportion, scale, light, texture, and color and designed beautiful homes rooted in historical references and built responsibly with modern practices.

Your favorite coastal home project, and why: The Beach House in Palm Island, Florida, is far and away our favorite house, but the regulatory agencies were very challenging. We had to overcome hurdles with the State DEP, FEMA, Charlotte County, and Wildlife Protective Agencies that govern lighting and landscaping, which may affect sea turtles and gopher turtles populating the area. Having worked with these agencies, it makes the outcome all the more rewarding.

An evolving coastal architecture trend: We are seeing more clients asking for homes on a more modest scale with a concern toward efficiency. They are interested in efficiencies in building systems and controls, air conditioning, lighting controls, and smart home systems, as well as efficiencies in the use and organization of space.

An overused element or no-no in coastal architecture style: Although we do not prescribe to any particular style, we have seen designers and architects forcing their will onto a particular site, resulting in a home that doesn't respond to the context of the site and that really doesn't fit. Often,

the proportions of these homes are poorly conceived, which makes for an awkward assemblage of forms and looks haphazard.

A project that best represents your individual coastal architecture style: The beach house at the Palm Island Resort best represents what we strive for in each of our coastal homes. This house responds to the context of the homes in the area with an updated influence—it's traditional with a contemporary twist.

An idea that still has the client talking: On a new coastal house in Gulf Breeze, Florida, we designed an operating glass wall on the seaward side of the house that opened up and retracted completely like an airplane hangar door and hid in the coffered ceilings of the balconies.

A coastline or beach on which you would love to own a house: Georgica Beach in East Hampton, New York, or a small cottage on the coast in York, Maine.

We love designing coastal homes because: It's a wonderful opportunity

to be able to design and build homes in some of the most beautiful places on the coast. The calm beauty that each house portrays often belies the many regulatory hurdles, the complexities, and the effort necessary to complete the project. This makes the final home all the more rewarding.

Most important considerations in a coastal architecture project: The sun's orientation and views relative to living spaces are critical to designing a successful home. Waking up to a beautiful sun-filled space, the reflections of the water, and the sound of the ocean are what living on the water is all about.

An unexpected or unique architectural element you've used: When designing a railing system for a mid-level deck area, I used stainless steel rods coupled with a mahogany cap to create a unique but classic railing system that didn't block the views of the ocean.

A common myth about coastal architecture you've proven wrong: A house must be large to be special ... rather, it should be a house with unlimited flexibility, expanding to meet the need for large gatherings yet maintaining a special intimacy for the homeowners.

Your favorite coastal home project, and why: A home I designed for a family on the Rhode Island coast three years ago, which started as a simple three-room decoration project before turning into a major 6,000-square-foot rebuild. The complete reorganization of the 1900s cottage into a luxury family home created many structural challenges from which unique design solutions emerged.

An evolving coastal architecture trend: The development of exterior spaces, which include exterior kitchens, fireplaces, and conversation areas.

Whether open to the elements or enclosed by moving walls and roofs, exterior areas are constantly incorporating new technology and materials that enhance the owners' lifestyle.

A project that best represents your individual coastal architecture style: A grand shingle-style home in Massachusetts, which we designed from the ground up. The site was previously undeveloped and offered few, if any, obstacles to the creative process. With a clean slate and a willing client, the design reflected many components of the great coastal homes developed along the New England coast in the 1900s.

An idea that still has a client talking: The design of an exterior entertainment level in a previously undeveloped basement using retractable walls and screening was a feature the client never anticipated. Complemented by an exterior shower, hot tub, and terrace, the previously unused space is now a primary gathering area.

A coastline on which you would love to own a house: Laguna Beach, California.

I love designing coastal homes because: These properties speak to my inner person and the life experiences I so enjoy. Meeting the dreams of homeowners and their goal of building a special place for their family is really what design is all about. To bring views, the sound of the ocean, and light into a place where memories happen is extremely rewarding.

Central America

Most important consideration in a coastal architecture project: I think it's a crime to waste the opportunity to

properly design and develop the most coveted pieces of real estate on earth. For an architect, there is a real responsibility to develop a coastal property in a reverent fashion befitting the opportunity at hand.

An unexpected or unique architectural element you've used: A detail I am pleased with at Villa Punto de Vista is within the viewless hallways that I transformed into a sort of "gallery of doorways." The effect was obtained by framing each entrance with a perimeter of Italian Bisazza mosaic tile and then cove-lighting the detail. The lighting is the only illumination of the hallway and not only produces the desired gallery effect but allows the unique colors for each doorway to designate each room, eliminating the need for name plaques or door numbers.

An evolving coastal architecture trend: The most fundamental trend overall is lowering dependence on CO2-emitting utilities such as electricity and mitigating building operation costs. In coastal homes, this primarily means cutting down air conditioning using nextgeneration glazing and a more thoughtful use of sun shading, which is typically the most eco-friendly solution.


An overused element or no-no in coastal architecture: Materials that weather badly. I can't believe the number of architects still using vast amounts of exposed wood that, when not maintained with the diligence of a yacht's crew, looks 15 years old after one year in the sun.

Your favorite coastal home project and why: A project I had the pleasure of visiting recently is Playa Vik in Jose Ignacio, Uruguay, by local design legend Carlos Ott. Hats off to the man. His work is refreshingly unique and my approach to architecture is similarly inspired.

A coastline on which you would love to own a house and why: Santorini, Greece. Where else can you seemingly soar above the ocean, not to mention the lost city of Atlantis, from the rim of an extinct volcano? CONTINUED ON PAGE 118

As Boston architect Tom Catalano

explains it, his client came to him with an ambitious program for constructing a water-front compound at Oyster Harbors on Cape Cod. The idea was to create a comfortable getaway that would easily accommodate three generations of his family, afford them play space, private space, and gathering areas, mostly under one roof. "[The client] wanted to be near his club and have a home where everyone could hang out together," Catalano says.

There was a house, with views of West Bay, on the existing oceanfront plot, that was razed. The new structure, Fair Winds, is a four-story, 13-bedroom getaway, complete with a separate three-bedroom guesthouse and a pool, hot tub, and pool house.

A master suite on the first floor of the main house has access to the outside and affords his client a bit of privacy, while the third and fourth floors offer privacy to the children and grandchildren via various accommodations, including suites and a nautical-themed bunkroom over the garage. The latter, fashioned like a sailboat, has a teak and holly wood floor, a family

room just for kids, and porthole windows. The suites include kitchenettes and social spaces. In addition, the top floor offers a large family room with a kitchenette and observation deck in a tower-styled space.

To keep the generations together whether for play, dining, or entertainment, Catalano designed the main floor's living room, dining room, kitchen, breakfast room, and family room so that they all flow into each other.

Everyone can easily access the main floor's pool, which has its own changing area, in addition to an indoor kitchenette and outdoor kitchen. The lower level of the house is devoted to a health club and spa, steam room and sauna, billiards, wine cellar, and bar.

"In the design, [the client] wanted the contrast of modern with a traditional vocabulary," Catalano explains, referring to both the inside and outside architectural details. The one design constant are the dramatic ocean views. Inside, traditional is juxtaposed with modern in various vignettes. Take for example, the classic turn of the main staircase with its rich mahogany banister, or the kitchen's wire-brushed, pickled fir ceiling surface that adjoins traditionally cut millwork.

Beyond being family friendly, this house is earth friendly, too. It is well insulated, with heating and cooling coming from an earth-coupled heat pump system. This eliminates the need for any fossil fuels or noisy equipment so often found on the outside of the home. Heating the pool water comes from an ingenious system that collects heat from the cooling system of the house.

Susanne Csongor of SLC Interiors in Hamilton, MA, joined Catalano in carrying the theme of mixing traditional with contemporary. She succeeded at mixing design eras as well as designers, textures, and a





















PARADISE FOUND

To complement the home's setting, which is all about the sea and sky, as well as the homeowner's art collection, which includes works by American and Chinese artists, designer Susanne Csongor and her team chose a suitable color palette that ranges from cerulean blue to yellow to soft sea-foam green to, of course, the requisite refreshing white. Outside, the family can gather by the in-ground pool for activities or simply to enjoy the sun and a swim. Surrounding it is a minimalist blend of greenery that allows the Cape landscape to speak for itself.



limited palette of clean, uplifting colors to support the client's art collection.

"The whole setting is of super-bright ocean and sky, and we pulled that in with the colors," says Csongor. "The clients' artwork, a very strong, bold palette of American artists and Chinese art, was a driving factor for our approach."

Csongor notes that where upholstered furnishings were merged in the seating areas, they would be simple and classic, which allow for the elegant, modern shapes to take center stage and highlight the hard, angular furnishings. Designer Holly Hunt's tables, fabrics, and lighting join creations by designers Dakota Jackson and Paula Ferrante. Custom-made wool rugs, woven in Nepal, spring from the creative genius of contemporary designer Carini Lang. "He has a wonderful sense of texture and color," Csongor says of Lang.

While the living room palette is a mix of beautiful, fresh colors of cerulean blue, cream, white, and yellow, the kitchen is much more directed at making a contemporary statement. Surrounding cabinetry is comprised of flat-recessed panels, while thick blue glass tiles from Ann Sacks add a swath of color behind a run of countertop. The latter is a mix of indestructible Corien to the left and right of the stovetop, with Calcutta gold marble where the family might dine.

Hunt's ultra-clean, modern lighting fixtures complement the design focus, while set in the breakfast bay, complete with a window seat, is a 72-inch round table from designer Guy Chaddock. The table can open and seat 10-12 family members for a weekend brunch. Easy-to-clean leather chairs by A. Rudin surround the table, and Rudin leather swivel stools line the bar as well.

A dreamy, hand-knotted rug from Tufekian complements the airy feeling of the high-ceilinged family room. End tables from Guy Chaddock provide a visual contrast with the couch, club chairs, and ottoman, which are all covered in a cozy, soft chenille. Linen covered pillows from Ankasa add a punch of color.

Csongor explains the twin lampshades from Blanchfields of Boston were glazed in cerulean blue to diffuse light and add to the relaxed atmosphere in the evening. The framed antique flag adds a compelling visual focus in the room.


For the master bedroom, where serenity reigns, the palette moved to a pale sea glass green and snow white. The white-on-white linen rug is from Stark and the linens are all from Csongor's own Blue Peacock store in Hamilton.


"We found the wall mirror on a shopping spree on the Upper East Side in New York and built the whole design scheme around it. It's playful and fresh," says Csongor.

Landscape architect Joe Wahler of Stephen Stimson Associates of Falmouth, MA, partnered with Catalano to create outdoor spaces that tastefully merged formal and informal spaces using native vegetation. The concept was to create an attractive outdoor layout without disrupting the natural habitat.

"The landscape falls to our cue; it's more formal in front, more traditional with the brick courtyard framed in pink granite," Catalano explains. "As we transition to private parts, the landscape is more simple and modern—an example being the granite steps in the lawn. At the front door, we have roses on each side." Where Plane trees line the driveway, flower gardens on the north and south sides create discreet outdoor spaces. A broad band of lawn sits between the house and water; a flight of stairs leads to the private dock.

All in all, this magnificent family escape gives everyone ample space and many choices for playing and congregating.







FREGATE ISLAND: PRIVATE ISLAND ROYALTY

Island lovers, nature enthusiasts, and jetsetters take note: The elusive and exclusive world of private islands reaches new heights on the Seychelles' Fregate Island.

Arrival by helicopter is simply a grand entrance to this ancient Darwinian dreamland. Next comes paramount service, haute amenities, a 6:1 staff-to-guest ratio, a sensational spa, experiential cuisines, and most importantly, unparalleled natural grandeur. The extraordinary rock-hewn landscape teems with primordial flora and fauna, while the surrounding waters reflect hues of blue never thought possible. A private, personal beach, strewn with gigantic boulders, soaring palm trees, and pillows of sugar-loafed sand casts a heavenly backdrop for fulfilling any and all island fantasies.

Nestled on the island's western reaches, Fregate's 16 villas draw from both traditional Creole and 19th-century Colonial design inspirations. Split by a glass-encased entrance foyer, the villas' distinct partitions of bedroom and living area soon reconnect on the expansive terrace, lined with a dramatic infinity-edged swimming pool. A cushioned bale and alfresco dining pavilion flank opposite ends of the pool, idyllic spots for "in-room" dining or marveling at the sunset, if and when the novelty of the umbrella-capped loungers fades.

While high-profile celebrities tend to confine themselves to their private villas, other guests prefer rewarding days exploring this tangible Garden of Eden. Fregate's daily agenda includes hiking, swimming, snorkeling, relaxing, contemplating, and dining on some of the most precious swathes of planet Earth.

All paths on this treasured island lead to one of seven breathtaking beaches. Even stalwart Maldives, Fiji, and French Polynesia aficionados gush and gawk at the blazing beauty of Fregate's beaches. The juxtaposition of towering granite slabs. bedrock boulders, white velvety sands, lush jungle. and vibrant turquoise water could be nature's finest panorama. Though you are likely to be the only one on a beach at any given time, you can ensure this by reserving Fregate's most prized splash grounds, Anse Macquereau, as your very own. The single entrance to this secluded beach is easily guarded with a wooden "Do Not Disturb" plaque, an official mark of territory.

The lack of hunting and predation has fostered a secure home for 101 species of seabirds, namely the angelic white terns, whose ubiquitous presence make each moment here feel like a heavenly, dream-like sequence. The scene grows more surreal once you meet the island's "King of the Jungle" James, a century-old wild giant tortoise, who prefers human play dates to tortoise socials. 

The King is also joined by a troupe of prehistoric pals—from millipedes to geckos—in this evolutionary dreamland, and a full conservation team offers daily nature walks and lectures for those keen on understanding the island's ecology.

To experience Fregate to the fullest, your private butler will gladly arrange a schedule for exploring the island's most spectacular nooks and crannies. He'll Fregate Island (pictured in this spread and in previous spread) comprises just 16 luxury villas. The island's unique topography is made up of powdery sand, bedrock boulders, granite slabs, lush jungle, and—naturally—the cerulean waters of the ocean.


map out beach ambles so that they end in treasure chests filled with cool beverages, including beers and fine wines. He'll arrange an unforgettable breakfast in the treetops, eye-level with the forest canopy, including a spread of fig preserves, coconut-banana jam, homemade breads, star fruit juice, and seafood frittata, all grown or sourced on-island. Expect a bona fide sea-to-table experience, where chef grills the freshest of local seafood and island vegetables tableside. Also on the agenda can be an evening of dining and stargazing at the island boathouse or historical plantation house;













you'll indulge in a mix of traditional and haute Creole cuisine like Lobster Curry with Breadfruit and Millionaire's Salad, a secret recipe that includes fresh shaved hearts of palm and shelled passion fruit, a flavor combination once reserved exclusively for the Seychellois uber-elite.

SILHOUETTE ISLAND: PUBLIC ISLAND ROYALTY

A short 45-minute speedboat ride from the capital island of Mahé, Silhouette Island prevails as one of the archipelago's most well preserved islands, with a whopping 98 percent of it declared a natural reserve. The local population hovers around 135 people, all living in a single village. In December 2010, the completion of the Hilton Seychelles Labriz Resort & Spa opened the destination to visitors, consummating a love affair between unspoiled natural grandeur and luxury travel.

Although the official "public" island status precludes the

Hilton Seychelles Labriz from marketing itself as a larger "private island resort," the experience here is fairly similar to a private island, where guests are splendidly marooned on the island for the duration of their stay. A total of 50 individual bungalows dot the coastline and gardens of Silhouette's southern perimeter. The whitewashed wooden furnishings set the tone for a theme of understated luxury. Salt and sand quickly washes off in the oversized bathtub and expansive outdoor shower. At close range, lush mountains rise to

a beach scene, a Garden Villa, and the Ocean Pavilion, all at the Hilton Seychelles


glory, with trees sprouting from infinite craggy tiers, granting the illusion of palm trees meeting the clouds. Massive boulders cluster along the principal beach of the beachfront villas, immersed in the silkiest of Seychelles' sands.

The common areas of the Hilton Labriz boast levels of style and sophistication one would expect from a high-end tropical resort. A chic swimming pool draws the sun worshippers for elongated tanning sessions. The contemporary alfresco bar speaks to a younger demographic with its avant garde furnishings and artisanal cocktails. Foodies are spoiled with myriad dining outlets, including a Thai restaurant and an elegant and atmospheric Italian restaurant called Portobello.

Though not as indulgent or exclusive as the Seychelles' bona fide private islands, the Hilton Labriz still offers its own inspiring island magic at a more modest price point.



mountainous backdrops impress, visitors gravitate here for more than just beautiful beaches. As the Seychelles' big city equivalent, Mahé is the epicenter of national culture and the Seychellois social scene.

The Seychelles emerged from Colonialism with both strong English and French influences infused into an unwavering Creole spirit. But on Mahé, the English influence trumps the French. This influence is most evident in language, architecture, customs, and cuisine; In Victoria, the capital city, a (much) smaller version of the Big Ben demarcates the city center.

Even as the Seychelles largest island, Mahé is quiet compared to other islands of its size and importance in the Pacific or Atlantic. To put it in perspective, there are only two traffic lights in all of Seychelles, both in Victoria, which serves as the country's business center. Here, you are less likely to see folks in business suits than women in local dress heading to the market for fruits and sundries. The market excitement reaches a peak on Fridays from 4 to 11 pm, when it feel like the entire island has congregated for an evening of shopping,

eating, and drinking Tacamaca rum, and then partying the night away on the island's unofficial "party night."

Further north, the town of Beau Vallon serves as the island's social capital. This small beach town hosts the Seychelles' top local restaurants and nightlife venues. Wednesday evenings at the Beau Vallon food market are a national pastime, when locals' gather to serve centuries-old recipes to one another, none more famous than the "fruit bat coconut curry." For those feeling a little less

adventurous, the Creole BBQ at the Boat House restaurant is about as local as it gets minus the "Fear Factor"-type dishes.

Though the beauty and beaches of Mahé's northern reaches don't quite reach the grandeur of those in the south, visitors venture here for immersion in local life. The Hilton Seychelles Northolme Resort and Spa is ideally located near the thick of Beau Vallon's action. The hotel's 30 stand-alone thatched roof villas recall a rustic style of French Polynesia's overwater bungalows. With all villas facing the ocean, sunsets here are hours-long affairs, best enjoyed in the ensuite bathtub or with drink in hand at the award-winning Les Cocotiers restaurant.

The majority of high-end resorts lie on Mahé's quieter southern reaches, and for good reason: The region flaunts the



iconic imagery of every Seychelles post card without having to travel to smaller, lesser-known islands. Case in point: The Banyan Tree Seychelles, which nestles a picturesque cove with an incredibly long and wide swathe of beach in the shadow of massive granite slabs. The resort evokes a traditional Colonial style, completely white in color, stacked through the hills as a series of freestanding, archetypal Creole houses adorned with local handicrafts.

Each of the 22 beachfront and 22 hillside villas offers the type of privacy and space you'd expect from a lavish private home. In the hillside villas for example, a large wooden entrance opens to a view-heavy private terrace, infinity pool, and lounge area, which then connects to the chic Asian- and Creole-inspired bedroom and bathroom. Much like in the lobby and recreational areas, fresh hibiscus flowers decorate all corners of the villa. Beachfront villas come with an added outdoor shower bonus, and all units across the property boast haute amenities as the standard, such as the private swimming pool. For this reason, most guests choose to experience meals in their own villas, which carries no extra charge.

Though the Banyan Tree brand is renowned for its Thai cuisine, the Seychelles property also prides itself on Creole cuisine. Try to coordinate your stay over a Tuesday night, when the Chez Lamar restaurant offers an experiential Creole home-style buffet. You'll stuff yourself on snake gourd salad, golden apple salad, salted fish curry with breadfruit, head-to-tail snapper, Sunday soup, and unbelievably moist steamed banana and pumpkin cakes.






A common myth about coastal architecture you've proven wrong: Thanks to seasonal storms and hurricanes, there's a paranoia associated with coastal architecture that keeps buildings from being as "liberated" as is possible when it comes to windows and doors. My solution with Punto de Vista was the introduction of cantilevered corners throughout the building, which bring the outside in like no other structural system can with a glazing solution that still protects the villa's occupants in the event of an occasional storm.

An idea that still has a client talking: Turning the nautically shaped roof over the Jacuzzi on the villa's sixth floor into a water collector. When it rains, the collector sends a tight trail of water six stories down into the reflecting pool at the villa's entrance. Our clients simply love it and don't regret booking the villa in the off-season.

A project that best represents your individual coastal architecture style: Punto de Vista's ship-like form is in reference to the fact that the villa is "chartered" by its guests and serviced by its "crew." I also wanted the tropical birds of the rainforest to be honored with the "wings" of the building. Together you have a yacht that flies gracefully over the rainforest.

I love designing coastal homes because: There is a breezy liberation of mind and body when at the sea that few other geographies can match. That said, I see an ocean of possibility in all projects when a client is open to a building becoming what the site tells us it must be.

At home in Belize with Dane Dingerson, windsurfing champ and founder of the country's Caye Caulker Nature Reserve.

FOR WINDSURFING NATIONAL CHAMPION of Belize Dane Dingerson, there's no place like home, especially when his home happens to be surrounded by the Caribbean Sea. Dingerson is the founder of the Caye Caulker Nature Reserve (cayecaulker.org/reserve), established in 1989 on the small limestone island off the coast of Belize. With an amphibious nature, Dingerson is equally at ease navigating the eye of the wind, planing the perfect wave, and planting tropical gardens. No matter the venture, he's living Caye Caulker's island lifestyle to its fullest. -Kiley Jacques

You have had such a diverse career history. from Windsurfing National Champion of Belize, to Founder of the Ocean Academy and the Caye Caulker Nature Reserve, to CEO of Eden Isles, Inc. What inspired you to take on so many things? I began traveling in college as part of my education, and found the world full of opportunities unavailable to those who prefer to stay home.

Why Belize? Why Caye Caulker Island specifically?

I am a curious traveler and often ask other high mileage travelers, 'Where is the best place on earth?' A doctor in India, who has been to more than a hundred countries, once told me, for her, it is Caye Caulker. Many years later, I went and found she was right. I've stayed for 30 years.


What do you love most about the island? The whole island is white sand. No matter how deep you dig, there are no rocks or dirt. The water is clear and warm because the nearby reef encloses and protects us from waves: sometimes when fishing, you can actually see the fish you are trying to catch.

Describe your home and its immediate surroundings? We have a good bit of direct oceanfront property because land here is very affordable. We live on a place about 300 feet from the ocean, and we have five

small decks from which we savor our forest and coastline proximity. The vegetation grows fast, and we allow it to crowd the house to provide natural cooling from shade and evaporation.

What is Caye Caulker's appeal? Slow development is sometimes best: it allows the local culture to survive and evolve in a natural way. There is an island nearby named Ambergris Caye, which attracts travelers who enjoy luxury resort vacations. But Caye Caulker is for people looking for a true Belize-style vacation. It's the kind of place that makes people dream about staying forever.
