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
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


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LIFE SPECTACULAR

> London to Monaco (1,000 miles in 10 days!) for the start of the Monaco Yacht Show at the end of last September.





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MODERN MODULAR

OUT ON DUNE ROAD NEAR QUOGUE ON THE SOUTH SHORE OF LONG ISLAND, THIS INNOVATIVE HOME USES MODULAR CONSTRUCTION TO MAXIMIZE LIGHT, SPACE AND VIEWS OF THE OCEAN.

here's a new kid on Dune Road near Quogue on the South Shore of Long Island—and it's an architectural innovation compared to anything that's been built there before.

At 2,400 square feet, it hardly rivals other newcomers measuring in at 10,000 square feet or more. But this sophisticated little cottage represents what could be considered a better way of designing and building an ocean home.

It's called modern modular. It was created out of four "boxes," designed in New York City, fabricated in Scranton, New Jersey, and trucked to a stunning site atop a dune overlooking the Atlantic. The four modules were craned into place in a single day atop pilings pounded 30 feet into the sand, eight feet apart.

"We showed up and watched all four get set and tied together," says owner Scott Lawin, an M.I.T.-trained architect turned financier from New York. Finishing touches were completed over the next few months.

Lawin studied modern design and building techniques in school, so when it came time to design



his Dune Road beach house, he turned to Resolution: 4 Architecture (RES4) in New York. "Other firms were doing modular work, but they (RES4) were far and away at the head of the pack," he says. "From a design and aesthetic perspective, it kind of clicked with the way we saw the world."

The main living areas take full advantage of unobstructed





THE ARCHITECTURE

RES4's first modular home was the original, competition-winning Dwell Home, designed and built in North Carolina in 2004. Since then the firm has created at least 100 modular homes of all sizes, including more than a dozen on Long Island. "It's a way of thinking through a strategy and a method of design," says Joe Tanney, founding partner in RES4. "It's about offsite prefabrication and using that methodology to embrace the limits. In this case, it was about the limits of width and height and four 'boxes' on top of each other."

Each of the home's two levels consists of a pair of side-by-side modules: one 12 feet wide and 52 feet long, the other 14 by 52 feet. "It's an efficient way of thinking about the space," Tanney says. "Using those constraints, we organized it from the inside out to maximize space and light and site it parallel to the beach and the ocean."

RES4 placed service spaces-kitchen, baths, mechanicals, laundry, and stairs-on the relatively opaque north elevation. Bedrooms and living space are located on the south to maximize beach vistas. "There are incredible views of the bay as well, especially from the roof deck," he says.


THE LAND

Lawin grew up spending summers with friends in Quogue. When he purchased the property, the small beachfront shack that came with was destined for demolition. "It had gotten hammered by waves and was falling apart," Tanney says.

The little shack had to go, but anything built onsite was restricted by code to the size of its footprint. There





The last phase is when the modules are set in place during one 12-hour day and all necessary connections are made, including mechanicals, electricals, plumbing, flooring, decking, and siding. Lawin's "boxes" were delivered with windows, lighting, counters, tiles, and fixtures already installed. Typically, a home takes 16 weeks from the time the modules are set to the time the client moves in.

"It took six months to wrap everything up here; it was set in late November and wrapped up by summer," Tanney says. "The entire process, from the time the client engaged us to move-in, lasted 16 months. And this one took a little longer to finish it off just right."

were also permitting and environmental concerns and a limited building season of September through May (because of birds nesting in the dunes).

"We had to lessen the environmental impact on the beach and the dune and reduce waste, because the last thing you want is to mix excess nails and shavings into the sand," Lawin says. "Nothing is easy out there, and rightly so-it's a beautiful landscape and an ecological system we want to protect."

THE PROCESS

RES4's typical design/build process consists of four phases with four months dedicated to each. First, the firm designs the project with the client. That's followed up with steps to coordinate engineering and approvals at the factory. Next up: site preparation with the



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THE HOME

Here's what's killer about this little gem near Quogue: Tanney studied with architect Charles Gwathmey at Ohio State University and later worked for him. Gwathmey became his mentor while also creating a new languageclean lines, cedar siding, open floor plans, and floorto-ceiling windows-for beach homes on Long Island. Lawin, too, studied Gwathmey's work at M.I.T., along with modernists Mies van der Rohe and Carlo Scarpa.

So this innovative two-story home, with its subtractive spaces, modernist bay window, and thoughtful layout, comes with a pedigree outside and in. The downstairs consists of a connected living space with children's play area and a covered deck for easy access between them. The upstairs bedrooms are separated by another covered space that also connects to the rooftop deck.

There's little furniture due to factory-installed built-

ins. "It's not unlike a ship's cabin, including the oculus on the deck where rain or snow comes down and you see it through the glass door of the bedroom," says Lawin. "And the

rooftop deck is a great place to relax or entertain with a fire in the fireplace."

But its most impressive feature is its steep cost-



cutting curve. "Most modular designs cost about \$400 per square foot, excluding the decks, which are about \$50 per square foot," Tanney says. "This one cost less, but to site-build it would probably have been anywhere from \$600 to \$1,200 per square foot."

That makes this Dune Road beach house a true master at reduction. OlH

UNIQUE CHAMPAGNE AND SPARKLING WINE CHOICES TO START THE NEW YEAR OFF RIGHT

here is no sweeter sound on New Year's Eve-or words by Jennifer Sperry any eve, for that matter-than the sound of a pent-up cork finally achieving blissful freedom. The release of carbon dioxide into a rising, mesmerizing swirl of bubbles is a universally chic and distinctly tasteful way to celebrate just about any occasion. In case you find yourself in a wine store rut this holiday season, we've assembled an array of intriguing Champagnes and sparkling wines to pop away 2017 and welcome in 2018!

The 200-year-old distinctive yellow label of Veuve Clicquot's standard Brut is immediately recognizable and an enduring symbol of the Champagne house's success and longevity. Veuve Clicquot continues its cuvée excellence with La Grande Dame 2006 (SRP \$150+). An exclusive blend of eight classic Grand Crus, comprising 53 percent Pinot Noir and 47 percent Chardonnay, it's a feast for the senses both on the nose and in the mouth, with a crisp, silky texture and a fresh, generous endnote. veuveclicquot.com

Throughout the history of Champagne, wines that were blended for greater sweetness were described as "rich," and Veuve Clicquot has propelled this tradition into the contemporary era with its Rich (SRP \$65) and Rich Rosé (SRP \$65) offerings, created expressly for mixology. Simply place ice cubes in a large wine glass, add one key ingredient (like fruit, tea, or an herb) for a unique twist, finish with the bubbly Rich, and voila: heaven in a glass. Plus, the bottle glows in the dark for extra festive flair. veuveclicquot.com

Looking to make an impression? The Moët Impérial Golden Sparkle Jeroboam (SRP \$450) will do just that. Weighing in at three liters (the equivalent of four standard bottles), it delivers a party-sized amount of Moët & Chandon's iconic Brut Impérial, known for its bright fruitiness, seductive palate, and elegant maturity. This holiday show-stopper is all about the math: three grapes, four bottles, endless enjoyment. moet.com

It's hard to improve on a classic like the currently available 2006 Vintage, but Dom Pérignon's Plénitude Deuxieme (SRP \$395.95)-or P2 for short-manages to

vibrate on an ultra-high level. As the story goes, the year 1998 was marked by the spectacular burning of grapes caused by record high temperatures in August followed by exceptional rainfall in September. These grapes already made an appearance in the First Plénitude released in 2005. Now, invigorated by additional years in the cellars, P2 transcends the vintage's original potential. domperignon.com

Engraved with a thousand delicate dimples and inspired by the luster of black pearls, Champagne Nicolas Feuillatte's Palmes d'Or 2006 Brut Vintage (SRP \$153-\$200) is the self-professed "diva" of Champagnes. Aged for a minimum of nine years, this award-winner is complex and distinguished, expressing the vast diversity of the Champagne region's soils. On the nose, it is what the house calls "tenderly zingy." On the palate, its acidity and low sweetness levels make for optimum balance and great structure. The partner 2006 Rosé Vintage combines powerful Pinot Noir from Bouzy with more subtle Pinot from Riceys. nicolas-feuillatte.com 01H

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It's official: you can now have one of Dom Pérignon's ico vintages delivered to your door in one hour. THE ALL-NEW. LONG-RANGE, WIDE-CABIN GULFSTREAM G500 IS ABOUT TO TAKE OFF

ou could consider the Gulfstream G450 a victim of ageism. It has been a very capable and immensely popular business jet, but it got old, and now it's getting replaced. This may seem an unfair fate, but as good as the G450 is, its successor, the clean-sheet-design G500, is much better-or at least it promises to be.

"The G500 is clearly vastly superior to the G450," says Kevin O'Leary, president and CEO of Jet Advisors (jetadvisors.com), a private jet acquisition, brokerage, and consulting firm in Bedford, Massachusetts. "It's faster and more fuel efficient. It has a much larger cabin with significantly larger windows. The cabin has a better pressurization system, which will keep the passenger more comfortable on longer trips. The prices are similarthe G500's is a few percentage points higher-but you get so much more."

The last of the G450s will roll off Gulfstream's production line in Savannah, Georgia, in early 2018, ending a run of 14 years-32 years if you include the models from which it derived, the GIV and GIV-SP. The G500 is expected to enter service by the end of 2017.

The G500 is priced at \$45.1 million. When the aircraft was still in production, a new G450 cost \$43.15 million. The G500 has a maximum range of 5,754 miles; a cruising speed of 561 mph (versus 5,000 miles and 528 mph for the G450); and a maximum operating speed of 610 mph, which equals the top speed of Gulfstream's flagship business jet, the G650/G650ER. The G500's range covers the distance from Los Angeles to London, New York to Moscow, or San Francisco to Tokyo.

Although the interior can accommodate as many as 19 passengers, the more common configuration will be a three-zone layout with 12 or 13 passengers in a combination of reclining seats (some of which convert into sleeping berths) and couches. The cabin is customizable and can include lavatories forward and aft and a full-size galley forward or aft. Passengers can stay connected through satellite communications and various high-speed internet options. The cabinmanagement system gives passengers control of the lighting, window shades, temperature, and

entertainment options through touchscreen devices.

Fractional provider Flexjet (flexjet.com) placed an order for several G500s three years ago-shortly after Gulfstream

introduced the aircraft at a ceremony in Savannah-and will begin taking deliveries in early 2018 as the aircraft's North American launch customer. OH

The new G500 promises to be far superior than the older G450 model it's replacing.



RICHARD MILLE CREATES A TECHNOLOGICALY ADVANCED MECHANICAL SAILING WATCH

fter flying across France on a private jet with the innovative watch creator Richard Mille, it was obvious that this trim, smiling, bespectacled Frenchman in his sixties doesn't just make wildly expensive, highly sought-after watches. He's a star-who simply loves to have fun.

But in his case, "fun" involves creating some of the most distinctive watches in the world and hanging out with friends who incidentally happen to be some of the most successful and influential people in the world-in some of the most exclusive destinations in the world.

The fact is: Mille is a true original whose character combines passion, creativity, precision, style, business savvy, craftsmanship, originality, self-assuredness, and an infectious joie de vivre better than anyone I've ever interviewed. Since his innovative watches are now some of the most coveted (and expensive) timepieces on Earth, he's not going to stop anytime soon.

He's actually just getting started. As a longtime race car lover, he began making mechanical watches for Formula I drivers that could withstand the shocks and G-forces of a race. Brazilian Formula 1 star Felipe Massa was the first

of many to wear custom-made Mille watches. But Mille didn't stop there.

"I opened up to different sports-golf, tennis, sailing-in addition to motor racing because I hate to be prisoner to one system," he adds. "And I love the challenge of making high-performance watches for different sports."

I learned that Liz's love of art and design began 30 years ago when she painted huge canvases and designed products for sale in some of the world's most exclusive stores. That love only multiplied when she met artist and teacher Ati Gropius, daughter of Bauhaus founder Walter Gropius and student of Josef Albers. "I took courses from Ati in both color and design," Liz told me in her Cape Cod studio recently. "I followed her everywhere. Ati became my mentor and teacher for 26 years.

"When Ati died she left all of her teachings to me," Liz continues, holding up her work, alive with color.

"This is where we take a shape and, with lots of thought but very little effort, turn it into a completely new form," she adds.

"So there's a lesson behind every single one of these?" I ask pointing to the colorful and complicated art that's strewn everywhere in her studio.

"Yes, absolutely," she says.

SPIRIT OF MEXICO

A RARE BOX SET REVERED AS MUCH FOR ITS TEQUILA AS FOR THE STORIES THAT ITS BOTTLES TELL

truly top-shelf spirit reveals itself in a number of ways. Some are luscious and full-bodied with a viscosity that produces a long, lingering finish. Others deliver a robust depth of flavor, one that introduces subtle new tastes and aromas with each sip. Clase Azul tequilas stand out among premier agave-based spirits for their ability to do both.

Clase Azul Plata (\$66.99), for example, is remarkably smooth for an unaged tequila, delivering bright herbaceous agave notes with a mouthfeel normally reserved for tequilas that have spent considerable time maturing and mellowing in oak.

Tequila aficionados who prefer hints of agave married with rich sweetness-a result achieved only through patient maturation in seasoned barrels-will want to seek out a bottle of Clase Azul Ultra (\$1,699). This decadent extra añejo tequila wraps hints of pepper and agave in layers of caramel, vanilla, and a distinct sweetness reflective of its five-year maturation in ex-sherry casks.

Yet, Clase Azul's most exclusive and luxurious tequila can be found only in the 15 bottles that make up the brand's México a Través del Tiempo boxed set (\$450,000). This ultimate tequila collection showcases the handiwork of Mexico's most esteemed artists, and all proceeds from its sale benefit the Clase Azul Foundation, a nonprofit that supports the country's various artisans.

The set's bottles (and their boxes), which can be purchased individually for \$30,000, reflect the history of Mexico, including stories and legends from the country's indigenous cultures. They also spotlight four Mexican Designation of Origin items: amber (including fossilized pieces), olinalá (a lacquered wood), talavera (an ancient pottery), and-not surprisingly-tequila.

As for the liquid held inside those bottles, it is a rare

blend of two ultra-aged tequilas-one spent 15 years aging in a Spanish sherry cask, while the second matured for six years in a port cask followed by another

five years in American white oak barrels. Perhaps best of all, the bottles are sold with three refills of the precious tequila they carry, so owners can sip, savor, and repeat. OlH

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


















Now more than ever architects, designers,

and other coastal home experts are finding new ways to infuse homes with beauty, style, comfort, and innovation. Some use dramatic textures and artistic custom detailing; others employ furnishings in chic new colors and ultra-smart technology that simplifies day-to-day life.

The best coastal architects, designers, and builders will always find innovative ways to blend indoor and outdoor spaces while creating luxe new spaces for chilling and admiring the view. Meanwhile, landscape architects and custom pool builders continue raising the bar on outdoor areas for relaxation, partying, and staying fit.


In fact, as you've already seen in this issue (page 16), sophisticated firms and adventurous clients are pushing coastal home design into dynamic new areas. So what will be the hot new coastal home design trends of 2018? We asked a team of respected coastal interior designers and architects, along with well-known furniture, outdoor living, and home technology experts, the same simple question. This is what we found out.

THINK BEYOND THE PORTICO

Designers Jamie Scott and Liz Hand-Fry of Connecticut-based Group Works LLC are creating exterior settings finessed with the finer points of architectural design. Situated around pools, the settings evoke a sense of drama inspired by travels and romance. For one home, Scott created an outdoor room outfitted with highend lounge furniture and gauzy curtains for mood. Technological advances and new materials are expanding the world of water features set on coastal landscapes. "I see the trend of adding drama to outdoor living areas continuing," says Ryan Hughes of Ryan Hughes Design Build in the Tampa, Florida, area. "For those who want the luxury of their home to extend outside, the possibilities for drama are continuing to grow. This often incorporates science and artistry." For one East Coast home, Hughes set a dramatic but homey tone around an elegant Italianate-

THE ART OF THE POOL

Swimming pools are entering new, creative territory. Melissa C. Gillespie, editor of Luxury Pools + Outdoor Living magazine, is captivated by a current trend to maximize the appearance of pool floors with starry 3D effects and intricate mosaic designs. For even greater visual appeal, many homeowners are ditching the deck, Gillespie says, using techniques such as steel-plate edges and zero-edge coping—taking the grass all the way to the edge of the pool—for a softer, seamless look. "Today's designs continue to emphasize blending the

indoors and outdoors. The key to accomplishing this is to work with a pool builder, landscape architect, and the primary architect to create a master plan," she notes. "It's really about integrating the pool design into the entire outdoor living space. Pools are no longer simply an afterthought." *luxurypools.com*


DETAILS, DETAILS, DETAILS

A home should reflect its owner's special character, and unique, artistic detailing gets to the heart of the matter. John R. DaSilva, AIA, design principal at Polhemus Savery DaSilva Architects Builders (PSDAB) on Cape Cod, Massachusetts, is seeing the rise of artistic details in his firm's designs. For one client who worked for the State Department, PSDAB designed a dramatic weathervane depicting an eagle in flight. For another, the firm partnered with an artisan to create glass doors with the opulent look of cut crystal, shimmering with reflected light like the adjacent ocean bay. It's about expressing individuality. "We all share characteristics, but no two people are identical," DaSilva muses. "Everyone has an image of themselves that they wish to project. So, too, with our clients through their houses." *psdab.com*

CLEAN COLOR

Color and form in furniture styles are embellishing the interiors of plush coastal homes, creating a pleasing dose of the unexpected. Andrew Terrat, design and







trade development director at home products firm Mitchell Gold + Bob Williams, is seeing a trend of sleek, modern furniture upholstered in super-comfortable materials and drenched in eye-catching colors. "Picture a clean-lined, peridot-colored sofa contrasted by a table crafted from the beautiful root of a teak tree," Terrat says. "It's simple and calm, yet dramatic and full of personality." *mgbwhome.com*

COOL TO THE TOUCH

Designer Robyn Branch, who recently dressed the interiors of several homes in Christophe Harbour, Saint Kitts, cites a dazzling rollout of patterns, textures, and weaves that mix organic and specialized materials. One home features a powder room ceiling constructed of black bamboo embedded in concrete, plus an ultrachic bedroom bench that melds dried grass and epoxy built by Miami furniture designer Serge de Troyer. A Clei transforming bed in the pool house, in metallicblue vinyl, is as bright as a bauble. Varying the textures

OCEAN VIEWS

The starring role in ocean homes still belongs to the view, and an upward trend in architectural design is opening homes to more expansive views and, in turn, achieving interiors that feel more spacious and light. Senior Project Designer Justin Detwiler, of John Milner Architects in Chadds Ford, Pennsylvania, says that "upside down" houses—where the main living spaces top the home—continue to gain popularity to expand





views while helping protect houses from rising sea levels. Detwiler recently designed an oceanfront home in New Jersey with primary living space on the second and third floors and secondary garage and service spaces on the lower level, after the existing 1970s home was destroyed by Hurricane Sandy. 

Architecturally, the homes mark another kind of upgrade. They represent a distinctly contemporary oasis in an ocean of traditional architecture, situated in a unique vacation destination where desert, mountains, and deep blue sea collide.

The Architectural Intent

The homes are designed in a warm hacienda style, with ceilings clad in natural wood. Their courtyards open up via six-panel glass doors onto decks, pools, and the Sea of Cortez.

Clearly, the architect's intent is all about merging indoor and outdoor living and creating a feeling of being outside all day long. "You go from inside to outside and don't even notice the transition," says Fernando de Haro, founder of Abax Arquitectos. "People leave their windows open day and night. There are terraces inside and outside the house, and the ocean breezes deliver cross ventilation throughout most of the rooms."

The desert sun is reflected everywhere inside: in the materials, textures, wall colors, and with the abundance of natural light. "There are sunny days all year long, and the light changes from bright white in the morning to reddish in the afternoon," de Haro says. "With that change of light, you feel the change in the color of your home—we worked with the light, so there's a sense of merging with the desert."

The influence of the Sea of Cortez cannot be denied. It's a cobalt backdrop for the development, one that creates a sense of place like no other.

The West Enclave Ritz-Carlton Reserve Residences were specifically designed to merge indoor and outdoor areas seamlessly and to take advantage of the stunning views.







"You learn what it is to live in the desert near the water. There's the dark blue of the water and the light from the sun," de Haro says. "A lot of people who bought these homes have homes on other beaches, but here they feel a great difference. It's the result of the wide-open ocean and the experience of being in that place."

The Next Generation

"It was incredible to see how the sea has such a presence, and the sunrise and sunset and hills, too, with their different colors," says Bertha Figueroa, the architect with Mexico City-based Abax Arquitectos who handled the interiors. "We wanted to achieve that with the basic colors of the houses."

Inside, she used basic, earthy colors, with hints of greens, yellows, and grays to punctuate the site's Mexi-

can heritage. Outside, the residences are clad in a native stone called morisca, one that shifts in the sunlight like a chameleon, its colors ranging from beige to orange. At sunset it turns red.

The architectural shift toward modernism is designed to attract a younger generation to Los Cabos. To be sure, the West Enclave maintains Ritz-Carlton's core values, but with a hip interpretation. "It's a new concept that's relaxed and stylish for a new Cabo way of life," she says. "There's refinement, but it's not stiff—it fits the way the new generation lives."


For Mexico City-based Carlos Rojo, the 47-year-old CEO of Grupo Financiero Interacciones, that refinement means amenities like restaurants, golf courses, a hospital, and a soon-to-be-completed Ritz-Carlton hotel. He bought his second home—a five-bedroom, beachfront affair—at the Reserve Residences six months ago.











He liked its look. "It's radically different. Most of the things you see around Cabo are a mixture of Mexican and Spanish architecture," he says. "This is very clean and very peaceful. I fell in love with not only the house but the architect's design."

The Big Picture

The community is part of a 2,000-acre development called Puerto Los Cabos, created by Grupo Questro. The West Enclave is the fourth community on the master-planned property and the second for Ritz-Carlton. Grupo Questro began acquiring land 30 years ago, breaking ground in 2005. Its most appealing acquisition is the three-mile stretch of beachfront along the sea.

"You come across the bridge and we've got a marina with 200 slips; we can accommodate yachts up to 250 feet," says Jeff Lawrence, director of sales at Puerto Los Cabos. "People come in from California and around the world—we've got a tour coming in from the Mediterranean next week."

They come to fish at Gordo Banks, with its world-class fishing grounds and the largest billfish tournament on the planet. And they come for San José del Cabo's arts and culture scene, with galleries, restaurants, and retailers just four minutes back across that bridge.

Still, Puerto Los Cabos is catching up on the arts and entertainment front. "We already have a culture garden in place," Lawrence says. "We're planning a museum and a private residential golf course with a club and a hotel."

The Bottom Line


When the community is built out, four more parcels will likely be filled in with hotels, making it a perfect holiday retreat for family-oriented homeowners like Carlos Rojo. "We have a big family, with four kids, so I'm spending my Christmas holiday with extended family there," he says. "Plus, when the hotel is built, we can have somebody stay there."


And his home has proven a positive influence on his bottom line. "It's a very good investment, because it's in a

growth area," he says. "I bought it a year ago and now it's already up 50 percent. I don't have any interest in selling, but it's going to continue to grow in value."

That kind of return on investment–accompanied by modern architecture and site-sensitive design–add up to next-level living on the Baja Peninsula. 0|H





Cabo San Lucas

Nightlife is still a big draw in this teeming tourist town, but those in the know skip the rowdy scene at El Squid Roe and head to the serene, open-air terraces of The Rooftop. Located at The Cape hotel, this upscale bar delivers topnotch service, craft mixology, and soaring views of the Pacific punctuated by iconic El Arco. For a dramatic dining experience, El Farallon at The Resort at Pedregal is second to none. Carved into craggy cliffs bordering the sea, the setting alone will have you dropping your jaw. Reserve an oceanfront table and be led along narrow, torch-lit footpaths to your own private nirvana. The waves lap so close that you can sense their salty spray as you dine on Baja's best bounty pulled fresh from the ocean that day.

Ready to reel in some fish of your own? The waters are teeming with tuna, marlin, mahi mahi, wahoo, and other prized catches. Cabo San Lucas remains the epicenter of sport fishing, and each morning the marina is abuzz with boats heading to sea in search of their quotidian haul. The opportunities to join the fleet are plentiful. Grab a pal and a private panga for a taste of traditional handlining fishing techniques. For larger groups, choose from dozens of big boat charters specializing in deep sea, bottom, or fly fishing methods. For the finest of fishing trips, book a private excursion with High Style Yachts and hop aboard the 87-foot Tourbillon. Equipped with state-of-the-art electronics, custom fighting chair, and live bait wells, this \$6.5 million luxury charter yacht is primed to provide the ultimate big game sport fishing experience.

The Corridor

Lavish resorts (see page 64 for a full report) define the 20-mile swath connecting Cabo San Lucas to San José Del Cabo and the legendary One&Only Palmilla is the resort that started it all. Check into a romantic oceanfront suite and enjoy velvet-glove treatment along with ocean views from your room, patio, and private plunge pool. Indulge in his and hers custom treatments at One&Only Spa then relish time in the steam rooms, saunas, rock pools, and outdoor leisure areas. Be sure to wander the resort's sumptuous grounds. Lush jungle-like landscaping creates a tropical paradise that will make you feel like Adam and Eve.

Thirsty for that first tee? Grab your clubs and tap in to the area's numerous golfing opportunities. The Quivira Golf club serves up spectacular views from every tee. But there may not be a more striking hole

DESTINATION LOS CABOS, MEXICO

Mexico than Quivira's par 3 6th hole (pictured right)that was designed by Jack Nicklaus. It's a must-play for any golfers who visit Cabo. You can also find your swing at the Jack Nicklaus-designed Palmilla Golf Club. One of the top courses in Mexico, it features a layout comprised of the 3,337-yard Arroyo Nine, the 3,602-yard Mountain Nine, and the 3,548-yard Ocean Nine. Another must-play golf destination are the two seperate nine-hole courses designed by Greg Norman and Jack Nicklaus respectivly in Puerto Los Cabos. Future 18-hole layouts by both designers are in the works.


San José Del Cabo


This tranquil town is rich in 18th-century Spanish Colonial architecture, making it a top destination for history buffs. For nature enthusiasts, the San José Estuary provides ample opportunities to observe the local flora and fauna. The playas are lovely and the new beachfront resorts popping up along the shoreline supply plentiful options for chilling on the sand.

The addition of a recently installed marina complex is making the San José Del Cabo area a mecca for yachtsmen as well. Sail up to the new Puerto Los Cabos Marina and slip into the luxe amenities of this master-planned, 2,000-acre, mixed-use resort community complete with its own golf course, botanical gardens, spas, and luxury accommodations. A freshly built bridge links these posh premises to the rest of the area, making excursions outside the enclave a breeze.

When wanderlust comes calling, swap your flip-flops for sneakers and stroll the narrow cobblestone streets of San José's historic downtown. Grab a refreshingly fruity ice cream popsicle from a local paletería; then make your way to colorful Plaza Mijares and its neighboring Gallery District. Rainbow-hued papel picado banners, lively music, and spice-laden aromas fill the air throughout the plaza's specialty boutiques, hip art galleries, and quaint courtyard eateries. Thursday evenings are especially festive during the weekly Art Walk (5-9 p.m. October–June). Artist receptions, cultural performances, and free-flowing wine make this selfguided soirée a must-see affair.

Farther afield, snuggled into the foothills of the Sierra de la Laguna Mountains, amazing farm-to-table eating awaits. It's a dusty drive up a ragged road to get to Flora Farm, but once arrived you'll be greeted by an oasis of edible greenery and an unforgettable farm-to-table feast (visit oceanhomemag.com for our video reviews). Meals are served family style in outdoor dining areas surrounded by fields of good things growing, many of which are destined for your plate. Nearby Acre boasts a similar concept and is well worth the short pilgrimage to experience its fare. If you lack time for both, plan for

East Cape

Seeking pure, rugged, sparsely populated playas? Pack your adventure gear and trek to East Cape. Although recent developments are bringing more visitors to the area, it retains a sleepy, untouched ambiance. It also has some great spots for beach camping. The crescent cove of Bahia Los Frailes is a personal fave. The warm, gentle, crystalline waters are deliciously inviting. Swimming and snorkeling are quintessential experiences here, but you should also spend time exploring the bay by kayak. Paddle over to The Friars rocks to observe the resident sea lion colony. Affable and curious, they may swim out to greet you.

When you're ready to commune with life beneath the sea, don your mask and dive into the vibrant waters of Cabo Pulmo National Marine Park. Thanks to the area's protected status, aquatic life is abundant and the coral reef is alive and well. With roughly eight established sites to choose from, you can log some serious bottom time. Be sure to include the wreck dive at El Vencedor. The sunken trawler forms an artificial reef and is frequented by legions of pufferfish, schools of yellow snapper, and a spine-tingling shiver of resident bull sharks. Farther out at Los Morros, up-close encounters with sting rays, groupers, jewel eels, and turtles are common. Depending on the season (and your luck), you may also bear witness to the creature on every scuba diver's bucket list: the whale shark.


Pacific Side

On the opposite side of the Baja lies the sun-drenched surf haven El Pescadero and the art-filled Pueblo Mágico Todos Santos. You'll want to spend a few days here, and Rancho Pescadero makes the perfect basecamp. Small, intimate, and beautifully appointed, this adults-only beachside boutique offers complimentary yoga sessions at its onsite pavilion, breezy indoor/outdoor suites, a spa by the sea, and sumptuous cuisine by Executive Chef César Pita. You won't want to leave, but the waves are calling.

Well-seasoned surfers swoon for the consistent right breaks of San Pedrito, but use care if you join them. Swift currents and a rocky bottom make for treacherous wipeouts. For friendlier swells, hit the beach breaks at Playa Cerritos. The sandy sea floor provides softer landings while the waves are welcoming to surfers and swimmers alike. Cliffside Hacienda Cerritos, set on the jagged point north of the beach, enhances the scenery. Finish your day at the hotel's patio bar—it's the perfect perch for sipping cocktails as the sun slips into the sea.

To the north, the intriguing artist colony of Todos Santos provides a kaleidoscope of paintings, sculpture, pottery, jewelry, and handicrafts to explore. Tequila tasting rooms and tiny taco stands are other worthy pursuits in this authentic Mexican town. Snag a snack and then wander the dusty, colonial streets to discover more than 20 gallerías along with cantinas and tourist abodes adorned with local artworks. Be sure to stop in at the colorful Hotel California. While it holds no relation to the iconic song, it's a work of art unto itself. This town bustles throughout the year, but if you time your trip for February, you can take in all the above plus five days of folk dancing, theatre performances, live music, and hands-on workshops during the Todos Santos Art Festival. **Olh**





Grand Velas Los Cabos

Grand Velas Los Cabos is one of the newer entrants to the Mexican peninsula's resort scene. An oasis in the middle of the contrasting landscapes of beaches, boulders, and desert, Grand Velas removes any stigma attached to the phrase "all-inclusive." As we found out during a recent stay, the experience starts upon arrival. With an awe-inspiring entryway and soaring ceilings, jaw-dropping views of the Sea of Cortez, and an eclectic collection of curated art and furniture, no expense was spared in Grand Velas Los Cabos' architectural and interior design.

And then there's the food. With five fine-dining restaurants, be ready to embark on an inspired culinary adventure—without ever leaving the property. Nothing could prepare us for the resort's Cocina de Autor, which offers what's called a "sensorial dining experience." Instead of menu choices, this "gastro-journey" consists of a multicourse tasting menu showcasing the Baja region's cuisine.

Another crown jewel of the resort is the 35,000-square-foot spa. Signature treatments make use of Mexico's native blue agave plant and include a seven-step water journey featuring a eucalyptus-scented steam room and multi-sensory pool. Outside the spa is the resort's centerpiece: three tiered infinity pools with a five-foot difference between each level. Ample rows of loungers ensure that every space is front row with unobstructed views of the sea and horizon. On the pool deck, three pergolas provide shaded relaxation. And one of our favorite perks: the pools are kept at different temperatures to suit guests' preferences of warm to cold. It was very hard to leave. *loscabos.grandvelas.com*

Chileno Bay Resort & Residences

Another recent entrant to the Baja luxury scene is Chileno Bay Resort & Residences, an Auberge Resort that's bringing modern luxury to Los Cabos. The property is set on a protected cove, on what many refer to as the "best beach in Cabo," and is being constructed in phases. When complete, the resort will include 60 guest rooms and 32 villas with two, three, four, or six bedrooms. We stayed in an expansive ocean- and pool-view room and were well taken care of—our butler offered a full orientation to our suite's features and amenities and prepared a welcome cocktail with mescal.

All rooms are well-appointed and outfitted with electric blinds, private terraces, and, our favorite features, pedestal bathtubs and outdoor garden showers. The property is anchored by its spectacular zero-edge, three-tiered pool, which developers and owners Mark Cooley and Edward Hooten of SV-RED Management say





was designed to be a bold centerpiece of the resort. The pool's upper section near the wellness building is family-friendly; the middle and lower oceanfront tiers have cabanas with curtained privacy.

Of special note is The Auberge Spa at Chileno Bay, home to a salt inhalation room, the only one of its kind in Mexico. It may seem as if we only fixate on spas, but with facilities like these, we would be remiss not to share the experience. Beginning in a refreshing mist alcove and ending in the serene reflexology pool, the full spa journey at Chileno Bay includes moments in the aromatherapy steam room, ice fountain, and salt inhalation room, which all serve to benefit the mind and body. *chilenobayresidences.com*

here is no way that I could have been confused with a VIP when I checked into the Fairmont Monte Carlo prior to the Monaco Yacht Show kickoff last September. I was sweaty. I was tired. I was wearing spandex bike shorts. And I'd just arrived in Monaco after riding my bicycle from Lyon and over Mont Ventoux (550 miles in six days!) with a passionate group of cyclists to raise money for the Blue Marine Foundation, an ocean advocacy charity near to my heart.


But looks didn't matter. I was treated like royalty from the moment I entered the lobby. Then things got serious. In spite of getting ready for one of their busiest weekends of the year (only the Monaco Grand Prix weekend is busier), the Fairmont staff did more than just roll out the red carpet for me—they scheduled a 90-minute massage to begin as soon as I arrived. Now, I've had way more than my fair share of massages as a cyclist and travel writer (more than most people), so I don't say this lightly: this was the best massage I've ever had. It was simply, and honestly, the best. Then all I needed to do was pour myself into my well-appointed room and get ready to celebrate the end of the ride and the beginning of the yacht show in style.

So what's better than getting the best massage of your life after six hard days spent riding across France? Sleeping in a king bed with high-thread-count sheets after six hard days spent riding across France, and one late night at the nearby Buddha Bar.

The next morning came quickly, but it was easy to take in stride once I stepped out into the sun and experienced the view from the Horizon Deck and Champagne Bar on the seventh floor. Eating breakfast with a full view of most of the world's largest and most expensive yachts (in Port Hercule for the yacht show) in addition to nearly all of Monaco's famous landmarks—the Prince's Palace, the Opera House and Casino—is not to be missed. Neither is the four-course gourmet "Market 45" lunch capped with a fantastic dessert.

The food was spectacular in all of the hotel restaurants, including, of course, Nobu Monte Carlo, famous for its new-style sushi. The service—from the spa team to the friendly staff I encountered all over the hotel—was amazing. And my room, with its airy balcony, comfortable bed, and large bathroom, was extremely comfortable. But after spending three days (and nights), I have to say, Fairmont's many views always stole the show.

The Fairmont Spa's balcony is one of the best places to watch 900-horsepower Formula I cars rip around the famous "Fairmont Hairpin" (and to get a pedicure) during the Monaco Grand Prix. If that's not close enough, the Fairmont also has four special suites (named for famous Monaco GP drivers) positioned right over the tunnel that the cars enter shortly after navigating the turn. Each





And the scenery (of the guests and the sunset) from the rooftop pool at the Nikki Beach club is off the hook. But the breakfast-

time view from the Horizon Deck will always be my favorite. I can still smell the coffee and feel the pleasant greasiness of a buttery croissant on my fingers. Most of all, I'll always remember looking out over all that Monaco has to offer and actually feeling like a VIP. **OIH**




t's a frigid November evening in the coastal capital of Denmark. The sky is as black as ink, the wind is whipping off the harbor with a biting chill, and it feels cold enough to snow. I'm wrapped in layers of winter clothes, and in any other city in Europe I'd be staying indoors.

This, however, isn't like other cities because Copenhagen has hygge, a powerful and very effective weapon to help banish the winter blues.

Hygge? Let me explain. Firstly, it's pronounced "huegah" and is a uniquely Danish phenomenon meaning to create a warm, welcoming atmosphere and enjoy the good things in life with good people.

Think everything cozy-a roaring log fire, warm woolen blankets, cashmere socks, the glow of a candle, the aroma of sugar-roasted almonds, a mug of steaming hot chocolate, best friends around a dinner table-and you're starting to get the picture.

Hygge weaves through the very fabric of modern Danish life, especially during the long winter season, and is now so ubiquitous in Denmark (and other parts of Europe) that it was chosen as one of 2016's words of the year by the Oxford English Dictionary.





night, with just a few weeks to go until the holidays, I'm determined to find my own hybrid hygge in a cutting-edge design city that does cool and cozy in equal measure.

I don't have to walk far. Traditional Christmas markets are in full swing in major squares, twinkling with colorful lights, lined with stalls selling festive ornaments and sweet treats, and

brimming with people drinking gløgg, Denmark's classic hot mulled spiced wine (trust me, it's delicious).

All the stores on Copenhagen's central boulevard Strøget-one of the longest pedestrian shopping streets in Europe-are swathed in holiday decorations, and restaurant windows glow with candlelight.

Across the city in Tivoli Gardens, Copenhagen's beloved amusement park dating back to 1843, the air is so thick with hygge that you can slice it with a cake knife as children and parents alike revel in the classic rides, candy floss stalls, and Christmas illuminations.

I'm starting to understand why Copenhagen is frequently rated the most livable city in Europe, and Danes constantly rank among the world's happiest people.

On its surface, Copenhagen looks much like many

other European capitals. A major port city, it was founded around 1160 and is located on the island of Zealand on Denmark's east coast.

With a population nudging 800,000, the City of Copenhagen is roughly split into six areas-the bustling commercial and historic center, surrounded by a network of canals and lakes on either side, and five distinct districts: Vesterbro, Frederiksberg, Nørrebro, Østerbro, and Christianshavn.

The relatively compact city area is best discovered on foot or by bicycle. Its maze of streets, alleys, and squares is home to a treasure trove of royal palaces, churches, museums, parks, gardens, and colorful canal houses.

Intersected by the central Strøget, which extends from Kongens Nytorv (King's New Square) to City Hall next to Tivoli Gardens, this delightful city is a place to wander almost aimlessly, each twist and turn delivering a new sight to savor.

Royal watchers can head for Amalienborg Palace-the official residence of Denmark's reigning queen Margrethe II and her family-and nearby Rosenborg Castle and King's Garden, designed as a royal summerhouse and playground in 1606.

The city's low-rise skyline is pierced with church spires, testament to Copenhagen's Evangelical Lutheran history, and museums abound showcasing an array of cultural themes.

Take the cover off Copenhagen's chocolate box, however, and three very different and exciting conceptscontemporary food, design, and architecture-are turning the city into one of the world's coolest and most cuttingedge destinations for the modern traveler.

The city's new architecture, including UN City, The Blue Planet (Denmark's national aquarium), VM Mountain residences, and the Koncerthuset prompted international style bible Wallpaper to name Copenhagen its Best City of 2016.

Sleek design, especially in the lifestyle and home furnishings departments, has been in Denmark's DNA for many decades, but a new generation of outstanding designers, from furniture to art and fashion, are elevating Copenhagen's international status.

Head to Vesterbro's meatpacking district of Kødbyen, Nørrebro's trendy Jaegersborggade, and Christianhavn's Papirøen-a former paper storage facility that's now home to Copenhagen's biggest street food market-and you'll find thriving hubs of creativity.

Perhaps the most exciting element is the city's burgeoning food culture, fueled by the global fascination with new Nordic cuisine.

Copenhagen now boasts 18 Michelin stars at 15 restaurants (Denmark establishments scored a record 29 stars in the 2017 Michelin Guide), with some of the country's best chefs bringing a fresh new twist to menus and restaurant design.

With a focus on purity, simplicity, and freshness, Danish chefs are sourcing the country's best natural ingre-

dients and fusing them with new and old Scandinavian culinary traditions with spectacular results.

Speaking of tradition in a city awash with contemporary hotels, it's heartening to find one that recalls Denmark's Golden Age while still offering all the comforts and amenities expected by sophisticated travelers.

Known locally as "The White Lady on Kongens Nytory," the grand, white-painted Hotel d'Angleterre has held court over Copenhagen's square for more than 260 years.

Fresh from an \$80 million total refurbishment in 2013, this landmark five-star hotel offers 92 spacious suites and guest rooms designed in classic style, but with a thoughtful modern twist and state-of-the-art technology.

No two accommodations are the same, with many of the suites' interiors inspired by noted Danish authors, artists, and composers such as Hans Christian Andersen,

Karen Blixen, Ludvig Holberg, Bertel Thorvaldsen, and Hans Christian Lumbye.

The palatial Royal Suite is a study in refined elegance, a lavishly decorated space with gilded paneling, plush carpets, and crystal chandeliers; separate living and dining rooms; and a royal wave-worthy balcony overlooking the square.

The hotel's Amazing Space spa more than lives up to its name, featuring an indoor pool and excellent body treatments to combat any lingering jetlag, while the stunning Palm Court ballroom and Louis XVI salons add a belle époque touch to weddings and special events.

Responsibility for the d'Angleterre's overall style and design falls to Creative Director Alan Evensen and
