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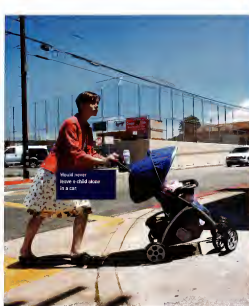

According to the FDA, PVC or polyvinyl chloride contains dioxin and dioxin-like compounds which have been shown to cause health problems, from birth defects to cancer in animals. The Healthy Building Network says PVC is "the worst plastic for environmental health perspective, posing major hazards as a many-ubiquitous product, life and disposal," and supports a shift away from PVC dependence. I encourage you to explore the issues surrounding PVC and help educate your readers about healthy home construction practices.

Rainwater Storage

While I am all for good ecological approaches to resource use, I find that your article ("Storing the Storm" April) erred far about the details of saving rainwater. A check of my own bills shows over 100,000 gallons of roof water used in the past year. My 2,000-square-foot roof with 16 inches of average yearling snow would provide 2,500 cubic feet, or 18,700 gallons. Unless there's a lot to store that amount would take at least 226 of the 62-gallon units at a cost of over \$40,000. Even at morning the price tag, where did keep 2500 units? (ASK, DENVER, WASHINGTON, D.C.)

The editors reply: Please note that you're not storing that whole amount of storm water using

as your stores during the dry times and filling with each rainfall, so you don't need that many barrels. Keep in mind, too, that our barrels are usually used as a supplement to other water sources, not to exclusively maintain a lawn. Rethought! The best way to optimize your water use is to landscape with what your local area will actually support, a practice called xeriscaping. Check out "Planning in Water Use" (page 48), for advice on choosing water-wise plants.

No-Stain Stone

New granite countertops that don't require sealing

PUT DOWN HOT TOOLS, let a little steam rise, and you'll see a granite countertop can take it. But forget to wipe a little spilled and wait or fail to rinse a power-burner-drenched knife before setting it down, and your precious stone can stain.

Diamond granite—imprudent to heat, bacteria, and chipping—is certainly valuable to discrimination from dark to oily foods. But not everyone. A new stain-resistant granite called StoneMark debuted this summer. Before the polished stone even reaches the home owner (let alone your kitchen), it's impregnated with a water-based solution that's guaranteed to stand against roughly made for 15 years.

Of course, the best defense against staining lies here in each spot before they preserve the porous stone. Porcelain countertops with a surface sealer extend that impervious time and make cleanup easier, but home owners often fail to keep up with the maintenance, says Fred Hansen, director of the National Countertop Center for Stone and Masonry Trades. "Granite is one of the most expensive countertop materials," says Hansen. "You don't expect to have to seal it."

StoneMark is currently sold at 300 Home Depot stores in 12 states, stay tuned for more locations. It comes in 40 colors and looks and feels the same as other granite. And at \$39 to \$70 a square foot installed, it costs a short the same, too. Visit stonemark.com for details.

WANTED: WOMEN'S BOOTS MADE FOR WORKING

This Old House editorial assistant Ashley Womble searches for steel-toed kicks

LAST YEAR MORE THINGS GOT TO BE done: a shoelace house renovation project for Anne-Cécile Honeff, a 10-year-old who was my first big job site. And after witnessing a do-it-yourselfer's fatal mix with a dropped Pelican black and chrome sawing a broken toe or two, I realized that my boots were inferior. Seeking open-toed, steel work boots for this year's project, I entered the shoe department at Penning New York City's largest athletic and work gear store. But among the 700 styles of boots lining the walls, not a single pair fit like a glove—or my first, for that matter. They had to be custom work boots for men, but reinforced for women's smaller feet.

Frustrated, I took my search online but found only western ropers, motorcycle, anchoring boots. With our precast concrete leg, new I went to an Army-Navy store that also caters to the hard hat crowd. That's where I first laid eyes on Timberland's new line of women's work boots. "Do you work in construction?" the salesperson asked as I slipped on a surprisingly cozy pair. I could in these boots, I thought.

Among Timberland's line of six safety toe shoes for women are the shock yellow and brown leather work boots, made for long-lasting work boots and steps that support your ankles while painting. They start at \$230 (see timberland.com for dealers).

PREVENT BBQ FIRES

This year's exceptionally dry weather coupled with human carelessness has ignited uncontrolled fires in nearly a dozen states, including California, Texas, Oklahoma, and Michigan. The scorches have destroyed millions of acres, hundreds of homes, and caused more than a dozen deaths nationwide. Meteorologists now say that this summer will be among the hottest and driest on record. That means little sparks from your fourth of July barbecue stove could catch on like you know—well, like the following steps to avoid such a flame-up:

1. Position your grill at least 2 feet away from wood siding, deck railings, awnings, and low-hanging tree branches.
2. Make sure grill equipment is in good shape. Propane or natural gas can leak from rusty tanks, cracked hoses, and corroded couplings, sending out a dangerous effluent.
3. Use kerosene, never kerosene fuel, to cover a flame.
4. Keep an eye on an open grill at all times. Simply closing the cover at the first sign of trouble could suffocate a fire.
5. Empty spent ashes into a metal bucket filled with water and let it sit for a day before burying them in the garden.
6. Keep an extinguisher handy outside to quickly douse a fire should it get out of hand.



GRASSHOPPER, A BATTERED

Q **JOYCE** While Billie derived the inspiration in 1971, he and friend Thomas Child worked out the idea to create a more marketable device that was patented a year later. Since about 10 million Americans own a "Bird's Nest" or one of the many spin-off, why are we so desperate for space in garden center stores?

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So says Elsewood, whose answer to the glaring question about the glazing color is woodgrain. It's a marketing gimmick. "What is underlying is the Florida company's 'Industrious' product, a waterproof barrier that they promise will keep moisture out of structural lumber while keeping the wood's natural—and fungus-fighting—beauty in. Elsewood has long been known as environmentally friendly wood preservatives; the problem is that when the wood gets wet, bacteria break out and cause it to rot. Elsewood is looking up its chain in a white-powder that they call the 'mold house.' Inside, an organic two-year experiment shows microorganisms eating away while the Elsewood remains unaffected.

Just about any species of wood can be applied to lumber from the lumber yard with a Elsewood contact. The treatment adds about 22 percent to the cost, but the wood will be guaranteed for the life of the house. And if blue's not your color, just remember, it gets revealed by the drought. YOU DON'T HAVE TO LIVE IN THE WHITE HOUSE to have a beautiful rose garden. So it's no surprise there's a new crop of tools on the market specifically designed for cultivating the thorny beauties. Make room on your porch bench for these essentials. —ADRIANNE

1) SPRINKLER: The colorful and durable plastic watering can has a nozzle, cushiony ribbed handle, as well as a swiveling spout for easy aiming. 2-gallon Power & Flow Watering Can, \$25, Home Depot.

2) HANDS: These comfy leather gloves were designed by a hand surgeon with the rose gardener in mind. The extra-long cuffs protect arms from thorns, while reinforced palms and finger pads improve grip strength and increase dexterity. Rose Garden Gloves, for men's and women's sizes, \$40, HomeGoods.com.

3) CUTTER: These snips have 3-inch blades for clipping stems when it's time to bring them inside to put in a vase. Slice the stems through the built-in, hook-shaped notches to remove the thorns. Snip & Snip snips, \$9, HomeDepot.com.

4) FERTILIZER: This organic mix is packed with beneficial soil microbes to break down organic matter, enabling soil so that it can be absorbed easily by the plant's roots. 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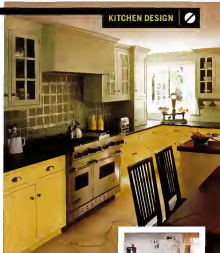


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Fit for the Family

It took this couple years to come up with a sophisticated, colorful kitchen that can handle a crowd.

THERE'S TRUTH TO THE OLD SAYING that you should live in a house for at least a year before remodeling on a major renovation. But that's not so wild. Sometimes that year stretches to several. For Jon and Nadine Bakos, make that seven. That's how long it took them to build the fake-wood cabinets, laminate counters, and vinyl flooring—just to mention the former where on the door shell required a longer run to keep items in place—that came with their 1990s house in Mount Pleasant, New York. The delay is especially long considering that Jon's family business, Bakos Kitchens, sells high-end kitchen cabinets. "People would come to the house expecting a progress disclosure," says Jon. "Their jaw would drop on shock."

The kitchen that emerged after a major renovation reflects Nadine's love of cooking and color, and Jon's requirement that it be different from what he saw every day. Working with designer Randy O'Kane, the couple doubled the room's square footage and brightened the space with a palette of greens and yellows. Now there's plenty of room for dining with their two daughters, 12 and 15, as well as extended family who stop by—both husband and wife come from big Italian families where "everyone has to participate in meal preparations," says Nadine. "It's open, it's friendly, and we can have 20 people in the kitchen without feeling crowded," she says. "I'll never figure out what took us so long."



The Plan

Update and add square footage to make room for the whole gang.

What They Did

- 1 | ADDED AND BORROWED SPACE.** The homeowners tore off the back of the house, which ended approximately where the next stands today, and bumped out 8 feet. They also gained space on the range side of the room by borrowing from a bedroom (which was relocated upstairs) and a dining room.
- 2 | MAXIMIZED NATURAL LIGHT.** Keeping wall cabinets to a minimum along the exterior wall left the house the sink allowed for lots of windows, including ones that wrap the two corners.
- 3 | INCLUDED HIS-AND-HERS SINKS.** He's a leftie, she's a rightie. One sink has the faucet at the far left corner, the other at the right, so the couple could cook and clean up together. "It's the one thing Jimmy insisted on," says Nicole Blotta.
- 4 | GROUNDED PALE COLORS WITH DEEP NEUTRALS.** "The black granite counters and oak table top gave the kitchen weight and sophistication," says kitchen designer Randy O'Kane, who thought the kitchen's green and yellow scheme would be too pastel otherwise.
- 5 | COINTEGRATED A FAMILY TABLE.** The task table built on as an extension of the island, which is also topped with task is now the spot where the family of four pitches in every day for meals.
- 6 | BECAME PEN PALS WITH GIUSEPPE.** Over the course of 25 months, Nicole Blotta wrote to Giuseppe Tatti, an architect in Milan, Italy, where a friend had met. She commissioned him to create the one of a kind Murano glass pendant lights that now hang in the kitchen.

B BEFORE: At just 9 by 12 feet, the kitchen had felt cramped and outdated.

AFTER: Now 26 by 24 feet, the renovation piece among the range sink, wall cabinets had a U-shaped layout. Flanking a kitchen sink would always be a doorway for convenient access to the island for keeping household projects engaged.

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Second-Story Job

» An airy, light-filled bath is at the heart of an upstairs master-suite retreat

FOR MOST HOMEOWNERS security is the order of the day. Check out Susan Romagosa's motivation for adding a second-story master suite to their Montauk, New York, summer home: "I was growing up in a small town where there were no cars, no cars to play from down the street, no cars to play from down the street, no cars to play from down the street. As the kids and the crowds grew, the people realized they wanted their own space. 'We needed a place to get away and relax,' says Susan. So after eight years, they decided to build up so they could look back.

The couple hired local Montauk architect Lisa Brubaker to design an upstairs complex with office (for his work) and sewing room (for her hobby). Susan especially wanted a master suite with a view where she could unwind. "That's why the bathroom is so generously sized," says Brubaker of the 9 by 14-foot space with a ceiling that peaks at 14 feet. Making the room feel even larger is the wide, wrap-around window wall overlooking Little Montauk, which Susan can look out from a private nook placed like a winter-filled window seat. "She wanted to be able to look out and watch the ocean," says Brubaker. In fact, all the bath's features—the double vanity, glass-walled shower and even the tub—provide a glimpse of the water.

"The bath is perched so all you see is the lake," says Susan. "It's really got the best view in the house."

The Plan

➤ Add a place upstairs where the homeowner could relax in the bath—with an awesome water view.

What They Did

1 | RAISED THE ROOF—AND THE CEILING. Adding a second floor to the ranch-style home allowed for a private, expanded master suite with a simple but luxurious 9 by 14-foot bath. To give the scorable room an even larger look and feel, the ceiling was vaulted, reaching 14 feet at its peak.

2 | OPENED UP THE WALLS WITH WINDOWS. Putting in nearly wall-to-wall windows facing the water plus smaller units on adjacent walls ensured maximum daylight and the broadest possible view. The architect also cantilevered the bathroom 2½ feet beyond the rest of the house's rear-facing wall to create the effect of being right on the water, with a boat.

3 | ORIENTED FIXTURES TOWARD THE VIEW. The tub is set straight up against windows that overlook the water. The glassed-in shower and recessed vanity wall provide at least a sideways glimpse of the outdoors. Even the toilet, centered in an alcove between the shower stall and the side of a closet that opens onto a hall, faces the wall of windows.

Divide and Conquer

Decorative metal edging defines garden spaces while it adds character to your landscape.

GARDEN EDGING is one of the quickest ways to add beauty and style to the grounds of your house. First, it performs an important function—defining planting beds and paths, and keeping grass from encroaching on soft—but it also expresses personality. Nearly any tree, plant, or shrub, for example, impart visual look to a border, while rustic, cast-iron edging looks evocative of a world of old-world country. The right edging can also complement a house's architectural style, whether it's graceful ballustrade or the functional geometry of an Arts and Crafts bungalow.

Unlike wood edging, which can deteriorate over time, cast-iron, steel, and copper versions will likely improve as they weather with age. Simple to install and maintain, these heavy-duty flat panels are set into the ground for easy anchoring. Just make sure to cut the edging a few inches back from the edge of the bed, safely out of the path of lawn mowers, lawn rollers, and the occasional wandering pet.

1. Look for style

There's nothing wrong with a simple, functional edging, but if you're looking for a decorative touch, consider a wrought-iron or cast-iron edging. It's available in a variety of styles, from a simple, flat panel to a more ornate, decorative design. The price range is \$10 to \$20 per linear foot.



Edging should complement, not overwhelm, so consider proportion when choosing, and try to select something about the same height as the plants it will border.

2 | ALUMINUM

Painted black, this aluminum edging is a double-layer hot-rod steel that reflects the shape of the weights. For added styling, consider a row of edging with green along the base. 35 1/2" in. tall, 30 1/4" in. wide. \$28 per panel. sherrillgardens.com

3 | NATURAL WOOD

Scrubbed wood has a more rustic look than metal, but it's also more durable. The natural wood is a kind of yellow pine that's cut into a 1/2" thick, 1 1/2" in. wide, 30 1/2" in. tall. \$28 per panel. sherrillgardens.com

4 | CAST IRON

The following wrought-iron fence post is one piece of evidence from early 20th-century suburbs, where it supported a row of garages. It is, tall, 70 in. when standing upright; three 5/8-in.-diameter holes are spaced 10 in. apart.

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Reining in Water Use

>> Ground rules for creating a lush yard that doesn't squander the available supply of H₂O

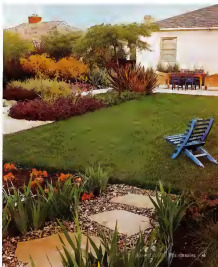

HERE'S A RIDDLE FOR YOU: Two homeowners live on the same street. One speaks his lawn weekly with rare new quantities of bottled water. The other looks his lawn up to an exfoliating scrubber each morning and then cascades the driveway, adjacent peninsula, and passively with the sun's finest ray water. What's being more extravagant?

The answer isn't as easy to figure as drought-prone places like Santa Monica, California, where council measures a strict 12 inches a year and 90 percent of the municipal water supply has to be imported from sources 400 miles away. Not coincidentally, "unconscionable water" and watering laws between the hours of 10 A.M. and 4 P.M., when most lawn mowers need quality, back up close to the city's municipal code.

"Where drinking water is scarce, it doesn't make sense to use so much of it on our lawns and flowers," says Santa Monica landscape designer Nicole Lopez. "You need to stand plants to the closest that you love so it just doesn't work the other way around."

The idea of creating a landscape designed to thrive on the amount of rainfall certain provides—called xeriscaping (ZEEER-uh-scaping)—seems like a

no brainer when you consider the facts: Across the country, booming populations of homeowners are uprooting offshoots of portable water issues: their clouds can replenish them. The problem spikes in summer, when, depending on rainfall, anywhere from 30 to 60 percent or more of all residential water used gets leveled on the landscape.

Wherever you live, it makes sense to stretch the finite supply of drinkable H₂O as far as you go. Water-wise landscapes tend to be more resistant to drought, more welcoming to pollinating butterflies, bees, and bees, and easier on the wallet. All good news, whatever the weather report predicts. Using water resources wisely doesn't mean you have to give up soft green-rolled turf or resign yourself to a gravel garden. While soil types, annual precipitation, and recommended plants differ from region to region (and even just to your lot), the basic principles that Lopez applies to sustain landscapes in perpetually water-scarped Southern California will help you create a yard that will weather dry spells, too.

1 **Stretch the lawn.** Most turf grasses require at least an inch of water a week to stay green in summer. So think about how much lawn you really need. When the owner of the Los Angeles property shown on these pages expressed his desire for a patch of turf where he could enjoy weekend volleyball games and where friends' ruffling children could play safely, Lopez let him follow his heart, sculpting out a generous swath of spindly-legged lawn, then surrounding it with ground-

covers and drought-tolerant plants better suited to the local hot, dry weather.

2 **Plant for your climate and site conditions.** Living things thrive best where they feel most at home. That can mean researching and putting in species native to the area, or even that there is similar climate. Lopez designs with residents Southern California natives like agave and Euphorbia (both succulents) with plants from places where conditions are similar, including Mexico, the Mediterranean region, South Africa, Chile, Australia, and parts of New Zealand. In the middle of how much sun and shade your yard receives—and the potential of any plants you choose to be sensitive

More Tips for Reducing Water Waste

- ▶ **Water only in the early morning,** when it's cooler and less windy to reduce evaporation. Watering when the sun is blazing does not cause up to 60 percent of outdoor water to evaporate away.
- ▶ **Raise your lawn's mow height** to 2 to 3 inches. Allowing tall grass to grow a little taller naturally shades its roots and helps keep the soil from drying out the soil.
- ▶ **Cluster the plants with like.** Not only are dramatic masses of plants more effective from a design perspective, they allow you to "type them" your yard according to moisture needs, so you aren't watering low-water plants, drought plants' specific requirements by mistakingly tagging or asking for advice at the local garden center.
- ▶ **Harvest rainwater runoff.** Install gutter-led rain barrels or consider an underground cistern. Talk to your plumber about the possibility of capturing "gray water" from your washing machine for landscape use. It's estimated that recycling water in these ways can reduce consumption of fresh water by up to 80 percent.

3 Address drainage issues early on, before planting, test your soil by digging holes. Digging it with water and seeing how long it takes for the water to percolate out. Clay-heavy soils that are slow to release moisture will suffocate plants. Soils that are overly sandy or hard and nutrient-poor ones, for example—fail to give plant roots a chance to drink up available water before it runs off an escape out of their reach. Once you know what type of soil you've got, you have two choices. Try to find plants that like it the way it is, or amend it to improve the way it behaves. Adding peat moss and aged compost will help beef up poor soils, incorporating sand along with compost will loosen clay soil and improve drainage.

4 Irrigate effectively. The most efficient systems are slow, steady, and targeted. The mister hoses or drip systems at flower beds and around groundcovers, trees, and shrubs—they can reduce water use by 20 to 30 percent. For turfgrass, install separate valves that hook up to in-ground sprinkler heads or microsprayers with flow-controlled nozzles. Try a timer to turn watering on and off at the same rate, or use a soil moisture sensor to stop watering when it's not needed. If you want a manual operation, install a simple rain gauge to determine how much rainfall has reached the ground so you can stop watering just enough to meet plants' demands.

5 Match to conditions. A 2- to 3-inch layer of mulch, pine bark, hardwood chips, gravel, or stone helps reduce water evaporation. It also helps hold organic leaves and suppresses thirsty weeds. But don't overdo it: Too much mulch in a ground level can create a root rot problem as the surface rather than deep down, where they'll help plants survive drought.

6 Establish regular maintenance schedules. Plants that are happy and well-fed—on pruned back to sticks, bent by winds, or overcrowded—demand less water. Pruning, over the long term, less maintenance over of your own time.

Construction With a Conscience

» Building and demolition take a toll on the environment. Here's how you can reduce damage—and your bottom line

FIRST DO NO HARM—OR AT LEAST do as little harm as possible. Rob Moody may not be a physician, but his approach to home construction echoes the doctor's creed. That's why Moody, owner of the EcoBuilders in Asheville, North Carolina, starts every job by setting up nylon web barriers anchored with bay nails to prevent upturned soil from running into local streams. Then he and his eight-arms crew force off moss in the yard in the drip line to protect delicate roots, throw down a gravel walkway so they don't track contaminated dirt into the house, and smooch at every 12-foot truss as it takes to accommodate recyclable building materials.

But the company, known for its dedication to maintaining green as can be job sites, goes even further, using FSC-certified lumber whenever possible, buying paints and sealants with low levels of volatile organic compounds (VOCs), and—here's how you know they're serious—setting up a composting porta-potty. “We have an employee handbook that details everything,” says Moody. EcoBuilders runs zero-vehicle or limited-powered trucks and equipment (and gives preferential treatment to any subcontractors who do the same). “All of my 2001 cars are dedicated to the cause,” Moody says.

Commitment like that costs a price. Because green products and practices tend to be more expensive, Moody charges 3 to 18 percent more than comparable

non-green contractors. But that hasn't stopped him from qualifying his services to the green job. "You can build green on any budget," he says. "You just have to figure out how far you're willing to go."

Increasingly, homeowners are taking extra steps to make sure their additions and renovations are as non-polluting, energy efficient, and waste-reducing as possible. And while some measures, like having a professional "deconstruction" team, can add to the bottom line, others, such as reusing discarded building materials on-site, can actually save you cash.

And then there's the fast-good factor that comes from knowing you've done your best to respect the earth's resources. Two years ago, Stephen Teth hired Moody to build a 7,400-square-foot house that Beth had designed. He was impressed by the contractor's willingness to pressure a change of the design as much as possible. He also liked the fact that Moody didn't build a Dumpster until the project was nearly

finished. "He took everything away in his pickup truck to be recycled—wood, cement, and plaster—so we never needed one."

Beth was willing to make all a few houses to build a house that lives in peaceful coexistence with its plot of land. "I had to give up

the bat tub, which was hard," he says. But in the end, he adds, he's just as happy looking out the window at the beautiful place that survived the construction as he would be immersed in whirlpool bubbles.

As Beth discovered, one of the easiest and most cost-effective ways to green up a job site is by recycling. "Almost everything can be recycled as a big material—lumber, flooring, sinks—all of it," says Ray Mason, a green-building consultant in Boulder, Colorado. Local recycling centers and waste-waste organizations like Habitat for Humanity's ReStore will pick up unwanted materials, saving you the cost of disposing them. If you're doing demolitions, consider hiring a deconstruction expert rather than a demo company to ensure that salvageable materials survive intact. According to the ReUse People, a California building-salvage

group, deconstruction can cost up to \$10,000 more, but pay offs often the expense, or even come out ahead, by donating materials to a nonprofit for a big, tax-deductible tax credit.

Even dumpster recycling is coming into vogue on-site. You can transform those old kitchen cabinets in your basement workshop, for example, or use discarded concrete to build up what's already in the area. Unwanted wood, drywall, and ceiling can all be used again, cutting down on waste while saving on materials fees.

"There are a lot of cost benefits in maintaining green job sites, but most people don't realize them," says Brian Newman, a green-building expert with the Missouri Advanced Research Center for the Arts. For example, it costs a contractor about \$14 a cubic yard to dump construction waste into a landfill. But the about \$125 a ton, he can reuse a mobile grinder that will chew up and spit out de-

What You Can Do

Here are a few commonly recycled building materials. To find a recycling organization in your area, consult the local Yellow Pages or the Construction Materials Recycling Association at www.cmrrecycling.com.

WOOD Unwanted wood can be chipped up for mulch, animal bedding, playground mulch or composting material, or it can be reused on-site in construction.

BRICKS Can be ground up for on-site use as a soil amendment.

CONCRETE Can be used as an aggregate for new concrete for roads or buildings. On-site, it can be ground and used for backfill or as a sub-base for driveways or sidewalks.

scribed building materials on-site. The difference in cost can be offset by using ground-up wood instead of commercial soil. Mason to control run-off, pulverized drywall for a gift balancing soil amendment, and ground brick as a driveway base or gravel garden.

Association of Home Builders' Green Building Subcommittee. Tappan applies the principles of green building like Moody, but he's a more cautious squarer in the movement. "After all," he says, "if you can get 100,000 houses to start thinking about green practices, you can start to achieve market transformation. And that's a real benefit with real effects."

Adjustable Wrenches

» One versatile tool turns nuts big and small

AN ADJUSTABLE WRENCH is a doer of all wrenches at a single tool. Where a fixed-jaw wrench can turn only one size nut or bolt, an adjustable can work on any (except) lug nut that fits between its jaws, sliding jaws. Of course, for jobs that require maximum torque, you can't beat the power and precision of a fixed wrench, but nobody wants to carry a cabinet of wrenches across the yard just to spot a rattling loose nut.

The secret of an adjustable wrench's versatility is also its biggest drawback. The jaws tend to "dig in" right where you're turning the heaviest, causing you to stand over, not across or beside your handle. Also, you can't adjust the jaws to turn before you buy. It should slide smoothly and hold its setting, whether you're giving a light twist to a TV cable flange or a heavy pull to secure a wing-nut chain. Look for nicely finished, heat-treated steel, stainless or aluminum jaw for durability, and if it seems too cheap to be true, it probably is.

Even though a pair of adjustable jaws does the work of many fixed wrenches, you'll still need more than one to your toolbox: a long-handled version for leverage, short ones to maneuver in tight spaces, and a range of jaw sizes to fit nut sizes from extra large to tiny. For extra starter tools, or good additions to your present collection, check out the great handy adaptables we've gathered on these pages.

UPPER-CLASS
Included in the limited wrenches available with a Craftsman wrench. This one's just what you need with a sliding bevel in a rubber and more reliable than a standard wrench. It's a great tool to have in your kit for tight-duty tasks around the house. It's \$42.99 at www.craftsman.com.

One Handle or Two?

As far as best-hand tools are concerned, a wrench has only one handle. Two-handed nut formers are really pliers, they aren't, even if their smooth jaws give an impression of "wrenchiness." But if the goal is the same—loosely held on to hex-sided fasteners or fixtures—we say the number of handles doesn't matter.

The trick is adding another handle from manufacturers to rethink the way the tool functions. And to devise wrenches that grab nuts single-handle versions can't reach, or that lock with a firmness no one-handed adjustable can match. And while it's true that the holding power of a pair of handles is limited in most cases by the strength of your grip, at least those handles give you direct feedback when the jaws start sloping. Besides, if you find yourself having to apply that much torque, you're better off trading your adjustable for a fixed jaw wrench anyway.

1 KITCHEN » 3 WAYS

You just can't help it in the 'burbs. The moment you're a contractor's truck in the neighbor's driveway, you're got to know what they're doing inside—especially if, as in many communities, the footprint next door is a carbon-copy of your own. After all, getting the wrap might yield some ideas for your place, and maybe even the name of a previously and willing to tackle the work.

That's what happened along a street of 1920s rowhouses in Roseville, New York. Ward revealed that one of the neighbors, Kara Berksmyer, was also a kitchen designer, and that she had a knack for seeing the possibilities in the small, cookie-cutter kitchens original to the homes. For one thing, she'd tackled her own, so she knew the challenges first-hand. The old kitchens were closed-off galley spaces with a single file lineup of appliances and not too much space, just as bad, every had also been victims of cheap updating over the years. As Berksmyer's name spread, she was called on to transform several of the "tough lots" kitchens, reconfiguring them according to the needs and lifestyle of each family.

On the following pages are three of those remodels, with design and building tips to put to work in your own home.

Pass-Through With a View

THE RITUAL OF a slightly arduous dinner around a table is one degree of formality for some families. That's certainly true for the Deans—which is why, though they created a new kitchen, they wouldn't sacrifice having a separate dining room.

When the family moved in 17 years ago, the kitchen was a mosaic of small-parked wood cabinets and floor. "It was an eyesore," says Leslie, one which, unfortunately, was visible through a 48-inch-wide pass-through that had been cut into the dining room wall. While the Deans loved the brightness of the opening, it annoyed on their flip-top lid. "A happy hacker had literally cut it out," says Leslie, then slid over the edge. Thinking they might mess, they retained the openness and made do with the minimal storage, keeping serving dishes and pots in the basement.

Last year, finally realizing they weren't going anywhere, the family hired Beckersome An and Cook and interior designer, Leslie told Reviermyer she wanted cabinets and built-ins that would significantly increase her storage space, a solution for integrating the pass-through (or so both the kitchen and the dining room, and a quiet, elegant look that "wouldn't compromise." The result solved all of the family's complaints and is a big hit with their now-teenage kids—no more nightly runs to the basement.

BIG IT Reviermyer's major cabinets with wood paneling and glass fronts were brought back, but set to create an illusion of height.

A KITCHEN THAT'S INTEGRATED into a house's main living area is ideal for some homeowners. "Now it's the first thing you see when you walk in the front door," says Robert D'Elia of his newly remodeled cooking space, which is visible from the living room and dining room. From the day he and his family moved into the house, they knew they wanted to create the sleek, design kitchen he remodeled in the 1990s. Desperate for food prep around the living beyond a house rising in L.A., Berkenslager approached Berkenslager about opening up the room. "While selecting the cherry cabinets, granite tops, and Kohler farmhouse sink and faucet was easy enough, the mechanics of improving the load-bearing wall is shared with the dining room wasn't so simple. "I knew it was going to cost us, but it would be worth it," Robert says of the labor support that had to be added and the street pipe that was removed. The family's goals, says Berkenslager, were a dining room with lower cabinets that store pots and pans, and a party closet. The Eat-In Option

IN SOME CASES, the kitchen is the family room, a place to both cook and connect. That was the thinking behind this kitchen/dining room renovation. The work was barely six months old when the present homeowners walked into it during a real estate open house. It sold them. When the previous owner, a gourmet cook, remodeled, she never thought her family would move, so she went all out, creating a comfortable eat-in kitchen. "They wanted our big room," says Berkensmyer, "so I said let's take the entire wall down and do a U-shaped kitchen with a sink that looks out onto the dining area." For the look, Berkensmyer designed a breakfast bar set lower than the rest of the kitchen peninsula, and for family dinners, a corner breakfast. The owners didn't want the kitchen to be seen from the front hall, so they styled the living room opening toward the breakfast. "It was just what we wanted," says the present owner. "A bright eating space, not a formal dining space."



FOR COOKING AND DINING

The kitchen/dining room wall came down in favor of a two-level peninsula, and the range went in where the back door bustled. The dining room's living room wall opened 3 feet toward the kitchen to create a wider breakfast and eating area and the opening was sheltered as the kitchen can't see when you come in the front door.

THE COMPLETE

Here's what you need to know to remodel a powder room or add one from scratch

HALF BATH

The earliest powder rooms didn't have tiles or even a commode. Their sole purpose was to provide a place for servants to add talcum powder to the white wigs of respectable men. But even though the fashions of the 18th century have long gone, the powder room (which now, thankfully, includes indoor plumbing) remains an indispensable place to break up. • While a half-bath WC was a rarity in the 1800s, was only in the wealthiest homes, by the 1930s, powder rooms as we know them could be found in many houses of the day. Still, it wasn't until the mid-20th century that the room became standard fare in suburban. • Powder rooms are generally situated near a home's public rooms (the foyer, the living and dining rooms) as a convenience to guests. At present, these half baths are now one of the most frequently remodeled and updated rooms in the house, according to a recent survey by Houzz, Inc.—and adding one to an existing house can increase resale value by as much as \$30,000. Because they're so much in demand, powder rooms are often resold today in small showplaces and stocked out with sculptural sinks, hand-carved fittings, and decorative tile or paneling. After all, given their small scale, they offer a good opportunity to create a big style statement without a huge outlay of cash. But before you go reinventing as that hand-hammered copper sink or tiled cherry vanity, here are some things to consider.

EVOKING THE PAST

FITTING IT IN When adding a powder room to an older home, the first task is carving out the space. Look for a space that is easily accessible from the main entrance area, but avoid plumbing if well threaded with the dining or living room where the added room would be a nuisance. Consider locating it in the room under a staircase or connecting a large linen closet door. To save no room, locate the room adjacent to plumbing lines so you can tap into the existing hot and cold water system. The room will need heating and piping behind the walls and under the floor—which can get very expensive if the bathroom floor is the foot of the main drain line or stack.

HOW BIG? With only two fixtures to fit in, the average half-bath measures about 30 square feet. After all, that isn't a huge need for storage, mirror/light or linen. View does not actually cut down on privacy, and doesn't feel clutter than a full bath. But one possibility you do have to consider is the door swing. In the best case scenario, it opens in so as not to impede traffic flow at the bathroom. So you'll need to plan for a 32-inch door opening, plus floor space (floating in so as that takes up some of the width of the door and maneuvering room around it). In really tight spaces the door may have to open out, or you can install a pocket door that slides into the wall for storage when open.

What's the maximum space you can squeeze a powder room into? In theory, you could squeeze one into 21 square feet and meet the International Residential Code (the way to check local code requirements as well). Code dictates minimum dimensions from side to side, as well as in front of the sink and mirror so they can be used comfortably. There must be 15 inches from the centerline of the commode out to the nearest wall or door, and 21 inches in front. Allow a maximum of 7 feet for handroom; you may even want to lower a very high ceiling if the room's footprint is tight, so the space feels proportional. In half-bath under the stairs, when the ceiling is low, rack the toilet under the lowest point. Don't forget electrical outlets for lighting and, perhaps, an exhaust fan for ventilation and white noise.

LAYOUT POINTERS Traditionally the sink is the focal point, and the toilet either placed next to it, where it can't be seen when the door's open, or on another wall entirely, where it's even less conspicuous. If space allows, using a vanity that resembles a dresser or sideboard can give the room a handsome, furnished look that ties in other rooms in the house. In a small space, a pedestal, console, counter, or wall-mounted sink can clear out a few extra inches, as

can a stand-alone toilet, rather than one with its own bowl.

If there's no space in square footage, consider building the toilet in a niche created by a half wall for the basin.

MATERIALS AND FINISHES Try to think outside the traditional bathroom box; the powder room should look more like a decorative room than a utilitarian WC. "It's one of the rooms that guests see the most, so it's worth spending some money on," says Illinois-based designer Mary Lou Kalamas. Kalamas suggests choosing one special material to work around. "I once brought from a vendor used to be an antique music box," she says. "Impassioned architectural detail by curving, molding treatment and wall paneling from surrounding spaces into the room. Sprung for hardwood, stone, or mosaic tile floors, and give the walls a rich color and/or pattern. A handsome table near the sink is an attractive way to display trunks and hand towels."

Many powder rooms lack natural light, and get much of their use at night, so properly placed lighting is key. Designers often rely on wall scones flanking the mirror to cast flattering, shadow-free task light. But it's good to have overhead ambient light as well, whether in the form of a pendant lamp or chandelier, or even a skylight to brighten the room during the day. Putting all light sources on dimmers allows you to modulate the glow for evening

PLANNING POINTERS

- 1 | **Follow the line.** When carving out space for a powder room, think about where water and waste lines can hook up to current plumbing. Adding new lines drives up costs a lot, especially if they're on an outside wall and need insulation.
- 2 | **Test-drive the layout.** Always dry-fit fixtures before installing them so you know exactly how their placement will work. You don't want to find out you can't get around the open door after you've installed the vanity basin.
- 3 | **Make it comfortable.** In a small powder room, the ceiling should be no higher than 8 feet to avoid a vertiginous effect. Any taller and you may want to paint it a deep color to make the space feel more intimate. Putting in a pocket door or installing floor tile on the diagonal will help a small room feel more spacious.
- 4 | **Make it special.** Consider using stone tile, hardwood flooring, or wainscoting, retrofitting a vintage dresser with a sink, or springing for a beautiful basin—after all, the powder room is one of the rooms guests see the most. Plus, its size means such upgrades are on a small scale.

DOUBLING UP

An informal survey of architects from California to Massachusetts suggests that sometimes two half-baths are greater than a whole.

Many home design pros report that an increasing number of recent projects have involved building a secondary powder room for the family in new homes and additions. Characterized by ample storage space and utilitarian fixtures such as an extra large sink or a small shower stall, these family powder rooms are all about function—serving to potty-train the littlest ones, hosting down-muddy young sports stars, or giving Mom or Dad a place to clean up after yard work. Connecticut-based architect Jay Henson recommends placing a secondary half bath in the back of the house, near the bedrooms, or off a great room kitchen in a large house that has a primary powder room located near the front entry.

Designed more for function than for style, the focus in a family powder room should be on materials that are durable, easy to clean, and kid-friendly. If excess dirt is likely, a tile floor with a drain can aid in quick cleanup. Depending on the size and layout of the house, this secondary half bath may include large tubs or a linen closet for storing towels and toiletries. It might even act as a miniature good house when equipped with a small go-inch shower, changing area, and a wicker dryer—stretching the limits of the space, but to maximize the meaning of the term "powder room" itself.

🔧 Permanent Solution: For new construction or additions, the most obvious fix is to install roof clips and code-compliant roof nails with 1/4-inch-thick

wood decking fastened securely to the roof trussing. Waterproof the seams with self-adhering flashing tape, cover the sheathing with roofing felt, and top the whole thing off with shingles rated for wind and impact resistance. Typically, there are two laminated sandwich layers of plywood and asphalt, fastened by nails in a specified area. INTHE TESTING LAB

If you buy new windows or doors for use in a hurricane region, you can be very knowing that they will already follow some national standards. That's because building standards—roofing, windows, doors, and doors—are set in strict high-wind speed areas and reinforced by most stringent ASTM International standards for wind penetration and debris impact. In addition, if the goods are up to snuff, independent testing facilities simulate a hurricane's fury. In both cases, impact windows perform, for instance, by withstanding a 9-pound ball of ice or air at 50 feet per second (about the speed of a baseball) or a significantly more powerful blow of a ball of the same size, then it's back to the drawing board for the manufacturer.

The Danger: High winds and flying debris will smash unprotected windows, setting off the catastrophic phenomenon known as internal pressurization. The wind comes in through a broken window or failed door and it's up to make back out," explains Leslie Chismen-Harmon, CEO of the Federal Alliance for Safe Homes, a coalition of insurance firms, private corporations and government agencies. "The pressure will build, and the likely outcome is that windows will shatter and your structure will be destroyed."

Permanent Solutions: Not all new impact windows, tested to one of the major standards (see box, right). Available from most leading manufacturers, these consist of a layer of plastic sandwiched between two pieces of glass. "Impact windows are similar to your car's windshield, but quite a bit thicker," says Steve Bing, coastal products manager for Andersen Windows. The super-strong glass may crack or tilt but is hard enough by flying debris, but the bond between the layers will keep the glass intact and in place. Window impact doors come in a variety of styles, including historically accurate double doors, typical to pay between \$5,000 and \$10,000 per year for an impact-resistant window or door for the same door or window.

What You Can Do Now

Protect your windows with storm shutters made of metal, aluminum, or high-density polyethylene plastic such as General Electric's Luma. Some of companies manufacture shutters. Here are a few common permanent and removable options.

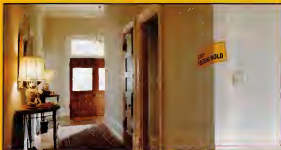


1. ALUMINUM PANELS
Interlocking aluminum panels slide into pre-mounted tracks and attach with wing nuts. The permanent track can be painted to match the house's exterior. Panels provide extra protection against debris and wind but they're tough to handle (and the sharp edges), bulky to store, and time-consuming to install. Expect to pay \$100 per square foot.

2. IMPACT WINDOWS
PVC-coated polycarbonate panels don't offer the same degree of protection as shutters but they do meet Florida Building Code standards. And, with no installation, they're easy to handle and store and use a few minutes to install. They're sturdy enough to block light (but it looks like your interior lights are on), says Mike George, a spokesman for manufacturer Reynold-Baker. About \$25 to \$35 per square foot, installed.

3. ROLL-UP SHUTTERS
Along with hurricane-style shutters, which cover a window from the top, these permanent awning shutters swing out shutters, in hurricane or fiberglass, combine protection and convenience with architectural style. When a storm approaches, just pull them closed and watch them securely. They're usually \$10 to \$15 per square foot, installed.

4. ROLL-DOWN SHUTTERS
When opened, steel roll-down shutters house a door inside the house. They can be operated manually or automatically if you opt for a remote, just remember to install a battery backup. "Roll-downs are the best of the door-in-house world," says Steve Bing, coastal products manager for Andersen Windows. He's not kidding: It's one of the best of thousands of dollars to have a set to \$10,000 square foot house with the fully automated variety.



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Garage and Entry Doors

❗ **The Danger:** If your home has an attached garage, there's that wide roll-up door as a hurricane vulnerability. When 100-plus-mph winds hit the relatively thin aluminum panels of an extended door, typically that door buckles and fails, allowing pressure to build up inside the house until it blows apart. The same is true of double-entry doors. Without adequate reinforcing, they can potentially blow out or be pulled off.

❗ **Personal Solutions:** Replace garage and entry doors with storm-rated models. For garage doors, this means tested steel construction with beefy rollers, hinges, and tracks, as well as steel braced attachment points. Reinforced entry doors typically are made of fiberglass, steel or solid wood with impact glazing. Prices range from a few hundred dollars for steel to several thousand for top-of-the-line fiberglass. See the California style model from Jeld-Wen's Hurricane collection. "It's made to simulate a hardened door," says David Price, associate marketing manager for Jeld-Wen Doors. "But it's a much stronger product than a conventional steel-and-wood door."

"More than 50 percent of the time, the garage door is the first thing to go," says Leslie Chapman-Hughes, CEO of the Federal Alliance for Safe Homes. Fortunately, it's one of the easiest parts of the house to strengthen against blow-in.

What You Can Do Now:

REMOVABLE BRACING SYSTEM

Temporary aluminum posts will improve your chances against a blow-through. At a cost of \$100, the aluminum Coller Fasten-Brace or the Secure Door system, sells for about \$200 for an extended garage door. Vertical posts are attached to the floor and ceiling. If the top is a predrilled bracket, then it's also hanging from the ceiling. Simply insert the posts to brace the door. (collerfasten.com, securedoor.com)

SETUP OF DOOR HARDWARE

Some simple hardware changes are all it takes to dramatically improve the strength of an entry door. For starters, replace hinges to meet with design windows that extend all the way through the surrounding framing. Change out the standard doorknob for a stronger three-piece one, and install a top and bottom multipoint locking system like the 5 Series from A&J Manufacturing (starting at \$300; a&jmfg.com). Use two or more internal deadbolts, giving you added protection without compromising looks. Finally, add external locking pins to the top and bottom of the movable door. In a traditional setup, only the stationary door has them. Make sure the lower pin extends down into concrete or solid wood.

Landscaping

⚠️ The Danger: When the ground is saturated by floods or heavy rain, plants rooted in dirt can combine with your house to make a deadly one. And it's not just trees that pose a hazard. Even landscape features like the pool can be a problem. If flooding causes it to overflow, the pressurized water can turn up clients and press. So remember to lower the water level in advance of the storm.

🛠️ Permanent Solution: If you're establishing a new landscape, plant well-rooted, established trees which tolerate slower growing species with similar leaves. As a landscape designer, we need to know that, but good trees reduce risk. Oak, birch, cedar, cypress and bald cypress. "Slower growing trees tend to have stronger wood," says Dennis Lingo, vice president of the Landscape Inspector's Association of Florida. Proper planting techniques help trees develop a strong root system, says Tim Old House landscape contractor Roger Cook. Avoid planting in areas with variations, such as narrow strips alongside sidewalks. If the roots are contained, they're not going to purchase the soil, increasing the chance of a blowdown.

The "labeled" trees—those that have been tested to survive in hurricanes—are the best. "Look for native plants, which have withstood the local weather for hundreds of years," says TOM landscape contractor Roger Cook.

What You Can Do Now

PRUNING AND BRACING

New planted trees will weather a bad storm better than those that are simply left to grow as intended. Structural pruning, particularly in a tree's early years, can prevent it from developing competing trunks (called "top killers" and "suckers") that grow upwards on each other from a central point. "That's like the San Antonio fruit market popping up the storm then to big wind," says horticultural Charles Lingo. "The tree goes out in half."

Prune mature trees so that wind can blow through the canopy of leaves, not against it. "Any dense foliage prevents wind from passing," Lingo explains. As for that tree, pick the "hug-a-bonnie" of a storm if possible. That will lighten the load and reduce the risk of a blowdown. Lingo says.

Finally, have a professional inspect the tree's health and structure. If the tree is old, long sections of it or if it's older or weak, it may be a good idea to remove it. Back in 2004, while giving flared tracks on the freeway near Orlando, Florida, mechanical engineer Frank Scarsudo extended a tow well south uphill down the big, red" look. "Why would the state thing for houses?" he wondered. And so he did. Teaming up with storm manufacturer Michael Madden, Scarsudo converted the Cat 1 Hurricane Warning System. Throw a few 10-foot-wide belts of the PVC-coated polyester over your house, hook it to anchors sunk into the ground, tighten the straps, and you effectively button down the whole house. "It barely tears. Wraps your house together," says Scarsudo. "It deflates the wind and diverts it over the whole structure." Consider it a supplement to storm shutters or impact windows. But at just \$3 cents a square foot, plus \$2.39 a square foot, it's a cost-effective way to protect your house from a new roof. hurricane-net.com



Basement Banker

Fallen in tornado country, know all about storm shelters. But after last year, some people at hurricane-proof regions are seeking a more secure place to bunker down than the "wind-whole interior room" recommended by emergency agencies. Those people might want to check out DePaul's Revier reinforced stormshelters. The prefab shelter comes in sizes from 4 by 6 feet to 12 by 12 feet (\$4,000 to \$12,000, installed). Once bolted and epoxied to a house's concrete foundation, it withstands winds in excess of 250 mph. But make sure to secure your flood risk. First, "Storm shelters might provide protection from flying debris and wind," despises Mark Smith, of the Louisiana Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness. "But they don't float." stormsheltersdupont.com

Portable Power

It could take a week or more for utilities to restore power to storm-torn neighborhoods. Here, a trio of solutions to keep you rolling through the blackout. **1. concrete to resurface it in place. The contractor would probably bring back the stone using a polishing compound and an angle grinder fitted with polishing pads, then he'll rub in a sealer, which your son should reapply periodically to protect against further chemical attack.

Straightening a Leaning Tree

The 25-foot-tall blue spruce in our yard has a pronounced tilt, which seems to be getting worse as the tree grows larger. I fear it will topple over someday. How can we prevent this?

J.K. BRIDGEVIEW, BOARDWALK, VA.

Roger Cook replies: If you try to pull the tree upright without fixing the root first, you'll probably tear them and kill the tree. Instead, dig a circle around the tree that's at least 18 inches out for each inch of trunk diameter and at least 2 feet deep. Only then should you attempt to straighten the tree using a trunk, creating a whole lot of

neighborhood trouble. Just be sure to put a thick pad on the trunk to the cable or rope you're pulling or you'll damage the bark.

If you could save yourself a lot of work and have a tree-moving company equipped with a truck-mounted crane spade to do the digging for you. As long as there's a way for the truck to pull up close to the tree, it can scoop it up, straighten it, and then lower it back down in a matter of minutes.

Whatever method you use, be sure to be careful to the tree for at least a year to keep the wood from pulling it out of alignment before the roots reestablish themselves.

Support for Sagging Insulation

Our 1962 home has floor beams that are 48 inches apart. The fiberglass insulation under the floor is sagging, and I don't know how to hold it in place. Any suggestions?

DAVE MOON, JACKSON, MISS.

Tom Skilling replies: Your type of floor construction is quite common for houses built over crawl spaces or in the basement. Instead of joists, the floor sits on a truss-and-goverlumber subfloor, which is supported by widely spaced braces on posts and piers.

To support the fiberglass batts by nailing chicken wire or a spacing network of mesh mesh to the underside of the batts. Then I'd fasten a layer of 1/2-inch-thick, full-faced foam aggregate boards with gylvane and roofing nails. The foam adds R-7.5 to the floor's insulation value. Make sure the fiberglass is sealed and tight against the subfloor before you install the batts. After that, and all moisture-related stuff.

This is not a fun job—you'll be spending a lot of time on your back wearing a mask and gloves, but the payoff will be a more comfortable house that room less to heat.

Removing a Tub Drain

I would like to remove my old tub drain, but it won't budge. I imagine it's supposed to unscrew in a trick squaring it with WD-40 and tapping it lightly, to no avail. What should I try next?

Michael Taborney replies: WD-40 isn't going to help you. A tub drain is threaded into a horizontal pipe called a waste shoe, and sealed

under a flange with a foam washer at plumber's party. This is what's preventing the lubricant from reaching the drain's threads.

Plumbers have specialized tub drain removers and pop-up plug wrenches for this purpose, but you can make your own drain remover with a pair of slip-joint pliers and a heavy screwdriver. Slide the pliers' handles down the drain, put the X-shaped metal cone or cushion inside, then put a screwdriver between the handles and use it like a lever to unscrew the drain. As for your hand's bit of trouble to break the pump's grip, but once you do, the drain usually comes out easily. If the cross-hairs are broken or missing, you'll need a stock of a drain key, which can be captured against the inside of the drain. You should be able to find one through a plumbing supply house or plumbingworld.com.

One caveat: If you somehow damage the waste shoe, it'll be a real nuisance getting everything back together. So if your goal is to remove the tub, then go for it. But if you just want to replace the drain, call a plumber.

Slippery Tile

Several glazed ceramic tiles are embedded in my driveway. Their highly polished faces are extremely slippery when wet. Is there anything I can do to make them safer?

Jon Perreault replies: There are liquid coatings that will make the slip-resistant and work that will not and roughen up the surface. Both are intended for commercial use and should be applied by professional installers. Just remember that any coating will have to be reapplied periodically as it wears off.

I think your best bet in this case would be to grind out the old tiles and fill in either with slip-resistant porcelain tiles or with a concrete patching compound. You can add some grit to the compound to approximate the look of the old tiles.

Dog vs. Levers

Just before we moved to our new house, our dog pawed various areas of the lawn with her claws. How do I minimize these dead spots and keep them from forming?

Roger Cook replies: Dog claws continue to dig gouges into the sod, which kills grass the same way too much fertilizer in one spot will "burn" a lawn.

Grass Be Gone

Two ways to quickly remove established turf.

The first step in building a new walkway or patio, or planting a new garden bed, usually involves getting rid of the grass. Fortunately, it's easier to eradicate than to grow, especially if you use the right tools and techniques. Here are two methods from Old Mouse landscape contractor Roger Cook used to strip a lawn.

GRASS HOE. For small projects, use muscle power to demonstrate above by Dave Pons of L.L. Evergreen. With a quick chop, the hoel's 8-inch wide blade cuts through roots, a bag on the handle pulls it out of the ground. Repeat the benefit of its being the last tool you pick up: your back won't be left giving out before the job's done. Indeed, take short swings, just hard enough to penetrate the root layer—couple of inches deep, at most. What's more, as you work, rather than pieces of sods, you'll see up the grass blades removed.

SOD CUTTER. For large projects, a gas-powered version does the mental work for you by going under the sods and lifting them back and forth until the sods are loose. Another way to remove sods is plowing deeply in one swift pass. Then just roll up the grass strips and replace them elsewhere if you wish. —TOMMY SHERIDAN

Saving Old Trim

How to pry a trim piece without splintering it.

Removing a nail molding without splintering it is a fine line and also one you learn from the process of buying a molding, not from the process of removing it. These delicate pieces are best in a pair of heavy-duty, a utility knife, and nippers.



1. Use the utility knife to cut through the nails and paint that grip the edges of the molding.
2. Work away from the wall and toward the molding, so you're not splintering it. Make a series of cuts, then insert your second pry bar on the other side of the wall. Rock the two bars back and forth to work the nail loose (left). Continue, working the bars down the strip, loosening each nail in turn. If you feel yourself pulling hard, slow down and look for any hidden nails you may have missed.
3. Extract. With the nails gone, the molding is loose. But don't hammer them out the way they came in, banging on a nail as it will cause the released molding to snap the molding's surface as it makes its exit. The best approach is to pull the nail through then the backside of the trim with a pry bar (right). Just pull the nail through where it came out of the wood and look the curved piece to one side.

How to keep clipped plants alive for up to a year

If valuable specimen plants are in the way of your renovation project, don't toss them in the chipper. Dig them up and lodge them in a safe spot surrounded with a plastic fence. They can wait quarters for up to a year if you follow the steps below. —Contributor Bruce Cook

SPRUE: Tie the branches lightly with a piece of twine. Cut through the roots with a transplanting shovel and create a root ball that's one foot across for every 30 inches of stem height. Pry the plant out of the ground and wrap burlap around the roots. Then cut it away from the construction zone. Go back and fill the hole and rake the ground level. He concludes: a broken ankle.

STOPSIL. Place the point in a shallow hole and cover the tail with a 2-inch layer of wood chips. Strip the bark and let the branches assume their natural form. Give the client about half an inch of water twice a week.

TRANSPLANT. Prepare the beds by raking up all debris and adding some peat. Rotate the shrubs' branches for the move to its new home. Plant it in a new hole three times the diameter of the root ball but no deeper than the spot it was growing in originally. —ADRIANOWSKI

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THE STONY THE BEARER A WEATHER HOUSE sounds something like a Post Office downer's lary. It began in 2006, when the arrival of the first postman gave a Dover Hills Maymoot knight a sense of brotherhood and passion. His growth in what was then a fledgling mill town, And Woodmen came Weaver's 25 years old Civil War veteran sent by the Hastings and Debar Industries Company to serve as its local's first station agent. After making a sale and many prices spent shuffling around the country for work, The New Year's resolve was ready to settle down. To build this handsome Italianate style house along the river on Millbrook Avenue. In what, would soon become Gravelly Falls a small remote neighborhood.

Those of the two walls in a half-story-deep front-hall nook looks about the same solid white. When Alvin first hung his hat in its very first hallway in 1886, the National Register adds a list of historic places, citing it as one of the best-preserved examples of 19th-century architecture in central Minnesota. Both wings of the L-shaped house took up the sunrise view that bay windows stacked up with bracket-supporting cranes. Some unimpressive decorations (brigs well-to-wealthy, wood-paneled) and two kitchen additions give the interior of the house a muted suburban feel, but they don't diminish Alvin's house a strong point, which include thick window moldings with ornate decorative spindlework, and a built-in dining room cupboard with six oval bar stools.

In the past 10 years, Massachusetts' revenue has been threatened by an annual amount of flooding. To ensure the Julian-Walton House survives, the City of Cambridge, which owns it, is offering \$32,000 to offset the cost of major floodlighting and performing needed interior-repair work (estimated at \$75,000). Most of the office houses in the street have already been relocated or, in some cases, demolished. Here is a chance to save this historic roadside not from the coasters of Boston but from the sea. —JULIAN WALTON
