SLOW AND STEADY

Master the art of slow cooking on the grill with pro know-how.

t's almost the end of summer, which means you'll soon be shutting down the grill and outdoor soirées for the season. Whether you're planning a Labor Day party or other gathering this month, take full advantage of your last hurrah with a top chef conquest: slow-cooked meat. We went to grill masters Eric Miller, executive chef and partner of Madison & Main in Sag Harbor, and the experts at Food Network Kitchens on FoodNetwork.com to provide the secrets to success in this department. Now get fired up!

Prep Time

Large pork butts, briskets, and St. Louis-style spare ribs are all ideal for slow cooking on a grill, says Miller. To

prepare your meat, let it sit out for about an hour and apply your favorite dry rub. 'You can also add additional flavor by making small cuts

and sliding garlic cloves into the meat," recommends Miller.

The Wood Way One of the main

differences between grilling with wood chips instead of charcoal is that wood tends to smoke more and add more flavor to the meal. The experts at Food Network Kitchens prefer the stronger flavor that hickory or mesquite gives for a brisket; fruitwoods, such as apple and cherry, work well for milder meats, like pork, poultry, or fish.

Tackle the **Temperature**

Miller advises that the most important thing when slowcooking meat on a grill is to keep the temperature consistent by using a meat thermometer. Also, be sure to push your coals or

wood to one corner of the grill. "Slow cooking requires an ambient temperature of about 200 degrees," he says. The temperature differs slightly from meat to meat, so follow your recipe.

Let It Rest

It's important to allow the meat to stand a few minutes before you slice and serve. "During the cooking process, the muscle cells contract; during the cooling process, the meat's juices will redistribute... While it cooks, the outside is hotter than the inside. Letting the meat cool before serving will even out the temperature," Miller explains.

RECIPES

TEXAS BBQ BRAISED BEEF BRISKET (shown opposite)

From Food Network Kitchens on FoodNetwork.com

STEP1: TEXAS BBO RUB

1/4 c. sweet Hungarian paprika

1 tbsp. kosher salt

1 tbsp. light brown sugar 1 tsp. cayenne pepper

1 tbsp. freshly ground black pepper

Mix together all ingredients.

STEP 2: TEXAS BBQ BRAISING SAUCE

1 (28-oz.) can tomato purée

12 oz. lager or amber beer

2 ribs celery, minced

1 medium onion, minced

1/2 c. cider vinegar

1/2 c. brown sugar

1/4 c. vellow mustard

5 thick slices bacon, coarsely chopped (about 6 oz.)

10 cloves garlic, minced

4 canned chipotle chiles in

adobo sauce, minced

3 ancho chiles, stemmed, seeded, and chopped

2 bay leaves

2 tbsp. chili powder

1 tbsp. kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper

Mix together all ingredients, plus salt and pepper to taste, in a large disposable aluminum pan.


STEP 3: BRISKET

1/4 c. cider vinegar

1 (5- to 6-lb.) piece beef brisket, preferably point-cut, fat trimmed 6 c. wood chips, preferably hickory or mesquite Kosher salt
Dry rub
Braising sauce
4 c. water

Apply dry rub all over brisket. Wrap tightly and refrigerate overnight. Soak the wood chips in water for at least 30 minutes before grilling. Prepare an outdoor grill with a medium to medium-low fire for indirect grilling. Put brisket in the aluminum pan filled with sauce. Throw a handful of drained wood chips on the hot coals, put the pan over the cooler side of the grill, and cover so the vent holes are directly over the brisket. Baste meat with braising sauce every 30 minutes, turning occasionally and adding water to the pan as necessary to keep meat partially submerged, until the meat is tender and an instant-read thermometer inserted in the thickest part registers 200°; about 3 3/4 hours. Replenish the chips as needed to maintain a medium to medium-low fire. Transfer the brisket to a cutting board, tent with foil, and let rest for 20 minutes. Skim the fat from the braising sauce and stir in the ½-cup cider vinegar and salt to taste. Reheat if necessary. Thinly slice brisket across the grain and arrange on a serving platter. Spoon some sauce over the meat and pass the rest out at the table.

Today, "Our collection is about colors and a bold, new interpretation of geometrics," says Yasmina Benazzou, director of design and creative development of Tai Ping Carpets, which acquired the iconic brand in 2005. When customizing clients' one-of-a-kind pieces, Benazzou takes every

> detail into consideration, from the blend of the wool to the finish.

Anita Bell, a Colchester, England-based fine carpet maker and artist (escapelandscaperugdesigns. com), offers a fresh perspective on carpet design as well. The nearphotographic images on her Ocean Rug Collection bring the beach inside: "Seahorses" is an area rug featuring an image that looks like

choppy waves crashing, and "Sapphire Ocean" exhibits an oceanic image of rich blues and whites. "Clients want a bespoke service to allow for the customization in colors and different textured rug finishes," Bell states. And for those who wish to take the personalization a step further, Bell has developed her own method of applying carpet to furniture, pushing the

design into a new direction-and dimension. OlH


Bold colors, lavish patterns, and customizable design options define the new world of carpets.

ecorative carpets have existed for thousands of years, with the earliest known piece having been identified as the 2,500-year-old wool Pazyryk carpet-covered with patterns featuring griffins, deer, and lotus buds-found in the Eastern Altai Mountains. Since the earliest days of the craft, carpet design has had plenty of time to evolve to include new materials, weaves, thicknesses, colors, and styles. For Emma Gardner, a Petaluma, CA-based designer, carpet patterns have always been a particular passion.

Says Gardner (emmagardnerdesign.com), whose firm offers fine carpet styles featuring florals, geometrics, and other silhouettes and shapes taken from nature, "I stay true to my inspiration [by] looking at reference books, keeping an open mind, going to museums; [putting] myself in a visually acquisitive place."

What's trending most in the world of rugs? It's going in "three different directions," Gardner explains. "The first is graphic and colorful. Color is coming back, which I'm thrilled about. Another one is texture; a lot of people are playing with materials and construction to play with texture, or things that shimmer, look soft, look appealing." Finally, "Organic shapes, like a flower... tree bark, [or] shells." She cites two designs of her own that illustrate her point: the "Flow" carpet, on which a



MyWallArt (mywallart. com), the Eersel, Netherlands-based firm, offers embossed and three-dimensional wall panels in creative and subtle shapes and sizes. "Caryotas" looks like an abstract flower, while "Craters" is a raised-dot design. The panels, available in 20 varieties and designed to form a pattern when assembled together, are comprised of bagasse, a byproduct of sugarcane, making them entirely eco-friendly. Best of all? As the light changes, tiny shadows created by the three-dimensional elements reveal a new look by the hour.

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THE STRAIGHT **AND NARROW**


Connecting your backyard to the beach-and all points in between.

ust like Dorothy's yellow brick road to Oz, a path can be as much about style as it is about function. For ocean homes, paths can be a way to visually connect a house to its yard, provide a way straight to the beach, or simply act as an aesthetic touch that coils


through the property.


But the path itself is not nearly enough. It must have a supporting cast-from shrubbery to flowers-to really give it star quality. Cassy Aoyagi, president and co-founder of FormLA Landscaping (formlainc. com), sees the important dual role that a path plays. "Pathways really work and look their best when

HGTV contributor Nicole Sassaman (nicolesassaman. com) is in accord with Aoyagi: A path should be more than just a path. "Nothing should stay just a walkway," she says. "You want to create that style [using] potted plants, sculptural metals, swinging gates. It builds curiosity."

Martin Holder, principal of the Chicago architectural and design firm Soucie Horner (souciehorner.com), has designed paths for an assortment of oceanfront homes. Like Aoyagi and Sassaman, Holder believes that a great path sets the stage for a backyard, giving it that added oomph. "A path adds that sense of intrigue," Holder says, adding that it is more than just a "visual point of reference." However, Holder also maintains that visually, a path should have a designated end, and a well-placed gate is a great way of achieving that. "The human condition is that we walk to a gate. It looks good and marks [the end of the path]," he says.

These designers agree that materials also play a big role in designing paths, decks, and patios, and they should take cues from not only the house, but the immediate surroundings. While Sassaman is a proponent of stone-"it stands up better against salt," she says-Aoyagi says to go with wood, all the way. "Wood decking or boardwalk-looking material is really fitting and weathers nicely on the coast," she says.

Then there is lighting, whose role can never be overstated. "Effective lighting can change everything," Aoyagi says. Contiguous to the path, Sassaman loves the idea of overhanging lights-dropping long tendon lights down, or a series of Asian-style lamps.


"Lighting plays a delightful role when it comes to how we understand and dwell in a space," Aoyagi explains. "Strategic lighting extends our very understanding of the space-in and outside of the home. From the inside, it stretches our eyes out of doors, creating the sense of greater space indoors. It also really draws you outdoors. It facilitates a seamless indoor-outdoor engagement." Keeping these key factors in mind, you'll be on the rightand beautifully designed-path. OH



BUILDING PLANS

A Massachusetts couple levels an old eyesore to build anew on a dream plot of waterfront land.

arah and Ian Hart were determined to live by the ocean. But when they found a spectacular waterfront lot perched atop a 72-foot bluff in Marblehead, MA, it had an obvious flaw: the house that had stood there since the 1950s.

"We fell for a beautiful piece of land and knew that this was the spot," says Sarah. "But the house was uninspiring, in need of repair, and it was moldy. Then, we found out that it was also non-conforming because it



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
was too close to the property line. This meant that any potential renovations would trigger municipal permitting issues."


The solution was clear: Tear down the house and build a structure that would conform to zoning regulations. This also provided the couple with the opportunity to indulge in their personal preferences.

"Ian left the major design decisions to me. I knew I wanted a Shingle-style house, and I wanted it to be light and airy," says Sarah. "Originally, I am from Vermont, and I am enamored of that state's native stone, so this was also a chance to incorporate a lot of stone work."

To realize their goals, the Harts turned to Paul Muldoon of the Beverly, MA-based architectural firm Siemasko+Verbridge, who responded with a design rooted in the area's coastal traditions while also meeting an active young family's various needs. The result is a 10,000-square-foot residence that is clearly a Shingle-style house, but with a light-filled interior unknown at the turn of the 20th century, when the house style was a favorite of New England's waterfront homeowners.

"We wanted to capture the views that are all around," Sarah explains. "We got that, along with architectural

interest in each room." This includes an entry and main rooms that boast richly coffered ceilings, a barrel-vaulted garden room that leads from the garage to the kitchen, and a large cook's kitchen that flows into the dining room and the living room beyond. The great expanse of space became possible through the use of steel beams in the ceiling.

Just off the front entry foyer is a small library richly paneled in cherry. "That room, to all of our surprise, has

become the favorite space for every family member," Sarah says. "The woodwork grows richer every day; it is simply a wonderful room in winter. The kids do their homework by the fire, and it's my husband's favorite place to read."

The house design incorporates a diamond motif, which appears in the form of windows that flank chimneys and fill eaves, as well as in ornamental shingle patterns and adjoining triangular elements in the ceiling coffers. The master bedroom features a dramatic corner in which the ceiling rises up two stories. The roof atop the rambling two-story house is slate, the most historically correct material for the Shingle style.

"It is also a great idea when you consider the storms that tear in off the Atlantic," the homeowner explains. "We have seen roofs flying off houses."

Muldoon designed a home whose liberal use of stone is a special delight to Sarah. "When the builder told me they had sourced the stone for the chimneys, the fireplace walls, the patios, and the mudroom floor, it was a special delight to learn that it came from the town next to where I grew up in Vermont," she says. svdesign.com OIH



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












CLIFFSIDE IN CROATIA

Villa Dubrovnik is Croatian through and through; boasting breathtaking Adriatic views, it was built from grey Brac stone and styled by two local designers. The property has 56 rooms, including seven suites. (If sitting in an alfresco tub is your idea of heaven, book one of the two Jacuzzi-equipped deluxe suites.) There are also two villas, both with their own entrance and parking.

Go into relaxation mode in the idyllic setting of the Villa's signature restaurant, Pjerin. Located on the cliffs, the glass walls overlook the sea with an unrivaled view of the Old City. Enjoy dishes such as homemade artichoke and ricotta ravioli or rabbit fillet with hazelnuts and wild mushrooms. No visit is complete without taking in the views from the resort's rooftop bar; watch the sunset over the Old City of Dubrovnik while indulging in the large selection of international wines.

While at Villa Dubrovnik, spend time getting pampered, exercising, or relaxing in the spa, which has a yoga room, indoor swimming pool, sauna, and steam

room. Indulge in a treatment at the Villa Spa, which uses organic Sodashi products for its facials and massages, or book The Villa Spa Experience Massage Diamond, a treatment that combines chromotherapy and massage.

Out in the gardens, amid the bougainvillea and oleander, there is a serene pool where you can loll on a four-poster lounger, order strawberries and champagne, and catch up on your reading. There's also an indoor pool with French doors for the rare drizzly day. Prefer saltwater? Use the rocky private beach, which has concrete platforms for sun bathing and a ladder to the sea.

The concierge at Villa Dubrovnik can also organize various

outings and activities, including private tours of historic Dubrovnik, Peljesac peninsula, Zagreb, or the Elaphiti Islands; horseback riding in Konavle; evening cruises or sea kayaking; visits to the wine regions; and trips to the oyster farms. You can even arrange to enjoy an authentic meal at a Croatian family home.

DINING IN THE OLD CITY


The pedestrian-only Old City of Dubrovnik is charming and rife with alfresco dining options. At the seaside Nautika (nautikarestaurant.com), try the lobster or the sea bass fillet with olive oil. cooked Konavle-style. 360 Dubrovnik (360dubrovnik. com) is named for its panoramic views, and the Mediterranean cuisine is immaculately presented. Cliff-hugging Cafe Buza (cafebuza.com), accessed through a literal hole in the wall marked with a wooden "cold drinks" sign, is known as the best place to watch the sun set.

TAKE THE **DUBROVNIK** CABLE CAR

The best views of Dubrovnik and the surrounding area are, without a doubt experienced from the top of the Srd Hill. Get there via the Dubrovnik Cable Car. On a clear day, you can see up to 37 miles. For this reason, the neighboring Imperial Fortress was strategically built on this privileged spot back in the early 19th century. At the cable car station restaurant, guests can enjoy the view while choosing from numerous traditional Dalmatian meals and drinks. dubrovnikcablecar.com


PADDLE OR **CRUISE TO** LOKRUM ISLAND

Lokrum Island, just off the Croatian coast, is a popular day trip destination. The island is rich with history and natural beauty; Austrian archduke Maximilian once had a holiday home here. SEATTLE GRACE

Boasting the perfect mix of stunning landscape and city sophistication, Seattle is a world-class wonder in the Pacific Northwest.

erceived by skeptics as the rain-soaked birthplace of grunge, Seattle often takes a lower spot
on travelers' wish lists than powerhouse cities
like New York, Miami, and San Francisco. But
set amidst a surreal landscape of jagged mountains and
sparkling waterways, not to mention teeming with more
cultural offerings than can be explored in one weekend,
Seattle is the perfect marriage of rugged coastal wilderness and sophisticated city living.

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Upon arrival, first-time visitors will discover a bustling metropolis blooming with a mix of historical and modern architecture. On any given avenue, Art Deco skyscrapers tower above modern, angular apartment buildings, and anything from a bake shop to a boutique might be housed in an original 19th-century structure. When it comes to shopping, retail has deep roots here. Seattle is the site of the country's first Nordstrom and REI stores and over time has welcomed the same bold-face brands that line the likes of Madison and Collins Avenues. Meanwhile, local retailers and restaurateurs

A handful of attractions are requisites for a weekend in Seattle-among them the Space Needle, Pike Place Market, the original Starbucks Coffee shop (its menu is strikingly simple), and Alaskan Way, the city's vibrant waterfront. The latter is packed with souvenir shops and seafood restaurants and is the site of Seattle's aquarium, ferry terminal, and newly erected Seattle Great Wheel, a 175-foot-tall gondola-style observation wheel that opened in June 2012.

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
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Beyond commercial pursuits, Seattle is rife with natural scenery and easily accessible outlying areas that offer an escape from city life. As few as 10 minutes to the north by car from Seattle's waterfront and across the scenic Aurora Bridge, Fremont is Seattle's sleepier bohemian neighborhood and an ideal jumping off point for boating on breathtaking Lake Union and kite flying at Gas Works Park (seattle.gov/parks).

For a more dramatic option, at Pier 52 on the waterfront visitors can board a ferry bound for Bainbridge Island (wsdot.com). During the 35-minute westward crossing, passengers watch Seattle's skyline shrink into the distance as Bainbridge's piney, rocky shoreline comes into view. Upon disembarking, a short walk from the Bainbridge ferry terminal takes passengers to the quaint town center, which is lined with charming galleries, boutiques, and restaurants (the homemade soups, quiches, cakes, and pies at Blackbird Bakery are divine-blackbirdbakery.com). It's just enough to see and do in a day's time to leave visitors feeling refreshed and ready to return to their base in spectacular Seattle. visitseattle.org OlH



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WEATHERING YOUR TRIP

It's rainy season somewhere.

ad weather spells a bad vacation. The very outdoor activities that anchor our vacations (golf, boating, sunbathing, diving, swimming, and poolside relaxing, to name a few) come to a screeching halt at the very onset of dark skies. While nobody has quite yet tapped into the climate's crystal ball, a few excellent resources are available to statistically gauge weather trends across the world and quite possibly prevent a travel washout-even during hurricane season.

Geography 101

As basic as it may sound, just because it's a sunny and warm across the U.S. doesn't make it summer everywhere else in the world. Beyond recalling the rule of opposite seasons between the Northern and Southern

Hemispheres, it pays to do detailed research on seasonal variations within your intended destination. For example, August is cold and rainy in Cape Town, South Africa, but it also happens to be the most pleasant time of year to visit South Africa's east coast. Commence your due diligence on the "When to go & weather" sections of myriad locales on Lonely Planet's destination pages (lonelyplanet.com).

Weather websites

While weather.com is the primary go-to source for our weather in the U.S., the website lacks statistical data on monthly temperature and rainfall averages for a vast number of exotic locales. A better resource for weather trends outside North America is holiday-weather.com, which provides a wealth of charts and graphs that detail annual average weather conditions, including temperature, sea temperature, rainfall, humidity, daily sunshine hours, average rain days, and average fog.

Absolute versus relative


Not all rainy seasons are created equal. Usually, the best way to understand what "rainy season" actually means is to do a bit of comparative analysis between destinations. Consider both absolute rainfall (sheer quantity) and relative rainfall (quantity compared to another destination) on holiday-weather.com. For example, the peak of rainy season in Ko Samui, Thailand, averages 16.9 inches of rainfall in November, nearly twice as wet as that of Miami during its peak rainy season in October (9.2 inches); therefore, going to Ko Samui in November is pretty much a guaranteed washout.

Hurricane season

Hurricane season (June 1 through October 31) translates to bargain basement prices at the finest resorts across Florida, the Caribbean, and Mexico. While risk-lovers reap great rewards traveling during this time of year, some destinations are far less risky than others. Aruba, Bonaire, and Curacao, the so-called "ABC Islands," fall out of the hurricane belt, making the islands quite popular in late summer. Elsewhere in the world, our hurricane season coincides with the superlative-and dry-weather on islands such as Bali.

Randomness

Even with all the advances in meteorology and excellent online tools, often the age-old adage holds true: "You can't predict the weather." Regardless of how well you think you've timed your holiday, always bring a few books, board games, or other diversions for when you're kept indoors. OH

A small, four-member staff provides colorful alfresco continental breakfasts, and the chef is available to prepare traditional Italian dishes accompanied by local wines. All meals are prepared fresh daily with ingredients from the on-site garden.

A stay at Villa Lilly may best be described by John Steinbeck, who wrote, "Positano bites deep. It is a dream place that isn't quite real when you are there and becomes beckoningly real after you have gone." GULF COAST

Everything's bigger in Texas, and Gulf Coast homeowners are gravitating toward art that's larger than life—just like their real estate. "People are looking for bold statement art that will wow their visitors and command a room," says Alex Farkas, co-founder and director of innovative online art marketplace UGallery (ugallery.com), of this mature client base's tastes. "Size and color often seem more important than subject matter. The art tends to be influenced by the surrounding landscape, and some pieces even skew toward conservative and religious themes."

SEA ISLAND, GEORGIA

It's no accident that the art scene of the islands off Georgia's coast is reflective of Southern charm and hospitality. "It's comfort over design," says Farkas. "While these areas aren't defining the next wave of art culture, they're big art consumers. People tend to gravitate toward traditional style and subject matter, like lots of landscapes and natural colors like rich greens and blues. The overall intent of the design is to create a comfortable and welcoming living space."

LOS ANGELES

Los Angeles's über-cool art scene pulls influence from everywhere, especially the allure of Hollywood and the city's roots as a fashion Mecca. "The art tends to be highly staged and cinematic," says Farkas. "A number of the most well-known contemporary Pop artists live in L.A., [and] some of the best photography we're seeing right now is being shot in L.A.—the city seems to be a bridge between the established New York art world and San Francisco's more 'new world' tastes. Los Angelenos are looking for a little bit of East Coast refinement and some of Northern California's grit."

MIAMI

In this established art city, look for Miami's one-of-a-kind sense of personal expression and liveliness within the home, not just on the streets. "People are buying large, bold abstracts and seascapes with lots of metallic and jewel-toned colors," Farkas says. "The art tends to be Pop, clean, and from more established artists. We see people in this area using art as a way to show sophistication. Miami is unique because it's an area with money and style, but also with a certain relaxed culture. People have good taste but don't seem to take themselves or their art too seriously."

MALIBU

Malibu's artistic tendencies go beyond cutting-edge twists on art and photography, extending into architectural elements that might prove too daring for other areas of the country. "I've been seeing a lot of adapted photography and conceptual art, like that of Jason Paul Bennett's hologram camera photography and Andy Cao," says Malibu-based private art dealer and collector Jenny Hardy. "In addition, general architecture has taken a very artistic 'anything goes' homage to Hollywood. The design of the homes themselves, more often than not, proliferate what might be referred to elsewhere as unlivable visual eccentricities—or 'classical progression' to the maximum. Think: remote-sensing 'werewolf security guard' props, 'air plants,' and shabby-chic ancient imports, like worn sterling silverware melted for wall paint, courtesy of Marshall Lewis and Jens Holst."

seems fitting that **Hayman** offers a deluxe beach villa numbered 007. After all, upon arriving here, guests will feel they're channeling Daniel Craig as the private seaplane delivering them from the airport on nearby Hamilton Island—after a seamless two-hour flight from Sydney—splashes down on the impossibly blue waters of the Coral Sea and slips smoothly into Hayman's marina. The cinematic James Bond, surprisingly, has never set foot in Australia in 50 years of action and adventure, but Hayman would surely top the list of every movie location scout as the perfect place for 007 to romance yet another stunning femme fatale.

On this occasion, we're welcomed by Friedel, a fresh-faced South African, who quietly introduces himself as our personal butler and whisks us to the sanctuary of a beachfront villa, where we are encouraged to take a dip in the plunge pool while he arranges a spot of lunch. Friedel then offers some amazing choices for our afternoon activities: a diving or snorkeling trip to nearby Blue Pearl Bay, a helicopter flight to iconic Whitehaven Beach and its vast swirls of pure silica sand, or a catamaran to sail off Hayman Beach. We could almost hear M telling us to get back to work as we weighed our options.

The most northerly of the Whitsunday Islands—a cluster of 74 densely forested isles basking in sunshine off the tropical coast of Queensland—Hayman makes the most of its rare natural beauty and unique position as a jewel in the crown of Australia's Great Barrier Reef retreats.

Perched on a crescent-shaped beach with panoramic views of neighboring Hook Island and Australia's mainland in the distance, the 209-room resort is divided into two low-rise wings, one cascading to an eyecatching hexagonal swimming pool, and the other set around a tranquil lagoon, complete with a pair of white swans. The pool wing's 90 rooms and six suites are the smaller of the two annexes but offer spectacular views of the swimming pool, beach, and Coral Sea. (Opt for a pool-access room on Level 1 and you can dip into the saltwater pool directly from your private balcony.) A more secluded and residential experience awaits in the lagoon wing's 90 rooms and 12 suites, with each suite featuring a separate

bedroom, dressing room, lounge, and dining area, double balcony, and an open bathroom that boasts a deep tub for an after-sun soak. A renovation program for both the pool and lagoon wings, scheduled to commence this year, will bring the accommodations' interiors to a new caliber mirroring that of their beautiful setting.

Eight beachfront villas added a new layer of luxury to Hayman when they opened in 2010, and they remain the resort's most sought-after accommodations, along with a private beach house next to the villas, which comes with

an outdoor plunge pool. Designed by renowned international architect Kerry Hill, who has won acclaim for his work with Amanresorts, each beach villa is a light-filled hideaway featuring a spacious and contemporary bedroom and bathroom separated by an open-air gallery with an oversize plunge pool, daybed, and outdoor shower. Beach villa guests also enjoy dedicated butler service, and a concierge is on hand to arrange reservations in Hayman's myriad dining venues and for booking island and reef activities.

Perched on opposite sides of Circular Quay—one of Sydney's major ferry, bus, and train hubs—each hotel is a kangaroo's hop from most of the city's best attractions.

The suite accommodates up for four people and is priced at AUD \$5,000 (approximately USD \$5,200) per night, including around-the-clock butler service.

While most guests check into the resort for a few nights, a select few can now buy into the Hayman lifestyle, thanks to the release of brand new residential properties, the first private ownership opportunity ever offered on the island. Situated on a hillside just east of the resort, with magnificent views of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, the first two Hayman Private Residences designed by Kerry Hill have been completed recently and sold to undisclosed buyers for a reported AUD \$18 million (USD \$18,750,000) each. More will become available in the near future.

One of the residences, a five-bedroom masterpiece with an infinity pool, media room, and expansive indoor and outdoor entertaining areas, is being leased back to Hayman for vacation rentals (per night rates on application). 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

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CAROLINA COOL

Low-key luxury shines along North Carolina's Crystal Coast

xperiencing North Carolina's Crystal Coast is like facing a string of endless Saturday mornings. Oceans of outdoor activities do their best to compete with the tug of a lazy day spent relaxing on the extra-wide beaches. No matter the choice, tomorrow offers another opportunity.

Devoid of even a single beachside hotel or resort development, Crystal Coast beaches are free from typical resort crowds and host more crabs and gulls most days than tourists. Miles of bike paths, shared marinas, and county-wide programs such as the Carteret Catch, a pledge by local restaurants to serve locally caught seafood, are just a few of the components that comprise this vast southern region off North Carolina's Pamlico Sound.

The interconnected beach communities that make up the area are more like siblings than distant relatives. While each shares its own personality and character, there is an underlying filial relationship that lets visitors know regional kinship is paramount.

Well south of their better-known Outer Banks cousins of Cape Hatteras and Ocracoke Island, the Crystal Coast communities framing Bogue Sound begin along scenic Highway 58. Here, Emerald Isle is the westerly anchor providing modern amenities and old-fashioned

beach town values. Families are the focus at this gem in the coastal crown, which boasts dozens of "sand castles"oversized, family-friendly mansions fully equipped for weekly rental and typically situated right on the shoreline.

Four miles up the road are Indian Beach and Salter Path. Heavy concentrations of second-home owners grow the summertime population of these villages, though each retains a comforting, small-town feel. Lore has it that Salter Path got its name from the trail fishermen carved by carrying their catch from the beach to the sound just past Riley Salter's mid-1800s home.

Salty tales are not restricted to 19th-century history, as one of the Crystal Coast's most famous visitors-if not a temporary resident-was the most notorious pirate that

ever sailed the seas, the feared and ruthless Blackbeard. His infamous ship, the Queen Anne's Revenge, is one of hundreds of wrecks just off shore, scattered along this section of the Outer Banks known as the graveyard of the Atlantic.

Sunk in 1718, the ship shares a watery tomb with many other wrecks-turnedreefs, including German U-boat submarines used during WWII. Hosting a higher concentration of wrecks than any other locale in the world, the Crystal

Coast was named the No. 1 wreck-diving destination in North America by Scuba Diving magazine.

Pine Knoll Shores, one of the most natural and untouched areas of Bogue Banks, is halfway between Atlantic Beach and Indian Beach and is home to one of three of North Carolina's state aquariums, a remarkable destination housing the state's largest saltwater tank that contains 900,000 gallons teeming with sharks and dozens of indigenous species.

Housed at the far end of this barrier island is Atlantic Beach, the Coast's elder statesman. Atlantic Beach contributes cultural capital to the region with concerts, outdoor films, and special events all summer long. Some of the area's best seafood restaurants reside here, serving up Atlantic triggerfish, North Carolina shrimp, and linecaught yellowfin tuna. Check out the casually chic Amos Mosquito's (amosmosquitos.com), where an ambitious menu featuring dozens of seafood specialties is executed with expertise.

Separated by the Beaufort Inlet, Beaufort and Morehead





City are sister towns of sorts, with Beaufort having undergone a renaissance of sorts. Beaufort's townspeople recognized the historical significance of their community (an important port for both the Northern and Confederate armies during the Civil War) and had the foresight to begin preservation efforts in 1977 that eventually led to a fullblown revival. What stands today are lovingly restored Civil War-era homes fronted by a highly serviceable marina (situated on the Intercoastal Waterway), a tiny but funky shopping district, and two oceanographic research facilities-The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) Center for Coastal Fisheries and a marine lab

run by Duke University.

Morehead City is more of a working-class town and is home to shipbuilding facilities and a large port that receives ships from as far away as China. The community is home to the annual Big Rock Blue Marlin Tournament



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each June (thebigrock.com). In this sport fishing Mecca, the meeting of the icy waters from Canada's Labrador Current collide offshore with the warmer Gulf Stream, creating a habitat second to none for trophy fish such as blue and white marlin, sailfish, and bigeye tuna, and superb eating fish like red drum, yellowfin tuna, and wahoo.

More than 56 miles along the Crystal Coast are dedicated to the wildly popular and permanently protected Cape Lookout National Seashore, home to the wild Banker Horses that have roamed free on Shackleford Banks for over a century. This destination represents one of the few natural barrier island systems in the world.

Carteret County, home to the Crystal Coast, boasts a population of 67,000. Many beachside homes feature a mashup of architectural styles from the Bahamas, Key West, and mainland Florida, showing off pastel colors like pistachio, peach, and lime green with white-on-white working shutters. Wraparound porches at both ground and second-story levels afford 360-degree views of rolling sand dunes, tall native grasses, and estuaries teeming with more than 100 species of water fowl.

Those fortunate to settle on the Crystal Coast have learned that the secret of this area rests somewhere between the ocean breeze and an it's-all-good state of mind.

A breezy wraparound porch affords the quintessential Southern experience, while finely tended English herb and flower gardens perfume the salt air and add to the elegant Victorian flavor of this lovely inn by the sea. pecantree.com

SELLING ON THE SEA

By the Sea Sotheby's International Realty carries the name and gets the results

he real estate market on Boston's North Shore is rife with stunning seaside mansions. Arguably, no one in the business knows the area and its inventory better than Karen Hanson, who heads up the firm By the Sea Sotheby's International Realty in the North Shore town of Beverly. The company was granted its Sotheby's affiliation in 2006 and has since been servicing high-wealth individuals throughout the region.

The firm carries only around 40 listings at a time, of which about half are coastal homes, according to Hanson. About half of its listings are over \$1 million. This year alone, By the Sea has sold about twice as many million-dollar homes than in 2012-and the year is far from over. "We are about 30 percent higher in total sales volume than 2012," Hanson says.

Need more proof of a turning market? Hanson says that the number of days on market for homes in the company's core area are down 19 percent, year over year, and in the over-\$1 million segment, days on the market are down 34 percent. "The market overall has seen shades of turning the corner from a buyer's to a seller's market, although we are far away from our peak in 2006," Hanson says. "Market volume is creeping up, as is market confidence, and homes that are priced well, especially those on scarce pieces of waterfront land, are selling at a faster clip than we've seen in years."

There's no doubt that the real estate market in and around the North Shore is back, as owners of coastline properties slowly begin bringing their assets to market. And buyers are there waiting. "No matter when you bring a house to market, if [it's] priced properly and it's unique enough, it will sell," Hanson says.

Regardless of what hits the market, buyers have the means to buy. "People who purchase these [homes] will always be able to," Hanson says. "They...see there's value, that it's a safe investment."

And the old real estate adage, again, rings true; it's all about "location, location." Buyers today don't care so much about the house itself, what realtors call the "bones." What buyers do care about is the land, the view, and the water. "Anyone in [the high-end] sector of the market can do anything to the house, even take it down



and rebuild," Hanson says. But act fast, Hanson warns, as it's not just a local market-international

buyers, too, are chomping at the bit. Hanson says that about a third of the traffic to her firm's website comes from international visitors; furthermore, the percentage of By the Sea's sales from international buyers is between 5 percent and 7 percent.

"The market couldn't be better," Hanson says. It sure sounds like it. bytheseasir.com OlH
