TRADITIONAL ARCHITECTURE FOR THE MODERN WORLD.







Before purchasing this Nantucket property,

Ray Pohl's clients had one question: Can we get a water view from the second floor? Out came the cherry picker for a look. "It was like the skies had opened once we got above the tree line," says Pohl, a principal of Botticelli & Pohl Architects. "You could see the harbor with the ferries coming in," he adds.

The owners, a couple who split their time between Nantucket and a Manhattan suburb, asked Pohl for a clean, modern design, a departure from the home he designed for them over a dozen years prior. While the house boasts hallmarks of traditional Nantucket style, including cedar shingle siding, dormers, and gabled roofs, it also has lots of glass.

Despite the owners' enthusiasm for that elusive water view, Pohl did not propose building an upside-down home. "The integration of indoor living spaces with outdoor ones gets lost with upside-down houses," he says. Here, the decking is almost flush with the house and the pool patio and fire pit are just a few steps down. With immediate access from the kitchen, dining, and living room the flow between indoors and out is seamless.

Easy circulation isn't the only upside: The vista is beautiful, too, lack of a water view notwithstanding. Landscape architect Miroslava Ahern transformed the property from one dense with scrub oaks and brush into a delightful landscape of undulating, grassy hills. Steep grading became a series of cascading outdoor spaces. "Framed by the moors, the elevated pool with its dark finish reflects the sunset," Ahern says. "It appears as a painting, an artistic extension of the great room."

The scene makes an impact right up front. "It's an unbelievable surprise when you walk

in the front door and see the stunning landscape through the wall of glass," says interior designer Nina Liddle, referencing the eight-panel door that stacks to one side, melding the main living space with the property out back. The European white oak ceiling accentuates the effect. "We like to give the ceiling interest to enhance the view and draw the eye through the house," Pohl says. The rhythmic treatment complements the European white oak floor, too, a design principle to which Pohl tends to adhere. "Clients might suggest a nautical-style mahogany floor, like you see in a Chris-Craft, but we prefer a consistent palette to preserve the idea of repose," the architect says.

Liddle enhanced the natural feel with the monochromatic color and materials palette which includes linen, alpaca, and other natural fibers. "Comfort was huge for both the structure of the furniture and the fabrics," the designer says. "It's very cozy." There are sheepskin lounge chairs, rattan and cane dining chairs, textural rugs, woven shades, plus natural stone and ceramic tile. The piece de resistance? A Lindsey Adelman chandelier featuring irregularly shaped, hand-blown glass globes strung up with knotty white rope.





Peter Deane, who collaborated with the owners on their home in Westchester, created the cabinetry throughout. "The homeowners' vision for the kitchen was a feeling of informal luxury that wasn't overly beachy," Deane says. Taj Mahal quartzite slabs set against crisp, bleached, rift-cut white oak cabinetry is nuanced and airy, while the island's reeded base and pantry's

caned panels inject coastal flavor, and black and unlacquered brass accents offer contrast and a subtle gleam that will patina.

Deane and Liddle took cues from the kitchen in designing the upstairs bathrooms—a reeded rift-cut white oak vanity graces the daughter's bath while the primary bath boasts an onyx slab. When it comes to the bars, however—there is a built-



in dry bar in the great room and a wet bar sunk into a niche in the upstairs hall—the team opted for base cabinets painted in Benjamin Moore Graphite anchoring simple floating shelves made from rift-cut white oak.

Liddle layered in fun, look-at-me details in the second-floor hallway, such as the black and white terrazzo tile bar backsplash with a whimsical wave pattern and a punchy runner made from marigold-colored braided jute. "They wanted a mostly monochromatic palette and were open to pops of yellow," Liddle shares. The grass-green elements in the first-floor guest suite were unplanned. "The client and I fell in love with the Artistic Tile glass mosaic so we used it on the shower walls," the designer explains.


The other bedrooms are composed in a medley of neutrals, as is the upstairs den, which the family refers to as the "chill pit." As in other second-floor rooms, there are dormers and vaulted ceilings that lend a sense of volume. A sectional with a chaise makes the most of the space, creating an intimate nest for watching television. Most importantly, the den, along with the couple's bedroom and their daughter's, opens onto a deck overlooking the backyard and the sea in the distance. "They grab coffee at the bar in the hall in the morning, or a drink in the evening, then head out to the deck to enjoy the view," Liddle says. *

TAKING IN THE VIEW

For living room design inspiration for a home in Laguna Beach, California, interior designer Michelle Zoldano of eponymous interior design firm in Dana Point looked directly outside. "Our intention was for the fireplace, along with the breathtaking ocean views, to be the first thing you see when you enter," says Zoldano of the complete remodel project situated on a cliff above a

popular regional beach.
"Opening the doors reveals a view of Thousand Steps
Beach. To complement this, we selected neutral furniture and highlighted the fireplace with its impressive stone as the focal point of the room."

To create a lived-in, organic and modern aesthetic in the living room, Zoldano kept original arched doors, added a wet bar, and chose warm and elegant materials such as quartzite, white oak, and bronze. The fireplace was also an integral design feature and underwent multiple design iterations. "We probably designed it about ten times before settling on this final version," explains Zoldano. "Although finding the right stone was timeconsuming, the result was definitely worth the wait. I love the wood detail on either side of the fireplace with the sconces. The floating hearth has led lighting underneath so at night [when the sconces and hearth lighting are turned on], it gives the fireplace a nice glow and looks beautiful during sunset hour."

The room is now a multifunctional sophisticated space for lounging and entertaining. "It's ideal for enjoying morning coffee, gathering with friends and family, reading a book, and sipping a drink made from the bar across from the fireplace," adds Zoldano. "Or, simply relaxing and taking in the view."

Having lived there for years, and with their boys transitioning into their teens, the homeowners decided it was time for a refresh. Enter Erin Hannon-Watkinson, founder of Toronto-based interior design firm Studio HA/WA.

"The house was built about 15 years ago as part of a subdivision," explains Hannon-Watkinson. "My clients wanted it to feel less cookie-cutter. They felt like they had never truly made it their own and hoped to achieve a distinct identity."

The goal was to establish a consistent aesthetic throughout—but more than just consistency, the homeowners desired beauty and elevated style. "One of our main points of inspiration is they mentioned that feeling of walking into a glamorous hotel," notes the designer. "This really spoke to me as I was able to pull from my experience in hospitality design to create unexpected luxuries and refined details."

From the main living spaces to the primary suite to the rooftop deck and backyard garden, Hannon-Watkinson delivered a clean-lined, luxe, less-is-more look that is equal parts contemporary and timeless. Subtle textures and patterns and strategic use of wood and stone enliven the low-contrast, neutral palette.



Prioritizing functionality—the owners admit to never having enough storage before—was another key focus, particularly in the kitchen. The designer-led schematic delivers a full wall of custom cabinets that organizes small appliances, coffee accoutrements, and more. "Everything not used every day can be hidden behind closed doors," notes Hannon-Watkinson.

The clients wanted this important cooking and gathering space to feel clean and classic, spurring Hannon-Watkinson to

Because the concept of contemporary beach living was the focus, the design team leaned into natural materials: warm woods, white oak on millwork, light/white stones with subtle veining to give depth and richness without commanding too much attention, and linen in the soft furnishings.

Opposite, Adding elements of concealed storage was a really important element so the kitchen could feel spacious and comfortable to move around in. By adding full-height millwork, the design team created a clear division between the spaces while still keeping them visually together.

Walnut Torii Stools by Bensen add warmth while a new slider introduces more natural light.

A large island with seating for eight is the centerpiece. "We had a lot of discussions about whether it was too big, but the clients really wanted space for their kids to have friends over and for the island to be a main hub," says the designer. A U-shaped stool arrangement allows for more conversation-friendly seating.

Toying with where to place two of the owner's wish-list items, a gas fireplace and bar, Hannon-Watkinson ultimately decided on the dining room. "We strategically placed the fireplace along the south wall so that it could be viewed and enjoyed from the living room, dining room, and kitchen while cooking," she explains.









To counter this bold visual element, she placed a full-height white oak bar on the room's opposite side. The bar's design emulates an armoire; pocketing doors keep the silhouette neat when the bar is open. The custom piece houses a bar sink, drawer dishwasher, below-counter beverage fridge, glassware storage, and a small wine selection.

Since the dining room is one part destination for formal dining, one part circulation space, Hannon-Watkinson recommended the circular Avenue Road table, so it is easy to walk around. The Noon 3 Pendant from Avenue Road is a purposefully bold architectural element.

Previously, the entry sequence, which leads from the front door into the living room, felt dark and closed off from the rest of the house. "It was just a standard Toronto entry," recalls Hannon-Watkinson. Her creative solution, a two-sided millwork installation, allows light and sight lines to pass between the two spaces while showcasing decorative accessories. The white oak installations "create drama by maximizing the height from floor to ceiling," she adds.

With her clients' blessing, Hannon-Watkinson's transformative wand extended into the outdoor living spaces, too. Typically small for Toronto, the backyard now beckons with a plunge pool, fire pit, and modest outdoor kitchen. The large Tribu daybed accommodates more than one person comfortably with an efficient footprint.

Yet another destination is the new rooftop terrace with views of Toronto's skyline. Here, the family comfortably entertains with help from a comfy seating area and bar, which doubles as a storage unit for cushions. "I'm always thinking about how we can use design to make something better and not just beautiful," she asserts.

Hannon-Watkinson's ability to blend style and function into elevated features is apparent at every turn. And it's the reason why this well-loved home feels and functions like new. *

The sun-kissed waters of the Gulf of Mexico lap the shoreline just steps away from this three-story family home in Galveston, Texas. While some interior designers may have been persuaded by nature's palette to lean into the hues of water, sand, and bleached shells, Dane Austin chose a different path: "My client had one request: 'I don't want any blue-and-white."

It's no coincidence that this homeowner's aversion to coastal cliché led her 2,000 miles away to Austin, a Boston-based interior designer with an eponymous firm known for fusing daring color combinations and unexpected pairings. "People appreciate our spaces, which come across as playful, individual, and demonstrate a sophisticated use of color," he says. "No two of our projects are the same."

Initially, Austin traveled to Galveston to work on the client's previous home, but six months into the project, she had a change of heart, sold where she was living, and moved into this home nearby, which had been designed by Michael Dreef, AIA, of Houston-based DMG Architects. Austin remembers the homeowner telling him, "There are two things you can't give me, more space and a better view," two things the new, larger residence delivered.







Taking his client's inclination for a "happy and cheerful" mood to heart, Austin created a palette that transcends shore-home convention: sun-drenched colors like terra cotta, pale pink peach, soft creamy yellows, and, to balance these warm shades, cool green. Each space in the 5-bedroom, 6.5-bath home on stilts incorporates these hues, but in an array of tonalities, in different combinations, and expressed in a variety of fabrics and textures.

Austin calls the living room, an elevator ride up from the first-floor entryway, the "star of the show, the hero." With a wall of windows and multiple double doors leading to a deck stretching the length of the house, the sizable room clad in white horizontal wood panels is bathed in sunlight. To soften the ambiance, Austin had the ceiling beams painted pistachio green, a fresh shade that matches a pair of custom ottomans and plays well with the predominantly pink sofas arranged opposite each other for easy conversation. The designer brought in a natural raffia-upholstered cocktail table along with wooden side tables and a sandy









brown, canework-patterned carpet as a counterpoint to the more colorful furnishings. "This room could have become a little too saccharine without some more earthy elements to ground it," he says.

Even while designing rooms with custom furniture, luxurious fabrics, and exquisite detail, Austin did not lose sight of the fact that this is, above all, a family home. Hanging above an antique chest of drawers in the living room is an enlarged photograph of a tank surfer, well known in his day, who is the homeowner's brother. "It meant so much to her to have this image displayed in her home," says Austin.

Very much a home that embraces the

present-day lifestyle of the homeowner and her three adult children, who visit, it was also inspired by the past—cherished time spent at her grandparents' beachside abode—and it anticipates the future, when the third generation will gather here, too. A solid-slab wood dining table can easily seat 10, and bunkrooms and a family-room reading nook were designed with future grandchildren in mind.

It's easy to imagine extended family occupying the open-concept main floor space in comfort. The flow is easy, thanks to Austin's thoughtfully planned but subtle approach to connecting the rooms through a shared color palette and complementary design details. For example, the basketwork on the Currey & Co. chandelier in the dining room suggests the living room rug's woven canework motif, while its natural grass-cloth shade echoes the Phillip Jeffries grass cloth on the backs of bookcases in the adjoining space. "It all has this woven quality to tie it together," says Austin. Likewise, the countertop chairs in the kitchen play off the McGuire dining room chairs.

Imbued with timeless charm, the private spaces continue to balance color and neutrals, earthiness and sophistication. Additionally, Austin's dexterous interplay of tangible and intangible elements is consistent throughout. For instance, the main floor primary bedroom, with high vaulted ceilings and enormous picture windows, is a sanctuary appointed with coral Kravet armchairs and motorized Thibaut draperies. But it is more than a pretty space for the homeowner. Says Austin, "I love that she can wake up in the morning and at the touch of a button on her bedside table open the draperies to see out to this view."

While his client let Austin know that she considers her office "the most beautiful place in existence," she also aspires to one day be the "cool grandma," who everyone wants to visit.

Summing it up in a thank you note to the designer, she wrote: "The whole house feels relaxed and welcoming. You created a space that I am proud of and it means more to me than you could ever know." •









Georgia's Sea Island, a barrier island on the Atlantic coast,

is one part five-star resort, one part exclusive gated community. Here, the architecture is eclectic, and still evolving.

"It's an exclusive location that attracts clientele from all over the world," says Chad Goehring, principal with Harrison Design.
Based in the firm's St. Simons office, just minutes from Sea Island, Goehring is well-versed in the region's flavor.

"There are a variety of architectural styles here: Mediterranean, Italian, Spanish," says



the designer, who collaborated with the firm's president Greg Palmer on the project. "In this case, inspired by their travels, the clients wanted a more English-inspired estate home."

At 6,022 square feet the home is large and designed for a growing family. However, Goehring softened its massing with inspired detailing. The Edwin Lutyens-esque bay window with scallop bracket evokes the feel of an English country estate, while the slate roof, painted brick, decorative timbers, and arched openings contribute to a cozier, more cottage-like presentation.

Per flood and FEMA regulations, the house sits six feet above the ground. "As designers, we have to incorporate ways to make the home feel comfortable on its site by concealing the extra height with terraces and stairs," says Goehring.

Instead of a more traditional front entry, the house greets with a central column of glazing. The front door is offset to the right. This purposeful transparency gives visitors a glimpse inside upon arrival. The rusticity of the French oak door contrasts with the elegant glass.

Similarly, another double-height bank of windows on the façade frames a sculptural stair. "The homeowner wanted it to be a key design feature, and it really took on a life of its own," says Goehring. "At first glance, it reads more like a piece of art. At night, when the house is lit up, it's the star of the show behind that transparent two-story element."

With the front entry sequence more subdued, the double-height family room at the center of the home emerges as a major feature. Heavy timbers on the ceiling, draperies on the double-height windows, and recessed armoires flanking the fireplace contribute a sense of scale and softness.

Natural cypress beams break up the all-white interior, which includes seven bedrooms and a bonus bunk area. "We tucked the bunks into a hallway. That way, they are there when the clients need them but otherwise blend into the wall," says Goehring. Meanwhile, the primary suite on the main floor is accessed via a hallway, giving it a more private, secluded feel when guests are in town.

Whether every bedroom is taken or it's just the family in residence, everyone gath-

ers most often in the kitchen. This functional space is bright and white and classic, with Shaker-style cabinets and sleek unlacquered bronze hardware. The island's prevalence of drawers mimics the look of an old apothecary cabinet.

From here, pocketing doors open out onto a screened porch, which delivers indoor comforts while reaching out toward the marsh and Intracoastal views. When the doors are open, "the kitchen feels twice as big and outside access is seamless," notes Goehring.

One half of the screened porch is dedicated to cooking and dining alfresco, while the other to entertaining around the fireplace. A flat wood ceiling demarcates the sitting area, giving it a more intimate feel. "This is where the family likes to sit and get cozy and just enjoy the coastal atmosphere," notes Goehring.

Outdoor living was a key consideration in the property's design: the swimming pool, terrace, and porches are arranged neatly on the main living level. "This way, the outdoor features are very much a part of the architecture and the family's everyday living," Goehring relays. Detaching the spa from the pool establishes it as its own water feature, complete with nighttime lighting.

"Because this house doesn't have a direct water view, it was important that the exterior landscape play an essential role," says Goehring of the firm's big-picture approach.

"We design a lot of houses with one style on the exterior and another on the interior. But this home," he elaborates, "is consistently calm and elegant inside and out. It's a really soothing, special retreat in a special place." *
