












Heritage properties, those loved and handed down from generation to generation, are cherished not only for their architecture but also for shared family memories.

For one Maryland couple, though, such a property offered a prime opportunity to build a new home and establish their own legacy.

The couple in question were expecting their first child when they commissioned SPEIGHT COOK Studio Architects to build them a new house on the half acre of family land in Severna Park that was to be their forever home.

"They wanted a primary residence that was comfortable and livable, and most importantly, that would grow with their family," says architect Stephanie Cook, a principal at SPEIGHT COOK.

They had no qualms about replacing the waterfront house that existed because it had not stood the test of time and was not suitable for a modern lifestyle.

The program for the transitional shinglestyle house, which faces the water on two sides, was quite ambitious considering that the flood plain was too high to include a basement and the fact that county regulations restricted the placement and size of the footprint.

The couple envisioned a 5,000-square-

foot house with two stories. On the first floor, in addition to the main living areas, they wanted a flex space near the kitchen that would begin as a children's playroom and eventually become a homework/study area, a den, or even a guest room as the kids grew.

On that same floor, they requested a games room large enough to accommodate a pool table, a foosball table, and a mini wet bar (an invisible lockable panel in the backsplash keeps the bottles out of sight and out of the way of children's hands).

"They wanted a place where the kids could hang out that's not the living room," Cook says. "Because there's no basement, they knew they needed to create a space for teenagers to go. We created that space over the garage, figuring that it also could be used as a guest bedroom if needed."

It goes without saying that another prime objective was to exploit the views, without, however, turning the waterfront façade into a characterless wall of plate glass.

"That was tricky," Cook says. "Because the existing footprint was oddly angled on the site and because of the constraints imposed by the county, we had to worry about the possibility that a neighbor would add a fence or a tree that would obstruct the view."

The main living spaces—the living room, the dining room, and the kitchen—are

aligned in sequence in a loft-like area facing the water.

"This design gives everything you need—cooking, eating, and sitting—all with the coveted water view," Cook says.

Different ceiling treatments in each of the three spaces give them distinct personalities and discrete boundaries that create a feeling of comfortable coziness.

"With this design, the rooms speak the same language but with different sentence structures," Cook says.

The ceiling in the living room is coffered, and the ceiling in the kitchen has beams. The dining room, which is in the center, is framed simply by a border of molding that links it visually to the other two flanking rooms.

Because this home is on the water, careful thought was given to indoor-outdoor spaces. There's a terrace off the dining room, and the living room offers a porch whose screening runs inside the space, giving pride of place to its exterior beams and columns.

The games room, too, opens to a screened porch, emphasizing the feeling of expansiveness.

The interior spaces, decorated by the wife, are in neutral colors and convey chic, yet casual, serenity.

It's the subtle architectural details that make the house shine. The door to the crawl space, which houses the utilities, is disguised as part of the wainscoting on the wall along the main staircase; the simple stone fireplace in the living room has a beamed mantel that hints of rustic domesticity; and the window frames, some white, some black, make the spaces distinct and defined.

All the details dovetail in the kitchen, which is appointed not only with two ovens but also with two parallel, marble-topped islands.

"This was the first time we had ever done two islands," Cook says. "Their biggest benefit is that the first one, which has seating and is closest to the dining room, acts as a buffer, keeping guests away from the foodprep island."

The house, which was completed a couple of years ago, is the family's best friend, catering to its every need with beauty, grace, and gratitude. *



THE FRIEND ZONE

A Newport Beach, California-based designer creates a welcoming coastal retreat in Del Mar that serves as the perfect home-away-from-home for two families and their quests. BY JENNIE NUNN

Former surfwear industry veteran and interior designer Raili Clasen, founder of Raili CA Design in Newport Beach, California, is well versed in the art of reimagining interiors. When asked to help reinvent a modest home in Del Mar for two families and their children from nearby Rancho Santa Fe, Clasen welcomed the challenge. "The property was originally used as a guest house by the next-door neighbors but had


no sleeping spaces or places to entertain," explains Clasen of the compact, 750-squarefoot structure. "Once they got approved to do a second story as an Accessory Dwelling Unit, or ADU, we got started on designing a weekend/ vacation house for the two families [all friends] with kids ages 10 to 19 years old."

To make the most of every square inch for the families alternating their stays, they added approximately

800 square feet consisting of a second story with two bedrooms and bathrooms; a powder room on the first floor; a kitchen and dining area with unobstructed views of the ocean; and an outdoor deck for barbecues and large group meals. "The inspiration came from their love of transitional coastal design, and our 'design with a wink," says Clasen. "Both families were all in on our small but whimsical details at the bar, in the artwork, and the fun rope lights in hallway and dining space. In the kitchen, the star of the show is the range, but the rope pendant from Cuff Studio is my favorite, especially against the white oak backdrop."

The two-story oceanfront home, akin to a private beach club layered with California coastal-inspired subtleties, now features a fully equipped kitchen and bar area thoughtfully designed as a hub for each family to linger, cook, and entertain with ease. "For this small of a space, the bar was a real stretch but provided a fun beverage center for all of

their guests to make a drink," says Clasen. "We installed the word 'cheers' on the tile with some fun glassware, and it became a big design element in the house. I still am amazed we were able to create a decentsized kitchen in this small space. It feels roomy with a completely open feel."

is saying that Belize is on their bucket list. After seeing the country firsthand, I tell them, go now. Time is fleeting, and Belize is

all you could hope it would be. And with new flights from the U.S., Belize is more accessible than ever.

Fronting the Caribbean Sea, just south of the Yucatan Peninsula in Mexico, Belize is small, about the size of New Hampshire in square miles. But tucked into this beguiling nation-part of Central America and a warmly welcomed member of the Caribbean Community—is a treasure of destinations: the flourishing Belize Barrier Reef (the second largest in the world); the breathtaking Great Blue Hole, a UNESCO World Heritage Site; stunning islands and cays easily explored by boat and perfect for snorkeling; and, inland, a patchwork of rivers, mountains, jungles, farms, and villages. Mayan sites reveal oncethriving communities that date to the years 600-800 AD.

Because Belize is small, it is possible to experience it fully without feeling cramped in a tight schedule. In a handful of days, we snorkeled off Bird Caye, cruised through the waters of the lovely town of Placencia, explored breathtaking Mayan ruins (including a small temple explored on horseback through the jungle), and more.

We started our getaway at Ka'ana, a resort



and spa in San Ignacio, set in the jungles of western Belize. Ka'ana, which means "heavenly," delivered spectacular pampering, including luxurious meals and relaxation by the pool. The resort has gotten accolades from both the Michelin and Forbes resort guides.

Our first culinary adventure featured an unforgettable wine dinner at Wine Smith Belize in San Ignacio. Every day in Belize we were wrapped in exquisite outdoor dinners amid tropical flowers, Caribbean breezes, and friendly, welcoming staff.

Ka'ana is a short drive to Morningside

Ranch, a horse farm that deserves to be seen even if you're not riding. It's nestled among grassland and trees lush with oranges, papayas, and coconuts and surrounded by mountain vistas. The expert guides took us on a nature tour, via a path through the jungle, ending at a Mayan site. After the horseback ride, we enjoyed lunch at the delightful Hode's Grill.

Nighttime was ushered in with a beautiful dinner in Ka'ana's gardens, where edible greens and vegetables used for the resort's sumptuous meals are grown. (Foodie tip:





The kitchen's delicious green juice is concocted from ginger, pineapple, chaya, and Cayo honey from Ka'ana's own bees.)

The next morning, after sunrise yoga and a solo ramble through Ka'ana's natural setting, we headed for an incredible thrill, the Great Blue Hole Flyover by Tropic Air, arranged by the Belize Tourism Board. The closeup tour over the Great Blue Hole, part of the Belize Barrier Reef Reserve System, will rock your world.

Next was a stay at the thoroughly delightful Naïa Resort & Spa in Placencia, where a luxurious massage started our adventure. Naïa is a luxury traveler's must-do. A lovely cottage awaited each of us, facing the beach and filled with all that oceanfront living can offer. That evening, we set out on a sunset cruise by Splash Dive Center. Cruising the Placencia canals and lagoon, we let our worries go with wine, snacks, and music, delivered by our friendly crew.

The next day brought another highlight, island-hopping and snorkeling at nearby Laughing Bird Caye. After snorkeling, where we saw abundant living coral and beautiful fish in the blue water, we were treated to a delicious chicken dinner grilled by our boat crew and island staff members on Laughing Bird, part of Belize's National Park System.

Our last night brought us a great cultural gem: a presentation of drummers playing traditional Garifuna music, while we enjoyed dinner in Naïa's exquisite garden. We were clapping and dancing under the moon before we knew it. It was a capstone of pure joy, just like the rest of our Belize stay. *

Everything about this apartment in Sunny Isles, Florida, seems to defy gravity.



It's poised atop the 39th floor of the 50-story north tower in the Estates of Aqualina.

It hovers over the Atlantic Ocean on one side and the Intracoastal Waterway on the other.

That gives its owners, a pair of emptynesters from New York's Upper East Side, 360-degree views of the water. It's as if they were living on a yacht—but loftily, up in the clouds.

Even the bar, designed by Vanessa Rome of her eponymous Manhattan interior design firm, floats between a kitchen island and a wall of windows, its brass and glass shelves suspended from the ceiling.

"I knew these clients like to entertain, so a bar where they could gather before dinner was essential," she says. "Next to it is the dining room, so we came up with the bar as the jumping-off point."

She placed the bar as close to floor-to-ceiling windows as possible, then created a flow out to dining and living areas—all within an open floor plan. "We maximized it with an oversized rug by Art and Loom," she says. "The path through the entire space leads eventually to an outdoor terrace."

Rome met her clients through mutual friends in New York, and they quickly hired

her to work on their Madison Avenue apartment five years ago. When they bought this Florida apartment, she was the first designer they called.

"Her simplicity and style are exactly what we wanted to bring to Miami," her client says. "Our inspiration was a pair of Brunello Cuccinelli boots—with their subtle suede and their amazingly calming taupe color."

What her interior designer delivered was better than the look and feel of those boots, she added. The key lies in the designer's subdued use of color. "Greige and cream were our color palette—even the Mark Jupiter—designed dining room table is greige," Rome says. "It's a quiet, soft tone because we didn't want to fight the view, and we wanted the backdrop to do its thing."

She approached the apartment's overall design by considering how each room would function for the family as a whole—the couple's two children are now off at college—and as personal spaces. For example, in the kids' bedrooms she saved room for desks where they can work when they come home for the holidays.

Underfoot in the primary bedroom is a soft shearling rug for coziness, while Venetian plastered walls add texture and elegance. "It's reflective, so the light coming off the sky and water make the room glow in a special way," she says.

Rome describes the interiors as layered minimalism for a place, northeast Miami, that's known for interiors that can be cold and stark. But for this couple's home away from home, this designer turned to clean and streamlined neutral materials like stone, linen, and mohair, creating spaces that feel warm while they look out over the water.

It's a soft touch that defers to its shifting surroundings. "The ocean is a constant backdrop, but its colors are constantly changing," she says. "It's a blue and green canvas, but it's never the same."

She kept the furniture neutral, too, and not too tall so it doesn't fight those water views. "The scale of everything is to make sure the water is visible," Rome says. "There are floor-to-ceiling windows that wrap around the entire apartment, so the color and material palettes are a soft, quiet backdrop."

Most of the furniture in the apartment was

custom-made in workrooms in New York. That includes work by artisans who work in wood, metal, and other media. Once the pieces were complete, a millworker flew down to Miami for their installation.

"I often design my own custom pieces, especially this bed for their primary suite, one that fits floor to ceiling very specifically," she says. "It's difficult to find things that fit perfectly, so I'm inclined to design furniture to scale."

Other touches include a lacquered lighting fixture over the dining room table, alabaster pendants in the bedrooms, and a massive, oversized round mirror from May Furniture, one that's backlit at night for dramatic effect.

Artwork at the entry is by Michael Staniak, and in the boy's bedroom, by James Verbicky; both are from L. Kotler Fine Arts. The oversized artwork in the office, turquoise to match the ocean, is from Peter Tunney.

Even the family's Australian Labradoodle received special consideration.


"We were told to leave space for the dog because it sleeps with the owners in their primary bedroom," she says. "So, instead of a dresser under the TV, we left the space empty for a dog bed," Rome says.

Which provides that canine with comfort—and a safe retreat from any fear of height or water. *









It was demonstrated handily with the recent renovation of an early 1980s home built on the water in Jupiter, Florida.

Its new owners, a recently married couple, set out to bring it up to speed—and adapt it to the salty life they love.

But not too much.

The husband's an avid fisherman with a hundred rods and a boat tied up for easy runs to the Keys and the Bahamas. But he's funny, too, and a more than a little quirky, says Heather Weisz, co-owner of HW Interiors, the firm that masterminded the renovation. "He was like, 'Can I hang my sailfish here and my rods here?" she says. "And his wife said, 'Of course not."

To compensate, Weisz—with the help of Sara Carroll, project manager with Rise Construction and Development—created an art installation out of white sand dollars, then elevated it onto a wall inside. "It's neutral and a bespoke piece of art for his office," Weisz says.

It clearly spells out the new theme for their renovated home: "STAY SALTY."

A millworker created all its letters while Carroll plugged in LED lights behind them and Weisz adhered them atop. "It's a focal point of the project," Carroll says. "It's conventional, but it has a subtle coastal vibe."

The clients asked Weisz for a full design plan. She in turn partnered with Carroll and Matt Still, owner of Rise, to execute her vision for the home. "We were trying to create a more open space that allowed Heather to run with what her design looked like," Still says. "There's a bit of a marine feeling tied in, because he's a big boater, but she tempered him before he got out of hand."

Weisz sought a coastal feel, with a light, sandy, textural look that was modern and beachy, with color tones lifted from the coastline. In the primary suite she made a few nods to ropes and boats, but with whispers, not screams. The lighter shades of blue-gray there were inspired by water views around the home.

"The first thing you see to the right when you pull in the driveway is all the water," she says. "That drove the design, plus their love of boating and the outdoors, so it's coastal but luxurious and timeless."

Most of the home's original design didn't make the cut—including aging fixtures and finishes. For example, when Weisz and her associates first visited the property, they noted a series of huge, polished-brass faucets in the shape of dolphins. "But the clients jokingly said: 'We want coastal in an elevated way, but perhaps not gold dolphin faucets," she says.

They opened some areas and filled in dated niches and cutouts, then opted for smooth and graceful contemporary arches for the dining room opening, pantry door, and a custom, built-in wall in the family room. All







else came down to bare studs—a full gut for everything, including the stairs.

And a new incarnation was born.

It began with new floors, casings, cabinets, and tops throughout, much of it in a contemporary "Micro-Shaker" style to stay current. "The new design used standard, well-balanced proportions," Carroll says. "Everything was framed according to plan, and precision was key, especially for the cabinetry."

They opened the entry vestibule by removing columns and raised flooring to create a new space with an eight-inch

stepdown—a look that surprised even Still. "It now feels like it's 10-foot ceiling that went up to 20 feet," he says. "We sunk it down, and that changed everything."

The only addition was for a walk-in

closet with two windows. Almost all the new work was on the interior, though Still and his associates also refreshed the exterior with paint and landscaping touches like new pavers for the driveway.

The interior's material palette is one of rich restraint, with white oak floors and finishes, plus applied moldings, antique glass, wall coverings, and rugs. "There's a tile breakfast table that's matte with a silky finish—and lots of natural materials, textures, and tones," Weisz says. "We layered them in."

Natural stone, especially quartzite and quartz, was the material du jour for the kitchen and all the baths, with their 14-foot ceilings. "It was a large project for the millwork firm, and we had to guide them in

finishings, room by room, instead of waiting to do them all at once," Carroll says.

She finds the stonework to be some of the most beautiful on site. "The kitchen hood is about 30 inches by 46 inches and clad in stone," she says. "It's massive and a focal point of the kitchen."

And it's a major player in a new iteration for an older home, renovated for a couple whose new lives are now centered on the coast. *

Narragansett, Rhode Island. As empty nesters the couple decamp to Delray Beach, Florida, for winter, but downsizing up north had not been discussed. Until a general contractor friend mentioned a trio of townhomes he was building in Jamestown. Curious, they swung by; they had a contract within 24 hours. "The moment we saw the amazing view of the Newport Bridge, it was a simultaneous, 'I would leave 'Gansett for this,'" Sherri recalls.

Getting in early on the build, the couple worked with Alex Crecelius of Alex Interiors to personalize the interior finishes and curate the furnishings. "Alex had us with her 'never boring' mantra," Sherri says.

Crecelius, who cooled off in the ocean at this very spot between waitressing shifts during college, guided Sherri and David in discovering their vision for their new home. "They wanted it to feel airy and modern, like a W Hotel," the designer says. The inspiration for the scheme was the beach; specifically, the sand. "The sand is light—almost white—but can also look taupe and still feel bright," Crecelius explains. For contrast, she incorporated black accents and a drop of

moody blue. "We love the way she made our neutral and monochromatic preferences so interesting with texture," Sherri says.

Entry is up a flight of stairs on the side of the home, and there's an elevator from the garage too. The open concept living space is white and airy, compliments of Benjamin Moore "Simply White" paint, a modern designer favorite for its clarity. The white oak floorboards that run through the home lend that sand-on-the-beach aesthetic Crecelius was after.

Custom white Shaker style cabinetry punctuated by linear brass pulls wraps a corner of the kitchen while white quartz with gray veining reminiscent of clouds folds up the wall

A wall installation of bare porcelain knots by Madeleine Walton of Purely Porcelain offers tone-on-tone interest and not-too-obvious nautical flair to the living room. Rope chairs by Palacek, the designer's coastal go-to furniture brand, for texture. Four Hands side table enhances the effect.

Opposite page, top to bottom, In the kitchen, Crecelius used quartz slabs for the counters and backsplash for a seamless look and easy maintenance. Black metal and glass doors turn a cabinet into a bar off to the side of the cooking area. Rounded Tom Dixon bar stools and domed Visual Comfort & Co. pendants counter all the straight lines in the space.

The bar in the den displays the owner's bourbon and whiskey collection and boasts a humidor drawer. The rounded deep sofa upholstered in lustrous nubby chenille is both snuggly and sexy, while matte gold accents offer subdued shine fitting for the masculine space.





and down the center island, waterfall style. Rift-sawn white oak shelves and the shiplapclad range hood are a slight nod to nautical.

It wouldn't be an Alex Interiors design without glamour. Here it's derived from the gilded underside of pendant lights, curvy Tom Dixon bar stools, and black metal and glass door fronts that turn a typical storage cabinet into an eye-catching bar. In the adjacent dining area, a draped coco bead chandelier adds romantic allure above the custom white oak table with a monolithic base that undulates like an ocean wave. Dining chairs with art deco appeal play off the bar stools while S-shaped head chairs composed of 29 strips of wood are rhythmic works of art.

The living room overlooks the water and leads to the front deck. There's also a three-sided, floating gas fireplace and a floor-to-ceiling Lucite wine rack that injects a sense of celebration into the salt air. A crushed-silk floor lamp ascends as though from the sea. "It's like something pulled out of a Disney ocean," the designer says. Like the supple Italian leather sofa, it came from Sklar in Boca Raton. "Sherri and David picked me up from the beach to shop when I was down there," Crecelius shares.

The designer amps up the unexpected in the powder room, where a backlit quartzite sink gives off nightclub vibes, and a Lindsey Adelman "Knotty Bubbles" pendant light is the epitome of coastal cool. Then there's the large Bob Marley portrait that Crecelius implored the owners' son, Derek DiClemente, to paint as a housewarming gift. "When they said their son's an artist, I thought, 'Yeah, so's mine,'" Crecelius quips about her four-year-old. Sherri adds, "He put his heart and soul into this, but the idea for Bob Marley was all Alex."

Prints of two more entertainers—Johnny Cash and Frank Sinatra—hang over the sensuous, sculptural sofa in the bourbon room, which Sherri likens to a speakeasy. The walnut-lined space with inlaid brass detailing is accessed through a black metal door boasting reeded-glass insets meant to cue the experience of entering a hotel lounge. "Dave showed me a picture of a friend's traditional



oak-paneled den," Crecelius says. "This skews sexier."

Upstairs in the guest bedrooms, Crecelius was influenced by Boston-based designer Rachel Reider's work at the Lark Hotels. "We didn't go crazy with the budget, but they're a fun place to be," she says. The serene primary bedroom features sea glass accents including Sklo sconces that resemble skate egg purses hung from brass hooks.

In the bath, Crecelius filled the wall above

the vanity with an enormous pill-shaped medicine chest and then hung unique lighting overhead; the sculptural linear pendant reminds her of tying up a boat with a glow-y rope. Meanwhile, the floor tile transports her to standing on sandy cement at a beachside refreshment pavilion.

"All of this is Alex, we just said okay; her talent is off the charts," Sherri says. "She started as our designer and ended as our friend." •


