Tall ships, acoustic guitars, and innovative design may not be conventional bedfellows, but when they come together in unison, the results can be stunning.

For more than 30 years, Wisconsin-based McPherson Guitars has been making pitch-perfect guitars for some of the world's top music stars-including Brad Paisley and Amy Grant-which are not only pitch-perfect instruments but also beautiful works of art.

Owner Matt McPherson's abiding love of the ocean, especially New England's historic tall ships, has inspired him to create a unique Nautical Guitar, blending cutting-edge design and technology with classic craftsmanship and detail.

Crafted from gorgeous Adirondack Red Spruce, Brazilian Rosewood, Flamed Maple, Honduran Mahogany, and Ebony, the Nautical has ocean-themed adornments including a hand-inlaid compass on the back, and exquisite scrimshaw by master scrimshander Bob Hergert on the peghead, heelcap and bridge.

"Tall ships have captivated people for centuries," says McPherson, "and we wanted to honor that legacy with a oneof-a-kind guitar." Valued at \$50,000, it's certain to become a collectors' item, mcphersonguitars.com.

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
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
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
COSTA BLANCA, SPAIN

High noon on Spain's beautiful Costa Blanca and life at the House on the Cliff is as it should be. The work of innovative Spanish studio Fran Silvestre Arquitectos, this unique ocean home, near Alicante, is designed as a single monolithic structure, protruding from a cliff and looking serenely towards the Mediterranean Sea. The sleek exterior, a concrete edifice covered by a white lime stucco as a nod to local traditional architecture, contrasts sharply with the rugged coastline. Living areas and bedrooms are contained in the upper level, complete with a balcony affording panoramic water views, while a staircase descends across an exterior wall to an infinity pool, fransilvestrenavarro.com.

OUT OF THE BOX

A RISING STAR ARCHITECT USES UNORTHODOX METHODS TO CREATE EYE-CATCHING DESIGNS

an Brunn is a Lego devotee. He takes to the multi-colored and sturdy building bricks with the same gusto as a child would to a new toy fire truck-prodding them, banging them around, pushing them to their limits.

Brunn isn't a child, though. He's a rising star architect, and he's stamping his unique and contemporary design aesthetic on California's iconic Pacific coastline, building trend-setting homes for design-conscious clients in Los Angeles and San Francisco.

Still, he loves his Lego. "It all started in childhood," he says of his enduring enthusiasm for the ever-popular Danish export. "I used to love building everything from cars to cities, and even though it's considered a children's toy, I still use Lego today to present to clients."

His seemingly unorthodox pitches have worked. Two of his recent projects, at Venice Beach in Los Angeles, and in the Bay Area of San Francisco, call to mind the

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distinctness of a Frank Lloyd Wright or Mies van der Rohe home-and more than for their names alone.

Like Wright's cantilevered Fallingwater, or Mies' glass-on-stilts Farnsworth House, Brunn's stylish and contemporary Flip Flop and Fold Up houses have a shape, flow, and design that's both visually arresting and not easily forgotten.

Innovative yet lasting design lie at the foundations of Dan Brunn Architecture, which operates from an office on Wilshire Boulevard in Los Angeles and another in his native Tel Aviv. "It's what I'm aiming for," he says. "I want to create and develop memorable work."

Consider Flip Flop's deliberately extended balconies, facing directly onto L.A.'s popular Venice Beach. "They have to do with reaching inside outside," Brunn says, alluding to Wright's use of positive and negative space.

"I try to carve out from a box everything else that you'd be inhabiting inside the box. My architecture is very much about choreography and walking through a space to a certain tempo."

Another example of this comes shining through his Fold Up house, located in the Bay Area of San Francisco. Here, the house is all about the center core-the stairs.

"Instead of placing them in a manner where you would face the beach, they are positioned at 90 degrees," he says. "It makes the user walk around the house, and always appreciate the ocean, but also have a sense of self. It's not only about the view but about the person within the view."

Heady stuff, but it fits the 35-year-old Brunn's curious nature and global perspective. Born in Tel Aviv, his family moved to the United States while he was still in elementary school and playing with Lego.

His innate creative spirit fueled a Bachelor of Architecture degree from USC, followed by a move east to attend the Harvard Graduate School of Design, and back west again to launch his own architecture practice.

Brunn describes his architectural style as inspired





by Bauhaus or the International Style, and he's always thinking outside the box.

At Flip Flop house, for example, he installed a stylish reflecting pond on the ground floor, which combined with the ocean breezes, releases cool air up through the house via a 'siphon' effect.

Other design innovations include outdoor heating (a must for balconies, says Brunn) and home automation. "Modern technology permeates design," he says. "The question is, how do we integrate it, not should we?"


Brunn also takes a whimsical approach to design, and almost always tries to add a fun element to his projects. "My Dad wishes I was on Saturday Night Live," he says. (Impressions are a forte of his.)

And while Brunn is an avid musician who composes rock music and fronts a band, much of his inspiration comes from travel.

A key element in the design of his widely acclaimed and award-winning CaesarStone Showroom, located in San Francisco, was taken from a sculpture he once saw while touring in Brazil.

"I like to appreciate what other architects don't go to see, something mundane," he says. "And when it comes time to start designing, I have that recollection and draw inspiration from it." danbrunn.com. OH

A LEADING ROLE

CHOOSING THE RIGHT ARCHITECT IS THE KEY TO SUCCESS IN ANY HOME DESIGN PROJECT

uilding or remodeling your own home can be one of the most exciting and rewarding life experiences, but it can also be a complex and daunting challenge. Finding, choosing, and working with the right team of professionals is the key element of any home design project, and the secret to success lies firmly in the business and personal relationships between owner and architect.

An architect plays a pivotal role in the planning, organization, and management process—professionally, creatively and sustainably—and it's essential to put considerable time and effort into choosing the right person for the job. Thankfully, help is at hand.

The American Institute of Architects (AIA), based in Washington, D.C., is not only the ideal place to start your search but is an invaluable network of professionals, services, and resources which can help guide and support you through your home building or remodeling project.

Founded in 1857, the association represents more than 83,500 licensed architects and industry professionals across the United States, many of whom are at the forefront of the ever-changing trends, innovations, rules, and regulations which drive the complex and fast-moving world of architecture.

"An architect is a bit like the director of a movie," says John Isch, a principal of Cincinnati based RWA Architects, and current chair of CRAN, the AIA's influential Custom Residential Architects Network–a "knowledge community" of 1,500-plus members at the leading edge of custom residential architecture.

"Of all the people involved in the construction of a building," he adds, "the architect really is the only one to have the most holistic viewpoint of the entire process. We're considering everything from the aesthetics to health, safety, and welfare issues, the product selection, sustainability, and economics, and managing all those things simultaneously."

A good architect, says Isch, should be the client's advocate at all times, helping an owner to make decisions, managing the outcomes, communicating quickly and clearly, and being a responsive and flexible intermediary and problem solver as issues arise. "The client must always come first," he adds.

Isch warns against what he calls "imposters" who are not registered but still portray themselves as architects,



and advises working only with architects who are members of AIA. "They're the ones who are really trying to develop themselves, to elevate their game, and who are passionate about the profession," he adds.

Isch asserts clients who choose AIA member architects also benefit greatly from the association's expansive support network, adding: "If you're not a member of AIA, you're really a voice of one." Members must also adhere to the AIA's strict Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct, assuring clients of their dedication to the highest standards of professional practice.

The AIA can also save homeowners time and money with an array of free, downloadable online documents, such as *You and Your Architect*, offering guidance on how to find the right architect and establish solid working relationships, *aia.com*. **OIH**

Here are some crucial questions to address when meeting with a prospective architect:

Experience

- · What is your design philosophy?
- · What sets your firm apart from other architects with similar experience?
- Do you have experience with the building type and size of my project?
- · Will you share with me a portfolio of similar projects and provide a list of client references?
- · Who from the architecture firm will I be dealing with on a regular basis? Is this the person who will design my project?

My Project

- · Are you interested enough in this project to make it a priority?
- · What challenges do you foresee for my project?
- What do you see as the important issues or considerations in my project?
- What is your estimated timetable for my project?
- · What means will you use to collect information about my needs, goals, etc.?
- · How will you help me to fully understand the scope and sequence of the project? Will you utilize models, drawings, or computer animation?

Design

- · What are the steps in the design process, and how are they organized?
- · What criteria will be used to establish priorities and make design decisions?
- · What do you expect me to provide?
- · How disruptive will construction be?
- · What role do you have during construction? Am I expected to work with the contractor directly?

Green Design

- · Do you have experience with "green" or sustainable design?
- Do you regularly integrate low or no cost sustainable design strategies into projects?



- · Considering the many areas that may be affected by sustainable design, how will you determine which options to pursue?
- · If sustainable design technologies are implemented, do upfront costs exist that may affect the construction budget? What are the expected pay back times?

Fees

- · How do you establish fees?

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HOME GROWN ROOFS

TURNING YOUR OCEAN HOME ROOF INTO AN ECO-GARDEN IS NOW AN EXCITING REALITY

he 'green roof' has long been the realm of commercial buildings and, to the untrained observer, is something of a vague concept-an altitudinal vegetative space, perhaps, or maybe an elevated garden.

A green roof does indeed exist out of the line of sight of the grounded eye, but that's not to say out of sight is out of mind. This curious, yet fascinating, innovation is going through an evolution of sorts, expanding from large commercial spaces atop offices, hotels, city halls, and factories to home grown residential rooftops.

So what exactly is a green roof? Here's the scientific definition: a series of layers including a waterproof membrane, root barrier, drainage mat, erosion control fabric, lightweight engineered soil, and vegetation. All well and good so far, but in layman terms, a green roof is just that-a green space which can be designed to grow any combination of vegetation from plants to shrubbery, even produce.

Both aesthetically pleasing and environmentally sound, green roofs reduce stormwater run-off and energy consumption, two environmental bonuses best

witnessed atop Chicago's City Hall, where an expansive green roof helps to cool the iconic and monumental building. New York's always trendy Brooklyn is also bedding in as a green roof hotspot, with success stories like Brooklyn Grange billing itself confidently as a commercial urban farm.

One of the firms leading the charge into residential green roofs is Apex Green Roofs of Somerville, Mass., which has maintained the green roof at Boston's Four Seasons Hotel, and constructed green roofs for homes in nearby Cambridge, and also Gloucester, just north of the city.

Apex owner Charles Sinkler says while Europe has been a pioneer in residential green roof construction, public interest has been steadily rising here in the United States over the past five years.

"The rise in popularity of green roofs is largely a combination of the green movement and the stormwater issue," he says, citing local governments in German cities which began charging building owners for stormwater run-off which was seen as a leading cause of pollution.

"A green roof is not only good for the environment," says Sinkler, "but home owners can create something aesthetically pleasing, and it is proven to at least double the life expectancy of a roof."

There are two types of green roofs-extensive and intensive. The latter are essentially elevated parks, able to sustain shrubs, trees, walkways, and benches due to their complex structural support, irrigation, drainage, and


for larger plant species, including bamboo and small shrubs. "It's instant gratification," says Sinkler.

One of the cleverer green roofs Apex has done was in Southwest Harbor, Maine, for a private residence bordering Acadia National Park. The roof was built on top of the home's garage and covered with semi-intensive herbaceous perennials and shrubs, making the garage appear almost as part of the landscape.

Green roofs like these are becoming more popular with homeowners and municipalities as a way for buildings to be less visually distracting from the surrounding natural landscape.

One aspect of a green roof, however, that does induce hesitation from homeowners is potential leakage. Bear in mind that there would be an entire vegetative space, and the water needed to sustain it, atop your house.

Luckily, technology known as Electric Field Vector Mapping exists to prevent this, with the ability to locate a leak the size of a pinhole, or even a larger tear, with speed and accuracy. A green roof may not be for everyone, but it's certainly a concept that's firmly on the rise. *apexgreenroofs.com.* **O**|**H**



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
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THE LIGHT FANTASTIC

THE RIGHT OUTDOOR LIGHTING WILL MAKE ANY HOME AND LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE SHINE

xterior lighting is as much about function as it is about form. Like any light, its main job is to illuminate and to provide clarity and definition to a space, but it's as much a part of the overall home experience as any interior lighting.

So says Simon Berry, director of Singapore based Illuminate Lighting Design. "Often a client will become so involved with the interior lighting element that the exterior lighting gets overshadowed," he says. "Yet the exterior is the journey to the interior, so it is an equally important part of the experience."

Exterior lighting unquestionably makes a statement, its purpose to accentuate the architectural design and landscape of a home. Without thoughtful and dynamic exterior lighting, a home loses a chance to shine when the sun goes down. "What we are really talking about is kerb appeal after dark," said Randall Whitehead of San Francisco based Randall Whitehead Lighting Solutions. "No matter how well a home is maintained or how beautifully it's landscaped, if it is not illuminated at all or illuminated poorly, all the homeowner's hard work is lost after dark."

So what makes good exterior lighting? It's about positioning, for one. "You have to think of the landscape

as a stage," says Berry. Take a home with water views, for example. "If you are lucky enough to have a direct view of the sea, then this is clearly the focal point and the light should lead the eye to this finale," he says. "If you keep the light low to the ground, and uplight trees, that will frame the view." Avoiding direct light is another key. "You should only be able to see the lit effect, not the source that is creating it," Berry adds.

According to Whitehead, the biggest design trend in landscape lighting is what is being widely dubbed "the moonlighting effect". This is where lights are mounted on the upper branches of tall trees or underneath the eaves of the main house to create shadow patterns onto the pathways, as if light were passing through the leaves or branches of the tree. "This is a very naturalistic way of creating exterior lighting," he says.

Of course, no lighting discussion is complete without tackling energy efficiency. Today, it's all about three letters: LED. "With a variety of LED colors available, not only can you illuminate the greenery in gardens, you can also do a fine job of illuminating fountains and pools," says Whitehead.

There's also the cost factor. "The advantage of LEDs over their incandescent counterparts is that they use much less energy," Whitehead continues. While a standard bulb will last between 2,500 and 3,500 hours, LEDs will last in the range of 25,000 hours.

"Though there will be a higher initial cost for the components, the energy savings can be seen immediately," he adds. "Homeowners will get their investment back in an average of three to four years," illuminateld.com, randallwhitehead.com. OH


ON THE SUNNY SHORES OF BARBADOS, COBBLERS COVE IS THE ESSENCE OF WEST INDIES HOSPITALITY

arbados possesses a certain casual elegance that's seldom found elsewhere in the Caribbean, and that vibe is beautifully brought to life at Cobblers Cove in Speightstown, a beachfront boutique hotel that is equal parts refined (the product of its English heritage) and relaxed (a reflection of its breezy West Indies setting).

Comprising just 40 suites set amid tropical gardens and far removed from the clamor of tourist traffic, Cobblers Cove feels less like a resort than a cozy island home (or English manor, to be exact). The atmosphere is so serene, in fact, that you might find tearing yourself away from its gentle embrace all but impossible during your stay.

In the spirit of true tranquility and relaxation, guests won't find TVs in their suites (though WiFi is available for those who can't bear to be totally disconnected). Instead,

private patios outfitted with lounge chairs and in-room bookshelves stocked with popular volumes encourage guests to kick back with a good read-or dream, if a nap in the breeze is more their speed. To make the most of the property's tucked-away and oceanfront setting, full shutterstyle walls retract, letting the sea breezes and birdsong in.

When guests aren't unwinding in the privacy of their suites, they can lounge poolside on the patio, charter a boat for a day of fishing, diving or waterskiing, or paddle a kayak or try other non-motorized watersports around the property's periphery. The beach at Cobblers Cove is home to a living reef, which, combined with its consistently calm, clear water, makes it a prime spot for snorkeling.

Among Cobblers Cove's standout features is Chef Michael Harrison's excellent cuisine, which, coupled with the hotel's luxe offerings and amenities, helped earn it a place in the prestigious Relais & Châteaux group.

Guests can enjoy Harrison's award-winning fare in high style at The Terrace Restaurant, which is open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner, or in a more casual mode at the poolside bar. ON PORTUGAL'S WILD ALGARVE COAST,

some 180 miles south of Lisbon, close to the point where Western Europe sinks into the Atlantic Ocean, Casa Colunata's graceful lines and crisp finish are in sharp contrast to the rugged terrain.

Its unabashedly contemporary design is in marked contrast, too, to the region's historical significance. Lagos is an ancient maritime town with more than 2,000 years of history, the acknowledged epicenter of Portugal's golden age of discovery.

The clean lines and structural curves of this Lagos home (the name translates from Portuguese as Colonnade House, a nod to the previous occupant of the site) embrace panoramic views over one of Europe's most beautiful coastlines.

The modernist house design, a broadly semi-circular structure, affords total privacy for the home's generous outdoor living spaces without obstructing the main site lines—and outdoor living along with captivating sea views are what this striking home are all about.

Designing a cutting-edge ocean home in this location presented an interesting set of design priorities. The concept was to build a contemporary house open to the sea, but protected from the wind. "Like a person opening their arms to the ocean," says Mário Martins, eponymous founder of Mário Martins Atelier, the innovative Lagos based architectural studio behind the design.

"The central terrace is the main space of the house,

where there is a sense of privacy and the horizon is predominant. It is around this terrace that the functional organization of the house is structured, on a single floor."

Five bedrooms, each en suite, and a large living room that opens into an elegant dining area and generous kitchen deliver a sense of space and openness. A cool monochrome palette for the interior adds a sexy, stylish finish that invites in the vivid blues outside.

Floor to ceiling windows create a smooth transition from exterior to interior, and a minimalist's eye for furnishings ensures that the vista takes center stage. The built area is just under 4,000 square feet of a total plot measuring 32,000-plus square feet.

The remarkable curved structure embraces the terrace and two-tier infinity pool and invites the occupants to live seamlessly between indoors and outdoors. "The

outdoor area is a natural extension of the house," says Martins. "The occupants are protected in the middle; it's as if they are being hugged by the building."

The angular statement arch, an architectural flourish at the eastern end of the curve, was inspired by the previous property on the site—a 1960s house with multiple arches (hence the 'colonnade' name reference). Martins refers to it as "an elegant pillar" and says it points to the black coastline rocks beyond.

Martins notes that this house—like all of his designs—is firmly rooted in a sense of place with a respect for, and connection with, the surrounding area. "I prefer to create something new, but using local materials and our culture as a base. My architecture is based in nature and the weather. I play with the natural elements."

It was fundamental to the architect, who was born and raised in the Algarve area, that local materials and building techniques were used in the construction. He notes that the house is covered in the simple white plaster typical of the region.

"Architecture doesn't need to use rich materials; the richness of architecture is shape, form and design," he says. "It is a southern house and as such the light is intense. It is this light, with its strong, distinct shadows, that gives color and meaning to the white that covers the building. The strong presence of water and surrounding

landscaping accentuate the tranquility of the place."


Martins says he has no particular style and doesn't follow fashion. "I go to a site and follow my feelings, a culture, and sometimes the site designs the house. I don't arrive there knowing what I am going to design. It is about the site and the natural conditions."


The Casa Colunata project was launched in 2007 and the home was a year in the design stage and took some 18 months to two years to build.

Martins acknowledges the greatest challenge was using local builders unaccustomed to a project of this type. But he's quick to add that they were more than a match for the task, and the finish is testament to their craftsmanship.


The architect elegantly avoids talking numbers—what the property cost to build and what it might be valued at today. This, he suggests respectfully, is a matter for its owners. But he does concede there has been considerable interest in buying it.

When asked whether Casa Colunata represents a watershed moment and a place among his favored designs, Martins is circumspect. "My favorite will be the next house," he says. "My challenge is to make a new house that is better than this one. This is what gives me the possibility to keep going." Watch this beautifully designed space, *mariomartins.com*. **OIH**






















SUPERSTAR LENNY KRAVITZ TURNS ROCK STAR DESIGNER AT PARAMOUNT BAY, MIAMI'S HOTTEST NEW LUXURY RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS

2010, Paramount Bay was a forlorn symbol of a Florida condominium market that had taken a sharp plunge into a real estate abyss. A renewed commitment to cutting-edge design, however, has transformed it into a major success story.

Stalled out and foreclosed upon three years ago, it was an incomplete 47-story tower, with common areas that were nothing but raw and open spaces. Even its location in downtown Miami, east of I-95 and overlooking Biscayne Bay, was questioned at the time.

But Anthony Burns, senior vice president at iStar Financial, the lender, and Edgardo Defortuna, president and CEO of Fortune International, a real estate broker, would not be deterred.

They wanted to bring the iconic tower, designed by leading Miami based firm Arquitectonica, back to life. "Like any redevelopment," says Burns, "there were existing conditions to overcome."

"We had to position it in a way that the sales team could market it in the fastest way possible," adds Defortuna.

So they started completely over—with a decision first to tackle its design challenges, inside and out—including its 25,000 square feet pool deck.

They sent out a request for proposals for the \$20 million renovation, and waited. Five design firms responded, but one stood out head and shoulders above the others. And it wasn't just because its front man was a rock star.

"Ultimately, we selected Kravitz Design because we were impressed with the company's edgy style of design," says Defortuna. "It offered what the building needed."

"They're world-renowned, and bring a public relations and marketing cache to the table," adds Burns.

Indeed. Lenny Kravitz is a four-time Grammy award-winning master of soul, funk, hard rock, folk rock, and R&B.



He also heads up a sophisticated design firm with plum commissions for private residences in Paris and New York, as well as for the set of the syndicated *Queen Latifah Show*, based in Culver City, CA, and re-launched in September.

At Paramount Bay, Kravitz delivered an insightful set of design solutions based on environmental considerations.

"They were looking to create a unique living experience in Miami, something that was very different from the white palette typically found in South Florida," he says. "We were inspired by the building itself, its location in Miami and its proximity to the Bay."

Opposite page, Kravitz's public spaces have a strong reliance on wood, brass, bronze, and marble finishes. Burns and Defortuna wanted to sell the building's 346 units at a premium, since it's sited directly on the water at 20th Street. Backed up to an urban corridor, its front entrance is pedestrian-friendly, with lush gardens that play up to its large scale. "You're transported away from the city," Burns says. "It's an urban oasis located on Biscayne Bay."

And it's only a stone's throw from Miami Beach, the Design District, Wynwood Arts District, and much of the city's cultural epicenter along Biscayne Boulevard.

The project is one of the larger condominium buildings in Miami. Of its total of 700,000 square feet, 15,000 are reserved for commercial space and 20,000 more are common areas for residents.

Residential apartments range from 1,456 square feet for a single bedroom unit to 5,173 square feet of total living space for a penthouse.

Other on-site amenities include a beach club, private elevator foyers, swimming pools, a waterfront promenade, full-service spa and fitness center, as well as restaurants and retail shops.

Kravitz's design assignment was to transform the public and outdoor spaces into something high-end but comfortable at the same time. "When you design with Kravitz, there's a story to tell," Burns says. "There's no compromise-it's all fit and finish in Miami."

"I wanted the residents to feel a strong connection between the interior and exterior areas," Kravitz adds. "To do this, we created an interactive plaza and brought the landscape into the lobby."

When residents enter the property, they're surrounded by tropical landscaping which creates an outdoor plaza, with a sheltered path leading to a porte-cochère. Two fountains are located at the center of the drive.

Kravitz says that he's very much inspired by the architecture and design of Brazil, and he's striving to prove the point at Paramount Bay.

Huge mahogany doors at the lobby entrance open up to a soaring, 30-foot-high lobby. There's a strong reliance on wood, brass and bronze in the finish palettes, with some wall treatments in leather.

Inside, he placed a large marble concierge desk at the center of the lobby-to emphasize the service element-complementing the desk with stone terrazzo flooring and an intricate aluminum screening that borders the west wall. A live, tropical plantscape at the lobby's north end blurs the line between indoor and outdoor.

"I think the biggest challenge was the vast amount of public space that there was to create," says Kravitz. "I don't like redundancy and with that amount of space, it was a huge challenge."

A grand staircase anchors the lobby's south end and











leads to the mezzanine level. It's crafted from Paonazzo marble, accented with American walnut, framed by smoky-gray glass, and then lined with a bronze handrail. Like the plantscape, seating is built into its marble base.

"The lobby was a disconnected space, and broken up," says Defortuna. "Now there's a breakfast space that opens up to the inside and outside, and the lobby spaces are almost an extension of your apartment."

Further to the north, a garden room opens to another three-tier outdoor garden with private seating, as well as access to Paramount Bay's commercial outposts, and ultimately to pedestrian sidewalks and Biscayne Bay.

"The architecture is not a generic look – it's light-colored and uber - modern," Burns says. "Kravitz is playing much more to a warm and edgy finish. There's nothing like it in Miami."

An 8,000 square feet club room is sited to overlook Biscayne Bay. It's mostly open space, but Kravitz broke it up in a number of niches for different uses. A 103-inch TV screen, almost the size of a movie theater screen, dominates one area, with comfortable seating for viewing.

Then there's the kitchen. "It's a show kitchen, but you can bring your own chef in and have a dinner party for 30," Defortuna says. "You can partition it off for lunch or dinner with friends, without feeling like you're in a huge space for 500 people to fill up."

In essence, every public space in and around the threeacre site bears Kravitz's fingerprint. "Each area we created has its own unique vibe, and they flow well from one to the other," Kravitz says. "The building is very grand, but we were able to make it feel warm and inviting."

It seems a winner all the way around. Defortuna, in particular, is pleased with the design. "It's a project put together in a beautiful way," he says. "The spaces are really comfortable, but there's a coolness to them, to their layout, and to their look."


But Burn has the ultimate metric: "There are 16 units left out of 347," he says. "It's an overwhelming success."

With prices ranging from about \$600,000 for a one-bedroom unit to \$11,500,000 for a penthouse unit, that's a long climb up from the South Florida real estate market of 2010 – and great design led the entire way. **0lH**

eace. It's a rare and elusive commodity many of us seek most while vacationing, whether exploring a new destination or retreating to the familiar sanctuary of a second home. Thankfully, it's also what CostaBaja Resort & Spa offers international guests in abundance.

This alluring Mexican resort, located in La Paz (which translates from Spanish, appropriately, as "the peace"), is less than two hours north of Los Cabos. As the capital of Mexico's peninsular western state Baja California Sur, which also has the country's longest shoreline, La Paz has long been regarded as a quaint and quiet coastal getaway, famous for its stellar sport fishing on the Sea of Cortez.

But peace is now only a part of its broad appeal. CostaBaja, the first five-star resort and spa in La Paz, has set a new benchmark in luxury accommodations, world-class dining, and lavish amenities, boosting this emerging destination's prestige for savvy vacationers.

The tranquility of La Paz, however, remains intact. This richly historic and centuries-old city isn't a man-made tourist destination, asserts CostaBaja CEO Alejandro Yberri, which is what separates it from other well-trod Mexican vacation destinations. "Tourists blend in here, but they do not dominate the city," explains Yberri.

Although La Paz-Manuel de Leon Airport is highly accessible via direct flights from Los Angeles and Mexico City, you're far more likely to encounter easy-going residents in town than visiting jet-setters. And just as

visitors mix seamlessly with the friendly locals, the glamorous contemporary architecture and design of CostaBaja seem to meld organically with the region's natural desert-by-the-sea terrain.

Situated on 550 acres of coastal and mountain property, CostaBaja is a master planned community featuring a variety of real estate and vacation options, including a 115-room Grand Heritage-managed boutique hotel. The comfortable accommodations offer mountain, golf course and ocean views, but vacationers can also enjoy spacious marina view suites that take full visual advantage of La Paz's direct access to the Sea of Cortez.

Famously described by Jacques Cousteau as the "world's aquarium," the always sparkling gulf is the centerpiece of any stay at this lovely retreat. "Every element focuses on the water and is set into its context with sympathetic materials, massing, and design," says architect Barry Smith, who was responsible for a recent redesign of the hotel, striving to include the unique and diverse topography within the resort's embrace.

He succeeded. The hotel itself has a modern, airy feel. Inside the rooms, glass-enclosed showers and dark mahogany wood finishes contrast with the bright surroundings. To maximize space (and to sleek effect), there is no furniture. Room components like head boards, dressers, and butlers are built-in millwork.

The resort's open-air restaurants also allow visitors to soak in the Baja beauty, especially from Steinbeck's-named for the Pulitzer Prize-winning author whose famous novel *The Pearl* was inspired by a visit to La Paz. The restaurant offers a bountiful selection of ocean-fresh

fish, smoked chicken, and a myriad of tapas, plus an extensive tequila menu and full-bodied wine list sure to satisfy the discriminating oenophile.


Step outside the well-appointed accommodations and activities abound. The star attraction, of course, is the Sea of Cortez. Take a kayak trip from the beach to the nearby sea lion colony, or charter a catamaran from The Moorings at the double-basin Marina CostaBaja, accommodating 250 slips from 30 to 200 feet. For even larger vessels, captains can drop anchor just outside the marina. During our visit, *Venus*, a superyacht designed for the late Apple founder Steve Jobs, dropped anchor (the flashy 260-foot vessel is sometimes dubbed the *iYacht*.)

This lively village, designed by Mexican architect Pepe de Yturbe, is the perfect spot to listen to music while dining at one of the many marina-view restaurants. Back at the resort, dine al fresco at The Beach Club, replete with outdoor dining and lounge seating.

Find a shady spot under the palapa by the large bar, or soak in the surroundings from an infinity pool that blends perfectly with the Sea of Cortez. The signature Damiana Margarita will add a distinctly Baja flavor featuring liqueur from the Damiana, a local desert herb, in lieu of the traditional Triple Sec.


TOP INTERIOR DESIGN EXPERTS JEFFREY AND DEBORAH FISHER JOIN OCEAN HOME

sk Jeffrey Fisher what makes an outstanding interior designer, and his answer is simple. "Someone who has remarkable observation, listening and mediation skills," he says emphatically. "Many clients can't properly articulate what they like or want, so it's important to pick up on the details of how they live in order to piece the entire puzzle together.

"And interior designers are only as good as their assembled team," he adds. "When you hire an interior designer, you're hiring their upholsterer, wallpaper hanger, painter etc., so make sure you've looked not only at their big picture but their fine details as well. It also pays to find a designer who is a good mediator because often times two people with opposing tastes are making the decisions collectively."

Wise advice from someone who has been at the forefront of the interior design industry since 2000, when he launched his highly successful Jeffrey Fisher





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Home collection with his sister and business partner Deborah, and now has offices in Toronto, Canada, and a new U.S. headquarters in Naples, Florida, opening in 2014.

It was the dynamic duo's unwavering eye for the big picture and fine details, not to mention their innate ontrend interior design skills, which first caught my attention when I met Jeffrey by chance at the exquisite Grand Hotel Tremezzo, on Italy's Lake Como, earlier this year.

Deep knowledge, understanding, and appreciation of the complex and ever-evolving world of interior design is a prerequisite for any luxury homes magazine editor, and I'm delighted to say I now have not one but two pairs of laser-sharp, sophisticated, and design-savvy eyes on the Ocean Home team.

"Diahann invited me to help decorate her dining room in New York City," he recalls, "and it was then I realized my true passion for interiors." hen Annie Falk throws a party, she throws a party. Thanksgiving at the Falk residence, for example, is a weekend-long event with 30 or so guests being entertained at two of her Southampton homes.

A native New Yorker who moved to Palm Beach 10 years ago with her husband and two daughters, Falk is all about entertaining. Her professional background is a blend of studying culinary arts under legendary chef Roger Vergé (a protégé of Alain Ducasse) at Le Moulin de Mougins in the south of France; coordinating huge annual company events for Barbizon International; and fundraising for various philanthropic organizations, including the March of Dimes, Norton Museum of Art, Palm Beach Police Foundation, and the American Heart Association.

One non-profit in particular struck a deep chord with Falk-the Children's Home Society of Florida (CHS), which provides adoption, early childhood development and family support services. To avert cuts to the program due to its waning fiscal budget, Falk dedicated 100 percent of the proceeds of her recent first book, Palm Beach Entertaining: Creating Occasions to Remember, to CHS.

"I wanted to prevent cuts, in particular, to its program called Transitions Home, which aids pregnant teens and



their newborns," says Falk. "This book was a natural project for me and incredibly gratifying. People are not only buying it, they are handing me a check made out to CHS at the same time."

The book is fashioned from CHS' successful annual Ultimate Dinner Party in mid-November, a progressive dinner-esque fundraiser that Falk chairs and hosts. It offers an inside look at the chic world of Palm Beach, known for its lavish lifestyle and grand parties, with more than 20 hosts opening their gilded doors to reveal entertaining secrets and 100 of their most tried-and-true recipes. Here, Falk shares three of her favorite recipes along with entertaining tips on how to throw a stressfree but crowd-pleasing Thanksgiving dinner party.

Annie Falk's Fall **Entertaining Tips**

Set the Tone

To make your Thanksgiving table original, personal and inviting, start by mixing and matching china patterns, silverware, and smooth and textured linens. Falk suggests taking your color cues from autumn leaves, a combination of browns, burnt orange, golds and greens. Additionally, amp up the ambiance with glass hurricanes filled with candles set on top of acorns and pinecones.

Put Fresh Forward

The best meal always begins with the freshest ingredients purchased within a day or two of preparation. Check out your local farmers' market for vegetables and fruits in season, and order your bird in advance from a reputable farm.

Make Substitutes

As your guest list grows, so does the list of dietary restrictions. At Falk's home, Thanksgiving is a feast that includes salads, soups and pasta, in addition to turkey, stuffing and sweet potatoes. Make sure there is always something for everyone.

Maximize the Menu

Menu cards elevate the look of any table. Falk likes to find vintage images or meaningful quotes to place at the top, and then list the menu items along with where they were procured, such as the local farm where the turkey was raised.

Place Perfection

Add a touch of elegance to each place setting by sitting in-season Bosc pears with a sprig of seasonal berries at the center of each plate. Place a gold-trimmed place card just beneath it and your menu card to the side, in a folded napkin.


Style Your Service

An easy way to elevate the look of any dish is to layer your serving plates. Try placing a glass bowl on an attractive platter and sprinkle it with shelled walnuts, hazelnuts and Brazil nuts, or edible flowers. This is especially lovely on a buffet.

Give Thanks

Thanksgiving is a time for reflecting on all your blessings from the past year with family and friends. Falk recommends beginning a fun and heart-warming ritual, such as a "gratitude journal," where you give each guest a scroll on which to write three simple things they are thankful for. Later, share the sentiments over dessert.

MOSCOW MULE

1/2 lime, juiced

2 oz. vodka

8 oz. good-quality ginger beer

1 lime slice

Pour lime juice into a chilled mug or iced glass and top off with ginger beer and vodka. Garnish with a slice of lime. Yields 1 serving. Fun side note: Mark Badgley and James Mischka of Badgley Mischka donated this recipe to the book!

VEGETABLES PROVENCAL

1 cup extra-virgin olive oil

1 large eggplant, sliced

2 medium zucchini, sliced

1 large green pepper, cored and sliced

1 large red onion, sliced

1 large yellow onion, sliced

2 large tomatoes, sliced

1 head garlic, peeled

2 Tbsps. each of finely chopped fresh parsley, tarragon, thyme and rosemary

1 Tbsp. finely chopped fresh marjoram

1 jalapeño pepper, seeded and sliced Salt and freshly

ground black pepper

Preheat the oven to 450°F. Pour 1/2 cup of olive oil into a roasting pan and add eggplant, zucchini, bell peppers, onions, tomatoes and garlic. In a medium bowl, combine parsley, tarragon, thyme, rosemary, marjoram and jalapeño. Whisk in the remaining 1/2 cup olive oil and pour the mixture over the vegetables. Season with salt and pepper. Cover with aluminum foil, place in the oven and bake for 1 hour, or until veggies are soft and cooked through. Remove foil, stir gently and return to the oven for 10 minutes for vegetables to crisp slightly. Yields 6 servings.

KIT'S PECAN PIE

1 to 1 1/2 cups coarsely chopped pecans

1 9-inch pie shell

6 Tbsps. unsalted butter, melted

1 1/4 cups light brown

1 cup light or dark corn syrup


2 tsp. vanilla extract 1/2 tsp. orange zest

1/4 tsp. salt

3 large eggs, beaten

1 Tbsp. bourbon

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Spread pecans over the pie shell. Combine butter, sugar, syrup, orange zest, salt, eggs and bourbon in a large bowl. Pour the mixture over the pecans. Bake 45-50 minutes until firm around the edges and soft but set in the center. Yields 8 servings.





hink of America's most significant cities and names like New York, Los Angeles, Boston, and Miami probably come to mind. Packed with skyscrapers-beacons of commerce and business-prestigious universities, world-class medical facilities, busy ports, and bustling arts, culture, and culinary scenes, not to mention millions of residents, these metropolises are hotbeds of American progression.
