

Introduction

This bibliography of the published work of the architectural partnership of Whitney R. Smith & Wayne R. Williams which include photographs by Julius Shulman is an excerpt from my 8,000 item Julius Shulman bibliography. Smith & Williams early on recognized the importance of good photography in marketing their modernist vocabulary of architecture in postwar Pasadena and Los Angeles County and commissioned Shulman for over 50 assignments during their most productive years between 1947 and 1964. Their work is finally being given the recognition it deserves with an exhibition *Outside In: The Architecture of Smith and Williams* at the Art, Design & Architecture Museum at UC-Santa Barbara. The exhibition, curated by Jocelyn Gibbs, will run from February 15, 2013 to May 12, 2013


