





"Put the little Rebel up to the table and let her eat," ordered the leader. And so she ate bread with the Yankees from my big tray, ever since called the "Yankee tray."





include that of teacher, engineer, architect, salesman, contractor, editor and freight clerk—are railroaders by hobby.

In the early days of railroading, a modeler often tried to keep his hobby quiet, lest his neighbors start talking about his "playing with trains." Soon the hobby magazines made it obvious that this interest in model railroads was widespread. For example, the subscription list of *Railroad Model Craftsman* is loaded with doctors, lawyers, military officers, clergymen and people from almost every conceivable profession, for railroading seems to have something of interest for everyone—even the famous, like bandleader Vaughn Monroe or Yul Brynner. Roy Campanella, star catcher for the Dodgers, shares a giant O gauge railroad with his son. And Walt Disney, along with his ace animator Ward Kimball, has an outdoor model railroad of his own as a hobby.

How does one get started in model railroading? While many manufacturers offer their scale models in ready-to-run form today, especially in the popular HO scale, many of the die-hards prefer to build their equipment either from kits or from raw materials. The most popular of the scale model gauges today is the tiny HO gauge which squeezes a mile into about 60 feet and can be built in a space 3x4 feet in size (some have been built smaller!), and a table 4x8' is amply large to provide some good railroading. Anything over 6x8' becomes a veritable empire. There are HO locomotives now on sale for as little as \$5, with \$25 being about average for a good metal steam-type locomotive. Many hobbyists have started with an operating railroad on a \$25 investment. Model railroading need not be expensive.

Layouts for a railroad are usually tables specially constructed at a height of about 42 inches. This height permits convenient viewing and easy accessibility to trouble spots under the layout. Favorite locations are the basement, with the attic, spare room and garage also being prime favorites. Some modelers have even constructed special railroad buildings and more than one flock of chickens has found itself evicted in favor of a miniature high iron!

Today it takes far less time to build a model railroad than it used to. Cars and locomotives which once took weeks to assemble can now be put together in a few minutes with a screw driver. Minutely detailed lost wax castings in PLEASE TURN THE PAGE

beryllium and low-cost plastics have replaced the older constructional methods to a great degree. Track is now available in sections, to go together in an incredibly easy fashion. A real scale-model railroad, complete with scenery, can be made into a presentable and attractive display in a matter of weeks.

Not all railroaders run trains. A growing number of hobbyists have turned collector, preferring instead to display their equipment. And, for many collectors, the most sought-after equipment are the battered and bruised, dented and rusty toy tinsplate trains of a bygone era. You'll find these railroaders searching through attics, junk shops and antique stores for their trains.

Collecting also includes the acquisition of railroadiana, such as timetables, railroad calendars, old spikes (the rustier the better), locomotive bells, and I even know of one New Jersey housewife whose husband has proudly mounted an old Jersey Central railroad signal on the front lawn.

The filing and display of railroadiana and old trains is a job in itself. Usually special railroad rooms provide the answer, along with filing cabinets and plenty of shelves. There's no denying its appeal, when every item tells a story of travel, adventure—even disaster. And there's more than a little nostalgia in looking at an old toy-train collection and spotting a locomotive such as you owned when you were a youngster.

But even railroading is changing. Once strictly a man's domain, this year saw a train set on the market in pastels to interest girls. And women aren't to be shunted off on a siding since they've discovered the bright fabrics so popular in shirts for rail fans look well on the feminine figure.

Maybe it's because the gals will go to any length to get the attention of the real gone amateur railroaders. But they have to—model railroading is pretty strong competition. THE END

5. How would you place a grand piano in a living room? (a) With the keyboard facing into a corner, (b) with the flat side against a wall, (c) with the end projecting into the room from a corner.

6. Which one of these lengths is incorrect for draperies? (a) to the window sill, (b) somewhere between the sill and the baseboard, (c) clearing the floor by an inch or so.

7. Your bedroom faces north. Would you paint it a shade of (a) blue (b) green or (c) yellow?

8. You have several small Oriental rugs. How would you place them? (a) Diagonally opposite, (b) at right angles to the walls.

9. If your color scheme is turquoise, cocoa and cream, which color would you choose for an accent? (a) wood rose, (b) char- treuse, (c) tangerine.

10. Your 18th Century English living room has striped taffeta curtains repeating the colors in your flowered wallpaper. What type of floor covering would you get? (a) plain broadloom, (b) rag rug, (c) an Oriental-type domestic rug.

CHECK YOURSELF AGAINST THESE CORRECT ANSWERS

1. (a) fruitwood, (b) mahogany, (c) pine.
2. Red, yellow and blue are the primary colors. Orange is a secondary color resulting from combining the primaries red and yellow.
3. (c). A flowered chintz would be most appropriate, since it's in keeping with the type of material used in Colonial days.
4. (b). Eye level is considered the best height for single pictures. With groups of pictures, the center of the group should be at about eye level height.
5. (b). A grand piano should always be placed with the flat side against a wall, preferably an inside wall to prevent damage from variations in outdoor temperatures.
6. (b). Draperies should always hang either to the sill, to the bottom of the apron (the piece below the sill), or to the floor, but never in-between.
7. (c). Yellow would be best since a light, warm color would help compensate for the lack of sunshine in a north room.
8. Small rugs should always be placed parallel to the walls.
9. (3). Tangerine would be the best accent color for this scheme since it is the complement of turquoise. A complementary color is always a good choice as an accent color.
10. (a). With patterned wallpaper and striped curtains, the most useful and agreeable choice would be a plain broadloom rug in a harmonious color.

Ever draw up the home casualty list after a children's winter party? Melted ice cream and cake crumbs are only the beginning, not to mention the rough-and-tumble type of destruction that can result if parlor acrobatics are indulged in! There is one very simple solution for all of this. Hold a winter skating party . . . in your own back yard!

The reason for my enthusiasm is the result of recent experience. Not long ago my two daughters (ages 8 and 9) received invitations to an afternoon party, celebrating the birthday of one of their small friends. A footnote to the invitation suggested that skates and warm clothing would be appropriate.


Being the curious type, as well as the Saturday afternoon chauffeur, I delivered my two offspring at the appointed hour and took a peek in the back yard. It was a beautiful day to begin with, not too cold (for Minnesota). Friday's snow glistened on the ground, and there, in the middle of the snow, was the smoothest patch of ice (about 20x30') that I ever saw!

Nearby, my nose soon informed me, was a large pot of hot chocolate warming over the coals of an outdoor charcoal grill. The host, behind the grill began making inviting motions toward

the hot dogs, hamburgers and cheese, so I decided to stay for a minute to see the fun (standing *CLOSE* to the provender).

A few other adults arrived with their children, and they too, fascinated by the rink, watched as the skating began. Two small boys arrived with hockey sticks, but the sticks had to be checked inside as a safety factor. Soon the children were being organized for games on the small patch of ice—games much like the ones they usually played—but this time on skates.








"Musical Chairs"). First, a circle of cardboard boxes was set up on the rink with one less box than the number of players. With a portable phonograph by the rink, the children skated around the boxes until the music stopped, whereupon the usual scramble followed to get seats. A prize was awarded to the last one to be seated on a box. Though a somewhat faster game than on firmer footing, it's only a little harder to do on skates.

Next, much to the delight of the hockey players, everyone was divided into two teams for "Broomball." Played just like hockey, brooms were used instead of hockey sticks and a softball instead of the hard hockey puck. Even for grownup non-hockey players, this is a lot of fun.




Now came the magic touch! With regular household bluing, shuffleboard diamonds were drawn at the ends of the rink. Hockey pucks were used for dies, brooms for pushers, and the children were soon playing shuffleboard on ice. Quite an idea!



While we watched the children play, my host explained some other back-yard games that are good for a home rink. One is ice hopscotch, done by drawing the hopscotch field with bluing and playing it on skates; another is "Ice Checkers," which is played by turning the whole rink into a huge checkerboard and using colored paper plates for checkers. Bluing, incidentally, freezes fast and is harmless to clothes.

The skating party looked like so much fun, in fact, that the adults planned a back-yard party a few days later!

If you believe in the fun of back-yard living (what an excuse for charcoal cooking!) and you live in a climate where freezing temperatures prevail during winter months, why not try it yourself? **THE END**

It Pays to Get an Appraisal

There's a saying that no home owner can be a happy one until he's bought at least two houses. Surely this is a luxury that few can afford, but the statement does suggest that the unwary buyer often acting on impulse or without competent advice, pays a high price for his mistakes.

However, the experience of a couple who purchased a house in our neighborhood and found a pack of trouble illustrates how even a former home owner can be deceived.

The average couple will shop assiduously for a \$100 living room table and will carefully weigh and ponder the final decision. When the purchase of a mink coat or a diamond ring is contemplated, there ensue long discussions among relatives and friends and an independent appraisal is not unusual. The amount involved may be \$1,000 or even \$5,000, but it hardly compares to the \$30,000 or \$40,000 outlay for the purchase of a home. Yet, in the latter case, the only advice the buyer usually gets comes from the real estate agent, who obviously is in business to sell houses. It's amazing how often people will buy a home and never think of getting the independent opinion of an appraiser.

Actually there are only a few items—good heating, a good roof, termite protection, a dry cellar and adequate closet space—that are essential in order to assure freedom from most worries of home ownership. It is the lack of attention to these obvious requirements that underlies most unhappiness. Fortunately, the risks are diminished as we reach into the area of the more popular priced house, in the \$15,000 to \$20,000 category. The various government and private financing agencies as well as local building and zoning laws act to protect the buyer. More important, the competition among builders makes available a wide choice of properties and provides a great deal of useful information, with the result that the buyer has an excellent chance of obtaining good value for his money. However, there are many factors such as neighborhood characteristics, soil drainage conditions, plans for future condemnation of property and possible assessments which are often glossed over and emphasize the need for competent advice.

To get back to our neighbor's case, he could have saved many dollars and a great deal of anguish by spending about \$25 for an appraisal. It seems he was not informed an electric pump in the basement automatically handled any leakage. A rainfall just before he moved in




This is not a mystery story—nor a game of hide-and-seek. The living room is still very much in evidence. But it's a far, far cry from the one you once knew.

In fact, there's an invasion going on—and the aggressor: the living room. There was a time when every activity in the home was assigned to a room. You cooked in the kitchen, ate in the dining room, read in the library and slept in the bedroom. Each was self-contained, confined by four walls and a lot of formality. Everything proper and everything in the proper place.

The living room? Well, it wasn't exactly a place where you lived. In Grandmother's day, it was scarcely a living room at all. Maybe you sat in the sitting room. But the parlor was reserved for Sundays, social teas and visits from the minister, with an antimacassar on every chair to say, "Please don't sit here."

Of course, America has changed since then. And changed mightily. A whole new crop of American


families (some 42 million strong) has grown up since Grandma's day . . . families piled high with kids and feeling their oats. And they've moved back into the living room.

But the living room of yesteryear hasn't been able to cope with the likes of these. For these are families with boundless energy who like to work, play, live—family style, and to the hilt—and let formality take the hindmost.

That's why the invasion is on. The living room is bustin' out all over, spilling forth into the kitchen, the dining room or the bedroom, taking over upstairs, downstairs, and even outside.

The American living room has taken off in every direction . . . assumed all shapes and sizes . . . and thrown conventional notions of what a living room should be into a cocked hat. For the Alfred Kellers of Pacific Palisades, California, the entire house is built around the living room . . . becoming supreme headquarters for every facet of their family living. From it, all other areas flow . . . kitchen, bedrooms, dining area, hobby room, terrace and pool. As you can see, it's a fun house for a fun-loving family. Actually, the living room is divided into two main areas . . . the family-recreation room (usually occupied by daughter Betty Anne and friends) and what might loosely be called a living-room theatre. (You can gather right here PLEASE TURN THE PAGE

that Alfred Keller is an avid home movie fan!) Both areas lead to the terrace and pool through separate sliding glass doors. The open floor plan divides the two areas with a jutting wall. On the family-room side, the wall houses a fireplace, barbecue grill, built-in TV, high-fidelity radio-phonograph and tape-recording unit. What a windfall for teenagers! The other side—another fireplace and a louvred loud-speaker system.

The beauty of this arrangement is that it allows family and friends of all ages to settle down to the wonderful


business of having fun—all at one time. There's hardly an excuse ever to leave home—because everything's right here!

Take the family recreation room. There are areas semi-divided for family dining, for games, for conversational relaxation, and still another area that includes a pass-through counter to the kitchen. Here's where breakfast, informal luncheons and snacks are served. Dancing anyone? You can dance all night—on a polished slate floor that runs, quite romantically, clear out to the terrace and swimming pool.

And what happens to the elder Kellers on such a night as this? Most likely, they go to the movies in the very next room. Note at the lower right the embroidered panel that covers the projection room-ports and the remote-controlled screen that ingeniously drops from the ceiling above.

Just why does this living room seem to fit the Kellers so perfectly? Because it was slowly and deliberately planned

that way. This is not the first home the Kellers have owned, but it is the first house they have built. Several times they were at the point of breaking ground only to have some unforeseen emergency call a halt to the proceedings. The delay, in spite of its disappointments, had its advantages. It gave the Kellers time to analyze just what they wanted in a home. Mr. Keller had his heart set on his own particular hobbies—home movies, hi-fi and home workshop. Daughters Betty Anne and Valerie (who has since married) wanted a place to entertain friends. Mrs. Keller craved a nook for sewing and arts and crafts. In family conclave, each family member's interests were weighed and in most cases provided for. Alfred Keller also made another important decision. At the same time he started work with architect Charles Kennedy, he

chose and employed landscape architect Joseph Copp, and interior decorator Jerry Alsobrook (shown below in two of their many "think" sessions). If only more home owners could realize the advantage of this foresight! This team of professional experts worked harmoniously to fill the requirements of the Keller family. Their tastes in architecture, landscaping and interior decoration were contemporary. "Let's



slingshot *sterile* modern," requested Alfred Keller at his first conference with his technical advisors, "and borrow the less extreme aspects of modern—an open floor plan, and glass walls, as many as we dare use, without sacrificing privacy for light and outlook." It took time and no

doubt some doing to work out the house plans, but the result is a graceful modernized version of a U-shaped house that fits the Kellers to a T!






Split-level Retreat

The Lanyon recreation room is on the lower level of their front-to-rear split level. Room overlooks pleasant garden in the rear of the house.

There are times when it seems the only place to go is down. We speak not of moral integrity but of the moment when a family decides it has to have more living room. There are countless families like the Bill Lanyons of Armonk, New York, who—when the children came along—moved from city apartment to suburb. Their new 3-bedroom split level was fine as long as Billy Jr. and Cindy were crib-size. But soon the pitter-patter grew louder. The steady stream of wet feet swelled into rivers. And for the Lanyons there was only one thing to do—*expand*. Not up, not out—but to the large, unfinished basement on the ground level which up to that time harbored little more than a collection of odd things that basements usually harbor.

On these two pages you see what a little imagination and a lot of hard work can do to transform a basement into an attractive recreation room. Prudy and Bill Lanyon began with one thing in mind: to make their room as practical as it was handsome. They followed through with this plan down to the last wipe-clean mylar place mat. The printed cotton drapery fabric sets the mood and color scheme of the room. It was the inspiration, incidentally, for the unusual floor treatment done in variegated bands of color running across the room (to make it seem wider) and to simulate the beauty of the Swedish handwoven floor coverings. Since this is a room that must serve both inside and out, the Lanyons chose redwood for the dining and cocktail tables. Sections are set far

enough apart to allow rain to drip off outdoors. The furniture is weather resistant but lightweight enough to be easily moved (you see Bill carrying a stack of six chairs below without strain on his sacroiliac). All legs are gold-anodized aluminum which contrasts effectively with the handwoven, specially-treated rattan used in the basket chair and the seats and backs of the dining chairs. Billy Jr. and Cindy get a big bang out of the vinyl covered stools. With removable legs, they, too, can be stacked when not in use.

If Bill Lanyon isn't an overly-enthusiastic do-it-yourselfer, he's a conscientious one. We asked him if he had any pointers to pass on to anyone who might take on a project like this. Said Bill, "Well, I'll start right off by warning you against your friends who say it's a cinch. It isn't exactly—but it's fun once you've started. I'm an amateur and if you are too, I wouldn't tackle the jobs that really call for a professional. Wiring, for example. We had an electrician put in the new circuit because we didn't want to overload. Remember, you need a lot of outlets for a room like this . . . TV, radio-phonograph, appliances, lamps and overhead fixtures. We got help, too, on the heating. I didn't feel qualified to install additional ducts and a cold air return. Of course, money was an item for us. That's why we paneled only one wall (to give the room a friendly look) and used dry-wall construction on the other three.



My lumber-yard bill came to roughly \$200. Installing studs for the new walls, furring strips for wallboard and the wallboard itself were the quickest and easiest jobs. The most time-consuming were the finishing touches . . . laying the tile, taping mouldings and trim, paneling and rubbing the tongue-and-groove V-joint redwood. We wanted a professional-looking job and brother, that kind of job takes time!

"But we think the time and the effort were worth it. And you know one thing . . . this room is absolutely child-proof!"




UNFINISHED ROOMS before Bill Lanyon started his project. Room in rear is now used as a workshop with space reserved for future bath.

Here's another switch on our living-room story. Step inside the home of Dick and Mary Ellen Boyer and you are greeted by one of the most handsome, engaging couples in Hubbard Woods, Ill. But once the greetings are made, you are more than likely to be escorted *downstairs*.

You see—living for the Boyers is on two levels—with the emphasis on the lower. It all started when they chose the site for their home. They picked the edge of a ravine—not a sharp precipice hanging over a small Grand Canyon but a pleasant, sloping piece of property overlooking the rose garden of an old estate.

Time was when anyone wanting to build on a hillside was considered slightly daffy. The only way to become a respected member of the community was to put your house up on stilts and pretend the slope wasn't there. Not so for Dick and Mary Ellen Boyer. They tried their level best to be unlevel . . . following the contour of the land, preserving the rose garden and letting the fluid, informal design of the house become a lovely asset to the irregular terrain. Living, therefore, is on two floors. You enter the house *upstairs* into a large living room with the bedrooms leading off. This room is actually a buffer. If the children take over the downstairs during the daylight hours, the Boyers do their entertaining up here (and they do a lot!). In the evening, the whole thing works vice versa.

But the bulk of *family* living is done downstairs. And what you find there is amply illustrated on these pages. You see the stairway in the picture just to the left. That's Sandy, Leslie and Kim Boyer watching television in what is known as the family room. The same room can be seen leading off from the dining area on the opposite page. The dining area is separated from the kitchen (see below) by a very convenient peninsula with base cabinets that open toward the kitchen and a glass-door wall cabinet that opens either way.


For Mary Ellen Boyer, the most wonderful thing about her home is that it neither ties her to her own apron strings nor limits her interests to humdrum chores. Housekeeping is that simple. In fact, Mary Ellen finds time to be a full-fledged partner to her artist husband as his treasurer. Dick Boyer is a top-drawer photographer—the first photographer to win the Chicago Artist's Guild's coveted Brush Award.

But as you can see, this husband-wife team is only a part-time job for Mrs. Boyer. Her main interests are her three bright youngsters. Mary Ellen shoulders the load of cleaning, cooking, laundering, ironing, sewing and shopping. But these family chores do not mean hours of endless drudgery. The relaxed, informal design of her home has streamlined housekeeping, giving her time to devote to the things she loves most: her husband and her children.



Kitchen has two ovens and surface units.

Glass-door wall cabinet is handy for loading dishes from kitchen side and setting table from dining side. Large, separate refrigerator and freezer units are at left. Laundry and utility room is just off the kitchen.

Someone's in the kitchen these days—and it isn't Dinah. The day of the servant—the cook, the maid, the butler, the butler's butler—is gone. *Passé. Fini.* Walk into a kitchen in this year 1958 and more than likely you find the lady of the house. For Mommie is now her own chief cook and bottle washer. And a pretty glamorous one at that.

Something else has changed since the passing of the servant. There's been a quiet revolution going on in the kitchen itself. When Dinah got her last paycheck, the American housewife was not the one to sit back on her laundry basket and bemoan the load that had befallen her. She put her *kitchen* to work . . . streamlining it from stem to stern . . . loading it with pushbutton efficiency. And while she was at it, she transformed the lowly scullery into a beautiful glamor spot. Today the kitchen is no longer just a kitchen. As you see here in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Mervyn Barnett of Los Angeles,

California, it takes on a full share of family living—and family upbringing. The Barnetts, like scores of other American families, have no reason to mourn for the good old days of the servant. They wouldn't know what to do with one if they had one. Their home is *designed* to be servantless. And quite frankly, they've grown accustomed to the idea and they like it. There's something very satisfying, they find, in bringing up their own children, running their own household, digging their own garden and planting their own trees.

Mervyn Barnett is a decorator by profession. So quite naturally, he designed his own kitchen-living room. Right off the bat, he had a twofold advantage: first, he knew the needs and requirements of his own family and secondly, he had the professional skill to carry them out. The Barnetts have four children . . . Neil, Paul, Anna and Colin, who range in ages from three to seven. Keeping an eye on four at such tender ages might seem an overpowering, full-time job to many a mother, but it doesn't faze Valerie Barnett—thanks in large part to the care and planning that went into the room. Measuring a spacious 22x16 feet in size, the living area adjoins a compact pullman kitchen. The pass-through counter allows Mrs. Barnett to keep tabs on the children at play while she tends to other household jobs. Note that the counter is a small built-in nursery in itself. Just the right height for children's meals, and with plenty of room for books, record player, paper and crayons, maps and blackboard. The wall adjoining the kitchen (at the right) has a large built-in desk with cork pin-up board, bookshelves and drawer space. And underneath, a handy toy bin so the children can store their favorite toys without having to leave the room.

The idea of concentrating the children's activities at close range is not the only reason why this kitchen-living room is worth its weight in servants. Behind that counter is a treasure trove of gadgets and equipment. Everything's there—from built-in oven to garbage disposal to washer-dryer. The Barnetts were wise, too, in their choice of materials, fabrics and accessories. The draperies are woven wood—good-looking yet easy on the upkeep. And speaking of carefree housekeeping, notice the vinyl flooring and the plastic-covered counters, dining table and chairs. The room is a crisp white with grape color accents on the floor, upholstery and draperies.

Does Valerie Barnett feel a crying need to ring for Dinah? Not one iota. We like to think that Dinah is now in her own kitchen—one that's just as nice as this one.

YOUR DECORATING SCHEME?

It was M-Day for the Grays—"Moving Day"—into a spanking new house that seemed so crisp, fresh and streamlined compared with our dingy high-ceilinged apartment with its dust-catching moldings and radiators.

"Don't!" I said to my two-year-old as we walked in the door, laden with the bird cage and two fine porcelain lamps. "Don't touch the wallpaper in the foyer!"

"Don't!" I repeated as we entered the kitchen. "Don't kick that chair leg!" The new dinette set had a shining, vulnerable black finish.

That was only the beginning. From that day on, everything was one long "Don't" punctuated by lesser "No's" and "Please's." At first I saw it as a dismal melodrama, with my small son cast as villain and our new house as the victim. But before long I realized it was a comedy of errors—mostly mine.

I had set up a decorating scheme without really considering our living scheme. Everything was terribly impractical. True, I'd been right about some things. The children's room was papered in an inexpensive nursery print. Its curtains could be tubbed and rehung without assists from the ironing board.

But in the rest of the house, my decorating had ignored our pattern of everyday living, which revolved largely about my small son. Neddy disliked playing alone in his own room so he dogged my footsteps, dragging his toys from kitchen to bedroom to living room as I did my chores. So the nursery was spotless; the wallpaper remained unmarred; the curtains were seldom touched by sticky fingers. But the kitchen wallpaper was a rogues' gallery of Neddy's prints and baby brother's Pablum. The antique shantung curtains in the living room, which separated a curious boy from the activities outdoors, were creased and wrinkled. Meanwhile I fussed over every smear and blemish, contenting myself with daydreams of how I'd redecorate when the budget permitted.

How easily I could have spared the budget, and myself, if I'd planned well in the first place. Now that I've learned the hard way, here are some pointers you may be able to use to advantage:

First, look at the layout of your home. What happens to incoming traffic? Do you enter a foyer, a corner of your living room or an alcove of your kitchen? Where will your family eat every day—in the kitchen or dining room? And where will you entertain?

If your dining room will be the scene of family gatherings—including small fry—think twice before you cover the floor with perishably pale carpeting or an expensive rug.

If your front entry leads directly into the living room, don't say hopefully, "We'll train the children to use the back door so they won't ruin the carpet." Instead, think of your own friends' wet galoshes on a snowy night and you'll decide something more practical is needed—at least in a small entry area.

Just because you're coming up with more "practical" requirements than you assumed in the beginning, is no reason to believe that everything's going to be drab and dull. Washable wallpapers come in gay, formal or sophisticated patterns. Or, if a non-washable paper catches your fancy, you can spray it with plastic to make it scrub-proof.

The range of floor coverings in the easy upkeep department is just as wide, like cork and vinyl tile, cotton scatter rugs and easily cleanable wool or combination fiber rugs.

For curtains, bedspreads and upholstery there are miracle fibers aplenty and sturdy cottons, denims and corduroys you can let your washing machine worry about.

And if you're in the market for new furniture you might choose a dining table with a wood-grained plastic top and side chairs covered with a tweedy plastic that is barely distinguishable from a woven fabric.

The possibilities are endless. And what's wonderful about it is that your rooms won't shout, "Look how practical I am!" when the last curtain is hung. Instead they'll look warm and livable. Your friends and guests will label them easy on the eyes. Only you will know how easy they are on work and energy.



Where Will I Park?

*If the question has a familiar ring in your jam-packed driveway
why not build an off-street parking area?*

When Henry Ford first rattled along the cobblestone streets of Detroit in his model T, he probably had good reason to feel he was starting something. And he certainly did. But we doubt if he ever would have predicted our present-day 64-million-car parking problem. Nor would he have thought the knotty question of "Where can I park?" would one day come home to roost in our own front yard.

But let's take a look at what's been happening. First of all, you're probably doing more entertaining than ever before . . . and you know that nowadays everybody comes by car. Secondly, chances are, you now own not just one car but two—or possibly three. And then, of course, the town hasn't helped matters by declaring many streets off-limits. No wonder *off-street* parking was bound to come!

But take heart—things born of necessity need not be the eyesore of the neighborhood, as the pictures on the next pages will prove. Your parking area can be as lovely as it


is functional. So we suggest that if you are buying or building a new home, if you are remodeling the house or re-landscaping the front yard, side yard or back yard, you consider using a good part of the space for a parking area. The shape and size will, of course, be determined by the space available, the number of cars you'd like to accommodate, and your own taste in design. Each standard size car needs a space of almost 10x20 feet, and its tightest turn takes a sector of a 45-foot circle. The cost will depend primarily on the amount of bulldozing to be done and your choice of paving materials . . . concrete, macadam, gravel or crushed stone. Prices are sure to vary in different areas of the country.

If you are re-landscaping, we suggest you move shrubs and other plants to a temporary spot. If you are starting from scratch and there's pressure on the budget, you'd be smart to buy trees, shrubs and plants in small sizes and plant them with plenty of room to grow. PLEASE TURN THE PAGE



Where Will I Park?


PORTLAND, OREGON: An island of trees, shrubs and native plants, circled with stone blocks, helped preserve the woody setting when this macadam

parking area was built. Native plants surround it also. It's the home of the C. Wade Hansons; Walter and Florence Gerke were landscape architects.




WINNETKA, ILLINOIS: Pea gravel was used with remarkable effect in the landscaping of this contemporary home on the North Shore just outside of Chicago. The parking area spreads out from the broad driveway and ad-

joins the carport. To the right, the native trees were supplemented with various shrubs; to the left, not visible in the picture, a gravel "lawn" was laid out and accented with small trees, shrubs and two stone walks.



HIGHLAND PARK, ILLINOIS: The turn-around and parking area at the Sidney Wexlers' home, viewed here from the front door, is well

designed to provide ample space, easy ingress and egress. Garage entrance is at the right. The landscape architect was M. W. Matz.



LAWRENCE, LONG ISLAND: Mrs. C. P. Dixon designed this crushed-stone parking area at the front of her house and used flowering cher-

ries, crabapples, wistaria and evergreens in the landscape. A serpentine brick wall faces street. Dalsimer, Inc., were landscape architects.



CARMEL, CALIFORNIA: A large macadam parking area takes the place of a front lawn at the home of Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Jacobs. It's made extremely attractive by a wide variety of plants, including rhodo-

dendrons, camellias, acacias, leucadendrons, purple plums, aralias, acanthus, geraniums and cinerarias in pots, Algerian ivy and Savin junipers as groundcovers. Thomas D. Church was landscape architect.

HOW YOU DO IT

If your house has an attic, one of the best and least expensive ways to gain added space, light and head room is to build a dormer. The one shown here in the sketch and photographs is a shed dormer covering nearly the entire area of the roof and opening up a large attic area. Where you have enough space in an attic and light and air are the primary needs, dormer windows rather than a shed dormer should prove sufficient.

While dormer windows along the sides of the roof will add to the livability of any room in an attic, it should also be remembered that this type of window will make a decided difference in the outside appearance, even to the point of changing the overall design of the house, sometimes making it appear out of balance. Just what the result of this addition will be is difficult for the average man to visualize. Therefore, it is often wise to consult an architect on this matter before reaching a final decision.

Something else to consider is the proper construction of a dormer. Since it's a rather large project it requires the removal of


a part of the roof as well as cutting out some of the roof rafters. If you haven't had much experience at this kind of work, it might be better to hire a skilled carpenter for the job. If you do decide to undertake it, don't forget that most of this work will be done while on the roof, so proper scaffolding should be built so you can work in safety and comfort. And as the roof will have to be left open for a considerable period of time, try to do the job in warm, dry weather, if possible. In any event, a tarpaulin should be ready for use to cover the opening in case of rain.

On examining our sketch, you can see that the opening in the roof is framed with double rafters. When locating your dormer, try to place it so that the roof rafters will form the two sides. Then double these by spiking rafters of the same size to them. The plate on which the rafters rest is doubled as well as corner posts and headers over windows. Studding forming the sides of the dormer is supported by double roof rafters on each side. Dormer windows can be built with a pitched roof or with a flat sloped roof. Large dormers, such as the one shown here need the flat, sloped variety. The outside ends of the dormer roof rafters are notched so they will rest flat on the plate. The notch adds strength and also thins down the ends of the rafters to suitable thickness for the eaves. Other ends of rafters are cut at an angle so that they fit snugly against the roof ridge board. Joists further strengthen dormer and provide nailing base for ceiling. Joists are nailed at one end to plate and rafter, at other end to rafters on opposite side of roof. Sheathing, roofing and siding are installed over framing.




GAIN A NEW



IN ORDER TO HAVE ROOM FOR VISITING GRANDCHILDREN, Mr. and Mrs. Whitney H. Roddy of Essex Falls, New Jersey, added dormer for extra bedroom space. In order not to detract from the appearance of the house, the dormer was put on the back roof. Identical siding and paint in a color matching the original house was used to blend in the addition as much as possible. Though the attic had a window at one end, it did not admit enough air or ventilation to make the space comfortable year 'round. Adding large shed dormer, rather than windows, doubled the living area.

VIEW OF NEW DORMER ADDITION shows children at play in spacious bedroom with large window that gives plenty of light. Slightly sloping ceiling gives plenty of headroom for adults and still provides enough slope for proper drainage for the roof. A variety of types and sizes of windows for dormer additions can be bought from lumber yards. These are complete windows, consisting of sashes, frames and trim and should present no great problem in installation for a competent craftsman.





ROOM WITH A DORMER

LOOKING TOWARD THE ENTRY TO THE BEDROOM you can see how the available space under the roof line was adapted for storage closets. Sharply sloping ceiling and knee wall at right show lines of old roof at the front of house. A full-height clothes closet would have been impossible without a dormer addition. Built-in closets, cupboards and drawers along sloping walls are an ideal use of this space which is too low for other uses.

VIEW OF BEDROOM FROM ENTRY shows how easily new room accommodates twin beds with room to spare. Resilient tile floor blends easily with Colonial furnishings and decoration and is a boon for children's rooms because it's so easy to clean. Tile's sound-absorbing qualities also make child's play less noisy. Window on the far wall is part of the original house structure and was, of course, retained to insure cross-ventilation. These rooms directly under the house roof should have maximum insulation between roof rafters to maintain comfortable temperatures.



50-YEAR-OLD HOME

Undaunted by its age, this Spokane home

If ever an old and dated house was remodeled with inspiration, it's the home of Mr. and Mrs. Don Klages of Spokane, Washington. More than expressing a change, the remodeled house is practically a rebirth, described with fresh ideas and new materials.

Despite the age of their old home, the Klages decided on remodeling rather than moving

because of the amount of work they'd put into their large and beautiful grounds, and simply because they liked the neighborhood. But, as you can see, the house didn't measure up to its surroundings. Built about 1910, it was laden down with old-world columns, an oversized front porch, small and randomly arranged windows and ornate roof brackets. It also needed shingles and fresh paint.



The assignment architect Warren Cummings Heylman undertook was clear-cut if difficult: to create a new-looking house on the basic structure of the old one. In front, the clutter of columns, brackets and small windows were replaced with two simple bands of glass admitting plenty of light into the house and cleaning up its appearance. To rid the house of its top-heavy look, the roof line was extended down and out from the house forming a carport. A long brick planter wall across the front also made the house appear lower. Since both Mr. and Mrs. Klages are active indoor as well as outdoor gardeners, enclosing the front porch to create a garden entry also provided an excellent space to display current blooming plants from the greenhouse at the rear. New hand-split roofing, wood siding and gray-blue paint completed exterior changes.

FLOWER SHOW AT HOME



FLOWER ARRANGEMENT BY BETTY B. MERRIAM

Since flowers seem to have the ability to adapt themselves to any container—be it a leghorn hat, a copper milk can or a bird cage—don't be surprised that the grocery stores are now providing us with new inspiration. If you, as some people we know, have accumulated a supply of the handy little plastic berry baskets without exactly knowing what to do with them, perhaps we can give you a hint—turn them into hanging flower baskets. It's as easy as putting two and two together. Filled with flowers (they need only a few to create a big effect), they can be most dramatic suspended from a ceiling over a table, hanging in a doorway (careful it's hung high enough) or over a window sill. For some festive occasion, try using groups of them to set the theme or put them in a spectacular light hanging from a ceiling fixture or a crystal chandelier, if you're lucky enough to have a facsimile of one.

If the occasion demands a more stately mood and background, the breathtaking bouquet on the opposite page is not only to be admired but copied. If you're still a novice in the art of flower arranging, and approximating this exalted group is beyond the scope of your present skill and accomplishment, either snip out the picture for future reference, or perhaps your local florist can help you out.



To make our hanging basket, put a block of plastic foam (obtained at a florist) in a plastic berry basket. Invert a second basket on top and wire both together securely. Submerge in water and let stand until foam is saturated. Wind wire around both sides of baskets as if to tie a package and then suspend it from a high point. Insert flowers cut at uneven lengths. (Flowers having weak or fragile stems may be wired to a florist's wooden pick.) Add foliage like ivy leaves to break up solid mass of flowers. As finishing touch (this is optional) wire a bow to a wooden pick and insert at side.







Let's Make Taffy Dolls

There's hardly a boy or girl from 8 to 18 who won't have the time of his (or her) life pulling taffy. Recently our friends Malcolm and Jill gave just such a party, with a new twist. All the guests were shown how to mold the pulled taffy into delightful little doll lollipops. Any novice (adolescent or adult) can do the same—just follow the instructions.

4 Shape and skewer all the doll heads. (One recipe should make about 24 lollipops.) To decorate:



8 For example, blond pigtails seem to call for a Dutch-style bonnet and a matching pale blue bow.



1 Using a taffy recipe found in any cookbook, begin by pulling the taffy until it is whole.



5 Twist tiny dab of yellow tinted taffy to make pigtails. (Have a variety of food colors handy.)



9 Your final step is painting the doll's features. Use a toothpick dipped in food coloring for this.



2 Divide the taffy, leaving one half white. Cut the other into pieces, ready for color dyes.



6 Once you've fastened the taffy pig-tails around each doll's head you're ready to make the hats!



10 Sometimes the simple shape of a doll suggests a personality. Stress this in painting the face.



3 Pull off a hunk of the white taffy and roll into a ball to shape head. Insert a skewer.



7 Let the doll's hair and face suggest the style of hat—beret, bonnet—anything is possible.




11 To prevent injury, place finished taffy dolls in a flower holder or filigree of a trivet.

- 1½ tsp. salt
- ¼ tsp. pepper
- 3 tbs. vinegar
- 3 drops tabasco sauce
- ½ tsp. paprika
- 4 hard cooked eggs, chopped

Mix veal, celery, parsley, chives, and pickles together. Dissolve bouillon cubes in boiling water, add bay leaves, peppercorns, marjoram, and thyme and simmer for 10 min. Soak gelatine in cold water for 5 min. Strain bouillon mixture and dissolve gelatine in it. Add to veal mixture with salt, pepper, vinegar, paprika, and tabasco sauce. Stir until well mixed and add chopped eggs. Pour into an oiled bread pan, 9½"x5½"x3", and chill in refrigerator until set—approximately 3 hrs. - 1 lb. ground lamb
- 1 egg
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- Dash of pepper
- 1 cup biscuit mix
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1 tbs. minced onion
- 1 tbs. minced green pepper
- 1 tbs. minced pimiento

Mix ground lamb, egg, and seasonings. Keep well refrigerated until ready to cook. Combine biscuit mix with milk, place on floured board and roll out into rectangle about 1/8 inch thick. Spread half the rectangle with a combination of onion, green pepper, and pimiento; fold unspriced half over top and lightly roll dough with rolling pin. Cut into long strips about 1 inch wide. (These may be made about an hour in advance of cooking.)

To broil the lamburgers: press small portions of lamb mixture firmly on a metal skewer to form a roll about 6 inches long and 1 1/2 inches in diameter. Partially cook over hot coals or under the broiler for about 5 minutes. Spirally and loosely wrap the biscuit strips around them and continue to cook for another 10 minutes turning frequently. (The lamburgers can be done in a hot oven, 450°F.)

that lasted three days caused considerable damage because the electric service was disconnected by the former owner who had moved to another state. It's hard to believe, but the new owner stated that had he known there was a water problem requiring the use of an automatic pump, he wouldn't have bought the house. An experienced appraiser would have called attention immediately to the condition that existed and his service would have more than justified his fee.

I can recall the case of a house which was purchased in May, and not until the following December did the occupants find out that it was impossible to heat some of the rooms. The forced hot air system simply was not good enough to deliver heat to the rooms at the end of the line. The furnace was large enough, but the extended duct system with its twists and turns impeded the flow of heat. And how often has the delusion prevailed that any old house bought at a bargain price could be economically remodelled and modernized? Even a house built according to one's own plan will probably not be perfect. Experience teaches that most people have to make compromises, and the secret of successful compromise, in the case of a house, is to settle in favor of curable faults and avoid the incurable ones.

Again, it is not always a bargain to buy a 10-room house when you need only seven rooms or to get a great deal of surplus land. High taxes and landscaping soon can dissipate the advantage of an initial low price and the theory of closing up some unnecessary rooms simply doesn't work out in practice. Good design and plan are important. Adequate wall space, proper location of windows and doors, and what the professionals call good circulation in the layout are some of the more important physical factors. But just as important are the elements of a good location including good neighbors, convenient shopping facilities, transportation and schools. These are factors that should be emphasized, for even in our automobile economy there's a limit to distance.

What it gets down to is the simple requirement of getting dependable information. A real estate broker is often equipped with the necessary experience to make a competent appraisal, but usually brokerage and appraising don't mix. A broker is interested in making commissions and maintaining a good record of sales. He is usually biased to the extent that optimism is an important ingredient of good salesmanship. The reputable appraiser, on the other hand, is objective, and is employed to make an independent analysis and interpretation of the market and express an impartial opinion of the value of a property.

Now, how does one go about employing the services of an appraiser? It would seem that it should be a fairly easy task to select a competent appraiser in any given locality. The various associations and societies of appraisers provide the names of their members in most areas. Often a simple inquiry at a local bank will elicit the name of a reputable person. However, there are times when the selection of an appraiser is not easy. Some men are quite experienced in the evaluation of farms, business properties, or factory buildings, but are not specialists in residential property. Fundamental to the choice of an appraiser is the assurance that he is a person of unquestioned honesty and proved ability. It's also wise to find out if he's had long experience in real estate, if he's diligent in carrying out his assignments, and if he's capable of exercising sound judgment. Our thrift institutions such as savings banks, life insurance companies or building and loan associations, as well as government agencies are experienced in real estate matters but even they get an appraisal before making real estate or mortgage investments.

Since you, as the buyer of a home, usually take a greater risk, why not act to safeguard what is probably your most important investment? Take the reasonable precaution of having an appraisal made by a competent, qualified person. **THE END**





The mystery of the laundry shelf

You'd think in this day of the automatic washer and the miracle fabric that the family laundry would be a relatively simple job. But no! Walk into your favorite grocery store and you are confronted with an astonishing MAZE of laundry products that's more than enough to make your head swim. Figure out, if you can, the soaps and the synthetic detergents, the low-sudsing compounds and the sudsing compounds, the bluing that goes into the wash water and the bluing that goes into the rinse water, the vegetable starches and the plastic starches, the agents to soften the water and the agents to soften the fabrics. No wonder you feel like screaming for help! True, these modern-day laundry products give you a far better wash than in Grandma's day—but they can be confusing. To help clear up the maze on the laundry shelf we've done some quiet investigating on our own. We give you herewith a list of them classified according to use and type. Some are available nationally, some locally. We don't have room to list them all; these are just a few examples. We do have one very valid suggestion: Before you buy, be sure to read the directions and look at the pictures. It's one way you can tell whether you're buying a cold-water soap or an "optical whitener" or an anti-static rinse.





DETERGENTS

Any product which loosens and carries away soil from fabrics and surfaces. *Soap* is one kind of detergent and *synthetic* or artificial compounds are another.

SOAP

A product made from fats, oils and alkali. They do a fine job of cleaning, but will often combine with minerals in untreated hard water and tend to form curd.

LIGHT DUTY: These contain equal amounts of fats and alkali and are recommended for hand washing fine fabrics or garments of delicate construction.

Synthetic detergents also fall in two other classes:

(1) THE SUDSING KIND; (2) THE LOW-SUDSING KIND.

Because soap has always sudsed in the past, the right amount of soap was generally judged by the *amount* of suds! But, actually, suds themselves have no cleaning power. It is what is in the *water* that does the job. Suds often slow down or "cushion" the water action, and keep the water from doing the best job possible. In cases of general cleaning, sometimes suds have many advantages, such as floors, woodwork, etc. that do not require forceful water action for best cleaning results.

These detergents are manufactured for a specific job. You will find cold water soaps for delicate wools and woven fabrics; "special garment" detergents for elasticized fabrics and "optical whiteners" and detergents for synthetic fabrics. Some have anti-static qualities.

Besides acting as a water softener for laundering, many of these products are used for other household needs. Read directions.

Must be repeated with each wash.

Products which help to whiten or brighten white or colorfast materials that are yellowed or grayed. They help to disinfect and sanitize too! Bleaches will not help if yellowness or grayness is due to curd or scum. (Remove this imbedded scum with a conditioned rinse using a water conditioning compound.)
