Walking into this home is like stepping aboard a classic yacht. Mahogany beams glow against white-painted woodwork.

Curves and swooping arches define spaces. And meticulously crafted cabinetry can be found in virtually every room.

Located on a salt water pond in Orleans, Massachusetts, it was designed and built by Polhemus Savery DaSilva, an architecture and construction firm based in nearby East Harwich. The husband-wife duo of John and Sharon DaSilva led the architectural team.

"We bought this property over 11 years ago," the homeowner recalls. "We loved the place, but not the house. But that was before the economic downturn of 2008, so we just sat on it. The kids were growing, and we were busy."

She describes the unlovely mid-century domicile that occupied the site as "formal, with small windows."

Eventually the economic landscape brightened and thoughts of renovation and rebuilding returned. "For 10 years, I looked in magazines at houses on Cape Cod and could always tell which ones were by Polhemus Savery DaSilva. I loved them," the homeowner recalls. "So I took Peter Polhemus [the firm's founder] to see the property."


Polhemus Savery DaSilva has been designing, renovating, and building some of the most interesting new and historic homes on Cape Cod since the firm's founding in 1996. With expertise ranging from site selection to interior design to maintenance, PSD has deep roots in the area's home market. This experience is invaluable when it comes to navigating the choppy waters of local, state, and federal environmental and land-use regulations.

In the case of this house, those regulations meant that any new construction had to fit inside the envelope of the existing structure.

"The beauty of the location is the reason we bought the property. We have 375 feet of water frontage and a dock," explains the owner. But its location also complicated the project.

"The house is in a sensitive location, on a peninsula with a salt water pond on three sides," says John DaSilva. "The house that stood on the property was banal and did not

take advantage of the site. But we were required to use the footprint of the original house, and also to adhere to the same height."

He adds that, because the house is located in a flood plain, it could not have a finished basement: flood vents have to allow water to flow through.


"She took the lead in interacting with us on what it would look like," John DaSilva says of the design process.

"I grew up on Long Island, and as kids we always had boats," remembers the owner. "I knew I wanted an interior inspired by that. This was designed to be the house that's in the family forever. We wanted it to be big enough and welcoming

enough so that our children always feel that they can come here with friends, and someday, with their own children."


With John and Sharon DaSilva leading the project, PSD designed and built a house with twin gables and a centered front door set into a shallow, arched entry porch. Traditional white cedar shingles cover the exterior; the roof is topped with red cedar. And the home boasts one of PSD's signature touches: decorative window shutters. In this case, the they are pierced with anchors.

The façade has small, traditional windows, but the rear is open to the view with large windows and French doors that open out to a broad terrace paved with





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bluestone. The terrace also features a large outdoor kitchen complete with an L-shaped granite bar counter, dining table, and lots of room for lounge furniture, and a large stone fire pit overlooking the water.

"For the interior, she wanted a nautical, playful feeling," Sharon DaSilva says. "She wanted an interior with open spaces, and the kitchen was very important to her as a place for entertaining and family gathering."

"PSD connected me with interior designer Susan Tuttle, who is located here in Orleans. I told her, 'I want nautical, but not hokey,' " the homeowner relates.

The design team accomplished just this. The front door leads into a dining room that opens to the back of the house. Above the dining table, the ceiling vaults in the manner of a yacht's cabin. Lined with beaded board, the ceiling makes the most of the low room heights designated by the building code. Distinctive mahogany beams connect the room's two sections.

To one side of the dining room is the kitchen, which features a coffered ceiling, dark blue granite countertops, and a large central island. The living room fireplace wall, composed of rough-hewn granite blocks, has an intriguing focal point: a whale's tail







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mantel carved from black granite. It is functional as well as whimsical—the tail is also a shelf.

When not in use, the TV is hidden behind one of the built-ins flanking the fireplace. Other TVs-in the study, master bedroom, and outdoor terrace—also hide behind cabinetry.

The whale's tail is one example of the playful spirit beloved by the homeowner. Other whimsical touches include the tugboat wall in the bunkroom and built-in wooden canopy over the master bed.

While she is delighted with the whole house, the homeowner is especially proud of the onyx lining the showers in the bathrooms.


"She has a strong sense of style and knows

Finished with custom brass and bronze lighting that evokes a yacht, the interior is undeniably dramatic. "The whole downstairs is one big built-in," laughs Tuttle. The result is an elegant home where it's easy to be together.

"My husband travels constantly for business and my daughters are busy with sports and school activities all the time," the homeowner says.

"This is where we get to spend time together. This is where life slows down and we really connect," she continues. And because the home is seamlessly integrated into its coastal environment and grounds her family, the owner appropriately named it "Summer Mooring." .









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SETTING THE STAGE

DESIGNER JENNIFER POST CREATES AN UBER-CHIC INTERIOR FOR A HAMPTONS SHINGLE-STYLE RETREAT

Let's say you just bought a new, gambrel-roof, Shingle-style home on exclusive Mecox Bay in Bridgehampton, New York. It was designed as a spec house in the familiar vernacular to fit

right in with its surroundings.

You'd probably want to go the traditional route with its interiors, right? Maybe a soft and muted look, just like all the other shingle styles built nearby in decades past?

Think again. You decide instead to work with Manhattan-based interior designer Jennifer Post because you want something altogether new and fun and bright and splashy and chic. You want a style closer to Miami Beach or SoHo than the traditional Hamptons.

Why Post? She's got a reputation. One that's built on bold moves and vibrant colors

but also on eye-popping surprises and hard-to-find furnishings.

And here, in this nearly new six-bedroom home right on the bay, Post rose to the occasion—and then exceeded all expectations.

"They wanted it to be like no other house, but it looked like any other house," Post says. "They wanted it to be special and just for them, to reflect their lifestyle and work with their contemporary art collection."

COLOR PUNCH

What's the first thing she tackled? Post looked down at the dark brown floors, shook her head, and dispatched them to the dustbin. "The only thing I did architecturally was stain the floors to a light gray," she says. "It brought a contemporary feel to the whole house."

Then she got to work with some rollicking snaps and punches. She used crisp blues and oranges (her clients are diehard Knicks fans) in any way she wanted: on chairs, carpets, sofas, runners, and even tables. "Using the color is a surprise, especially in the dining room and kitchen, where the blue legs are unexpected," she says. "And it's harmonious, room to room, because there are no doors downstairs. It's one big room where the colors sing together and talk to each other and speak the same language."

The vibrant idiom of Post's design materializes in the most unusual ways, like in the first-floor gallery: a transition space between dining and living areas where four low-slung rocking chairs float on a Mediterranean blue carpet. "It had to be really sharp and playful and fun," she says. "It's for the teenagers and young adults who all meet there before going out to dinner."

CLIENTS WITH VISION

Her clients were a newly remarried couple with four children: ages 27, 25, 20, and one high school junior. "The kids grew up going to the Hamptons," says their 50-year-old father, a Manhattan-based financier. "We wanted a place to relax and play on the water; we use it from Memorial Day through Labor Day."

Their assignment for Post? "To decorate it in a way that anyone could feel comfortable walking in with a towel from the pool, and







where we could always have friends over and where the kids could have friends over," he says. "We wanted a place where you could spread out a bunch of people and not know they're there."


Moreover, he and his wife wanted it to feel like a young place: comfortable and relaxing yet clearly designed with a clue as to what's new. "We wanted a vacation weekend place where you can leave your work and baggage behind," he says. "It's incredible for relaxing on the water."

Its location helps a lot in that regard. The water at Mecox Bay is only three to four feet deep, so it's perfect for kayaking, jet skiing, water skiing, or paddle boarding. "They have every toy imaginable," Post says. "Once they get there they don't have to



go anywhere all weekend. It's an adults' camp and a kids' camp too."

It's a tonic also, with the Atlantic just a kayak ride away. "The Hamptons can be a hustle-bustle type of place, but this is a peaceful enclave with about 100 homes," the client says. "We're at the very end of the bay, where it's protected from storms and hurricanes and just minutes away from the ocean and beach."

A BUILDER WHO COLLABORATES

The couple was wise enough to call in the 7,500-square-foot home's original builder, John Nocera, who's not only experienced in working with well-known Hamptons architects but who literally knew where all of its construction bones were buried. After all, he'd been deeply involved in engineering its birth in the low-lying wetlands site.


"We had to get creative with retaining walls. The house sits on 196 pilings, sunk 16 feet below grade," Nocera says. "It was built at the existing grade and 32,000 yards of fill elevate the site." The home was already Energy Star-compliant, with geothermal heating and cooling, spray foam insulation, and a solar compensation of 10 kilowatts.

He accompanied its new owners on a walk-through before the purchase, and once the deal was done, he teamed up with Post to execute their vision. Nocera prides himself on attention to detail, something that's de rigueur for Post. "She would relate something to us about how to handle a situation, and we worked it out, and that's how we worked as a team to make it all happen," he says.

The original layout had two master suites but the teams converted one into an entertainment room with a TV and four sectional sofas ("parrot blue" is how Post describes them), which can be joined up into square beds for sleepovers. The remaining master suite is the builder's favorite space. "It's on the second floor overlooking the water, the deck, and the pool," he says. "There's a phenomenal master bathroom with a freestanding shower and tub."

THEATER ALL AROUND


Punctuating all of the spaces in the home is the owners' modern artwork collection, se-

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

lected with guidance from New York art consultant Ann Cook. "What we tried to accomplish was to bring a contemporary feel with things that relate to Jennifer's vision," the client says. "The neon piece above the mantle in the room with the rockers makes a statement—that art was purchased with the house in mind."

If it all adds up to a very bold theatrical look and feel, that's no coincidence. During her undergraduate years at the University of Cincinnati, Post studied filmmaking and theater. "When I got to New York, I worked in the-







ater design and studied perspective, volume, and massing," she says. "As soon as you open the curtain of a theater, the audience knows what the whole play will be about. And that's how I know what you'll feel about this house."

Thus, the rocking chairs. "You walk in the front door and see them," the husband says. "I wouldn't think in my wildest dreams of putting four rockers in the front room."

But then again, he's into finance, not theater or interior design. Still, he and his wife deserve credit for trusting Post with creating their home's no-holds-barred interior while respecting its familiar, traditional exterior.






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

LIVE LIKE A KING

THE BRANDO GIVES GUESTS THE STAR TREATMENT IN THE SOUTH PACIFIC.

Half a century ago, getting away from it all was much easier to do. Many of today's most popular tropical islands were less developed, so you didn't need to travel too the ends of the Earth to feel like you were relaxing a world away. Now, with ever-quickening modes of transportation and more capable, alwaysconnected pieces of personal technology, the world feels much smaller. And as we all know too well, escaping the stress of everyday life in the 21st century is no easy task.

Fortunately, a number of private islands exist that feature luxuriously appointed resorts and not much else. Intrepid world travelers willing to venture to the South

Pacific have their choice of a few of them. Laucala Island, for example, located about 150 miles northeast of the main island of Fiji, celebrates its 10th anniversary this year as a luxury resort destination.

Meanwhile, almost 2,000 miles to the east-and 30 miles north of Tahiti in French Polynesia-The Brando resort is set on the stunning southwestern edge of the Tetiaroa Atoll.

For centuries, the atoll served as the exclusive retreat for Tahitian royalty, and guests of The Brando with an adventurous spirit can take to Polynesian outrigger canoes, kayaks, paddleboards, or bicycles to visit the temple ruins. Those who prefer to unwind at the resort can enjoy a day of pampering at the

21,500-square-foot spa featuring steam baths and a cooling waterfall. In the evening, decadent meals are served at Les Mutinés, the resort's fine-dining restaurant, which seats 20 guests and is supervised by Guy Martin, who runs the two-Michelin-starred Le Grand Véfour restaurant in Paris.

It features 35 villas ranging in size from one to three bedrooms and costing from about \$3,200 to \$15,100 per night. ◆

A NEW COURSE

THE ROYAL BLUE GOLF CLUB AT THE BAHA MAR RESORT IN THE BAHAMAS SPICES UP THE GAME.

Even at a spectacular resort golf course

designed by a world-class architect, the avid golfer's experience can be marred by predictability. Simply put, the course doesn't change. Sure, the tee boxes may be moved forward or back a few yards and the hole location can be cut in a more chalenging position on the green. but the general look and feel of each hole-and more important, how each hole plays-remains constant.

Such is not the case at the Royal Blue Golf

Club at Baha Mar resort in the Bahamas.

The course, a signature Jack Nicklaus design (and the only Nicklaus-designed course in the Bahamas), features just two sets of tees that are free flowing, meaning they are repositioned-sometimes significantly so-each day.

As the club's head golf pro Andy Deiro explains, the degree to which the tees are repositioned is influenced most by resort guests who are playing the course for at least a second time during their stay. "If we have repeat guests, we want them to have a

different golf experience," he says.

Not only can the tees be moved to lengthen or shorten a hole by as much as 100 yards, many holes feature expansive, flat, and closely mowed teeing areas that allow the tee boxes to be moved laterally as well. That means hazards and fairway bunkers will be in play some days and unreachable (or easily carried) on others. It also means that golfers will likely need to play different shots (with different clubs) off the tee and into the greens.

On average, the Royal Blue tees play between 6,400 and 6,500 yards, but Deiro acknowledges that those tees are nothing more than a recommendation. "We just think this is where you're going to have the most fun," he says. "If you think it's too long or too short on any given hole, play from wherever you want." *

They all also feature an innovative powertrain-gas or zero-emissions electric powered-that utilizes tank-like tracks that deploy into and out of the hull when it comes time to drive up the beach.

The boats built by Iguana Yachts start at about \$400,000, and represent a super stylish perspective on the growing amphibous boat category.

Four unique Iguana models are currently available: a classic open-cockpit cruiser; a




more luxurious "exclusive" iteration with optional hardtop; a commuter model in limo or sport configuration; and an expedition vessel equipped with a wave-piercing bow, deep-V hull, and shock-absorbing seats. And all embody a fresh, more literal interpretation to the term "pleasure cruising." .

The Ariel name has long been associated

with revolutionary, high-performance modes of transportation, going as far back as the beginning of the 20th century when Ariel Motorcycles began producing motorized two- and four-wheel vehicles. In 1999, a new company was formed utilizing the historic moniker. Since then, the modern Ariel Motor Company has produced vehicles that are as attention-grabbing as the innovative quadricycles, grand prix racers, and hillclimbers that were branded with the Ariel name during the early 1900s.

Most recently, the specialty vehicle manu-

facturer unveiled the Ariel Nomad, an off-road-capable version of the brand's Ariel Atom 3: a street-legal speed demon that can sprint from 0 to 60 mph in less than 3.3 seconds and from 0 to 100 mph in just over 7 seconds.

But when some who test drove the Atom 3 wanted a smoother ride, the Nomad was built to provide that added comfort without sacrificing much in the way of performance (it still accelerates from 0 to 60 mph in 3.5 seconds).


"The Atom is iconic and provides extreme performance," says Mark Swain, president of TMI AutoTech Inc., Ariel Motor Company's North American manufacturing partner. "The Nomad provides extreme performance when the surface gets a little rough."

The off-road vehicle is available in two models: Nomad Sport (starting at \$80,000), which the brand describes as a dream-ful-filling rally racer, and Nomad Tactical (starting at \$92,250), which is equipped with more adventure-seeking gear such as a winch, top-mounted light bar, under-vehicle protection, and larger mud terrain tires. Both models can be supercharged, increasing their total power to 300 hp. *



ande Gerber has been an Alist-taste maker since he

age kids—Kaia and Presley Gerber—are gorgeous models, too. One of his closest friends is George Clooney. And oh yeah, the little tequila company he founded with Clooney and luxury real estate mogul Mike Meldman of the Discovery Land Company—Casamigos—just sold for a cool BILLION dollars (\$700 million up front with the potential for another \$300 million based on sales performance over the next decade).


Meanwhile, the 56-year old Gerber shows no sign of slowing down any time soon. He and Clooney continue to be involved with Casamigos. In fact, they've just launched a new Mezcal and he still works with the Casamigos team in the office he designed near this spectacular home in Malibu.


"I love living on the beach," he says via email recently. "And there are very few ocean-front properties like this. Cindy and I have loved raising our kids in Malibu so, when I heard this place may come on the market, I bought it before it did. I had to have it."

He's not kidding when he says there is nothing else like it in Malibu. The home is set on a secluded beach and encompasses three acres of mature trees, panoramic oceanfront views and peace and quiet that's not so easy to find so close to L.A.

The long driveway leads to the home that was built in the 1940s. But Gerber has done a masterful job renovating since he and Crawford bought it several years ago. "The house already had great bones and I've always been passionate about architecture and design," he says. "The house is simple, casual and elegant. It feels like we're at home and on vacation every day. It also has great open spaces that are designed be comfortable for the family and perfect for entertaining."

Of course Gerber's Malibu house is "perfect for entertaining." The Whiskey became the IT spot back in the early '90s because he designed it to feel like his living room, and he brings the same style and design eye to everything he does. In fact, Gerber
















has designed all of their houses and the Casamigos Malibu HQ, too.

As you'd expect, the whole family loves hanging out in the living room that makes the most of the panoramic view. The large wraparound deck is the ideal place to watch the sunset—and enjoy a glass of Casamigos—after a long day. And the master suite not only has a fireplace, sitting area, two separate spa-like baths and dressing closets, it also has a private entrance located on the second level that's situated around a large interior courtyard.

Rande's passion for real estate and design extends up the beach – to the house he owns next door. And the story of the famous guest he and Cindy have hosted in both homes is legendary.

"We love to have intimate cocktail parties," he continues, "but one of the funniest things that happened at the house didn't happen during a party." Gerber goes on to describe the particular night when he and George Clooney had had a few drinks at Café Habana, the bar he opened in Malibu.

"George and I were excited about doing

more with our tequila than just drinking it. We were in Café Habana talking about launching Casamigos, the design of the bottle, and who we were going to get to distribute it. Anyway, we'd drunk enough and got a ride back to my house on the beach. Then

George decided to stay at our place rather than get a ride home to his house.


"George usually stays in our guest house on the beach next door when he's over. And if I've had a couple of drinks, I usually stay in the guest room in the main house, rather than bothering Cindy in our bedroom. But things didn't go according to plan that night. Instead of walking down to the guest house, George decided that he would just stay in the guest room of the main house.

"George crashed out and I fell asleep in









the kids' room. Anyway, Cindy wakes up at some point in the night and wonders, 'Where is Rande?' So, she gets up and goes into the guest room looking for me. All she sees on the bed is a body face-down, fully clothed, with motorcycle boots on and phone in hand. So she gets into bed and whispers, 'Babe, why don't you take your clothes off and get under the covers?' Then George wakes up and is like, 'Huh?' and Cindy ran out of the room laughing.

"We laughed about it for hours actually.

And that's when we came up with one of our early ideas to promote the new brand. 'Drink Casamigos and wake up with Cindy Crawford!' Or as Cindy saw it: 'Drink Casamigos and wake up with George Clooney!'"

In fact, Clooney wrote and directed the video that ran when they first launched Casamigos based on that night. It was called, "It Could Happen." It had Cindy waking up with George...and Rande waking up with George, too.

But no matter how busy they get, it's clear


that Malibu will always be a sanctuary for Gerber and his famous family. They have a lake house that the family goes to every summer. They still take family vacations together. 


Clockwise from left: Reece and Hamilton on the beach. Reece working out. The family in Kauai and Hamilton on ice.

've been lucky enough to meet movers and shakers on superyachts, private planes, and in their spectacular beach homes all over the world. But I'd never interviewed a famous power couple in a boiling hot sauna until I traveled to the Hawaiian island of Kauai to meet Laird Hamilton and Gabby Reece.

Hamilton had just finished work pouring concrete for the house they're building on Kauai's north side. The sauna was inside a large barn on the property where he stores the surfboards he's used to ride some of the world's largest waves. And I was trying not to stare (or pass out from the heat) as Reece told me what it's like to migrate between Malibu in the summer and Kauai in the winter. Then she flashed me a warm smile and said, "Time to get into the ice."

The sauna and ice bath (thermoregulating) are part of the couple's







innovative XPT workout regime they share with a wide circle of famous friends (and via their select workshops held across the country). But as you'd expect, living by the ocean means more to them than simply having a cool place to work out.

KAUAI


Since Hamilton is one of the world's most famous big wave surfers, the couple winters in Kauai for the waves. But Hamilton's relationship with the ocean goes way deeper than just surfing. "I grew up in Hawaii," he

says. "And when you're raised in Hawaii, you have a cultural connection to the ocean. A relationship. The ocean has taught me my greatest lessons and brought me many of the greatest rewards in my life. I wouldn't be with Gabby or my kids if it wasn't for the ocean. And I wouldn't be building this house if it wasn't for the ocean either."

You'd think they'd build a house on a cliff overlooking a famous surf break, right? Not exactly. Instead they chose a peaceful piece of overgrown hillside in Princeville on Kauai's north shore. The reason? A boat ramp. It's one of only nine lots on the river with direct access to what Hamilton describes as his "professor, priest, and disciplinarian"—the open ocean. And his eyes light up when he describes the ultimate freedom and pure power that compel him to regularly risk his life surfing massive waves.

That's why their homes always have a view of the ocean they but are set back from the coast. "I'm in the ocean and sand every day. For me, home is where I can retreat a bit from the power that's given me everything in

life, and scared me profoundly as well. I love walking in the grass and seeing waterfalls off in the distance," says Hamilton, pointing out across the Hanalei Valley. "Plus, it's just so darn pretty," he adds with a totally disarming smile and not a whiff of sarcasm.

Reece further explains her husband's vision for the house they are building when he first showed her the property. "I was like, 'Cool, we're buying a boat ramp. Whatever.'" That's all she saw at first. "Then he nailed some slats in a tree. 'Climb up there and look,' he said. And then I understood."

When the house is finished, every room will have a spectacular view of the entire Hanalei Valley, Hanalei River, and Hanalei Bay. "So he cleared the land," she continues. "He built the barn and carved out the spot on the hillside for the house. We have two more concrete walls to pour and then we'll be into framing."

They worked with a local architect but are both heavily involved in the design and con-

struction. The bottom level will have three bedroons for their girls. Upstairs, a huge great room will take full advantage of the view. The top floor is reserved for bedrooms and a giant office for Reece. Of course, they'll also have a pool, sauna, ice tubs, and enough additional bedrooms to accommodate their many famous (and not-famous-at-all) friends who come to visit and work out.

"It's a gift," says Reece. "I think I'm the benefactor, but it's a gift for Laird too because he really loves this special spot."



"We bought the house in Malibu 20 years ago," Reece says. "We had a really good feeling about the land and Laird was sold as soon as he saw its view of Point Dume, Paradise Cove, and Malibu's undeveloped canyons. But we didn't design or build the house. The house we're building here [in Kauai] will be more of a reflection of my sense of style."

Their Malibu house is large—about 10,000 square feet—but Reece is quick to point out they don't need such a big house. Instead,





they use the extra space to work out and build community with their friends. "The house provides," she says. "It's doing its job. We all sleep there. We're safe there. We're creating memories there. It provides safety and shelter for other people. But the house is not art. I appreciate art. But the magic of the house comes from the people and the view rather than the house itself."

"Everyone always thinks Malibu is like Hollywood," Hamilton adds. "But it's really just a small town with lots of amazing people who are successful in diverse fields." Many of those amazing people (including XPT ambassadors Rick Rubin, Kenny Chesney, and Joakim Noah, plus others like Orlando Bloom and Tim Ferriss) have participated in the regular workouts that go on at their Malibu place.

"We've built a really beautiful life in Malibu," says Reece. "Some of the best people


I've ever met are in Malibu. It doesn't matter what they do or how much they have. Take my friend Kelly, for instance. She's married to Ron Meyer, the head of Universal. This is a guy who works harder than any person I know, but he'll drive the extra half hour into work just so he can wake up in the morning and look out at the ocean. Obviously Ron and I are different, but the point is, Malibu attracts interesting people who share a common connection to the ocean."

And the cool thing about Reece is that she has lots of famous friends but also teaches three free fitness classes a week for the locals when she's in Kauai. "You see what happens when people really work together," she says. "Saying 'We're gonna do this together' may be the best form of connection there is, and when people slow down and actually try to connect, amazing things happen."

For Hamilton, who needs to be in the water to plug into the power of the ocean, the view will always be more important than the house. But Reece is a bit different. She uses their houses (and pools and saunas and ice baths) to plug into the power of people. I had a feeling that was the case when she and Hamilton treated me with such hospitality during my sauna/ice bath/interview, which took the better part of an afternoon. But it became crystal clear when I said thank you on the way back to my hotel.

"People always say to us, 'Thank you for opening your home,' " she says. "But they don't realize that they're leaving their energy for us as well. We feel really fortunate because we live in beautiful places and get to share those places with lots of interesting people."

I have a sneaky suspicion that the pure collective power of Gabby Reece and Laird Hamilton will always eclipse any house they build. But I still can't wait to see it and share the story when it's finished.







When

the time came to design her family's new home on the barrier island of Brigantine, New Jersey, interior designer Amy Kennedy was thinking small.

But her husband, Patrick—the retired congressman from Rhode Island—had other ideas. "If we build it, they will come," he said, considering the prospect of raising a large family there. They already had a daughter named Harper, but Patrick was thinking big: as in seven bedrooms, seven and a half baths, and 7,000 square feet, a layout large enough to accommodate lots of kids.

Their inspiration came from homes they saw in Newport, Rhode Island (the district Patrick represented in the U.S. House of Representatives), as well as on Nantucket and in Hyannis Port, Massachusetts, where the family visit each summer. "We wanted it to feel like it belonged on the Cape, and we knew we wanted Shingle style," Amy says. "I wanted a lot of natural materials on the outside and wanted it to be interesting from all sides, because it's on the water—it had to look good from there."

When they bought the lot, they intended on renovating the existing 100-year-old home, which faced the Intracoastal Waterway. Then they got a call from their builder, who'd gutted the place. "He said, 'I can't do this job for you; the beams are warped and the cinderblock walls are beginning to crumble,' "Amy says. "If a builder says he can't do the job, that's serious."

A NEW DESIGN

So they turned to Fenwick Architects in Linwood, New Jersey, for design ideas and a new house. Blueprints in hand, they approached builder Alex Balcersky of Balcersky Building Co. Inc. and cabinetmaker Tom Collins of Colmar Kitchen Studio. Finally, they got to work building their new home—for a full two years.

"We were tasked with taking what the architect had laid out and actually improving it," Collins says. "Amy was actively involved





from the get-go, and there were a lot of revisions during a long process, but there's no area where we could say, 'I wish we'd gone with the original design.' It was fully vetted."

The process was not without its challenges. Hurricane Sandy blew in just after the

foundation was poured. But the damage was relatively minor, and there was a silver lining in the form of ocean-borne beams from the Atlantic City boardwalk. "They washed up on the beach," Amy says. "We used them in the ceilings for the kitchen, living room, and our bedroom, plus some pieces for the outdoor fireplace mantel."

The home was

Ultimately, everything was built to hurricane code, and the landscape was designed to withstand the winds and salt of the environment.

THE PROCESS

As construction got underway, the team refined the design as they moved along. "I got a text with a napkin drawing reconfiguring the master bath," Collins says. "We were constantly in each space with a lot of hands-on designing."

That was especially true in the kitchen and master bath, where they added nooks and a bay window for the bathtub and slipped windows into the shower too. In both spaces, Amy



aimed for symmetry. "We made sure that the kitchen island is centered," she says. "And there are his and hers sinks in the master bath, not a long, connected one, because my husband is a mess-maker and I'm kind of neat."

All the while, they balanced elegant design with rational functionality. Collins sat down with Amy to make sure that everything worked to its specific needs and was in the right place. "We really discussed all that—where do we put my knives and Tupperware and cutting boards and the trash compactor?" she recalls. "Not many people use one, but I like it, so where does it go?"

The details in the kitchen cabinetry were designed to yield an Old World, built-in-place feel. "Wood-Mode Fine Custom Cabinetry is a custom manufacturer, so it's all customized," Collins says. "Like the three pantry cabinets made as one to give off a richness and make it stand out."

FAMILY ICONS

Amy and Patrick use the house to display iconic Kennedy family photos and memorabilia but, "We made space for them without making the house museum-like," Amy says.

Most keepsakes are on the third floor, where Patrick maintains an office for his work as founder of The Kennedy Forum, which leads a national dialogue on transforming mental health and addiction care by uniting mental health advocates, business leaders, and government agencies around a common set of principles. He's also a co-founder of One Mind, an organization that pushes for greater global investment in brain research. And he works from JFK's senate desk, passed on first to his father, Senator Ted Kennedy. Other items include JFK's presidential bomber jacket and a model sailboat given to his dad by Bobby and Ethel Kennedy.

Then there's the mast split into three pieces. "It's from Patrick's dad's boat. It snapped during a bad storm and was sitting in the garage," she says. "I thought it was really pretty, so our builder, Alex Balcersky, had custom brackets made for it."

Patrick was right. They built it, and "they" came. The couple now have four kids, (plus a new baby expected this summer), who all have room to grow in a house by the sea. •





In fact, Kohanaiki's A-team can arrange anything: surfing, stand-up paddling, snorkeling, and diving and deep-sea fishing on the *Kai Kea*, Kohanaiki's powerful 39-foot center console boat. They even organized a fun fishing tournament for kids while I was there.

Meanwhile, I'm not surprised that active families and professional athletes alike are attracted to Kohanaiki. The comprehensive sports complex includes state-of-the-art tennis



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and basketball courts as well as countless fitness and yoga classes. And its signature K-fit program was developed specifically to help guests enjoy their surroundings while also working out with Kohanaiki's onsite personal trainers.

Now if all this activity is making you tired, don't worry. Kohanaiki's main clubhouse is a stunning, 67,000-square-foot shrine to relaxation and wellness. It has everything you'll ever need—full-service spa, infinity pools, hot tubs, yoga lawns, relaxation areas, and sweeping views of the ocean—to ease even the most stressed mind and body. It also features a bowling alley, movie theater, private dining rooms, wine and cheese tasting room, spectacular wine collection, cigar room, and poker room. There's even a master brewer crafting one-of-a-kind beers onsite.
